Kejriwal urges PM to introduce currency notes with images of Laxmi-Ganesh



Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Friday wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi urging him to introduce currency notes with pictures of Lord Ganesh and Goddess Laxmi along with that of Mahatma Gandhi. "One Hundred and thirty crore people of the country wish that there should be a picture of Gandhi ji on one side and Shri Ganesh ji and Lakshmi ji on the other side of Indian currency", he said in the letter. The letter further says that

Din rages to 'topple' Mahatma Gandhi from Indian currency note pedestal

A day after Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's demand to add images of Goddess Laxmi and Lord Ganesh on Indian currency notes (ICN), clamour grew on Thursday among various political parties to 'topple' or 'overcrowd' Mahatma Gandhi's exalted pedestal on the country's paper money. Various leaders from different parties such as the BJP, Congress, Shiv Sena (UBT), Republican Party of India (K) and others came up with different heroes - ranging from Gods and Goddesses to historical icons and freedom fighters who could share space with Gandhiji on the ICN.



BJP legislators like Nitesh Rane and Ram Kadam demanded the pictures of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Veer Savarkar, among others, on the ICN. They even circulated photoshopped ICN of Rs 200 and Rs 500 denominations showing the three leaders - with Gandhiji conspicuously missing in their proposed designs!

Prominent Congress Dalit leader Nitin Raut demanded to add the image of B.R. Ambedkar, which was seconded by Shiv Sena's (UBT) ex-Mumbai Mayor Kishori Pednekar. "Why not Ambedkar? It's because of him that the country is enjoying the fruits of democracy today," they pointed out. Republican Party of India (K) President Sachin Kharat demanded to add the image of Gautam Buddha, senior Sena (UBT) leader Anil Parab pitched the name of Shiv Sena founder Balasaheb Thackeray, while deputy leader Raghunath Kuchik suggested Lord Ram or even Subhas Chandra Bose and Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel.

Delhiites working hard but still a long way to go : Kejriwal on Delhi pollution

NEW DELHI: Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday said the results of efforts made by Delhi residents to curb pollution in the city are encouraging but there is still a long way to go. His remarks came a day after Diwali when the air quality in the national capital was recorded in the 'very

poor' category. The situation, however, was relatively better than previous years due to favourable meteorological conditions which diluted the effect of many residents flouting a firecracker ban and stubble burning. Delhi's air quality index (AQI) stood at 326 at 8 am. "Delhiites are working hard in the field of pollution. There have been very encouraging results but there is still a long way to go. We will make Delhi the best city in the world," Kejriwal said in a tweet in Hindi. Emissions from firecrackers and farm fires have contributed significantly to Delhi's PM2.5 pollution on Diwali over the years. Their share this year was relatively less than previous years due to reduced bursting of firecrackers and moderately warm and windier conditions which prevented rapid accumulation of pollutants. Delhi had recorded an AQI of 382 on Diwali last year, 414 in 2020, 337 in 2019, 281 in 2018, 319 in 2017, and 431 in 2016, according to Central Pollution Control Board data. An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', and 401 and 500 'severe'.

Nearly 250 criminals identified preparing fake passports, 126 arrested in Haryana

Delhi's pollution level lowest in 5 yrs post-Diwali: Gopal Rai



Delhi Environment Minister Gopal Rai on Tuesday said that this year the pollution level in the national capital was the lowest after Diwali compared to the last five years. Sharing the figures of the last five years, the minister said that this year, there has been a reduction of 30 per cent in pollution compared to last year itself. "Thirty per cent lesser firecrackers were burst in Delhi this Diwali, people are becoming aware", said the environment minister. Rai also flagged off mobile smog guns from the Delhi Secretariat. "Today we are starting 150 mobile smog guns. Last year we started 10 such smog guns. Out of these 150 mobile smog guns, two smog guns will

level of pollution has not increased today compared to every year. Today is the lowest level of pollution in the last five years. Last year it was 462, but today it has come down to 323, that is, there is a shortfall of about thirty per cent", Rai said. On the incidents of burning of firecrackers in the capital city, Gopal Rai said that "Some people had burnt crackers. However, it is expected that gradually awareness will increase in them too. Since the AQI in Delhi is still 323 and it is increasing as the winter season approaches. Our efforts are continuing to bring down the pollution levels". On the question of stubble burning in Punjab, he said, "The state controlled the farm fires without the Centre's help. Last year, on the day of Diwali, there were 3, 032 incidents of stubble burning in Punjab, 228 in Haryana and 123 in Uttar Pradesh. This year only 1, 019 incidents of stubble burning have been registered on the day of Diwali, while this figure has increased in Haryana and Uttar Pradesh."

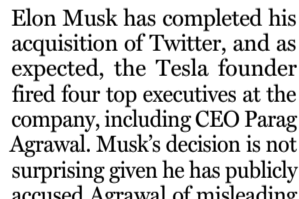

Elon Musk fires Twitter CEO Parag Agrawal

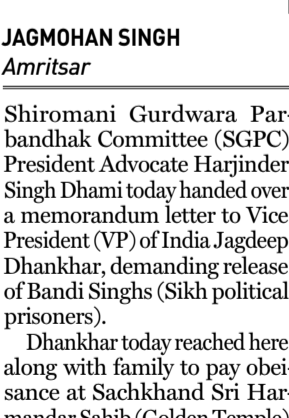


Elon Musk has completed his acquisition of Twitter, and as expected, the Tesla founder fired four top executives at the company, including CEO Parag Agrawal. Musk's decision is not surprising given he has publicly accused Agrawal of misleading him on the number of spam-bot accounts. Musk famously used a poop emoji to reply to one of Agrawal's tweets. Here's a quick look at Agrawal's short-lived term at the social media company. The India-born Agrawal was appointed as Twitter's CEO in November 2021 after Jack Dorsey stepped down. At the time, Dorsey had fully endorsed Agrawal. Given Musk has fired him, Agrawal's stint at the job was less than a year. Agrawal is an alumnus of the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT)-Bombay. He also has a PhD in Computer Science from Stanford University and has interned with other companies such as Microsoft, Yahoo, and AT&T Labs. He first joined Twitter in 2011, so he has worked here for nearly 11 years. Previously, he was Twitter's Chief Technology Officer (CTO) and was appointed to the role in 2018. As reported previously, he played a role in the company's technical strategy, especially around machine learning and AI. He also led efforts on scaling Twitter Ads systems. While Musk has fired Agrawal, the relationship between the two did not have a rocky start, at least publicly. Back in April, when Musk had bought a majority stake in Twitter, Agrawal wel-

SGPC President Dhambi hands over memorandum Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar demanding release of Sikh prisoners

Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) President Advocate Harjinder Singh Dhambi today handed over a memorandum letter to Vice President (VP) of India Jagdeep Dhankhar, demanding release of Bandi Singhs (Sikh political prisoners). Dhankhar today reached here along with family to pay obeisance at Sachkhand Sri Harmandar Sahib (Golden Temple) and expressed his devotion. In his letter, Dhambi said Sikh prisoners are lodged in different Indian jails for nearly three decades despite completion of their sentences, which was a big injustice with the Sikh community. He said imprisoned Sikhs chose the path of struggle in 1984 in protest against the military attack on Central Sikh shrine Sachkhand Sri Harmandar Sahib and Sri Akal Takht Sahib in Amritsar, named as Operation Bluestar by the then Congress government. He said SGPC had been demanding release of Sikh prisoners through democratic means for a long time. Dhambi said that on the issue of Sikh prisoners, the SGPC had also sent letters seeking appointments of meetings to



the Prime Minister of India, Home Minister of India, Chief Ministers of Delhi and Karnataka states, but the Sikh body did not receive any positive response. He said that it is being felt that by not releasing the Sikh prisoners, they are being discriminated against, as they have already served double sentences than life imprisonments. SGPC President demanded from the Vice President to take cognizance of this important issue of release of Sikh prisoners and issue necessary directions to the Government of India and concerned State Governments for their release. AAP seeks Iqbal Singh Lalpura's removal as minorities panel Chief

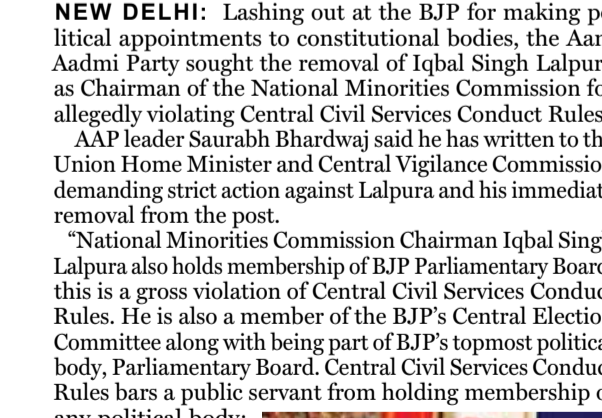
Lashing out at the BJP for making political appointments to constitutional bodies, the Aam Aadmi Party sought the removal of Iqbal Singh Lalpura as Chairman of the National Minorities Commission for allegedly violating Central Civil Services Conduct Rules. AAP leader Saurabh Bhardwaj said he has written to the Union Home Minister and Central Vigilance Commission demanding strict action against Lalpura and his immediate removal from the post. "National Minorities Commission Chairman Iqbal Singh Lalpura also holds membership of BJP Parliamentary Board; this is a gross violation of Central Civil Services Conduct Rules. He is also a member of the BJP's Central Election Committee along with being part of BJP's topmost political body, Parliamentary Board. Central Civil Services Conduct Rules bars a public servant from holding membership of any political body; he should be immediately removed from Constitutional post. The Aam Aadmi Party has complained to Home Minister Amit Shah and Central Vigilance Commission demanding his removal from Constitutional post," he said. Bhardwaj said that Lalpura heads a prominent constitutional body, which is autonomous and receives all types of complaints, including several complex matters. Due to this, its chief should be a neutral person, completely detached from party politics. "Earlier on the day, AAP leader Atishi also wrote to Union Tourism Minister demanding removal of BJP national spokesperson Sambit Patra from ITDC Chairman's post for allegedly violating CCS Conduct Rules and misusing the post for party work.

Azam Khan disqualified from UP Assembly, House secretariat declares seat vacant

Chhath Puja declared as Dry Day in Delhi for first time

NEW DELHI: For the first time, Chhath Puja has been declared as Dry Day in the capital city. This year, the Puja falls on October 30 (Evening) and October 31 (Morning). Delhi Lt Governor V.K. Saxena has declared Chhath Puja that falls on Sunday on October 30 as Dry Day in the Capital. The LG, in his capacity as “Government” as per Section 2 (35) of Delhi Excise Act, 2009, has declared the Dry Day. Meanwhile, the LG has also written to Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal to ensure that sufficient manpower and logistics must be put in place well before time at all designated sites. “It has been brought to my notice that more than



840 sites have been identified and designated for this purpose by the departments concerned. Anticipating large gatherings this year and keeping in mind the zeal and fervour with which the festival is celebrated, it becomes imperative on part of the administration to leave no stone

before, during and after the religious ceremony, is also of paramount importance. “In this regard, it is felt necessary that sufficient manpower and logistics must be put in place well before time at all sites. Simultaneously, relevant information in this regard along with messages creating awareness and urging people regarding the same must be put in public domain,” reads the letter. Along with the requisite safety measures like marking of danger zone, barricading of deep waters to avoid any untoward incident, adequate lighting, deploying divers and rescue boats, the LG has also asked to address the issues of foam and pollution in the Yamuna Ghat that may prove

injurious to devotees. “On some of the designated Ghats like Bhalswa lake, Wazirabad-Sonia Vihar, Badli, Bawana Industrial Area, Maidan Garhi, Kalindi Kunj, Budh Bazar-Uttam Nagar amongst others, large congregation of devotees ranging from 10,000 to 4,00,00 is expected to be present. Proper planning for crowd management and securing law and order at all sites has already been discussed with Delhi Police,” he said. The New Delhi Municipal Council, Municipal Corporation of Delhi and Delhi Development Authority have also been directed to ensure cleanliness and make arrangements for other civic amenities under their jurisdiction in mission mode, reads the letter.

Home Minister Amit Shah to gift multi-crore projects to Haryana

Union Home Minister Amit Shah will inaugurate and lay foundation stones of various projects of Haryana in Faridabad in Thursday, an official said on Wednesday. Shah will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of four projects costing Rs 6,629 crore. These include laying the foundation stone of the Haryana Orbital Rail Corridor project costing Rs 5,618 crore, the inauguration of the Rail Coach Refurbishment Factory in Sonapat district costing Rs 590 crore, the country's first longest elevated railway track built in Rohtak for Rs 315.40 crore. Besides, the Union Minister will also dedicate and inaugurate the Haryana Police



Residence Complex, Bhondsi, constructed at a cost of Rs 106 crore. Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar will preside over the programme amid the presence of Union Minister of Railways and Communications Ashwini Vaishnaw, Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala and

Union Minister of State for Power Krishan Pal Gurjar. Many senior officials of the Central and the state government will attend the programme. The district administration has completed its preparations in view of the visit of the Union Home Minister.

Increase in consumption of milk & milk products in Haryana

SATISH HANDA Haryana state known for production as well as consumption of milk in the country in past years has witnessed further increase in past couple of years as well as during current year. Information reveals, the consumption of ghee in the state in past few months has also increased by nearly 30%, whereas consumption of other milk products which include butter milk (lassi) has increased by 48.80%, consumption of curd increased by 54.50% and consumption of milk increased between 7 to 10%.

Information reveals, Haryana state leads in per capita consumption of milk in the country in which Haryana state government federation has played important role due to its policies in branding, packing, quality and marketing through a network of retail outlets and VITA booths in rural as well as in urban areas, also having contract for procurement of milk through a chain of milk societies in rural areas as a result the sale of milk has witnessed increase by more than 7% whereas in case of other products like ghee, curd and butter milk sale increased up to 55% in past about a year. Talking to media persons Dr Banwari Lal State Cooperative Minister told that state milk federation has played an important role to boost status of VITA milk and milk products and it is due to the efforts sale as well as profits witnessed good results having sale worth Rs 1505 crore during year 2021-22 as compared to sale worth Rs 1159 crore during year 2019-20.

Hisar in Haryana among 9 railway stations to have multifunctional complexes

SATISH HANDA Rail Land Development Authority (RLDA) is going to set up multifunctional complexes initially at nine railway stations in the country in West Bengal, Rajasthan, Punjab and Haryana states for which tender have already been invited. Railway department has decided to develop multifunctional complex at Hisar railway station in Haryana state during first phase. RLDA will provide nearly 372 to 2350 square meter land adjacent to the railway

station on 45 years lease basis for developing these multifunctional complex having facility for shopping complex, fast food stall, restaurant, book stall, ATM counter, medical store, variety store, hotel accommodation under a roof and sufficient parking space to attract train passengers as well as visitors to railway station since multifunctional complex will be situated very close to the railway platform, which will also bring handsome income for investors in this project. RLDA Vice President V.P.



Dudeja told media persons that railways will provide facilities like drinking water, sewerage system and regular supply of electricity round the clock in these multifunctional complexes at the railway stations to be developed in the country. He told that RLDA has already allotted 58 sites for

multifunctional complexes on 45 years lease basis and work to develop 16 complexes has already been started in the country. According to information, RLDA has plans to develop four types of projects at or near the railway stations which include developing business sites, re-development of railway colonies, face lifting of railway stations and railway offices. Information reveals, RLDA has started work at 16 railway stations in the country during current financial years which

include Bangalore and Raichur in Karnataka state, Lilua and Namakgola in Howrah state, Nizamabad in Telangana state, Waltex Road and Agmor in Chinnai state, Bhopal in Madhya Pradesh state, Ludhiana in Punjab state, Abu Road in Rajasthan state, Bhusawal and Sholapur in Maharashtra state, Bareilly, Varanasi and Gorakhpur in U.P state where land adjoining the railway stations has already been allotted on 45 years lease basis which have brought earning to railways worth Rs 1633 crore.

Ram Rahim names Honeypreet as 'Ruhani Didi'

BAGHPAT: Dera Sacha Sauda chief Gurmeet Ram Rahim, who is on a 40-day parole, has announced that his 'daughter' Honeypreet will now be known as 'Ruhani Didi'.



He said that Honeypreet, who has had her share of controversies and was also arrested, will now be known as Ruhani Didi. Ram Rahim also quashed rumours of a change of leadership at the Dera Sachcha Sauda and said that he would remain its head. The Dera chief issued both the statements while addressing Saad Sangat at the Dera in Baghpat. He is staying at Barnawa Ashram after getting parole from Suneria Jail in Haryana. He has been addressing his disciples online.

convicted for hatching a conspiracy to kill the Dera's former manager Ranjit Singh, who was shot dead in 2002. During the parole, the Dera chief began to interact with his followers online almost on a daily basis. In the past few days, at least two BJP leaders, including Haryana Vidhan Sabha Deputy Speaker Ranbir Gangwa and Karnal Mayor Renu Bala Gupta were found interacting with Ram Rahim online and seeking his blessings.

Ram Rahim celebrated Diwali online in the camp by lighting sparklers and appealed to the people not to spread more pollution. He has also released a 3.52-minute Punjabi video song featuring himself from his Dera located in Uttar Pradesh's Baghpat. He released videos of the Diwali celebrations at the Dera. Ram Rahim termed his imprisonment as a "spiritual journey" and added that he was writing a book on it.

The Congress candidate for Adampur bypoll, Jai Prakash, too came forward claiming that he was Ram Rahim's "biggest disciple". Previously, Ram Rahim was granted parole thrice in 2021 and twice in 2022, which includes 21 days in February and a month in June. The timing of the Dera chief's repeated release on parole has often raised questions. According to prison authorities, a convict is entitled to parole of 90 days every year, subject to clearances on his conduct and security clearances from the district administration where he or she would be staying during the parole period.

It may be recalled that Ram Rahim, first convicted in August 2017 by a special CBI court in Panchkula, is serving a 20-year jail term for raping two of his women disciples at the Dera headquarters in Sirsa. In 2019, Ram Rahim and three others were convicted for the 2002 murder of journalist Ram Chander Chhatrapati. Last year, he, along with four others, was

On February 7, Ram Rahim was granted furlough days before the Punjab Assembly polls and granted Z-plus security "due to a high-level threat to his life from pro-Khalistan elements".

HAFED gets export orders for 20000 ton Basmati rice

SATISH HANDA Its first time Haryana State Cooperative Supply & Marketing Federation Limited (HAFED) of Haryana government has recently received export orders for 20000 ton Basmati rice from Saudi Arab. Information reveals, Haryana state holding nearly 50% share in export of rice in the country at present. However, export of Basmati rice from Haryana was adversely affected in past two years due to epidemic outbreak in the country as well as in the world resulting in rice exporters and farmers cultivated paddy crop suffered a lot in this period due to slump in the market. Whereas, as a result of improvement in system and relief in economic conditions in the world the demand of rice in domestic markets as well as in export markets have returned on the track like previous years. According to Kailash Bhagat HAFED Chairman they are expecting good export orders for Basmati rice from other countries also this year and will procure quality Basmati rice from farmers in the state for exports.

Heroine of value worth Rs 3 cr seized with 2 arrests including woman

SATISH HANDA The district police Rohtak on Wednesday arrested two persons including a woman during checking of vehicle in which both were travelling near a crossing at Sampla in Rohtak district and seized 1.5 kg heroine of value worth Rs 3 crore in international market lying in a plastic box kept under the seat as told by SP Rohtak Uday Singh Meena while addressing a press conference on Wednesday. He told that police department had received a secret input that two drug peddlers were on their way to Rohtak from Delhi purchased narcotic substances from Delhi. Meena told that after the infor-



mation was received an intensive search operation was conducted on Delhi-Rohtak road which led to the arrest of accused Sonia, a resident of Anandpura Society near Jind bi-pass Rohtak and Lalit son of Balwan Singh a resident of Shastri Nagar Hisar driving a vehicle bearing registration no. T-1022-HR-7964 impounded by the cops along with drugs kept in a

plastic box under the side seat where female partner was sitting. Police registered a case no. 488.2022 under NDPS Act after both the accused were taken into custody by the police and produced in the court seeking police remand. SP said that the properties of the accused arrested by police are being attached and would be demolished if found built illegally. He told that a police team has been deputed to Delhi from where both arrested had procured heroine from a foreign national youth a resident of Dwarka at Delhi. During preliminary investigation both arrested admitted that they are procuring drugs from Delhi and supply in the area around Rohtak.

Two senior Haryana government officers arrested while accepting bribe

Teams of State Vigilance Bureau Haryana arrested two senior government officers red handed while accepting bribe in past 24 hours. On the complaint of a contractor Amit a resident of Narwana to vigilance department that payment of his bill for payment Rs 6.13 lakh was lying unpaid in the office of irrigation department at Narwana in Jind district since past one and half year since concerned Executive Officer Banarsi Das demanding Rs 60000 bribe in view of releasing his payment when he informed vigilance department on 21st October and according to



a plan when the contractor Amit contacted Executive Engineer Banarsi Das to hand over bribe money he was called at the rest house late evening when vigilance team in the presence of duty magistrate Sanjay Singh arrested Executive Engineer red handed accepting Rs 60000 currency notes and a case was registered against him at the police station. According to information Banarsi Das Executive Engineer was being retired on 31st October this year. In another case, Team from vigilance department Karnal led by Narender Singh DSP arrested

Bhupinder Singh Mining Engineer at Bhiwani while accepting Rs 1 lakh bribe from Ajay Kumar a resident of Bhiwani allegedly demanding money for issuing a permit to lift soil when he lodged complaint with vigilance department at Toll Free number on 21st October in the afternoon and investigation in the case was handed over to Narender Singh DSP vigilance department at Karnal immediately who arrived at Bhiwani to take action in the case. Bhupinder Singh Mining Engineer called complainant Ajay Kumar late evening outside his office near Mini Secretariat Bhiwani and was arrested by vigilance team red-handed while accepting bribe amount and a case was registered against him at Bhiwani police station.

Farmers in Haryana incurring Rs 19500 crore annual loss in the absence of SYL canal water

SATISH HANDA Recent meeting between Chief Ministers Haryana and Punjab for construction of SYL canal failed to resolve long pending issue since Punjab Chief Minister repeated old dialogues that Punjab government is not in a position to spare even a single drop of SYL canal water to Haryana as taught by AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal Chief Minister Delhi. Haryana Home & Health Minister Anil Vij expressing surprise said that Kejriwal claims himself as son of Haryana and at the same time not only exhibiting step attitude towards Haryana state but also violating Supreme Court of India directions which is a cruel joke on farmers of Haryana. Vij said, the aim of meeting between chief ministers of both states was related to construction of SYL canal but Punjab Chief Minister Punjab continued repeating the dialogues as taught by Kejriwal. Information reveals, farmers in Haryana state are suffering financial loss worth Rs Rs 19500 crore every year in the absence of irrigation in nearly 10 lakh crore acre land due to shortage



of their share of SYL canal water causing less production of about 42 lakh ton food crops every year since Punjab and Rajasthan are using nearly 2600 cusec water of Haryana share capable to irrigate nearly 10.08 lakh acre land remains dry not only due to water but also water level in underground in most of area in Haryana fast declining and farmers have to spend huge amount on electricity to lift underground water with the help of tube wells or bear heavy diesel cost. Past scenario reveals, according to an agreement on 18th November 1976 Punjab government took rupee one crore from Haryana to complete construction of SYL canal in about a year but kept on lingering on matter for one reason or other when Haryana government knocked at Supreme Court of India as regard construction

of canal which was challenged by Punjab government on 11th July 1979 under section 78 of reconsideration Act in the court. In year 1981 an agreement was made between both governments in the presence of then Prime Minister Late Smt Indira Gandhi and construction of SYL canal started in 1982 when Shiromani Akali Dal in Punjab opposed the same in an agitation when Rajiv-Longowal agreement was made in 1985 in which then Punjab government agreed upon the proposal and construction work started but in the meanwhile two engineers involved in construction work were killed under mysterious circumstances in July 1990 and then Chief Minister Haryana Hukam Singh demanded from government in centre permission to construct the river in 1996 but to no result.

9000 kg adulterated milk products, sweets destroyed during raids in Haryana



SATISH HANDA Talking to media persons Haryana Home & Health Minister Anil Vij disclosed that teams of CM Flying Squad, Food Safety and Food Supply departments along with police collected 848 samples of food products and sweets from different towns in the state during raids and destroyed nearly 9000 kgs milk, milk products and sweets found either adulterated or being prepared under unhygienic condition at the spot during present festival season so far which included 150 kg 'khorva' 3851 kg sweets and 4954 kg products used to manufacture sweets found spurious in quality destroyed at the spot. Collected samples were forwarded to the laboratory for testing. Vij said, stern action will be taken against those supplying products found injurious to health. Out of 848 samples of food products collected in raids during present festival season included 30 samples collected at Ambala which included 2006 kg potato chips, 2310 kg gram flour destroyed by raiding teams at the spot. Similarly 75 kg cheese and 35 kg milk sweets collected through 30 samples at Bhiwani, 34 samples collected at Charkhi Dadri, 32 samples collected at Fatehabad in which more than 70

kg milk products and sweets were destroyed at the spot, CM Flying Squads collected 38 samples at Faridabad, 83 samples collected at Gurugram in which 435 kg spurious quality noodles were destroyed at the spot. CM Flying Squad collected 37 samples at Hisar during raids and destroyed huge quantity of sweets. CM Flying Squads during 38 raids at the sweets shops at Jind collected 125 kg milk products found unfit for use and destroyed at the spot. Similarly raiding teams collected 26 samples at Jhajjar, 38 samples at Kaithal, 30 samples at Karnal, 49 samples at Kurukshetra, 21 samples at Mohindergarh, 18 samples at Rewari, 47 samples at Panchkula, 59 samples at Panipat, 9 samples at Palwal, 45 samples at Rewari, 47 samples at Rohtak, 10 samples at Sirsa, 51 samples at Sonapat and 43 samples at Yamunanagar from milk dairies and sweets shops and goods found contaminated were destroyed at the spot. Information reveals that Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar had directed CM Flying Squads to take strict action against those supplying adulterated food products including sweets which performed remarkable duty this festival season to take action against adulterators playing with the life of public for self-vested interest.

Drug smuggling through darknet, cryptocurrencies increased: Shah

NEW DELHI: Union Home Minister Amit Shah said that there has been an increase in drug smuggling through the darknet and cryptocurrencies, which is also responsible for terrorism.

The Home Minister made the remarks at a high-level regional meeting on drug trafficking and national security in Gujarat's capital Gandhinagar on Wednesday. Shah said that on the one hand narcotics are eating the youth like termites and on the other hand the illegal money coming from the narcotics trade nurtures terrorism.

He said that to keep the youth safe and to combat the financing of terrorism, all the Central and state agencies have to fight this as a common battle and have to win. Shah said that the



major drug smuggling issues in western states include the increasing maritime smuggling of heroin from the west coast, illegal cultivation of narcotics such as opium, ganja, and poppy, use of couriers and parcels in drug smuggling, darknet

and increase in drug smuggling through cryptocurrencies.

Shah said that during the recent investigation of cases, new trends have emerged in drug trafficking in western states and necessary action needs to be taken to tackle these new trends.

The Home Minister said that among the states of the western region of the country, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa and the Union Territories of Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu have a vast coastline, additionally Rajasthan and Gujarat share borders with Pakistan.

Shah said that there has been an increase in the smuggling of South Central Asian heroin through the sea route as well as the increasing cases of heroin smuggling through the Indo-Pak border is a matter of concern. Sharing details drug smuggling cases, the Home Minister said that from 2006 to 2013, a total of 1,257 cases were registered, while from 2014 to 2022, 3,172 cases were registered, which is a total increase of 152 per cent.

BSE launches Electronic Gold Receipts



NEW DELHI: Leading stock exchange BSE has launched Electronic Gold Receipt (EGR) on its platform, a move that will help in efficient and transparent price discovery of the yellow metal.

It introduced two new products of 995 and 999 purity during the Muhurat trading on Diwali and trading will be in multiples of 1 gram and deliveries in multiples of 10 gram and 100 gram, the exchange said in a statement.

The announcement came after the exchange last month received final approval from the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) for introducing EGR on its platform.

BSE in February received in-principle approval from Sebi after which the exchange conducted several mock trading in the test environment for its members to facilitate trading in EGRs.

EGRs will cater to all market participants, which means that buyers and sellers on the exchange will include individual investors, as well as commercial participants along the value chain like importers, banks, refiners, bullion traders, jewellery manufacturers, and retailers.

"The launch of EGRs represents a significant milestone not only for the BSE but also for the global bullion industry. BSE is committed to continuously facilitating access to high-quality investment-based products and services for our stakeholders," Sameer Patil, CBO at BSE said on Monday.

The EGR platform will lead to greater assurance in the quality of gold supplied, efficient price discovery, and transparency in transacting. This can create a vibrant gold ecosystem in India by enabling actual fungibility of gold. India is the second largest consumer of gold globally with annual gold demand of approximately 800-900 tonne and holds an important position in the global markets.

The country has remained a price-taker in the global markets, and at present, does not play any significant role in influencing the price-setting for the commodity.

A platform for EGR infuses transparency in gold spot transactions, enables India to emerge as the price setter, and would eliminate existing market inefficiencies.

Former Hurriyat chairman Ansari passes away



SRINAGAR: Former chairman of the Hurriyat Conference and influential Shia leader Maulana Abbas Ansari died here on Tuesday. He was 86. "Maulana (Ansari) breathed his last at his Nawakadal residence in the old city on Tuesday morning," a relative of the deceased leader said.

He said Ansari was not keeping well for the past couple of months and was hospitalized for some time in September.

Ansari was the last chairman of the undivided Hurriyat Conference which split into two factions soon after his election as the head of the separatist amalgam in 2003.

He had stepped aside from active politics and his son Masroor had replaced him in Hurriyat as representative of Ittehadul Muslimeen party.

The three parties - which were part of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government for two-and-half years before it collapsed on June 30 - will now come together for the first time through the BJJ.

Besides the Congress, NCP and Sena-UBT leaders, the BJJ will also see the participation of many other political and farmers groups, prominent individuals from different walks of life, social and non-political entities which will join and march together with Gandhi at various locations during the state sojourn.

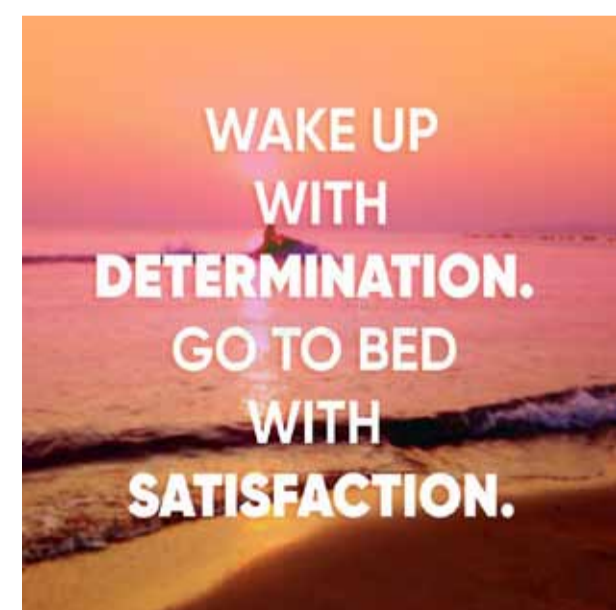
Small savings rates should be pegged higher

The Government recently increased the returns on a handful of small savings instruments for the ongoing October to December quarter by 0.1 to 0.3 percentage points. Popular investment avenues for the middle class such as the Public Provident Fund (PPF) and the National Savings Certificate were left out. On paper, the returns on these instruments are to be reset on a market-determined basis, with a spread of 0 to 100 basis points (one basis point equals 0.01%) over the yields on government securities with comparable maturities. That this has not been adhered to is evident even at a cursory glance, given the long pause between rate changes. Following interest rate hikes this year to curb inflation, government securities' yields have been shooting up. This month, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said that interest rates offered on various schemes in the current quarter are 44 to 77 basis points below the formula-implied rates. For households that have been grappling with 6%-plus inflation since January, punctuated by a few months of 7%-plus price rise, these meagre hikes are far from enough to lift sentiment.

The last time rates were hiked was in January 2019, just ahead of the Lok Sabha election. In March 2021, the Government had announced further cuts ranging from 0.4% to 1.1%, but withdrew the decision overnight, citing an 'oversight' amid a poll campaign for five States. However, even as a token gesture to voters in upcoming polls, this latest tweak in small savings rates does not make the cut. As the RBI's top brass warned earlier, negative returns have serious consequences for the economy if households, which are the biggest lenders, stop parking their savings in such fixed income instruments and banks. The next quarter should see a fairer and healthier reset of returns to negate inflation's dent on household savings.

Move the needle on climate action

India and other developing economies are justifiably worried about the damage to growth from COVID-19, Russia's war in Ukraine, and the global economy's downturn. But these troubles pale in comparison with the climate catastrophe already resulting from the current trajectory of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, whose effects hit developing economies and the poor hardest. That is why it is imperative that COP27 — the United Nations' climate summit which opens in Egypt from November 6 — makes real advances to stave off the worst effects of global warming. This means going beyond COP21's important Paris agreement (2015) on national commitments to cut GHG emissions and COP26's notable Glasgow agreement (2021) to stem deforestation.

Despite nervousness in making bold commitments in these uncertain times, a breakthrough must be made in rectifying decades of lopsided emissions by rich countries. They are still unwilling to offset past excesses by extending the massive financing that developing economies need for climate action. Just as problematic is the continuous and heavy burning of fossil fuels by the top five emitters — China, the United States, India, Russia, and Japan — as well as Southeast Asian countries taken together. What is worse, many of their plans are woefully inadequate for reaching carbon neutrality by 2050 to help keep temperatures rise below 2°C as envisaged in the Paris agreement. COP27 would be a success if progress is made on both these issues. One way would be for the summit to name the countries that are most out of line and ask them to do more.

On the other hand, rich countries have already shown that they can mobilise vast resources to tackle global emergencies. They did this in the 2008–09 global financial crisis and spectacularly so in the \$15 trillion committed in 2020 (by



one estimate), by the major economies to fight COVID-19. But when it comes to climate change, rich countries are failing dismally in raising the UN-goal of at least \$100 billion annually in climate finance for developing countries. COP27 should move the needle on this vital area.

Reaching carbon neutrality by 2050 is the absolute minimum for all major emitters if unthinkable scenarios of global warming are to be averted. The reverberating message from COP27 should be that the price for achieving carbon neutrality is a fraction of the cost of having to adapt to an increasingly unliveable planet. Ahead of COP27, Singapore has announced that it will achieve net zero emissions by 2050, a powerful signal even if coming from a country with only 0.1% of the carbon footprint.

Advance the year for net zero

India's reliance on fossil fuels is extremely high. High GDP growth, India's biggest goal, just cannot be achieved in the face of runaway climate change. The

country has set a target date of 2070 for net zero. China is the world's leader in renewable energy, but its share of coal and gas in energy production remains over 70%, with the country continuing to finance massive fossil fuel-based infrastructure. China has announced net zero for 2060. India and China awkwardly weakened the goal of COP26 from a "phase-out" of coal power to a "phase-down". This, however, is the moment to advance their date for net zero to 2050. Energy is responsible for about three-fourths of GHGs in the air, and low carbon energy needs to lead the decarbonisation of the global economy. India's plan for decarbonisation, even if very gradual at present, will nevertheless need to see a massive switch to renewable energy. Electric power has made progress in adopting renewables in its energy mix, but a far bigger switch from fossil fuel is needed for domestic heating and cooling. Factors in the way of a more ambitious adoption of renewables such as solar and wind include the variability in their generation due to weather condi-

tions, weak transmission grids, and poor financial conditions of power distribution companies.

COP27 should call for the extensive use of markets to help shift the global economy to a low-carbon path. The summit could back a radical shift in countries adopting carbon pricing, for example, via a significant carbon tax on the source of pollution. It should reiterate the need for all countries to eliminate fossil fuel subsidies. In terms of climate financing, something similar could be done to what was achieved during the COVID-19 pandemic, when rich countries raised vast amounts of financing. Climate projects can be vastly scaled up by multilateral development banks, such as the World Bank and Asian Development Bank, all of which have strong climate-action mandates.

Based on the mixed track record of past summits, expectations may not be high for what COP27 may bring. One way that it could advance the climate agenda is by choosing commitments to be backed by UN-member states that will be seen by governments to be benefiting them — in terms of health and cleaner cities, to name just two examples — and putting their economies on a more environmentally sustainable path that alone can deliver national interests in these tense economic times. India has historically been a hesitant climate actor, not unlike other big emitters. COP27, which will be held at Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt (November 6-18), is a chance for the country to strongly back environmentally sustainable development in its national interest.

A dismal case of slashing schemes and cutting funds

Over the past three years, over 50% of existing central government-sponsored schemes have been discontinued, subsumed, revamped or rationalised into other schemes. The impact has been varied across Ministries. For example, for the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development, there are just three schemes now out of 19 schemes, i.e., Mission Shakti, Mission Vatsalya, Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0. Mission Shakti itself replaced 14 schemes which included the 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao' scheme.

In the case of the Ministry of Animal Husbandry and Dairy, just two schemes remain out of 12. Additionally, the Ministry has ended three schemes which include Dairying through Cooperatives, National Dairy Plan-II, etc. For the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, there are now three out of 20 (Krishonnati Yojana, Integrated Scheme on Agricultural Cooperatives and the Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana), while there is little information on the National Project on Organic Farming or the National Agroforestry Policy. There may be some who believe that a reduction in government schemes is a notable achievement. But does this lead to better governance, through less government? Are we reducing the state to the bare bones? For schemes that exist, there are challenges such as funding cuts, disbursement and utilisation of funds. As of June 2022, Rs 1.2 lakh crore of funds meant for central government-sponsored schemes are with banks which earn interest income for the Centre.

The Nirbhaya fund (2013) with its focus on funding projects to improve the public safety of women in public spaces and encourage their participation in economic and social activities is an interesting case; Rs 1,000 crore was allocated to the fund annually (2013-16), and remained largely



unspent. As of FY21-22, approximately Rs 6,214 crore was allocated to the fund since its launch, but only Rs 4,138 crore was disbursed. Of this, just Rs 2,922 crore was utilised; Rs 660 crore was disbursed to the Ministry of Women and Child Development, but only Rs 181 crore was utilised as of July 2021. Yet, a variety of women-focused development schemes across States are being turned down or ended. Meanwhile, women continue to face significant risks while in public spaces.

Farmers have not been spared either with fertilizer subsidies having been in decline over the last few years; actual government spending on fertilizers in FY20-21 reached Rs 1,27,921 crore. In the FY21-22 Budget, the allocation was Rs 79,529 crore (later revised to Rs 1,40,122 crore amidst the COVID-19 pandemic). In the FY22-23 Budget, the allocation was Rs 1,05,222 crore. Allocation for NPK fertilizers (nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium) was 35% lower than revised estimates in FY21-22. Such budgetary cuts, when fertilizer prices have risen sharply after the Ukraine war, have led to fertil-

izer shortages and farmer anguish. How will we incentivise farmers to continue agricultural operations?

Employment programmes

It is the same story with the rural poor. The allocation for the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) went down by approximately 25% in the FY22-23 Budget earlier this year, with the allocated budget at Rs 73,000 crore when compared to the FY21-22 revised estimates of Rs 98,000 crore. The Economic Survey 2022-23 has highlighted that demand for the scheme was higher than pre-pandemic levels as rural distress continues. Anecdotal cases show that actual funding disbursal for MGNREGA has often been delayed, leading to a decline in confidence in the scheme. The Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan (June 2020, for a period of 125 days) sought to provide immediate employment and livelihood opportunities to the rural poor; approximately 50.78 crore person days of employment were provided at an expenditure of approximately Rs 39,293

crore (against an announced budget of Rs 50,000 crore, Ministry for Rural Development). One must also note that the scheme subsumed 15 other schemes. With between 60 million to 100 million migrant workers who seek informal jobs, such a scheme should have been expanded.

Now to health-care workers. For Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHA), who are the first responders, there have been delays in salaries for up to six months. Regularisation of their jobs continues to be a struggle, with wages and honorariums stuck at minimum levels.

There is one more example. Biodiversity has also been ignored. Funding for wildlife habitat development under the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has declined: from Rs 165 crore (FY18-19), to Rs 124.5 crore (FY19-20), to Rs 87.6 crore (FY20-21). Allocations for Project Tiger have been slashed — Rs 323 crore (FY18-19) to Rs 194.5 crore (FY20-21). A pertinent question is about meeting climate change obligations in the face of funding cuts.

Rather than downsizing government schemes and cutting funding, one should right size the government. After the Goods and Services Tax reform, the Centre-State relationship has been transformed, with fiscal firepower skewed towards the Centre. Our public services require more doctors, teachers, engineers and fewer data entry clerks. We need to build capacity for an efficient civil service to meet today's challenges, i.e., providing a corruption-free welfare system, running a modern economy and providing better public goods. Rather than having a target of fewer government schemes, we should raise our aspirations towards better public service delivery.

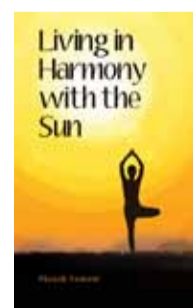

Elon Musk says won't fire 75% of Twitter staff as he finalises deal

SAN FRANCISCO: Tesla CEO Elon Musk has told Twitter employees that he is not going to lay off 75 per cent of the workforce when he takes over the micro-blogging platform.

Reports earlier mentioned that Musk will fire 75%, or 5,600 employees, from the Twitter staff globally.

Musk, who visited Twitter headquarters in San Francisco with a sink in his hands late on Wednesday, cleared to the employees that he will not sack so many people, reports TechCrunch.

Musk has casually mentioned laying off Twitter staff in his tweets, without sharing



any figure.

Twitter employees are still anxious about expected staff cuts as part of the takeover, which is likely to be closed on Friday.

According to The Wall Street Journal, banks and lenders have started to send \$13 billion in cash backing Musk's \$44 billion takeover of Twitter.

"Once final closing conditions are met, the funds will be made available for Musk to execute the transaction by the Friday deadline," the report mentioned. Musk must complete the acquisition by Friday or face the lawsuit at a court in Delaware, as per the deadline given by the judge.

Meanwhile, reports said that Twitter employees had written an open letter to the board of directors and Musk, criticising his plans to lay off 75 per cent of the workforce.

Twitter has told employees in an internal message that they would hear directly from Musk on Friday.

"In view of findings of various spot checks, inspections and the reply to the show cause notice submitted by SpiceJet, for continued sustenance of safe and reliable air transport service, the number of departures of SpiceJet are restricted to 50 per cent of the number of departures approved under Summer schedule 2022 for a period of eight weeks," the DGCA had said in its July 27 order.

Walmart reportedly raising up to \$3 bn for Flipkart to expand India biz

Retail giant Walmart is reportedly raising up to \$3 billion for its e-commerce giant Flipkart to further expand its operations in the country.

With new funds, Flipkart's valuation is set to soar to more than \$40 billion, giving a fillip to the Indian funding scene which is going through a harsh winter.

Flipkart Group in July last year raised \$3.6 billion to grow and advance the digital commerce ecosystem in India. The investment valued the group at \$37.6 billion post the money then.

According to media reports, Walmart may bring strategic investors into Flipkart via this fundraising.

The move, according to close sources, is to keep Flipkart ahead in the e-commerce race as online shopping surges with every festive season in the country.

Reached for a reaction, a Flipkart spokesperson told IANS that "We do not comment on speculation". Walmart declined to comment.

The last fundraise demonstrated significant interest from global investors, including sovereign funds, private equity and crossovers



in addition to Walmart. It was led by financial investors GIC, Canada Pension Plan Investment Board (CPP Investments), SoftBank Vision Fund 2 and Walmart, along with investments from sovereign funds DisruptAD, Qatar Investment Authority, Khanah Nasional Berhad, and marquee investors Tencent, Willoughby Capital, Antara Capital, Franklin Templeton, and Tiger Global.

"This investment by leading global investors reflects the promise of digital commerce in India and their belief in Flipkart's capabilities to maximise this potential for all stakeholders," Kalyan Krish-

namurthy, Chief Executive Officer, Flipkart Group, had said in July last year.

"The quality of the investor group and valuation is further confirmation of global confidence in Flipkart and its mission to transform commerce in India," Judith McKenna, President and CEO - Walmart International, had said.

Bengaluru-based Redseer Strategy Consultants had predicted \$11.8 billion worth gross merchandise value (GMV) during the entire festive month up to Diwali. E-commerce marketplaces usually hold up to three sales leading up to the festival of lights.

The online retail platforms in India clocked \$5.7 billion (about Rs 40, 000 crore) worth festive sales between September 22 to 30, a robust 27 per cent (year-on-year) growth.

Mobile phones continue to lead the market with 41 per cent contribution in gross merchandise value (GMV) and nearly 56, 000 mobile handsets were sold every hour, according to the report by Redseer.

Flipkart Group (Flipkart, Myntra and Shopsy) continued to lead the market with 62 per cent market share in GMV.

and over 80 per cent of global operator-billed revenue will be attributable to 5G connections by 2027.

In addition, the ability of standalone 5G networks to offer 'network slicing' will act as the ideal platform for the growth of 5G private network revenue.

Standalone 5G uses next-generation core networks supporting network slicing technology, which can be used to take a 'slice' of public 5G infrastructure and provide it to private network users.

Mahatma Gandhi had also adopted the path of 'aparigraha' as laid down by Jain gurus, he said.

Also recalling Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the prime minister said Gujarat has given two Vallabhs' to the country and noted that Patel's birth anniversary will be celebrated on October 31.

5G service revenue to reach \$315 bn globally in 2023

The global 5G service revenue is expected to reach \$315 billion in 2023, rising from \$195 billion this year, a new report showed on Monday.

This represents growth of over 60 per cent in a single year for operator-billed 5G service revenue, according to Juniper Research.

"Despite the growth of the Internet of Things, revenue from consumer connections will continue to be the cornerstone of 5G operator revenue increase," said research co-author Olivia Williams.

Over 95 per cent of global 5G connections in 2027 will be connected personal devices such as smartphones, tablets and mobile broadband routers, "Williams added.

The increase in revenue will



be driven by the accelerating migration of cellular subscriptions to 5G networks; owing to operator strategies that minimise or remove any premium over existing 4G subscription offerings.

It forecasts over 600 million new 5G subscriptions will be created next year, despite the anticipated economic downturn in 2023.

The report predicts growth of 5G networks will continue,

The disadvantages of being more online are also coming to the fore, such as one out of every three such youth has a problem of depression, anxiety or stress. Nevertheless, this generation prefers to participate in all kinds of social or commercial

events through social media. To build relationships, this generation also likes people who they have met through online mediums.

No matter how much you use mobile and the internet, living in a natural environment has its own benefits. In many countries in Asia and Europe, 80 percent of school-children have been found to have poor vision. 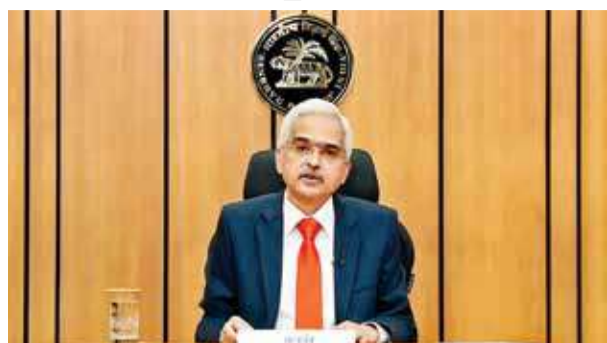
the physical condition of children having autism. Drumming increases functional connectivity in the brain.

Reserve Bank's Monetary Policy Committee to discuss inflation report on November 3

MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank will hold a special meeting of its rate-setting committee on November 3 to prepare a report for the government on why it failed to keep retail inflation below the target of 6 per cent for three consecutive quarters since January.



The six-member Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) headed by RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das will prepare the report on reasons for failure to meet the inflation target as well as the remedial measures the central bank is taking to bring down prices in the country.

Under the provisions of Section 45ZN of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Act 1934... an additional meeting of the MPC is being scheduled on November 3, 2022," RBI said in a statement on Thursday.

Section 45ZN of RBI Act deals with failure to maintain the inflation target. RBI Act mandates that in case the inflation target is not met for three consecutive quarters, the central bank has to submit a report to

the government explaining the reasons and detail the remedial actions it will be taking to check the price rise.

This will be the first time since the monetary policy framework came into effect in 2016 that RBI will have to explain its actions to the government. As per the mandate given to RBI by the Union government, the central bank is required to ensure retail inflation remains at 4 per cent with a margin of 2 per cent on either side.

Inflation had overshoot the target for over three quarters during the pandemic also but

RBI did not have to provide an explanation to the government. It was because of a technical shortcoming in data collection as data was collected without visiting mandis because of pandemic-related curbs.

The retail inflation based on CPI has remained above 6 per cent since January 2022. It was 7.41 per cent in September. The MPC factors in retail inflation while deciding the bi-monthly monetary policy.

If the average inflation remains above the upper tolerance level or less than the lower tolerance level for any three consecu-

tive quarters, it is considered a failure on part of RBI in meeting the inflation targeting mandate. Last month, Das said the central bank considers the communication to the government for missing the inflation targets as privileged communication and will not be making it public.

RBI has been aggressively raising the key interest rate since May in a bid to contain inflation. It has so far raised the short term lending rate by 190 basis points taking the rate to a nearly three-year high of 5.9 per cent.

Union FM review high inflation & weak rupee, says economic performance 'Impressive'

Even as economic growth and rising inflation remain major concerns for India, with Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman saying that these twin challenges would be in focus in the next Union Budget, the monthly economic review for September has said that country's economic performance has been "impressive" in the first half of 2022-23.



"Indian economic performance in the first half of 2022-23 has been impressive compared to the world. As measured by PMI composite index, the economic activity level was higher for India at 56.7 compared to 51.0 for the World level during April-Sept 2022," said the economic review which was released on Saturday by the Finance Ministry.

"While wholesale inflation has significantly reduced from its peak of 16.6 per cent in May 2022 to 10.7 per cent in September 2022 on account of moderating commodity prices and government measures, retail inflation remains above the RBI's upper tolerance band due to an uptick in food prices. However, food inflation is expected to moderate as the harvesting and

procurement seasons progress, thereby contributing to a declining headline retail inflation in the rest of the fiscal year," it said while elaborating on inflation.

"On the external front, the rupee has performed relatively well in first half of 2022-23 compared to other major economies, reflecting the strong fundamentals of the Indian economy." The rupee incidentally had touched a historic low of 83.18 earlier this week, even as Sitharaman said that she saw it more as a case of the dollar strengthening than the rupee falling.

The economic review for September 2022 however noted that "the country should be able to meet these challenges

and keep the economy growing steadily".

"Prudent macroeconomic policies that have served the country well since 2014 continue to remain essential. As is the case with battling in swinging conditions, balls well-left (policy errors avoided) will be as important as balls played well (policy decisions taken)," it said.

The Central government's continuous thrust on capital expenditure promotes broad-based growth by facilitating private sector capital formation. Significant pick-up in consumption has resulted in a more-than-proportionate jump in GST revenues, a more robust economic recovery could al-

low the collections to settle at an elevated level, proving the high revenue productivity of the broad-based consumption, the review further noted.

A well-capitalised banking system has led to an upswing in credit disbursement to the retail, industry and services segments.

"High-Frequency Indicators (HFIs) suggest a continued broadening of traction in services activity. E-way bills, in particular, point to the overall growth of inter-state wholesale and retail trade.

"Going forward, the pent-up demand in the services sector, combined with a strong economic outlook for India, will drive growth in the service sector," the review said. Service sector firms are positive about demand conditions, sales turnover, their hiring plans and the overall business situation they expect in third quarter of the current fiscal. However it cautioned that "even as India remains one of the bright spots in an otherwise gloomy global scenario where the dark clouds of recession gather, the country's fiscal and monetary authorities must remain watchful.

Indian Rupee touches 82.72 against US dollar

Indian rupee on Friday closed at 82.63 after touching a high of 82.72 against the US dollar. The Indian currency gave up its early gains due to higher dollar demand. Earlier this month, rupee had touched a record high of 83.18 against the dollar.

The investors' dim outlook on China and also on the overall global economy has impacted the rupee. Rupee's fate will also depend on the crucial Federal Reserve meeting on November 2, market watchers said. In addition to this, the ECB's soft comments drove market views that central banks will likely moderate the pace of monetary tightening. This was more so, after the Bank of Canada surprisingly announced a smaller-than-expected rate hike.

Auto-rickshaw, taxi fares hiked in Delhi



NEW DELHI: The Delhi government has approved a hike in auto-rickshaw and taxi fares in view of rising CNG prices in the national capital, according to an official statement on Friday.

According to the revised fares, the meter down charge (minimum fare) for the initial 1.5 kilometre for auto-rickshaws has been increased from Rs 25 to Rs 30, while the per kilometre charge after meter down has been hiked from Rs 9.50 to Rs 11. For taxis, the per kilometre charge after meter down has been hiked from Rs 14 to Rs 17 for non-AC vehicles and from Rs 16 to Rs 20 for AC vehicles. The last revision in the auto-rickshaw fares happened in 2020 while that for taxi which includes black-and-yellow taxi, economy taxi and premium taxi happened nine years back in 2013.

Bank of Canada increases policy interest rate

OTTAWA: The Bank of Canada has increased its benchmark interest rate by 50 basis points to 3.75 percent.

Given elevated inflation and inflation expectations, as well as ongoing demand pressures in the economy, the bank's governing council expected that the policy interest rate will need to rise further, the central bank said in a statement issued on Wednesday.

In the last three months, Canada's CPI inflation has declined from 8.1 percent to 6.9 percent, primarily due to a fall in fuel prices.

However, price pressures remain broadly based, with two-thirds of CPI components increasing more than 5 percent over the past year, the bank said.

The bank added that its preferred measures of core inflation were not yet showing meaningful evidence that underlying price pressures are easing.

The bank expected CPI inflation to ease as higher interest rates help rebalance demand and supply, price pressures from global supply disruptions fade, and the past



effects of higher commodity prices dissipate.

CPI inflation is projected to move down to about 3 per cent by the end of 2023, and then return to the 2 per cent target by the end of 2024.

According to the bank, the Canadian economy continued to operate in excess demand and labour markets remain tight.

The effects of recent policy rate increases are becoming evident in interest-sensitive areas of the economy: housing activity has retreated sharply, and spending by households and businesses is softening.

The bank projected the country's GDP growth to slow from 3.25 per cent this year to just under 1 per cent next year and 2 per cent in 2024.

Quantitative tightening continues and is complementing increases in the policy interest rate, the Bank of Canada said.

Softbank-backed health unicorn Cerebral laying off 400 people

SoftBank-backed digital mental health company Cerebral is laying off about 20 per cent of its staff as it restructures its business.

According to The Wall Street Journal, nearly 400 people will lose their jobs, primarily clinical staff and care counselors. A memo from its CEO, David Mou said the cuts would affect employees across the company, including at headquarters and among clinical care staff and support workers.

"The changes are part of Cerebral's ongoing transformation programme, which drives to create more sustainable growth and stability, while further delivering our mission to democratise



access to high-quality mental health care for all," a Cerebral spokesperson was quoted as saying in reports. "These changes are focused specifically on realising operational efficiencies while prioritising clinical quality and safety across the organisation," the spokesperson added. The care counselors meet patients regularly to manage medications prescribed by clinicians and provide support.

The company has come under scrutiny for making it easier to provide Attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) medication to potential clients.

In April, a former Cerebral executive sued the company, alleging he was fired after voicing concerns about unethical prescribing practices and patient safety issues.

The San Francisco-based company has raised more than \$426 million to date, and was last valued at \$4.8 billion.

Earlier this year Cerebral laid off "hundreds" of people, primarily affecting its support and operations team to improve its programmes.

Rajnath Singh dedicates 75 infra projects from eastern Ladakh

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Friday dedicated to the nation 75 infrastructure projects including bridges, roads and helipads built at a cost of Rs 2,180 crore in strategically key areas of Ladakh, Jammu and Kashmir, Arunachal Pradesh and Sikkim among others.

He inaugurated the projects at a function held at the Darbuk-Shyok-Daulat Beg Oldi (DS-DBO) road that provides connectivity to India's northernmost outpost of Daulat Beg Oldi in eastern Ladakh.

The highlight of the event was the onsite inauguration of 120-metre-long 'class-70 Shyok Setu' on the DS-DBO Road at an altitude 14,000 feet, the defence ministry said.

The bridge will be of strategic importance as it will facilitate logistics movement of the armed forces. Other projects inaugurated virtually by Singh included two helipads, one each in Hanle and Thakung, in Eastern Ladakh, it said. These helipads will enhance



the operational capabilities of the Indian Air Force in the region. The rest of the projects were inaugurated virtually by Singh.

The 75 projects included 45 bridges, 27 roads, two helipads and one 'Carbon Neutral Habitat' and they are spread across six states and two Union territories.

Twenty of the projects are in Jammu and Kashmir, 18 each in Ladakh and Arunachal Pradesh, five in Uttarakhand and 14 in other border states of Sikkim, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and Rajasthan.

Speaking on the occasion, the defence minister reaffirmed the government's commitment to ensure the progress of far-flung areas to fulfil the security needs of the country.

Singh noted that infrastructure development along with the valour of the armed forces was the main reason that helped India effectively deal with the recent situation in the northern sector, in an apparent reference to Indian military's response to Chinese PLA's aggressive behaviour in eastern Ladakh.

FM Nirmala Sitharaman asks States to ease logistics burden on exporters



Kakinada (Andhra Pradesh): Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Friday asked States to adopt a multimodal approach and ensure logistics did not become a burden on exporters.

She said the PM Gati Shakti was a beautiful protocol with which a synergy could be brought in.

Delivering the inaugural address after inaugurating the third campus of the Indian Institute of Foreign Trade in Kakinada, Sitharaman referred to 'One District-One Product' and 'Vocal for Local', initiatives, aimed at promoting local products and creating their export markets.

She said the Commerce Ministry was working on getting an export policy that would help the exporters by giving them incentives and promoting many things.

There's a repetitive and very relevant line that the Commerce Minister refers to. We can't be exporting taxes. We also should identify ways in which those taxes whether Centre, State or local that are on these products should be removed so that we don't burden their exporters, the Finance Minister said.

The governments did not get much revenue from those products but burdened the exporters nevertheless, she noted. She said the growing cost of electricity and logistics was also affecting the exports. With better roads and ports coming electronic facilitation for the customs operations coming surely, the logistics element is being addressed little by little. State governments should also spend some time to see that logistics doesn't become a burden on exporters, Sitharaman said.

The Finance Minister referred to the Prime Minister's suggestion that States should open export promotion offices in Indian embassies abroad. If you have the capacity to tell the kind of things you produce that are international class our embassies are the place where you should be and target the markets there. Some of our States are the size of some European countries. We have the capacity even as a district to capture the market outside, she said.

The 'One District-One Product' is an attempt to identify such products in each district that have a natural capacity, organic capacity. And 'Vocal for Local'. Those are the kind of products that capture international imagination and need to be supported, she added. Sitharaman, who said she was speaking as a student of trade and not a minister, observed that trade-related courses should become a lot more nimble. She exhorted the IIFT students to have a comprehensive understanding of what was going on in the global trade areas. "Multilateral institutions that govern trade have set the global norms. We should understand them. If anything, India's case should be put forward in a far more discerning, understanding way, she said. Sitharaman asked students to widen their horizon and have a multi-disciplinary approach to studying trade. The Finance Minister asked the IIFT Vice-Chancellor to ensure the institution actively engaged in India's trade. Wonderful brains are here. Use them to tell the Commerce Ministry how to go about it (foreign trade). You should be in the team of the Commerce Minister when he negotiates trade (with foreign countries), Sitharaman said. She took a dig at the Indian economic service and Indian trade service officers for doing only a copy-paste job. You have Indian economic service and Indian trade service officers giving papers to the Minister, saying, Oh, minister can you please take this up? But, many a time I find them copy-paste. I am sorry to say this. The Minister doesn't get an advantage, Sitharaman remarked. Andhra Pradesh Ministers Buggana Rajendranath, K Nageswara Rao, Ch S V Krishna, S A Raju, Rajya Sabha members G V L Narasimha Rao, P S Bose, Lok Sabha members V Geeta, M Bharat, MLCs, MLAs, and others attended the event. The IIFT-Kakinada has been opened on a temporary basis on the campus of the Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University here. IIFT's own campus on a 25-acre site at the Kakinada SEZ would be built at a cost of Rs 230 crore.

Markets log gains for 2nd day on buying in Reliance

MUMBAI: Equity benchmarks ended higher on Friday helped by buying in index major Reliance Industries along with fresh foreign fund inflows.

Extending its previous day's rally, the 30-share BSE benchmark climbed 203.01 points or 0.34 per cent to settle at 59,959.85. During the day, it jumped 376.33 points or 0.62 per cent to 60,133.17.

On similar lines, the broader NSE Nifty advanced 49.85 points or 0.28 per cent to end at 17,786.80. In the Sensex pack, Maruti, Reliance Industries, NTPC, Power Grid, Mahindra & Mahindra, Bajaj Finserv, Titan and Kotak Mahindra Bank were the major winners. Shares of Maruti climbed nearly 5 per cent after the company announced its earnings. Maruti Suzuki India on Friday reported an over four-fold increase in consolidated net profit to Rs 2,112.5 crore in



the second quarter ended on September 30, 2022, riding on record sales. Tech Mahindra, Tata Steel, Sun Pharma, ICICI Bank and State Bank of India were among the laggards. "Gains in index heavyweights helped the domestic market to withstand its gains

despite negative trends in its global peers. US tech stocks had a significant sell-off following disappointing quarterly results and a bleak forecast. "However, the strengthening rupee along with a softening treasury yield and decent Q2 earnings results are sup-

porting the domestic market in the near term," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services. The BSE smallcap gauge fell by 0.62 per cent and midcap index dipped 0.41 per cent. Among BSE sectoral indices, auto jumped 1.66 per cent,

energy climbed 1.20 per cent, oil & gas (0.76 per cent) and consumer discretionary (0.32 per cent). However, metal fell by 1.44 per cent, commodities declined by 1.08 per cent, IT (0.76 per cent), bankex (0.72 per cent) and telecommunication (0.55 per cent).

Meanwhile, the rupee declined by 15 paise to close at 82.48 (provisional) against the US dollar on Friday.

Elsewhere in Asia, markets in Seoul, Tokyo, Shanghai and Hong Kong ended lower.

Stock exchanges in Europe were trading in the negative territory in mid-session deals. Wall Street had ended on a mixed note on Thursday.

International oil benchmark Brent crude was trading 0.84 per cent lower at USD 96.15 per barrel. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) turned buyers on Thursday as they bought shares worth Rs 2,818.40 crore, as per exchange data.

Rishi Sunak: I will be unite Britain with action

In his first address to the nation via a televised statement in front of 10 Downing Street, now his official residence-cum-office as Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, Britain's first non-white, non-Christian head of government Rishi Sunak pledged: "I will unite our country not with words, but with action." He did not mince words about the "mistakes" made by his immediate predecessor, Liz Truss and said: "I have been elected as leader of my party and your Prime Minister in part to fix them." He added: "This will mean difficult decisions to come." Sunak promised that he will be as caring as he was as Chancellor of the Exchequer during the Covid pandemic, saying: "I will bring that same compassion to the challenges we face today." But he indicated the current generation of Britons



have to settle the country's debt, instead of leaving this for their children or grandchildren. At the end of his five and a half minute speech, he waved to the assembled journalists and camera crews before entering the historic door and building.

Earlier, British monarch King Charles III granted Sunak an audience at Buckingham Palace and formally

invited him to constitute a government. Sunak is the youngest Prime Minister of Britain in 200 years. He has risen to this position after only seven years in politics. He was previously an investment banker and hedge fund manager.

He is of Indian origin by virtue of his grandparents hailing from pre-partition India, though his parents were brought up in East Africa. He

NEWDELHI: "We are proud of him and wish him success," Infosys co-founder Narayana Murthy said in his first comments on the elevation of his son-in-law Rishi Sunak as Britain's prime minister.

Sunak, 42, on Sunday won the race to lead the Conservative Party and is now set to become Britain's first prime minister of Indian origin. "Congratulations to Rishi. We are proud of him and we wish him success," Murthy said in first reaction emailed to PTI. "We are confident he will do his best



for the people of the United Kingdom."

Imran booted with 'ghari chor' chants

Former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan was booted with 'ghari chor' (watch stealer) chants within the vicinity of the civil courts in Lahore.

In a video circulating on social media, the PTI chairman could be seen emerging out of a gate at the Civil Courts Lahore surrounded by his party workers and security personnel when people standing there started chanting the derogatory slogan with reference to the Toshakhana controversy, Geo News reported.

In the video, a PTI supporter accompanying Khan could also be seen shoving a man for chanting slogans.

Khan has granted a cheque worth 50 million PKR to the Lahore Bar and invited the lawyers to participate in his party's upcoming long march. Aside from that, the PTI chief also announced the provision of health cards to



lawyers and also promised to upgrade a hospital for them. Khan also said that a Lawyers' Protection Bill will be passed by the Punjab Assembly.

On October 21, the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP), in a consensus verdict related to the Toshakhana reference, disqualified Khan and ruled that the PTI chairman was no more a member of the National Assembly, reports Geo News.

"Criminal proceedings will be initiated against the PTI chairman for misdeclaration," the verdict said.

The ECP stated that Khan had submitted a false affidavit and was found involved in corrupt practices under Article 63(1)(p).

Under the said article, a lawmaker is disqualified for the time being from being elected or chosen as a member of the Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) or of a provincial assembly.

Vietnam reports 260,000 dengue cases, 102 deaths this yr



HANOI: Vietnam has reported about 260,000 cases of dengue fever infections and 102 deaths so far this year, the Ministry of Health said. The number of infections and fatalities grew nearly five times from the same period in 2021, the Ministry said, adding that "major outbreaks" are likely to occur in many provinces and cities in November and December, reports Xinhua news agency. Ho Chi Minh City is still the hotspot with nearly 70,000 cases and 29 deaths. The capital Hanoi has seen more than 8,000 cases with 12 deaths. Besides dengue, Vietnam has also witnessed the complicated developments of other diseases recently.

Joe Biden thanks Indian-Americans as he hosts Diwali event at White House

NEW YORK: Hosting a Diwali reception at the White House, which was attended by more than 200 prominent Indian-Americans, US President Joe Biden thanked the community for making the festival of lights a joyous part of the American culture.

More than a billion Hindus, Jains, Sikhs, and Buddhists celebrated the festival of lights in the US, India, and around the world on October 24.

"We are honoured to host you. This is the first Diwali reception of this scale in the White House ever to be held. We have more Asian-Americans than ever before in history and we want to thank you for making the Diwali celebration a joyous part of American culture," Biden said while addressing the Indian-origin community at the East Room on Monday.

With a population of more than 4.5 million, Indian-



Americans make up 1.4% of the US population and are the largest group of South Asian-Americans.

Biden, along with First Lady Jill Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, thanked the South Asian community across America for their optimism, courage, and empathy.

"Together, South Asian Americans reflect the soul of who we are as a nation, wheth-

er helping us emerge stronger from this pandemic, building an economy that works for everyone, or serving and protecting our communities and our country," Biden said.

A record 130 Indian-Americans are in key positions of Biden administration -- the best representation from the community that makes up around 1 per cent of the American population.

Indian-origin Labour MP Nadia's tweet on Rishi Sunak sparks outrage

LONDON: Indian-origin Labour MP Nadia Whittome has deleted a tweet, which she posted earlier this week saying Rishi Sunak becoming Prime Minister "isn't a win for Asian representation".

Whittome was "instructed" to remove her tweet, a spokesman for Labour leader Sir Keir Starmer confirmed, after it drew backlash on social media, the BBC reported. "Rishi Sunak as prime minister isn't a win for Asian representation," Whittome wrote in the tweet, which now stands deleted.

"He's a multi-millionaire who, as chancellor, cut taxes on bank profits while overseeing the biggest drop in living standards since 1956. Black, white or Asian: if you work for a living, he is not on your side," she added. Sunak, the UK's first Asian Prime Minister, and his wife Akshata Murthy's combined fortune is estimated to be 730 million pounds, double the estimated 300 million-350 million



pounds wealth of King Charles III and Camilla, Queen Consort.

They own four properties spread across the world and valued at more than 15 million pounds, The Guardian reported.

Whittome's Punjabi Sikh father emigrated to the UK from Banga, Punjab at the age of 21. Her mother is an Anglo-Indian Catholic solicitor and former member of the Labour Party. In a statement to BBC, Whittome's office said: "Like Rishi Sunak, Ms Whittome is second-generation British Indian. "Ms Whittome was pointing to Rishi Sunak's record as chancellor to

demonstrate that effective political representation of British Asian communities -- and the interests of all working people -- is about far more than the ethnicity of the prime minister."

Labour Party leader Keir Starmer, meanwhile, "welcomed" the appointment of Sunak as "the first British Asian Prime Minister", describing it as a "real milestone for our country". But on being pressed by the Sky News on Wednesday to comment on the issue, he said: "The position of the Labour party is the position that I have set out. The whole Labour Party supports that, and we're very, very pleased to do that".

Whittome, a staunch critic of Sunak, had earlier tweeted: "Rishi Sunak and his wife sit on a fortune of 730,000,000 pounds. That's around twice the estimated wealth of King Charles III. Remember this whenever he talks about making 'tough decisions' that working class people will pay for."

As soon as it became clear that Rishi will become the next Prime Minister, Pakistani netizens on Twitter laid claim to the incoming British leader.

"I think Pakistan should also lay claim on Rishi Sunak because his paternal grandparents were from Gujranwala who from there migrated to Kenya and then to Britain," one user tweeted. Another said: "Wow! What a tremendous achievement. A Pakistani has now ascended to the highest office in England. Anything is possible if you believe." Some suggested that it was a moment of joy for both India and Pakistan.

"Going to bed in the US with hopes that a Punjabi from Gujranwala will be the prime minister of the UK in the morning! Both Pakistan and India should be jointly proud of this moment!"

one user said. "Since Gujranwala is in Pakistan, anyone who belonged to this city even 100 years ago is a Pakistani today," tweeted another. Gujranwala, known for its good food and culture of wrestling, is located about 1.5 hours from Lahore.

Before partition, when Rishi's grandparents used to live in Gujranwala, the city used to be a locality surrounded by at least seven gates, used as entry and exit points to it, Geo News reported. Today's Gujranwala is a congested, densely populated city surrounded by narrow streets, filled with shops of clothes, jewellery, electronics and others. Before partition, the city had a large and thriving Hindu community. When the communal riots erupted in British India (today's India and Pakistan), many Hindus, Sikhs and Muslims were forced to migrate and relocate. Many Muslim and Hindu families left today's India and Pakistan for Kenya and other countries, Geo News reported.

In Britain, Asian and rights groups have hailed the rise of Rishi as hopeful and the dawn of a new era.

Canadian city gets first turban-wearing Sikh woman councillor

TORONTO: Indo-Canadian healthcare worker Navjit Kaur Brar has become the first turban-wearing Sikh woman to be elected as Brampton City Councillor in the recent Municipal council polls.

Brar, a respiratory therapist and a mother of three, won the race for City Councillor in Wards 2 and 6, beating Jermaine Chambers, a former Conservative MP candidate for Brampton West.

Brar had 28.85 per cent of the votes cast on Monday with Chambers as nearest contender with 22.59 per cent, and Carmen Wilson coming in third at 15.41 per cent, the Brampton Guardian reported.

"I am so proud of @Navjitkaurbrar. She was a selfless and dedicated front line healthcare worker during the pandemic. She has stepped up for public service and I am confident she will be a phenomenal addition to Brampton City Council," tweeted Brampton Mayor Patrick Brown, who won a second term in recent election. As part of her campaign she knocked over 40,000 doors and spoke to over 22,500 residents in the last two months.

"Over the past 3 years, I've spoken to countless Bramptonians and the sentiment I hear is that they are all hurting, they feel unheard, they feel left behind. With the rising cost of living it's getting harder to raise and provide for your family in Brampton... As your city councillor I will fight for better services for all Bramptonians and ensure that your voices are heard," Brar had said in her campaign pitch. Brar previously ran as the Ontario NDP candidate in Brampton West, losing out to incumbent Progressive Conservative MPP Amarjot Sandhu.

Another Sikh candidate, Gurpartap Singh Toor,



knocked off his opponent Gurpreet Dhillon in Wards 9 and 10 by a scant 227 votes.

As many as 40 Punjabis were in the fray for Brampton civic elections, according to local media reports.

Out of 354,884 eligible voters in Brampton, only 87,155 of them turned up to cast ballots -- an abysmal voter turnout of approximately 24.56 per cent, according to unofficial results, The Pointer reported.

The Indo-Canadian community, along with the councillor candidates, had raised concerns over the election date overlapping with Diwali -- one of the most-awaited festivals celebrated by the large swathe of Indian diaspora present in the North American country.

"It is very problematic that the elections are taking place on the Diwali day, especially the municipal election that has always seen a low voter turnout," Gurpartap Singh Toor, who has won Wards 9 and 10, had told Omni Punjabi. Elections for municipal government are held every four years on the fourth Monday of October, which fell on October 24 this time. These polls usually elect a mayor and city council and sometimes also a school board. Around 40% of Brampton's population is South Asian, and the municipal election also fell on the religious festival of Diwali, celebrated by Hindus, Sikhs and Jains.

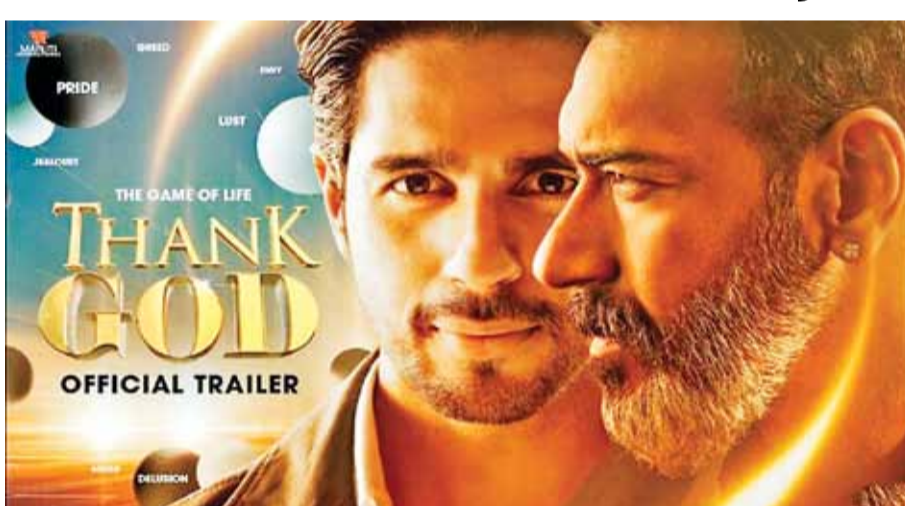

Messi stars, PSG among 4 teams advancing in Champions League

His first goal was a nonchalant, outside-of-the-foot finish. His second was pretty much his trademark fast feet outside the area and then a precise curler into the corner.

Lionel Messi kept up his stellar pre-World Cup form to help rampant Paris Saint-Germain become one of four teams to advance to the last 16 of the Champions League on Tuesday, along with Chelsea, Benfica and Borussia Dortmund.

That's more than half of the round of 16 lineup confirmed now five clubs had already gone through and PSG will be one of the teams its rivals are looking to



avoid, especially with Messi in this mood. Kylian Mbappe, too.

At opposite ends of their careers, the two superstar forwards are tasked with guiding the French champions to a first Champions League title and they both scored twice in a 7-2 thrashing of Maccabi Haifa.

Neymar, the other member of the team's high-profile at-

tacking trident, also scored in a victory that guaranteed PSG a top-two finish alongside Benfica in Group H. Both teams are on 11 points heading into the final round.

Benfica was a 4-3 winner over Juventus, which has failed to reach the knockout stage for the first time since the 2013-14 season.

With perhaps the best goal of the 33 scored in the next-to-last round of group games, Kai Havertz whipped a long-range shot in off the crossbar to earn Chelsea a 2-1 win at Salzburg and a first-place finish in Group E.
