AFGHANISTAN'S SIX **PROVINCIAL CAPITALS HAVE BEEN CAPTURED IN THE PAST 24 HOURS BY THE TALIBAN PUSHING THE NUMBER OF PROVINCES OVERRUN BY THE TERRORISTS TO 18**

NEW DELHI: The Taliban have captured over half of the 34 provincial capitals, some of them after surrenders by local governors, even as India along with some other nations are making a last-ditch attempt to mount intense international pressure on the Taliban through the UN Security Council.

Many major cities of Afghanistan in the south, west and east have fallen to the Taliban which has formed a virtual ring around Kabul. Many major cities—Kandahar, Herat, Lashkar Gah, Zabul, Nimroz, Farah, Kunduz and Ghazni-have fallen to the Taliban.

Apart from a clutch of smaller towns, only the National Capital, Jalalabad and Mazar-i-Sharif are the other major population centres that remain to be taken. In the latest surrender, the Capitals of Goh and Uruzgan provinces were abandoned by local officials and security forces. Air travel becomes costlier



NEW DELHI: Domestic air travel is set to become costlier as the Civil Aviation Ministry has raised the lower as well as upper caps on fares by 9.83 to 12.82 percent, according to an official order.

India had imposed lower and upper limits on airfares based on flight duration when services were resumed on May 25, 2020, after a two-month lockdown due to coronavirus.

The lower caps were imposed to help the airlines that have been struggling financially due to coronavirus-related travel restrictions. The upper caps were imposed so that passengers are not charged huge amounts when the demand for seats is high.

In an order dated August 12, 2021, the ministry increased the lower limit for flights under 40 minutes of duration from Rs 2,600 to Rs 2,900 - an increase of 11.53 per cent. The upper cap for flights under 40 minutes of duration was increased by 12.82 per cent to Rs 8.800.

Similarly, flights with duration between 40-60 minutes have a lower limit of Rs 3,700 instead of Rs 3,300 now, the order said. The upper cap on these flights was increased by ration between 60-90 minutes have a lower limit of Rs 4,500 an increase of 12.5 per cent. The upper cap on these flights was increased by 12.82 per cent to Rs 13,200 on Thursday. Now, domestic flights of duration between 90-120, 120-150, 150-180 and 180-210 minutes have lower caps of Rs Rs 5,300, Rs 6,700, Rs 8,300 and Rs 9,800, respectively, as per the ministry's order.

Till date, domestic flights of duration between 90-120. 120-150, 150-180 and 180-210 minutes had the lower limits of Rs 4,700, Rs 6,100, Rs 7,400 and Rs 8,700, respectively. The lower cap on flights between 120-150 minutes duration was increased by 9.83 per cent to Rs 6,700, as per the new order. On Thursday, the upper caps on domestic flights of duration between 90-120, 120-150, 150-180 and 180-210 minutes were increased by 12.3 per cent, 12.42 per cent, 12.74 per cent and 12.39 per cent, respectively, as per the order.

75th Independence Day: Govt plans to honour 'unsung' freedom fighters



NEW DELHI: The government has drawn up a list of 146 names and planned 75 regional, six national and two international seminars under the banner of "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav", the campaign to mark 75 years of Independence.

The names have been compiled separatelyby government departments and the Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR), an autonomous body under the Union education ministry.

But some historians have criticised the presence of wellknown figures such as Subhas Chandra Bose, Birsa Munda and Tantiya Tope, and called

Jana Sangh ideologue Nanaji Deshmukh and the Hindu Mahasabha in the list compiled by government departments. "When Prime Minister Narendra Modi in March flagged of the 75-week long programme Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav to commemorate 75 years of India's independence, he referred to a shlok (verse) of Yajurveda. Through that he (PM) conveyed that in the last seven decades we have missed some opportunities to celebrate those who did not get any acknowledgment yet for their role in India's freedom struggle. So, ICHR

has planned a three-tier

programme to celebrate the lives of our unsung heroes, said ICHR director (research and administration) Om Jee Upadhayay. The 146 names have been

classified by state of origin, and also include figures from smaller tribes and castes. In the list are Gandhians such as Ghelubhai Naik, agricultural economist Mohanlal Lallubhai Dantwala, former Jana Sangh idelogue Nanaji Deshmukh, and communist leader Ravi Narayan Reddy. The list of also includes

several tribal leaders, including Laxman Nayak from Odisha, Telanga Kharia from Jharkhand and Komaram Bheem from Telangana.

The list of little-known groups includes Hindu Mahasabha, Andhra Pradesh Library Association, Karnataka Sahitya Parishad, and Bengal's Anusheelan Samiti, among others.

The government also drew up lists of lesser-known events and literature.

The first list included the Surat salt agitation (1840s), war against the company raj, also known as the sepoy mutiny, (1857-58), Bundelkhand resistance (1808), and Rangpur peasant uprising (1783), among others. AGENCIES

CHANDIGARH: A tiffin carrying an IED explosive was found at Daleke village of Amritsar on August 8 evening

This was stated by Punjab DGP Dinkar Gupta. He said it could have been delivered via a drone from Pakistan. Five hand grenades were also found in a bag that contained the tiffin box.

The DGP said that on the intervening night of August 7 and 8, drones were heard in the area. Then the police got an input that a bag was found abandoned in suspicious circumstances. Upon opening it, the police found seven pouches in the bag that contained plastic tiffin, five hand grenades and 100 cartridges. An explosive substance weighing 2 kg, a switch and a remote control device were also found.

Middukhera murder: Slain Faridkot Cong leader's kin reject cops' theory

FARIDKOT: While the police are searching for Vinay Deora of Kotkapura, booked in eight criminal cases, as a suspect in the murder case of Youth Akali leader Vicky Middukhera, some others have joined the "war" of allegations and counter-allegations.

Countering the police theory that Middukhera was killed as he was involved in the murder of Gurlal Singh Pehalwan, Youth Congress Faridkot president, Sukhchain Singh, Pehalwan's father, today accused cops of misleading the investigation.

"There was no rivalry between my son Pehalwan and Middukhera. They were very close to each other. Projecting them as 'rivals', the police are trying to give the wrong impression and mislead the investigation in both cases, he said.

Pehalwan was killed in Faridkot on February 17. The



murder was orchestrated by a Canada-based gangster and his associate and jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi. Middukhera was accused of having had his closeness with Bishnoi group. Two days ago, a police team had reached the house of Vinay Deora but found it locked.

Sources in the police said Vinay was one of the suspects in Middukhera's murder as

The top court was hearing a plea against the July 2011 order of a division bench of the high court which had dismissed a petition against its single judge order. The single judge had said it was not possible for the retired officer to return to his own state due to which the order of eviction shall be kept in abeyance. The high court had also said the authorities were at liberty to provide alternative accommodation to him on nominal licence fee in Faridabad. The officer had earlier given representation to the concerned authority to allow him to retain the government accommodation and he was allowed to retain the house for

India's inflation outlook isn't benign as it may seem

ow would covid, which has driven commodity and oil prices lower and deeply affected the labour market, affect inflation? One would expect inflation to be well within limits, if not actually slip into the deflationary zone. Yet, India's inflation numbers for June suggest that it has breached the upper tolerance limit of 6% set out by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). The reported 6.09% headline inflation is driven by high yearon-year protein inflation, especially meat and fish at 16.22% and pulses at 16.68%, resulting in a food inflation of 7.29%. In June 2020, the prices of pan, tobacco and intoxicants were up 9.7%, and personal care and effects, 12.43%, compared to the same period the previous year. However, such inflation data appears to present a completely different picture if we study the monthly change in the consumer price index (CPI) over the six-month period of January to June 2020. During this period, food and beverages witnessed a -0.26% inflation rate, with vegetables leading the downward trend at -22.18%. Four items have been above the 6% mark, including meat and fish (12.54%), pulses and products (6.62%), pan, tobacco and intoxicants (6.91%), and personal care and effects (6.11%). Overall CPI headline inflation was just 0.93%. Has the decline in demand imposed by the lockdown over much of the past six-month period resulted in the fall of inflation below the 2% mark, even as the year-on-year number suggests high inflation? How does one make sense of these differing numbers and what does the future hold for us? Going by a recent study of the impact of covid-19 on inflation risks in 43 countries, including 31 emerging market economies (EMEs), it appears that India's experience of higher inflation amid covid is actually representative of that of most EMEs. It identifies falling output, oil prices, financial conditions and exchange rates as the variables most likely to impact inflation risks.

Foreign militants in Taliban ranks playing key roles in gaining control

lthough the Taliban has been denying the presence of fighters from different foreign militant groups, the monitoring group of the UN has estimated about 8.000-10.000 militants mainly from Central Asia, the north Caucasus region of the Russian Federation and Xinjiang Uyghur region of China. As far as terrorists from Pakistan are concerned, the number could be around 10,000 because thousands of militants from Pakistani based terror organisations like Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM), Taliban Pakistan have heavily embedded with the Taliban.

According to UN reports, most of the fighters in Taliban ranks were asked to wear masks to hide their identities. Afghan intelligence sources have reported that they have seen foreign fighters in the ranks of the Taliban descending on new cruisers. Rahmatullah Nabil, Former Director of National Directorate of Security (NDS) shared a few pictures of these foreign militants. "Taliban have taken territories in Northern #AFG specifically Badakhshan with the help of Al-Qaeda & ETIM fighters. Qari Faseehuddin has the support of foreign elements. Jaish ul Nasr brigade of Al-Qaeda & others are fully active. Haii Furqan is leading ETIM in the North, he said in a series of posts. "Remnants of IMU aligned with Taliban commanded by the son of Tahir Yaldshev are actively engaged in battle. ETIM was also instrumental in the first fall of Kunduz in 2015. Taliban rely on advisory & training role of foreign elements. The supplies are through Shah Salim pass. Haji Furqan is of the ETIM or commonly known as TIP,"



Nabil said.

The rapid and lightning advancement of the Taliban in the last seven days is due to active support of the Pakistani army and ISI and these foreign militant groups, mainly with the support of Al-Qaida and allied groups, including the East Turkestan Islamic Movement (ETIM), a Uyghur Muslim rebel group; Tehreek-e Taliban Pakistan (TTP); and Central Asian militant outfits such as the Islamic Movement of Uzbekistan (IMU) and Jamaat Ansarullah, militants outfit also known as the Tajik Taliban. Despite repeated denial by the Taliban that they don't have any foreigners in their rank, an UN Security Council report on July 21 noted

that, "the Eastern Turkistan Islamic Movement (ETIM) consists of several hundred members, located primarily in Badakhshan and neighbouring Afghan provinces. A number of Member States identify this group as the Turkistan Islamic Party, which is a widely accepted alias of ETIM. Many Member States assess that it seeks to establish a Uighur state in Xinjiang, China, and towards that goal, facilitates the movement of fighters from Afghanistan to China"

The Taliban and Al-Qaeda remain closely aligned and show no indication of breaking ties," the report says. This nexus continues despite the US-Taliban deal signed in 2020, which called for severing ties with the group. Officials in Kabul told Nikkie Asia that the alliance of transnational militants has helped the Taliban cement their territorial gains. "Highly trained members of Al-Qaeda or its allied groups embed with Taliban units to act as military advisers in key operations, and train them in planting explosives and other types of makeshift mines." Senior Afghan officials claimed that ETIM fighters, led by their commander, Haji Furqan, working with Jamaat Ansarullah, have helped the Taliban seize territory in northern Afghanistan.

Last month, The Taliban recently assigned Tajik leaders from Jamaat-e-Ansarullah to monitor Afghanistan's northern border with Tajikistan. In the last 24 hours social media platforms are filled with horrifying videos of the Taliban hanging people to death. Afghans have been pleading and begging to the US, UN for help. While the US has "stopped" worrying about Afghanistan, the UN chief is saying, "following escalation in fighting ï¿1/2 with deep concern,". The Secretary General Antïnio Guterres expressed hope that discussions between the Government of Afghanistan, Taliban and regional and international envoys underway in Doha "will restore the pathway to a negotiated settlement of the conflict", underscoring that the UN "stands ready to contribute to such a settlement".

The world leaders are apprehensive about the bleak future of 35 million Afghans but they have left them to fight on their own.

e adulation and financial generosity that is being rightly bestowed on our very first Olympic gold-medallist in athletics, the javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra, is wonderful. He deserves every bit of it for making every Indian proud. However, all the other Indian Olympians have also worked as hard to qualify and participate. One hopes that the ones without a medal to showcase take their failure well and without any future mental repercussions. This is where sports administrators and coaches play a major role in keeping them going.

Mental issues relating to sportspersons uas become an essential top In the earlier days, if one could not stand up to the pressures and failed to perform, one was typed as a person with a weak temperament and one who did not have the strength to compete. Sports is being inundated with a regular flow of superstars succumbing to pressure which eventually leads to mental illness. Simone Biles, the famous gymnast from USA, was one such victim at the Olympics in Tokyo, and the world's leading cricket allrounder, Ben Stokes of England, was another. He opted out of playing an important Test series against India and has still not given any confirmation of his return. These are just two examples. One wonders whether in the past, sportsmen and sportswomen faced similar mental issues but were scared to reveal it. The very concept of playing a game and partaking in a sport was to teach and familiarise youngsters to integrate and form a bond with one another, create teamwork



faced with pressures galore. "The mental trauma being faced by leading sports personalities now is very worrying, said Dr. Roma Kumar, the acclaimed clinical psychologist from emotionally.in.

The pressure to perform can cause fear, excessive stimulus as to what to do or what not to do and confusion in one's mind. This, she says, leads to stress, anxiety, negative thoughts that effect the basic processes of a sportsperson. This, therefore, also leads to low concentration and reduced coordination of movements hampering their normal performances.

It has become imperative that a serious thought be given to tackle mental issues of a sportsperson right from school to the International level Sachin Tendulkar. Indian sport, has also revealed recently the pressure that he went through mentally. So did Virat Kohli earlier. One wonders as to what must be going through in the minds of thousands of upcoming sportsmen aspiring to follow in their footsteps. To read about their international sports heroes struggle through such problems may make some of them worried about pursuing their dream. This is a time of plenty of choices and options for individuals. Sports coaches at all levels need to be trained, qualified and educated to assess the mental condition of their students. Individual sports is an area that puts even more pressure on a sportsperson. Therefore, it has become important to monitor a sportsperson on a regular basis about all aspects of their health -- physical, emotional and mental. This, one hopes, will reduce the possibility of deterioration in mental health which was never encountered so much before.

Narendra Modi might have had the political genius of exploiting the growing consensus for the "re-branding" of India, the roots of this process were laid in the India Shining campaign under the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government. The last bit is ironical, as most commentators see the India Shining campaign as a liability for the BJP, which created a huge backlash ultimately leading to a shock defeat of the BJP in the 2004 elections.

"The spirit of India Shining, then, embodied a new subjectivity constitutive of the self-centered individuals who had seceded from the collective. This possibility appealed to the newly prosperous middle class and legitimized that appeal in the public discourse...What appeared to be a

failure in the aftermath of the 2004 electoral defeat was, in fact, a decisive turn towards a broad consensus in favour of economic reforms", Kaur writes.

Moreover, Kaur also argues that the growing legitimacy for an exclusivist Hindu image of a "New India" is in keeping with the brand building process rather than inimical to it, as is believed by many commentators. In a global marketplace (Davos) where each country is trying to out-compete the other to woo capital, it is precisely the mix of an ancient Hindu culture with the modern-day capitalist appeal that defines India. "The uncommon difference, the exclusive identity not shared with others is the prime ingredient on which a successful brand is built... This also means that in order to market the exclusive inner self, the brand needs to evict the other - the Muslims, the poor, the Dalits - from the image frame, to seek the uncommon in what had once been a common cultural existence", the book says.

Apple challenges patent troll targeting **Maps navigation: Report**

SAN FRANSISCO: Apple in a counter-complaint filed in California is seeking to nullify a new assertion from patent holdings firm Traxcell, which is suing the tech giant in Texas for alleged infringement of intellectual property covering navigation systems, the media reported.

Traxcell, a non-practicing entity, sued Apple in January on claims that the company's Maps product infringes on US Patent Nos. 9,918,196 and 9,549,388.

The IP covers locating and providing directional assistance to devices on a mobile network and hardware that facilitates such capabilities, reports AppleInsider. It appears, however, that Traxcell is attempting to slip in claims from a third, heretofore unmentioned invention in US Patent No. 10,820,147 for a "Mobile wireless device providing off-line and on-line geographic navigation information".

As explained by Apple in a complaint filed with the US District Court for the Northern District of California, Traxcell served the iPhone maker with its preliminary infringement

contentions as related to the lawsuit in Texas. Despite not asserting the 147 patent in its original filing, the NPE included attached claims in the document and in July said it intends to assert the IP against Apple, the report said.

On Wednesday, Traxcell sent Apple a draft complaint set for filing in the Western District of Texas. Apple is looking to win a declaratory judgment that it does not infringe on the '147 property'. "This Court should not allow the threat of a future lawsuit and uncertainty surrounding Traxcell's allegations to harm and cause unpredictability to Apple's business, Apple asserts.

Apple lists several reasons why Maps does not infringe on the '147 patent, mostly leaning on the fact that it does not own or operate the cellular network through which its devices access mapping tools. That stipulation is detailed in multiple claims of the '147 property,

Apple argues. As for jurisdiction, Apple said California is the appropriate venue given Traxcell continues to communicate with the company's offices in the state, the report said.

DoT engages with banks to find solution to stress in telecom sector

NEW DELHI: The Department of Telecommunications (DoT) has initiated discussions with banks to address financial stress in the telecom sector, particularly Vodafone Idea Ltd (VIL) that urgently requires fund infusion to stay afloat.

There was a meeting of DOT officials and senior bankers on the issue of Vodafone, sources said, adding that banks have been asked to look for a solution within the prudential guidelines.

According to sources, senior officials from the country's biggest lenders State Bank of India and Bank of Baroda were also present among others in the meeting. More such meetings are expected to take place in the coming days, they said.

Meanwhile, the Finance Ministry has asked public sector banks to collate and submit data related to their debt exposure to

the telecom sector in general and VIL in particular.

Lenders, both public and private, stare at a loss of Rs 1.8 lakh crore in case VIL collapses. A large part of the loans to the lender is in the form of guarantees with public sector

banks having a lion's share of the debt. Among the private sector lenders, Yes Bank and IDFC First Bank may be impacted the most. As a precursor, some private lenders with a funded exposure have already started making provisions.

For example, IDFC First Bank has marked the account of VIL as stressed and has made provisions of 15 per cent (Rs 487 crore) against the outstanding exposure of Rs 3,244 crore (funded and non-funded).

This provision translates to 24 per cent of the funded exposure on this account. The said

Tencent, SoftBank-led funding pushes Argentina's Uala to US\$2.45b valuation

BENGALURU: China's online giant, Tencent Holdings, and SoftBank Group Corp's Latin America-focused fund led an investment round for Argentine firm Uala which took its valuation to US\$2.45 billion, the fintech company said on Friday. The US\$350 million investment comes several months after Uala announced its expansion into Mexico, as it tries to capitalise on the interest around the fastgrowing fintech industry in Latin America.Launched in October 2017, Uala offers a Mastercard branded prepaid card and an app that allows users access to a number of financial services including sending and receiving money, online shopping, withdrawing cash at ATMs and requesting loans. The digital banking startup, founded by Harvard University graduate Pierpaolo Barb has a head of 1,000, and aims to raise it to 1,500 by the end of the year. In an interview in May, Mr Barbieri said Uala could eventually expand into Peru, Paraguay, Colombia, Chile, US and Europe. In June, the company said it had issued more than three million Mastercard branded prepaid cards in Argentina. Uala is also trying to expand through the acquisition of rival Wilobank, the first fully digital bank approved by the central bank in Argentina. Income Tax Dept to refund excess interest, Bank of Baroda reports net profit late fee paid while filing FY21 ITR

NEW DELHI: The Income Tax Department said it will refund the excess interest and late fee paid by taxpayers due to software error while filing ITR for 2020-21.

The last date for filing ITR for last financial year has been extended till September 30, 2021, from July 31 to give taxpayers compliance relief during the pandemic.

However, some taxpayers complained that interest and late fee was charged while filing income tax return (ITR) after July 31, 2021.

The department in a tweet said the ITR software was rectified on August 1 itself to remove the error due to incorrect computation of interest under section 234A and late fee under section 234F of Income Tax Act.

"Taxpayers have been advised to use the latest version of the ITR preparation software or file online. If, by any chance, someone has already submitted the ITR with such incorrect interest or late fee, the same will be correctly calculated while processing at CPC-ITR and the excess amount paid, if any, will be refunded in the normal course

Lower lending rates has reduced burden on households: Shaktikanta Das

New Delhi: The significant reduction in lending rate on personal housing and commercial real estate sector augurs well for the economy, as these segments are also employment-intensive, **RBI** Governor Shaktikanta Das said. While announcing the third bi-monthly monetary policy review, he said, the interest rate transmission has improved. 'The efficacy of RBI's

monetary policy measures and actions is reflected in the significant improvement in transmission dur-

ing the current easing cycle. The reduction in repo rate by 250 basis points since February 2019, has resulted in a cumulative decline by 217 basis points in the weighted average lending rate (WALR) on fresh rupee loans," he said. The Governor also said

that the reduction on lending rate has reduced the burden on households. "Domestic borrowing costs have eased, including interest rates on market instruments like corporate bonds, debentures, CPs, CDs and T-bills. "In the credit market, transmis-



sion to lending rates has been stronger for MSMEs, housing and large industries. The low interest rate regime has also helped the household sector reduce the burden of loan servicing," he said.

The significant reduction in interest rates on personal housing loans and loans to the commercial real estate sector augurs well for the economy, as these sectors have extensive backward and forward linkages and are employment intensive, he added.

With regard to the shift from LIBOR as a benchmark for export credit, the Governor said the transition away from London Interbank Offered Rate (LIBOR) is a significant event that poses certain challenges for banks and the financial system. The Reserve Bank has been engaging with banks and market bodies to proactively take steps and the central bank has also issued advisories to ensure a smooth transition for regulated entities and financial markets.

In this context, it has been decided to amend the guidelines related to export credit in foreign currency and restructuring of derivative contracts, he said. "Banks will be permitted to extend export credit in foreign currency using any other widely accepted Alternative Reference Rate in the currency concerned.

"Since the change in reference rate from LIBOR is a "force majeure" event, banks are also being advised that change in reference rate from LIBOR/ LIBOR related benchmarks to an Alternative Reference Rate will not be treated as restructuring,' AGENCIES he said.



NEW DELHI: The finance ministry said the economic impact of the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic is likely to be muted and there are visible signs of economic rejuvenation. BSE introduces new surveillance measure to curb volatility in mid, small-cap stocks band framework will remain

NEW DELHI: To curb excessive volatility in mid and small-cap counters, the BSE has introduced a new surveillance measure for certain stocks having a market capitalisation of less than Rs

The new measure, add-on price band framework, will be applicable to companies with a market-capitalisation of less than Rs 1,000 crore and on securities in groups-X, XT, Z, ZP, ZY, and Y, BSE said in a circular.

Under the framework, BSE said "the shortlisted securities, will have 6 monthly, 1 yearly, 2 yearly and 3 yearly price band in place of weekly, monthly, quarterly price band". These add-on price and, therefore, are capable bands will be in addition to the applicable daily price bands of such securities.

The exchange, in a circular on Monday, had said the shortlisted securities will be subjected to additional periodic price limits of weekly, monthly and quarterly. V K Vijayakumar, Chief

Retail inflation likely cooled to 5.78 per cent in July: Poll

NEW DELHI: Retail inflation likely slowed to a threemonth low in July, bringing it back within the central bank's target range, on falling food prices and an easing of supply chain disruptions, a Reuters poll found.

The August 5-9 poll of 48 economists showed consumer price inflation eased to 5.78 per cent last month from 6.26 per cent in June.

If realized, it would be the lowest inflation print since May and within the Reserve Bank of India's tolerance band of 2 to 6 per cent - although well above the mid-point.

Nearly four lakh people newly displaced in Afghanistan by conflict since start of year, says United Nation

UNITED NATIONS: Nearly four lakh people have been newly displaced in Afghanistan since the start of the year, with a huge spike from May, a spokesperson for UN chief Antonio Guterres has said, amid the deteriorating security situation in the war-torn country.

The US has already pulled back most of its forces from Afghanistan and is looking to complete the drawdown by August 31, ending nearly twodecade of its military presence in the country.

Afghanistan has been witnessing a series of terror attacks since the US began withdrawing its troops on May 1. The Taliban insurgents have overrun one-quarter of Afghanistan's provincial capitals.

"Since the start of the year, nearly 390,000 people have been newly displaced by conflict across the country, with a huge spike since May," Spokesman for the Secretary General Guterres, Stephane Dujarric said at the daily press briefing on Wednesday.

He said according to UN humanitarian colleagues, between July 1 and August 5, 2021, the humanitarian community verified that 5,800 internally displaced persons (IDPs) have arrived in Kabul and are seeking safety from the conflict
