Zomato's market value tops₹1 lakh crore after blockbuster listing



**NEW DELHI:** Zomato's market capitalisation topped Rs 1 lakh croremilestone after a blockbuster listing on stock exchanges, data from BSE showed. Zomato shares cent over the issue price of Rs 76 to open at Rs 116 on the National Stock Exchange.Zomato shares jumped as much as 83 per cent from the issue price to hit an intraday high of Rs 138.90. At the day's highest level Zomato achieved market capitalisation of Rs 1.08 lakh crore on the BSE making it one of the few listed entities to enter Rs 1 lakh crore market capitalisation club on market debut.

The IPO of the online provider was the second largest IPO after the Rs 15,199.44 crore Coal India share sale way back in October 2010. It is also the first Indian mega startup to go public, paving the way for the other leading digital companies such as Paytm, Flipkart and Ola to take the IPO route.

Zomato's Rs 9,375-crore offer had received a stupendous response from the investing community. The IPO was subscribed 38.25 times; the portion reserved for qualified institutional buyers (QIB) was non-institutional investors attracted 32.96 times subscription and retail segment, 7.45 times.

Following the bumper listing Zomato co-founder tweeted: «A lot of people are calling this a <historical moment». It is not. History is always made in hindsight. Never in the present. Back to work.»

Zomato was incorporated in 2008. Backed by China>s Ant Group, Zomato is among the most prominent startups in the country today and has a presence in 24 countries worldwide.

NEW DELHI: The BJP dared Rahul Gandhi to submit his phone for investigation if he believes it was tapped, and asserted that no one's phone has been tapped illegally by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi government. BJP spokesperson Rajyavard-

han Rathore told reporters that the Congress is determined to stall Parliament for one reason or another after being rejected twice by people in Lok Sabha polls of 2014 and 2019. He also took a swipe at Gandhi, saying even a "junior copy writer" will not be interested in copying his phone's content as the Congress leader has nothing "original" to offer. Amid a row over the suspected Pegasus snooping, Gandhi had said earlier in the day that all his phones were tapped. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah allegedly used the Pegasus spyware against India and its institutions, and "the only word for this is treason", Gandhi alleged.

#### France's Emmanuel Macron changes phone over Pegasus scandal

**PARIS**: French President Emmanuel Macron has changed his mobile phone and phone number in light of the Pegasus spyware case, a presidency official said, in one of the first concrete actions announced in relation to the scandal.

"He's got several phone numbers. This does not mean he has been spied on. It's just additional security," the official told Reuters. Government spokesman Gabriel Attal said the president's security protocols were being adapted in light of the incident.

#### US says technology use against civil society, regime critics concerning

WASHINGTON: The US has said it is against the use of spying technology on civil society, regime critics and journalists, even as it maintained that it has no particular insight into the Pegasus issue in India.

"The whole notion of using this type of technology against civil society, or regime critics, or journalists, or anybody like that through extrajudicial means is always concerning," US's Acting Assistant Secretary for South and Central Asian Affairs Dean Thompson told reporters during a news conference in Washington. Last Sunday, an international media consortium reported that over 300 verified mobile phone numbers, including of two ministers, over 40 journalists, three Opposition leaders and one sitting judge besides scores of businesspersons and activists in India could have been targeted for hacking through the Pegasus spyware.

### India's biggest arms licence scam, J&K district magistrates in CBI net

**SRINAGAR**: The CBI on over a dozen locations in Sr July 24 carried out searches in some parts of Jammu and Kashmir in connection with cases related to alleged irregularities in the issuance of thousands of arms licences to non-residents on forged documents, officials here said.

The agency is yet to share details about the searches but confirmed that the exercise was being conducted in connection with a case registered in 2019 on the allegations that between 2012 and 2016, the deputy commissioners of various Jammu and Kashmir districts had fraudulently and illegally issued bulk arms licences in lieu of monetary consideration. Further details are awaited.

The CBI had in December 2019 carried out searches at nagar, Jammu, Gurgaon and Noida on the premises of the then district collectors and magistrates of Kupwara, Baramulla, Udhampur, Kishtwar, Shopian, Rajouri, Doda, Pulwama, and several other places.

The searches were carried out in connection with a probe into two cases pertaining to the alleged issuance of around two lakh arms licences from different districts of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir by their collectors and magistrates. It is alleged that arms licences were issued in lieu of illegal gratification.

It is alleged that then public servants in cahoots with other accused issued arms licences to non-residents of state in violation of rules and received illegal **AGENCIES** gratification.

# 47 people die in rain landslides in Raigad

Helicopters are patrolling the flood-affected areas with rescue squads to pick up stranded people off the roofs of their houses, even as air rescue operations are underway in Maharashtra - especially in Raigad and Ratnagiri districts which witnessed incessant rains causing devastating floods in 24 hours – that continues to be severely hit by the storming monsoon rains which caused flooding of rivers, towns and villages.

Meanwhile, 47 people were reported to be killed in landslides, heavy rains and floods in various parts of Maharashtra. The Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray annouced Rs 5 lakh ex-gratia for the next of kin of those who have died in flood-related incidents in the state. Prime Minister Narendra Modi annouced Rs 2 lakh ex-gratia for the next of kin of those who died in Raigad due to landslides, besides Rs 50,000 being given to the injured, the PMO tweeted.

NDRF battalions, local police and fire brigade as well as Coast Guard jawans are working with local residents in the rescue efforts, led by rescue squads and helicopters in Mahad, even as the administration appealed to people to climb and stay on the roof of their houses or any high location to enable

The Indian Navy has mobilized seven rescue teams for flood reliefs and evacuation in the severely-affected areas of Ratnagiri and Raigad districts. Two Navy rescue teams were rushed to Mahad in Raigad, while five teams were sent to Chiplun in Ratnagiri district -- even as a team of army personnel arrived at Chiplun in Ratnagiri to conduct relief work Meanwhile, 18 teams have been deployed and another eight additional teams will be sent out in Maharashtra, while about 32 bodies have been recovered following landslides in Raigad due to excessive rain," according to Mohsen Shahidi, DIG, National Disaster Response Force (NDRF).

About 56 villagers were rescued along with cattle in Chiplun's Mirjoli village after they were trapped following a landslide. Kolhapur district witnessed as many as 47 villages being cut off after all connecting roads leading to them were submerged in water due to the heavy rains.

# Punjab CM approves Rs 331 cr more to fight Covid pandemic

**CHANDIGARH:** CM Capt Amarinder Singh today approved allocation of Rs 331 crore in addition to the money already allotted for emergency Covid response

During a virtual meeting on Covid review, he ordered establishment of a paediatric unit in each district and one centre of excellence in paediatrics for the state. The government, he further announced, will also establish liquid medical oxygen storage tanks in every district to ensure 24X7 availability of medical grade oxygen. Medical gas pipeline systems will also be set up at each district, sub-division and CHC level, he said, announcing the establishment of 17 additional RTPCR labs. ICU beds in government hospitals shall also be increased to 142, and a hub and scope model for telemedicine and teleconsultation shall also be established,

### Rs 650 cr approved under Punjab Nirman Programme

CHANDIGARH: The Chief Minister has sanctioned Rs 658 crore under the Punjab Nirman Programme and also okayed Rs 22.50 crore for sports kits, Rs 30 crore for open gyms and Rs 7.50 crore for mahila mandals. The Council of Ministers had earlier given the nod to amend PNP guidelines for utilisation of funds.

#### Punjab govt seeks 40L Covid vaccine doses from Centre

CHANDIGARH: Citing the current demand for more than 2 lakh Covid vaccine doses for the second dose alone, CM Capt Amarinder Singh today demanded 40 lakh more doses from the Centre on an urgent basis to inoculate the eligible population.

The state was expecting 2.46 lakh doses to arrive today but the CM, during a virtual meeting, noted that vaccine remains in short supply, having run out of Covishield and left with mere 3,500 Covaxin doses. Punjab has vaccinated more than 90 lakh eligible persons (nearly 37% of eligible population), he said.

# Haryana approves Rs 883-cr rail line between Karnal, Yamunanagar

CHANDIGARH: The Haryana Government has given its approval for the Karnal-Yamunanagar rail line project, fulfilling a longpending demand of people of the region for a direct and fast rail connectivity between the two important cities.

An official spokesperson said the rail line would strengthen the original transport infrastructure by providing a fast, safe, economical, comfortable and reliable mobility option to people of Haryana.

The government approved the detailed project report (DPR) on July 20 after incorporating all suggestions made by the Ministry of Railways to the draft report submitted earlier in September 2019.

Haryana Rail Infrastructure Development Corporation (HRIDC), a joint venture between the Ministry of Railways and Government of Haryana, finalised the DPR at an estimated cost of Rs 883.78 crore. The project shall be implemented in a period of



line would take off from the existing Karnal railway station on the Delhi-Ambala railway line and would connect at the existing Jagadhri-workshop railway station on the Ambala-Saharanpur Railway line. The new line will act as a feeder route for the eastern DFC, having an interchange point with the Railways at Kalanaur station (adjoining Yamunanagar) by providing direct connectivity to Karnal, Panipat and other parts of central Haryana. The existing rail route from Karnal to Yamunanagar, via Ambala Cantt, has a route length of 121 km. The comparative road distance between Karnal and

Yamunanagar is 67 km.

The proposed railway line, with a route length of 64.6 km, will, thus, provide the shortest link between these two cities and shall greatly reduce the travel time for passengers and freight traffic. The official spokesperson said the major benefits from the project would include direct and faster connectivity between Karnal and Yamunanagar, faster transportation of passengers as the travel distance would get reduced by 50 km and speedier access to market for agricultural produce, plywood and timber, industrial products, metal industry, fertiliser etc from rural regions like Indri, Ladwa

Vij disclosed that state health department hav-ing nearly a lakh 'Remdesivir' injection in their stock to treat Corona patients and black marketing of medicines will not be permitted.

In reply to a media question that the disease may spread by the time oxygen plants are installed in hospitals in the state, Vij said all concerned officers of health department has been directed to complete installation

of oxygen plants immediately and arrangement for ICU and ventilators in government hospitals has been made. He said, state government has made arrangement for regular supply of electricity, installation of diesel generating sets and concentrators for storage of oxygen in all PHC and CHS mostly situated in rural areas. As regard vaccination in the

state, Vij said leaders of political parties in opposition are in the habit of making false blames on ruling state government for limited stock of doze for vaccination in Haryana state, which is absolutely untrue since vaccination doze is being supplied by government in the centre to every state across the country daily and consumed because

# Probing fictitious transactions of Rs 2,200 crore: CBDT after raids on media group

claimed to have detected "fictitious transactions" of Rs 2,200 crore after the Income Tax Department carried out multi-city raids against the Dainik Bhaskar media group early this week.

It said the searches that were launched on July 22 in nine cities like Bhopal, Indore, Delhi, Ahmedabad, Noida and some others are "continuing and further investigations are in progress". "The voluminous material found during the search operations is being examined," the CBDT statement issued here said.

The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) frames policy for the IT Department. While the statement did not name the group, official sources identified it to be the Bhopal headquartered Dainik Bhaskar group which is involved in various business sectors like media, power, textiles and real estate with a group turnover of more than Rs 6,000 crore per an-

of funds among group companies engaged in unrelated businesses to the tune of Rs 2,200 crore has been found.

"The enquiries have confirmed that these have been fictitious transactions without any actual movement or delivery of goods. The tax effect and violation of other laws are being examined," the statement alleged. The media group, on the day of the raids, had posted a message on its website saying the government was scared of its true journalism.

From bodies in river Ganga

to Corona deaths, the group that brought the real numbers in front of the country is being raided by the government, it alleged in a message in Hindi.

'I am independent because I am Bhaskar, Only the readers' will matters in Bhaskar," it had said. The CBDT statement alleged that the group has more than 100 companies, including the holding and subsidiary companies, and that they have been operating several companies in the names of their employees that have been used for booking "bogus" expenses

"During the search, several

of the employees, whose names were used as shareholders and directors, have admitted that they were not aware of such companies and had given their Aadhaar card and digital signature to the employer in good faith. "Some were found to be relatives, who had willingly and knowingly signed the papers but had no knowledge or control of the business activities of the companies, in which they were supposed to be directors and shareholders," the CBDT

Such companies, it alleged, have been used for multiple purposes like "booking bogus expenses" and "siphoning off" the profits from listed companies, routing of funds so siphoned into their closely held companies to make investments, making of circular transactions etc.

"The nature of such bogus expenditures booked vary from supply of manpower, transport, logistics and civil works and fictitious trade payables. "The quantum of income escapement pany," it alleged. AGENCIES

using this modus operandi, detected so far, amounts to Rs 700 crore spread over a period of six years," it claimed. However, the quantum may be more as the group has used multiple layers and investigations are being carried out to unravel the entire money trail, it added.

The statement said the tax department is probing the violation of certain sections of the Companies Act and Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement prescribed by SEBI for listed companies in this case. "Application of Benami Transaction Prohibition Act will also be examined," it said. The CBDT said the real estate entity of the group is operating a mall and had been sanctioned a term loan of Rs 597 crore from a nationalised bank.

"Out of this, an amount of Rs 408 crore has been diverted to a sister concern as a loan at a low interest rate of one per cent."

# Co-operative sector needs urgent reforms

he cooperative movement certainly needs reform and revitalisation. Beset by political interference, many cooperative societies do not hold elections regularly, while some are superseded frequently. The 97th Constitution Amendment, which came into effect in 2012, was a major step towards infusing autonomy, democratic functioning and professional management. The recent Supreme Court verdict holding the amendment unconstitutional to the extent it applied to cooperative societies under the control of the States is a reminder that even well-intentioned efforts towards reforms cannot be at the cost of the quasi-federal principles underlying the Constitution. The amendment added Part IXB to the Constitution, concerning cooperative societies. Part IXB delineated the contours of what State legislation on cooperative societies ought to contain, including provisions on the maximum number of directors in each society, reservation for seats for SCs, or STs, and women, besides the duration of the terms of elected members, among others. The question before the Court was whether the 97th Amendment impacted the legislative domain of the State Legislatures and, therefore, required ratification by half the legislatures, in addition to the required two-thirds majority in Parliament. The Gujarat High Court had found the amendment invalid for want of such ratification. The Supreme Court, by a 2:1 majority, upheld the judgment holding the amendment invalid, but only in relation to cooperatives under the States. The elaborate amendment would hold good for multi-State cooperative societies, on which Parliament was competent to enact laws. There is no denying that the scope for democratising the functioning of cooperative societies and enhancing their autonomy remains unchanged. And this needs to change urgently.

# One can't live by Internet alone



e just-concluded initial public offering (IPO) of Zomato, which has successfully raised about Rs 9,000 crore at an astronomical valuation of Rs 66,000 crore, makes one believe that money does grow on trees.

More than 150 years ago, Leo Tolstoy, one of the greatest novelists and thinkers of the world, writing in his book, What Then Must We Do, wondered and asked: if everything of value and substance is produced in the rural areas, why then are the villages mired in poverty and cities awash in wealth? That question continues to befuddle us.

All these thoughts brought back memories of my own life from the 1980s. Those days I struggled as a farmer to make ends meet. I toiled all day, living out of a second-hand Army tent in a remote part of rural Karnataka. One day, after harvesting the banana crop and loading it on to my tractor well before dawn, I drove it to the weekly farmers' market in Hassan, the district headquarters. As I approached the main road leading to the market, my tractor stopped behind a massive row of trucks and vehicles, hundreds of them, all belonging to other farmers. Walking up a kilometre I came across thousands of agitated farmers. They had unloaded their fresh green chillies and tomatoes on to the road and the black tarmac had turned red and green. The heady pungent fumes from the crushed chillies made it impossible to breathe. Discovering that the prices had crashed, the farmers were up in arms as they were not even able to recover the transportation costs. So, they had blocked the roads. Around noon, finally extricating myself from the melee, unable to sell my produce and crestfallen, I ferried the bananas back to my farm and fed them to my cattle.

The IPO event of Zomato also reminded me of those days when banks repeatedly turned down my request for an agriculture loan of Rs 1 lakh but two decades later, a bank sanctioned an eye-popping amount of Rs 500 crore on a silver platter to my low-cost airline as the airline was publicly listed and a highly valued stock. The value lay in the mind's eye of the beholder, who, unbeknownst to me, was in thrall to mythic bears and bulls who



wayed the bourses.

All these strange phenomena of the modern economy hark back to the old conundrum: how is it that those farmers who own land. toil and till; produce real stuff that we eat and drink and touch and feel; produce things that keep us fed and warm — grains, fruits, vegetables, meat, cotton, wool and silk and so on — live in destitution whereas the merchant who peddles them or the broker who speculates is rich? The multinational behemoths which retail groceries and other products (Kraft Heinz, Cargill, Tyson Foods, Danone, Nestle, Unilever, Walmart, Reliance), those which build solid steel plants, automobiles, buildings, bridges, ships, railways and chains of hotels may in turn wonder why they do all the heavy lifting but are overshadowed in their stock market valuation by Amazon, Microsoft, TCS and Infosys. And now, the new kids on the block — Byju's, Zomato, and Paytm — are more valuable than those that have been working for decades. The Manipal Group, for instance, runs scores of medical and engineering colleges and hospitals. It owns hundreds of acres of prime land across cities in India and even overseas. It has massive education complexes and impressive laboratories, medical diagnostics equipment, and surgical operation theatres Despite thousands of crores of investments and hundreds of professors and doctors and nurses, it is valued at a fraction of Byju's.

Similarly, the Taj Hotels, Oberoi Hotels and other five-star hotels own the most expensive real estate. They have luxurious rooms and suites, gourmet restaurants, spas and salons, and swimming pools fit for maharajahs. But they are valued less than a fraction of Zomato. And Zomato, which produces nothing and only purveys the food made by innumerable restaurants across the country, has almost twice the valuation of Jubilant FoodWorks that owns Domino's Pizza. While others make profits, Zomato and the new unicorns

all bleed cash but have dizzying valuations. I met Neeraj Gupta of Meru Cabs, who was the first entrepreneur to launch nationwide GPS-linked radio taxis in India. He revolutionised urban mobility a few years ago. He owned more than 3,000 cars then. His company now has a fleet of 9,000 cars. But Uber and Ola, which manage a few lakh taxis across the metros of India, have upended his business model. These are asset-light companies that only manage the taxis enlisted on their Internet platform. They meet the needs of customers with optimal, effective and timely use of available resources but have heady market caps. I am not discrediting these Internet companies. These are indeed brilliant concepts.

#### A good life

Information and data are said to be the new fuel of the modern economy. The Internet makes the world go round and round and the stock valuations of new-age companies can orbit you into space.

But there is limited space in that stratosphere. This world, and life on it, cannot be circumscribed in a make-believe cloud. You can't eat information and everyone cannot live in the Internet bubble. We need food, clothing, water, housing, transportation, electricity and hospitals, and also flowers, poetry and art. We need education in schools and university campuses where there are teachers in flesh and blood and where breezy, invigorating dialogue, debate, bonhomie, music, and laughter reign. We need restaurants and travel, and beaches with sun, sand, and wine and kisses. We need stout hearty men and women who work with their hands to provide for the world. All that makes for a good life.

That may not make you a billionaire, which the sterile world of the Internet economy can make you, but don't be disheartened or discouraged. That real world rooted in the earth and soil I speak of can create wealth too. It can give abundant joy and meaning if you do your job with passion and commitment. Then my thoughts turned to my wife's 25-year-old Iyengar Bakery tucked away in Malleswaram, Bengaluru. It is a landmark eatery, which is loved and patronised by the local residents. It is part of the cultural landscape. Her wealth has not soared like the stocks of Internet companies. But she is happy and content and loves making breads and buns every day. And she is the master of her own universe.

There are countless such people across India in myriad fields — farmers, teachers, doctors, writers, journalists, masons, carpenters, blacksmiths, mechanics, artists, artisans, grocers and vendors — who serve their communities and provide jobs, livelihoods and security. They make this a wonderful world. Man cannot live by the Internet alone.

# Empowering nature with biocentric jurisprudence



ie Great Indian Bustard, a gravely endangered species, with hardly about 200 alive in India today, came under the protective wings of the Supreme Court of India in a recent judgment. The Court said, in M.K. Ranjitsinh & Others vs Union of India & Others, that in all cases where the overhead lines in power projects exist, the governments of Rajasthan and Gujarat shall take steps forthwith to install bird diverters pending consideration of the conversion of overhead cables into underground power lines.

The overhead power lines have become birds frequently tend to collide with these power lines and get killed. The Ministry of Power, in an affidavit dated March 15, 2021, has said: "The Great Indian Bustard ("GIB") lacks frontal vision. Due to this, they cannot detect powerlines ahead of them, from far. As they are heavy birds, they are unable to manoeuvre across power lines within close distances. Thus, they are vulnerable to collision with power lines." In protecting the birds, the Court has affirmed and emphasised the biocentric values of eco-preservation. The philosophy of biocentrism holds that the natural environment has its own set of rights which is independent of its ability to be exploited by or to be useful to humans.

Biocentrism often comes into conflict with its contrarian philosophy, namely anthropocentrism. Anthropocentrism argues that of all the species on earth humans are the most significant and that all other resources on earth may be justifiably exploited for the



benefit of human beings. Expressions of such line of thought date back many centuries and find mention in Politics, a well-known work of Aristotle, as also the moral philosophy of Immanuel Kant amongst many others.

#### The 'Snail darter' case

A noteworthy instance of the application of anthropocentrism in the legal world is in that of the "Snail darter" case in the United States. In 1973, a University of Tennessee biologist David Etnier, discovered a species of fish called the "Snail darter" in the Little Tennessee river. Etnier contended that the snail darter was an endangered species and that its existence would be gravely threatened by the continuation of development works relating to the Tellico Reservoir project. Following this revelation, a lawsuit came to be filed challenging the continuation of the Tellico Reservoir project. The challenge travelled all the way to the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court of the United States of America in Tennessee Valley Authority vs Hill, held that since the "Snail darter" was a specifically protected species under the National Environmental Policy Act, the executive could not proceed with the reservoir project. However, after the Supreme Court delivered its verdict, Congress enacted a law excluding retrospectively the snail darter from statutory protection. The project progressed and the fish suffered.

#### Species in danger

the world with countless other species, many of which are nearing extinction on account of man's imprudent insensitivity. About 50 years ago, there were 4,50,000 lions in Africa. Today, there are hardly 20,000. Indiscriminate monoculture farming in the forests of Borneo and Sumatra is leading to the extinction of orangutans. Rhinos are hunted for the so-called medicinal value of their horns and are slowly becoming extinct. From the time humans populated Madagascar about 2,000 years ago, about 15 to 20 species of Lemurs, which are primates, have become extinct. The compilation prepared by the International Union for Conservation of Nature lists about 37,400 species that are gravely endangered; and the list is ever growing.

#### Some green shoots

Some aspects of constitutional law on ecoconservations are significant. The Constitution of India declares that it is applicable to the territory of India. While making such a declaration, it very obviously refers to humans within that territory and its predominant aim was to give them rights, impose obligations and to regulate human affairs. The Constitution is significantly silent on any explicitly stated, binding legal obligations we owe to our fellow species and to the environment that sustains us. It is to the credit of the judiciary that out of these still and placid waters, it has fished out enduring principles of sustainable development and read them, inter alia, into the precepts of Article 21 of the Constitution.

a gloomy landscape, one i ened to observe some green shoots emerging. Pieces of legislations are slowly evolving that fall in the category of the "Right of Nature laws". These seek to travel away from an anthropocentric basis of law to a biocentric one. In September 2008, Ecuador became the first country in the world to recognise "Rights of Nature" in its Constitution. Bolivia has also joined the movement by establishing Rights of Nature laws too. In November 2010, the city of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania became the first major municipality in the United States to recognise the Rights of Nature. As a first step, these laws empower people in a community to "step into the shoes" of a mountain, stream or forest ecosystem and advocate for the right of those local communities". These laws, like the Constitution of the countries that they are part of, are still works in progress

These enabling factors are unique to India and tremendous keys to realising the benefit of the democratisation of access and data brought about by the digital age, Seth says.

Though India is very well placed to achieve digital superpower status, the author is of the opinion that there are four critical areas India can set a firm foundation with a concept called "digital first" - building core capabilities

on digital technology and the new business rules he outlines in the book.

India has an opportunity to leverage for increased success in areas like global IT leadership, innovative global business, digital transformation for conventional industries and enterprises and public services and enterprises, he says. "All of this is to support and fuel waves of entrepreneurship. I believe this will lead to a virtuous cycle of entrepreneurial growth. A wave of entrepreneurs with innovative new businesses and digital conversion of older industries will fuel the next wave of entrepreneurs, who each reach a higher level and drive the next wave of innovation and growth," he suggests.

# Can resume work from office: Infosys tells employees

**NEW DELHI:** Outsourcing giant Infosys Limited told employees last week they could resume work from offices, according to a memo seen by Reuters that offers an early sign of the country's \$190 billion technology services sector moving to get back on track.

The Bengaluru-based IT services company stopped short of calling all employees back to work, reflecting wider caution across the sector as Indian officials warn about the looming threat of a third wave of CO-VID-19 infections.

Still, after a devastating second wave of infections in May, the country's daily numbers are roughly a tenth of the peak, with infections falling to the lowest in four months on Tuesday.

Health experts have appealed to state governments and citizens to not lower their guard against COVID-19, saying a third wave was inevitable.

Other sectors such as aviation and manufacturing have had to call some employees back to sites, or are staying closed entirely as the pandemic disrupted travel and many back and start working from raised the number of deaths to



curb rising cases.

In its memo, Infosys said the country's safety situation seems to be improving, with growing vaccination coverage. Infosys did not respond to Reuters' request for comment on the memo. # 7 in 10 consumers in India encountered tech support scams last year, highest globally, says Microsoft

nessed a relatively high rate of tech support scams at 69 per cent in the last 12 months—among the highest globally—with a significant increase seen in such scams stemming from unsolicited calls, a Microsoft survey said on Thursday.

Microsoft's 2021 Global Tech Support Scam Research report showed that consumers in India experienced a relatively high "scam encounter rate" of 69 per cent in the last 12 months, similar to the 70 per cent rate experienced in

However, there was an overall five-point drop in such scam encounters globally, with a rate of 59 per cent over the same period.

Microsoft commissioned YouGov for this global survey in 16 countries, including India, Australia, Japan and Singapore, and it included 16,254 adult internet users (about 1,000 per country). This is a follow-up to similar surveys that Microsoft fielded in 2018 and 2016.

About 48 per cent of the respondents in India were



tricked into continuing with the scam - an eight-point increase from 2018, and three times higher than the global average (16 per cent). One in three (31 per cent) of those surveyed continued engaging and eventually lost money, an increase of 17 points compared with 2018 (14 per cent), the report said.

Consumers in India who lost money to such scams in 2021 lost Rs 15,334 on average. However, 88 per cent of those who lost any money were able to recover some back, with the average being Rs 10,797.

The most common methods of payment for those who

bank transfers (43 per cent), followed by gift cards (38 per cent), PayPal (32 per cent), credit cards (32 per cent), and Bitcoin (25 per cent).

Microsoft said the high number of people falling victim to scams is likely due to consumers in India being more trusting of unsolicited contact and more inclined to believe that a company would initiate contact.

# Asian Development Bank lowers India's growth forecast to 10% for this fiscal

**NEW DELHI:** The Asian Development Bank has downgrađed India's economic growth forecast for the current financial year to 10 per cent, from 11 per cent projected in April, on account of the adverse impact of the coronavirus pandemic.

India's GDP growth recovered to 1.6 per cent in the last quarter of fiscal year ended March 2021, narrowing contraction in the whole fiscal year from 8 per cent estimated in April to a revised 7.3 per cent, the multilateral funding agency said in the Asian Development Outlook (ADO) Supplement.

"Then a second wave of the pandemic induced many state governments to impose strict containment measures. New COVID-19 cases daily peaked at more than 4,00,000 in early May, then fell to a little over 40,000 in early July.

"Early indicators show economic activity resuming quickly after containment measures eased. The growth projection for FY2021 (ending March 2022), downgraded from 11 per cent in ADO 2021 to 10 per cent, reflects large base effects," it said.

# Economic reforms benefited unevenly; wealth creation at bottom of pyramid needed: Mukesh Ambani

**NEW DELHI:** Three decades of economic reforms in India have benefited citizens unevenly and there is a need for the "Indian model" of development to focus on creating wealth at the bottom of the pyramid, the richest Indian Mukesh Ambani said, exuding confidence that the country can be at par with the US and China by 2047.

Writing a rare column on the occasion of 30 years of economic liberalisation, the chairman of the India's largest company by market value Reliance Industries Ltd said bold economic reforms helped GDP of USD 266 billion in 1991 grow by over ten times.

"India transformed from an economy of scarcity in 1991 into an economy of sufficiency in 2021. Now, India has to transform itself into an economy

of sustainable abundance and equitable prosperity for all by 2051. In India, equity will be at the heart of our collective prosperity," he wrote in The Times of India Ambani said India in 1991

showed foresight and courage in changing both the direction and determinants of its "The government placed

the private sector also at the commanding heights of the national economy, which the public sector had occupied for the previous four decades. It ended the license-quota raj, liberalised trade and industrial policies, and freed up capital markets and the financial sector. These reforms liberated India's entrepreneurial energy and inaugurate an era of fastpaced growth," he wrote.



These reforms helped the Indian economy become the fifth largest in the world, halving poverty rates despite population rising from 88 crore to

"Key infrastructure has improved beyond recognition. Our expressways, airports and ports are now world-class, and so are many of our industries and services," he said.

It is unimaginable, he recalled, that people had to wait for years to get a telephone or a gas connection, or that businesses had to seek government's permission to buy a computer.

"With our accomplishments over the past three decades, we have earned the right to dream big. What can be a greater dream than to be able to celebrate the centenary of our independence in 2047 by making India one of the world's three wealthiest nations, on par with America and China,"

The road ahead, Ambani said, is not easy. "But let us not be deterred by unexpected and temporary problems, such as the pandemic, or distracted by unimportant issues that dissipate our energies. We have the opportunity, also a responsibility towards our children and youth, to make the next 30 years the best ever in independent India's history." To realise

this, the model of self-reliant

India cooperative with the rest

of the world may be the answer, according to Ambani.

"So far, economic reforms have benefited Indians unevenly. The disparity is neither acceptable nor sustainable. Therefore, the Indian model of development should focus on creating wealth for the people at the bottom of the economic pyramid," he said.

Ambani further said the understanding of wealth and the ways to pursue it have to change and root them in the primacy of empathy.

"For too long, we have been measuring wealth only in personal and financial terms. We have neglected the truth that India's true wealth lies in achieving 'Education for All', 'Health for All', 'Employment for All', 'Good Housing for All', 'Environmental Safety for All',

'Sports, Culture and Arts for All' and 'Opportunities for Self-Development for All' - in short, 'Happiness for All'." he said.

To attain these redefined parameters of prosperity, care and empathy have to be brought to the core of everything in business and society, Ambani said, adding that nations become prosperous when they expand their markets.

"Our greatest advantage lies in India's continent-sized domestic market, which is still largely untapped. Our economy will begin to witness miraculous growth when we create a middle class of one billion people with rising incomes. 

# Tokyo Olympics opening draws 16.7 million U.S. TV viewers, a 33-year low

TOKYO: NBC's broadcast of the Tokyo Olympic Games opening ceremony drew 16.7 million viewers, the smallest U.S. television audience for the event in the past 33 years, according to preliminary data from Comcast-owned NBCUniversal on Saturday.

Across all platforms, including NBCOlympics.com and the NBC Sports app, 17 million people watched the ceremony, NBCUniversal said in an email. The streaming audience on those platforms grew 76% from the 2018 PyeongChang opening ceremony and 72% from the 2016 Rio opener, reflecting a change in viewing habits.

Friday's audience reflects a steep drop, despite difficult comparisons with previous opening ceremonies when viewers had fewer streaming options. The Tokyo opener TV audience declined 37% from 2016, when 26.5 million 59% from 2012, when 40.7



London ceremony.

It was the lowest audience for the opening ceremony since the 1988 Seoul Games, which attracted 22.7 million TV viewers. It was also lower than the 1992 Barcelona Games, when 21.6 million people tuned in, according to Nielsen data.

The Rio, London, Barcelona and Seoul numbers reflect final ratings data not yet available for the Tokyo Games opener.

The company plans to air an "unprecedented" 7,000 hours of Olympics coverage across its multiple television networks and Peacock. **BEIJING**: The death toll in central China's unprecedented flash floods triggered after the heaviest rainfall in 1,000 years has reached 33 with eight people missing, officials said.

The torrential rain has affected about three million people in Henan province and a total of 376,000 local residents have been relocated to safe places, the provincial emergency management department said. Rainwater has damaged more than 215,200 hectares of crops, causing a direct economic loss of about 1.22 billion yuan (about USD 188.6 million), state-run Xinhua news agency reported.

The massive floods, described by meteorologists as a once-in-a-lifetime event, has resulted in apocalyptic scenes in Henan and its provincial capital Zhengzhou, a metropolis of 12.6 million, with its public avenues and subway tunnels getting submerged

**TOKYO**: A confident smile never leaving her face, Mirabai Chanu ended India's over two-decade long wait for a weightlifting medal at the Olympics, clinching the 49kg category silver medal five years after leaving the same platform in tears following a disastrous debut

With her historic triumph, she ensured that India was second on the medals tally for now, a feat that has never been achieved before by the country

The diminutive iron lady from Manipur lifted a total of 202kg (87kg+115kg) to better Karnam Malleswari's bronze in the 2000 Sydney Olympics. With this, she exorcised the ghosts of the 2016 Games where she had failed to log a single legitimate lift, leaving her shattered.
