LG of Delhi asks CM Kejriwal to sack Jasmine Shah, think tank office sealed

Lieutenant Governor of Delhi VK Saxena on Friday asked Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal to sack Delhi government think-tank, Delhi Dialogue and Development Commission vice chairman Jasmine Shah, over charges of misusing his office for political purposes.

An official in LG office said Shah was given two opportunities to reply to the show cause notice issued on October 17 by the Director of the planning department but Shah failed to submit his reply.

Instead, he informed that the reply was submitted to the Minister of the Planning department.

The LG office wrote a letter to the CM office on November



4, seeking to know the reply of Shah but the CM office till now has not replied to the letter.

Thereafter, LG asked to remove him and in the interim, to prevent any further misuse of the office of DDC, Shah's office was sealed late Thursday.

Meanwhile, the office of Shah was sealed on Thursday night by SDM Civil Lines

following an order from the Delhi government planning department to restrict Shah and prevent his access to office.

Shah holds the rank of a Delhi government cabinet minister.

Planning department is the parent body of the DDDC. "LG has ordered that Jasmine Shah will be restricted

from discharge of functions as vice chairman DDDC and to use any privileges and facilities connected with the office of VC DDDC with immediate effect," an order dated November 17 issued by Vijender Singh Rawat, director of the planning department stated.

The manpower and staff of Shah have also been ordered to be withdrawn besides locking the chamber of the VC to prevent him any access.

The order further stated, "Accordingly head of office/deputy secretary is hereby directed to give effect to this order immediately. Office chamber of VC may be locked in order to prevent access of the premises the vehicle and manpower and staff facilities shall be withdrawn with im-

mediate effect."

Accordingly, SDM Civil Lines sealed the office of the DDDC VC on Thursday night. Reacting on the development, deputy CM Manish Sisodia said the office of Sambit Patra, who is chairman of ITDC should also be sealed.

"Jasmine's office has been locked by LG alleging that he is AAP spokesperson. Then office of Sambit Patra, who is Chairman ITDC, should also be sealed since he is spokesperson of BJP", he said.

The notice was served over 30 days after BJP MP Parvesh Sahib Singh lodged a complaint with Delhi LG Saxena alleging that Shah was using his office for political activities like attending political debates on TV on behalf of AAP.

Director General of the NIA, Dinkar Gupta said that measures to curb such cases of terror funding would be discussed in the 'No Money for Terror' ministerial conference, being held in Delhi on November 18-19. He added that the funding of Khalistanis in Punjab and terrorist organisations in Kashmir had become a major issue for the country.

Delhi BJP demands sacking of 2 AAP MLAs involved in selling of MCD election Ticket

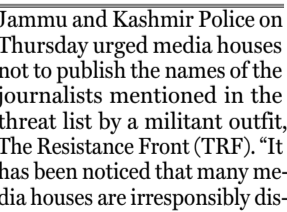

After militant threat, J&K Police urges media to not publish journalists' names

Jammu and Kashmir Police on Thursday urged media houses not to publish the names of the journalists mentioned in the threat list by a militant outfit, The Resistance Front (TRF). "It has been noticed that many media houses are irresponsibly discussing names of journalists regarding the online anonymous threat," Srinagar Police tweeted. "Media houses are requested not to fall for sensationalism & to behave responsibly not endangering the safety & security of their fellow journalists (sic)," they added. Earlier, the TRF issued a threat along with the list of names of journalists working for local news organisations, following which nearly half a dozen journalists quit their jobs.

India creates history, first private built rocket Launched

India created history by successfully launching its first private-sector rocket "Vikram-S", a suborbital vehicle developed by Skyroot Aerospace.

Vikram-S crossed the target of 80 km above sea level and peaked at an altitude 89.5km. The rocket began its descent soon after and safely splashed in the Bay of Bengal, about 130 km away from land.

The rocket was launched by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) from Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikotla on Friday carrying three Cubesats at 11.30 am under the mission named "Prarambh" (the Beginning).

The successful launch marked the foray of the private sector into the country's space industry, dominated by the state-run ISRO for decades. Skyroot Aerospace became the first private company in India to give a boost to the Indian space programme, after the central



government opened the sector to private players in 2020.

The launch vehicle has been named so as tribute to the father of the Indian Space programme, the Late Vikram Sarabhai. Vikram-S is single-stage fuel rocket meant to test most systems and processes in

Skyroot Aerospace's project ahead of the launch of Vikram-1 scheduled for next year.

The launch is also a sub-orbital one, meaning the vehicle will reach outer space, it will not remain in orbit around the Earth, with the flight time being less than five minutes

Farooq Abdullah resigns as National Conference president

National Conference president and former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Farooq Abdullah, 85, has reportedly resigned as National Conference president; citing health reasons. The party is now holding fresh election for the party president on December 5. It is speculated that National Conference vice president Omar Abdullah will take over the party.

Abdullah reportedly announced his resignation at the party's provincial office bearers meeting held in Srinagar. He is reported to have urged party leaders to take control of the situation and work towards strengthening the party. "I will not be contesting for the post of president any longer," Abdullah is reported to have said. "The elections for the post will be held on December 5. It is time for the new generation to take over the responsibilities."



Some countries support terrorists as part of their foreign policy: Modi

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the third edition of the 'No Money for Terror' Ministerial Conference here on Friday. Speaking on the occasion, Modi said, "certain countries support terrorists as part of their foreign policy."

"They offer political, ideological and financial support to them, he added."

The PM attacked Pakistan and China without naming them. Addressing the representatives of 78 countries, Modi said that a cost should be imposed on countries that support terrorism.

He added that the world today needed to stand united against covert and overt support to terrorism in all its forms to end global terrorism.

The PM stressed on 'proxy' wars being dangerous and said that organisations and people who sympathized with terrorists need to be isolated, adding that, "all terrorist at-



tacks deserve equal outrage and action."

He said that India considered that, "even a single attack is one too many, even a single life lost is one too many."

"Our country saw the dark face of terror long before the world took serious note of it," said Modi.

He added that India lost

thousands of precious lives, but fought terrorism bravely.

The PM said that, "we will not rest until terrorism is uprooted."

Representatives of several countries and multilateral organisations will discuss ways to deal with terrorism and financing of terrorism at the conference.

Delhi's air quality further improves

The air quality in Delhi improved further, with the AQI recorded at 221 under the "poor" category, according to official figures.

The figures by the System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting And Research (SAFAR) showed that the concentration of both PM 2.5 and PM 10 levels in the national capital stood at 221 (poor) and 160 (moderate), respectively. The Air Quality Index (AQI) between zero and 50 is considered "good"; 51 and 100 "satisfactory"; 101 and 200 "moderate"; 201 and 300 "poor"; 301 and 400 "very poor"; and 401 and 500 "severe".

AQI under the "moderate" category was also recorded in the city's Pusa area (186) and Lodhi Road (152), while Mathura Road recorded 232 under the "poor" category.



Meanwhile, Noida's AQI stood at 302 (very poor) and Gurugram recorded 162 (moderate).

Jamaat-e-Islami Hind condemns the gruesome Delhi murder of Shraddha Walkar

Jamaat-e-Islami Hind (JIH) has condemned the gruesome murder of Shraddha Walkar in Delhi. In a statement to the media, the Vice President of Jamaat-e-Islami Hind, Prof. Salim Engineer said: "We are shocked

and numbed to read the news about the gruesome murder of Shraddha Walkar in Delhi. We condemn it and demand the harshest punishment for her killer. We share the grief of her father, relatives, and friends. The heinous manner in which her dead body was disposed of is so chilling and barbaric that we are



at a loss for words to express our disgust and revulsion. Two issues need serious introspection by society. One is the rise in domestic violence and physical abuse of women. In many instances, this is leading to femicide and needs to be debated and all attempts must be made at the level of society and the government to put an end to this disturbing trend. Secondly, a physical relationship without marriage (live-in) is not

only traumatizing for women but also hazardous to her safety in many instances as this particular case of Shraddha Walkar shows. We urge the government and civil society to take the lead in debating these issues and come up with holistic solutions so that we don't lose our daughters to femicide and domestic violence."

SKM urges farmers to continue struggle till all demands are met

Samyukta Kisan Morcha (SKM) on Thursday exhorted the farmers to join the nationwide "March to Raj Bhawans" programmes and submit a memorandum to the President through the respective Governors on November 26.

Earlier, on November 14, SKM's National Council held a meeting at Gurudwara Rakabganj and strongly condemned the Modi government for betraying the farmers by not implementing the written assurances made on December 9, 2021 for legally guaranteed MSP, withdrawal of the Electricity Bill, among other demands.

The meeting resolved to advise all constituent organisations to be prepared to further intensify the struggle across the country. "March to Raj Bhawans" marks the beginning of the next phase of the farmers protest. Also, it



appealed to farmers across the country to join continuous and committed nationwide struggles till all the demands including "Karz Mukti - Poora Daam" (Freedom from Indebtedness and Full Remunerative Price) are fulfilled by the government.

Legally guaranteed MSP for all crops and freedom from indebtedness are the major demands for which the farmers have been fighting since the rollout of neo-liberal policies that aggravated the agrarian crisis and peasant suicides. Since 1995, more than 4 lakh farmers have died by suicide in India and around 68 per cent of the peasant households are in debt and financial distress. These demands, along with the demands of repeal of three pro-corporate Farm Laws and the Electricity Bill 2020, led to the year-long historic farmers' movement at the Delhi

About 266 attempts of drone infiltration have been made by Pakistan so far this year in Punjab and Jammu and Kashmir which is more than double the number recorded last year, Director General of Border Security Force (BSF) Pankaj Singh said.

MGNREGA: will I have to touch feet of PM to get funds: Mamata Banerjee

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday questioned whether she will have to touch the feet of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi to get the dues of the state government on account of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) scheme.

"To get the Central funds for the 100-day job scheme under MGNREGA scheme is our right. I personally met the Prime Minister and spoke to him in the matter. Will I have to touch his feet now?

The Union government will have to pay our dues at any cost. Else the positions of power have to be vacated," the Chief Minister said while addressing the birth anniversary celebration of iconic tribal freedom fighter, Birsa Munda at Jhargram on Tuesday afternoon.

Incidentally, Leader of the Opposition in West Bengal assembly, Suwendu Adhikari has filed a public interest litigation seeking a CBI probe and an audit by the CAG in the implementation of MGN-



REGA scheme in the state.

Without directly referring to that development, the Chief Minister said that some leaders from West Bengal are constantly appealing to the Union government so that the Central funds to the state government are blocked.

"What do they want? Do they want to conspire with the Union government to keep the people of West Bengal starved? I would request the people of the tribal community to hit the streets with bows, arrows and traditional

musical instruments in protest," the Chief Minister said.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister said that besides MGNREGA, the Union government is also not providing the funds for the housing schemes.

"Construction of over 50 lakh houses is being held back because of the lack of funds. This is not a charity that the Union government is making to us. This is the genuine dues to the state government as the Union government is also not giving

us the state's share in goods & services tax," she said.

Reacting to the chief minister's statements, BJP national vice-president and party's Lok Sabha member, Dilip Ghosh said that it has been over 11 years that Mamata Banerjee has become the chief minister. "So, what she had been doing for so many years. Actually, these are lame excuses on her part as she had understood that the tribal vote bank is slowly moving away from Trinamool Congress," said Ghosh.

Clearing Delhi's landfill sites ending corruption in MCD among AAP's 10 guarantees for municipal polls

With the poll bugles sounded in the MCD, the Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Friday announced the AAP's 10 guarantees for the people of Delhi before the upcoming December 4 municipal election. During a press meet, the CM Kejriwal said that the Bharatiya Janata Party will not win more than 20 seats in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi elections. He added that if it will get the hold of MCD they will 'beautify' the national capital and accused the current MCD of trying to turn the city into a city of 'garbage mountains'. During a press conference, he alleged that the civic body has plans to create 16 new landfill sites. At present, three landfill sites - Ghazipur, Okhla, and Bhalswa - are located on Delhi borders.

People living in the vicinity of these landfill sites are affected by the foul smell emanating from these garbage mounds and a host of other issues. Their life is literally like hell. We have heard

that there are plans to make 16 new garbage mountains in the national capital,» the CM said. On the other hand, he said, the AAP government is developing Delhi into a city of parks and lakes. «Today, Delhi is known for its education and health facilities and these people want to turn it into a city of garbage mountains. The government is working to make Delhi a City of Tirangas, lakes, and parks, and these people want to turn it into a city of garbage mountains,» Kejriwal said. «If given a chance, we will beautify the national capital in a time-bound manner,» he added. Sisodia had also leveled similar allegations on Thursday.

The Municipal Corporation of Delhi in a statement on Thursday said that it is «working tirelessly» to flatten the three existing landfill sites in the city. «It has come to the notice of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) that some claims have been made that the corporation has planned to set up new sanitary landfill sites at 16 locations in Delhi. «The MCD completely denies the allegation and wishes



to state in a very unambiguous term that there is no plan to establish any new sanitary landfill site,» it had said.

The AAP has launched a month-long campaign to highlight the failures of the BJP-ruled civic body. As part of the campaign, groups led by AAP MLAs tried to reach Ghazipur and Okhla landfill sites on Wednesday and Thursday, respectively, to stage a protest, but were stopped by police. The BJP held control of the three erst-

while municipal corporations in Delhi, and the AAP was the main opposition party till the terms of the civic bodies expired in May and the three bodies were united to form a single MCD. Elections to constitute a new civic body are yet to be held. The central government has fixed the total number of seats in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi at 250 from the existing figure of 272. This was stated in a Delhi Gazette notification issued on Saturday.

What are Arvind Kejriwal's 10 Guarantees?

1. Clean Delhi — AAP will clear the three garbage mountains, not let any new landfill come up, clean and maintain all roads and gullies, bring global expertise and latest technology for garbage disposal
2. Corruption Free MCD — Process of getting maps and building plans cleared will be simplified, 'enter-vasooli' will be eliminated, minor violations will be regularised under a scheme
3. Parking Crisis will be solved — Radical and permanent solution will be implemented to solve the parking crisis in Delhi
4. Stray Animal problems will be solved — residents will get relief from the menace of stray dogs, stray cattle and stay monkeys
5. Better, cleaner roads — MCD's roads and gullies will be repaired and maintained for easier commute
6. World-class Education and Healthcare Model in MCD too — MCD's schools and hospitals will be transformed on the lines of Delhi Government's Model
7. Beautification of Parks — All MCD parks will be face-lifted. Delhi will be turned into a City of Parks
8. MCD Administration Reforms — All MCD contract workers will be regularised. All MCD employees will get salaries on time
9. Reforms for Traders — Conversion fees and Parking fees will be ended. Sealed shops will be opened. Inspector Raj will be ended. Licencing processes will be simplified and digitised.
10. Vending Zones for Hawkers — Hawkers will get freedom from extortion. Hawkers will get to trade inside clean vending zones.

4805 persons died, 8857 injured in 9825 road mishaps during last 10 months in Haryana

A survey reveals that a patients suffering from cancer disease dies in every two hours in Haryana state. Similarly, on an average 13 persons suffering from heart disease die in the state every day. Whereas, the total number of deaths reported due to road accidents daily in Haryana are higher recorded as 15 persons succumb to their injuries during road mishaps and 30 persons seriously injured every day generally due to driving vehicles in high speed, travelling on unfit vehicles, driving under the influence of liquor and lacking security measures on the roads having nearly 1662 black spots on link roads as well as highways in the state.

victims 54% include of age below 35. It is observed most of the accident victims die due to delay in treatment.

While having a look at past five years' data as regard number of road mishaps, deaths and injured due to accidents obtained from state police record 9825 road accidents were reported till 30th October 2022 in which 4805 persons died and 8857 sustained serious injuries in Haryana state. Whereas during year 2021 Haryana state witnessed 10049 road accidents in which 4943 persons died and 9595 persons injured. Information reveals that during year 2020 the state had 9506 road mishaps in which 4631 person lost their lives and 8826 persons injured. According to police records 5057 persons died and 9362 persons injured in 10944 road accidents in Haryana state during year 2019. The year 2018 had registered 11238 road mishaps in the state in which 5118 persons died and 10020 persons sustained injuries. During year 2017 state police registered 11258 road accident cases at various police stations across the state in which 5120 persons lost their lives and 11258 persons injured.

Service books of 2.32 L employees verified: Haryana Chief Secretary

CHANDIGARH: Haryana Chief Secretary Sanjeev Kaushal on Monday said the government employees will no longer face any problem in matters relating to promotion and holidays as more facilities have been extended for the employees online through e-service books.

Presiding over a review meeting in connection with the Human Resource Management System (HRMS) portal with officials of the Human Resource Department, the Chief Secretary said e-service books of about 2, 32, 000 employees out of 2, 65, 000 have been verified on the HRMS portal, adding the remaining about 33, 000 employees should also get their e-service books verified latest by November 30.

He said after November 30, the employees whose service books will not be verified may have to face salary-related problems. He also directed the heads of all the departments to strictly adhere to these instructions.

All service-related activities and digital service books of the employees of various departments, boards and corporations have been uploaded on the Human Resource Management System portal.

On this portal, the e-salary system of Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS) along with integrated workflow and information of the employees is available round the clock.

More than 3100 crop stubble burning cases reported in Haryana

According to the latest information as regard crop stubble burnings cases during this year till 13th November 2022 more than 3100 burning cases has been reported so far as compared to nearly 5100 crop stubble burning cases reported till this period during previous year 2021 in which Fatehabad district leading in Haryana state recording total number of 677 cases reported so far, followed by Kaithal dis-

trict recorded 655 crop stubble burning cases and Jind district recorded 411 crop stubble cases ranking at the third place in highest crop stubble burning cases. Whereas, Faridabad district in the state was recorded as having lowest number of only a single crop stubble burning case during current year.

Deputy Commissioner Fatehabad Jagdish Sharma told that total numbers of nearly 800 satellite images of burning crop stubble in open were re-



ceived, of them during physical investigation 677 crop stubble burning cases were detected. He said, action has been taken not only against 276 farmers fined amount worth Rs 7 lakh allegedly violated government directions not to burn crop stubble in open

spreading pollution in the atmosphere harmful for the health but also action has been taken against nearly 270 government employees allegedly involved in carelessness in performing their duty, which included 45 employees in agriculture department 47 Patwari working in revenue department, 44 Gram Panchayat workers and 134 Numburdar besides few employees of agriculture department were also suspended by the government and charge sheeted under Rule 8.

SGPC demand action against those making provocative & hate speech against Sikhs

The Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) has written to Commissioner of Police, Amritsar, demanding strict legal action against those who made provocative and hate speech against Sikhs. Secretary Partap Singh said that a video of a Shiv Sena



leader namely Harvinder Soni from Gurdaspur calling Sikhs as terrorists and threatening to attack Sri Darbar Sahib has gone viral on social media. «Due to this provocative statement about Sri Darbar Sahib,

the central Sikh shrine, there is a lot of resentment among the community members», said Partap Singh in a statement to the media.

He said in another viral video a person namely Rahul of Am-

ritsar, associated with Shiv Sena has threatened Sikhs of killing them. He said these statements can disturb the peaceful environment of Punjab, which has the tendency to break the mutual brotherhood of people living here, peace, law and order.

The SGPC secretary demanded that strict legal action should be taken against these two persons by registering a case against them under the relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code. He said it should be ensured that in future, if someone makes such hate speech, then the culprit is not spared.

Team of crime branch from Delhi accompanied by central as well as Haryana state drug control departments arrested seven persons of a manufacturing company RDM Biotech started producing food supplements at Ganaur in Sonapat district about six years ago in 2016 after obtaining a license from Ayush department Haryana and after two years in 2018 started manufacturing drugs for the treatment of cancer disease under the same li-

cense in a famous foreign brand 'Genowhey' and gradually developed a network for the sale of fake medicines for the treatment of cancer not only in India as well as in abroad thus earning huge amount of money.

Among seven persons arrested by Delhi police were identified as a qualified doctor Pavitra Narain, Shubham Manna a qualified engineer, Prabhat a qualified MBA, Pankaj Singh, Akanksha Verma, Ankit Sharma and Ram Kumar who had initially obtained license to manufac-



ture Ayush food supplements and started manufacturing about 21 Ayurvedic products after obtaining license from

Food & Drug Administration (FDA) also. During raid on a clue police team collected 20 bags raw material as calcium carbide and starch being filled in capsules instead of any useful chemicals for the treatment of cancer disease. According to police information, there were only five workers in the factory and all types of mixing of chemicals being done by the seven themselves. Police seized raw material as well as capsule filling machines recovered from the site during raid and sealed the factory.

Modi virtually Inaugurates '25th Bengaluru Tech Summit' with pre-recorded video message

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday said India is using technology as a weapon in the war against poverty. «Under the Svamitva scheme, we are using drones to map lands in rural areas. Then, property cards are given to the people. This reduces land disputes. It also helps the poor to access financial services and credit,» he said in a pre-recorded video message at the inauguration of Bengaluru Tech Summit 2022.

PM Modi who is attending the G20 meet in Indonesia, appeared virtually to kickstart the Bengaluru Tech Summit in its silver jubilee year. He addressed Indian startups from 16 states and 600 innovators displaying their concepts and investments at the event. Over the course of three days, about 20 new product launches are also scheduled for the summit, to unveil tech that consumers can expect in future.

Modi said «During Covid-19, many countries were struggling with a problem. They knew people needed help. They knew benefit transfers would help. But they did not have the infrastructure to benefit people. But



India showed how technology could be a force for the good.»

From ranked 81st in 2015, India has jumped to the 40th rank in the Global Innovation Index this year, Modi said. «The number of unicorn startups in India has doubled since 2021. We are now the third largest startup hub in the world. We have over 81,000 recognised startups. There are hundreds of international companies that have R&D centres in India. This is due to India's talent pool,» he said.

In India, technology is a force of equality and empowerment, which is mirrored in the world's largest health insurance scheme Ayushman

Bharat that provides a safety net for about 600 million people. «This programme is run based on a tech platform,» he said.

Modi said the central government is successfully running its ecommerce platform called Government e-MarketPlace (GeM) for small businesses and traders, who fulfills the government's needs. «Technology has helped small businesses find a big customer. At the same time, this has reduced the scope for corruption. Similarly, technology has helped with online tendering. This has accelerated projects and boosted transparency. It has also hit a procurement

value of Rs 1 trillion last year,» he said.

PM Modi said India is no more a place known for red tape, but known for red carpet for investors in terms of FDI reforms, liberalization of drone rules, steps in the semiconductor sector, production incentive schemes in various sectors, or the rise of ease of doing business.

«India has one of the largest online repositories of open courses. There are thousands of courses available across different subjects. Over 10 million successful certifications have happened. This is all done online and free, India's data tariffs are among the lowest in the world,» the PM said.

While in his inaugural address Infosys Co-Founder Kris Gopalakrishnan expressed confidence that the IT industry will be recruiting at least 2 lakh people in the near term, despite several challenges including moonlighting faced by it. «I am confident that the industry will face challenges including moonlighting. The industry will grow and continue to recruit. And in the near term the industry will be recruiting at least 2 lakh people in the near term,» he said.

Synthetic drugs smuggled from Pakistan being sold in 10 states

Information reveals, consumption of synthetic drugs being illegally smuggled from Pakistan via Punjab has witnessed nearly 18% increase in past some time in nearly 10 districts in the country including Haryana, Punjab, Delhi, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha and Bihar. Synthetic drugs are manufactured in laboratories with mixing chemicals like in case of medicines and the demand of such drugs fast increasing with much increased profits in this illegal business.

A survey reveals that opium has much demand and consumption in Haryana state as compared to other drugs being supplied from the states Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh. Whereas, drugs like heroine and charas are in much demand in Delhi, Haryana, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh states. Ganja is widely used in Haryana state especial in much demand in rural areas being smuggled from various states including Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Odisha and Rajasthan.

Narcotic Control Bureau led by a senior IPS officer Shrikant Jaghaw was set up in Haryana state some time ago with the efforts of Home Minister Anil Vij when the state became a hub of drugs in North which arrested large number of drug smugglers and suppliers in the state in past one year and seized huge stocks of drugs including opium, heroine, charas, ganja poppy husk, intoxicated tablets, capsules and injection from drug smugglers. State government took a decision to introduce bulldozer scheme in Haryana and demolished large number of industrial and commercial structures built illegally in the state with the earning from sale and smuggling of drugs by hard core criminals and gangsters in order to wipe out drugs completely from the state.



According to information by Narcotic Control Bureau information nearly 460 cases have been registered in the state in which 4683 drug smugglers, suppliers were arrested. Shrikant Jaghaw told that Haryana state police during year 2022 till November 8 has registered 3350 cases under NDPS Act as compared to 3975 cases registered during year 2021 in the state.

BJP will sweep Gujarat Assembly polls: Shah



Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday exuded confidence that BJP will once again romp to power with a thumping majority breaking all records in next month's Assembly polls. Till now, Congress holds the record of winning the maximum number of seats ever. In 1985, under Chief Minister Madhavsinh Solanki's leadership, it bagged as many as 149 seats in the 182-member Assembly. Home Minister Shah, accompanied party's Naranpura candidate Jitendra Patel, Ellisbridge candidate Amit Shah and Sanand candidate Kanu Patel while they filed their candidature forms before the election officer.

In a veiled attack on AAP, he said people of Gujarat have never voted for a third party and this party's candidates will lose its deposits.

Under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel the state has continued to grow on a development path, achieving new heights in development, said Shah.

According to party sources, the Union Minister is busy clearing hurdles on complicated seats. caught as Telangana government holds 51 per cent in SCCL.»

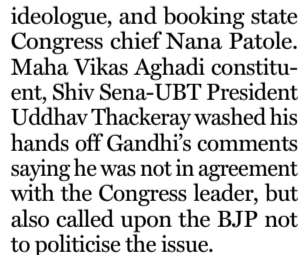

Rest the Case, an online legal aggregator platform expresses its views on amendments in Abortion laws

Since the preface of the MTP Act in 1971, abortion laws in India for rape victims, unmarried women, and married women were varied. Legal or illegal, many people have asked questions about the abortion policy in India.

The Supreme Court landed its rendition of the MTPA to the heart of constitutional rights. It specified a woman's 'decisional liberty' to exercise 'close personal preferences' as a 'self-governing' person. The court even accepted the very significance of bodily duty set on women by an avoided

pregnancy and the 'cascading effects' of such pregnancies on their Mental well-being, Education and Career.

Abortion was made legal by the MTP Act in 1971, we will look back at the history of numerous decisions passed and debated to allow women to have their take on Abortion. Until the 1960s, Abortion was banned in India and was actionable as per the law. Section 312 of the IPC states that a female can face three years of jail and a fine. Section 312 of the IPC could outline the wilful inducing miscarriage if it were not done in good faith to save the child.



In 1964, the Committee urged the relaxation of abortion laws that would help lessen unsafe abortions and reduce maternal mortality in the country. In August 1971, a medical ending bill was presented in Rajya Sabha, and Lok Sabha and was passed by Parliament. The MTP Act came into force on April 1, 1972. However, it was changed in 1975

to make it less critical. The abortion law was amended in 2002 in brief to allow the use of the then-new medical abortion pills.

In March 2020, both the Houses of Parliament gave the MTP revision bill. It was one of the last bits of laws to be given prior to the lockdown. This act signified the main core of the previous show and is an improved and liberal interpretation. It raised the time limit of abortion from 20 weeks to 24 weeks. This act also let unmarried women abort their pregnancies depending on the loss of contraceptives. The medical academy could only show the de-

tails about abortion to a qualified person. The MTP amendments law is more inclusive of Minors, Rape survivors, Victims of incest, differently abled and so on.

Rest the case is a legal aggregator that makes legal information and services available to everyone digitally. The CEO of the platform Shreya Sharma said, «It is a huge win for women and the judiciary with this judgment passed by the Supreme Court. However, a lot of work still needs to be done in terms of making sure the laws are implemented on the ground level.»

The law admits shifts in the marital status of a pregnant

with her partner (widow or divorced). But, it did not take the case of unmarried women. It is a highly regulated process in which the law assigns the power to decide on the pregnant lady to the RMP and has the great choice of the RMP to decide if the abortion must be fed or not. In a historic judgment, the Supreme Court on 29th September allowed married and single women access to abortion care. The top court also added that this matter is about bodily autonomy and no distinction should be made between married and unmarried women.

Opaque financing hurts democracy



The discourse around political finance in India usually revolves around the issue of corruption. We see this in the political contestation over the introduction of electoral bonds. It is either presented as a pious instrument for 'cleansing' politics, by routing funding through legal channels, or as a murky mechanism for legitimating 'institutionalised corruption'.

Thus, the corruption frame locks the issue of political funding into a superficial binary of 'clean' versus 'dirty', expressed in moral or legal terms. This framing precludes any focus on the structural relationship between the nature of political funding and the shape of our political system — conveniently so, for the relationship implicates almost every political party, whether it is ruling or in the Opposition. Corruption is merely one symptom of this structural relationship, rather than being a driving factor.

In any country, the nature of political finance is an important determinant of the structure of political competition. The structure of political competition can be studied around three axes: institutional (the regulation of competition between ruling and Opposition parties); organisational (the regulation of competition within a party); and ideological (the role of ideas in determining competition between parties).

All the three axes of political competition are substantially influenced by the nature of political finance. One, the degree of transparency of political funding informs the efficacy of institutional safeguards. For example, the inherent opacity of electoral bonds renders the power of the Election Commission of India (ECI) irrelevant in terms of ensuring a level-playing field. Meanwhile, the information asymmetry between the ruling and the Opposition parties gnaws at the fairness of electoral processes.

Second, the extent to which political funding is centralised within a party de-

termines whether power in the party is drawn from organisational structures or exercised in a personalistic manner. For example, membership-funded parties such as the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam and the Bahujan Samaj Party of an earlier era were highly organised parties where leaders wielded power in a responsive, programmatic manner. Similarly, we can chart the transformation of the Labour Party in the United Kingdom over the course of the 20th century, from an organisationally-driven mass party to a centralised elite party, as (among other factors) the balance of party funding shifted from Labour unions to corporate houses.

Third, the political financing regime also shapes the role of ideas in grounding political competition. Admittedly, this relationship can proceed in varied ways according to the contingencies of different political contexts. But, as a general matter, when political finance is anchored to a narrow concentration of economic capital, the ideological basis of political competition tends to become severely corroded.

Bonds as advantage to ruling party

Having constructed this framework of analysis, let us come back to the issue of

electoral bonds. How do we expect the rise of electoral bonds, as a major source of political finance, to affect the prevailing patterns of political competition? At the outset, one must note the remarkable speed with which electoral bonds have colonised at least the declared sphere of political funding. Within two years of its introduction, electoral bonds were said to cover 52% of the total income of national parties and 53% of the total income of regional parties, according to an analysis by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR).

There are two salient features of electoral bonds we must consider to gauge its impact on political competition.

One, the design of electoral bonds, perhaps more than any other instrument of political finance, leans to the advantage of the ruling party. It is not surprising that the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in 2019-20 got over 75% of the total electoral bonds sold, as opposed to the meagre 9% share of the Congress, according to ECI data. As the political scientist, Milan Vaishnav, has written, electoral bonds invert the concept of transparency and openness in political funding, whereby only the government, and presumably the ruling party, have access to the transaction trails. The information

asymmetry and barriers to institutional scrutiny thus created considerably skews the channel of electoral bonds towards the ruling party. Second, electoral bonds centralise political funding towards the national units of political parties, further entrenching the leverage of national leadership over the State and local units. As a reply to a Right To Information (RTI) query revealed, out of the 5,851 crore of electoral bonds sold in 2018-19, 80% of the bonds were redeemed in Delhi. Electoral bonds were introduced alongside significant legal amendments, such as the removal of erstwhile limits (7.5% of net profit) on corporate donations. These changes in the legal architecture of political finance enable the prospects of an alliance of national political elite and big business conglomerates squeezing the space for both local elites and regional capital.

These two features of electoral bonds signal an important break, harking back to another turning point in the history of political finance brought under the Indira Gandhi regime. As Mr. Vaishnav and Devesh Kapur have written in their book, *Costs of Democracy: Political Finance in India*, Indira Gandhi banned corporate donations in 1969 in order to limit the growth of the Swatantra Party and the Jana Sangh, who she feared were increasingly attracting corporate backers. These changes in political funding melded well with her wider strategy of tightening the grip of the state (and hence the ruling party) over big business through the project of dialling up licence/controls and nationalisation of key industries. At the same time, the Indira Gandhi regime also cultivated personalistic relationships with big business elites in order to marginalise the regional strongmen which had till then controlled the organisational structure of the Congress party.

Shrinking exports with high deficits cause of concern

For the first time since February 2021, India's goods exports shrank this October, dropping 16.7% from last year (and 16% from September 2022) to slip below \$30 billion after a 20-month-streak above that mark. Most sectors were hit hard: engineering goods, pharmaceuticals and chemicals and employment-intensive gems and jewellery, textiles and handlooms. Just six sectors recorded an uptick, with electronics goods being the only manufacturing segment. Imports grew 5.7% year-on-year, expanding the country's trade deficit over 50% to \$26.9 billion. This is the fourth straight month of a \$25 billion-plus goods trade deficit that hit a record \$30 billion in July. To be sure, imports have now been moderating sequentially for four straight months and dropped 7.3% from September to an eight-month low of \$56.7 billion. But a marginal dip in petroleum imports, along with a 10.3% shrinking of non-oil, non-gold imports from September, can also be construed as a sign of slackening domestic demand. India's trade deficit so far this year is now over \$175 billion, from \$94.2 billion a year ago. However, there is no need to be 'overly depressed' as India has a very low share of global trade which can only grow. A new Foreign Trade Policy to replace the current one from 2015, was recently deferred yet again till April 2023 for reasons that included waiting out the current global turmoil. If anything, the tumult in trade flows will be much worse by then. Policymakers must stop dithering and be more pro-active in recalibrating their stance — for instance, the steel export duty amid lower global prices has triggered higher imports, while exports, including those of engineering goods, have collapsed. The Finance Ministry recently identified external pressures as a key challenge — with a depreciating rupee making imports pricier and slowing global demand hurting exports. More actions are needed to match these concerns.

Sustainable Development Goals and Haryana



Haryana has been ranked as the fastest-growing state in the NITI Aayog's Sustainable Development Goal Index 2020-2021 but the situation is grim in Haryana in the area of health and nutrition.

The fact sheet of NFSH (National Family Health Survey)-5 (Haryana) provides information on key indicators and trends for Haryana. This survey is the most comprehensive survey to date on the health and nutrition indicators of India's men, women and children. In Haryana information was gathered from a sample of 18,229 households, 21,909 women, and 3,224 men.

According to NFSH-5, the sex ratio has improved in Haryana from 876 (2015-16) to 926. The fertility rate has declined from 2.1 to 1.9 in NFHS-5 which is better than the national average. Infant and child mortality rate has improved. About 80% of women and 91% of men are literate (refers to women/men who completed standard 9 or higher and who can read a whole sentence or part of the sentence.) In the case of women empowerment, 87% of females usually participate in household decisions and 39% of women are owning a house or land in their name and 73% of women are having a bank account that they themselves use. About 50% of women are having their mobile phones and 18% of women have ever experienced spousal violence.

Although in the above indicators Haryana is ahead national average there is also a black side of the picture. About 70% of children up to age 6 are anaemic in Haryana which is greater than the national average which is 67.1%. The infant mortality rate (35.2) has improved if we compare it with NFHS-4 but the prevalence of anaemia is chronic in Haryana and it is among the top 5 states in India as for as the extent of anaemia is concerned. The more alarming thing about the national average is the 8 percentage



points rise in the fraction of children suffering from anaemia from 59% in NFHS-4 to 67% in NFHS-5. About 27.5% of children are stunted and 21.5% are underweight in Haryana in the age group of 0-5 years. According to a report, anaemia is found more chronic in women in comparison to men. In India, About 59% of females are anaemic in the age group of 15-19 and 57% in the age group 15-49, whereas in Haryana 62% of women are anaemic in the age group of 15-19 and 60.4% are anaemic in the age group of 15-49.

While the results of the NFHS are usually mixed, and improvements in certain sectors ride along with stagnation and deterioration in other sectors, this year, there have been radical improvements in maternal and child health, sex ratio and population control. A greater proportion of births than ever before is now happening in institutions, more children in the 12-23 months age group have received their vaccinations, and, most interestingly, the Fertility rate in India as well as in Haryana is decreasing. In Haryana it is 1.9 which is below the national average (2.0), indicating that India has

contained the population explosion. Policies, as in the case of the family planning sector, seem to have borne fruit, years after they were implemented. While the gender ratio has, for the first time, recorded more women per 1,000 men, gender ratio at birth in the last five years still underlines the persistence of a deep-rooted son preference especially in middle-class Haryana, one that has to be countered, through policy and law. The initiative of the central govt. increasing the marriage age from 18 to 21 years will definitely improve the health and nutrition levels in the near term by putting more girls in college and enabling women to achieve greater financial independence in the long run in India including Haryana and other states.

Still, malnutrition and anaemia is the biggest challenge for the economy in achieving the Sustainable Development Goal of ending all forms of malnutrition among children under 5. Poor public health is always the most important hurdle in development. The major reason behind malnutrition and anaemia is poverty among the lower class and the unhealthy lifestyle of the middle

class. Mortality rate and longevity of life have improved because of health facilities but still, there is a need for a targeted distribution system of healthy food for poor people in the state. Mid-day meal schemes should include nutritious food. A health slogan of 'food should be medicine and medicine should be food' should be started in near future. Although only 8% of people are below the poverty line in Haryana according to NITI Aayog's multidimensional poverty measures but the poverty among this small section is severe. NFHS-5 is national and sub-nationally at the state and district levels representative, so its findings on children's nutritional status can help policymakers identify critical areas where better policy can provide course correction. Since India has the most malnourished children in the world, it's worth analysing what NFHS-5 has to say about India's progress towards achieving UN Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 2.2.

Haryana has reported considerable improvement in the sex ratio reflecting the effective implementation of the 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao' scheme, launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in January 2015.

A 57-point rise in the sex ratio at birth in the last five years (females per 1,000 males) has been recorded in Haryana, as per the National Family Health Survey-5 (2020-2021).

The sex ratio witnessed an increase from 876 (NFHS-4 2015-16) to 926 in NFHS-5 while the sex ratio at birth recorded an increase from 836 to 893 (2020-21). Chief Minister Manohar Lal has congratulated the officers involved in this campaign and said that the 'Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao' campaign will continue and the State will soon reach the 950 mark in gender ratio at birth (girl child).

Trading of electronic gold receipts is planned to be made available on the platform of the National Stock Exchange

At the 14th International Gold Economic Forum organised by ASSOCHAM V S Sundaresan, Executive Director, Securities and Exchange Board of India stated in his keynote address that gold is one of the most essential assets and that India has amassed more than 20,000 tonnes of gold over the years. India's global market accounts for 25% of global demand, and since less than 1% of supply is acquired from mining, imports are mostly used to fill the gap. We need to tap the quality assurance and price standards. With the right market regulator, people will have more acceptance and comfort of dealing with the product.

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) introduced the Electronic Gold Receipt (EGR), and the BSE launched it about a month ago. According

to V S Sundaresan, Executive Director at Sebi, "we hope that this product would undoubtedly gain acceptance over a period of time." In order to use this product, physical gold must be deposited in a vault. The vault manager will then issue an electronic receipt, which will be credited to the investor's demat account and can be traded on the stock exchange. Accordingly, the gold will remain in a vault but will produce some form of income, and V S Sundaresan noted that the gold that isn't being used can be put to good use.

EGR trading was started on the Bombay Stock Exchange's platform, he noted. Mrugank Paranjape, Chairman, National Council on Commodity Markets, ASSOCHAM & Managing Director & Chief Executive Officer, NCDEX e Markets Limited (NEML), "The domestic market is supported by cultural, wedding, and holiday demand,



which opens up a wide range of prospects. The industry is currently focusing on product offers that deliver both value and variety to India's diverse cultural and demographic customer base as a result of the competitiveness engendered by such rapid expansion."

P C Kandpal, Deputy Managing Director (Retail - PB & RE), State Bank of India (SBI) said, "Banks play a significant role

in the gold sector by fostering greater trust throughout the gold value chain, driving efficiency, providing liquidity, fostering transparency, and assisting price discovery."

Mining and recycling should be the two main directions that the gold industry should move in, according to Somasundaram P R, Regional CEO - India, World Gold Council (WGC). India's domestic gold market demand

increased by up to 80%. The government has put in place the Gold Monetization Scheme, Sovereign Gold Bond Scheme, and Hallmarking Scheme to safeguard consumers when they purchase gold of the appropriate purity, boost export competitiveness, and promote India as a significant global market for gold jewelry.

He went on to state that the Indian gold sector requires a self-regulatory organisation as it is poised for the next stage with the establishment of an SRO, further shedding light on the issue of "Self-Regulatory Organization (SRO) For Global Benchmarking: Opportunities, Challenges, and the Way Forward." The SRO will initiate systematic code of conduct for every industry vertical, providing certification for members who adopt these codes, interacting with stakeholders across the gold value chain and promoting best practices, he said.

Wholesale inflation eases to 8.39%, consumers may not benefit

India's wholesale price inflation (WPI) in October fell to a 20-month low 8.39% year-on-year, since March 2021.

It was also less compared to 10.70 per cent in September, mainly due to a slide in commodity prices.

This was also the first time that the WPI fell below a double-digit mark in 18 months.

The WPI had soared to 15.88 per cent in May 2022. In October 2021, it was 13.83 per cent.

"Decline in the rate of inflation in October 2022 is primarily contributed by fall in the price of mineral oils, basic metals, fabricated metal products, except machinery and equipment, textiles, other non-metallic mineral products minerals etc," an official statement said.

Inflation in primary articles was 11.04 per cent, while food articles inflation rose to 8.33 per cent from 0.06 per cent in October 2021.



Reacting to the numbers Rajini Sinha, Chief Economist, CARE Ratings told to media "In line with our expectations, WPI inflation fell to single digit in October after a gap of 18 months. The easing of WPI inflation was aided by softer global commodity prices and a favourable base."

She said, with significant correction in prices of fuel, metals and chemicals in the past few months, WPI inflation has been on a downward trend. "Imported inflation due to

weaker rupee and high food inflation (for items like cereals and vegetables) will continue to put some upward pressure on WPI inflation. Nevertheless, we expect the wholesale inflation to ease further and scale below the CPI inflation by the fourth quarter of FY23," Sinha added.

The pace of moderation in inflation at the retail level could be relatively muted as producers may not fully pass on the benefits of easing commodity prices to the final consumers, she added.

Adoption of new technology necessary for transparent accounting system: FM Nirmala Sitharaman



MUMBAI: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Friday said that adoption of new technology is necessary for a transparent accounting system. Transparent accounting is also so essential for sustainable economy and transparency cannot be ensured without trust and ethical accounting practices, she said. Sitharaman, who is also in charge of the corporate affairs ministry, was speaking at the 21st World Congress of Accountants that is being jointly organised by the International Federation of Accountants (IFCA) and the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

Indian-origin Nishad Singh under scanner for crypto exchange FTX crash



Indian-origin Nishad Singh, is being scrutinized for financial practices that caused the collapse of FTX, one of the world's largest cryptocurrency exchanges. He lived with the FTX founder along with 9 others. Singh was in the inner circle of FTX's 30-year-old founder, Sam Bankman-Fried. "Gary Wang (Chief Technology Officer), Nishad and Sam control the code, the exchange's matching engine, and funds," said a person familiar with the matter. Beleaguered crypto exchange FTX recently admitted that "unauthorised transactions" have drained hundreds of millions of dollars from its wallets, saying the company has moved many digital assets to a new "cold wallet custodian". FTX, which last week filed for bankruptcy in the US, did not reveal how much it lost in unauthorised transactions but reports claimed the amount could be as high as \$600 million.

July-September quarter GDP growth estimated at between 6.1 and 6.3 pc: RBI

MUMBAI: India's economic growth is likely to be in the range of 6.1 to 6.3 per cent in the second quarter, helping the country achieve 7 per cent growth rate in the current fiscal, said an article published in the Reserve Bank's bulletin released on Friday. The National Statistical Office (NSO) will be releasing the growth estimates of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for the July-September quarter on November 30. The article titled "State of the Economy", written by a team led by RBI Deputy Governor Michael Debabrata Patra, also said recent global developments have thrown up both risks and opportunities.

War against drugs: Punjab police destroys 151kg heroin, 11 qtls poppy husk worth Rs 800cr

Punjab Police have destroyed over 151Kg heroin and 11 quintals of Poppy Husk, valued at over Rs 800 crore in the international market, by burning them in a furnace in Amritsar on Tuesday.

The process of destruction was completed by the High-Level Drug Disposal Committee of contraband under the chairmanship of IGP Counter Intelligence Rakesh Agrawal. Members of the High-level Drug Disposal committee including AIG SSOC Am-

ritsar Sukhminder Singh Mann, AIG SSOC Fazilka Lakhbir Singh, AIG CI Amritsar Amarjit Singh Bajwa and DSP SSOC Harwinderpal Singh were also present on the occasion.

Official Spokesperson of Punjab Police informed that the case properties of drug cases registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 at SSOC, Amritsar and Fazilka was destroyed at Khanna Paper Mill Amritsar on Tuesday.

He informed that apart from this, the disposal certificate for opium weighing 40.5 Kg was also issued by Range Level Drug Disposal Committee for depositing the same in Government Opium & Alkaloid Works, Neemuch (M.P.).

Crypto.com mistakenly sends Ethereum worth \$400 mn to another exchange

Crypto.com has admitted that it mistakenly sent over \$400 million in Ethereum digital coins to another crypto exchange called Gate.io.

Crypto.com CEO Kris Marszalek said in a tweet that the company was sup-

posed to send 320,000 cryptos to one of its offline wallets, but accidentally sent it to a "whitelisted" address belonging to the corporate account at Gate.io.

"It was supposed to be a move to a new cold storage



address, but was sent to a whitelisted external exchange address. We worked with Gate team and the funds were subsequently returned to our cold storage. New process and features were implemented to prevent this from reoccurring,

"Marszalek acknowledged. The Crypto.com CEO said the transfers that generated so much speculation on Twitter "were made over three weeks ago, on October 21 to Crypto.com's whitelisted corporate account at Gate.io."

Anti-money laundering efforts will be accelerated by new AI tools & legislation from the govt says Justice M N Bhandari

NEW DELHI: Solving the Issue of money laundering has become an international effort and Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002 is a tool for active enforcement to fight against this criminal offence according to Hon'ble Justice M N Bhandari, Chairman, Appellate Tribunal, PMLA, Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance Government of India who spoke at ASSOCHAM 2nd India International Conference on Money Laundering and Col-



lective Response. Chief Guest, Justice M N Bhandari, noted that combating the issue of money laundering continues to be a major task for all countries and financial institutions in the world. Administrative stability and economic stability are harmed by financial crimes. The Indian government has taken a number of actions in the past to stop money laundering. Justice Bhandari added stating that, "these steps are

intended to prevent financial crimes and to ensure that the administrative and economic stability of the country is maintained."

Guest of Honor, Justice Yashwant Varma Judge, Delhi High Court shared his perspectives on the theme and said, "Money Laundering is an economical and financial menace and needs to be eliminated with the collective response from stakeholders". They pose immense challenges in terms of income disparities, conflicts between rich and poor, developed and underdeveloped and therefore financial intelligence units have created anti-money laundering standards. "With the advent of growing tech, it becomes challenging to monitor digital transactions therefore cross border monitoring is required", he noted.

Income Tax Department conducts search actions in Karnataka

Income Tax Department initiated Search & Seizure actions on 20.10.2022 and 02.11.2022 on certain individuals who had executed Joint Development Agreements (JDAs) with various real-estate developers. The search action covered more than 50 premises spread across Bengaluru, Mumbai and Goa.

During the course of the search operations, a large number of incriminating evidences, in the form of documents and digital data have been found & seized. Evidences regarding the sale agreements, development agreements and occupancy certificates (OCs) have also been seized. These evidences revealed that the land owners had not disclosed income accrued to them from capital gains on transfer of the land given for development through JDAs to various



developers, even after issue of the OCs from the authorities. It was also unearthed that in many instances, the land owners suppressed income from capital gains for various years by artificially inflating the cost of acquisition & various other costs, and by not disclosing full value of consideration on transfer of land. It was also found that some of the land owners didn't even file their ITRs for various years, where capital gains income had accrued to them. When confronted, the assesses concerned admitted their lapses and agreed to disclose income from capital gains detected in their respective cases, and pay due taxes thereon.

Nitin Gadkari inaugurates of 3 NH projects worth Rs 1,206 Crore in West Bengal

Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari inaugurated and laid the foundation stone of 3 national highway (NH) projects worth Rs 1206 Crore in Siliguri on Thursday.

Addressing the gathering, Gadkari said that the inaugurated projects include 2-lane ROB in replacement of Level Crossing at km 615.5 of NH-31 (Oodlabari) and would give significant boost to international connectivity and ROB in lieu of Level Crossing at km 661.100 on NH-31 (Maynaguri). He said that it would help reduce accidents due



to improved safety features and bring down travelling time and distance. Gadkari said that the development of these projects will lead to industrial and eco-

nomical growth in West Bengal as well as in the eastern parts of India with significant inroads towards the agriculture sector. Giving a major fillip to traffic decongestion in Siliguri, the foundation stone was laid on Thursday for the development to 4/6-laning of NH-31 (New NH-10) with both side service roads from km 569.258 to km 581.030 (end of AH-02 project on NH-31 near Shivmandir to Sevoke Army Cantonment). It would boost connectivity to North Eastern India & neighbouring countries like Nepal, Bhutan, and Bangladesh.

Center govt lays out action plan to promote millet export

India is going all out to celebrate 2023 as the International Year of Millets as declared by the United Nations General Assembly.

To promote shipment of cereals, the India's Commerce and Industry Ministry, through its apex agricultural export promotion body, Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA), has prepared a comprehensive strategy to promote Indian millets exports across the globe, commencing December 2022. For exports of Indian millets, the Indian government has planned to facilitate participation of exporters, farmers and traders in 16 international trade expos and Buyer Seller Meets (BSMs).



As per the government's robust strategy, Indian missions abroad would be roped in branding and publicity of Indian millets, identification of international chefs as well as potential buyers such as departmental stores, supermarkets and hypermarkets for

organising B2B meetings and direct tie-ups.

In addition, Ambassadors of Foreign missions in India of the targeted countries and potential importers would also be invited to showcase various millet-based products, including Ready to Eat millet products and facilitate B2B meetings.

The APEDA has planned to organise millet promotional activities in South Africa, Dubai, Japan, South Korea, Indonesia, Saudi Arabia, Sydney, Belgium, Germany, the UK and the US by facilitating participation of different stakeholders from India in some of the significant food shows, Buyer Seller Meets and roadshows.

As Yellen seeks closer US-India economic ties, India dropped from currency monitoring list

United States has removed India from its currency manipulation monitoring list and made the announcement while Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen was in New Delhi to boost economic relations between the two countries.

The Department conveyed the decision in a report to Congress that said India had met the criterion for removal from the list that monitors whether countries manipulate the rate of exchange between their currency and the US dollar to gain unfair competitive advantage in international trade or to exploit balance of payments adjustments.

The report said that Italy, Mexico, Thailand and Vietnam have also been removed from the Monitoring List, while China, Japan, Korea, Germany, Malaysia, Singapore, and Taiwan continue to be on it. India met at least one of



three criteria for dropping from the list over two reporting periods making it eligible for removal, as did the four other countries.

A coincidence as it was because others were also dropped, the release of the report came during Yellen's India visit to tighten the trade bonds as the US seeks global economic and manufacturing realignment after facing problems from overdependence on China.

Yellen spoke of the concept of "friendshoring" - bringing supply chains to friendly countries. She said: "In a world where supply chain vulnerabilities can impose heavy costs, we believe it's important to strengthen our trade ties with India."

"India is one of our trusted trading partners," she said. The three factors considered in putting a country on the monitoring list are the size of the bilateral trade surplus with

the US, current account surplus, and persistent one-sided intervention in the foreign exchange market.

In addition, it also considers currency developments, exchange rate practices, foreign exchange reserve coverage, capital controls, and monetary policy.

The report did not specifically say what criteria India had met, but it mentions New Delhi's performance in the related fields.

The report said that India's foreign exchange reserves stood at \$526.5 billion at the end of June, which is 16 per cent of the gross domestic product.

It said that India, like other countries covered in the report, continues to maintain "ample - or more than ample - foreign currency reserves based on standard adequacy benchmarks".

It also had a \$48 billion trade surplus with the US, according to the report.

Two Indian-origin community helpers in Australia win \$672,805 mn grant

Two Indian-origin achievers are among 20 inspiring Australians who have won A\$1 million grant (\$672, 805) for creating sustainable and innovative solutions to address community issues.

New South Wales-based Amar Singh and Rishi Verma have won the grant under the Tomorrow Maker program by Sydney-based AMP Foundation.

Singh, the 41 year-old founder and president of Turbans 4 Australia, has been awarded for community service, and promoting multiculturalism and religious tolerance.

Singh, who experienced ethnic slurs because of his beard and turban, realised that there was no better way to teach others about the Sikh community and faith than connecting with the community through charity work.

It was then that he founded his charity organisation in 2015



to assist people facing financial hardship, food insecurity, homelessness and those impacted by natural calamities.

He also won the prestigious 2023 New South Wales Australian of the Year Award recently for supporting the community during floods, bushfires, drought and the pandemic.

help solve diabetic retinopathy, which is the leading cause of blindness amongst indigenous and rural populations of Australia.

Born and raised in Lidcombe, he is also the co-founder and CEO of Stethy, an AI assistant providing diagnostic tools to physicians.

"Stethy started to create a world where everyone has access to instant, affordable and safe medical care at any time

and place," Verma, currently a doctor at NSW Health, said.

Before studying medicine, he was a space engineering intern at NASA and completed his Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery at the University of Wollongong.

"Current economic conditions are impacting everyone but are disproportionately impacting our First Nation people and disadvantaged communities across Australia. We know that climate change and environmental issues threaten our very existence; and the global pandemic has highlighted the fault lines in our society -- all very big issues," Nicola Stokes, General Manager of AMP Foundation, said.

"I am pleased to let you know that our 2022 Tomorrow Makers are not afraid of taking up challenges or tackling what are dubbed awicked problems', those social issues thought too difficult and complex to solve," she added.

HASA delivers forums and virtual sessions in English, Hindi, Punjabi, Urdu and Arabic on topics from mental health to Covid-19 vaccinations. "It is an honour, and privilege at the same time it brings a lot of responsibility to me to work harder to cater for the needs of Australian multicultural communities," Khillan told The



Australia Today. As a student in India, he sold offerings outside a temple to fund his medical education. After moving to Melbourne in 2010, Khillan worked to raise awareness of domestic violence and dowry abuse.

He has played a pivotal role in delivering key healthcare and

health education to culturally diverse communities in Victoria, a government release note stated.

"Congratulations to paediatrician Dr Angraj Khillan, 2023 Victorian Australian of the Year. Dr Khillan has changed lives by delivering healthcare and health education to culturally diverse

communities across Australia," Linda Dessau AC, Governor of Victoria, tweeted. Sweden's annual inflation hits 9.3% as food, fuel prices surge



STOCKHOLM: In October, widespread price increases continued in Sweden for products such as food, in particular vegetables, and non-alcoholic beverages as the country's CPI (Consumer Price Index with fixed interest rate) 12-month inflation rate stood at 9.3 per cent, down from 9.7 per cent in September, according to official figures. Statistics Sweden said on Tuesday that the country's CPI (Consumer Price Index) reached 10.9 per cent in October as "increased interest expenses contributed with about 1.8 percentage point to the inflation rate", reports Xinhua news agency. "The inflation rate according to CPI was higher than according to CPIF because of the increased interest rates of mortgages. This effect is eliminated from CPIF," Caroline Neander, price statistician at Statistics Sweden, explained. Fuel, electricity, food and non-alcoholic beverages were among the biggest contributors to the October inflation rate. These products were 32.7 per cent, 25.6 per cent and 17.2 per cent, respectively, more expensive than in the same month a year ago. In the category of food and non-alcoholic beverages, the increases in the price of meat, milk, eggs, cheese, bread and cereal were the most noteworthy.

United Sikhs Team meets Ukrainian Members of Parliament

United Sikhs team met Ukrainian Members of Parliament in Washington DC this week. They discussed the humanitarian situation in the wake of the escalation of the Russian attacks in Ukraine, and the resulting humanitarian challenges that lie ahead.

United Sikhs has been providing humanitarian assistance along the borders and interiors of Ukraine since the beginning of the Russian invasion nine months ago.

The teams also pointed out the need for bracing up for harsh winter conditions in the coming months from a humanitarian standpoint. They feared that the winters would be more difficult this



year. Power infrastructure has been damaged heavily during the Russian attacks which might cause electricity shortages and difficulties in keeping homes warm.

ments on the ground and they continue to serve. The purpose of the meeting was to explore the possibilities to work further with the Ukrainian government to maximize the reach of humanitarian assistance in the most vulnerable areas of Ukraine."

Appreciating the work of United Sikhs, Ukraine

MP, Yevheniia Kravchuk said, "Ukraine is growing to triumph through these unprecedented times. We value the humanitarian work United Sikhs has been doing in Ukraine. Contribution of organizations like United Sikhs should be recognized and celebrated globally for standing up for humanity."

Time to invest in Indian, South Asian languages: UK MP

Asserting that there has been a steep decline in British students learning South Asian languages, UK MP Gareth Thomas has said that it's time to invest in languages like Gujarati, Hindi and Tamil, to bolster bilateral relations.



"There has been a steep decline since 2015 in the number of UK students studying Gujarati, Urdu and other languages prevalent across South Asia at GCSE level," Thomas, a Labour-Cooperative Party parliamentarian for the Greater London constituency of Harrow West, tweeted.

"It's time to invest in the languages of South Asia," he said. The General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) is a qualification normally taken by most UK students at the end of compulsory education.

According to the UK's Department of Education, there were no students taking Hindi GCSE from 2019 to 2022, whereas in 2015, 19 students had sat for this exam. Between 2015 and 2021, the number of students entering GCSEs in Bengali, Gujarati, Persian, Punjabi, and Urdu drastically came down, with Gujarati seeing a 77 per cent fall in entries, followed by Bengali, which saw a 66 per cent drop, Punjabi a 45 per cent, and Urdu a 37 per cent decline.

The MP's comments come at a time when India's economy has overtaken the UK's in terms of size, making it the fifth biggest.

An IMF forecast says India is expected to leap further ahead of the UK up to 2027 - making the South Asian nation fourth largest economy, and leaving the UK behind as sixth. Now, with a seven per cent growth forecast for 2022, Thomas believes that "being able to communicate in the languages used to do business in these markets is crucial to delivering long-term economic growth across the United Kingdom".

"If we want stronger trade links with India and other South Asian countries, and if we want stronger cultural and security ties too then investing in

school and community teaching of South Asian languages like Gujarati, Urdu, Bengali, Punjabi, Tamil Hindi, etc is overdue," the Harrow West MP said in a press statement.

The UK government recently invested millions to support the teaching of Mandarin and Latin. The British Council also identified that Spanish, Mandarin, French, Arabic, and German are the top five priority languages to improve the UK's skills, security and influence in the world.

The ethnic minority population of Harrow has a large and established Gujarati Indian community, who originally settled in large numbers after their expulsion from Uganda in 1972. "We need to do more to build on similar links across the UK, between diaspora communities here and the great trading nations of South Asia," Thomas said.

Meanwhile, some British Asians rue that the languages are not taught in the schools due to a lack of qualified and trained teachers. "I'm a British Bengali who is fluent but illiterate in my mother tongue. Sadly they didn't offer it as a subject at my school Eton College, so instead I have GCSEs in ancient Greek and Latin," Dr Brijesh, a twitter user, wrote in response to the tweet by Thomas.

World Diabetes Day and Children's Day: Health Experts highlight the rising cases of Diabetes in youngsters

Observing World Diabetes Day and Children's Day, The Associated Chambers of Commerce and Industry of India (ASSOCHAM), an apex body, organized a webinar on "Diabetes Free India" in response to the growing cases of diabetes in children. Therefore, it's the duty of individuals, parents and caregivers to take requisite steps and provide adequate care for healthy weight management which includes daily exercising, eating a nutritious diet along with proper sleep and mental stimulation."

Padma Shri Dr. Anoop Misra, Chairman, fortis- C-DOC centre of Excellence for Diabetes, metabolic Diseases and Endocrinology, Chairman, National Diabetes, Obesity and Cholesterol Foundation (N- DOC),

President, Diabetes Foundation (India)DFI shared his insights on how the goal towards Diabetes Free India should be below 5% cases. Focusing on children and primordial prevention will cut down the prevalence. Educating and creating awareness is the need of the hour for a better tomorrow and prevention, he noted. All stakeholders should join together for multi component intervention to improve insulin levels in all diabetic patients, he added. According to Dr. Brij Mohan Makkar, Senior Diabetes & Bariatric Physician and Director, Dr. Makkar's Diabetes and Obesity centre, New Delhi, Insulin is the life saving drug in terms of diabetes and the impact is physiological, he said.

Energy prices drive up Italian inflation to 11.8% in October

Consumer prices in Italy rose by 11.8 % in October compared to a year earlier, the government's statistics entity said.

Energy-related impacts continued to play an oversized role, according to the National Institute of Statistics (ISTAT). It said the final data for the consumer price index in October is lower than the 11.9-per cent estimate released last month, reports Xinhua news agency. However, it is still a record since Italy's adoption of the euro currency in 1999.

The last time prices rose so sharply in one month was in June 1983, when inflation hit 13 per cent during a period when Italy was still using the lira currency. In September this year, prices were 8.9 per cent higher than a year earlier. Soaring energy prices continue to drive up other prices, ISTAT said, with prices for energy goods increasing by 71.1 per cent in October compared to a year



earlier. In September, the year-on-year increase was 44.5 %.

Food prices, which are influenced due to costs for transportation, mechanisation, and fertilizer, also rose dramatically, increasing by 13.3 per cent compared to October 2021. This was faster than the 11.4-per cent increase recorded in September. ISTAT said that the country's "core" inflation rate -- a calculation that excludes energy and food costs -- still came in at 5.3 per cent in October, an increase from 5 per cent a year earlier. Over the first 10 months of the year, prices rose by 8 per cent, ISTAT said, while the "core" rate increased by 3.7 per cent over the same period.

Israel launches plan for generating solar electricity in agricultural lands

Israel has announced a plan to optimise agricultural land use by integrating clean solar electricity generation.

The plan, at a cost of 17 million shekels (about \$5 million), includes more than 130 pilot programmes, which will be spread over a total area of about 2 square km. Xinhua news agency reported, citing a joint statement from the country's energy and agriculture ministries. The programmes will include facility deployment for solar power generation in agricultural plots throughout Israel, using various technologies and crops.

The programmes will also include research and develop-



ment, for examining the effects of solar power generation on agricultural production, the statement said.

The plan follows a government decision to increase the target for electricity production from renewable energies in Israel to 30 per cent by 2030 while maintaining the continued output of profitable agricultural produce and optimising the use of agricultural land, the ministries said.

While requesting for privacy at this difficult time,

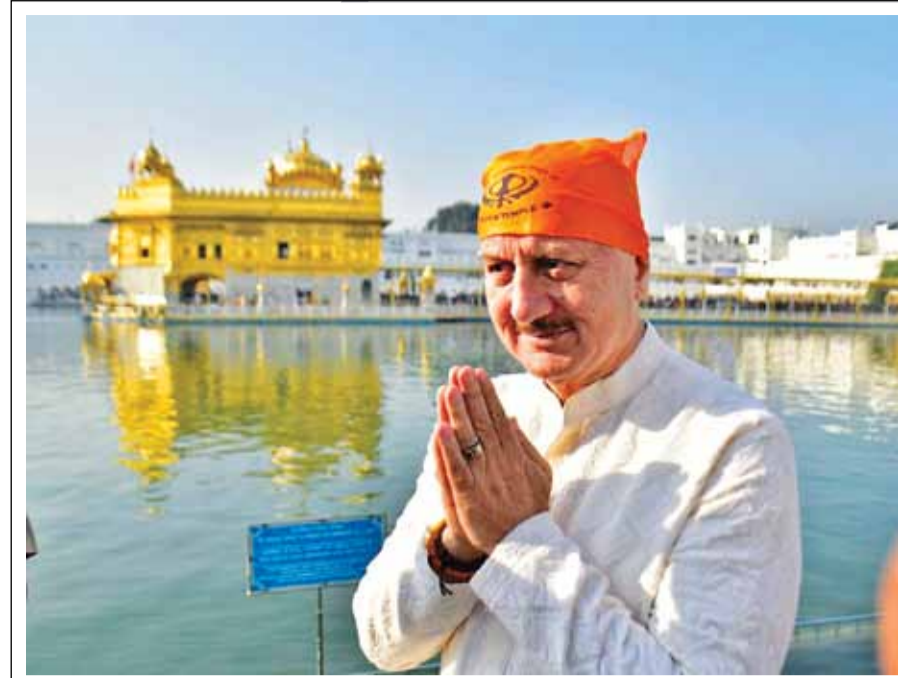

With 17 more shows added to 'Eras Tour,' Taylor Swift makes her biggest ever US tour

Singer Taylor Swift announced on Friday morning that she has added 17 additional dates to her 'Eras Tour' of U.S. stadiums, bringing the total number of gigs to 52.

That amended number makes it her biggest tour to date, and one that could easily break her own record for a gross in North America, reports Variety.

All of the newly announced gigs are in cities that were previously part of the tour, but with second or third nights added, and in one case, a fifth night. The tour's concluding stop at LA's SoFi Stadium is now a five-night stand.

That well eclipses the 38 dates that Swift did in the U.S. on her "Reputation" tour in 2018, which had a record gross of \$266.1 million on ticket sales of more than 2 million attendees. With this far bigger



number of 52 shows, Swift is almost certain to break that "Reputation"-era record in 2023, even if she were to play at well under capacity, which probably isn't likely. Swift made Friday morning's announcement relatively quietly, by putting the amended graphic up on her Instagram Stories, although obviously it won't stay quiet for long.

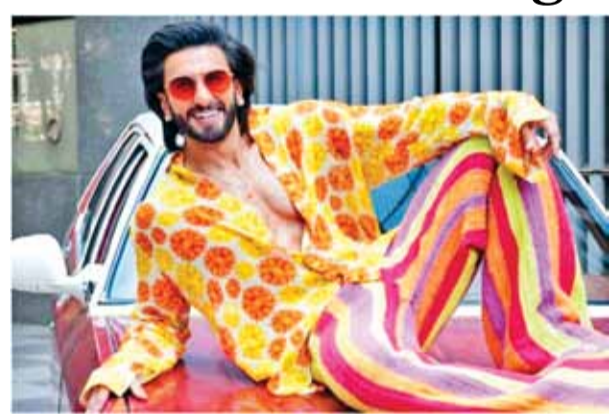
Teaser of Deepthi Ganta's 'Meet Cute' anthology released
