India takes over SCO rotating presidency

Uzbekistan on Friday handed over the rotating presidency of the eight-member Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) to India in this historic city of Samarkand. Uzbek President Shavkat Mirziyoyev chaired the 22nd SCO summit in Samarkand which was attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "As a result #SCOSamarkand-Summit, India will host next SCO summit as a chairman of Organisation in 2023. We will do our best to assist India, our strategic partner, in the implementation of this responsible mission," Uzbek Foreign Minister Vladimir Norov tweeted.

In this historical Uzbek city, the prime minister also said India is making progress to become a manufacturing hub while highlighting various aspects of the country's economy.

"We are making progress on making India a manufacturing hub. India's young and talented workforce makes us naturally competitive," he said.

Delhi liquor policy: ED conducts fresh raids at 40 locations



Enforcement Directorate on Friday launched fresh raids at about 40 locations across the country, including at the Delhi residence of a YSRCP

MP, as part of a money laundering investigation into alleged irregularities in the now scrapped Delhi Excise Policy, official sources said.

The searches are being conducted at premises linked to liquor businessmen, distributors and supply chain networks in Nellore and some other cities in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Delhi-NCR, they said. The premises linked to YSRCP Lok Sabha MP from Ongole M Sreenivasulu Reddy in Delhi are also being searched, they said. Reddy has links with liquor distributorship business. He could not be contacted by PTI despite repeated attempts. The action started early morning with agency teams being escorted by police and paramilitary personnel at the locations being searched by them.

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi set to return as attorney general

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi is set to return as India's attorney general from October 1, sources familiar with the development said. Rohatgi was the country's attorney general from June 2014 to June 2017. The present man in the job, K K Venugopal, 91, was re-appointed as the top law officer of the country for three months on June 29. He had been unwilling to continue in the position due to "personal reasons" but acceded to a request by the government, Law Ministry officials said. Venugopal was appointed as attorney general in July 2017, succeeding Rohatgi. The attorney general usually has a tenure of three years. When Venugopal's first term as the attorney general was to end in 2020, he requested the government to relieve him of his responsibilities on account of his age. He later accepted a fresh tenure of one year since the government was keen on him continuing given the high-profile cases he was handling and his vast experience at the Bar. Rohatgi, a veteran lawyer, has appeared in several high profile cases in the apex court as well as high courts across the country. He appeared for the Special Investigation Team (SIT) in the apex court, which had heard a plea by Zakia Jafri pertaining to the 2002 Gujarat riots. Jafri, the wife of slain Congress leader Ehsan Jafri who was killed during the violence at Gulberg Society in Ahmedabad on February 28, 2002, had challenged the SIT's clean chit to 64 people, including Narendra Modi who was Gujarat chief minister during the riots.

Punjab Government declares War against stubble burning



Punjab Government has declared a War on stubble burning to save water, soil and environment from pollution. Punjab Agriculture Minister Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal today held a meeting with district Agriculture officers to discuss a blueprint to control stubble burning and implementation at the district level.

farmers, running awareness campaigns and some new scientific methods such as decomposer spray are being adopted to stop stubble burning practice in the state. Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal gave a call to all the officers and employees to work practically at ground zero instead of just doing paperwork. Agriculture Minister today directed the senior officers not to give leave to any officer or employee of the agriculture department till November 7.

Punjab Agriculture Minister also ordered to establish a state level control room to keep a vigil on all the activities in the field regarding stubble burning awareness campaign and immediate reporting of cases of stubble burning. The Minister also asked the Additional Chief Secretary Agriculture Saravjit Singh to be in regular touch with the district civil and police administration regarding the issue of stubble burning.

Ghulam Nabi Azad receives militant threat

Former Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Azad has received a threat from the militant outfit The Resistance Front (TRF) claiming that the recent entry of Azad in the politics of Jammu and Kashmir following his exit from the Congress is part of a well-thought-out strategy by the BJP-run central government.

"Before leaving the party, Azad had a closed-door meeting with Union Home Minister Amit Shah and National Security Advisor (NSA) Ajit Doval," an online poster said. The poster also claimed that the BJP is using displaced Kashmiri Pandits for its political agenda and Ghulam Nabi "is part of the plan B of the Centre." The TRF also said that Rahul Bhat, a Kashmiri Hindu killed as part of a target killing campaign by terrorists in Kashmir Valley, was in direct contact with the NSA Ajit Doval. "Our intelligence wing detected the synergy of these two and we eliminated Rahul Bhatt. There are many people like Rahul Bhat, who are working for the center by staying here. Soon they too will be found," the TRF claimed in its statement.

Haryana becoming a junction for supply of IED in the country

With repeated incidents of recovery of Improvised Explosive Devices (IED) in Haryana state in past few months including recent case a couple of days ago in which IED packet along with RDX was recovered on Jind Road near Kainchi Chowk at Kaithal when SHO Titram police station Ram Lal reached at the spot immediately along with police force and entire area around the spot was sealed and a case was registered under Explosive Substance Act. STI Ambala started investigation in the case. A bomb disposal squad arrived from Madhuban (Karnal) and diffused the bombs. Surprisingly, in past few months IED has also been recovered at Ambala, Karnal and

Kurukshetra districts which is a clear indication that Haryana becoming a junction for supply of explosive to other states in the country. Maqsood Ahmed SP Kaithal also arrived at the spot told media persons that in this case of blast of timer bomb it would have caused severe destruction in about 75 meters area due to explosion.

According to information, three hand grenade timer bombs, IED was recovered near Ambala on 20th March, 2022 near an educational institute on the national highway at village Saddopur close to Punjab-Haryana border. Similarly, Karnal police on an information on 5th May, 2022 recovered IED in a Inova car at Bastada Toll Plaza near Karnal and arrested four persons



carrying explosive material identified as Gurpreet Singh and his brother Amandeep Singh both residents of Ferozpur, Parminder Singh and Bhupinder residents of Ludhiana all arrested by the police. On 4th August 2022 police recovered a packet containing 2.5 kg RDX along with a pistol near Mirchi Hotel on G.T. Road near Shahabad in Kurukshetra district and arrested a suspected person identified as Shamsher Singh

a resident of Tarantaran in Punjab state. Investigation by STI from Punjab revealed that a gangster identified as Harvinder Singh alias Rinda wanted in several criminal cases in Punjab managed to flee and presently residing in Pakistan running a network in India trying to spread terrorism on the directions by a terrorists group in Pakistan. According to National Investigation Agency information, Harvinder Singh alias Rinda managing to send explosive material near Indrapak border area in Punjab through drone collected by his companions in Punjab and transfer the consignment at towns in neighboring Haryana state for onward deliveries at the destinations in rest part of country.

PM Modi has given 1,000 sq kms of territory to China without fight: Rahul Gandhi

NEW DELHI: After reports of disengagement with China at Ladakh, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday attacked the government for not restoring the status quo of April 2020 at Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China. Rahul said, «China has refused to accept India's demand of restoring status quo of April 2020. PM has given 1000 Sq Kms of territory to China without a fight. Can GOI explain how this territory will be retrieved?» he said. Government sources on Tuesday said that there has been complete disengagement at key flashpoints in the Ladakh sector

between India and China. The process started on September 8 after months of talks and 16 rounds of corps commander meetings. As per sources the two sides have moved back after May 2020 friction. The sources said that both sides have verified their posts at LAC by the ground commanders. According to sources both India and China moved back their frontline troops to the rear from the face-off site of PP-15 in the Gogra-Hotsprings area in eastern Ladakh and dismantled temporary infrastructure there as part of a five-day disengagement process.

Indian diplomats upset with Punjab CM's false claim on BMW setting manufacturing plant in state

Diplomats in the External Affairs Ministry in India and abroad are upset with the claims made by the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann about setting up of a new manufacturing plant by leading auto giant BMW in the state which was later refuted by the latter. According to a source with the Ministry, the diplomats see it as a question of credibility and said that such tall claims

should be avoided as it hurts the credibility of the country and the government too. The source said that it has left the diplomats embarrassed. During Mann's visit to Germany, the Indian diplomats had arranged a meeting. However, after that he announced that BMW had decided to set up a new manufacturing plant in his state. "The efforts of Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann to rope in major investments from Germany bore fruit on

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday said that the AAP government in Punjab will "fully support" the Agnipath Scheme during the recruitment drives of Agniveers. Kejriwal's clarification came after reports that the Punjab government was not supportive of the recruitment drive.

We will completely cooperate with the scheme and the army," Kejriwal said while replying to a question in his first offline press conference since the formation of the AAP government in Delhi in February 2020. Later, his Punjab counterpart

Bhagwant Mann clarified that directions have been given for "complete support" on the Agnipath scheme. "All deputy commissioners were directed to provide complete support to Army authorities for recruitment of Agniveers in Punjab. Any laxity shall be viewed seriously. Every effort will be made to recruit the maximum number of candidates in the army from the state," Mann said in a tweet. The Agnipath scheme, launched in June this year, seeks to recruit soldiers in the Army, Navy and Air Force on a short-term contract of four years.

Seizure of 1050 gms of gold valued at Rs. 54.70 lakh at SGRDJI Int'l Airport, Amritsar

Custom Department has seized Gold worth Rs. 54.70 lakhs at Shri Guru Ramdasji International Airport. An official statement issued here today stated that an employee of Spicejet who came down from aerobridge stairs after entering Flight no. SG56 from Dubai to Amritsar on 15-16.09.2022 was intercepted by officers of Customs, SGRDJI Airport, Amritsar at 4:20AM. During checking, two packets wrapped in Black adhesive tape were found in his possession. Nine Gold Biscuits weighing 1050 grams valuing Rs. 54,70,500/- were found concealed in those packets. On further interrogation, he admitted that the gold was collected from under a seat which was left there by an international passenger, said the official. The said employee disclosed that he was smuggling gold by the same modus operandi for the last 3 months. The said employee has been arrested by the Customs Officers.

SUV driven by juvenile crushes food delivery boy to death in Delhi

A speeding SUV driven by a juvenile allegedly crushed a food delivery boy to death in Central Delhi's Desh Bandhu Gupta Road, police said. According to information, the incident took place at around 11 p.m. on Friday night. The father of the accused juvenile, said to be a class 9 student, is a millionaire businessman who was arrested in a cheating case around two months ago. "He was driving an MG Hector. A friend of the juvenile who, a foreign national, was also with him at the time of the incident. The duo left the SUV at the crime scene and fled," the police said. The victim identified as Rahul Kumar, had been working with Swiggy, the online food ordering and delivery platform.

Four arrested in case of Crypto fraud worth crores of rupees

The Haryana Police have arrested four persons allegedly cheated large number of people amount worth crores of rupees by luring them with an offer of high returns through a fake company Crypto World Trading Company having office in Sector 8 Ambala City with a wide network of agents mainly in adjoining districts Karnala, Kurukshetra, Yamunanagar and many other districts in the state. Addressing a press conference SP Ambala Jashandeep Singh Randhawa said that CIA staff Ambala police led by Inspector Harjinder Singh arrested four accused identified as Kapil Jaiswal a resident of Ekta Vihar Ambala Cantt, Vikas Kalra a resident of Ambala City, Tarun Taneja, and Ramesh Kumar both residents of Kurukshetra. Randhawa told that a case was registered at Sadar police station Ambala City on the complaint of Mandeep Singh a resident of village Bhanokheri near Ambala



City on 24th August 2022 when Kapil Jaiswal was arrested on 6th September, Vikas was arrested from Amritsar (Punjab) on 8th September, Tarun was nabbed from Pilani (Rajasthan) on 10th September and Ramesh was arrested from Ambala on 12th September. Ambala Sadar police station had received several complaints against the firm after complaint lodged by Mandeep resident of village Bhanokheri duped by them as well as several others amount worth lakhs of rupees investing with Crypto World Trading Company. Randhawa said, during investigation, properties worth about Rs 60 lakh have been seized from

the accused including the seizure of 13 bank accounts and the recovery of four luxury vehicles, cash, and gold. He said investigation is going on by a team of SIT led by DSP and action will be taken against whoever is found to be involved during the course of the investigation and detail of all agents associated with this cheat company are being procured for further action. Information reveals, company owners as well as its agents were assuring investors claiming that their company was working on the investment software designed by google duly approved by the government.

Court sentences man to 12 yrs in prison for sexually assaulting woman

AMBALA: A man has been sentenced to 12 years' imprisonment by a court here for sexually assaulting a woman and instigating her to attempt suicide. Additional Sessions Judge, Fast track court, Ambala, Aarti Singh on Wednesday awarded the jail term to Vijay Kumar, a resident of the city. According to the prosecution, the woman, who was then 18 years old, had jumped before a train at Ambala Cantt railway station in 2017 which left both her legs crushed.

On the basis of her statement, the Government Railway Police, Ambala Cantt had registered a case against Kumar. In her complaint, the woman said Kumar had assured to marry her while concealing the fact that he was already married. He took her to various hotels where he sexually assaulted her. When she insisted on marriage he refused and threatened her with dire consequences. In the meantime she came to know that Kumar was already married.

Gang of 3 including 2 women in sale-purchase of new born children busted by CM Flying Squad

CM Flying Squad Haryana on a information recently busted a gang of three including two women at Faridabad running a network of agents in Delhi, Haryana, Punjab and other neighboring states for purchase of new born children delivered by pregnant women from extremely poor families and selling them earning handsome profit in deals. Among those arrested by CM Flying Squad team during raid at a hotel in Badarpur were identified a male Deepak a resident of Mahindra Park Delhi, his two female companions Meenu a resident of Uttam Nagar Delhi and Anita resident of Sultanpuri Delhi both also involved in carrying passengers on E-Riksha. All three members of the gang as well as their agents usually used to visit government hospitals in search of pregnant women from financially weaker families likely to have delivery in a hope to have a deal for the new arrival.

CM Flying Squad led by Rajesh Chechi DSP succeeded in preparing a fake couple will-



ing to purchase a newly born child through racket of three. The fake couple comprising of Satbir a police sub inspector and Rajesh Kumari ASI contacted three expressing desire to own a newly born child and were offered a nine days old child when they gathered in a hotel at Badarpur to finalized deal when three demanded Rs 6 lakh and the deal was finalized at Rs 4 lakh after negotiations. At the time of getting advance payments against deal CM Flying Squad team prepared a video as well as recorded entire deal and on a signal conducted raid and arrested three in a case under human trafficking act.

Ramesh Chechi DSP told media persons that CM Flying Squad on a clue had arrested organizer of a NGO last month allegedly finalized a deal for the sale of 15 days old child at Ballabhgarh at Rs 1.5 lakh

and another deal was finalized by them in sale of a nine days old baby born in a hospital at Delhi sold to a couple in Punjab few months ago and the three earned handsome amount in this deal. Chechi told that during preliminary investigation the three arrested accuse admitted having a chain of agents in different places usually in touch with pregnant women belonging to financially weaker families usually visiting government as well as charitable hospitals and convince them to sell their expected child. They told that their agents also visit private hospitals to remain in search of female clients usually fail to conceive and willing to own a newly born child and do not hesitate to spend any amount.

According to Alok Kumar Mittal CID Chief in Haryana state while talking to media persons at Chandigarh told that CM Flying Squad in the state during 344 raids in past three months has registered 265 cases and arrested 126 persons. Among few important cases exposed in Haryana state by the Flying Squad included several manufacturing units functioning in the state illegally.

High Court stays imprisonment of Daler Mehndi in human trafficking case

A relief for Pop singer Daler Mehndi, Punjab and Haryana High Court on Thursday granted stay to the decision of a Patiala Court that had sentenced him to two years of imprisonment in a 2003 human trafficking case.

He was lodged in the Central Jail in Patiala. The artist was imprisoned after being given a two-year prison term on July 14 for illegally transporting people abroad while they were acting as members of his band.

Police had registered a case against the singer, his brother



Shamsher Singh -- who died in October 2017 -- and two others, after it was alleged that the accused took money from people to the tune of Rs 1 crore

failed to return the money. The case was registered in 2003 in Patiala. Daler Mehndi was subsequently arrested but released on bail after a few days. Daler Mehndi's arrest was quite controversial at a police station in Patiala in 2003 as he was asked to strip by a few junior police officers during interrogation. He spent a few days behind bars before being released on bail.

His younger brother, singer Mika, who accompanied him during the surrender in 2003, had to beat a hasty retreat near the police station when an "organised" mob surrounded their vehicles. Complainant, Bakhshish Singh, alleged that the deal never matured and the accused

Hooch deaths: High court orders transfer of Haridwar District Excise Officer

Uttarakhand High Court has asked the state government to transfer the District Excise Officer of Haridwar, where nine people had died recently after consuming illicit liquor. A division bench comprising Chief Justice Vipin Sanghi and Justice R C Khulbe asked the government to ensure the order is complied with within 10 days. Nine people had died after consuming illicit liquor in Shivgarh and Phoolgarh villages of Haridwar district recently, while several others were hospitalised.

Quality Hammer to hit corrupt employees in Haryana: CM Khatter

Past few years scenario in Haryana reveals that few government employees including officers feel accepting bribe is a part of their duty as such large number of scams of value worth crores of rupees in important developmental projects in the state were exposed attracting headlines in newspapers in past couple of years especially at Ambala, Faridabad, Gurugram, Karnal, Jind and Panchkula at the time when state government was facing spread of epidemic outbreak in the state and was busy in saving the lives of victims suffering from disease, whereas,

on the other hand few corrupt government employees were busy in collecting bribe. There is a long list of such developmental projects in which corrupt government employees released payments to contractors and suppliers on the basis of fake bills without work done or receipt of material. According to information, several such developmental projects are yet incomplete due to shortage of funds allocated for these projects still hanging on fire as a result of handful of corrupt government employees.

Information reveals, large number of officers as well as staff involved in corrupt practices



in past sometime are now on the radar of Quality Assurance Hammer introduced by ruling government in the state likely to recover bribe amount along with dividends from corrupt employees. Ruling government in the state presently focusing on

this vital issue in which people in the state have been deprived of benefits and facilities due delayed projects as a result of a handful of corrupt employees in government offices. While talking to media persons Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khatter said that all such cases have been referred to Alok Mittal Chief CID Haryana and Shatrughit Kapoor Chief of State Vigilance Bureau to investigate frauds and push all those behind bars involved in corruption.

Khatter on receipt of large number of complaints has announced a Quality Assurance Committee at Gurugram to bring transparency in devel-

opmental engineering projects in different sectors including education, health, irrigation, PWD, construction of roads and transport announced in the state which will function under direct control of Haryana Chief Secretary Sanjeev Kaushal to monitor entire functioning. He told that all government tenders as well as purchases will be made on line on a portal to bring transparency in procurements, avoid corruption as well as supply of sub-standard material. Khatter said, 174 developmental projects of value worth Rs 2000 crore have been announced recently in the state of September 4, 2022.

378 lost children & 482 adults rescued in 8 months in Haryana

Anti-human Trafficking Teams in Haryana police played an important role to rescue 378 lost children and 482 lost adults in Haryana state in past eight months with effect from January 1 till August 31 this year. Information reveals large numbers of children as well as old-age persons seen begging at the bus stands, railway stations, outside religious temples and other public places or involved in child labor rescued by the police and assisted to re-join their family. In few cases where lost children are found handicapped, deaf and dumb unable to hear or speak and found at the mercy of others, in such cases members of Anti-human Trafficking units have to face lot of inconvenience while joining these rescued children with their families. There are few rescued children from other states unable to understand language and during counseling of such children Anti-

human Trafficking staff members have to face lot of inconvenience.

Chief of Crime Branch Haryana O.P. Four Ambala Central Jail prisoners threatened Dy Jail Supdt to kill him, his family by Lawrence gang

Baldev Nagar police station Ambala City registered a case against four prisoners lodged in Ambala central jail under various sections of IPC allegedly threatened to kill Dr. Rajiv Kumar Deputy Superintendent arrived with Neelum and other security men on the information that prisoners are carrying a mobile phone in the jail for search operation of mobile phone illegally carried by them. When Dr. Rajiv Kumar started search for the mobile phone in the barrack in which they were lodged they started misbehaving and abused him threatening to kill him as well as his family by Lawrence gang members claiming themselves members of the same group.

Dr Rajiv Kumar along with security staff traced the

mobile from a prisoner during search but they refused to hand over the same and started throwing mobile phone from one prisoner to another and finally thrown the same on the floor damaged and broken into pieces. The four prisoners were identified as Surya Pratap Singh a brother of gangster Kala Rana, Ankur Singh, Yog Raj alias Pinka Gujjar and Jitender Singh all involved in large number of criminal activities. Dr. Rajiv called another jail security staff which arrived immediately and over powered all four prisoner, later shifted them in separate cells. Information reveals, Dr Rajiv Kumar earlier received threatening calls from prisoner Surya Pratap Singh also on January 26 as well as June 13 this year when six mobile phones were recovered in the



jail during a search operation. Information revealed that Surya Pratap Singh brother of gangster Kala Rana was having a criminal record allegedly involved in several criminal cases registered against him in past including murder of a Yamunanagar based businessman Raghunath alias Raghu on August 28, 2020 and firing on Dilbag Singh brother of a former INLD MLA when he was lodged in jail and was

sent to Kutikshetra jail. Surya Pratap Singh was also named allegedly involved in conspiracy of a double murder case in which two youths Vishal and Mohit were shot dead in broad daylight opposite DAV Riverside School on Jagadhari Road Ambala Cantt in a conspiracy by him and the arms were allegedly supplied by him in month January this year.

175 years old historic jail was set up at Ambala during British rule in the country and given status of central jail in 1947 after independence of country. Jail spread across 12 acres area has 17 barracks to accommodate prisoners including a separate section for female prisoners and a hospital inside the jail. Nathu Ram Godse killer of Mahatma Gandhi was hanged along with Narayan Apte in

this jail in 1949 which still exists in the jail for display, followed by other hangings in this jail including Basant Kumar who had thrown bomb on a procession led by then British Viceroy Lord Harding in 1912 and a freedom fighter Jashleshwar Singh. As many as 12 hangings were held in this jail during a mutiny against British government in 1915 in which 18 persons were held, among those the imprisonment of six persons was changed to life imprisonment. Among those arrested and lodged in this jail during protest against British rulers were Sucheta Kriplani later became first chief minister in U.P., and Bibi Amar Kaur sister of martyr Bhagat Singh, Raj Kumari Amrit Kaur later became Health Minister in the country.

Blister will not stop us, we will unite India, says Rahul Gandhi

Amid intermittent rains and swelling public turnout, Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra entered the third day in Kerala on Tuesday, with the Congress leader and scores of supporters marching along the streets without umbrella when it rained. Gandhi, who has embarked on the 3,500 km Kanyakumari-Kashmir footmarch, said though the participants suffered from blisters on their feet, the campaign would go on. Scores of people lined up on the roadsides despite rains in the city, to greet Gandhi and the other padayatri. The Congress leaders, including Gandhi, walked along the streets without umbrella when it was raining. In a Facebook post, Gandhi said, "even though the feet have blisters, we are out to unite the country. We are not going to stop. #BharatJodoYatra," and uploaded a related video clip. The third day of the yatra,



which commenced around 7.15 am from Kaniyapuram near Kazhakootam, saw an encouraging turnout of people like the previous two days of the Kerala leg of the foot march, which is set to cover 3,570 kilometres from Kanyakumari to Kashmir over a 150-day period. When the yatra reached its first halt point of the day at Attingal here, AICC general secretary in-charge of communications Jairam Ramesh tweeted, "The padayatra has just reached the morning break point at Mamom near Attingal, where there will be a number of interactions with different groups." The yatra is scheduled to resume at 5 pm and end for the day at Kallambalam junction here. On Monday evening, the yatra had covered 100 kilometres when it reached Kazhakootam. Addressing a large crowd there, Gandhi had said elections can be won with hatred, violence

and anger, but it cannot solve the socio-economic problems facing the country. "India's dream is broken, not scattered. To realise that dream, we are bringing India together. 100 km done. And, we have just begun," Gandhi tweeted at the end of the day's yatra. Ramesh had tweeted that the Bharat Jodo Yatra has completed exactly 100 km and that it has "rattled, unnerved and disturbed the BJP, whereas the Congress party has already been refreshed 100-fold. Every step we walk renews our resolve!" The 150-day foot march was launched from Kanyakumari in neighbouring Tamil Nadu on September 7 and will cover 12 states and two Union territories. The Bharat Jodo Yatra, which entered Kerala on September 10 evening, will traverse through the state covering 450 kilometres, touching seven districts over a period of 19 days before entering Karnataka on October 1.

Bharat Jodo Yatra, a new freedom movement: Economist H M Desarda



The Congress party's Bharat Jodo Yatra is a "new freedom movement or a second freedom struggle" to unite the people against the BJP's alleged "polarising strategy", a noted economist and former member of Maharashtra State Planning Board professor H M Desarda, said here on Tuesday. The professor, who has joined the yatra from Kanyakumari to support it on behalf of the civil society, said political parties and mass movements opposed to

BJP's alleged "polarising strategy" should unite. Speaking at a press conference here, he claimed that the yatra has been jointly organised by the Congress and civil society organisations to oppose the allegedly bankrupt policies of the Central government. "The yatra should unite the common people to counter the forces of fascism and the status quo. The need of the hour is to unite 90 per cent of the people who are unorganised farm-

ers, self-employed daily wage earners and construction and domestic workers. "It is a new freedom movement, a second freedom struggle," he added. Highlighting the problems he has seen in the country, the professor claimed that the growth and governance model in the country and many States was still "feudal, colonial, pseudo-socialist and parasitic". He further contended that even after 75 years of independence, though the colonial rulers have left, "their bankrupt policies are still being perpetrated" and as a result, more than a billion people in the country are in deep distress which has allegedly worsened during the Narendra Modi government's rule. Therefore, the character of the Congress party has to undergo a radical change, it should become the Nationalist Movement that it was during Mahatma Gandhi's time, he said.

Hyderpora encounter: SC dismisses man's plea for exhuming son's body

The Supreme Court on Monday denied a petition of a man Mohammad Latief Magrey, who was killed in Hyderpora, in Srinagar last November. A bench comprising Justices Surya Kant and JB Pardiwala said once buried, the body should not be disturbed. While the court said it respected the sentiments of the father, the bench made it clear that it cannot decide matters on sentiments and the relief granted by the Jammu and Kashmir High Court was just and equitable.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Wednesday that Hindi has brought India special honour globally and that its simplicity and sensitivity always attract people. In his tweet on Hindi Diwas, Modi expressed heartfelt thanks to all who have made tireless efforts to enrich and strengthen the country's largest spoken language. Hindi Diwas is observed every year on September 14.

Fuel prices regulated by election dates, not by global rates: Congress

NEW DELHI: Congress alleged that petrol and diesel prices were regulated by the election dates and not due to the global rates. Addressing a press conference, party spokesperson Gaurav Vallabh alleged that retail inflation, GDP growth, and a depreciating rupee are some of the examples that paint a concerning picture of how the economy was being managed. He alleged that the BJP government was creating new lows with more data points released by its own government. The middle and lower-income groups suffer the most due to the callousness and incompetence of the government. «Retail inflation has been above RBI's upper band of



6 per cent for the last seven months. Commodities such as food, vegetables, and fuel hurt the middle and lower-income groups most. The government has been primarily the most inconsiderate towards the fuel prices. Since they have a cascading effect across all economic activities, the government's inactions speak of its cluelessness and misguided focus, « he said. The party leader said the

prices of crude oil have been consistently on a downward spiral for the last few months and are at a seven-month low. «But the prices of petrol and diesel in our country don't seem to reflect this trend, even after deregulation, which means that the prices of petrol and diesel should change as per the global prices.» As per the Petroleum Planning & Analysis Cell (PPAC, Government of India), Crude Oil Indian Basket as on September 8 was USD 88.00 per bbl. On May 21, the government announced a cut in excise duty on petrol and diesel by Rs 8 and Rs 6 a litre, respectively, leading to a reduction of petrol rates by Rs 9.5 per litre and diesel by Rs 7 per litre

Centre trying to establish 'Agency Raj', deterring job creation: Mamata Banerjee

Two days after the Enforcement Directorate (ED) seized Rs 17.32 crore in cash from the residence of a city-based businessman in connection with a mobile gaming app fraud case, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee echoed her Cabinet colleagues in slamming the recent central agency activities in the state. «The Union government does not want more jobs to be created. An attempt is being made to establish an 'Agency Raj'. There is absolutely no development,» the Chief Minister said at an event to hand over appointment letters to various beneficiaries under 'Utkarsh Bangla', a skill development scheme of the state government, at the Netaji Indoor Stadium here.



She also launched a scathing attack on the Centre over disinvestment of government stake in public sector entities. «The Union government is selling Railways, SAIL and CIL. How will new jobs be created? In the midst of this Agency Raj, we are trying to develop industries and create jobs in the state. I am proud that after being trained here, the youth of West Bengal are getting job offers from outside. I request those who are going outside

to come back to the state as there will be enough jobs in West Bengal only,» the Chief Minister said. She also attacked the opposition parties in the state and the media for showing West Bengal in poor light. «They are always resorting to slander. Had they highlighted the positive works of the state government, both Bengal and its people would have benefited,» Banerjee said. Ever since the seizure of large amount of cash by the ED on Saturday, Trinamool Congress leaders have been slamming the recent central agency activities in the state. When the counting of notes was on Saturday, state minister and Kolkata Mayor Firdah Hakim had said that the continuous raids and search operations by the central agencies were part of the Centre and BJP's ploy to show West Bengal in poor light.

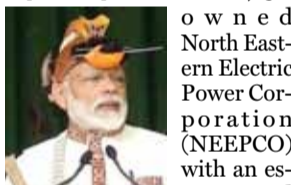
BJP releases another sting video on Excise Policy, alleges 'money used in Punjab & Goa elections'

PM to inaugurate NE's biggest power plant and only greenfield airport in Arunachal

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, responding to Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister Pema Khandu's request, has agreed to inaugurate 600 MW Kameng Hydro Electric Project which will be northeast India's largest power plant. He will also inaugurate the region's first greenfield airport at Itanagar, officials said on Friday. An official of Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said that Khandu apprised Modi about the Kameng Hydro Electric Project, executed by the state-



owned North Eastern Electric Power Corporation (NEEPCO) with an estimated cost of around Rs 8, 000 crores and about the greenfield airport, commissioned by the Airport Authority of India at a cost of Rs 650 crore. The Chief Minister told the Prime Minister that the 600 MW Kameng Hydro Elec-

tric Project is the largest in the northeastern region and it would be a boon for the power sector in the country, especially the northeastern states and provide power for grid stability. The Chief Minister said that the Director General of Civil Aviation has issued the necessary licence on September 7 to operationalise the greenfield airport, which was recently renamed by the state government as "Donyi Polo Airport".

EC declares 253 registered unrecognised political parties as 'inactive'

NEW DELHI: As part of its action for ensuring due compliance by Registered Unrecognised Political Parties (RUPPs), the Election Commission of India (ECI) led by Chief Election Commissioner, Rajiv Kumar, has delisted 86 non-existent RUPPs and declared another 253 as 'inactive RUPPs'. The action against 339 non-compliant RUPPs takes the tally to 537 defaulting RUPPs since May 25, 2022. The ECI said that as per statutory requirements under Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, every political party has to communicate any change in its name, head office, office-bearers, address, PAN etc. to the Commis-

sion without delay. A total of 86 RUPPs have been found to be non-existent either after a physical verification carried out by the respective chief electoral officers of concerned states/UTs or based on report of undelivered letters/notices from the postal authority sent to the registered address of the concerned RUPP. It may be recalled that the ECI had delisted 87 and 111 RUPPs through orders dated May 25 and June 20, respectively. The latest decision against 253 non-compliant RUPPs has been taken based on reports received from chief electoral officers of seven states -- Bihar, Delhi, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Telangana



and Uttar Pradesh. These 253 RUPPs have been declared inactive, as they have not responded to the letter/notice delivered to them and have not contested a single election, be it Assembly polls or Parliamentary elections of 2014 and 2019.

These RUPPs have failed to comply with the statutory requirements for more than 16 compliance steps since 2015 and are continuing to default, said a senior EC official. Of the above 253 parties, 66 RUPPs actually applied for a common symbol as per Para

10B of the Symbols Order 1968 and did not contest the respective elections. It is pertinent to note that privilege of a common symbol is given to RUPP based upon an undertaking of putting up at least 5 per cent of total candidates with regard to said legislative Assembly elections of a state. «Possibility of such parties occupying the available pre-election political space by taking benefits of admissible entitlements without contesting elections cannot be ruled out. This also tends to crowd out the political parties actually contesting elections and creates a confusing situation for the voters,» added the official.

Farmers protest against proposed IIT campus in Goa

Farmers staged a protest against the proposed Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) campus in Goa, claiming the state government was acquiring land for it without their consent. After the farmers' protest on Monday in Sanguem area of South Goa district, Chief Minister Pramod Sawant said some people had the habit of unnecessarily opposing projects. Talking to reporters in state capital Panaji on Monday, Sawant said the land where the IIT was proposed belonged to the government and they will ensure no one faces injustice due to the project. Farmers protested after team of state revenue officials

went to Sanguem to demarcate land for the upcoming IIT Goa campus. A team led by Deputy Superintendent of Police Nilesh Rane tried to pacify the farmers, but they went ahead with the protest. The farmers have been reluctant to give their land for the project. We have been cultivating paddy at the place where the government wants to acquire land for the IIT Goa campus. We don't want IIT, a woman farmer told police. She claimed the state government was acquiring land without the consent of the farmers, who have been growing crops on it for generations. Some of the other protest-



ers said they will not allow the demarcation process to continue at the site.

The Sanguem police have registered a case against the protesting farmers for ob-

structing the land demarcation work, a senior police official said.

Meanwhile, Chief Minister Sawant said some people had the habit of unnecessarily opposing projects. The land where the IIT is proposed belongs to the government. Some people are just encroaching the land, he said adding that people should shun the negative mindset. We will ensure people do not face any injustice. If someone is a tenant or has a document to prove his/her (land) ownership, they can submit it to the district collector, the chief minister said. Sanguem BJP MLA Dhanash Pal Dessai said the IIT campus in Goa will help in creating employment opportunities for locals.

President Murmu to attend Queen Elizabeth's funeral



President Droupadi Murmu will represent India at the state funeral of Queen Elizabeth II in London on September 19. Murmu will be visiting London from September 17 to 19 to offer condolences on behalf of the Government of India. Queen Elizabeth, the former head of state of the UK and Head of the Commonwealth of Nations, passed away on September 8. President Droupadi Murmu, Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar and Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed condolences at the demise of Queen Elizabeth II.

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar visited the British High Commission in New Delhi on September 12 to convey India's condolences. India also observed a day of national mourning on Sunday (September 11). Prime Minister Narendra Modi had tweeted, "Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II will be remembered as a stalwart of our times. She provided inspiring leadership to her nation and people. She personified dignity and decency in public life. Pained by her demise. My thoughts are with her family and people of UK in this sad hour."



Weaker sections have no hedge against inflation

The latest retail inflation data from the National Statistical Office is a sobering reminder that accelerating price gains still remain the single biggest challenge to policymakers as they try to steer Asia's third-largest economy to a more durable recovery from the pandemic-induced slump. Inflation based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) quickened in August to a provisional 7%, from 6.7% in July, as the pace of gains in food prices as measured by the Consumer Food Price Index accelerated by a sizeable 93 basis points to 7.62%, from July's 6.69%. And rural consumers bore a disproportionately higher burden: with month-on-month changes in both food prices and overall inflation appreciably greater at 0.88% and 0.57% respectively, compared with the 0.50% and 0.46% rates of urban inflation. Of particular concern is that inflation in the prices of cereals — staple grains in every household — surged to 9.57% from the preceding month's 6.9% rate. Month-on-month the pace was a disconcerting 2.4%. The Finance Ministry has asserted that the increase in headline inflation was “moderate”, even as it sought to downplay the significance of food price pressures by terming food and fuel prices as “transient components”. It also pointed to the steps by the Government to cool prices. And it cited oils and fats and pulses as two items where prices had begun to ease in response to the Centre's steps. However, the prices of pulses and products quickened by 1.7% month-on-month. Services categories including housing, health, education, recreation and personal care too witnessed sequential increases in price gains. The challenge going forward would be for providers to tread carefully so as not to yet again depress consumption by raising prices too quickly. Policymakers would do well to heed the dictum of a former RBI Governor, who never tired of reiterating that ‘containing the build up of price pressures is the best anti-poverty programme’ as the poor ‘have no hedge against inflation’.

Climate action & cooperative federalism

India's procurement of 5,450 electric buses and subsequent increase in ambition to have 50,000 e-buses on the country's roads by 2030 represent the immense potential for progress on climate and development goals through close collaboration between the Union and State governments. With the shared aim to rapidly electrify a key pillar of India's public transportation, recent governance efforts have created a new business model for e-buses. If this sector is further developed, it can reduce air pollution in cities and fuel import bills, improve the balance sheets of State transport companies, and spur domestic manufacturing and job creation.

State of State-owned buses

There are currently around 1,40,000 registered public buses on India's roads, with large numbers of them having sputtering engines that spew planet-warming fumes into the atmosphere. At least 40,000 of these buses are at the end of their lifespan and must be taken off the roads immediately.

However, most buses are owned and operated by State transport undertakings, which are in poor financial health. In part, they incur large losses because they play an important social function by providing subsidised fares to crores of Indians each day. With a few exceptions such as Mumbai's Brihanmumbai Electric Supply & Transport Undertaking (BEST) of the Brihanmumbai Mahanagarपालिका, when State transport undertakings go to the market to buy buses, they face problems of fragmented demand and high prices. Furthermore, there are limitations to nation-wide action on this issue as State governments control issues such as transit, urban governance and pollution control.

A success story

Until recently, there had never been a unified



tender to address some of these challenges. Cooperative federalism can easily become a fraught issue. However, in the case of the Grand Challenge 1, a tender for 5,450 buses (across five major Indian cities — Kolkata, Delhi, Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Surat), the opposite happened. Instead of a race to the bottom, the respective expertise, strengths and needs of Union Ministries and States informed the process and the successful outcomes.

Convergence Energy Services Limited (CESL), a nodal agency of the Union government, acted as the programme manager in this effort at centralised procurement in concert, with State-led demand and customisation. Coordination between a range of Union government Ministries and State governments standardised demand conditions across these five cities and discovered prices that beat the increasingly outmoded internal combustion engines.

On a cost-per-kilometre basis, the prices discovered were 40% lower than diesel and 34% less than CNG (without factoring in the subsidy through FAME-ID). A note on FAME: the Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of

(Hybrid & Electric Vehicles in India (FAME-India) Scheme was launched under the National Mission on Electric Mobility in 2011/National Electric Mobility Mission Plan 2020, and unveiled in 2013. The scheme encourages the progressive induction of reliable, affordable and efficient electric and hybrid vehicles.

With high fuel prices and energy security challenges in the wake of the war in Ukraine, the switch to electric vehicles appears even more sensible and lucrative.

This inflection point in unit economics was enabled by three key factors: collaboration, pace and transparency. First, the tender itself was a fully consultative process and varied contributions by participants already influenced the design of future tenders. Second, there was a shared sense of urgency that shaped this collaboration, which leveraged the bureaucracy's power when working on time-bound and measurable schemes and increased receptivity to creative and new ideas. Finally, transparency was the most resilient quality of a public process. From the outset, there was clarity about the intention to engender trust and build a publicly available process and tender that invited bids from automakers and operators.

In the wake of the first tender, it was incredibly gratifying to share a feeling of success with five States, five Transport Ministers, five State Secretaries and the heads of a range of State transport undertakings, each of whom had played a part in the process.

To be clear, excessive centralisation can have limitations and contradict the federal principles enshrined in the Constitution. For instance, India's States and districts vary vastly in their vulnerability to climate impacts, and decentralised decision-making and locally-led adaptation will help reduce potential damage to lives and livelihoods. Urban local bodies and

gram panchayats can be the heart of climate action.

However, in certain areas where India must move the needle quickly or where States lack size and financial clout, such as the electrification of mass mobility, centralised procurement and programme management can deliver architectural transformations rather than just incremental transitions.

There is much work ahead

Although a good start has been made, much work remains to be done to enable the electrification of mass mobility in India. The country's shift to clean public transportation will require a suite of efforts, from ramping up manufacturing capacity to domestic battery production to building out charging infrastructure (ideally plugged in to a grid powered by renewables) to capacity building of State transport undertakings to developing financial instruments and structures.

Nonetheless, the progress we have made on electric bus tendering is a harbinger of climate action made possible by cooperative federalism. As India now ramps up its demand to deploy 50,000 buses across 40 cities, it will need to continue the spirit of true inter-ministerial and Union-State collaboration to fulfil its ambitious targets for green and inclusive economic development. The combined clout and strength of the federal compact can enable large strides being made towards innovative models that not only improve transit, the quality of life in cities and progress towards national climate goals but also build models for the rest of the world to emulate.

The Brunt of Unpaid work! if women stop, the world will stop

The invisibility and lack of recognition of unpaid domestic and care work result in gender inequality and women's disempowerment. According to the recent Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS), women's participation in employment in India is low and significantly less than that of their male counterparts. Women comprised just 18% of the workforce compared to 52% of men before the pandemic. A Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE) survey revealed that around 39% of women lost their jobs during the ongoing pandemic due to several reasons, including an increasing demand for unpaid domestic work put on them by their families. Globally, while unpaid domestic work by women is valued at nearly 13% of the total economy, in India, women's unpaid domestic work is estimated to be valued at almost 40% of its GDP. While women carry the Indian economy on their backs through their backbreaking domestic work and care work, it often goes unaccounted for as it is not considered productive labour.

This devaluation of women's work and its exclusion has led to the reinforcement of the gendered division of paid and unpaid labour, leaving women without wages and little bargaining power in the household and allowing the vicious circle to continue where men, economy, and country prosper at their expense.

It is argued that engagement in unpaid domestic and care work is one of the prime reasons for women's low participation in economic activities. Women do an average of 75% of the world's total unpaid care work. Women's unpaid domestic work is often invisible but has immense value. According to the International Labour Organisation (ILO), a huge 16.4 billion hours are spent by women on unpaid care work daily. This is equivalent to two billion people working eight hours per day, without payment. The actual value of this work amounts to 9% of the global GDP, which is equivalent to \$11 trillion.

Similar differences also exist in women's time allocation to paid and unpaid work by geography. In rural areas, Indian women spend more time in unpaid activities in comparison to urban areas. Women are more likely to spend less time in unpaid work and men are less likely



to contribute to housework in northern states over southern states. Haryana is the most unequal among the Indian states with men aged between 15-59 spending just 15 minutes on unpaid housework every day while women of the same age do 269 minutes of unpaid housework. Social norms expect women to perform unpaid labour in India and the consequences for straying from the norm can be harsh. OXFAM India's 2019 household care survey found that one in three survey respondents thought that it was acceptable to beat a woman for failing to care well for the children or not attending to a dependent or ill adult member in the household. For failing to prepare a meal for the men in the family, 68% of survey respondents thought women should be harshly criticized and 41.2% thought they should be beaten. About 66% of the working women surveyed in Delhi by the Institute of Social Studies Trust (ISST) reported an increase in household chores and 36% stated an increased burden of child and elderly care work during the pandemic.

In this Perspective, we discuss the societal, organisational, institutional and psychological factors that explain why time poverty is often under appreciated. We argue that scientists, policymakers and organisational leaders should devote more attention and resources toward understanding and reducing time poverty to promote psychological and economic well-being. Therefore, the strong message emerging is that policymakers and employers need to act fast to

reduce “time poverty” among women and push for greater gender equality in the labour market and an urgent need for gender budgeting.

The story of women in India being overburdened with unpaid work is centuries old. The time use survey conducted by the National Sample Survey Office (NSSO) in 2020-21 confirms a persistent pattern of “time poverty” suffered by women in India. The NSSO survey showed that women spent 84% of their working hours on unpaid activities, while men spent 80% of their working hours on paid work. One of the repercussions of their unpaid work burden is their lack of participation in paid work. Indian women's participation in paid employment is much lower than their male counterparts. Only 21.8% of women aged 15-59 years were engaged in paid work in comparison to nearly 70.9% of the men. However, if we were to take into account both paid and unpaid work, women's participation reaches 85% men's is just 73%.

In 2019, the time spent by Indian women on unpaid work was 10 ten times more than men. TUS 2019 shows that women participation in unpaid domestic services for household members — cooking, cleaning, household management — is as high as 81.2 per cent each day compared with 26.1% for men. It also states that there is a wide gender disparity, with only 18.4% women participating in employment activities compared with 57.3% of men; also, while men spend an average of 459 minutes (7 hours and 39 minutes), women spend only

333 minutes (5 hours and 33 minutes). There is a stark difference in the time spent by men and women in caregiving activities for a dependent child or an adult. While only 14% of men participate in unpaid caregiving services for household members spending on average 76 minutes a day (1 hour and 16 minutes), the share of women (2 hours 14 minutes) is almost double at 27.6%

Unlike in international TUS in India, the reporting of time spent on various activities was not done separately by each person in the household, but often by a central respondent for all members of the household. It is entirely possible that male respondents overstated their contributions to domestic chores and understated their wives' contributions to economically productive work.

In India, the 2021 state assembly elections offered a unique and unexpected opportunity for the recognition of women's UDCW through promises of unconditional cash transfers. However, direct benefit transfers (DBT) are not a magic bullet for achieving women's economic empowerment. There is a fundamental need to secure an adequate financial infrastructure and financial literacy. Although some of the negative consequences anticipated by the critics of such transfers were not borne out in reality, it was noted that the patriarchal social norms around UDCW are so deeply entrenched that explicit feminist messaging on the part of the government is necessary to shift social norms towards the recognition and eventual reduction and redistribution of UDCW. In short, unconditional cash transfers like the scheme are an innovative means of recognising women's UDCW which could potentially rewrite the relationship between women and the Indian welfare state and hold critical insights for international debates on the vexed relation between paid work, unpaid work, and social reproduction. LFPR should increase. Females should not be replaced by men rather more employment opportunities should be increased for both to absorb the increasing population.

New book highlights silent movement reforms post ‘91

A big boost to literacy is the only way to sustain the gains of the 1991 reforms and raise the quality and level of migrant workers' lives in the soft underbelly of the big cities, felt academics and administrators while many aspects of a book by educationist Manimala Roy's new book

The speakers concurred with Roy's contention that schooling opened up new opportunities for children of the uprooted workers in the unorganised sector and that in turn raised the community's economic and social status

According to the author, the 1991 economic reforms unleashed a silent revolution in the festering city slums. Migrant workers saw the possibility of a large number

of white-collar jobs being available to their children once liberalisation opened up many sectors of the economy. With some education, they knew, their children would be able to land low-level jobs in sectors like telecom, civil aviation, retail and automobiles

Buoyed by such prospects, they sent their children to school, often private schools, paying hefty tuition fees. Without any government intervention a quiet social movement took off with far-reaching consequences

As a result, the country's literacy scene got a new boost, the blows of child labour were softened and within a generation the migrant community moved up socially and economically with their children becoming part of

the organised sector

This story has been traced, researched and chronicled by Roy in her book “From Shanties to School: A Silent Movement”, published by Konark Publishers Pvt Ltd

During the discussion at the India International Centre on Friday, Former ambassador Reena Pandey said the book effectively conveyed the impulses for literacy growth in the distressed slums

Terming the development as

Reliance can explore reorganising company to list subsidiaries: Report

Billionaire Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Industries Ltd can explore reorganisation of the company into three independent entities for different business verticals as it prepares to list subsidiaries and induct next-generation of founding family into key roles, a report said.

This, a report by Kotak Institutional Equities, would help prevent any holding company discount in Reliance as and when its subsidiaries list, prepare for eventual management change and preclude inter-linkages between entities as and when they become independent, listed entities. India's most valuable company has three distinct businesses - oil refining and petrochemicals business house in oil-to-chemicals (O2C) unit, digital business including telecom and retail.

"Reliance can explore reorganisation of the company into three independent entities for its three different business verticals as it prepares to list its subsidiaries and induct next-generation members of the founding family into key roles," the report said. Company



management and shareholders may consider a reorganisation of the company to achieve three mutually linked objectives of structure, succession and segregation. "One option could be to reorganise Reliance into three independent listed business verticals (communications, energy and retailing). This would broadly entail shareholders of Reliance eventually becoming shareholders of the retailing and telecommunications entities other than the minority shareholders in those entities. Various smaller entities may be clubbed into one of the appropriate verticals to ensure limited overlaps post the restructuring," it said. At the company's

annual shareholders meeting last month, Ambani identified his twin children Akash and Isha for digital and retail respectively and youngest son Anant for energy business.

"We note that our hypothetical structure of three independent listed entities instead of four listed entities (Reliance + three listed subsidiaries in communications, energy, retailing) or three listed entities (Reliance + two listed subsidiaries in communications and retailing) will prevent potential large holding company discount for Reliance stock relative to the value of its assets in the parent entity and holdings in various subsidiaries.

The pets of royal families also live in royal style, even if they are as small as bees. On the demise of Queen Elizabeth in Britain, Buckingham Palace's pet royal bees were informed in a secret manner. The little insects were given this news in a traditional way. The beekeepers informed the bees that the Queen had died and that Prince Charles was becoming the new King. For this, the message was narrated in a low voice after tying a black cloth around the boxes of pet bees. This is an age-old tradition and every time on the death of a king or queen, a

similar message is conveyed. It is believed that if the message of death is not given to the bees properly, then they die.

In the changing times, honey is now considered a healthy alternative to white sugar. Did you know that to produce one kilogram of honey, bees have to visit more than two million flowers to collect pollen from them? It is also a known fact that 80 percent of the world's crops are pollinated by bees only. That's why the great scientist Albert Einstein once said that if the bees became extinct, then life on earth would end

in no time. If crops were not pollinated in due time, food production would stop and life would be in jeopardy due to starvation. That is why it is said that for life to continue on the earth, it is necessary to protect all animals and plants. Every insect or plant has some important role to play in the ecosystem.

The businessmen associated with the trade of beekeeping in Punjab are facing a big problem. Their domesticated bees are dying very fast and the reason behind this is being told that pesticides are being used indiscriminately by the farmers to increase the yield of millet, sunflower, paddy, etc., which is proving to be fatal for the bees community and they are ending a life prematurely. In fact, the boxes which are used for beekeeping are moved to the states of Rajasthan, Haryana, and Punjab from time to time according to different crop cycles. Their location is changed so

that the bees keep getting pollen grains in abundance and for this, they do not have to travel far. Sunflower cultivation is high in Haryana, so bee boxes are shifted to Haryana during the sunflower crop season. Bajra (pearl millet) is cultivated more in Rajasthan, so the boxes are also taken to Rajasthan. The people associated with the beekeeping business of Punjab have demanded from the state government that such guidelines should be issued that pesticides should not be used on crops more than a prescribed limit, otherwise the units and businessmen involved in honey production will suffer huge losses.

The world economy was hit hard due to the outbreak of the pandemic in the last two years, after which the invasion of Russian troops in Ukraine took place. This unusual and protracted war has shaken the economies of European countries. Not only European, most of the big nations of the world



including the USA and Australia have come under the grip of the global recession. The next two-three years are going to pass like this. Thankfully, India's economy is not in that bad shape. Looking at cosmetics sales data and women's shopping patterns, economy experts have concluded that the recession has really hit the world. It has been seen that US women are buying more lipsticks than ever before.

Lipstick is considered a cheap item and their higher sales than other cosmetics indicate that women are opting for lipsticks instead of buying expensive cosmetics for their makeup. In the US and Europe, sales of cosmetics such as lipsticks have grown by 70

percent this year. Compared to other items, the price of lipstick has increased less. Renowned entrepreneur Leonard Loder first used the term Lipstick Index during the recession of 2001. Then in the uncertain economic environment, women were turning to cheap beauty products. Economic experts are linking the increased demand for lipsticks to the economic uncertainty in the world.

There is one more worry. One of the major consequences of spending more time on mobile and TV screens is that users get myopia. 21 percent of children aged between 5 and 15 years in India and 32 percent of adolescents in other countries of the world suffer from myopia. It is estimated that by 2050, half of the world's population may suffer from this eye problem. Due to long hours of staring at the mobile screen in the dark of night or in low light, there is a lot of stress on the eyes and the blue light of the mobile weakens the

muscles of the eyes, causing the problem of nearsightedness. One solution to this is not to stare at the same screen for hours in a row. If you have to do some important work, then give rest to the eyes in between. Keep changing the screen, that is, sometimes work on mobile, sometimes on a laptop, and sometimes on your desktop computer. When the eyes get to rest in this way, then there will not be so many problems in the eyes as it could be otherwise. In China, the situation has become such that 80 percent of adolescents who have completed 12 years of schooling have become victims of myopia. Because of this, suitable candidates are not being found there for the recruitment of pilots in the armed forces. In China, it is mandatory for all youth to serve in the army for a few years, but due to poor eyesight, pilots cannot be recruited and there is also a problem in recruitment in other departments of the army as well.

Asian shares mostly higher after wobbly gains on Wall St

Shares were mostly higher in Asia on Thursday after a wobbly day of trading yielded modest gains on Wall Street.

US futures inched up while oil prices were mixed. Shanghai's benchmark lost 1 per cent to 3,204.93 after China's central bank left its benchmark lending rate unchanged. While other major economies are raising rates to cool inflation, China's economy has been slowing and inflation remains moderate.

Tokyo's Nikkei 225 index gained 0.5 per cent to 27,946.20. Japan reported a record trade deficit for the month of August, driven by high costs for imports of energy and other commodities and a weak yen. But analysts said they expect a rebalancing in coming months.

Motor vehicle production should continue to normalise as supply chain disruptions ease, while commodity price growth has eased even further. Darren Tay of Capital Economics said in

Wall Street is especially worried that the rate hikes could go too far in slowing the economy and send it into a recession. The Fed is trying to avoid that outcome, but the latest inflation reports suggest that is becoming a more difficult task.

The broader US economy has been slowing, but consumers have remained resilient and the job market remains strong. Wall Street will get another update on inflation's latest impact on spending when the government releases its retail sales report for August on Thursday.

The market is also monitoring US-China tensions and war in Ukraine, while business and government officials are bracing for the possibility of a nationwide rail strike at the end of this week that could paralyze an already discombobulated supply chain.

Chinese loan apps: ED freezes over Rs 46-cr worth funds kept in payment gateway accounts

Enforcement Directorate on Friday said it has frozen Rs 46.67 crore funds of merchant entities kept in four online payment gateway accounts of Easebuzz, Razorpay, Cashfree and Paytm after it carried out raids this week against a "Chinese-controlled" investment token app. The funds have been frozen under the anti-money laundering law. The latest action comes after the agency earlier this month raided the Bengaluru premises of Razorpay, Paytm and Cashfree over alleged irregularities in the operations of instant app-based loan giving companies "controlled" by Chinese persons and later similar seizure order for Rs 17 crore funds kept in their accounts was issued.

Air India to induct 30 planes over next 15 months

The airline has signed leases and letters of intent for inducting 5 wide-body Boeing and 25 Airbus narrow-body planes over the next 15 months.

"These new aircraft, which will enter service from late 2022, will increase the airline's fleet by over 25 per cent. Not counting the 10 long-grounded narrow-body and 6 wide-body aircraft that have been returned to service in recent months, these new aircraft mark the first major fleet expansion since Air India's acquisition by the Tata Group earlier this year," it said in a release. The planes being leased include 21 Airbus A320 neos, 4 Airbus A321 neos and 5 Boeing B777-200LRs. The B777-200LRs will join the fleet between December



2022 and March 2023. They will be deployed on routes from Indian metro cities to the US.

"Mumbai will see the addition of flights to San Francisco as well as to both of the New York area's international airports, Newark Liberty and John F Kennedy, while Bangalore will receive a 3x weekly service to San Francisco.

"These aircraft will result in Air India offering Premium Economy haul flights for the first time," the statement said.

According to the release, the 4 A321 neo aircraft are

expected to join the fleet in the first quarter of calendar year 2023, while the 21 A320 neos will be inducted in the second half of 2023.

These aircraft will be deployed on domestic sectors as well as for short-haul international destinations.

"After a long time without significant growth, Air India is delighted to resume expanding its fleet and global footprint. These new aircraft, together with existing aircraft being returned to service, address an immediate need for more capacity and connectivity, and

mark a strong step forward," Air India CEO and Managing Director Campbell Wilson said.

Currently, the airline's narrow-body fleet stands at 70 aircraft. Out of them, 54 are in service and the remaining 16 aircraft will progressively return to service by early 2023. Air India's wide-body fleet stands at 43 aircraft, of which 33 are operational. The rest will return to service by early 2023.

Similar movement was seen on the NSE as well, where shares of the company opened at Rs 605 apiece, then touched Rs 589.95, up 1.97 per cent from its previous closing price.

The Edinburgh-based company, which was formerly known as Standard Life Aberdeen, has offered the shares in the price band of Rs 564.1-578.55, which is a discount of up to 2.5 per cent on the



scrip's close on Monday in the block deal.

The shareholding of Abrdn, one of the promoters of the insurer, will fall to 1.7 per cent after the trade is executed from the present 3.7 per cent, as per the term sheet. IOC gives Rs 50 crore for Cheetah relocation project



India's top oil firm IOC will give Rs 50.22 crore towards funding the ambitious trans-continent relocation of Cheetahs from Africa to India, the company said on Tuesday.

Indian Oil Corporation (IOC) has signed a memorandum of understanding with the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) for meeting two-thirds of the Rs 75 crore project cost.

"Under the aegis of the NTCA and powered by IOC, the ambitious Cheetah Reintroduction Project is set to welcome the first Cheetahs on Indian

soil after over seven decades on September 17, 2022," the company said in a statement. IOC is the first and only corporate to come forward to support 'Project Cheetah' through CSR.

Under this project, a source population of 15-20 Cheetahs will be flown in from Namibia and South Africa and will be introduced at Kuno National Park, Madhya Pradesh.

IOC will be contributing Rs 50.22 crore over five years for cheetah reintroduction as well as its habitat management and protection, ecology develop-

ment, staff training and veterinary healthcare. The cheetah population in India dwindled during the 19th century, largely because of bounty hunting by local kings and ruling British officials. The last three Asiatic cheetahs were hunted down in 1948 and the cheetah was declared extinct in the country in 1952. The subspecies of cheetah which got extinct in India was Asiatic Cheetah (Acinonyx jubatus venaticus) and the subspecies being introduced in the country is the African Cheetah (Acinonyx jubatus jubatus). Research has shown that the genes of these two subspecies are the same. On August 2, IOC said it had signed an MoU with NTCA for the transcontinental relocation of Cheetah in its historical range in India. The MoU was signed by S M Vaidya, Chairman, IOC and S P Yadav, Addl. Director General (Project Tiger) and Member Secretary (NTCA).

Tesla installs record 4K EV supercharger stations globally

Tesla, an undisputed leader in the electric car market, has installed nearly 4,000 supercharger stations globally, growing 34 per cent year-on-year.

According to data compiled by Finbold, Tesla had 3,971 supercharger stations globally, recording a growth of 33.88 per cent from the 2,966 recorded during a similar period in 2021. During the first three months of 2022, the Tesla stations stood at 3,724, representing a growth of 7.13 per cent from the previous quarter. In total, during Q3 2021, the company had installed 3,254 stations globally.

Elsewhere, the Tesla also witnessed a spike in the number of supercharger connectors, which stood at 36,165 during Q2 2022, representing a YoY growth of 34.44 per cent. During the first quarter of 2022, the connectors stood at 33,657, growing 6.85 per cent from 31,498 in Q4 2021. Tesla managed to record growth in the supercharger segment despite operating in a period marred by the economic effects emanating from the pandemic. "Interestingly, Tesla has managed to record supercharger growth despite facing challenges mainly from the chip shortage. Notably, in recent years, charging infrastructure companies raised concerns due to chip shortage factors derailing the momentum of rolling out public charging options," according to the Finbold report. Overall, Tesla is likely to accelerate the installation of supercharger stations as the company adopts innovative technologies to reach more locations.

The company will acquire these land parcels either through outright purchase or by forming Joint Development Agreements (JDAs) with landowners.

Mumbai-based Mahindra Lifespace Developers Ltd, part of Mahindra Group, is one of the leading real estate players in the country. The company's market cap recently touched USD 1 billion (about Rs 8,000 crore).

In an interview with PTI, the company's Managing Director (MD) and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Arvind Subramanian said Mahindra Lifespace

is looking to acquire new land parcels for business expansion in three focus cities - Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR), Pune and Bengaluru. He highlighted that the company already acquired a land parcel this fiscal that has a Gross Development Value (GDV) of Rs 1,700 crore and the deal pipelines are strong. "Last year, I had set a guidance of Rs 2,500 crore worth of new land acquisition. All these numbers are GDV, so the sales value of the new land that we acquire and not the cost of land acquisition. We did Rs 3,800 crore last fiscal year and this year we have already done Rs 1,700 crore. We will certainly be doing at least an equivalent amount in the rest of the year," Subramanian said.

In terms of the GDV, he

It is for the first

time Modi and Xi came face-to-face at the summit in this historic Uzbek city since the start of the border standoff between India and China in eastern Ladakh around 28 months back.

Advocate Dhama said that the minority Afghan Sikhs are leaving their home country due to atrocities and insecurity. "It is a matter of concern that

if Sikhs do not stay in Afghanistan, who will take care of Guru Granth Sahib, and Gurdwara Sahibs there? It is this reason that the Sikhs while coming to India are bringing along holy Guru Granth Sahib", said he.

He said the Taliban ruled government of Afghanistan should not take decisions against the sentiments of Sikhs. SGPC President appealed to the Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi to intervene in this matter to stop the Afghanistan government from taking decisions against Sikh sentiments and protect the rights of Sikhs in Afghanistan under Taliban rule.

China banned from Queen's Lying-in-State in Parliament complex



The House of Commons Speaker has refused permission for a Chinese government delegation to attend the Queen's Lying-in-State at Westminster Hall within the Parliament complex before the funeral at Westminster Abbey in London on Monday, according to UK media reports. Sir Lindsay Hoyle is said to have refused a request for access to Westminster Hall due to Chinese sanctions against five British members of Parliament and two peers for accusing Beijing of mistreating its Uighur Muslim minority. 'Politico' and BBC have reported. While the House of Commons said it did not comment on security matters, the media reports claimed that China would have a presence at the funeral but not be allowed into the Parliament building.

Japan logs record Aug trade deficit on weak yen, costly oil



Japan posted a record trade deficit in August as costs for imports of oil and gas soared, the government reported on Thursday. The 2.82 trillion yen (USD 19.6 billion) deficit, the 13th in a row, was triple the deficit logged in the same month a year earlier. Customs data showed exports rose 22 per cent from a year earlier as regional economies recovered from pandemic-related disruptions while imports soared 50 per cent. Energy-related imports from the Middle East accounted for about half of the deficit. Japan's currency, the yen, has weakened sharply against the US dollar as the Federal Reserve has raised interest rates to counter inflation. Surging prices for many commodities and other products are also pushing Japan's imports higher.

Joe Biden approval rises sharply ahead of midterms

President Joe Biden's popularity improved substantially from his lowest point this summer, but concerns about his handling of the economy persist, according to a poll from The Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research.

Support for Biden recovered from a low of 36 per cent in July to 45 per cent, driven in large part by a rebound in support from Democrats just two months before the November midterm elections.

During a few bleak summer months when gasoline prices peaked and lawmakers appeared deadlocked, the Democrats faced the possibility of blowout losses against Republicans.

Their outlook appears better after notching a string of legislative successes that left more Americans ready to judge the president on his preferred terms: Don't compare me to the Almighty. Compare me to the alternative.

The president's approval rating remains underwater, with 53 per cent of US adults disapproving of him, and the economy continues to be a weakness for Biden.

Just 38 per cent approve of his economic leadership as the country faces stubbornly high inflation and Republicans try to make household finances the axis of the upcoming vote.

Still, the poll suggests Biden and his fellow Democrats are gaining momentum right as generating voter enthusiasm and turnout takes precedence. Average gas prices have tumbled 26 per cent since June to USD 3.71 a gallon, reducing the pressure somewhat on family budgets even if inflation remains high. Congress also passed a pair of landmark bills in the past month that could reshape the economy and reduce carbon emissions.

Republicans have also faced resistance since the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade and its abortion protections. And Biden is openly casting



former President Donald Trump as a fundamental threat to democracy, a charge that took on resonance after an FBI search of Trump's Florida home found classified documents that belong to the US government.

This combination of factors has won Biden some plaudits among the Democratic faithful, even if Americans still feel lukewarm about his leadership.

I'm not under any belief that he's the best person for the job he's the best from the people we had to choose from, said Betty Bogacz, 74, a retiree from Portland, Oregon. He represented stability, which I feel President Trump did not represent at all.

Biden's approval rating didn't exceed 40 per cent in May, June or July as inflation surged in the aftermath of Russia invading Ukraine.

The president's rating now is similar to what it was throughout the first quarter of the year, but he continues to fall short of early highs. His average approval rating in AP-NORC polling through the first six months of his term was 60 per cent.

Driving the recent increase in Biden's popularity is renewed support among Democrats, who had shown signs of defection in the early summer. Now, 78 per cent of Democrats approve of Biden's job performance, up from 65 per cent in July. Sixty-six per cent of Democrats approve of Biden on the economy, up from 54 per cent in June.

Amid inflation, Turkey launches massive housing project for low-income families

Low-income families in Turkey started submitting applications for a massive social housing project that President Recep Tayyip Erdogan described as the largest such initiative in the history of the country currently in the grip of rising inflation.

The five-year project was announced by Erdogan on Tuesday, as the government battles rising housing and rental costs as well as a 24-year-high inflation rate of more than 80 per cent in August, reports Xinhua news agency.

Under the project, 500,000 homes and 250,000 residential plots will be provided to eligible applicants whose monthly income is less than 18,000 liras (\$990) in Istanbul and 16,000 liras in other provinces. According to local media, the project will cost the government close to \$50 billion. Priority would be given to pensioners, young people, newlyweds, army veterans, relatives of soldiers killed



in combat and the disabled, according to Erdogan.

More than 250,000 people have submitted their applications on the first day of its launch on Wednesday, according to Environment, Urbanization and Climate Change Minister Murat Kurum.

In Istanbul, the country's largest city of 16 million people, long queues of applicants were seen outside public banks. The project was launched at a time when housing and rental costs throughout the country, particu-

larly in the major cities, were rising rapidly. Housing prices increased by 160 per cent in June compared to a year earlier, according to the Turkish Central Bank's latest Housing Price Index. The growth rate was 184 per cent in Istanbul and 165 per cent in Ankara.

According to the Turkish Statistical Institute, around 820,300 homes were sold from January to July this year, a 24.2 per cent increase year on year despite high borrowing rates and rising home prices.

Nepal, India discuss issues of bilateral, mutual interests

Nepal and India discussed matters pertaining to bilateral and mutual interests during the Foreign Secretary-level talks in New Delhi.

At the invitation of his Indian counterpart Vinay Mohan Kwatra, Nepal's Foreign Secretary Bharat Raj Poudyal arrived in New Delhi and held the bilateral talks at Hyderabad House on Tuesday where two sides discussed a wide range of issues and issues related to mutual interest and concerns, according to statements issued by New Delhi and Kathmandu.

The Foreign Secretaries discussed multiple areas of cooperation between Nepal and India covering trade, transit, connectivity, infrastructure, power sector, irrigation and inundation, agriculture, investment, development cooperation, health sector cooperation, culture, and people to people rela-



tions, among others, a statement issued by the Nepali Embassy in New Delhi said.

"They reviewed the progress on the discussions held during the high-level visits of the Prime Minister of Nepal Sher Bahadur Deuba to India on April 1-3 and of Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi to Lumbini, Nepal on May 16. The two Foreign Secretaries discussed the ways and means to build on momentum generated by those visits. They also discussed cooperation on multilateral forums," the statement added.

Driven by consumers, US inflation grows more persistent

US inflation is showing signs of entering a more stubborn phase that will likely require drastic action by the Federal Reserve, a shift that has panicked financial markets and heightens the risks of a recession.

Some of the longtime drivers of higher inflation spiking gas prices, supply chain snarls, soaring used-car prices are fading. Yet underlying measures of inflation are actually worsening.

The ongoing evolution of the forces behind an inflation rate that's near a four-decade high has made it harder for the Fed to wrestle it under control. Prices are no longer rising because a few categories have skyrocketed in cost. Instead, inflation has now spread more widely through the economy, fuelled by a strong job market that is boosting paychecks, forcing companies to raise prices to cover higher labour costs and



giving more consumers the wherewithal to spend.

On Tuesday, the government said inflation ticked up 0.1 per cent from July to August and 8.3 per cent from a year ago, which was down from June's four-decade high of 9.1 per cent.

But excluding the volatile categories of food and energy,

so-called core prices jumped by an unexpectedly sharp 0.6 per cent from July to August, after a milder 0.3 per cent rise the previous month. The Fed monitors core prices closely, and the latest figures heightened fears of an even more aggressive Fed and sent stocks plunging, with the Dow Jones collapsing more than 1,200 points.

India, Gulf Cooperation Council sign MoU to facilitate consultations

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has held a "productive" meeting with the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) Secretary-General Nayef Falah Mubarak Al-Hajraf during which the two leaders signed an MoU on the mechanism of consultations between India and the six-nation regional bloc.

Jaishankar arrived here on Saturday on a three-day visit to Saudi Arabia to discuss ways to further strengthen relations between the two countries. It is his first visit to Saudi Arabia as External Affairs Minister.

On the first day of his visit on Saturday, Jaishankar met GCC Secretary-General and exchanged views on current regional and global issues.

"Productive meeting with @GCC Secretary-General Dr Nayef Falah Mubarak Al-Hajraf. Signed the MoU on the mechanism of consultations between India and GCC. Exchanged views on the current regional and global situation and the relevance of India-GCC cooperation in that context,"



Jaishankar tweeted after the meeting. The GCC is a regional, intergovernmental, political, and economic union comprising Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates.

India enjoys traditionally cordial relations and cooperation with the GCC.

India's old, historical ties with the GCC states, coupled with increasing imports of oil and gas, growing trade and investment, and the presence of approximately 6.5 million Indian workers in the region, are of vital interest to India, according to the Indian Embassy

in Riyadh. India's economic linkage with the GCC has increased steadily, especially due to the growth in oil imports.

During 2020-21, India's exports to GCC were USD 28.06 billion. The bilateral two-way trade during the period was USD 87.36 billion.

Earlier this year, there was an unease in India's ties with some Muslim-majority countries, including Gulf nations, over the controversial remarks of two former BJP leaders on the Prophet Mohammad. All six GCC nations had condemned the remarks.

Jill Biden shares memories of 9/11 as wife, sister, more

When Jill Biden realised that terrorists had attacked America on September 11, 2001, her husband, Joe, wasn't the only loved one whose safety she worried about.

Biden recalled being scared to death that her sister Bonny Jacobs, a United Airlines flight attendant, was on one of the four hijacked airplanes that were flown into New York's World Trade Center, the Pentagon and a Pennsylvania field, killing nearly 3,000 people.

After learning that her sister was safe at her Pennsylvania home, Biden told The Associated Press on Saturday as she and her sister remembered that day.

On Sunday, Jill Biden, now the first lady, will mark the 21st anniversary of the 9/11 attacks by delivering remarks at the Flight 93 National Memorial in Shanksville, Pennsylvania accompanied by Jacobs.

The 40 passengers and crew aboard that United Airlines flight fought back against their hijackers, thwarting a feared



attack on the US Capitol in Washington.

I called Bonny to see where she was because I was scared to death... I didn't know where she was, whether she was flying, not flying, where she was, Jill Biden recalled. And then I found out she was home.

Biden had gone to teach her class at Delaware Technical Community College, then went straight to her sister's house after school was dismissed.

Joe Biden, then a US senator, was on an Amtrak train barreling toward Washington when his wife got through to him.

They were on the phone when she cried out, Oh my God, oh my God, oh my God after an airplane hit the second World Trade Center tower.

WikiLeaks founder's family brings campaign to Mexico

This week the objective was to insert mention of Julian Assange into a meeting between Mexico's president and the United States' top diplomat. Next week, it will be to have Australia's prime minister bring it up with the US president at Queen Elizabeth II's funeral.

The efforts are part of the campaign by John Shipton, father of the WikiLeaks founder, to find allies and convince the US to drop espionage charges against Assange, who remains in a British prison awaiting extradition to the US. The journey by the septuagenarian Australian architect together with another son, Gabriel, brought them this week to Mexico. The country has become the family's main ally in Latin America since President Andrés Manuel López Obrador offered Assange political asylum and called for the US to allow him to seek refuge there.

We call President López Obrador an ice-breaker, because afterward the leaders of Chile, Colombia and Bolivia called for his release too, Gabriel Shipton said during the visit to Mexico. Among a packed scheduled of events, John Shipton received the key to the capital Wednesday on behalf of Assange, a ceremonial honour the city bestows on distinguished guests. The day before, he addressed Mexico's Senate. American prosecutors say Assange helped US Army intelligence analyst Chelsea Manning steal classified diplomatic cables and military files that WikiLeaks later published, putting lives at risk. He faces 17 charges of espionage and one charge of computer misuse. His defenders consider Assange a symbol of a free press and a fight for justice who exposed US military wrongdoing in Iraq and Afghanistan.
