GST Collections in July Jump to Rs 1,48,995 Cr

Goods and service tax (GST) collections in July jumped 28% year-on-year (y-o-y) to Rs 1,48,995 crore, on better reporting and economic recovery. This is the second-highest GST revenue collection ever. The mop-up in June had stood at Rs 1,44,616 crore, according to an official statement.

The GST collections in July 2022 are the second-highest ever, after the April 2022 mop-up of Rs 1,67,540 crore. It is the sixth time that the monthly GST collections have crossed the Rs 1.40-lakh-crore mark since the inception of GST and the fifth month at a stretch since March 2022.

"The gross GST revenue collected in July 2022 is Rs



1,48,995 crore, of which CGST is Rs 25,751 crore, SGST is Rs 32,807 crore, IGST is Rs 79,518 crore (including Rs 41,420 crore collected on import of goods) and cess is Rs 10,920 crore (including Rs 995 crore collected on import of

goods). This is second highest revenue since the introduction of GST," the finance ministry said in a statement on Monday.

The government has settled Rs 32,365 crore to CGST and Rs 26,774 crore to SGST from IGST. The total revenue of the

Centre and the states in July 2022 after regular settlement is Rs 58,116 crore for CGST and Rs 59,581 crore for the SGST.

"The revenues for the month of July 2022 are 28 per cent higher than the GST revenues in the same month last year of Rs 1,16,393 crore. During the month, revenues from import of goods was 48 per cent higher and the revenues from domestic transaction (including import of services) are 22 per cent higher than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year," it added.

The ministry also said the growth in GST revenue in the current financial year till July 2022 is 35 per cent higher over

the same period last year and displays a high buoyancy. This is a clear impact of various measures taken by the GST Council in the past to ensure better compliance. "Better reporting coupled with economic recovery has been having a positive impact on the GST revenues on a consistent basis," it added.

During June 2022, 7.45 crore e-way bills were generated, which was marginally higher than 7.36 crore in May 2022, the statement said.

Sanjeev Sanyal, principal economic advisor to the Government of India, said in a tweet on Friday, "With Rs 1.49 lakh crores of GST collected in July, the momentum in the

RBI retains FY23 inflation projection at 6.7%

The RBI on Friday retained its retail inflation forecast for current fiscal year at 6.7% amid geopolitical developments and higher global commodity prices, hoping inflationary pressures to ease further. In its previous monetary policy review in June, it



had projected retail inflation for 2022-23 at 6.7%, up from 5.7% forecast in April. The RBI raised the benchmark lending repo rate by 50 basis points to 5.40%.

RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said inflation in second and third quarter of the ongoing fiscal year is expected to remain above the upper tolerance level of 6%. The central bank aims to keep retail inflation in a band of 2-6%.

economy is clearly intact." Abhishek Jain, partner (indirect tax) at KPMG in India, said, "Continuing the positive trend, this month's GST collections are 28 per cent higher than the collections as compared to same month

of last financial year, leading to an impressive 35% year-on-year growth."

He added that these consistent high collections indicate recovery from the pandemic-induced slowdown and can also be attributed to inflation

and tight check and balances implemented by the government. "Further, with rationalisations being implemented subsequent to the recent GST Council meet, these numbers may further go up in the coming months."

Mufti's new Twitter DP shows tricolour, old J&K flag

Former J&K Chief Minister and the PDP president Mehbooba Mufti on Wednesday put up a new Twitter display picture showing Prime Minister Narendra Modi and her late father Mufti Mohammad Sayeed with the national flag and the now-derecognised flag of Jammu and Kashmir. This was apparently in response to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's call in his Mann ki Baat for putting tricolour as the profile picture of their social media accounts between August 2 and 15. "Changed my dp since a flag is a matter of joy & pride. For our state flag was irreversibly linked to the Indian flag. It was snatched thus breaking away the link.

Taking action against dubious digital loan apps: Sitharaman

Government is taking action against dubious digital loan apps, including those originating from outside the country, and also Indians who helped in setting them up, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman informed Rajya Sabha on Tuesday.

Most of the dubious apps are originating from one particular country and as a result a lot of borrowers are harassed and money is being extorted from by these apps, she said during the Question Hour while replying to a supplementary question.

The minister was asked about reports of dubious digital loan apps backed by Chinese entities which do not follow RBI guidelines in giving loans.

Sitharaman said the Ministry of Finance, Corporate



Affairs, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology and a few other departments, inclusive of Home, are all constantly discussing and working to ensure action is taken in these cases.

"Only a couple of months ago particularly in the state of Telangana a lot of people have been put to harassment and action has been initiated. That's not to say we are not taking action elsewhere," she

said. She also said the government is consciously taking action against Indian citizens who have also helped in establishing these companies and also what may be broadly defined as shell companies through which they are operating. She also said action in all these angles are being taken.

Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das had recently said the central bank will soon come out with regulatory architecture for digital lending platforms.

Most of the digital lending apps are not registered with the central bank and operate by themselves. There have been increasing cases of alleged suicides of borrowers due to harassment by a few of the operators of digital lending apps.

Delhi Police chief meets Home Minister Amit Shah

Newly appointed Delhi Police Commissioner Sanjay Arora met Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday, a day after he took charge of the force. Arora is a Tamil Nadu-cadre IPS officer and headed the paramilitary force Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) before his appointment as Delhi Police chief on Sunday.

"The Police Commissioner of Delhi, Shri Sanjay Arora called on Union Home Minister Shri @AmitShah," Shah's office tweeted. Officials described the meeting as a courtesy call.

Arora, who was once part of the Tamil Nadu Police's special task force which later hunted down forest brigand Veerappan, succeeded Rakesh Asthana, a Gujarat-cadre IPS officer, who retired on Sunday. Arora, 57, is the second successive non-AGMUT cadre IPS officer to head the Delhi Police and the third since the Delhi Police Act was passed in 1978 and a commissionerate was established.

Before Arora and Asthana, Ajai Raj Sharma, a 1966-batch IPS officer of the Uttar Pradesh cadre, was appointed as the Delhi Police chief in 1999 when L K Advani was the Union Home Minister. The Delhi Police functions under the Union Home Ministry and its officers belong to the Arunachal Pradesh-Goa-Mizoram and Union Territory (AGMUT) cadre.

Punjab govt extends 'moong' procurement date till Aug 10



CHANDIGARH: Giving a big relief to the Moong cultivators across the state, the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann today extended the date of procurement of summer Moong crop on Minimum Support Price (MSP) by August 10th. Divulging the details, the Chief Minister said that earlier the procurement of Moong crop on MSP in the state was to end on July 31st. However, he said that to facilitate the farmers for selling their crop, the state government has decided to extend this procurement season by August 10th. Bhagwant Mann said that those farmers who have not yet sold their crop can sell it now in the mandis by this date adding that Managing Director (MD) Marked, which is state nodal agency for the procurement, Ramveer has been given necessary directions in this regard.

Private players can use drones for delivery purposes as per rules: Govt

Government of India is utilising services of drone service providers for vaccine delivery, inspection of oil pipelines and power transmission lines, anti-locust operations, agricultural spraying, survey of mines, and land mapping, private players are free to use drones for delivery purposes subject to compliance with Drone Rules, 2021, said the Civil Aviation Ministry. In September 2021, the government notified the Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme to promote the growth of drone manufacturing by private companies.

Shinde govt will collapse as treachery not acceptable in Maha: Aadiya Thackeray

Maharashtra never tolerates treachery and the Eknath Shinde-led government will collapse for sure, Yuva Sena chief and former minister Aadiya Thackeray said on Monday. ed the BJP during the Rajya Sabha poll in June despite being a Congress MLA.

After joining the party, Bishnoi said that Prime Minister Modi is the best Prime Minister of the country who always thinks about the country and the welfare of the poor.

Bishnoi also appreciated Khattar and said despite being the chief minister for eight years his reputation is spotless.

BJP national general secretary Arun Singh and media department head Anil Baluni also were present during the joining of Bishnoi.

Not scared of Modi, says Rahul Gandhi

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, who is facing ED investigation in the National Herald case, on Thursday said that he was not scared of the Modi government.

"We will not flee, neither are we scared of Narendra Modi. Let him do what he wants to," Gandhi said while talking to mediapersons outside his house here. "They think they



can silence our voice by pressurising us. But it is not going

to happen. Whatever Modi and Amit Shahji are doing is against democracy," he said.

Rahul Gandhi skipped the meeting of the Congress MPs in Parliament on Thursday. Congress had called a meeting after the Enforcement Directorate (ED) sealed the Herald House here. The Congress has also accused the ruling dispensation of treating the op-

position leaders as "terrorists". "The entire country is watching as an investigating agency has been deployed mindlessly against the leadership of India's oldest political party. You (the BJP) are treating this party, its leaders and institutions as terrorists," Congress spokesperson Abhishek Manu Singhvi said during a media briefing on Wednesday.

UP govt sanctions Rs 797 cr for road work in Ayodhya

The Uttar Pradesh government has sanctioned Rs 797 crore for the broadening and renovation of roads leading to the Ram temple in Ayodhya. The decision was taken at a state Cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath. "The construction of the Ram temple is in full swing in Ayodhya. To



avoid crowd on big occasions in Ayodhya and deal with it, the cabinet has approved broadening of the 12.940 km road from Sadatganj to Nayaghat on lines of Kashi Vishwanath corridor," Tourism Minister Jaiveer Singh told reporters. He said the road from Faizabad to the Hanumangarhi and Ram temples will also

be widened and shopkeepers be rehabilitated. The Cabinet has approved Rs 797.69 crore for the project and set a deadline of two years to complete the work, he said.

Average inflation rate highest in 2022, at 6.82%, since 2014



NEW DELHI: Amid the debate over price rise and inflation in the country, a comparison of government data since the year 2014 discloses that the all India average inflation rate is highest at 6.82 per cent in current year 2022.

As per the government data, the average inflation was 6.65 per cent in 2014, came down to 4.91 in 2015 and further slipped to 3.33 in 2017. Even in 2019, it was 3.72 per cent but jumped to 6.62 in 2020. Average inflation rate in 2021 was 5.14 per cent.

The National Statistical Office (NSO) releases the inflation rate on the 12th of every month (next working day if 12th is a holiday), based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

As per the Ministry of Statistics, overall increase in CPI based inflation is broad based and major contributions is due to increase in food and fuel related index. Food inflation is led by cereals, milk, fruits, vegetables, spices and

prepared meals. Fuel inflation was driven up by a rise in LPG and kerosene prices.

"CPI excluding food and fuel hardened across almost all components, mainly by the transport and communication sub-group due to increase in the prices of petrol and diesel. A large part of the increase in inflation in the recent months can be primarily attributed to supply shocks linked to the war in Europe," said the ministry.

The price situation of major essential commodities is monitored by the government on a regular basis and corrective action is taken from time to time, it said, adding that several supply side measures have been taken by the government to address inflation. These include reduction in import duties and cess on pulses, rationalisation of tariffs and imposition of stock limits on edible oils and oil seeds, maintenance of buffer stock for onion and pulses etc, said the ministry.

Lok Sabha witnesses heated arguments over issue of farm loan waivers

Lok Sabha on Tuesday witnessed heated arguments between the Treasury and Opposition benches over the issue of farm loan waivers with Speaker Om Birla making an intervention and telling the members that advances under the Kisan Credit Card scheme are not written off.

While asking a supplementary, NCP member Supriya Sule sought to know whether the government has any plans to waive off the loans given to the farmers under the Kisan Credit Card (KCC) scheme.

Replying to the question, Parshottam Rupala, Union



Minister of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, said it was for the first time in last so many decades that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has extended the scheme to fishermen and dairy farmers as the

KCC was earlier confined only to agricultural farmers.

He said its main aim is to provide small farmers institutional credit up to Rs 1.6 lakh without any collateral.

Besides, Rupala said, if a

farmer repays the loan promptly, he or she would get three per cent interest subvention from the central government and some state governments too provide interest subvention up to four per cent to the KCC borrowers.

So, virtually a farmer is not paying any interest on his loan if it is paid on time, he said.

Sule and other opposition members then said the minister was not giving the answer to the specific question on whether the government was planning to waive off the KCC loans taken by the farmers, to which Rupala reacting strongly.

Centre Govt holds meeting with health experts on monkeypox



A meeting of top health experts called by the Centre on Thursday deliberated on the need for revisiting existing guidelines on management of monkeypox amid rising number of cases of the disease in the country. India has so far reported nine cases of monkeypox including one death. "It was a technical meeting to revisit the existing guidelines," an official said. The meeting was chaired by Dr L Swasticharan, director of Emergency Medical Relief and attended by officials from the National Aids Control Organisation, National Centre for Disease Control and World Health Organisation (WHO) representatives.

ED being used to 'harass' opposition parties: Cong

The Congress on Wednesday alleged that the Enforcement Directorate has become a "tool" in the hands of the BJP-led Centre to "destroy" the Opposition parties. Congress leader in Lok Sabha Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury also said that the party was not being allowed to raise the issue of alleged "misuse" of the ED by the Centre in Parliament. Chowdhury's remarks came a day after the ED raided the head office of the Congress party-owned National Herald newspaper here and other locations as part of an ongoing money laundering investigation.

Go First car goes under IndiGo plane at Delhi airport, narrowly avoids collision with nose wheel



A car belonging to Go First airline went under an IndiGo A320neo aircraft at the Delhi airport on Tuesday, narrowly avoiding collision with the plane's nose wheel, sources said. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) will investigate this incident, its officials stated. There was no damage to the plane, aviation industry sources said. The aircraft was ready to depart for Dhaka on Tuesday morning when a car belonging to Go First airline went under it, narrowly avoiding collision with the nose wheel, the sources said.

Arora is the second successive non-AGMUT cadre IPS officer to head the Delhi Police and the third since the Delhi Police Act was passed in 1978 and a commissionerate was established. Before Arora and Asthana, Ajai Raj Sharma, a 1966-batch IPS officer of the Uttar Pradesh cadre, was ap-




pointed as the Delhi Police chief in 1999 when L K Advani was the Union Home Minister. The Delhi Police functions under the Union Home Ministry and its officers belong to the Arunachal Pradesh-Goa-Mizoram and Union Territory (AGMUT) cadre. According to an official order, the competent authority

has approved the inter-cadre deputation of Arora. Arora, a 1988-batch IPS officer, will take charge on Monday and will continue till further order. He is due for retirement in 2025. He served as the Superintendent of Police of the Tamil Nadu Police STF which was set up to hunt down forest brigand Veerappan and he was awarded the chief minister's gallantry medal for bravery during this stint. He served as Coimbatore police commissioner between 2002 and 2004. Arora was appointed the Director General of the paramilitary Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) in August last year. He also had stints in the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and the Border

Security Force (BSF). He holds a B.Tech degree in Electrical and Electronics Engineering. In a separate order, the Home Ministry said his tenure as DG ITBP has been curtailed and his inter-cadre deputation from the Tamil Nadu cadre to the AGMUT cadre will begin from the date of joining the AGMUT cadre and up to his date of superannuation i.e. up to July 31, 2025, or until further orders, whichever is earlier, in relaxation of inter-cadre deputation guidelines. In yet another order, the home ministry said Director General of the SSB, S L Thakur, a 1988-batch IPS officer of Madhya Pradesh cadre, will hold additional charge of DG ITBP till further order.

Delhi govt withdraws new excise policy

Delhi government has decided to withdraw the new Excise Policy for the time being and directed the sale of liquor through government-run vendors, Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia said on Saturday. Targeting the BJP, he alleged they were "running an illegal liquor business in Gujarat" and they wanted to do it now in Delhi also. The deputy chief minister, who also holds the excise portfolio, said in a press briefing that the Delhi chief secretary has been directed to ensure that liquor is now sold through government shops only and there is no chaos. He also alleged the BJP was using agencies like the CBI and ED to threaten liquor licensees, many of whom have now shut shops, and the excise officials



who were scared to start open auctions of retail licences. "They want to create a shortage of liquor so that they can run an illegal liquor trade in Delhi like they are doing in Gujarat. But we will not let this happen," Sisodia said. Under the new excise policy, nearly 468 liquor stores are running in Delhi at present. The policy, that extended twice after April 30 for a two-month period each, will end on July 31.

One killed in scooty crash in Delhi's Janakpuri



A 30-year-old Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) conductor died on Thursday after his scooty met with an accident, police said. After getting information about the incident in Janakpuri area, police reached the scene of the accident found a black scooty next to a person lying unconscious on the road. He was rushed to DDU Hospital where he was declared brought dead, Deputy Commissioner of Police (West) Ghanshyam Bansal said. A case under sections 279 (rash driving or riding on a public way) and 304A (causing death by negligence) of the Indian Penal Code has been registered at Janakpuri police station, the DCP said. The deceased was identified as Naveen Mohar, a resident of Chhawla. He was employed with the DTC as a conductor. Efforts are being made to identify the accused and vehicle which hit the scooty, Bansal added.

Gangster Goldi Brar's two companions arrested in Haryana

After the arrest of four members of gangster Goldi Brar gang led by Shashant Panday resident of Gorakhpur in U.P and remaining three residents of Ambala district by CIA Staff-II of Ambala police few days ago while talking to media persons SP Ambala Jashandeep Singh Randhawa said that during six days remain going on Shashant Panday disclosed that he brought arms seized by police from M.P on the direction by gangster Goldi Brar to kill a leading Haryana businessman from whom Goldi Brar had demanded ransom amount worth crore of rupees and threatened to kill him if ransom demand not fulfilled by him. SP told that on a clue Ambala police arrested them while they were planning to kill leading businessman at a lonely place near Babyl immigration ground Ambala Cantt. Randhawa told that police took Shashant Panday to M.P to identify the person supplied weapons. He said, Goldi Brar presently operat-



ing his network while sitting in abroad and wanted by the police in several cases registered against him in Punjab, Haryana and Delhi states. Meanwhile, Anti Gangster Task Force (AGTF) of Punjab police on 26th July on a clue arrested two persons suspected involved in Musewala murder case in Punjab while both were entering Haryana to hide themselves at a police barrier near village Pathranasituated on Bhatnara road on the border of Dabwali in Sirsa district about 10 km from Bhatinda while travelling on a motorcycle. Both arrested were identified as Malkiat Singh alias Kitta a resident of village Bhaini and Haadeep Singh alias Mama a resident of village Aaklia Jalal in Bhatinda district.

No new tax or VAT increase in UP: CM Adityanath

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Friday said that keeping in mind the larger public interest, the government has neither increased the VAT and nor has imposed any new tax in the state. Chairing a meeting of the state tax department pertaining to revenue collection at his residence, he said that Value Added Tax (VAT) will not be increased in the near future too. Adityanath said the amount collected from the public will be spent on developmental and public welfare works, according to an official statement released here. He directed that for financial year 2022-23, concrete efforts should be made pertaining to revenue collection with an aim to collect Rs 1.50 lakh crore as Goods and Services Tax (GST) and VAT. The chief minister also directed officials that the number of GST-registered traders should be increased to 4 lakh in the next 6 months.

Nearly 170 dengue cases in Delhi so far this year, highest since 2017

Nearly 170 dengue cases have been reported in the national capital this year till July 30, the highest for the period since 2017, according to a civic body report released on Monday. At least 26 cases of the vector-borne disease were recorded in July, it said. According to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) report, the city recorded 23 dengue cases in January, 16 in February, 22 in March, 20 in April, 30 in May and 32 in June. The total count of dengue cases reported in the capital this year stands at 169 till July 30.



Till July 25, the city had logged 159 cases. So, 10 fresh cases have been reported in a week, the report stated. Also, in 2017, Delhi had reported 185 cases during the January 1-July 30 period, it said. The count of dengue cases reported in Delhi between January 1 and July 30 last year was 52. The corresponding figures were 31 in 2020, 40 in 2019, 56 in 2018, the report said. No death has been reported so far this year due to the disease, the MCD report said. Cases of vector-borne diseases are usually reported between July and November, sometimes stretching till mid-December. Civic officials said dengue cases were being recorded earlier this year due to a weather condition that is congenial for mosquito-breeding. Last year, 9,613 dengue cases were recorded in the national capital, the highest since 2015, along with 23 deaths, the maximum since 2016. In 2016, 10 deaths were reported due to dengue. Delhi had recorded two deaths due to dengue in 2019, four in 2018 and 10 in 2017. According to official data, 4,431 dengue cases were recorded in Delhi in 2016, 4,726 in 2017, 2,798 in 2018, 2,036 in 2019, and 1,072 in 2020.

Delhi High Court seeks clarification on Patanjali's 'Coronil' claims

NEWDELHI: The Delhi High Court on Thursday sought a proper clarification from Baba Ramdev regarding his Patanjali ayurveda company's product 'Coronil', on allegations of spreading misinformation about the Covid-19 cure capacity of the product. Justice Anup J. Bhamhani orally remarked the clarification of the yoga guru seemed 'more like pat on his own back' as there was hardly any withdrawal of the claims he made in public. 'You gave the public two impressions: one is that allopathic doctors don't have a cure and two that Coronil is the cure and treatment. You cannot say it is a supplementary measure. The idea is to be clear in your communication. Words have to express thought. If there is bona fide thought, then it has been concealed in this clarification,' he said orally during the hearing. The court was dealing with a suit filed by several doctors' associations alleging Ramdev's public statement affects them as Coronil does not cure coro-



navirus and it is misleading. During the course of the hearing, senior advocate P.V. Kapur, who appeared on behalf of Ramdev, said each medical discipline has a common objective and is neither inferior nor superior to others. 'We have tendered apology about what was said about the allopathic doctors,' he submitted. On the other hand, senior advocate Akhil Sibal, represented the doctors' associations, argued that the Patanjali website content claims that Coronil is a treatment to Covid-19. After the detailed submissions, the court listed the matter for further hearing on August 18.

Six having Pak links threatening Haryana MLAs arrested






Man gets 10-year jail term for raping minor in Ghaziabad





Unfortunately, drug addiction among youths of both sexes in parties, by those living in hostels and PG houses is fast increasing since past few years by the students as well as working males and females in order to have mental relief before going to bed in which drugs are usually injected in the body by a single syringe by several thus causing infection. The modern fashion trend of having tattoos on different parts of body by men and women to attract opposite sex is another major reason for fast increasing cases of Hepatitis disease also known as 'Kala Peelia'. Health department information reveals that HIV diseases has witnessed fast increase in past few years. According to health department figures more than 50% patients suffering from Hepatitis C visited OPD at Ambala Civil Hospitals in past couple of years were seen suffered from this disease due to blood infection in the body during injecting drugs in the body using a single syringe by several persons. A survey also revealed that nearly 45% youths including females staying in college hostels, PG houses and jointly staying in groups in private houses usually become habitual for taking drugs for having relief from mental tension or fun sake before going to the bed at night and they usually use a single syringe to inject drug in arms by all unaware of consequences. It is generally seen that in high profile parties drugs are served to guests using a single syringe to inject drugs to all visitors. Some of the prominent reasons cause Hepatitis C and B include having unsafe sex relationship, use of common syringe while injecting drugs in the body, intake of infected blood, use of infected syringe, while having tattoos on the body, having shave at a saloon with an infected blade and while getting holes for wearing ear rings and nose pin with an infected needle, Accord-







ED raids National Herald office, other locations in money laundering case

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday raided the head office of the Congress party-owned National Herald newspaper here and 11 other locations as part of an ongoing money laundering investigation, officials said, a week after it questioned Congress chief Sonia Gandhi.

The searches are being carried out under the criminal sections of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) to "gather additional evidence with regard to the trail of funds and they are against those entities who were involved in the National Herald-linked transactions", they said.

The action is being undertaken in light of fresh evidence obtained by the ED after the latest questioning of various people, in this case, they said.

The raids came after the probe agency questioned Congress president Sonia Gandhi and her MP son Rahul at its headquarters here. While Sonia Gandhi was questioned for more than 11 hours, spread over three



rounds, last month, Rahul Gandhi was probed by the ED for five days, at intervals, clocking over 50 hours in June.

Senior Congress politicians like Mallikarjun Kharge and Pawan Bansal were also questioned by the ED in April.

The National Herald is published by the Associated Journals Ltd. (AJL), and its holding company is Young Indian.

Officers of the federal agency searched the office of the National Herald located in the 'Herald House' building at Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg near ITO in central Delhi. The office

is registered in the name of AJL. According to officials, the location of a shell (dummy) company in Kolkata involved in the case, has also been covered in the raids. The Congress party had called the ED action against its leaders "political vendetta", saying there was no money laundering in the case.

The Congress party has said it gave a Rs 90 crore loan to an ailing AJL between 2001-02 and 2010-11 and later, in 2011, the shares of AJL were allotted to Young Indian and this debt was converted into equity and the loan was extinguished

under the PMLA after a trial court here took cognisance of an Income Tax department probe against Young Indian based on a private criminal complaint by BJP MP Subramanian Swamy in 2013.

Swamy had accused the Gandhis and others of conspiring to cheat and misappropriate funds, with Young Indian paying only Rs 50 lakh to obtain the right to recover Rs 90.25 crore that Associated Journals Limited owed to the Congress.

In February last year, the Delhi High Court issued a notice to the Gandhis seeking their response to Swamy's plea.

According to the ED, assets worth about Rs 800 crore are "owned" by the AJL and the agency wants to know from the Gandhis how a "not-for-profit" company like Young Indian was undertaking commercial activities of renting out its land and building assets.

The Congress party has said that the Income Tax Department has valued AJL's properties at worth about Rs 350 crore.

Admit that you revolted to save yourself from probe agencies, stop maligning Hindutva: Raut to Sena rebels

Shiv Sena leader Sanjay Raut on Sunday said the rebel lawmakers should honestly admit that they revolted against the party leadership to protect themselves from the central probe agencies.

In his weekly column 'Rokhthok' published in party mouthpiece 'Saamana', he said, "The rebel group should stop saying that they switched sides because Shiv Sena gave up Hindutva. Why malign Hindutva unnecessarily? Show honesty in saying that all ran away to protect themselves for Enforcement Directorate (ED)."

Govt to build more green expressways: Gadkari

The government will be building 26 green expressways in the country in the next three years and India's road infrastructure will be as good as that in the United States by 2024, Transport minister Nitin Gadkari told Rajya Sabha on Wednesday.

Replying to supplementaries during the Question Hour, the minister said there is no shortage of funds with the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) which has AA rating



and is financially very sound. He said the NHAI can build five lakh km roads in a year.

"In the next three years, we are building 26 green expressways," he said, adding that one can travel from Delhi to Dehradun, Haridwar or Jaipur in two hours thereafter.

He also claimed that once the expressways are built, one can travel from Delhi to Chandigarh in 2.5 hours, Delhi to Amritsar in four hours, Delhi to Katra in six hours, Delhi to Sri-

nagar in eight hours and Delhi to Mumbai in 12 hours and Chennai to Bengaluru in two hours. It used to earlier take 4.5 hours to travel from Meerut to Delhi but now people are coming in 40 minutes, he claimed. "Under Narendra Modi's leadership before 2024, India's road infrastructure will be the same as that in the United States, I promise. There is no shortage of funds," Gadkari said, adding, we will change the entire infrastructure of the country.


Division bench sets aside subpoena on ex-CEC Sunil Arora

A division bench of the High Court of Karnataka has set aside the order of subpoena summoning the ex-Chief Election Commissioner of India, Sunil Arora issued by a single judge bench, to testify in an election petition.

The single judge had issued the subpoena in the order dated June 17, 2022 in the election petition filed by Ravishivappa Padasalagi challenging the election to the Assembly of Mahesh Kumatahalli in the 2019 by-election to the Athani Vidhana Sabha constituency.

The by-elections were scheduled in October 2019 but were rescheduled to December 2019. The rescheduling came after a Supreme Court observation as it was hearing petitions pertaining to the disqualification of MLAs in whose constituencies the elections were scheduled.

After the election Kumatahalli won from Athani and this was challenged by Padasa-



lagi. In this petition, the single judge summoned the ex-Chief Election Commissioner of India as a witness to explain the circumstances of the rescheduling of the election.

This was challenged by the Election Commission before the Division Bench.

In its judgement recently, the HC bench of Justice Krishna S Dixit and Justice P Krishna Bhat said, "What were the facts and circumstances that lead to issuance of the notification postponing the elections cannot

be the subject matter of oral evidence of the Commissioners of the Election Commission of India which is a multi-member body. Its decisions are not the decisions of the individuals."

The court said issuing of subpoena to functionaries of constitutional bodies is not ordinarily done.

"Since they have to act and take significant decisions in the discharge of duties fearlessly. Otherwise, they run the fear of being called as witnesses and that may push them to defensive mode affecting public interest," it said.

"A very strong case has to be made out for summoning the members or ex-members of constitutional bodies," the Division Bench said.

The bench however, said that official records can be summoned through which the circumstances that resulted into issuance of the subject notification can be gathered.



Health ministry releases dos and don'ts to prevent contracting monkeypox

With rising cases of monkeypox in the country, the Union health ministry on Wednesday released a list of dos and don'ts to avoid contracting the disease. It also underlined that anyone can catch the virus if they have had prolonged or repeated contact with an infected individual. Among the dos, the ministry advised isolating the infected person from others so that the disease does not spread, use of hand



sanitisers, or washing hands with soap and water, covering mouth with masks and hands with disposable gloves when close to a patient, and using disinfectants to sanitise the environment around. The don'ts state avoid sharing linen, beddings, clothes, towels, among others, with people who have tested positive for the infection. The ministry advised not to wash soiled linen or laundry of patients and those of non-infected persons together, and avoid public events even if you only exhibit symptoms of the disease. "Do not stigmatise people who have contracted the virus, and suspected patients as well. Also, do not believe any rumour or misinformation," it said. Meanwhile, a task force on monkeypox has been constituted to closely monitor the emerging situation in the country and decide on response initiatives to tackle the spread of the disease.

1.29 cr votes cast for NOTA in last 5 years: ADR

About 1.29 crore votes were cast for NOTA option in the last five years in state and general elections, poll rights body ADR said on Thursday. The Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) and National Election Watch (NEW) have analysed the number of votes secured by NOTA (None of the above) in various elections during 2018 to 2022. According to the report, on an average NOTA has secured 64,53,652 votes (64.53 lakhs) in the state assembly elections. The report said overall, NOTA secured 65,23,975 (1.06 %) votes. Among the NOTA votes in Lok Sabha elections, the highest number of votes i.e., 51,660 was in Gopalganj (S.C.) constituency in Bihar while the lowest number of NOTA votes i.e., 100 was in Lakshadweep. Among state assembly elections, NOTA has secured the highest percentage of votes in 2020 at 1.46 per cent (7,49,360 votes) in two states assembly elections of Bihar (7,06,252 votes) and NCT Delhi (43,108 votes). NOTA has secured lowest percentage of votes in 2022, i.e., 0.70 per cent (8, 15,430 votes) in five states assembly elections (combined) of Goa (10,629 votes), Manipur (10,349 votes), Punjab (1,10,308 votes), Uttar Pradesh (6,37,304 votes) and Uttarakhand (46,840 votes), the report said.




Spectrum - a key resource - must not lie unused

India's latest auction of telecommunications spectrum, including of bands ideally suited for offering 5G technology services, drew bids exceeding a record Rs 1.5 lakh crore in a clear sign that the industry is on the path to recovery. While the Government has netted just over a third of the Rs 4.3 lakh crore reserve price it had set for the spectrum on offer, the fact that 71% of the airwaves on the block won bids is testament to the improvement in the industry's health. The Centre's move last year to ease regulatory norms around payment of dues, including a four-year moratorium on outstanding payments and the redefinition of adjusted gross revenues to prospectively exclude non-telecom earnings, allowed service providers a breather and helped them attract investor interest as also spread liabilities over a staggered period. Industrywide increases in tariffs also helped lift average revenue per user at the telecom service providers, boosting margins. The Government's decision to return bank guarantees to telcos must have helped improve their eligibility for debt - crucial for capital expenditure. And with spectrum usage charges also binned, the enhanced flexibility likely allowed enthusiastic participation from all three private players, a far cry from when the very survival of Vodafone Idea was in doubt. However, the auction also offers crucial lessons. The high reserve price likely dampened enthusiasm for certain spectrum bands. While the 3.3 GHz and 26 GHz were snapped up at the reserve price in several service areas, the 600 MHz was left untouched, and 60% of the 700 MHz spectrum remained unsold. The latter is ideal for rural connectivity as well as signal penetration inside buildings in urban areas. If spectrum is seen as a precious national resource, the Government would do well to not let it lie unused and instead price it in an optimal manner.

Fiduciary duty in public assets sale

The sale of the loss-making national carrier Air India to the Tata Group is a move that evoked a mixed response. While some hailed it on the assumption that it would no longer spell a further loss to the exchequer, its opponents felt that a national asset was being sold at a throwaway price without transparency by the Union government.

On October 8, 2021, the Union government announced that Tata Sons was the winner of the bid for the airline for consideration of Rs 18,000 crore; the Tatas would retain Rs 15,300 crore of Air India's debt and pay Rs 2,700 crore in cash to the Government. The seller, the Government of India, would retain a liability of Rs 46,262 crore that was transferred to a special purpose vehicle, the Air India Asset Holding Ltd (AIAHL) - thereby passing on the liability to individual tax-payer citizens. Thus, what was technically sold was just aircraft routes/landing rights and some core assets of Air India, and not Air India per se.

The sale of an enterprise is different from the sale of its assets (otherwise known as 'asset sale'), where in order to unlock the value of assets, liabilities are retained by the seller either by himself or through a special purpose vehicle, and assets are sold for a competitive price, as otherwise, the liabilities will surpass the value of the assets, rendering the enterprise value to negative. This is the norm in many corporate transactions.

It appears that this is the logic that was the driving force behind the Air India sale, where some assets (aircraft and a 50% stake in an airport services division) were sold to the Tatas, and the Union government retained a significant portion of the liabilities through the AIAHL.

While an asset sale is normal in a corporate private transaction, the Government needs to exercise caution when selling a national asset to a private player. In a private asset sale, there



are independent checks and balances, such as regulatory approvals, and the consent of the secured creditors (mostly banks) who will give their consent to park the liability only when they are satisfied that the promoters or the shareholders of the private enterprise would be able to satisfy the liabilities either from the proceeds of the sale or otherwise.

In a typical asset sale by the Government, these approvals are a mere formality. When the sovereign government assumes the debt, no banks that the government directly or indirectly controls can conduct due diligence independently on the nature of the sale and report fairly on whether the proceeds of the sale are sufficient to satisfy the debt because the government has given an undertaking to repay the debt or the government may even force banks into a settlement with lesser repayment or even a write-off. Thus, it is citizens who will end up repaying the debts of Air India.

It is prudent to extend the doctrine of 'public trust' to the government's management of public sector enterprises. There is a fiduciary duty cast upon the government to act fairly and in a transparent manner while dealing with public assets. Unlike a private asset sale, a government selling

public assets and assuming liabilities without proper planning will impose an enormous debt burden on citizens.

The Air India asset sale needs scrutiny in light of the Government's new National Monetisation Pipeline (NMP), where public assets will be monetised either as leases or outright sales. Air India's asset sale and retention of liabilities set a dangerous precedent as it could result in selling public assets to government faithfuls and leaving the liabilities on citizens.

The privatisation of loss-making public sector enterprises may prevent the state from incurring further losses. However, unless the sale proceeds are substantial, genuine and transparent, a crisis of legitimacy may arise.

Electoral bonds

One example is the anonymous electoral bonds scheme which taps corporate funding to help any political party and where the details are known only to the ruling party, which could fuel mistrust of such asset sales. A Right to Information filing by the Association for Democratic Reforms showed that with the State Bank of India as the sole authorised dealer of electoral bonds, out of

Rs 3,429 crore of the total value of electoral bonds generated by the bank (FY19-20), the ruling party at the Centre alone devoured a whopping Rs 2,606 crore, or 76% of the total bonds issued so far. This is also the period that saw some major privatisation of public sector enterprises.

The recent award of a contract worth Rs 1,126 crore to a Chinese firm (Shanghai Tunnel Engineering Co. Ltd.) to construct an underground rail stretch in Delhi and a contract worth Rs 170 crore to another Chinese firm, Taizhong Hong Kong International Ltd., for the supply of wheels to Vande Bharat trains cannot be seen in isolation. It is important to remember that China is an aggressor at the Line of Actual Control. Here, the role of discreet political funding through anonymous electoral bonds needs to be assessed more closely.

Consult States

It is vital to recognise the role of States in establishing a public asset such as Air India. They have actively participated in the growth of the airline in the form of land and other infrastructure to its offices. States were not consulted in the whole process which is a breach of the spirit of 'cooperative federalism'.

According to Article 1 of the Constitution, India is a Union of States, i.e., the idea of India as a Union lies with the States, which are the owners of land and responsible for the maintenance of other infrastructure. Hence, any unilateral sale of assets by the Union without consulting States would only deepen the mistrust between the Union and the States.

There's a way to reap the demographic dividend

The UN report, World Population Prospects 2022, forecasts that the world's population will touch eight billion this year and rise to 9.8 billion in 2050. What is of immediate interest to India is that its population will surpass China's by 2023 and continue to surge.

A long-time critic of China's population policy and author of Big Country with an Empty Nest, Yi Fuxian, believes that without its one child policy, China's population, too, would have naturally risen and peaked at 1.6 billion in 2040, allowing the world's second-largest economy to enjoy a much longer 'demographic dividend.' Instead, China is enduring an ongoing population implosion, which by 2050, will leave it with only 1.3 billion people, of whom 500 million will be past the age of 60. India's population, by contrast, would have peaked at 1.7 billion, of whom only 330 million will be 60 years or older.

Simply put, India is getting a demographic dividend that will last nearly 30 years. How it handles this windfall will determine if it will rise to the top of the economic league table by the end of this century or continue to eddy at lower middle-income levels. A sceptical world is watching.

India's potential workforce

Most optimistic about India's future rise are major consulting firms. Deloitte's Deloitte Insights (September 2017) expects 'India's potential workforce to rise from 885 million to 1.08 billion people over the next two decades from today', and 'remain above a billion people for half a century,' betting that 'these new workers will be much better trained and educated,' than their existing counterparts. It contends that 'the next 50 years will, therefore, be an Indian summer that redraws the face of global economic power.'

McKinsey & Company's report, 'India at Turning Point' (August 2020), believes the 'trends such as digitisation and automation, shifting supply chains, urbanisation, rising



incomes and demographic shifts, and a greater focus on sustainability, health, and safety are accelerating' to 'create \$2.5 trillion of economic value in 2030 and support 112 million jobs, or about 30% of the non-farm workforce in 2030.'

The Economist is optimistic about India's future too. In its May 14, 2022 issue, it had this to say about India, 'As the pandemic recedes, four pillars are clearly visible that will support growth in the next decade; the forging of a single national market, an expansion of industry owing to the renewable-energy shift and a move in supply chains away from China, continued pre-eminence in IT, and a high-tech welfare safety-net for the hundreds of millions left behind by all this.' But not all are so bullish about India.

The Financial Times in an article, 'Demographics: Indian workers are not ready to seize the baton', believes that India's bad infrastructure and poorly skilled workforce will impede its growth.

RAND Corporation's report, 'China and India, 2025. A Comparative Assessment', commissioned by the U.S. Secretary of Defense endorses this view as does the 2018 report, 'An Indian Economic Strategy to 2035', released by the Australian government and another

on India from the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) titled, 'Going for Growth'. Their pessimism may be overstated and even outdated today. It is possible that McKinsey & Company and Deloitte are seeing something many others are missing out on.

There is so much going on for India today compared to China, the only country it can be reasonably compared to. It is still a young country and in a much better position to transform itself compared to China of the 1970s. It is still an open society where mass protest matters and produces results. Indians have not been traumatised as Chinese were at the time of Mao Zedong's death and in the aftermath of two events he set off and which roiled China for decades - The Great Leap Forward and the Cultural Revolution.

The IT technologies now available in India, and most importantly the Internet they run on have matured exponentially. Many things right from video conferencing to instantaneous payments and satellite imaging are getting better and cheaper by the day.

Thanks to the COVID-19 pandemic, we know these can revolutionise learning and transform Indian society at an astonishingly low cost, unimaginable through much of

China's economic liberalisation.

Creaky and inadequate as they are, India's administrative systems manage to deliver and its infrastructure is in far better shape today than it was for China at the start of its reforms. Nor did India impose the equivalent of China's one child policy that has seen China suffer the consequences of a prematurely ageing society with a skewed gender ratio.

Deep divide in China

India does not have a Hukou system which in China tethers rural folk to rural parts creating a deep divide between a small and prosperous urban China and a much larger, very deprived rural China about which the world knows so little about.

As Scott Rozelle at Stanford University's Centre on China's Economy and Institutions, writes in his book co-authored with Natalie Hell, Invisibly China - How the Urban Rural Divide Threatens China's Rise, 'Thanks to the Hukou system disincentivising migration to urban areas, only about 36% of China's overall population is urban and fully 64% is rural (some 800 to 900 million people).' The huge divide between urban and rural China is, according to Rozelle, almost unbridgeable.

To wring the best out of its demographic dividend, India needs to invest massively in quality school and higher education as well as healthcare - sectors it has neglected for decades - across India on an unprecedented scale, literally in trillions of rupees between now and 2050 when it would have reached the apogee of its population growth.

India must seize the moment and not be incremental in its approach. Given the will it can initiate and see through a transformation that will stun the world, even more than China's has so far.

A masterful novel casts new light on race, politics, and self

Bestselling British-Pakistani novelist Mohsin Hamid's new work of speculative fiction, 'The Last White Man', will hit the stands on August 29, announced Penguin Random House India (PRHI) on Wednesday. To be released under Penguin's 'Hamish Hamilton' imprint, the book claims to explore themes of 'human connection, love, loss, and identity' through a sociocultural lens.

'It is a book not just about loss, but about hope and optimism, about a new kind of world being born. I'm looking forward to having it in the world,' said the UK-based author in a statement.

It is the story of protagonist Anders who one morning wakes to find that his skin has turned dark.

Soon, reports of similar occurrences surface across the land. Readers join Anders on his journey in search of answers as his bonds with his family and his lover are tested.

According to the publishers, this record of loss of identity and privilege experienced by those so far untouched is a perfect fit for fans of Franz Kafka's novella 'Metamorphosis'.

First published in 1915, 'Metamorphosis' narrates the story of salesman Gregor Samsa, who wakes one morning to find himself transformed into a huge insect and subsequently struggles to adjust to his new condition.

Hamid's previously authored novels are 'Moth Smoke' (2000), 'The Reluctant Fundamentalist' (2007), 'How to Get Filthy Rich in Rising Asia' (2013), and 'Exit

West' (2017).

Mohsin Hamid has twice been shortlisted for the Booker Prize (from his four previous novels) most recently for 'Exit West' - a novel which examined the issue of migration (and particularly a world which aimed to close borders) both conventionally via the story of a tentative relationship, and very unconventionally via the use of a magic realism device which effectively took supposedly uncontrolled migration to its logical extreme by postulating a series of mysterious Narnia-style doors which open between different parts of the world and which

permit (at least temporarily) instant migration, and which from there explored less of a dystopian world than a utopian (or at least optimistic one) as people come to terms with the need to adapt to migration.

The book was a short, easy and enjoyable read but one which prompted reflection on its themes. It was one marked by a distinctive style of writing which was at some times very lyrical and other times almost mundane and with a mix of extremely long paragraph or page style sentences mixed with much shorter sections (although even there the use of 'And' to start sentences gave those sections a similar 'run-on' quality when read in one's head. I described the novel as very reminiscent of the writing of José Saramago, and particularly his 'Blindness' - a fable type novel exploring the development of a premise of an alternate world, but also set against a gentle love story. In fact I said it was Saramago but with more punctuation.

Ashok Leyland expects commercial vehicle industry to grow at fast pace in coming qtrs

Hinduja group flagship Ashok Leyland expects the commercial vehicle industry to grow at a fast pace in the coming quarters, with economic activity gaining momentum and demand picking up across segments, according to a senior company official.

The Chennai-based company, the second-largest player in the commercial vehicle space, expects both its domestic sales and overseas shipments to remain robust in the remaining part of the fiscal. "I believe so because the pandemic and some of the uncertainties that were there globally are now all behind us. There is no reason why the commercial vehicle industry should not grow," Ashok Leyland Whole Time Director and CFO Gopal Mahadevan told to media.

He was replying to query whether the worst is behind the commercial vehicle industry, which saw sales dip in the last few years on account of regulatory changes and low offtake during the pandemic period.

"The commercial industry will grow with trucks and buses expected to do well... truck sales will improve as many industries would require more units as they



are running at full capacity," Mahadevan stated.

Besides, with the Covid impact waning and schools, colleges and offices opening up, it would lead to a rise in intercity and intracity travel, aiding the sale of buses, he noted.

"So, bus sales should also go up. Also, light commercial vehicles will grow because there has been a disruptive change in behaviour and consumer patterns. E-commerce has grown... So, what's happening is that e-commerce will become a big driver, and last-mile delivery will become very, very important,"

Mahadevan said.

On the outlook for the exports, he said that the company expects dispatches to grow in the current financial year compared to FY22, with the demand scenario improving across markets.

The company shipped out around 11,000 units last fiscal and expects to improve the tally in the current financial year.

"So, we are positive. We have some challenges in Sri Lanka, which hopefully will get sorted out. But the rest of the SAARC market is slowly warming up. And we are expecting our exports to grow higher

than last year definitely," Mahadevan stated. The company, which exports mainly to SAARC, the Middle East and Africa, also expects better dispatches this year on account of an improved product range that is well suited for customer requirements outside the country, he added.

Mahadevan noted that the company has been "astutely managing" the chip shortage issue to lessen the impact on production and cater to enhanced demand. "Even now, it does pose a challenge, and the manufacturing teams are working round the clock to manage it," he added. The supply has definitely improved but is yet to reach a normal level, Mahadevan noted. "Hopefully, in the next couple of years, we will see a lot of capacity coming up, which would be helpful for the industry," he noted.

When asked about the prospects of electric mobility, Mahadevan said: "Definitely it is the focus area for the future... the adoption of electric vehicles is much faster than what we thought." It will be adopted at a fast clip across the LCV and bus segments while the heavy

commercial vehicle vertical would take longer to encompass the change, he added. "India typically is a very fast adopter of technology... So, we will see the same adoption happening but as a country, we would need to look at the overall infrastructure for charging. You know, because there's no point in saying that we'll have an electric cell which will, you know, be charged with power generated from coal," Mahadevan said.

So, there should be more green energy that is available to charge these electric vehicles, he added. Besides, there needs to be some uniformity as regards to the charging stations, Mahadevan said. "So all of this can be worked out. It's not very difficult," he added. Elaborating on the company's strategy, Mahadevan said it has received robust orders for electric buses from various states. "We are also not going to randomly pick up orders for the sake of it. You know, orders should be sensible, they should be executable. They have to be profitable. So, we are ensuring that we are pursuing business very methodically," he noted.

SpiceJet clears all outstanding principal dues of AAI

SpiceJet on Tuesday said it has entered into an agreement with the Airports Authority of India (AAI) and cleared all outstanding principal dues of the airport operator.

"With this, SpiceJet will no longer remain on 'cash and carry' at AAI-run airports across the country and will revert to advance payment mechanism for daily flight operations," the airline's statement noted.

The Centre-run AAI had in 2020 put SpiceJet on a 'cash and carry' basis as the carrier was unable to clear its previous dues.

In the 'cash and carry' model, the airline has to make daily payments to the AAI for various charges -- navigation, landing, parking, and others -- to operate flights.

SpiceJet said on Tuesday: "In another big boost for the air-



line, AAI will release SpiceJet's INR 50 crore bank guarantee following the airline clearing all its principal dues. This will result in additional liquidity for the airline."

SpiceJet has been making losses for the last four years. It incurred net losses of Rs 316 crore, Rs 934 crore and Rs 998 crore in 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21, respectively.

In the April-December period of 2021, the airline posted a net loss of Rs 1,248 crore. The airline is yet to declare results for January-March period of 2022.

Aviation regulator DGCA had on July 27 ordered SpiceJet to operate not more than 50 per cent of its flights, which were approved for summer schedule, for a period of eight weeks.

Limited Liability Partnership (LLP) and Companies are incorporated under the Ministry of Corporate Affairs as per the provisions of LLP Act, 2008 and Companies Act, 2013. This was stated by Union Minister of State for Corporate Affairs Rao Inderjit Singh in a written reply to a question in Lok Sabha.

Giving more details, the Minister stated that during FY 2021-22, 1,67,080 companies were registered as compared to 1,55,377 in the previous year. Further, during FY 2020-21, 43,050 LLPs were registered as compared to 42,187 in previous year. On National Financial Reporting Authority (NFRA), the Minister stated that the Company Law Committee constituted by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs in its report of March, 2022 (Chapter 1 Para 11) has inter-alia, recommended that NFRA be empowered to take appropriate action against other contraventions under NFRA Rules, 2018, in addition to its existing powers to take action against 'professional or other misconduct'.

EVs going mainstream, fire incidents help industry mature: Ather Energy CEO

Electric two-wheelers are going mainstream and the fire incidents will only help manufacturers to focus on quality, thus helping the industry mature, according to Ather Energy co-founder and CEO Tarun Mehta.

The Hero MotoCorp-backed firm expects that by the end of this decade up to 30 million electric two-wheelers would be sold in India and Ather Energy would invest a "lot more" for capacity growth over the next few years. "What has happened recently, I think, has ended up maturing the industry. This will push more and more manufacturers to focus more on quality and reliability," Mehta told to media.

He was responding to a query on how the fire incidents of electric two-wheelers of various manufacturers, such as Ola Electric, Okinawa, PureEV and even Ather's sole case, would impact the growth of EVs in India. The incidents are pushing more and more players to focus on "quality as the number one parameter", he said, adding in any case "EVs are going mainstream irrespective, but with better quality products, this will become a no brainer".

In April this year cases of electric two-wheelers of manufac-



turers -- such as Ola Electric, Okinawa Autotech and PureEV -- catching fire were reported. It prompted the government to form a panel to examine. Union road transport and highways minister Nitin Gadkari warned companies of penalties if they were found to be negligent and said they would be ordered to recall the defective vehicles.

Subsequently, Ola Electric recalled 1,441 units of its electric two-wheelers. Okinawa also announced its recall of 3,215 units of its Praise Pro electric scooter to fix any issue related to batteries. Similarly, PureEV recalled 2,000 units of its ETrance+ and EPluto 7G models.

On the incident of an Ather electric scooter catching fire, Mehta said it was "an accident vehicle, where screws were replaced, water was poured in... it was not a real scenario". "We've never had a fire in a functioning vehicle. We're extremely proud of that record," he added.

Unitech founder Ramesh Chandra granted medical bail by Delhi HC

The Delhi High Court has granted eight-week medical bail to realty firm Unitech's founder Ramesh Chandra in a money laundering case against him. Justice Jasmeet Singh released Chandra on medical grounds and asked him to furnish a personal bond to the tune of Rs 25,000 with a surety bond of the like amount.

The court noted that from the medical record, it was clear that Chandra's condition was quite serious and his ailments have assumed larger proportions on account of age.

India's services sector growth falls to 4-month low in July

India's services sector lost momentum in July as demand was curtailed by competitive pressures, elevated inflation and unfavourable weather, a monthly survey said on Wednesday.

The seasonally adjusted S&P Global India Services PMI Business Activity Index fell from 59.2 in June to 55.5 in July, pointing to the slowest rate of growth in four months.

For the 12th straight month, the services sector witnessed an expansion in output. In Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) parlance, a print above 50 means expansion while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

As per the survey, service providers that reported higher sales in July mentioned favourable demand conditions and fruitful advertising. However, growth was dampened by fierce competition and unfavourable weather, survey participants said. According to Pollyanna De Lima, Economics Associate Director at S&P Global Market



Intelligence, there was a "noticeable loss of momentum for the Indian service economy as demand was somewhat curtailed by competitive pressures, elevated inflation and unfavourable weather. Both output and sales increased at the weakest rates for four months".

The domestic market remained the key source of sales growth as international demand for Indian services worsened further, the survey said.

Meanwhile, business sentiment in the service economy was subdued in July as only 5

Input costs rose sharply, though at the slowest pace in five months.

"The subtle easing in cost inflationary pressures to a five-

month low was also welcomed by services firms struggling to preserve margins and contributed to a softer rise in prices charged. Yet, survey participants again reported considerable strain from food, fuel, input, labour, retail and transportation costs," Lima said.

On the jobs front, July data showed a negligible increase in service sector employment across India. The rate of job creation was fractional and broadly similar to June. The vast majority of firms left payroll numbers unchanged amid a lack of need to raise workforces.

Meanwhile, the S&P Global India Composite PMI Output Index -- which measures combined services and manufacturing output -- fell from 58.2 in June to 56.6, highlighting the slowest increase since March.

RBI likely to raise key policy rate by at least 35 bps to check inflation: Experts

Days after the US Fed raised the interest rate, the RBI may go in for its third consecutive policy rate hike by at least 35 basis points to check high retail inflation, experts said.

The central bank has already announced to gradually withdraw its accommodative monetary policy stance.

The Reserve Bank of India's rate-setting panel -- the Monetary Policy Committee -- will meet for three days from August 3 to deliberate on the prevailing economic situation and announce its bi-monthly review on Friday.

With retail inflation ruling above 6 per cent for six months continuously, the RBI had raised the short-term borrowing rate (repo) twice so far this fiscal -- by 40 basis



points in May and 50 basis points in June.

The existing repo rate of 4.9 per cent is still below the pre-Covid level of 5.15 per cent. The central bank sharply reduced the benchmark rate in 2020 to tide over the crisis created by the pandemic.

Experts are of the view that

The possibility of an aggressive 50 bps and a measured 25 bps hike cannot be ruled out either, it added.

A research report by Bank of Baroda said that while the US Federal Reserve raised the rate by 225 bps in CY22, the RBI has hiked the repo rate by 90 bps. An aggressive rate hike by the Fed is feeding expectations that the RBI may also front load its rate hikes.

However, conditions in India do not warrant an aggressive stance by the RBI, it added. "... in the absence of any fresh shocks, India's inflation trajectory is likely to evolve in line with the RBI's projections. Hence, we expect that the RBI may hike rates by only 25 bps in Aug'22, followed by another 25 bps rate hikes in the next

two meetings," it said.

The government has tasked the RBI to ensure consumer price index-based inflation remains at 4 per cent with a margin of two per cent on either side.

Dhruv Agarwal, Group CEO of Housing.com, said while other banking regulators across the world, including the Fed, are raising rates aggressively, the situation in India does not warrant that kind of approach yet.

"In our estimate, it is expected to be in the range of 20-25 basis points," he said.

In a report, Radhika Rao, Executive Director and Senior Economist at DBS Group Research, said the RBI monetary policy committee is expected to stay focused on price stability

RBI's financial inclusion index rises, showing growth across all segments

The RBI's composite financial inclusion index (FI-Index) capturing the extent of financial inclusion across the country rose to 56.4 in March 2022, showing growth across all parameters.

The index captures information on various aspects of financial inclusion in a single value ranging between 0 and 100, where 0 represents complete financial exclusion and 100 indicates full financial inclusion.

"The value of FI Index for March 2022 stands at 56.4 vis-a-vis 53.9 in March 2021, with growth witnessed across all the sub-indices," the RBI said in a statement.

In August last year, the central bank said it has been conceptualised as a comprehensive index, incorporating details of banking, investments, insurance, postal, as well as the pension sector, in consultation with government and respective sectoral regulators.

The FI-Index comprises three broad parameters -- Access (35 per cent), Usage (45 per cent), and Quality (20 per cent) with each of these consisting of various dimensions, which are computed based on several indicators.

The FI-Index was constructed without any 'base year' and as such it reflects the cumulative efforts of all stakeholders over the years towards financial inclusion. The index is now published annually.

M/s Adani Data Networks Ltd has obtained 400 MHz spectrum in mm wave band (26 GHz). M/s Bharti Airtel Ltd has obtained 19,867.8 MHz in 900, 1800, 2100, 3300 MHz and 26 GHz bands. M/s Reliance Jio Infocomm Ltd has obtained 24,740 MHz spectrum in 700, 800, 1800, 3300 MHz and 26 GHz. M/s Vodafone Idea Ltd has obtained 6,228 MHz spectrum in 1800, 2100, 2500, 3300 MHz and 26 GHz.

DRI detects Customs duty evasion of Rs. 2,217 crore by Vivo Mobile India Pvt. Ltd.

During an investigation pertaining to Vivo Mobile India Private Limited (hereinafter referred to as 'M/s Vivo India'), the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) has detected Customs duty evasion of around Rs 2,217 crore.

M/s Vivo India is a subsidiary company of Vivo Communication Technology Co. Ltd., Guangdong, China, and is engaged in the business of manufacturing, assembling, wholesale trading as well as distribution of mobile handsets and accessories thereof.

During the course of investiga-

tion, searches were conducted by DRI officers at the factory premises of Vivo India, which led to the recovery of incriminating evidence indicating wilful mis-declaration in the description of certain items imported by M/s Vivo India, for use in the manufacture of mobile phones. This mis-declaration resulted in wrongful availment of ineligible duty exemption benefits by Vivo India, amounting to Rs 2,217 crore. After completion of the investigation, a Show Cause Notice has been issued to M/s Vivo India demanding Customs duty amounting to Rs. 2,217 crore, under the provisions of the Customs Act, 1962. A sum of Rs 60 crore has been voluntarily deposited by Vivo India, towards discharge of their differential duty liability.

Recently, in another set of investigations conducted by DRI, Show Cause Notices demanding duty of Rs. 4,403.88 crore have been issued to Oppo Mobiles India Private Limited.

IOC sold petrol at Rs 10 a litre loss, diesel at Rs 14



Indian Oil Corporation sold petrol at a loss of Rs 10 per litre and diesel at Rs 14 a litre during April-June, leading to the firm reporting its first quarterly net loss in over two years, a report said.

The nation's largest oil refining and fuel retailing firm reported a net loss of Rs 1,992.53 crore in April-June compared to Rs 5,941.37 crore of net profit in the same period a year back and Rs 6,021.9 crore in the preceding January-March quarter.

"IOC (Indian Oil Corporation) reported an 88 per cent year-on-year decline in its standalone EBITDA to Rs 1,358.9 crore and a net loss of Rs 1,992.5 crore, despite record high gross refining margins (GRMs) of USD 31.8 per barrel

for the quarter.

"Earnings decline was driven by a sharp fall in retail fuel margins for petrol and diesel with an estimated net loss of Rs 10 per litre for petrol and Rs 14 a litre for diesel for the quarter and inventory loss of Rs 1,500-1,600 crore due to excise duty cut in the quarter," ICICI Securities said.

While fuel retailers are supposed to revise petrol and diesel prices daily in line with cost, IOC and other state-owned firms Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) kept prices on hold despite a rise in input cost.

The basket of crude oil India imports averaged USD 109 per barrel, but the retail pump rates

were aligned to about USD 85-86 a barrel cost.

This is the first quarterly loss in over two years. The company had reported a net loss in January-March 2020, but that was on account of inventory losses on processing costlier crude.

"While GRMs have come off post the Q1 highs to levels of USD 11.8 per barrel (a low of USD 0.8 per barrel was reached in the third week of July), marketing margins have improved owing to lower product prices. Therefore, we do factor in lower losses for FY23 (April 2022 to March 2023) and GRMs sustaining at USD 17-18 per barrel levels over the full year," ICICI Securities said in the report.

Typically, oil companies calculate a refinery gate price based on import parity rates. But if the marketing division sells it at prices less than import parity, losses are booked.

State fuel retailers are supposed to align rates with an international cost every day. But, they have periodically frozen prices before crucial elections.

IOC, BPCL and HPCL stopped revising rates ahead of assembly elections in states like Uttar Pradesh last year. That 137-day freeze ended in late March, with prices being raised by Rs 10 per litre each before another round of freeze came in force in early April.

Govt cuts windfall tax on diesel, ATF export, raises levy on domestic crude oil

The government has halved the windfall tax on the export of diesel and scrapped the levy on jet fuel (ATF) shipments but raised the tax on domestically produced crude oil.

The tax on the export of diesel was cut to Rs 5 per litre from Rs 11, according to an official notification issued on Tuesday evening.

Export of petrol will continue to attract nil tax.

The tax on domestically produced crude oil was hiked to Rs 17,750 per tonne from Rs 17,000, a move that will hit producers like ONGC and Vedanta Ltd.

The cut in taxes - the second in as many weeks - came as India's trade gap swelled to a record.

The measures come hours

after data showed India's trade deficit ballooned to a record high in July, as elevated commodity prices and a weak rupee inflated the country's import bill.

The gap between exports and imports widened to USD 31.02 billion in July from USD 26.18 billion in June. This, as a result of exports falling and elevated commodity prices together with a weak rupee, is inflating the import bill.

Imports jumped 43.59 per cent in July from the year-ago month, while exports dropped 0.76 per cent.

India first imposed windfall taxes on July 1, joining a growing number of nations that taxes super normal profits of energy companies. But international oil prices have cooled



since then, eroding profit margins at both oil producers and refiners.

On July 1, export duties of Rs 6 per litre (USD 12 per barrel) were levied on petrol and ATF and a Rs 13 a litre tax on

the export of diesel (USD 26 a barrel). A Rs 23,250 per tonne windfall tax on domestic crude production (USD 40 per barrel) was also levied.

Thereafter, in the first fortnightly review on July 20, the

Rs 6 a litre export duty on petrol was scrapped, and the tax on the export of diesel and jet fuel (ATF) was cut by Rs 2 per litre each to Rs 11 and Rs 4, respectively. The tax on domestically produced crude was also cut to Rs 17,000 per tonne.

Now, the export tax on diesel and ATF has been cut following a drop in refinery cracks or margins. But the levy on domestically produced crude oil has been raised in line with a marginal increase in international crude prices.

Prashant Vasishth, Vice President and Co-Head, Corporate Ratings, Iera Limited, said "the tinkering of the export duties is being done on the basis of the movement of the cracks spreads on these prod-

ucts, which have been elevated but volatile due to the geopolitical situation, lockdown news, inventory levels, demand fluctuations etc".

Additionally, the windfall tax on crude production has also been increased, though marginally considering the international crude oil price trends.

"Though certainly tinkering these rates frequently creates its own uncertainty, however, considering the high level of prices (crude prices consistently above USD 100 per barrel, crack spreads of diesel above USD 30 a barrel etc), a number of countries have imposed windfall taxes and accordingly as a measure per se, India is not the only country to implement this," he said.

IndiGrid to acquire Raichur Sholapur Transmission Company for Rs 250 cr

India Grid Trust (IndiGrid) on Tuesday said it will acquire a 100 per cent stake in Raichur Sholapur Transmission Company Private Limited for Rs 250 crore. It has signed a share purchase agreements (SPAs) for the acquisition of 100 per cent



shareholding on July 30, 2022, IndiGrid said in a statement. However, the completion of acquisition would depend upon receipt of relevant approvals and completion of contractual obligations, it added.

According to the company, its "Board has signed share purchase agreement to acquire 100 per cent shareholding and economic interest in one or more tranches, in RSTCPL from Patel Engineering Limited (owning 33.34 per cent), Simplex Infrastructures Limited (owning 33.33 per cent stake) and BS Limited (owning 33.33 per cent)".

The acquisition would cost Rs 250 crore, as per the statement. IndiGrid CEO Jyoti Kumar Agarwal, "As a low-risk operational transmission asset with long-term contracted cash flows and minimal counter-party risk, this acquisition fits in well with IndiGrid's growth strategy. We are committed to grow IndiGrid by acquiring value accretive projects while ensuring predictable distributions and superior investor returns". IndiGrid is India's first and largest Infrastructure Investment Trust (InvIT) in the power transmission sector. President Wickremesinghe made the remarks while addressing a ceremonial sitting of Parliament which reconvened on Wednesday after a seven-day adjournment. "I wish to specially mention the assistance provided by India, our closest neighbour, in our efforts of economic revitalisation, he said.

"The government of India under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi has given us a breath of life. On behalf of my people and that of my own, I convey our gratitude to Prime Minister Modi, the Government and people of India," Wickremesinghe added.

Last week, Modi congratulated President Wickremesinghe and said that India will continue to be supportive of the quest of the people of the island nation for stability and economic recovery, through established democratic means.

Pelosi says US will not abandon Taiwan as China protests

US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, meeting leaders in Taiwan despite warnings from China, said Wednesday that she and other members of Congress in a visiting delegation are showing they will not abandon their commitment to the self-governing island.

Today the world faces a choice between democracy and autocracy, she said in a short speech during a meeting with Taiwan's President Tsai Ing-wen. America's determination to preserve democracy, here in Taiwan and around the world, remains ironclad.

China, which claims Taiwan as its territory and opposes any engagement by Taiwanese officials with foreign governments, announced multiple military exercises around the island and issued a series of harsh statements after the delegation touched down Tuesday night in the Taiwanese capital Taipei.

Taiwan decried the planned actions. Such an act equals to sealing off Taiwan by air and sea...and severely violates our country's territorial sovereignty, said Captain Jian-chang Yu at the National Defence Ministry's



media briefing Wednesday morning. Pelosi's trip has heightened US-China tensions more than visits by other members of Congress because of her high-level position as leader of the House of Representatives. She is the first speaker of the house to come to Taiwan in 25 years, since Newt Gingrich in 1997. Tsai, thanking Pelosi for her decades of support for Taiwan, presented the speaker with a civilian honor, the Order of the Propitious Clouds.

Facing deliberately heightened military threats, Taiwan will not back down, Tsai said. We will firmly uphold our nation's sov-

ereignty and continue to hold the line of defense for democracy.

Tsai later said in a news conference, Military exercises are unnecessary responses. Shortly after Pelosi landed, China announced live-fire drills that reportedly started Tuesday night, as well as a four-day exercise beginning Thursday in waters on all sides of the island. China's air force also flew a relatively large contingent of 21 war planes, including fighter jets, toward Taiwan. Pelosi addressed Beijing's threats, saying that she hopes it's clear while China has stood in the way of Taiwan going to certain meetings,

that they understand they will not stand in the way of people coming to Taiwan as a show of friendship and of support.

Pelosi noted that support for Taiwan is bipartisan in Congress and praised the island's democracy. She stopped short of saying that the US would defend Taiwan militarily, emphasizing that Congress is committed to the security of Taiwan, in order to have Taiwan be able to most effectively defend themselves.

Her focus has always been the same, she said, going back to her 1991 visit to Beijing's Tiananmen Square, when she and other lawmakers unfurled a small banner supporting democracy, two years after a bloody military crackdown on protesters at the square. That visit was also about human rights and what she called dangerous technology transfers to rogue countries.

Pelosi is visiting a human rights museum in Taipei that details the history of the island's martial law era later Wednesday before she departs for South Korea, the next stop on an Asia tour that also includes Singapore, Malaysia and Japan.

US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi arrives in Malaysia, tensions rise over Taiwan visit

US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi arrived in Malaysia on Tuesday for the second leg of an Asian tour that has been clouded by an expected stop in Taiwan, which would escalate tensions with Beijing.

The plane carrying Pelosi and her delegation touched down at an air force base amid tight security, national news agency Bernama reported.

While there have been no official announcements, local media in Taiwan reported that Pelosi will arrive in Taipei on Tuesday night, becoming the highest-ranking elected US official to visit in more than 25 years.

The United Daily News, Liberty Times and China Times — Taiwan's three largest national newspapers — cited unidentified sources as saying she would fly to Taipei and spend the night after visiting Malaysia.

China, which regards Taiwan as its territory, has warned of repercussions, saying its military will "never sit idly by" if Pelosi pushes ahead with the visit.

The White House on Mon-




day decried Beijing's rhetoric, saying the US has no interest in deepening tensions with China and "will not take the bait or engage in saber rattling".

White House National Security Council spokesperson John Kirby underscored that the decision on whether to visit the self-ruled island was ultimately Pelosi's.

He noted that members of Congress have routinely visited Taiwan over the years.

Kirby said administration officials are concerned that

Al Qaeda leader Zawahiri killed in US strike in Afghanistan



Al-Qaeda chief Ayman al-Zawahiri, who played central role in 9/11 attacks and later created the terror group's regional affiliate in the Indian subcontinent, has been killed in a US "precision strike" in Afghanistan's capital Kabul, in the biggest blow to the global terror network since killing of its founder Osama bin Laden in 2011 in Pakistan.

Zawahiri, who assumed the leadership of al-Qaeda after the death of bin Laden, was killed in a drone strike carried out by CIA on Saturday evening at a house in Kabul where he was sheltering to reunite with his family, US President Joe Biden said on Monday, declaring that "justice has been delivered and this terrorist is no more".

The 71-year-old Egyptian surgeon, who had a US\$ 25 million bounty on his head, was bin Laden's second-in-command during 9/11 attacks and took over as the head of al-Qaeda after his death. He remained a visible international symbol of the terror group, 11 years after the US killed bin Laden during a raid in Pakistan's Abbottabad in May 2011.

"I authorised a precision strike that would remove him from the battlefield, once and for all," Biden said on Monday in a speech from the White House.

According to officials, Zawahiri was on the balcony of a safe house when the drone fired two missiles at him. Other family members were present, but they were unharmed and only Zawahiri was killed.

"He was deeply involved in the planning of 9/11, one of the most responsible for the attacks that murdered 2,977 people on American soil. For decades, he was the mastermind of attacks against Americans," said Biden.



The US president was kept abreast of the strike against Zawahiri as he was isolated with a rebound case of Covid-19. Biden spoke outdoors on Monday from the Blue Room Balcony at the White House.


"Now, justice has been delivered and this terrorist leader is no more. People around the world no longer need to fear the vicious and determined killer," Biden said.

"The United States continues to demonstrate our resolve and our capacity to defend the American people against those who seek to do us harm. We make it clear again tonight, that no matter how long it takes, no matter where you hide, if you are a threat to our people, the United States will find you and take you out. Biden said the precision strike targeting was the result of the "extraordinary persistence and skill" of the nation's intelligence community.

"Our intelligence community located Zawahiri earlier this year - he moved to downtown Kabul to reunite with members of his immediate family," Biden said.

His killing will bring closure to families of the victims of the 2001 attacks, Biden said, adding that Zawahiri had also masterminded other acts of violence, including the suicide bombing of the USS Cole naval destroyer in Aden in October 2000 which killed 17 US sailors. The strike comes one year after Biden ordered the withdrawal of US troops from Afghanistan, prompting Taliban forces to rapidly seize control of the war-torn nation.

had won her heart and she started liking all his habits. After which she proposed to her servant.



Nancy Pelosi's visit to Taiwan will have "serious implications" for regional peace: Pak

Lending its support to its all-weather ally China, Pakistan on Wednesday said US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's visit to Taiwan will have "serious implications" for regional peace and stability.

Pelosi landed in Taipei on Tuesday night disregarding China's stern warnings. She is the highest-ranking US official to visit Taiwan in 25 years. After Pelosi's arrival in Taiwan, China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued a strong statement, saying that her visit is a "ser-



ious violation of the one-China principle and the provisions of the three China-US joint communique".

China claims Taiwan as part of the mainland and vows to

integrate what it calls the rebel province even by force.

The Foreign Office said Pakistan "is deeply concerned over the evolving situation in the Taiwan Strait, which has serious implications for regional peace and stability. Pakistan also reaffirmed its strong commitment to the One-China Policy and firmly supported China's sovereignty and territorial integrity.

The statement said the world is already reeling through a critical security situation due to the Ukraine conflict, with

destabilising implications for international food and energy security. The world cannot afford another crisis that has negative consequences for global peace, security and economy.

Pakistan strongly believes that inter-state relations should be based on mutual respect, non-interference in internal affairs, and peaceful resolution of issues by upholding principles of UN charter, international law and bilateral agreements, the Foreign Office statement said.

UK PM Election: Rishi Sunak tables 'radical' tax vision



As the voting process for the new Conservative Party leader formally opened with postal ballots being mailed out to Tory members from Monday, Rishi Sunak vowed to cut the basic rate of income tax by 20 per cent in a few years, if elected Britain's Prime Minister.

The 42-year-old former Chancellor, who is trailing his rival Liz Truss in the opinion polls and bookmaker's odds, said his "radical vision" would mean a 20 per cent tax reduction - the "largest cut to income tax in 30 years".

Tax cuts have become a dominant issue in the election campaign and while Truss has pledged cuts from day one, Sunak sought to focus on a more measured approach to curb soaring inflation.

Under the proposals, Sunak said he would build on his previously announced 1 per cent cut to income tax in April 2024. A further 3 per cent off by the end of the next Parliament, around 2029, will be paid for through economic growth.

Indo-Thai bilateral trade touched USD 15bn in FY'22



The bilateral trade between India and Thailand reached an all time high of around USD 15 billion in 2021-22 as the domestic market remains attractive for Thai investors, said Union Minister of State for External Affairs Rajkumar Ranjan Singh.

The economic cooperation between the two countries in trade, investment and tourism have continued to flourish during recent years, Singh said on Saturday at the ongoing second edition of the North East India Festival, being held in Bangkok.

"Thailand is the fourth largest trading destination for India in the ASEAN region. Bilateral trade between India and Thailand has reached an all time high of around USD 15 billion in 2021-22. The Indian market remains attractive for

Thai investors," he added. Commerce, Culture and Connectivity define the future focus areas of cooperation between India and Thailand, Singh stressed.

"India provides huge opportunities for investment in infrastructure, including roads, ports, power sector, food processing, renewable energy, digital technology, logistics and electric vehicles," he said. Singh expressed happiness over the fact that businesses from both sides can enter into long-term partnerships for more diverse and resilient supply chains.

"India's Act East policy complemented by Thailand's Act West policy has provided the basis for building a multi-faceted partnership between the two countries. Northeast India is the gateway to Thailand and other

South East Asian countries. "We would welcome the business community of Thailand to explore the Indian market for greater trade and investment linkages with particular emphasis on Northeastern states," the Indian minister said. All the Northeastern states are rich in natural resources, minerals and forest wealth, exotic fruits and vegetables, and unparalleled scenic beauty, he stressed.

Echoing similar sentiments, Thailand Deputy Prime Minister Jurin Laksanawit said: "Thailand is historically and geographically very close to India's North East." He thanked the Indian government for organising the second edition of North East India Festival at Bangkok in the 75th year of India's diplomatic relations with Thailand. "The North East India Festival will help in pushing trade, tourism and people to people connect with both the regions," Laksanawit said.

The three-day festival showcasing the Northeastern region's rich diversity and opportunities began on Friday with the presence of a number of dignitaries, including central ministers of India and Thailand along with several chief ministers from the region.

India, Maldives ink six pacts to broad-base ties



India and Maldives on Tuesday inked six agreements to expand cooperation in several key areas with Prime Minister Narendra Modi asserting that New Delhi has been and will continue to be the "first responder" to any need or crisis facing the island nation.

After wide-ranging talks with visiting Maldivian President Ibrahim Mohamed Solih, Modi announced a Line of Credit of USD 100 million (one million = 10 lakh) for the neighbouring country for the completion of development projects in a time-bound manner.

"We also reviewed projects for the construction of 4000 social housing units in Greater Male today. I am happy to announce that we will additionally provide financial support for 2,000 social housing

units," he said in his media statement.

"We have also decided to provide an additional line of credit of USD 100 million so that all projects can be completed in a time-bound manner," he added.

The prime minister said the threat of trans-national crime, terrorism and drug trafficking is serious in the Indian Ocean and close India-Maldives ties were vital for peace in the entire region.

He said the India-Maldives partnership is not only working in the interest of citizens of both countries, but it is also becoming a source of peace and stability for the entire region.

India has been and will continue to be the first responder to any need or crisis of Maldives, he said.

India signs pact with 116 countries to get cheaper international airfare

Government of India has activated bilateral air service agreements with 116 countries and is allowing foreign carriers to serve India to add more flights to the country's metropolitan cities.

"India has signed bilateral Air Services Agreement (ASA) with 116 foreign countries," Minister of State for Civil Aviation Gen VK Singh (ret'd) informed the Parliament in a written reply on Monday.

"Any designated foreign airline can operate to/from a point in India if it is designated as a point of call in the bilateral Air Services Agreement (ASA) signed between India and the country which has designated the airline," he added.



Travel industry experts said the government's move will benefit passengers and may bring down airfares.

"It is good to have bilateral air service agreements with countries to increase seat capacity and have an open sky policy for foreign carriers as it will benefit passengers," Anju Wariah, Director, Group Business Development, STIC

operations to and from any international airport, including Kannur International Airport, under the ambit of bilateral ASAs concluded by India with foreign countries.

The travel industry has been urging the government for quite some time that foreign carriers be allowed to operate from cities other than metro airports. "Indian-designated carriers are free to mount operations from any city but a foreign carrier is not.

Till the time it's not done, there will be a demand-supply gap which can impact prices," Anju Wariah said.

'Main hoon jhum jhum Jhumroo': Kishore's forgotten onscreen talent



Known primarily for his gifted, effortless, and vibrant singing, he was actually a complete entertainment package in Hindi films -- being also an accomplished actor, lyricist, composer, producer, director, screenwriter -- and both on and off screen, his biggest eccentric.

From "Khwab ho tum ya koi haqeeqat" to "Pal pal dil ke paas", "Zindagi ke safar mein maqam" to "Khaikhe paan Banaraswala", and "Khlite hain gul yahan" to "Kya yehi pyar hai", Kishore Kumar's mellifluous voice still reverberates for stars from Dev Anand to Dharmendra, Rajesh Khanna to Amitabh Bachchan, and Shashi Kapoor to Sanjay Dutt, in a range of emotions, moods and situations. However, it goes on to eclipse his own onscreen prowess, where he could essay madcap antics of young romantic leads to restrained and sensitive essaying of more complex and nuanced characters.

Everyone has their own range of favourite songs from Kishore Kumar, born on this day (August 4) in 1929, but if you ask about his film roles, what comes usually to mind is "Chalti Ka Naam Gaadi" (1958) where he starred with his elder brothers Ashok and Anup, or his over-the-top depiction of a pan-chewing music 'ustad'-cum-love relationship consultant in "Padosan" (1968).

But there was much more to him as an actor, as he demonstrated a flair for essaying a wide variety of roles, held his own against the likes of Dilip Kumar, Meena Kumari ("Naya Andaz", 1956), and even Jayalalithaa (in "Man-Mauji", 1962) and went on to inspire future generations. While he has nearly 3,000 songs (including a duet where he sings the female side in falsetto) from 1,200 odd films, he also went on to act in about 90 films between 1946 and 1982. Why he is not as famous for them is that most of these came before 1970 or bombed at the box office. And why he didn't do more films is rooted in his own whimsies. Kishore Kumar was notorious for asking his servants to ward off filmmakers, biting their hand as they paid him his fees, or not turning up for work. In one case, where a director obtained a decree from the court directing him to turn up for work, he only did what he was expressly told to do. You can imagine how that would have turned out.
