LG V K Saxena has 'derailed' governance: Delhi govt to SC

NEW DELHI: The Delhi government has told the Supreme Court that Lieutenant Governor V K Saxena has "derailed" the governance of the national capital by encouraging the "recalcitrance of civil servants" towards the elected government.

In an affidavit filed before the top court, the AAP government alleged that Saxena is running a parallel system of governance in the NCT of Delhi by taking unilateral executive decision. "Civil servants serving in the Government of NCT of Delhi have become indifferent to the elected government. The net result is that the basic day to day functioning of the Government of NCT of Delhi stands completely jeopardized."

"The problem has become even more acute with the appointment of the incumbent Lieutenant Governor earlier this year. Any co-operation between the civil servants and the



elected government is sought to be penalised and recalcitrance towards the elected government is being encouraged," the affidavit filed by Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia said.

Two separate affidavits were filed before the top court which is hearing the legal issue concerning the scope of legislative and executive powers of the Centre and Delhi government over control of services in the national capital. The AAP government said the uncon-

stitutional and undemocratic encroachment of the powers of a duly elected government has made governance in Delhi challenging and unnecessarily difficult for the elected government.

The Delhi government contended that this has led to a situation where officials have stopped attending meetings being called by the ministers and even stopped taking their calls. "Officials are either delaying or not at all supplying the files

concerning the department to the ministers. Officials are disobeying orders/directions of the ministers, including orders/directions that are in writing," it said.

"Such regular interventions of the Lieutenant Governor have the effect of not just usurping the powers of the duly elected State Government so as to not only upset the scheme of federalism and representative democracy, but also harmed public interests in sectors ranging from public health, education, environmental protection, to name a few. "The unconstitutional and undemocratic encroachment of the powers of a duly elected Government has made governance in Delhi challenging and unnecessarily difficult for the elected government, contrary to the intent and purpose of the Constitution (Sixty-Ninth Amendment) Act, 1991," the Delhi government said.

Delhi's air quality slips back to 'very poor' category

NEW DELHI: Delhi's air quality deteriorated to the 'very poor' category on Friday, after marginal improvement over the last few days, with a layer of smog shrouding several parts of the city.

The city recorded a minimum temperature of 14.6 degrees Celsius, a notch above normal, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

The national capital's overall Air Quality Index (AQI) stood at 331 at 9 am. Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) data showed.

An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', and 401 and 500 'severe'.

The relative humidity was 79 per cent at 8:30 pm, the IMD said.

The weather department has forecast mainly clear skies during the day. The maximum temperature is expected to

Gopal Rai launches AAP war room for MCD elections



NEW DELHI: AAP's Delhi unit convenor Gopal Rai on Thursday inaugurated the party's war room for the upcoming MCD elections from where it will conduct, among others, the nomination process and social media campaigns for the polls. The 250-ward Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) goes to polls on December 4 and the counting of votes will take place on December 7. "The war room will have a set of 10 tasks, including booth management, candidate monitoring, social media campaign and star campaigners," Rai said. When asked about nominations, he said the candidate selection process was underway. The BJP has been in power in the MCD -- trifurcated in 2012 into north, south and east corporations and then unified this year -- for three straight terms. The high-stake civic polls are largely being seen as a three-way contest between the BJP, the AAP and the Congress.

If convicts of Rajiv Gandhi murder case can be released, why not Sikh prisoners: Dhami

SGPC PRESIDENT'S SHARP REACTION AFTER SUPREME COURT DECISION

AMRITSAR: Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) President Harjinder Singh Dhami while reacting to the Supreme Court's Friday decision to release convicts in Rajiv Gandhi's assassination case, raised question that why the same is not being applied in the cases of Sikh political prisoners?

In a statement issued he alleged that the discriminatory policy being adopted by governments for the Sikhs stands exposed with this decision. The SGPC President in a statement issued from his office said that the Sikh community has been raising voice for the release of Sikh political prisoners locked in different jails in the country for the last three decades, but the governments have turned a deaf ear.



He claimed that there are many such cases, in which the governments have been merciful to the prisoners with heinous charges like murder, rape, etc. On the other hand, injustice is being done to the Sikh prisoners. He said even release of Prof. Devinderpal Singh Bhullar is possible with a consent from the Aam Aadmi Party government in Delhi, but the Chief Minister of Delhi Arvind Kejriwal is

adopting anti-Sikh sentiments. Similarly, the case of Bhai Gurddeep Singh Kherras' release is pending with the Karnataka government, he said.

Harjinder Singh Dhami said that despite the clear instructions by the Supreme Court in the case of death sentence commutation of Bhai Balwant Singh Rajoana, the governments are working under the policy of ignorance and opposition.

SGPC President said that if the Tamil Nadu state government can recommend the release of accused involved in Rajiv Gandhi assassination case, then why not the same can be done by the governments of various states, including the Centre and Punjab for the release of Sikh political prisoners. He also said that the release of the Sikh prisoners is linked to

completion of their sentences, while the convicts of the Rajiv Gandhi assassination have been released prematurely. This discrimination is deeply hurtful to Sikh sentiments, about which governments should be serious.

Dhmi has expressed objection to Congress for including Sikh Genocide accused Jagdish Tytler in the state election committee for the elections of Municipal Corporation Delhi. He said that even after 38 years, the wounds of the Sikh Genocide are still oozing and the victim Sikh families are demanding punishment for the perpetrators. He said Congress is rewarding the perpetrators of Sikh Genocide by giving them positions. SGPC President strongly said that Congress should refrain from such actions.

Active Covid cases in country dip to below 12000

NEW DELHI: India logged 842 new coronavirus infections taking the tally of COVID-19 cases to 4,46,64,810, while the active cases dipped below 12000, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated on Friday.

The death toll climbed to 5,30,520 with six fatalities which includes five reconciled by Kerala. One death has been reported from Rajasthan in a span of 24 hours, the data updated at 8 am stated.

The active cases comprises 0.03 per cent of the total infections, while the national COVID-19 recovery rate increased to 98.78 per cent, according to the ministry website.

A decrease of 435 cases has been recorded in the active COVID-19 caseload in a span of 24 hours.

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease surged to 4,41,21,538, while the case fatality rate was



recorded at 1.19 %.

According to the ministry's website, 219.77 crore doses of Covid vaccine have been administered in the country so far under the nationwide vaccination drive.

India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20-lakh mark on August 7, 2020, 30 lakh on August 23, 40 lakh on September 5 and 50 lakh on September 16.

It went past 60 lakh on September 28, 70 lakh on October 11, crossed 80 lakh on October 29, 90 lakh on November 20 and surpassed the one-crore mark on December 19.

The country crossed the grim milestone of two crore on May 4 and three crore on June 23 last year. It crossed the four-crore mark on January 25 this year.

Forex kitty drops by USD 1.09 bn to USD 529.99 bn

MUMBAI: India's foreign exchange reserves dropped by USD 1.087 billion to stand at USD 529.994 billion for the week ended November 4 on a sharp decline in the gold reserves, the Reserve Bank said on Friday. In the previous reporting week, the reserves had swelled by USD 6.561 billion to reach USD 531.081 billion, making it the biggest weekly jump in a year. In October 2021, the country's forex kitty had reached an all-time high of USD 645 billion. The reserves have been declining as the central bank deploys the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressures caused by global developments.

Foreign currency assets (FCA), a major component of the overall reserves, decreased by USD 120 million to USD 470.727 billion during the week to November 4, according to the Weekly Statistical Supplement released by the RBI. Expressed in dollar terms, the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves. The gold reserves dropped by USD 705 million to USD 37.057 billion, it said.

Sensex rallies 1181 points to close at lifetime high

MUMBAI: Equity benchmark Sensex vaulted 1,181 points to close at its all-time high on Friday, in lockstep with a rally in global markets after lower-than-expected US inflation data fuelled hopes that the US Fed may go slow on rate hikes. A sharp recovery in the rupee and unabated foreign capital inflows further bolstered sentiment, traders said. The 30-share BSE benchmark zoomed 1,181.34 points or 1.95 % to settle at 61,795.04 -- surpassing its previous closing peak of 61,765.59 hit on October 18, 2021. Likewise, the broader NSE Nifty rallied 321.50 points or 1.78 per cent to finish at 18,349.70. HDFC twins topped the Sensex gainers' chart, jumping up to 5.84 per cent, following reports that the merged entity's weightage could increase in MSCI global indices. Infosys, Tech Mahindra, HCL Tech, TCS, Wipro, Tata Steel and Reliance Industries were among the other winners, rising as much as 4.51 per cent.

BJP cannot be fool people of Himachal: Kharge

BANUTI (SHIMLA): Addressing his first public meeting in the Himachal Pradesh assembly elections, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Wednesday trained his gun on the BJP and said it may have been able to befool people across the country with its "jumlas" but cannot do so in the hill state.

"People here are educated, understand everything and take a considered decision (in voting).... The BJP have been able to befool people all over the country with its jumlas (rhetoric) of Rs 15 lakh in bank accounts and jobs, but it cannot do so here," Kharge said. Kharge, who was elected Congress president recently, arrived in Himachal Pradesh Tuesday evening and addressed



his first public meeting in Banuti in support of party candidate from the Shimla Rural assembly constituency Vikramaditya Singh.

The Congress is seeking to wrest power from the BJP in the hill state, where the Congress and the BJP have governed alternately for the past many decades.

Polling in Himachal Pradesh will be held on No-

ember 12 and the counting of votes will be taken up on December 8. Kharge said the Congress would fulfil all its promises made in the manifesto and the restoration of the old pension scheme would be the first decision of its government, if elected. "As far as the old pension scheme is concerned, it will be implemented first. This is our promise and if given a chance this will be the first thing to be done," he said.

Restoration of the old pension scheme, 300 units of free power, aRs 680-crore StartUp fund, one lakh jobs and Rs 1,500 per month for women aged between 18 and 60 years are among the promises the Congress has made in its manifesto for the Himachal Pradesh polls.

Congress can never unite India: BJP

GANDHINAGAR: In a scathing attack on Rahul Gandhi's ongoing 'Bharat JodoYatra', BJP leader Sambit Patra on Wednesday said the Congress can never unite the country.

The BJP spokesperson was speaking to reporters here ahead of Gujarat state Assembly polls.

"There is trust on one side, which provided development for 27 years with the help of people of Gujarat. Every Gujarati takes pride that he has built Gujarat. You (Gujarati) had put your trust in Prime Minister Narendra Modi and he reciprocated by giving you hospitals, electricity, water and roads," said Patra.

Nitin Gadkari meets Assam Governor; discusses infra projects

D Raja calls for Left unity to defeat BJP-RSS

Supreme Court of India upholds 10% EWS quota in 3-2 verdict

Supreme Court Monday upheld by a 3:2 majority, the 103rd amendment to the Constitution introducing a 10 per cent reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) in admissions to educational institutions and government jobs.

While Justices Dinesh Maheshwari, Bela M Trivedi and J B Pardiwala agreed that the amendment does not violate the basic structure of the Constitution, Chief Justice of India U U Lalit and Justice S Ravindra Bhat dissented.

Justice Maheshwari, in his judgment, said that the reservation is an instrument of affirmative action by the state to ensure an all-inclusive march towards



the goal of an egalitarian society while countering inequalities. "It is an instrument not only for inclusion of socially and educationally backward classes to the mainstream of society, but also for the inclusion of any class or section so disadvantaged as to be answering the definition of a weaker section. In this background, reservation singularly on economic background does not violate any essential feature of the Constitution and does not cause any damage to the basic structure of the constitution," he said.

Exclusion of the reserved categories from the EWS quota does not violate the equality code and does not in any manner cause damage to the basic structure of the constitution, he added. Justice Maheshwari also opined

that the reservation for EWS over and above the 50 per cent cap does not violate the basic structure, saying that the ceiling, by itself, is not inflexible and in any case only applies to reservation envisaged by Articles 15(4), 15(5) and 16(4) of the Constitution.

Concurring with Justice Maheshwari's statement, Justice Bela M Trivedi said that the amendment enabling state to make special provisions for EWS other than Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Socially and Educationally Backward Classes is required to be treated as an affirmative action on the part of the Parliament for the benefit and betterment of the EWS category.

JNU Clash: Delhi Police register two separate FIRs

NEWDELHI: Police have registered two separate FIRs in connection with a scuffle that broke out between two groups of students on the Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) campus, officials said on Friday. Police had said that two students were injured in Thursday's clash, while university sources claimed only one student suffered injuries. The scuffle near the Narmada Hostel was a fallout of events that unfolded at a birthday party on Wednesday, the sources said earlier. Deputy Commissioner of Police (southwest) Manoj C said, "On the complaint of JNU student Nishant Nagar, a case under sections 323 (punishment for voluntarily causing hurt), 341 (punishment for wrongful restraint) and 34 (common intention) of the Indian Penal Code has been registered.



He further added that on the complaint of another JNU student Kartik, a second FIR under similar sections has been registered in VasantKunj North police station and further investigation is underway. A few purported video clips were circulated on social media that showed some students with sticks running on the campus. In one of the videos, masked students were seen with sticks. One of the students was wearing a JNU sweatshirt. Police said they will verify the authenticity of the videos circulating on social media.

Delhi HC Judge gave her insights on Intellectual Property, its policies and challenges at the 2nd IP Excellence Awards 2022

NEW DELHI: "We have come a long way since the time the first National Intellectual Property (IP) Policy was made in 2014, which I was (luckily) a part of along with various other wonderful IP professionals. We realise that over the years IP policy didn't remain on paper and the innovation ecosystem has improved with time," stated Justice Prathiba Singh, Delhi High Court at the 2nd IP Excellence Awards 2022. Organised by the apex industry body, Associated Chambers of Commerce and Industry of India (ASSOCHAM), the theme of the award event was International IP Exchange: Enriching Your IP. Praising the Indian courts, she said that it recalibrated and did a stupendous job during pandemic, one of which



includes the establishment of IP Division (IPD) in Delhi High Court. "The abolition of the IPAB (Intellectual Property Appellate Board) came as a huge shock," recalled Justice Prathiba Singh, adding, "But then under the leadership of the then Chief Justice, appointed a committee, constituting three of us judges in the Delhi High Court. We recommended the creation of the IPD, which was a long process of about six months during the pandemic, where we studied about 40 jurisdictions of the world before drafting the rules for the IPD. Congress to win Himachal elections: Ashok Gehlot

Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot on Thursday exuded confidence that the Congress will score a clear victory in the Himachal Pradesh assembly elections. "The unemployment situation is terrible in Gujarat," he said. He also criticised the BJP over the Morbi tragedy in which a suspension bridge collapsed, resulting in the death of more than 130 people, and alleged



that the state government is not conducting any enquiry into it. Gehlot said the state government should conduct a judicial inquiry into the accident. He said Gujarat has a "stubborn" chief minister. On the 'Bharat JodoYatra', he said, "Rahul Gandhi has started a movement, lakhs of people are joining it," adding that the yatra has bothered the BJP. "Rahul Gandhi has started this yatra on the issues of inflation, unemployment and peace and harmony and the yatra is having a huge impact," he said. The state government has started preparations for the upcoming budget and a round of consultation with the stakeholders will be held in a meeting on Thursday, Gehlot said.

Narcotic Cell ASI arrested while smuggling opium at Ambala

CIA staff of Haryana Railway Police (GRP) on an information arrested Niranjana working as Assistant Sub Inspector in Narcotic Cell of Haryana police on an information that he is going to collect a consignment of drugs at the entry gate of railway station Ambala by a drug supplier in a white car. Chasing by a team of CIA staff saw a white car bearing registration number 24-Z 0012 in which a person sitting in the car came out to meet Niranjana ASI sitting in his car. Meanwhile, police team immediately conducted raid when Niranjana attempted to flee and did not hesitate even to hit members of police team they were saved and his vehicle hit a motorcycle of a policeman, but in due course of time he was overpowered by members of CIA staff, which during checking recovered a packet containing 250 gm opium and Rs 29000 currency notes. Paramjit Singh Sub Inspector GRP CIA Staff told that the person sitting in white car arrived to deliver opium was identified as Shiv Narain a resident of Jhalawad in Rajasthan. Niranjana was produced in the court on Tuesday and remanded to police custody. Shiv Narain during preliminary investigation disclosed that he brought opium from main supplier Kripal Singh residing at Jhalawad in Rajasthan. During preliminary investigation Jai Narain told that he arrived to deliver opium against payment Rs 29000.

Congress trusts old warhorses, while BJP reposes faith on younger faces in Himachal

SHIMLA: The grand old party Congress is trusting its old warhorses to leave behind greenhorns to win the November 12 electoral race in Himachal Pradesh. In comparison, the state ruling BJP has largely discarded its veterans and reposed faith on comparatively younger faces with the slogan 'crivajadlega' (electoral traditions will change), meaning to buck the trend to sweep the polls alternatively as both arch rivals ruled the state from 1985. Out of 412 candidates in the fray, 24 are female and 388 male candidates. A total of 55, 92, 828 voters will elect their representatives. Of them, 193, 106 are first-time voters in the age of 18-19 years. There are 121, 409 voters above 80 years, while 56, 501 voters with



disabilities. Among the eldest candidates, the Congress has fielded Col. Dhani Ram Shandil (82) from Solan; Chandra Kumar (78) from Jawali; Kaul Singh Thakur (76) from Drang; Thakur Singh Bharmouri (75) from Bharmour; KishoriLal (75) from Baijnath and Khimi Ram (73) from Banjar. Congress rebel Gangu Ram Musafir (77), who has been denied the party nomination, is contesting as an Independent from Pachhad. The youngest candidate is Piyush Kanga (26), who is in

fray from Bilaspur as an Independent. The others are Chaitanya Sharma (28) of the Congress from Gagret; JabnaKumari (29) of AamAdmi Party (AAP) from Nachan; Puja (29) of the Himachal Jan Kranti Party from Bharmour; ManishaKumari (30) of AAP from Nurpur; KishoriLal (31) of the CPI(M) from Karsog; Vikramaditya Singh (33) of the Congress from Shimla (Rural); and Deep Raj (34) of the BJP from Karsog. The BJP has denied the party ticket to 11 sitting legislators, shifting seats of two ministers, denying nomination to one minister, whose son has been fielded from that constituency, and swapping seats of two veterans owing to infighting.

Crop stubble burning cases 10 times more in Punjab than Haryana

Political leaders in Haryana and Punjab are blaming each other for burning crops stubble in open that caused spread of pollution at Delhi, National Capital Region (NCR) and other towns in Northern part in the country. According to available data, cases of crop stubble burning cases have been detected nearly ten times more in Punjab as compared to Haryana state. Political leaders

has now started playing politics in this regard due to spread of pollution at Delhi, NCR and few other towns reached beyond danger point as such few families residing at Delhi and in NCR have started temporarily shifting to safe places till situation improves since it has become difficult for aged persons, children and heart patients to live in thick smoke and pollution. Kuldeep Singh Dhillon Agriculture Minister in Punjab recently in a statement blamed Haryana government responsible for pollution in the atmosphere at Delhi and NCR, whereas J.P. Dalal Agriculture Minister Haryana refuted allegations and pointing out at Arvind Kejriwal said that instead of playing politics he should take necessary steps to impose strict ban over crop stubble burning in open since number of such cases is nearly ten times more in Punjab as compared to Haryana state. Information reveals that number of such crop stubble burning cases has witnessed nearly 31% drop this year as compared to previous year in Haryana, whereas on the other hand nearly 18% increase in burning cases has been recorded in Punjab this year as compared to previous year.

SVB arrested over 150 officers in 2022 involved in corruption

Haryana state government has changed policy not to spend more than 10% amount over developmental projects finalized by the government since projects of value worth crores of rupees are hanging incomplete in the state due to delayed construction work by Public Works Department (PWD) in the state for one reason or the other as such cost of production most of such projects increased too much and according to a study by State Vigilance Bureau this is usually due to government officers working in these projects found involved in corruption. Investigation by State Vigilance Bureau (SVB) revealed that huge amount of payments were released by the concerned department officers without work done by the contractors or receipt of material from suppliers on the basis of fake bills as such only in Ambala district construction work in more than half dozen important projects have come to halt in the absence of funds sanctioned for these projects since a major amount alleged spent over these projects went into the pockets of contractors raised fake bills and officers as well staff working in the departments and work in large number of such projects have stopped giving rise to conflicts. Information reveals that in most of the cases the cost of projects hanging in between have to be revised by the government officers in the department for completion of such incomplete projects misusing their powers even increased up to 170% in few cases showing additional work done in these projects. According to new policy by the state government in case the cost of tender exceeds 10% the department will have to re-tender for additional work in favour of some other contractor to avoid corruption. Talking to media persons Abhijit Kapoor Director General SVB told that more than 150 corrupt officers and employees working in government offices including working in the rank of HCS and Chief Engineer working in the state caused inconvenience to government as well as public deprived of to avail benefits of large number of important projects were found involved in corrupt practices during investigation by SVB in nearly 143 cases, arrested and sent behind bars. Abhijit Kapoor told that Chief Minister has given free hand to SVB for the arrest of corrupts in government offices made situation bad to worst in past few years as such the department has released two toll free numbers 1800-180-2022 and 1064 and a Watts App number 094178-91064 for lodging complaints against corruption.

Woman beaten to death by obsessed 'lover' in Gurugram

A 19-year-old woman was allegedly beaten to death by a man obsessed with her in Faridabad's Mujesar area, police here said Thursday. We started looking for her and around 5.30 am today a call came from an unknown number on Roshni's brother's phone. The person who called said that there is a woman lying in injured condition on a road. He said she has asked him to call on your number, Raju said. After getting the details about the location, her family members went to the spot where they found Roshni lying in a pool of blood at a roadside. She told his brother Kishan that Mahendra had done this to her, Raju said. She told me that Mahendra had taken her forcibly with him from outside the factory in night and thrashed her with a stick. She lay injured overnight on the road.

Himachal Election: PM Modi links Congress to instability, corruption and Scams

On the occasion of Guru Nanak Jayanti a few hours after the yatra entered Maharashtra Monday night from neighbouring Telangana. At the Gurudwara Sahib, Gandhi prayed for harmony and equality. Rahul Gandhi resumed his march, he was flanked by senior Maharashtra Congress leaders including former Chief Ministers Sushilkumar Shinde and Ashok Chavan, state party Chief Nana Patole, and other leaders like Balasaheb Thorat, Manikrao Thakre and Naseem Khan. The march will proceed from to Atkali in Biloli city of Nanded. Gandhi is scheduled to halt at Godavari Manar Sugar Factory ground in Biloli for night stay, a party functionary said.

On Monday night, as Gandhi said entered Maharashtra holding a 'flaming torch' (mashaal), he said small and medium businesses suffered due to the Centre's wrong policies like demonetisation and poor implementation of the Goods and Service Tax. Gandhi said

during his stay in Maharashtra over the next 15 days, he will listen to the voice of the state and also its pain, and asserted no force can stop his yatra, that began on September 7 from Kanniyakumari (Tamil Nadu) and will culminate in Srinagar.

The 3,570-km-long yatra led by the Congress MP reached Deglur in central Maharashtra's Nanded district from Telangana. During his stay in the state, Gandhi will address two rallies as part of the cross-country march aimed at reviving the party.

Gandhi said the march started two months back from Kanniyakumari and it will stop only at Srinagar after hoisting the tricolour. "No force can stop this yatra," asserted the former Congress president, whose party was a strong political force in Maharashtra for several decades and was a constituent of the three-party ruling coalition till June this year. Gandhi said the aim of the yatra is to bind the country together and highlighted major issues before the country. "The reality of India is that the country cannot give employment to its youth, even if it is willing. On one hand there is unemployment, on the other hand there is inflation," he said, attacking the Narendra Modi government.

Haryana CM inaugurates road projects worth Rs 141 crore

Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar on Saturday dedicated two projects -- a newly constructed flyover at Basai Chowk and the Mahavir Chowk underpass built near the main bus stand in Gurugram -- at a cost of Rs 141 crore.

"After coming to power in 2014, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) was formed to expand the development and related schemes in the city so that development plans are made here only. The development of Gurugram has gained momentum with the formation of GMDA," Khattar said.

The Chief Minister also mentioned the projects of road in-



frastructure and metro expansion and said that the metro line expansion connecting the Palam Vihar area to Dwarka Sector-21 of Delhi has also been approved. Referring to other major projects being implemented through GMDA, Khattar said that the construction of multi-specialty Sheela Mata Medical College and Hospital with a capacity of 650 beds is underway in Sector-102 at a cost of about Rs 542 crore.

Public service broadcast is a good idea

Tweaking guidelines for television channels operating in India, the Union Cabinet has laid down some norms on content as well. In the time of polarising opinions, heated debates and narrow targeting of ideas on television, it said wherever applicable, the channels would have to broadcast content on themes of national importance and socially relevant issues for at least 30 minutes every day. The 'Guidelines for Uplinking and Downlinking of Satellite Television Channels in India, 2022' point out that as airwaves and frequencies are public property and need to be used in the best interest of society, a company with permission to operate in India, barring foreign channels, will have to air content in the service of the public. The themes that have been picked out include education and spread of literacy, agriculture and rural development, health and family welfare, science and technology, welfare of women and weaker sections of society, protection of environment and of cultural heritage and national integration. These are subjects on which a lot more awareness is necessary. In its 2008 recommendations, the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India had suggested a public service obligation, which the Information and Broadcasting (I&B) Ministry has taken on board. But there is no clarity yet on compensation norms and who is going to foot the bill for the public service component on TV. The guidelines, with effect from November 9, replace those in operation since 2011 with the Government announcing a host of measures which include making India a teleport hub. The Government has done away with the requirement to seek permission for live telecast of events; only prior registration of events will be necessary for live telecast. As for the 30-minute public service slot, I&B Secretary Apurva Chandra has said stakeholders will be consulted regarding the modalities, which will have to be sorted out.

Stop politicising the policing



India's Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) convened a conference in late October in the capital, which saw the participation of the Union Home Minister, a few State Home Ministers and police chiefs. West Bengal did not send its highest officials citing its preoccupation with pooja-related issues. The Delhi conference was a very important occasion aimed at improving the quality of policing in the country through an exchange of ideas. The seriousness of the subject required attendance at the level of the Chief Minister and if some States gave it a miss, it was an unfortunate development and a reflection of the lack of seriousness in matters of governance affecting public order and crime.

The debate now over the way the Tamil Nadu police have handled the case of a blast in Coimbatore that happened recently, and a possible terror-related plot, also fits in this scene and is relevant to the state of law and order in the State and elsewhere. There is a section of influential public opinion which has accused the Tamil Nadu government of having been slothful and delayed handing over investigation of the incident to the National Investigation Agency (NIA). This has been rebutted by the State Director General of Police (DGP) who said that his force could not abruptly abandon the investigation and had to do the preliminary investigation to facilitate an NIA take-over. The exchange of barbs by the two sides has been an unfortunate and avoidable development and the truth lies in between. Rather than getting into a slanging match, what is more important is an examination of the standard operating procedures in place, the identification of lacunae and the initiation of corrective measures.

The first Home Minister of independent India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, would have been dismayed by the politics in Centre-State relations in a matter as serious as policing. He placed great value on professional

policing, one reason why he insisted on an elitist and well-trained corps such as the Indian Police Service (IPS) which worked alongside the Indian Administrative Service (IAS). He was under immense pressure from various quarters, which included his own Congress party, to disband both the Indian Civil Service and IP, but as a distinguished and astute visionary, he was steadfast in his belief. Subsequent events proved him right. Despite all their faults, the two all-India services have been a cementing force and have greatly contributed to establishing nationally accepted standards of governance, especially in the area of law and order.

The passage of 75 years in a free India has more than established that a country of our proportions and diversity will need objective policing by a highly trained police force. It is distressing that there is still conflict between the MHA and some States over utilising talent in the IPS and the sharing of resources available in the States. Both sides have to be partially blamed for this unfortunate state of affairs. Petulance in personnel management has occasionally affected administration in the Centre and States.

Camaraderie is essential

It is a no-brainer that in this, New Delhi is

the senior partner in what is definitely a collaborative relationship. But there have been actions over the decades that have inflicted many deep wounds on public order. These have been situations that have demanded large numbers of well-trained policemen. The Centre has always chipped in with support from the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF). There have also been other outfits such as the Border Security Force (BSF), the Indo Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) and the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) which have also worked in tandem with the State Police. Therefore, it makes sense that the MHA and State Police stop squabbling but explore how best to forge a strong camaraderie. We are also witness to frequent spats between States and the Centre over the use or alleged misuse of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). Here again both parties have to share the blame. But the basic point that has been ignored is that crime and bureaucratic corruption have inter-State ramifications and only a national agency can bring in a much-needed and wide perspective. Insensitive action by a few States to withdraw consent to the CBI to function in a State smacks of politics and vindictiveness, which diminishes the fight against public servant graft.

What is lacking

'Police' is a State subject under the distribution of powers laid down in the Constitution of India. But that does not mean the Union government has no say in the matter. Training and technology are two areas where the Centre does greatly contribute to sharpening police ability to combat terrorism and other major public disturbances. The Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel National Police Academy in Hyderabad is a world-class institution that has resources and the professional excellence which are generously available to State police forces. Petty squabbling reduces the exchange of ideas and goes to attenuating the police response to difficult situations that require police assistance. This is why we need a political leadership that does not get bogged down in petty differences but promotes a free exchange of talent and resources between New Delhi and the States.

There is no point in blaming a DGP if he or she does not respond to a situation in a professional manner. The DGP looks up to the Chief Minister for directions. If the latter is driven by political considerations and gives unprofessional instructions, there is very little that the DGP can do. Despite all that the Supreme Court of India has done to insulate the chief of police from political caprice, the truth is that a DGP is perilously placed vis-à-vis the Chief Minister and his or her party men. It is lamentable that public opinion in the country has not asserted itself to impart a better sense of policing at all levels of government. I do not foresee any change in this unfortunate situation in the years ahead.

DR. DINESH BASWAL EXPLAINS WHY IT IS CRUCIAL TO EMPOWER FRONTLINE HEALTH WORKERS

The frontliners of the first 1,000-day window of life

Addressing malnutrition is critical to laying a strong foundation for human development. Optimal maternal nutrition and infant and young child feeding are the most effective set of interventions in reducing child deaths and disease, preventing malnutrition, in determining cognitive development, and in eventually enabling adult life productivity. Specifically, the first 1,000 days of life, i.e., from conception to the first two years of a child's life, are key as this phase presents a critical window of opportunity in ensuring optimal growth, development, child survival and lifelong health and nutrition. In fact, 80% of brain development takes place in the first 1,000 days of life.

To address the persistent high burden of malnutrition, India has been undertaking several policy and programmatic efforts which include the flagship programme, the Prime Minister's Overarching Scheme for Holistic Nourishment (POSHAN) Abhiyaan (launched in April 2018) under the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD). Its overarching goal is to improve nutritional outcomes by focusing on capacity building, improvement of service delivery, community mobilisation and participation, use of technology, and inter-ministerial/inter-departmental convergent planning and review. Additionally, there has been an enhanced focus on documentation of interventions coverage in the first 1,000 days, such as registration of pregnancies, antenatal checkup, and exclusive breastfeeding, as compared to the situation in 2015-16.

Evidence-based interventions are key

Evidence tells us that for bringing about change in nutrition outcomes, evidence-based interventions need to be delivered with high coverage, continuity (over the first 1,000 days of life and across delivery channels), intensity



(multiple interactions), quality and equity. The health and nutrition status of women, including the weight and haemoglobin level, age at conception, and levels of multiple micronutrients during periconception period, are critical determinants for the child's health.

The criticality of preconception care, i.e., care before pregnancy, is acknowledged. In 2018, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare worked with Maharashtra and UNICEF to introduce the first ever primary health-care innovation programme to promote the health of women during the preconception period, in the Peth and Sinhar blocks of Nashik district, Maharashtra. During the programme, which was completed in 27 months, it was seen that promoting the health of adolescent girls and women not only promotes the health of the newborn but also prevents low birth weight, preterm birth, and newborn deaths. Its success led to it being scaled across several districts in the State.

All such interventions are delivered to the last mile by the network of the frontline work force: Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs), Auxiliary Nurse-Midwives (ANMs) and Anganwadi Workers (AWWs), who play a key role in empowering the com-

munity on health planning and action. In many geographies, they are the only access point to basic nutrition and other health services. They are critical in promoting healthy practices, providing on-ground support, and improving awareness.

In Uttar Pradesh

For example, during the Poshan Pakhwa in March 2022, in a remote village in Uttar Pradesh, all families with children below two were able to overcome age-old fears and misconceptions and get their children weighed at the anganwadi centre after multiple and continuous efforts by the AWWs, supported by the lady supervisor. Mothers and other relatives such as grandmothers and also fathers were enlightened about the benefits of regular weight measurement. Men, especially fathers, also play a very important role in ensuring maternal and newborn health (MNH). They can influence behaviours and good practices around MNH within their households and communities. Studies show that mothers are 1.5 times more likely to receive prenatal care in the first trimester when fathers are involved during pregnancy.

Back to the story. The AWW and the lady

supervisor found support in the panchayat pradhan who had organised a community-level meeting a day before the start of the Poshan Pakhwa. All the men, women, AWWs, ASHAs, schoolteachers and community elders were involved to generate awareness on the benefits of weight measurement, early detection of undernourished children and ensure the weighing of all eligible young children.

Similarly, lady supervisors of a block in Unnao district (Uttar Pradesh) have ensured that AWWs have not only received growth monitoring devices but also been trained to measure and record body weight accurately. Community mobilisation meetings to ensure coverage of all eligible children were also organised.

These stories of change from Uttar Pradesh that have been driven by frontline workers and their supervisors resonate with the joint efforts of AWWs and ASHA workers in a remote village bordering Nepal, who ensure the regular weighing of each child every month to detect deficiencies in early growth.

The momentum for strengthening the nutrition system focuses on regular skilling, supportive supervision and motivation of frontline workers to deliver contextualised, focused and quality nutrition and health services. These along with data-driven reviews must be prioritised and sustained at the programme level. Because of their deeper understanding on the issues and needs at the grassroots level, their contribution to community health is much more. It is crucial to empower our frontline workers who are driving change at the last mile.

Replying to a media query about the unit, Pandit said: "Medical Cyclotron unit will produce radioactive isotopes required for critical imaging procedures such as PET scan for treatment of cancer and other critical ailments. Presently, Odisha obtains isotopes on a daily basis from Hyderabad, Mumbai or Kolkata and the isotopes



remain effective for only a few hours..."

The Health secretary said the proposed state-of-the-art Medical Cyclotron facility would be unique to the entire South East Asian region. It would be "operated by NISER in close collaboration with TMCH, Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Mumbai, Variable Energy Cyclotron Centre, Kolkata, Board of Radiation and Isotope Technology, Department of Atomic Energy and Atomic Energy Regulatory Board.

Official sources said that the outcomes of this world class standard facility would include, production of medically useful

radioisotopes, South East Asian regional facility for research and development in the area of nuclear medicine, national facility for research and development in the areas of basic sciences, skill development of human resources for applied science courses, and training of undergraduate and postgraduate students.

In another development towards Universal Health Care, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik also approved the provision of "Corpus Fund" for hiring super specialists and specialists doctors on contractual basis for Capital Hospital, and BMC Hospital in the state capital here.

Centre Govt deregulates uplinking of satellite TV channels



NEW DELHI: The government on Wednesday unveiled revised uplinking and downlinking guidelines for satellite television channels that allows Indian teleports to uplink foreign channels and scraps permission for live telecast of events. The Guidelines for Uplinking and Downlinking of Satellite Television Channels in India, 2022, which have been approved by the Union Cabinet, also makes it mandatory for television channels to telecast content in national and public interest for 30 minutes every day, Information & Broadcasting Secretary Apurva Chandra told reporters here.

Maharashtra increases subsidy outlay for small scale businesses

"Earlier, such subsidy was available only to people from SC, ST categories, women, Divyang

persons and retired military officials. The state has now decided to extend the subsidy to OBCs, Nomadic Tribes and minorities as well," Samant added.

The government has received complaints about nationalised banks not extending support to such loan applicants, the minister said, adding that now the subsidy will also be distributed through district cooperative banks.

The state would hold a conference chaired chief minister Eknath Shinde where top 30 industrial houses in the country will be invited to either set up their plants in the state or expand the existing ones, Samant said.

Your smartphone will soon help map surroundings for better 6G experience



A team of US researchers, including one of Indian-origin, is developing smartphone technologies that will use current 5G and emerging 6G wireless systems to "view" and map the surrounding environment.

The mapping of a user's surroundings will improve communication by identifying obstacles that may interfere with radio frequency signals.

"Mobile wireless devices have gradually transformed from mere communications devices into powerful computing platforms with a multitude of sensors, such as cameras and radars," said Harpreet Dhillon of Virginia Tech's College of Engineering.

In fact, when we shop for a new phone, the main considerations are its camera quality, processing speed, memory, and sensors, whereas hardly anyone checks its frequency bands.

"Since this is one of the first efforts to do a comprehensive analysis of vision-guided wireless systems, this is expected to have a significant impact on future generations of wireless," Dhillon said in a statement.

Professors Walid Saad and Dhillon of the College of Engineering have been awarded a \$1 million grant to develop vision-guided wireless systems. Researchers at the Bradley Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering (ECE) want to take the multi-use function of cellular devices

even further with the idea of a "vision-guided wireless system."

"In 6G, we talk about high-frequency bands like terahertz," said Saad. "These high frequencies can deliver high rates and high bandwidth, but the problem is that the signals are susceptible to blockages -- much more so than low frequencies.

"Those frequencies can be blocked by things like your arms moving, or someone standing in a room with you," Saad added.

Although these blockages might seem irritating, they could actually be the key to helping researchers improve communication.

"If a communication system fails because the signal is blocked, at sub-THz bands, we can still use that information to sense the environment and know that there was an obstacle in the first place," Saad noted. "Then, with both situational awareness and other side information - like a picture of the room - we can use that multimodal data to communicate better."

These vision-guided systems can be used in several applications, such as enhancing the performance of tomorrow's wireless systems (6G), creating a more advanced and interactive gaming environment, and pushing the boundaries of extended reality while exploring the metaverse.

For every rupee depreciation, software exports increase by \$250 mn: SBI Chief Economic Advisor

India's software export revenue and remittances act as a strong counter cyclical buffer against increase in current account deficit (CAD) due to hike in global oil prices and rupee depreciation, said the State Bank of India's (SBI) Chief Economic Advisor.

In a research report Dr. Soumya Kanti Ghosh, Group Chief Economic Adviser, SBI, said for every rupee depreciation, software exports increase by \$250 million. Ghosh said contrary to the expectations, the Q1FY23 Balance of Payments (BOP) numbers have shown that a strong counter-cyclical buffer in the form of service exports and remittances.

For example, in Q1, India's CAD was expected to breach \$30 billion/3.8 per cent of gross domestic product (GDP), but the actual numbers came in at 2.8 per cent of GDP.

The positive surprise was because of strong remittances and software exports, the CAD got a lift of 60 basis points, Ghosh said. "We expect that if such trends of strong remittances and software exports have continued (RBI data suggests software exports in Q2 was strong) in Q2, and India's CAD comes in below the threshold level of 3.5 per cent of GDP in Q2, the CAD for FY23 could still be closer to 3 per cent benchmark and not in excess of 3.5 per cent of GDP," he added.

Also, forex reserves could jump by another \$5 billion as swap transactions reverse and thus having a positive impact on rupee as is being currently witnessed, he noted. To understand the factors that are impacting India's CAD, Ghosh worked on the structural vector autoregressions (SVAR) model. With oil forming 30 per cent



of India's import bill, it has a major impact on macro-economic variables. An increase in oil import price impacts directly the trade deficit and consequently CAD gets widened. That apart, it also results in inflation. According to Ghosh, the SVAR model introduces a counter cyclical response to increased oil prices in the form of software service exports that

is impacted positively because of a rupee depreciation. "Although, remittances are positively impacted, we have not considered them in our SVAR model because of data volatility." The results of the SVAR model clearly gives an idea of the negative impact of oil price shock on CAD, inflation and growth in one direction and the positive impact of software

exports on CAD as a result of rupee depreciation.

In particular, a positive shock to oil prices leads to immediate and sharp increase in CAD, which dissipates completely in about eight quarters. The trade deficit also increases up to two quarters after the initial positive oil price shock, he said. "This implies that India's trade deficit may already have been adversely impacted for first half of the current fiscal because of the oil price shock," Ghosh said.

In case of GDP, positive shock to oil prices leads to immediate decline, which however starts reversing after third quarter and completely dissipates after the seventh quarter.

"This implies that India's first half GDP growth in FY23 could have been impacted because of oil price shock. Most interestingly, rupee dollar exchange rate also gets impacted and it de-

preciates slightly after increase in oil prices till three quarters following which it starts appreciating," he said.

As a result, the rupee outlook is likely to improve in Q4 of FY23.

The impact of oil price on consumer price index (CPI) inflation will dissipate after four quarters and it means that the CPI inflation outlook for FY24 will be consistent with RBI's forecast of 5 per cent.

Ghosh said India's software exports are on the rise with the share of offside mode of exports by Indian IT service companies increasing to 88.8 per cent in FY22 compared to 82.8 per cent five years ago.

Ghosh said a \$10 increase in crude oil prices leads to increase of 40 bps in CAD, 50 bps in CPI and 23 bps decline in growth with software exports acting as counter cyclical buffer.

Crypto exchange Coinbase to lay off more employees amid FTX saga



Leading crypto exchange Coinbase will lay off more employees soon in a fresh round of job cuts, as the world of crypto faces another existential threat after the FTX collapse, the media reported.

The layoffs were announced internally and the company is likely to sack around 60 employees in its recruiting and institutional onboarding teams, reports The Information.

The cuts will take place as the broader cryptocurrency industry is in chaos due to the ongoing FTX saga which has alarmed investors and caused cryptocurrency values to sink further.

Crypto exchange FTX Founder and CEO Sam Bankman-Fried told investors that he needed emergency funding to cover a shortfall of up to \$8 billion due to withdrawal requests received in recent days.

Leading crypto exchange Binance has also pulled out of the FTX acquisition deal.

Even before the FTX problems, Coinbase had tried to control costs, as declining crypto trading volumes were hurting this year's revenue, the report said. In June this year, the crypto exchange company had announced to lay off 18 per cent of its workforce, or about 1,100 jobs amid the economic downturn.

Brian Armstrong, CEO and co-founder had said that while the company tried its best to get this just right, in this case, it was clear that it had overhired.

Now, the collapse of the FTX crypto exchange has brought yet another round of threats to the crypto industry as a whole amid Bitcoin and other crypto values dropping further.

US Treasury Secretary meets FM Nirmala Sitharaman



NEW DELHI: US Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen, who is on a day-long visit to India, on Friday met Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman ahead of the 9th meeting of the India-US Economic Financial Partnership here. "Union Finance Minister Smt. @nsitharaman and US Treasury Secretary Dr. @SecYellen meet ahead of the 9th meeting of India-US Economic Financial Partnership #EFP, in New Delhi, today," the Finance Ministry said in a tweet. During the meeting, both sides will discuss issues of mutual interest, including climate finance, multilateral issues, India-US cooperation at G20 under India's presidency, taxation, supply chain resilience, global economy and macroeconomic outlook.

Gold climbs Rs 294, silver rises Rs 638



NEW DELHI: Gold price in the national capital rallied Rs 294 to Rs 52,663 per 10 grams on Friday amid a rise in price of the metal in the international market, according to HDFC Securities.

In the previous trade, the yellow metal had closed at Rs 52,369 per 10 grams.

Silver also surged by Rs 638 to Rs 62,858 per kg.

"MCX Gold December future has surpassed the crucial resistance of Rs 52,100 and headed towards the next target of Rs 52,600," said Vinay Rajani, Research Analyst at HDFC Securities. In the international market, gold was trading higher at USD 1,761 per ounce while silver was up at USD 21.89 per ounce.

No new Rs 2,000 notes printed from 2019-2022, says RTI reply

An RTI reply has disclosed that no new Rs 2,000 denomination currency notes were printed during 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22.

The RTI application filed by IANS disclosed that the Bharatiya Reserve Bank Note Mudran (P) Ltd printed 3,542,991 million pieces of Rs 2,000 notes in the financial year 2016-17, which drastically came down to 111.507 million notes in 2017-18 and was further reduced to 46.690 million notes in 2018-19.

The RTI reply received from the Bharatiya Reserve Bank Note Mudran (P) Ltd revealed said that '0' number of Rs 2,000 denomination currency note was printed in 2019-20,

2020-21 and 2021-22.

The Reserve Bank of India had introduced the Rs 2,000 note after the government announced the demonetisation move that banned old Rs 500 and Rs 1,000 currency notes on November 8, 2016.

A recent reply in the Parliament (on August 1) said that the number of fake currency notes of Rs 2,000 denomination seized in the country as per NCRB data increased substantially between 2016 and 2020, from 2,272 to 2,44,834 pieces.

As per the data, the total number of fake Rs 2,000 notes seized in the country in 2016 was 2,272, which increased to 74,898 in 2017 before reducing



to 54,776 in 2018. The figures in 2019 stood at 90,566 pieces, before registering a remarkable spike in 2020 to 2,44,834 pieces.

The RBI had issued

banknotes in all denominations in the Mahatma Gandhi Series - 2005 with a new exploding numbering pattern in 2015. With these visible security features, the general public can

easily distinguish a counterfeit note from a genuine one.

More than 90 per cent of the counterfeit notes detected in the banking system were of low quality and none of the major security features were compromised. Details of security features of these notes are displayed on the RBI website for the general public, said the reply in the Parliament.

It also said that the RBI issues various instructions to banks on measures to safeguard against forged currency notes. The central bank regularly conducts training programmes on detection of counterfeit notes for employees/officials of banks and other organisations handling large amount of cash.

Coinbase has \$15 mn deposits on FTX, now acquired by Binance

Leading cryptocurrency exchange Coinbase has clarified that it only has \$15 million worth of deposits on FTX to facilitate business operations and client trades, as it faced a partial outage.

In its bid to provide clarity, the company said regardless of whether the Binance and FTX transaction completes, "we have very little exposure to FTX and we have no exposure to its token, FTT". "We have no exposure to Alameda Research, and we have no loans to FTX," Coinbase said in a blog post late on Tuesday.

The clarification came as Binance on Tuesday announced a non-binding, letter of intent to acquire FTX for an undisclosed sum. Binance founder and CEO Changpeng Zhao (CZ) said in a tweet that FTX asked for their help. Binance and FTX teams were working on clearing out the withdrawal backlog.

Coinbase further said that as a publicly traded company in the US, "we've also built our busi-



ness in a way that allows us to be transparent about our track record, balance sheet strength, and effectively and prudently manage risk for our customers and ourselves". "We are in a strong capital position. We ended Q3 with \$5.6 billion in total available USD resources, including \$5 billion in cash and cash equivalents," the company informed. "Fragmented, opaque regulatory frameworks in the US are driving crypto to offshore unregulated exchanges, where looser regulations can put customers at risk," it said.

Meanwhile, Coinbase said it was monitoring a fix for a partial outage that affected its website and app for around two hours.

Man held with heroin worth Rs 35 crore at Mumbai Airport

channel, he said.

On searching his luggage, officials recovered 4.98 kg of off-white colour powder in a trolley bag and on testing, presence of heroin was found, the official said.

The contraband was kept in a black polythene bag concealed under a false cavity created in the trolley bag, due to which it was difficult to detect the drug, he said.

Further investigation in the case is underway to unearth and neutralise the international drug smuggling syndicate, the official said.

Seizure of Stone Sculpture of Buddha datable to 2 nd / 3 rd CE at ICP, Attari

The Customs department here today informed that Customs officers posted at Land Customs Station at Attari under the Amritsar Customs Preventive Commissionerate have seized an antique stone sculpture of Buddha.

Commissioner Customs Amritsar, Rahul Nangare in a statement issued here today informed that a passenger of foreign nationality, who arrived in India via ICP, Attari was intercepted and his baggage was examined. During examination of his baggage, the Customs officers posted at the passenger terminal of ICP Attari, detected a stone sculpture of Buddha.

The sculpture was detained by Customs officers posted at the Passenger Terminal, ICP Attari on suspicion of being a prohibited item falling in the category of Antiquity. But at the same time a passenger who



was a Foreign National was freed to continue his journey to the next nation.

The matter was referred to the office of Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) Chandigarh circle. The ASI has now given a report confirming that the sculpture fragment appears to be Buddha of the Gandhara School of Art and tentatively datable to 2 nd or 3 rd CE and falls under the category of an-

tiquity under the Antiquities and Art Treasure Act, 1972. They have further informed that the main features of such idol pertaining to Gandhara School of Art are- with Flute hair, Face of Buddha shown as crown prince, the idols of Buddha are of are of Black soft stone, which comes from Syat ghati and the Gandhara Art is strongly influenced by Greeco- Roman Art, said he.

The stone sculpture has been seized under the Customs Act read with Antiquities and Art Treasure Act, 1972 and further investigation and necessary action under the relevant Acts is being taken in the matter. It was an incident of around twenty days back, but today a report with regard to Sculpture of Buddha was received from Archaeological Survey of In-

dia (ASI) Chandigarh, said a Custom official.

He said the seized Stone Sculpture of Buddha may be handed over to some museum or department of Archaeological Survey of India.

Adding further he said that in previous such instances of seizures of Antiquities, 262 Antiquity Coins were seized from a passenger at Land Customs Station, Attari Rail in May, 2017 and another 65 Antiquity Coins were seized from a passenger at Land Customs Station, Attari Rail in September, 2018.

The ASI had identified these coins as belonging to various historical eras including, Maharaja Ranjit Singh Period, Indo Greek coins of Azeluzus, square coin of Appolodotus, Coins of Akbar, Jahangir and Humayun and Coins of British era with legend Victoria Empress bust. Some of these Coins are now displayed in the Dharohar: National Museum of Customs & GST at Goa.

Global Covid infection rates higher than previously reported

A joint study by the World Health Organisation's (WHO) Unity Studies and SeroTracker and colleagues suggests that based on seroprevalence, global Covid-19 infection rates are likely to be higher than previously reported.

The study, published in the open access journal PLOS Medicine, found that global seroprevalence rose from 7.7 per cent in June 2020 to 59.2 per cent in September 2021, suggesting two-thirds of the global population may be SARS-CoV-2 seropositive from either vaccination or infection.

Estimates of Covid-19 infections based on seroprevalence data far exceed reported cases, suggesting a bigger global impact of Covid-19 than previously known. According to the authors, "this study on global seroprevalence of SARS-CoV-2 antibodies found that while seroprevalence has increased over time, a third of the global population tested negative for antibodies against the virus as of September 2021 estimates. It was also found that compared



to seroprevalence estimates, routine testing for Covid-19 has largely underestimated the number of global infections".

Serosurveillance provides estimates of antibody levels against infectious diseases and is considered the gold standard for measuring population immunity due to past infection or vaccination.

In order to ascertain the true rates of infection and indicators of immunity in the population against SARS-CoV-2 over time, researchers conducted a systematic review and meta-analysis of seroprevalence studies published from January 1, 2020 to May 20,

2022. From their search parameters, the authors identified 965 distinct seroprevalence studies sampling 5, 346, 069 participants between January 2020 and April 2022, with 43 per cent of these studies being from low-middle income countries.

"As we enter the third year of the pandemic, implementation of a global system or network for targeted, multi-pathogen, high-quality and standardised collaborative serosurveillance is a crucial next step to monitor the pandemic and contribute to preparedness for other emerging respiratory pathogens," said the researchers.

PM to gift traditional Himachal items to world leaders at G20 summit



During the G20 summit in Bali scheduled to be held on November 15-16, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is likely to gift unique art and handicraft items from Himachal Pradesh to world leaders, according to official sources. The sources said that the Prime Minister may gift items like Kullu shawls and Kangra miniature paintings. India will take over the G20 presidency from Indonesia from December 1. India's tenure will continue till November 20, 2023. G20 is a premier forum for international economic co-operation representing around 85 per cent of the global GDP, over 75 per cent of the global trade and around two-thirds of the world population. India is taking over the presidency at a time when geo-political tensions are on the rise owing to the Russia-Ukraine war and inflation, rising fuel prices as well as unemployment are emerging as major global concerns apart from weakening of emerging markets and currencies, including the rupee.

Winning ticket for \$2.04bn jackpot sold in California



A jackpot-winning Powerball ticket was sold in California for a record \$2.04 billion, authorities said. Lottery officials confirmed in a tweet on Tuesday that "California Lottery makes its FIRST EVER Billionaire", reports Xinhua news agency. "One lucky ticket sold at Joe's Service Center in Altadena matched all 6 numbers in the November 7 Powerball draw," said the tweet.

The jackpot climbed beyond its earlier estimate of \$1.9 billion to \$2.04 billion at the time of the drawing, making it the world's largest lottery prize, according to California Lottery officials. In addition to the high tem-

PM Modi to visit Indonesia to attend G20 summit



NEWDELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Indonesia from November 14 to November 16 to attend the 17th G20 summit in Bali at the invitation of the Indonesian President Joko Widodo.

According to a statement by the Ministry of External Affairs, during the Bali summit, G20 leaders will deliberate extensively upon key issues of global concern under the summit theme of "Recover Together, Recover Stronger".

Three working sessions will be held as part of the G20 sum-

mit agenda, namely on food and energy security, health and digital transformation.

At the closing session of the summit, Widodo will symbolically hand over the G20 presidency to Modi. India will formally assume the G20 presidency from December 1, 2022, the statement added.

On the sidelines of the summit, the Prime Minister will hold bilateral meetings with some of his counterparts. Modi will also address and interact with the Indian community in Bali, official sources said.

UK braces for strikes over pay disputes



A series of large-scale strikes across the UK over long-running pay disputes are set to disrupt daily life for the next few months and also expected to take a huge economic toll.

Strikes on the London Underground will go ahead on Thursday, after the government body Transport for London (TfL) and trade union representatives failed to reach an agreement, reports Xinhua news agency. The unions had asked TfL to pause job cuts and changes to pensions.

"Our members are resolute in their determination to see a just settlement to this jobs and

pensions dispute," said Mick Lynch, general secretary at The National Union of Rail, Maritime and Transport Workers.

"They will continue their industrial campaign for as long as it takes." TfL has warned that there will be "limited or no services running" on Thursday, and passengers should avoid travelling on the Tube.

London Underground handles up to five million passengers a day, according to TfL. At peak times, there are over 540 trains running around the British capital. Meanwhile, starting on November 18 around 700 workers at

London's Heathrow airport will participate in a three-day strike. These workers are responsible for a wide variety of roles, including ground handling, airside transport and cargo, said Unite, one of the largest trade unions in the UK.

The strike will particularly affect Qatar Airways, which has scheduled an additional 10 flights a week during the World Cup that starts on November 20.

Passengers returning to the US for the Thanksgiving holiday are also set to be adversely affected, Unite said. Next, more than 70,000 university staff at 150 UK universities will strike for three days at the end of November over pay, working conditions and pensions.

The strike will be "the biggest ever to hit UK universities and could impact 2.5 million students", the University and College Union (UCU) said. UCU's demands include a meaningful pay rise to deal with the cost-of-living crisis, after employers granted a pay rise worth just 3 per cent this year. This followed over a decade of below-inflation pay rises, the union underlined.

Hottest October in northern Italy since 1800

Large swathes of northern Italy experienced the hottest October this year since record keeping began in 1800, the country's National Research Council said.

Temperatures reached 3.18 degrees Celsius above normal levels in the northern part of the country, Xinhua news agency quoted the Council as saying.

However, in Italy as a whole, temperatures were high but not record-breaking.

The Council said they were 2.08 degrees Celsius higher than normal, the second-highest increase compared to normal levels, just behind the record of 2.13 degrees Celsius reached in 2001.

The new data comes from Giulio Betti, a meteorologist and climatologist with the National Research Council.

In addition to the high tem-



peratures, much of the country has also suffered from a lack of rainfall, and an increase in extreme weather events including storms, floods, and strong winds.

The record high temperatures in October followed a long and unusually dry heatwave in Italy in the summer months, which resulted in hundreds of deaths and slashed agricultural production.

According to previous reports from the National Research Council, this year is on track to be the hottest ever recorded nationally.

Indian national charged in \$8 mn Covid relief fraud scheme in US

An Indian national in the US faces a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison if convicted in an \$8 million Covid-19 relief fraud scheme, according to court documents.

Abhishek Krishnan, 40, has been charged by a federal grand jury in Newark, New Jersey, for fraudulently obtaining millions of dollars in Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans guaranteed by the Small Business Administration (SBA) under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. Krishnan, who previously resided in Wake County, North Carolina, is charged with two counts of wire fraud, two counts of money



laundering, and two counts of aggravated identity theft.

After returning to India, Krishnan allegedly submitted numerous fraudulent PPP loan applications to federally insured banks, including on behalf of purported companies that were not registered business entities. The fraudulent PPP loan applications allegedly included false

statements about the companies employees and payroll expenses, as well as falsified tax filings. As part of the fraud scheme, Krishnan allegedly used the name of another person without that person's authority. He allegedly submitted at least 17 PPP loan applications seeking over \$8.2 million and received more than \$3.3 million in loan proceeds. Following receipt of the funds, Krishnan allegedly laundered the proceeds of the fraud. If convicted, he faces a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison on each of the top counts and a mandatory minimum of two years in prison on each count of aggravated identity theft.

Pak PM to appoint army Chief 'at any cost', Sharif brothers decide in London huddle

As crucial discussions among various stakeholders around the next Pakistan army chief's appointment gain momentum within and outside the country, the Sharif brothers have reportedly decided in a London huddle that the prime minister will not buckle under any 'pressure' to make the all-important appointment - come what may, media report said.

Meanwhile, it emerged on Thursday that former prime minister Nawaz Sharif had been issued a diplomatic passport, paving the way for his impending return to the country, Dawn reported.

In the face of looming pressure from Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Imran Khan to appoint a new army chief that would be acceptable to him, and announce early polls, both Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and his elder brother Nawaz Sharif have decided that the powers of the premier to appoint the army chief will not be surrendered



at any cost, a reliable source privy to the talks between the two brothers in London said, Dawn reported.

Insiders said that the prime minister had reportedly flown to London to place the options he was conveyed by certain quarters before his elder brother in the context of the fast-changing political scenario.

However, the source said both brothers agreed not to give in to Khan's demand for

snap elections. "PM Shehbaz told Nawaz that almost all Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) parties are on the same page over the premier's powers to appoint the army chief and complete the incumbent government's tenure till August 2023. They (PML-N and allied parties) are even ready to sacrifice their government, but will not budge from their stance," the source maintained, Dawn reported.

Nawaz's children - Maryam, Hassan and Hussain - were also present in the meetings. A PML-N insider said the coalition government had "certain pressures" from some quarters over the issue of army chief's appointment and fresh polls. "That is why Shehbaz reached out to the party supreme to decide whether to accept some demands or not," he said.

The prime minister had rushed to London on Wednesday on his way back from Egypt to have the 'final word' from his elder brother and party's supreme leader, who has been in a self-imposed exile for three years, over the appointment of the new army chief. Sources said an extension to Gen Bajwa was also discussed during the meeting. Gen Bajwa's tenure is set to end on November 29, Dawn reported.

This was Shehbaz Sharif's third visit to the UK since taking over as premier in April this year.

Top US Gen estimates 200K military casualties on both sides in Ukraine war



General Mark Milley, Chairman of the US Joint Chiefs of Staff, has estimated that around 100,000 Russian and 100,000 Ukrainian soldiers have been killed or injured since Moscow waged its ongoing war against Kiev on February 24.

Addressing an event in New York late Thursday, the most senior US general also said that around 40,000 civilians had died in the war, reports the BBC. These are the highest-ever estimates offered by a Western official. General Milley, who serves as US President Joe Biden's most senior military adviser, added that for any talks to be successful, both Russia and Ukraine would have to reach a "mutual recognition" that a wartime victory "is maybe not achievable through military means, and therefore you need to turn to other means".



'Bhabhiji' actress Charrul Malik to make her big-screen debut with 'DASHMI'

Charrul Malik, who stars in 'Bhabhiji Ghar Par Hai' and 'Happu Ki Ultan Palan', said that she's all excited about her upcoming Marathi feature film 'Dashmi', which will mark her big-screen debut. Charrul said the film will be released next year and "I am playing a good role where

my character's name is also Charrul." Explaining how it happened, she said: "I suggested to my director that I keep my name and he agreed happily." "We were shooting this film in Lucknow last month and there are some parts we are yet to complete. That will happen in Mumbai. In February, I'll

be shooting again. It's a very big project, I can't reveal more details but I'm very happy and excited," Charrul added. Talking about her journey as an actress, Charrul said: "My learnings as an actor so far is that the process is still on and that learning never stops. The difference in acting and anchoring is that in anchoring

you are the director, producer and script writer. And in acting, you've to follow what has been told to you and expected from you," she said. On TV, there is not much scope for retakes, she explains, adding: "You have to do everything quickly as compared to film shoots. So as an actor I have learnt that here you have to be spontaneous. Your grasping power, your skills, your overall pace should be maintained because other actors are sharp in comedy with whom you are working. So, I've to compete and match their level of acting."

Charrul started her journey as an anchor and later moved towards acting. She says that she always tries to give her best and has learned to be more patient in life with her experience. "I don't know how successful I'm in doing that but I give my hundred per cent and, also, I have learnt that in acting you have to be very natural. You shouldn't go overboard. "So, I think it's very cool. I have learnt patience because whenever we go on set and have a scene and we're supposed to wait for 4-5 hours. 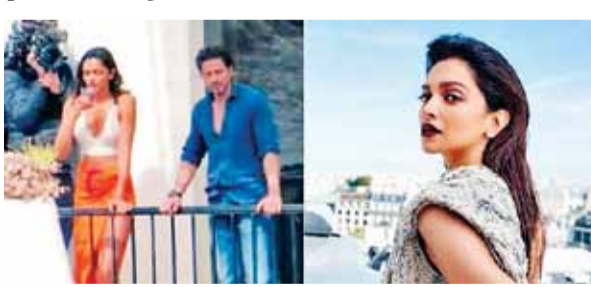
