Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann had on Thursday said in Jalandhar that "good news" would be announced on April 16. Punjab was already providing free electricity to the farming sector. PM cannot imprison truth, Mevani's arrest undemocratic: Congress



Thursday termed as "undemocratic" and "unconstitutional" the arrest of Gujarat legislator Jignesh Mevani over his tweets with former party chief Rahul Gandhi saying Prime Minister Narendra Modi cannot imprison the truth by trying to "crush" dissent.

"Modi ji, you can try to crush dissent by abusing the state machinery. But you can never imprison the truth." Gandhi said on Twitter, using hashtag '#DaroMat" and "#Satyameva-Jayate". SC sets aside Allahabad HC order granting bail to Ashish Mishra

NEW DELHI: Supreme Court of India on Monday cancelled the bail granted by the Allahabad High Court to Ashish Mishra, son of Union minister Ajay Mishra, in the Lakhimpur Kheri violence case. A special bench of Chief Justice N V Ramana and Justices Surya Kant and Hima Kohli also asked the accused to surrender in a week's time.

The top court on April 4 had reserved its order on a plea of farmers seeking cancellation of bail to Mishra. Earlier, the high court had granted bail to him. On October 3 last year, eight people were killed in Lakhimpur Kheri during violence that erupted when farmers were protesting against Uttar Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya's visit



Four farmers were moved down by an SUV, in which Ashish Mishra was seated, according to the Uttar Pradesh Police FIR. Following the incident, the driver and two BJP workers were allegedly lynched by angry farmers.

A journalist also died in the violence that triggered outrage among opposition parties and farmer groups agitating over the Centre's now-repealed agricultural reform laws. AGENCIES extended support to the strategic

Russia bars Kamala Harris, Mark Zuckerberg MOSCOW: Russia's foreign

ministry has announced that it has barred US Vice Pres dent Kamala Harris, Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg and 27 other prominent Americans from entering the country. In a statement on its website

Thursday, the ministry said that the move came as a response to ever-widening anti-Russian sanctions brought on by the Biden administration. It claimed to be targeting top executives, public intellectuals and journal ists shaping what it referred to as the Russophobic narrative prevailing in US public debate. Alongside Harris and Zuckerberg, the ban includes top defense and justice officials; the CEOs of LinkedIn and Bank of America: high-profile foreign affairs commentators; as well as the editor of the Russia-focused Meduza news website.

India extends duration of USD 400 mn currency swap facility with Sri Lanka

COLOMBO: In an unstinted and multi-faceted support to Sri Lanka which is grappling with its worst-ever economic crisis, India has extended the duration of the USD 400 million currency swap facility which had been concluded with the island nation in January.

This was the first extension of an international debt instrument to Sri Lanka after the government led by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa on April 12 temporarily suspended debt servicing. The embattled government had announced an orderly default until the country came to an agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for a possible bailout package. India's unstinted and multi-faceted support to Sri Lanka continued. As ongoing currency support, @RBI extended the duration of the US\$ 400 million currency swap for @CBSL which was concluded in #January this year, the High Commission of India said on Twitter. However, the debt service suspension was not applicable to currency swap arrangements with other central banks. The debt default came as the island nation was grappling with its worst-ever economic crisis compounded by forex shortages and a balance of payments crisis. Sri Lanka had also drawn on Indian credit lines worth USD 1 billion for essential imports and separate ones for the importation of fuel.

The island nation's central bank started borrowing from other central banks and the market through swaps as reserves were lost due to money printed to keep rates down, the Economy Next news service said in a report. Sri Lanka's economists have printed money under various pretexts, delayed market rate rises through various monetary instruments and triggered currency crises for 72 years and blamed them on budget deficits and imports, the **AGENCIES**

Adopt 'nation-first' approach to decision making: PM Modi to civil servants

NEW DELHI: Emphasising a "nation-first" approach to decisionmaking, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday said there cannot be any compromise on the unity and integrity of the country and even decisions at the local level should be made on this touchstone.

Addressing civil servants on the 15th Civil Services Day at Vigyan Bhawan here, he said every decision should be evaluated on the basis of its capacity to strengthen the country's unity and integrity. PM Modi said in the country's democratic set-up, "we should be committed to three goals".

"The first goal is that there should be a change in the life of the common people in the country, their life should be easy and they should also be able to feel this ease. The common people should not have to struggle in their dealings with the government, benefits and services should be available to them without hassle," he said.

Secondly, given the growing stat-



ure and changing profile of India, it is imperative that things should be done in the global context, he said. If we do not follow the activities at the global level, it will be very difficult to ascertain our priorities and focus area. "We need to develop our schemes and governance models keeping this perspective in mind. he added.

Thirdly, Modi said, "Wherever we are in the system, our prime responsibility is the unity and integrity of the country, there cannot be any compromise. Even local

decisions should be measured on this touchstone". Every decision should be evalu-

ated on the basis of its capacity to strengthen the country's unity and integrity, Modi said, adding "nationfirst (approach) should always inform our decisions". The prime minister also underlined the need to update systems and governance models regularly, saying "we cannot deal with the challenges of today with systems of the last century". Referring to 'Amrit Kaal', the

25-year lead-up to the centenary year of independence in 2047, Modi said it cannot just be a "routine" or simply for celebration or praising the journey from the 75th year to the 100th year of independence. "India @100 cannot be routine. This $2\bar{5}$ -year period should be seen as one unit and we should have a vision from now onwards itself. This celebration should be a watershed," he said. India tops milk production in world, turnover higher than wheat & rice output: PM Modi



BANASKANTHA: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said India produces milk worth Rs 8.5 lakh crore annually, more than the turnover of wheat and rice, with small farmers being the biggest beneficiaries of the dairy

in Delhi's Jahangirpuri, say cops

NEW DELHI: The situation in Jahangirpuri of northwest Delhi is heading towards normalcy amid heavy deployment of security personnel in the violence-hit area, police said on Tuesday.

Some of the shops, mainly of grocery, in the streets have opened and the movement of people is becoming normal, they said. Over 500 police personnel and six companies of additional force have been deployed in the area round the clock.

Besides, a total of 80 tear gas gun parties and water cannons have been deployed and drones are also being used in sensitive areas for rooftop surveillance, police said. Clashes broke out between two communities during a Hanuman Jayanti procession in Jahangirpuri on Saturday, in which eight police personnel and a local resident were injured.

According to police, incidents of stone-pelting and arson were reported during the clashes and some vehicles were also torched. Meanwhile, the road in front of the mosque where the proces-

sion was allegedly attacked has been shut and the entire area cordoned off with barricades by police. Police have also pitched ents near the barricades.

All senior officers have been instructed to be at the spot to avoid any untoward incident. On Monday, a peace march was organised by police, along with the members of Aman Committee, in the Jahangirpuri area. The committee appealed to the people of the area to maintain peace and harmony, not to spread and trust rumours or misinformation and to report

said. On Monday, Delhi Police Commissioner RakeshAsthana said that the presence of police personnel in sensitive areas, including Jahangirpuri, will continue till the situation becomes normal. Speaking to a television news channel, Asthana had said, "We have deployed adequate force not only in Jahangirpuri, but in other areas also. We will use technology for surveillance and are monitoring the situation to make sure that no un-

Man kills family, commits suicide in Ghazipur

A 35-year-old man allegedly committed suicide after killing his wife and two children in Sadat Bazar area under the Jakhania police station limits here following a suspected family dispute, police said on Monday.

ShivdasSonekar, who was preparing for competitive examinations, allegedly killed his wife Reena (30), son Aarav (5) and daughter Sejal (3) by smothering them with a pillow on Sunday night, police subinspector MahendraYadav said.

Sonekar later committed suicide by hanging himself from the ceiling of his room, Yadav said. Sonekar used to live in a joint family and the bodies were found from their room in the morning, the police officer said, adding that family discord is

Delhi police chief visits cop injured in Jahangirpuri violence, assurés him all support



Delhi Police chief Rakesh-Asthana visited sub-inspector MedaLal, who was injured during the communal violence in Jahangirpuri, and assured him the department would provide him all support, officials said Monday.

The police commissioner enquired about Lal's wellbeing and told him that the entire force is proud of his courage and sense of duty which helped in quickly controlling the unruly mob, according to a statement.

"He assured him of all possible support and assistance from the department during these testing times," it said.

Lal received a gunshot injury during clashes that broke out between two communities when a Hanuman Jayanti procession was passing through localities in northwest Delhi's Jahangirpuri on Saturday.

Seven other police personnel and a local resident were injured in the violence.

The Delhi Police has arrested 21 people, including the person who allegedly fired a bullet that hit the sub-inspector, and the "main conspirators" behind the clashes.

Two juveniles have also been apprehended in connection with the incident.

The Delhi High Court on Wednesday refused to interfere with the Centre's decision on the allotment of a graveyard allegedly owned by the Delhi Waqf Board to the Indo Tibetan Border Police (ITBP), saying that it is not uncommon for graves to be shifted when they cause any obstruction in development activity.

Chief Justice VipinSanghi said it was not inclined to interfere with the single judge's order declining to grant the interim relief of stay to the Delhi Waqf Board in relation to the construction activity on the plot and noted that the rights of the Board have been protected.

On March 9, the single judge, while dealing with the Board's petition against the Centre's move to re-consider the de-listing of 123 Waqf properties, had opined that there was no ground to grant a stay and observed that the property was allotted to the ITBP sometime in 2017 and in case the Board succeeds in moved the high court earlier had contended.

an Interlocutory Application in Supreme Court for providing Aadhaar cards to National Register of Citizens (NRC) applicants whose biometrics have been locked in the updating process of the citizenship document.

The decision was taken at a Cabinet meeting, chaired by Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, here on Wednesday evening.

Later Sarma tweeted: Approval to filing of an IA (Interlocutory Application) in the Supreme Court for relaxation of Para 9 of the SOP and for providing Aadhaar cards to NRC applicants whose Aadhaar cards are kept on hold because of existing SOP.

This, he said, will benefit a large section of people below poverty line, students, pensioners, job seekers who do not have Aadhaar cards.

Over 27 lakh NRC applicants in the state had submitted their biometrics during the claims and objections phase for updating the state's NRC. Of these 19 lakh names were not included in the final draft of the NRC published on August 31, 2019, and these people are now

According to the draft policy, vehicles with swappable batteries will be sold without a battery, providing the benefit of lower purchase costs to potential EV owners. It said any individual or entity is free to set up a battery swapping station at any location, provided that the specified technical, safety and performance



standards are adhered to. Considering the constraint of

space in urban areas for setting up charging stations at scale, Finance Minister in her Budget speech 2022-23 had announced that the Centre would be introducing a battery swapping policy and interoperability standards in order to improve efficiency in the EV ecosystem.

According to an official statement, in this regard, Niti Aayog held an inter-ministerial discus-

sion to formulate a robust and comprehensive battery swapping policy framework in February 2022. It also held an extensive

Congress in its existential crisis is not good for democracy

ongress has been consistently decimated after every election . When the BJP under Narendra Modi and Amit Shah swept power at the Centre in 2014, the Congress ruled in nine states. Now with the loss of Punjab, the number of States where it is in power of its own is down to just two. In the last eight years since 2014, the Congress has won just five of the 45 elections held in the country.

The most ironic is its fading in Punjab where it looked all set to win, less than a year ago. Call it infighting or mishandling by party high command, it lost badly and its Chief Ministerial candidate Charanjit Singh Channi who contested from two seats, lost from both.

The PCC President Navjot Singh Sidhu too lost. Similarly in Uttarakhand, it was hopeful for a victory but the party lost with its former Chief Minister, Harish Rawat losing elections from Lalkuan. From Uttar Pradesh where party leader, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra contested on the slogan of "ladki hun, lad sakti hun" and crisscrossed the entire state and from Goa and Manipur there was no consolation for the party. It is becoming increasingly clear that Nehrus and Gandhis seem to have entirely lost to charisma to pull in votes but just targets for dynastic whipping.

The rout of the Congress does not bode good for the party and for a healthy democracy which needs a strong opposition because the recent elections were fought on the premise of a "semi-final" for the 2024 parliamentary election. The results of the latest round of assembly elections show that the BJP is well placed to win again in 2024. There now remains no doubt that come 2024 and it would pit the BJP not against the Congress but a coalition of regional parties, may be sans Congress. The Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh elections, later this year, the Karnataka election in mid-2023, and polls in in Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Mizoram in November and Rajasthan in December the same year, could well decide the party's future. Its hope of wresting back Himachal Pradesh from the BJP later this year in the absence of six time chief minister, Virbhadra Singh, who died last year, stands little slim chance. In the two states it still rules, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh which go to the polls next year, there is huge infighting. It is a grim reminder for the grand old party to reform or else by the 2024 General Election, it may be in power in no state at all. Democracy needs a strong Opposition to hold the government to account. Indeed regional parties are gearing up and so is Aam Aadmi Party but a motley collection of parties each eying the Prime Ministership, does not suit the best interests of a vibrant democracy. Less than a decade old AAP is the only political party other than the BJP and the Congress that is in power in two States and it has to be an important constituent of the political grouping that comes together to take on the BJP in 2024.

It is time for the Congress to act fast to check the existential crisis and set its house in order by ending adhocism. For instance, after Rahul Gandhi's resignation as president in 2019, Sonia Gandhi has been interim president and she still continues as such. Notwithstanding the complete rout in five states, the Congress still has around over 692 MLAs in the country, compared to BJP's 1,373 which confirms that everything is still not lost but Congress has to resurrect in the best interests

The Minister was replying to a question from Trinamool Congress MP Manas Ranjan Bhunia. He also said that Tamil Nadu occupied the second spot with 22.17 crore work days and spent Rs 5,981.75 crore. Andhra Pradesh was third with 18.16 crore work days, and funds worth Rs 5054.17 crore.

Bhunia pointed out that the performance of BJP-ruled States such as Goa, Gujarat and Uttar Pradesh was "not impressive." Goa is ranked at the bottom of the list with 94,000 work

Government to take call on LIC IPO timing this week

NEW DELHI: Union government is likely to take a call on the timing of LIC initial public offering within this week, a senior official said.

The sale of 5 % stake or 31.6 crore shares in the country's largest insurer was originally planned for in March, but was postponed in view of the geopolitical tension.

The government has time till May 12 to launch the IPO without filing fresh papers with markets regulator SEBI.

The official said it would be a tough call to decide whether to go ahead with the retail and domestic investor demand or to wait for geopolitical tension to ease and FIIs to return to



market. A decision on timing the IPO would be taken this week, LIC's embedded value, which is a measure of the consolidated shareholders' value in an insurance company, was pegged at

about Rs 5.4 lakh crore as of September 30, 2021, by international actuarial firm Milliman Advisors. There were estimates made in certain quarters that LIC's market valuation would

be about 2-3 times its embedded value. The official said that for a company of the magnitude of LIC, such high multiplier to embedded value may not be correct. The official further said the IPO price would have to be fixed in a way that on the listing day there is an upside to the stock and investors get

LIC is already a matured company and has seen business growth since its inception. The market valuation would have to be done keeping in mind its growth potential here-on, the official added. If the IPO is not launched now then it would have to be deferred till August or September since fresh papers

with updated quarterly results and valuations would have to be filed with SEBI.

If the government decides to go ahead with the initial public offering by May 12 then the life insurer will have to file the red herring prospectus with SEBI by next week

The official also said that under the present market condition the government is unlikely to offload more than 5 per cent stake in the life insurance behemoth. When we are already facing headwinds, we cannot test waters with higher IPO size. The finance ministry did not respond to the e-mail seeking comments

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday made a strong case for regulating cryprocurrencies at a global level to mitigate the risk of money laundering and terror funding.

Participating at a high-level panel discussion organised by the IMF, the Finance Minister said that as long as the nongovernmental activity of the crypto assets was through unhosted wallets, the regulation was going to be very difficult.

However, she said, cross border payments between countries will become very effective through Central Bank-driven digital currencies.

The risk which worries me more on the non-governmental domain is essentially you're looking at unhosted wallets across the borders, across the globe... So, regulation cannot be done by a single country within its terrain through some effective method and for doing it across the borders, technology doesn't have a solution which will be acceptable to various sovereigns at the same time applicable within each of the territory," she said.

World Bank President David Malpass has welcomed India's move to begin selling oil from its stockpiles, asserting that the world needs to take important steps to address the current set

Speaking on the sidelines of the annual Spring meeting of the IMF and the World Bank held here, Malpass told reporters that allowing more trade and opening of markets were very important" steps.

"I was intrigued to see and welcomed India's moves yesterday and today to begin to sell from its stockpiles. I think market opening steps by many of add a lot to the global supplies and alleviate some of the impact on the poor countries, he said on Wednesday.

"And they themselves need to build up their systems to produce more. One of the drawbacks is that, in recent years, there's been a shortage of investment, especially in the developing world. We need to

find policies going forward that will add investment, he said. One of the solutions for

the world is to recognise that markets are forward he said.

If you announced policies today, it has an immediate impact on where people begin to invest. I think the world can take steps to say that the capital allocation of global resources can be improved. What we have now is a capital allocation that leads to deep inequality, Malpass said.

The inequality is growing

worse. That means more countries falling further behind, not making advancements, and not having the investment that is needed. Some of that owes to the macro policies of the advanced economies. They've been borrowing very heavily from the global capital markets, which leaves less for other countries. That can be

improved, he asserted. As central banks raise interest rates, it's important for them to use all their tools and not be undercut by the government demand stimulus, Malpass said, adding that the central banks can use tools that add to supply and that allow capital allocation to be improved.

"I think that's going to be vital. They've been talking about, not just interest rates, but also shrinking the balance sheet, which I think would have a stimulative effect on the global investment climate, because it would occupy less of the capital at the central banks from the current situation. Govt of India bound by assurance given to Portugal on Abu Salem: Union home secy

The Government is bound by the assurance given by the then deputy Prime Minister L K Advani to the Portugal government that the maximum sentence handed out to gangster Abu Salem will not exceed 25 years, the Union home secretary has told the Supreme Court.

In an affidavit filed in pursuance to the apex court's April 12 order, Union Home Secretary Ajay Kumar Bhalla said the assurance would come into effect once the period of 25 years expires on November 10, 2030.

"It is respectfully submitted that the Government of India is bound by the assurance dated December 17, 2002. The period of 25 years, which is mentioned in the assurance, will be abided by the Union of India at an appropriate time subject to the remedies which may be available, the affidavit said. The home secretary submitted that Salem's contention about non-compliance of assurance is premature and based on hypothetical surmises and

He also stated in his affidavit that judiciary is independent in deciding all cases including criminal cases in accordance with the applicable laws without in any way being bound by any position taken by the executive. The matter is listed for hearing before a bench of Justices S K Kaul and M M Sundresh on April 21. The top court had earlier asked the Centre to make its stand clear on the issue.

It had said that the stand on the commitment made by the Union of India would have wide ramifications the next time the

country wants to bring back any fugitive.

The top court had said that it is not satisfied with the affidavit filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) which said that the assurance given by India to Portugal on the maximum sentence during the extradition of Salem, a convict in the 1993 Mumbai serial blast case, is not binding on Indian courts.

On February 2, the top court had sought a response from the Centre on a plea filed by Salem, serving life imprisonment for his role in the 1993 Mumbai that his imprisonment cannot

extend beyond 25 years as per the terms of the extradition treaty between India and Portugal. It had granted four weeks to the Centre to respond on a plea by Salem claiming that the 2017 judgement of TADA court sentencing him to life imprisonment was against the terms of the extradition treaty.

Salem had contended that life imprisonment awarded to Salem is against the assurance given by the Indian government to Portugal from where he was extradited.

His plea said, "Even despite the categorical assurances by the Government of India that the appellant will not be sentenced for more than 25 years which assurances formed part of judicial proceedings right till the Supreme Court of Portugal and upon which the extradition order was passed, there was a complete and gross violation by the TADA Court when it imposed sentences of serial blasts case, contending life imprisonment for certain


