Siddiqui, 38, an awardwinning journalist was killed during an assignment in Afghanistan July last while covering clashes between Afghan troops and the Taliban in Spin Boldak district of Kandahar

This is Siddiqui's second Pulitzer Prize. He received the prestigious award in 2018 as part of the Reuters team for

Among the awardees is San-

na Irshad Mattoo, a Kashmiri girl who has won the award. Sanna holds Masters in Convergent Journalism from the Central University of Kashmir. She has her work published in international media outlets including Al Jazeera, TIME and TRT World. She has also done a fellowship with the prestigious Magnum Founda-

She is the fourth photograher from Jammu ai mir who has won a Pulitzer. In 2020, three photographers from the Union Territory working for the AP won the award.

Santoor maestro Shiv Kumar Sharma dies at 84

Veteran santoor player and music composer Pt Shiv Kumar Sharma died here on Tuesday morning following a heart attack, family sources said. He was 84.

Sharma, one of India's most well known classical musicians, was due to perform in Bhopal next week. He was also suffering from renal ailments.

"He had a severe heart attack at around 9 am... He was active and was to perform in Bhopal next week. He was on regular dialysis but was still was active," the family source

A Padma Vibhushan recipient, Sharma was born in Jammu in 1938 and is believed to be the first musician to

have played Indian classical music on the santoor, a folk instrument from Jam-

mu and Kashmir.

As one half of musician duo Shiv-Hari, he composed music with flute legend Pt Hari Prasad Chaurasia for an array of films such as "Silsila", "Lamhe" and "Chandni".

Terrorists kill policeman in J-K's Pulwama A policeman was shot dead

by terrorists at his residence in Pulwama district of Jammu and Kashmir on Friday. Constable Reyaz Ahmad Thokar was shot at in Gudoora in the district this morning, a police spokes-man said. The injured cop was rushed to the Army's 92



base hospital in the city but succumbed to injuries. This is the second attack by terrorists within 24 hours. A Kashmiri Pandit government employee was shot dead by terrorists inside his office at Chadoora in Budgam district on Thursday.

Only Congress governs for welfare of Polls to 57 Rajya Sabha seats poor, middle class families: Rahul



Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Sunday stepped up his attack on the government over the hike in price of domestic LPG cylinder, and said only his party governs for the welfare of poor and middle class families.

Cooking gas LPG prices were on Saturday hiked by Rs 50 per cylinder, the second increase in rates in just over six weeks national energy rates. Non-subsidised LPG now

costs Rs 999.50 per 14.2-kg cylinder in the national capital, up from Rs 949.50 previously, according to a price notification of state-owned fuel retailers.

In a tweet, Gandhi compared the price of domestic LPG cylinder of about Rs 410 with a subsidy of Rs 827 in 2014 under a Congress-led government to that of over Rs 999 with "zero subsidy" in 2022 under the BJPled Centre. "2 cylinders then for the price of 1 now!" the former Congress chief said.

Punjab Power Minister ensures adequate power supply for paddy plantation





"The States' fiscal position

is fragile like never before and needs urgent remedial measures," said the former finance minister, flanked by some other members of the panel such as Gourav Vallabh and Supriya

Goswamys explore 19th-century Pahari paintings in book

Art historian couple B N Goswamy and Karuna Goswamy have authored an illustrated book on 19th-century Pahari paintings that depict the journey of five pilgrims to the land of Lord Shiva.

"A Sacred Journey: The Kedara Kalpa series of Pahari paintings and the painter Purkhu of Kangra", published by Niyogi Books, features detailed descriptions of the paintings, their subtle nuances and spiritual significance and includes over 170 images of the Kedara Kalpa series of paintings from leading museums and collections around the world.

The present volume of paintings is based on Karuna Goswamy's research and her identification, for the first time, of the little-known ancient Shaivite text Kedara

The authors state that there are long and smaller versions of the Kedara Kalpa text. The long version asserts that Kedara is the foremost among tirthas; visiting Kedara and performing puja there are beneficial for devotees.

In the long version, Shiva narrates past events to Parvati. However, there is a slight gap in the narrative here and one comes upon a small group of five Brahmins who decide to venture on the 'great path'. It is from this point that the shorter version of Kedara Kalpa, as in other copies of the text begins.

B N Goswamy calls the venture a " sthala purana to Kedarnath. A sthala purana is about a place - a pilgrimage; what it entails and what it leads to".

The authors have ascribed it to Pahari painter Purkhu and they appear to be made between 1815 and 1820. The

Cutting fuel taxes to help stabilise macroeconomy

s the ruling BJP marks the eighth anniversary of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government, retail inflation has accelerated close to the 8.3% level last seen in May 2014, when Modi assumed office in the last week of the month. For a government that prided itself on its inflation taming successes in the first five years, a combination of factors including the COVID-19 pandemic, high crude oil prices and now the war in Ukraine have created a perfect storm that sent the Consumer Price Index (CPI)-based inflation racing to a 95-month high of 7.79% in April. Food and fuel were the biggest culprits fanning last month's furious pace of price gains that seem unabating. Food inflation as measured by the Consumer Food Price Index (CFPI) quickened to a 17-month high of 8.38% last month, with rural consumers experiencing it at 8.5%, a pace that was 41 basis points faster than that experienced by their urban counterparts. Ten of the 12 items in the food and beverages basket of the overall CPI registered sequential acceleration as well. Of concern are the prices of cereals and products, which constitute almost a tenth of the CPI and account for the key staples of wheat and rice that are essential for ensuring food security. Inflation in cereals accelerated by more than 100 basis points to 5.96% last month. With inflation now having turned far more broad-based and logging a strident pace in excess of 8% for four of the six sub-groups in the CPI, policymakers have their task cut out. While the RBI must continue to tighten monetary policy in order to protect the vast majority who have no hedge against inflation, the pass-through of high oil costs, reflected in double-digit price gains in the transport and fuel and light categories, leaves the Government with little option but to cut fuel taxes if it is serious about taming inflation so as to ensure overall macroeconomic stability.

GAUTAM I. MENON EXPLORES WHY THERE IS NO GETTING PAST THE PANDEMIC TILL WE CREDIBLY COUNT COVID-19 DEATHS

Covid death count is crucial



World Health Organization (WHO) recently released a report that estimated global deaths from COVID-19 across 2020-2021. It suggested that about 14.9 million deaths could be attributed to the pandemic worldwide during that period, further estimating that about 4.7 million of these deaths were in India alone. For comparison, the official Indian COVID-19 toll for that period is 0.48 million, a number smaller than the WHO number by a factor of about 10.

A number of independent news reports have suggested that there was pressure from the Indian government on the WHO to suppress their estimates. Indeed, once the report appeared, it was immediately criticised by a number of prominent government representatives. A government press release called the report "statistically unsound and scientifically questionable".

India's rejection of the report makes it the only country to do so, out of the 194 member states of the WHO. However, the estimates for India are broadly consistent with estimates from a number of independent groups, all falling in the broad range of 2.2 million to 6 million deaths.

At the core of all such estimates, especially in situations where official numbers might not align with reality, is a quantity called "excess mortality". This compares estimates of the actual death toll with the number of deaths expected in the same year but without the mortality caused by the pandemic, an obvious counterfactual. There are thus two estimates here - an estimate of the actual number of deaths, and the "counterfactual" estimate. The difference between these is the number of excess deaths that we should attribute to the pandemic.

For the counterfactual estimate, one should extrapolate from the number of deaths in previous pre-pandemic years, but with additional statistical corrections that represent how the population changes from year to year. Somewhat subtly, one must account for the indirect impacts of the disease as well. These should include the



occur during periods of a lockdown, for example. Accounting for those who died simply because medical treatment was hard to access in the pandemic period, even if from non-COVID-19 causes, is also important.

For the actual death toll, one must rely on official data, if it is believed to be accurate, or estimate the number by other means, as the WHO did for India.

The government's issue with the WHO report involves both these separate estimates. It argues that the model used by the WHO to estimate deaths in the counterfactual scenario is flawed. Further, it suggests that the way in which the actual deaths are calculated - from a combination of official reports, numbers from external non-government vebsites and news reports — is questionable.

The official response from the government is short on specifics. It provides no alternative routes to these estimations, apart from insisting that the official record should

In its response to the WHO, the Indian government has argued that its own Civil Registration System, or CRS, is of sufficiently high quality that the numbers it provides can be used in place of model estimates. Data from the CRS for 2020 are now available, but were released just two days before the WHO released its own report and could not therefore be incorporated in its estimates. The CRS numbers point to an increase of 470,000 deaths in 2020 over 2019, although these are very unlikely to all be COVID-19 deaths. The WHO's estimates for deaths from the pandemic in 2020 yield numbers that are larger by a factor of about 2.

The available CRS data do not estimate how many deaths actually took place in India in 2020, but only those that were registered, a number known to have a distinct urbanrural divide. Because the CRS only counts registered deaths, the quality of its numbers can only be understood by comparison to other methods. India's Sample Registration System tracks a set of representative households to estimate deaths in a given year. This could have been a useful point of comparison. However, in 2020, the SRS did not take place.

The CRS has been argued to undercount deaths in some of India's most populous States, especially deaths of women and children. Low levels of death registration are believed to occur in the highly populous states of Uttar Pradesh and Bihar and are likely to have slipped further during the pandemic. Given these, it is possible that the discrepancy between the official and the WHO estimates may simply reflect inadequacies in our mechanisms for counting deaths. There is universal agreement that the bulk of the deaths from COVID-19 across the span of the pandemic can be associated with the Delta wave, which struck India between February and June of 2021. Even in the WHO calculation, the year 2021 contributes more than 80% to the overall estimate of pandemic mortality. On this, government representatives have so far been silent. The CRS data for 2021 will only be available next year

Why is it important to count the dead? One reason is, of course, closure. It is hard to find an Indian who has not experienced a direct COVID-19 death of a family member, or an untimely death as an indirect consequence of an infection. To insist on the sanctity of an official record that potentially undercounts them, without providing an adequate reason for believing that record, would ignore our responsibilities to the dead and to those they left behind.

We could ask whether any possible undercounting of deaths indicates deliberate mismanagement or whether it simply points to the difficulty of maintaining accurate records in a country of India's size and comolexity. We could ask how the Indian public nealth system fared in the defining public health event, so far at least, of this century, in comparison to other countries.

But here's the larger question: How should the Indian government respond to independent, external measures of its performance on any issue where these measures diverge from the official narrative? In recent years, the Indian government has demonstrated some prickliness in such matters. In this particular case, it has been largely bolstered by a relatively unquestioning media that has supported the government's refusal to acknowledge the potential toll of the pandemic as an act of "patriotic defiance", in the words of the mathematician and COVID-19 modeller Murad Banaji.

letter war between two sets of retired public officials (civil servants, judges and army officers), oncerning the prevailing political and social situation in the country, has been widely reported in the media. In the last week of April 2022, a group of these retirees, calling themselves as the Constitutional Conduct Group (CCG) sent an 'open letter' to the Prime Minister. In the letter, they appealed to him to call for an end to the politics of hate and violence against the

Very soon thereafter, another rival group of Concerned Citizens (CC) surfaced and rubbished the allegations as a 'false narrative', inspired by western and international lobbies.

Unfortunately, in neither of the formulations, is there any reference to the role of the civil service (of which they all were distinguished members in the past) in whatever is happening or not happening in the country, concerning law and public order and the security of citizens. It is the police and magistracy, judicial courts and other regulatory agencies — not politicians — which have been authorised and empowered by law to take preventive action against potential troublemakers, enforce the laws relating to criminal, economic and other offences, and maintain public order. In mature democracies, self-respecting public officials normally discharge their constitutional and legal responsibilities with honesty, integrity and their own conscience, firmly resisting the dictates of the vested interests. What is happening in our country?

Perhaps, a reference to the recent events in Great Britain will serve to clarify things, as



the main features of our governance system — the cabinet system with accountability to Parliament and a permanent civil service with political neutrality as its hallmark - are patterned on the English constitutional model.

Recently, Britain's two top Ministers. Prime Minister Boris Johnson and the Chancellor of the Exchequer (Finance Minister), Rishi Sunak, were accused of violating their own lockdown regulations for COVID-19 by attending Christmas and other parties at 10, Downing Street, London (Prime Minister's residence) in the months of November to December 2020.

A career civil servant, Sue Gray, was asked to inquire into the veracity of the charges. Of Ms. Gray, it was said that she would never want to tarnish her reputation by claims of a cover-up or a shoddy investigation.

She came to the finding that against the background of the restrictions on all citizens, the gatherings held were inappropriate and represented a serious failure to observe the high standards expected from top public functionaries. The public and the political

establishment accepted the integrity of the exercise. Then, another wing of the civil service, the London Metropolitan Police, imposed fines on the Prime Minister and the Chancellor of Exchequer for their misdemeanour, and again both the top Ministers accepted the penalty

Can this happen in India? It might have been possible in the early years when Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel created independent India's civil services, but no longer. The deterioration in standards was very visible uring the National Emergency d 1975. The civil services, like other institutions including the judiciary, just caved in; the trend might have accelerated over the years; now, no one even talks of civil service neutrality, although there is the rare purist who could be sticking to the old standards of behaviour.

Earlier, during communal or caste riots, the Administration focused on quelling the disturbances and restoring peace in the affected locality, without ever favouring one group over the other. Now, there are allegations of local officers taking sides in a conflict. For civil servants who work with ruling politicians directly, following a political master's diktats and identifying with his interests, anticipating his views in official work and acting on them and pandering to his narrow political interests, often become easy options that put them out of harm's way.

The politician, lacking the vision and intellectual grasp of a Sardar Patel, could also reward a compliant bureaucrat by offering prized and lucrative assignments both within and outside the country. He could also have him placed in an inconvenient

position or even punish him if he does not follow his line. This can happen despite the protection and safeguards in Article 311 of the Constitution. That a civil servant's pliant and submissive behaviour means an end to civil service neutrality and the norms and values that this trait demands, does not seem to bother either the political or bureaucratic

The norms that define neutrality are: independence of thought and action; honest and objective advice; candour and ,'speakprivacy of a Minister's chamber. Associated with these norms are the personal values that a civil servant cherishes or ought to cherish, namely, self-respect, integrity, professional pride and dignity. All these together contribute to the enhancement of the quality of administration that benefits society and

This objective may, however, be at a discount when politicians are eager to serve their personal and party interests, and overzealous and ambitious officials dance to their tune, thereby leading to a dilution of standards. It could also create favourable conditions for both political and bureaucratic corruption.

"Constitutional morality is not a natural sentiment," wrote B.R. Ambedkar, the architect of the Constitution and added, "It has to be cultivated. We must realise that our people have yet to learn it. Democracy in India is only a top dressing on an Indian soil which is essentially undemocratic."

SC refuses to grant interim relief on pleas seeking stay on LIC-IPO share allotment

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Thursday refused to grant any interim relief and stay the Life Insurance Corporation (LIC) IPO share allotment on a batch of pleas filed by some policy holders. A bench of Justices DY Chandrachud, Surva Kant and PS Narasimha said that the court should be reluctant to grant any interim relief in matters of commercial investments and IPO. We are not inclined to grant any interim relief, the bench said as it issued notice to the Centre and LIC on the batch of pleas seeking their response within eight weeks. The bench said that on the aspect of interim relief the court must be guided by the well settled principle of prima facie case, balance of convenience and whether there is any irreparable injury. The LIC-IPO opened on May 4 for retail and other investors and is set to be allotted on Thursday. The bench noted that one of the pleas has challenged the interim order passed by the Bombay High Court and disposed it, saying the writ petition before the high court will be transferred to the apex court. The top court tagged the batch of pleas with a pending matter referred to a Constitution bench on the issue of passage of the Finance Act, 2021 as a money bill.

SBI Q4 profit jumps 41 % to Rs

9,114 cr on fall in bad loans **NEW DELHI:** The country's largest lender SBI on Friday reported a 41 % surge in standalone net profit at Rs 9,114 crore for the fourth quarter ended March 2022, helped by decline in bad loans. State Bank of India (SBI) had registered a profit of Rs 6,451 crore during January-March period of 2020-21, the lender said in a regulatory filing. Total income of the bank during the March quarter increased marginally to Rs 82,613 crore, from Rs 81.327 crore in the same period of the previous fiscal. On a consolidated basis, the bank reported a 56 per cent increase in net profit at Rs 9,549 crore, compared to Rs 6,126 crore in the fourth quarter of the previous fiscal. With regard to asset quality, gross non-performing assets (NPAs) of the bank declined to 3.97 per cent of gross advances as on March 31, 2022, is against 4.98 per cent by the same period of 2021. Net NPA or bad loans too came down to 1.02 per cent as on March 31, 2022 from 1.50 per cent in the year-ago period. For the entire financial year 2021-22, the bank reported a 55 per cent rise in standalone profit at Rs 31,676 crore, from Rs 20,410

CGST Mumbai West Zone busts tax fraud on bogus bills of around Rs. 60 Crore

CGST Commissionerate, Mumbai West Zone have busted a fake GST Input Tax Credit (ITC) racket and arrested the proprietor of a Versova based company.

Acting on a tip off received from Central Intelligence Unit of CGST Mumbai Zone, an investigation was initiated against M/s NECIL Metal Dealers Pvt Ltd, which deals in trading of ferrous metal and scrap.

The company was involved in fraudulent availment and passing of GST Input Tax Credit (ITC) of Rs 10.01 Crore without receiving or supply of goods, in gross violation of the provisions of CGST Act, 2017. Bogus bills of around Rs. 60 Crore were issued for this tax fraud. One of the director of this company was arrested in January 2022 but another director was absconding. He was traced on 11.05.22 and his statement was recorded wherein he admitted his role in tax fraud.

He was arrested under Section 69 of CGST Act. 2017 for contravention of Section 132 of CGST Act, 2017 and produced



Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Esplanade on 11.05.2022. The Magistrate has remanded him to 14 days judicial custody. Further investigation is under progress.

This case is a part of special drive initiated by CGST Mumbai Zone to stamp out fake ITC networks and tax evaders. As a part of this drive Mumbai West Commissionerate has unearthed fake ITC amounting to Rs.465 Crore, recovered Rs. 35 Crore and arrested five tax evaders, during last six months.

The CGST officers are using data analysis and network analysis tools to identify potential fraudsters. Department is going to intensify the drive against tax evaders in this financial year.





Elon Musk, the world's richest man, had said that one of his priorities would be to remove "spam bots" from Twitter. Tesla CEO Musk, who added that he was still committed

to the acquisition, decided to waive due diligence when he agreed to buy Twitter on April 25, in an effort to get the San Francisco-based company to accept his "best and final offer". Since then, technology stocks have plunged amid inves-

tor concerns over inflation and a potential economic slowdown

The spread between the offer price and the value of Twitter shares had widened in recent days, implying less

than a 50% chance of completion, as investors speculated that the downturn would prompt Musk to walk or seek a lower price.

"Twitter deal temporarily on hold pending details supporting calculation that spam/fake accounts do indeed represent less than 5% of users," Musk told his more than 92 million Twitter followers.

Twitter did not immediately respond to a request for comment. There was no immediate reaction from the investors

that Musk tapped last week to raise \$7.1 billion in funding. Musk tweeted a Reuters story from ten days ago that cited the fake account figures. Twitter has said that the figures were an estimate and that the actual number may be higher.


