

RESERVE BANK OF INDIA HAS LAUNCHED DIGITAL **RUPEE PILOT IN 4 CITIES**

NEW DELHI: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has launched digital Rupee pilot in 4 cities on December 1. The primary idea behind introducing digital Rupee is to eventually move away from paper cash and, in turn, lessen the cost of managing and transporting paper money. Interestingly, digital Rupee or e-Rupee isn't linked to cryptocurrency by any means and isn't based on Blockchain technology.

In simple words, digital Rupee or digital currency is just a digital form of cash/paper money. Now that also means that the value of digital Rupee and paper money are the same. For instance: 1 digital Rupee is equal to Re 1 cash. So, unlike crypto, which is a volatile market and value fluctuates as per the market, digital Rupee's value never changes and has the same denominations as paper currency and coins.

DIGITAL RUPEE OR E-RUPEE ISN'T LINKED TO CRYPTOCURRENCY BY ANY MEANS

The central bank of India has started the pilot of digital Rupee in four cities including

Mumbai, New Delhi, Bengaluru, and Bhubaneswar. For the initial testing, RBI partnered with four banks -- State Bank of India, ICICI Bank, Yes Bank, and IDFC First Bank. Once the testing process

begins, RBI will extend the partnership to four more banks including -- Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, HDFC Bank and Kotak Mahindra newly launched digital Rupee

Bank. The service will also be expanded to more cities in the days to come. Cities that will get access to digital Rupee in the second phase include -- Ahmedabad, Gangtok, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Indore, Kochi, Lucknow, Patna, and Shimla.

Digital Rupee and cryptocurrency are two different things and are in no way linked to one another. While crypto is based on blockchain, that's not the case with digital Rupee. The

it is to eliminate cash money from the market eventually. Another aspect where crypto and digital Rupee do not match is the value factor. Cryptocurrency is a risk-driven market and its value changes depending on the market conditions. That's not the case with digital Rupee. Its value remains the same throughout, just like cash money. Digital Rupee is a "digital"

Ludhiana court blast case: NIA arrests Harpreet Singh



NEW DELHI: In a latest development in connection with the Ludhiana court blast case, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested most wanted Harpreet Singh alias Happy Malaysia, from Indira Ganrival from Malaysia.

Earlier, the NIA had announced a reward of Rs 10 lakh for providing information about Singh. A non bailable warrant (NBW) was also issued against him by a Special NIA court and a look out circular was also opened.

The case pertains to the massive bomb blast that took place in the Ludhiana Court Building in 2021. One person died and six persons were injured in the explosion.

The case was initially reg istered at Police Station Division-5, District Ludhiana Commissionerate of Punjab and later on the probe of the matter was taken ovet by the NIA. "Investigations revealed that

Satinderjit Singh, alias Goldy Brar, a native of Sri Muktsar Sahib and having gone to Canada on a student visa in 2017, is an active member of Lawrence Bishnoi gang.

The killing of Moosewala was executed by six sharpshooters and four of them were arrested and two shot dead in a police encounter.

Controversial Akali leader Sucha Singh Langah again in Sikh fold

Akali leader and former cabinet Minister Sucha Singh Langah, who was excommunicated by Akal Takht the highest Sikh temporal seat around five years back, today was cleared for reinstatement in the Sikh Fold.

On October 5, 2017, after his video of immoral transgression went viral, Langah was excommunicated from the Sikh fold.

Akal Takht while clearing his way for reinstatement, today imposing Tankash (religious punishment) told him that he cannot become a member of any Gurdwara Committee or SGPC for the period of five years.

However, Jathedar Akal Takht Harpreet Singh has also slapped Tankah (religious punishment) and asked him to



perform Sewa selfless service in the community kitchen of the Golden Temple for twenty one days including cleaning of used utensils of pilgrims and to listen religious hymens here.

Earlier today, when he appeared with folded hands before the Five Sikh head priests led by Jatehdar Akal Takht in full public view, Langah in a loud voice through the sound system admitted his sin he had committed with a woman which was deadly against the Sikh tenants. On listening to Langah, Jatehdar asked Langh to repeat five times before the Sikh Sangat about his sin he had committed

in the past and Langah did so. Langah was a baptized Sikh as well as former Punjab PWD



UIDAI releases October Monthly Progress & Achievement Report

New Delhi

Aadhaar adoption and usage by residents continues to progress across India, indicative of how it is touching lives, and enabling ease of living for residents. In October, over 175.44 cr authentication transactions were carried out via Aadhaar.

A majority of these monthly transactions were done by using fingerprint biometric authentication, followed by demographic and OTP authentication.

So far, cumulatively almost 8426 crore authentication transactions have been completed by using the 12-digit digital ID by the end of October, indicative of how Aadhaar is increasingly playing a role in good governance and aiding welfare delivery. Whether it is 'Jeevan Pramaan', e-KYC, AEPS for last mile banking, Aadhaar enabled DBT or authentication, Aadhaar, a digital infrastructure of good governance,



has been playing a vital role in supporting the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi's vision of Digital India.

The number of face authentication transactions jumped from 4.67 lakh in September to over 37 lakh in October. Face authentication is facilitating pensioners to generate digital life certificate at home by using their mobile phones without visiting banks or common service centers, thus promoting ease of living of the senior citizens.

Similarly, in October alone, 23.56 crore e-KYC transactions were executed using Aadhaar, and the cumulative number of e-KYC transactions via Aadhaar has now gone up to 1321.49

crore by the end of October 2022. Aadhaar e-KYC service is increasingly playing a crucial role for banking and non-banking financial services by providing transparent and improved customer experience, and aiding ease of doing business.

An e-KYC transaction is executed, only after the explicit consent of the Aadhaar holder, and eliminates physical paperwork, and in-person verification requirement for KYC.

Similarly, Aadhaar Enabled Payment System (AEPS) has been an enabler of financial inclusion at the bottom of the income pyramid.

In October alone, 23.64 crore number of AEPS transactions were carried out across India, a jump of over 12.4% when compared with September. Cumulatively, 1573.48 crore of last mile banking transactions have been made possible via the use of AEPS and the network of micro-ATMs so far, by the end of October 2022.

Union Govt directs FM radio channels not to play songs glorifying drugs

NEWDELHI: The Union Information and Broadcasting Ministry has issued an advisory cautioning FM radio channels against playing songs which glorifies drugs and gun culture.

The ministry has said that strict action will be taken against those who violate the advisory.

The ministry has learnt that some FM radio channels are playing songs which glorify liquor, drugs, weapons, gangsters and gun culture.

Broadcast of such songs or content is in violation of the All India Radio Programme Code and the Central government has the right to impose restrictions up to suspension of permission and prohibition of broadcast, the ministry has asserted.

The ministry has directed the channels to strictly follow the prescribed terms and conditions and do not broadcast any



content promoting anti-social activities including alcohol, drugs, gun culture.

According to the ministry, the High Court of Punjab and Haryana has taken judicial note that such material affects children of impressionable age. Apart from this, it gives rise to the culture of gangsters.

In the advisory, the ministry has asked the radio channels to strictly adhere to the terms and conditions prescribed in grant of permission agreement (GOPA) and migration grant of permission agreement (MGOPA) and not air any content in violation thereof.

Sexual assault case: SC refuses to entertain Tarun Tejpal plea for in-camera hearing **NEW DELHI:** The Supreme

Court on Monday declined to entertain a plea by former editor of Tehelka magazine Tarun Tejpal seeking in-camera hearing on Goa government's appeal against his acquittal in a sexual assault case.

A bench headed by Chief Justice D.Y. Chandrachud and comprising justice P.S. Narasimha told Tejpal's counsel that he cannot sav that hearing on an appeal should be held in-camera. Chief Justice Chandrachud said: "The accused has no right to demand it should be in-camera." Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, representing Tejpal, said there are privacy rights and also the reputation of his client is also involved here. He further added that Tejpal was acquitted and allegations were prima facie false, and also the judge said it

will be an online hearing. "It will be a media trial, " said Sibal, adding that the identity of the victim will also be revealed.

Senior advocate Amit Desai, also appearing for Tejpal, pressed that proceedings in the appeal should be held in-camera. However, the bench said, can somebody who is an accused assert that the trial should be in-camera when the victim does not demand so?



Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the Goa government, said the judge had revealed the name of the victim in the judgment and it is an encyclopaedia as to how the victim should behave in such situations. The top court said that let the concerned judge take a call on the conduct of the proceedings and asked Tejpal's counsel to make a submission before the concerned court. After hearing arguments, the bench refused to interfere with Bombay High Court at Goa which rejected his application for in-camera hearing of the appeal filed by the Goa government against his acquittal in a sexual assault case. Tejpal had moved the apex court challenging the high court order.



SC-govt tussle continues over Collegium system

he Centre appears determined to turn its conflict with the judiciary over judicial appointments into something unseemly. The sources of friction are two-fold. One is the daily diatribe by Law Minister Kiren Rijiju, who appears to have been given an assignment to target the Collegium system with trenchant criticism of its known, but uncorrected flaws, and top it with unwarranted remarks such as asking the Court not to send any files, if it felt it was sitting on them. The second is the Government's strategy of delaying appointments recommended by the Collegium as a counterblast to its loss of primacy in the matter. It is not difficult to bring relations between the judiciary and the executive back on track, if only the two sides are willing to address each other's concerns. The Court has a valid point when it says the uncertainty over the fate of a recommendation for appointment is resulting in eminent lawyers withdrawing their consent or declining invitations to join the Bench. There are instances of the Government ignoring even two or three reiterations, and of the absence of any communication of objections or reservations, if any, that the Government may have about particular candidates. If the current trend continues, it is not difficult to conceive of a situation in which a major verdict that may go against the Government is portrayed by the political leadership as stemming from the hostility of the judiciary and not one on merits. One way of stopping further deterioration is for the Government to clear pending recommendations. Another way is for the judiciary to begin or agree to a process of reforms in the way the Collegium functions, especially with regard to expanding the range of consultation and widen the zone of consideration so that the superior judiciary, and those it consults, are more diverse and representative of all sections.

KRISHNAN SRINIVASAN CALLS FOR LIBERALIZATION OF LAWS THAT RESTRICT FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION FOR JOURNALISTS

The woes of Indian journalism



e first week of November includes a day selected by the United Nations as the International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists. It sadly passed unobserved in India.

The comparative advantages of a liberal society are transparency and equal opportunity in society and economy, which drive innovation, productivity and scientific progress. One might speculate that in ancient times, our ancestors may have enjoyed sufficient freedom to speak and criticise, because without this, there could not have been such striking advances in philosophy, grammar, law, mathematics, astronomy and medicine which characterise our civilisational legacy.

Though the Indian Constitution is liberal, its interpretation through legislation has been anything but; harsh omnibus laws infringe and limit liberties, violate human rights and lead to degeneracy among administration and law enforcement agents. There has probably never been a more adversarial atmosphere to journalism in India than what now exists; there is disquiet not only among the media that had a creditable record of helping to enforce accountability among officeholders, but also among activists and NGOs deemed objectionable by elected authority and its partisan instruments. Some years ago, a citizen was arrested for sedition in Uttar Pradesh five years after he allegedly posted a morphed photo of the Prime Minister; a chemistry professor in West Bengal was arrested because he uploaded a caricature of the Chief Minister on a social network. Now, from Aakar Patel being refused permission to leave the country to Sanna Mattoo facing similar and repeated obstructions to receive an international award, to the closure of Amnesty and funding curbs on Oxfam in India, as Booker Prize winner Shehan Karunatilaka wrote, "Complete freedom is a luxury for South Asian writers," and that in India a publisher could be jailed for something that offends.



The Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, or UAPA, and multiple other laws can be used by governing circles and their adherents to embrace anyone in interminable coils of police FIRs, with body and soul-destroying udicial procedures, constituting a threat to free expression. As Rajeev Dhavan has written, "A central characteristic of Indian press law has been direct governmental control." Our political leaders crave positive coverage and thus establishment hostility to perceived negative reporting is a fact of life in India.

Too many fetters

The media in India enjoys no immunity. Critics of the media confuse their notions of good journalism with what is legally permissible, which creates the problem. Journalists are subject to criminal and civil laws, such as defamation, contempt of court, sacrilege, contempt of Parliament and the Official Secrets Act, which places them in considerable jeopardy. There is a need to roll back such legislation and stop its perverse implementation, which is taken to absurd extremes. The answer is to liberalise the laws that restrict freedom of expression, and especially the criminal aspects in the statute book that affect the journalist profession.

A well-known columnist in Delhi once experimented with a set of daily newspapers for their advertisement content and concluded that four of the eight he studied were totally dependent on advertisement revenue from Union or State governments or public sector, while only three had a healthy allotment of private sector advertisement. This anecdotal example reflects the media's basic vulnerability: over-dependence on income flows from the state or state-run corporates which makes them accommodative to the paymasters' concerns. And what is true for print is more so for electronic media where operating costs can be higher.

The early decades after Independence were no golden age, with overt and covert inroads into press freedom, censorship, curbs on advertising space, restrictions on newsprint, attempts to regulate salaries, and the excesses of the Emergency. But there were also stinging criticisms of the government — on Bofors, anti-Sikh riots, Commonwealth Games kickbacks, 2G scam, and the Jan Lokpal movement. Leaders were not immune from criticism. There were clashes before the bench, and thanks to a plucky press and conscientious courts, freedoms that constitute the basis of liberties

we now invoke were largely safeguarded, and democratic norms were consolidated. Today, by contrast, the government's excesses and misdemeanours are defended in convoluted ways to deflect blame on the opposition or previous administrations. The judiciary frequently appears excessively compliant, giving rise to doubts about its independence as the ultimate arbiter of the laws of the land. The ideals of earlier times, whatever their defects, are now being discredited and, under the pretext of majority mandate, safeguard institutions are being dismantled. Indian diversity is being mutated into a more unitary form, and ethno-religious polarisation is hardening. The climate of insecurity and fear is having adverse effects on the democratic spirit and the quality of public debate.

The Hathras 2020 events are an example of monstrous illegitimacy. To disallow a family a last glimpse of its daughter, threaten them with consequences if they spoke up, ban media interaction and cordon off the village borders on the unimaginable. While no perpetrators have been punished, journalist Siddique Kappan spent two years in jail just for being on site and is still imprisoned to answer assorted charges despite being ranted bail by the Supreme Court.

I cannot concur with any proposition that the media should play the role of parliamentary opposition, because the media should be free to criticise both the government and the opposition — that is the basis of a free press. I also cannot agree with the proposiion that hate speech can best be countered by more speech because we know the depths to which most electronic and social media have sunk. By assuming shrill activism, many sections of the media have enhanced the confrontational environment in our society. The media should not act as investigator, law court and court of appeal — but nor should agencies of the executive.

Pitfalls and promises involving loss and damage decisions



major takeaway from COP27 in Egypt, as far as loss and damage (L and D) is concerned, is the ecision relating to new funding arrangements focusing on L and D — those particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change.

The decision includes a transitional committee to prepare elements relating to the operationalisation of the new funding arrangements to be adopted at COP28. The decision restores the faith of countries, especially those vulnerable, in the process of multilateralism. The committee will aim to identify and expand sources of funding, which demonstrates a lack of clarity on rce of funding (adequate and p dictable) accruing to the new fund only. There is a question mark over the new L and D fund with non-compliance by developed countries as far as climate finance commitment (mobilising \$100 billion per year by 2020) is concerned. The new funding arrangements will complement the existing arrangements and include sources, funds, processes and initiatives under and outside the Convention and the Paris Agreement, which would assist in mobilising new and additional resources. This dilutes the consistent demand raised at COP27, and outside of it by the Alliance of Small Island States (AOSIS) to set up a dedicated loss and damage response fund, which would be on top of existing climate finance commitments.

The decision again recognises the mitigation-centric nature of the history of climate change negotiations to be suiting the agenda of developed countries. It says restricting the global average temperature rise to below 1.5° Celsius is essential to limiting future loss and damage.



The mitigation-centric nature of the negotiation can be traced to Article 2 of the on Climate Change (UNFCCC) 1992. Adaptation as the second pillar of the climate change regime is possible once 'stabilisation of greenhouse gas concentrations is achieved at a level that prevents dangerous human-induced interference with the climate system and allows ecosystems to adapt naturally to climate change'. L and D could gain traction after two decades of climate change negotiations at Paris 2015. Article 8(1) only makes the party recognise the importance of averting, minimising, and addressing L and D associated with the adverse effects of climate change, including extreme weather events and slow

Past, present and the future

In the entire climate change negotiations, the developed countries have consistently opposed being made liable for climate-change related adverse effects. The basis for their contribution to various funds so far is the principle of common but differentiated responsibilities and

respective capabilities (CBDR). For global environmental degradation, they only acknowledge their responsibility in view of the pressures their societies place on the environment and of the technologies and financial resources they command, according to research papers

The compensation aspect involves a serious legal hurdle of establishing causal relations between the injurer and the victim since the adverse effects of climate change occur substantially later than the greenhouse gas emissions that cause them. During the negotiation process for the UNFCCC in 1991, AOSIS, which is at the forefront for the cause of loss and damestablishment of an international insurance pool as a 'collective loss-sharing scheme to compensate the most vulnerable small island and low-lying coastal developing countries for loss and damage arising from sea level rise'. Funding was to come from assessed contributions according to a 'formula modelled on the 1963 Brussels Convention Supplementary to the Paris Convention on Third Party Liability in the Field of Nuclear Energy, with 50% based on parties' relative contributions to emissions in the year prior to a contribution year, and 50% based on parties' relative shares of gross national product in the year prior to the contribution year'.

Taxing fossil fuel firms

The realisation of the 1991 proposal would have addressed at least who pays for the L and D. But the concept of an international insurance pool requires more research and deliberation amongst major emitters in developed and developing countries. In Egypt, AOSIS, instead of insisting on an international insurance pool demanded a dedicated L and D Response Fund. It wanted funding from governments on a grant basis, which would be on top of existing climate finance commitments. The fund would also draw upon other potential sources, which include, as UN Chief Antonio Guterres advocates, a windfall tax on oil and gas companies' profits. The idea of taxing fossil fuel oil and gas companies needs more research as it indicates an alternative to the nation-state approach of climate change negotiations. The idea highlights that 'substantial emissions have come from fossil fuels sourced from non-Annex I countries such as China, India, Saudi Arabia. South Africa and Mexico, and from nations that are not large-scale emitters, such as Nigeria, Venezuela, Kuwait, Angola, Malaysia, and Libya'.

The German-backed "Global Shield Scheme against climate risks", is a part of COP27's decision. The Shield is aimed at increasing pre-arranged finance to be disbursed before or just after disasters happen. The AOSIS favours a dedicated L and D response fund which would help disburse funding from different propositions, including the Global Shield, and avoid a piecemeal approach. The other probable avenues to address L and D are litigation, but the issues of causation, attribution and standing appear to be potential obstacles, at the domestic and international levels.

Assam resisted repeated invasions for 5 centuries

s Assam is celebrating the year-long varied events on the occasion of the 400th birth anniversary of Lachit Borphukan. the great Ahom General who had inflicted the most crushing defeat on the mighty Mughals, a new book throws light on how Assam had fought relentlessly against Muslim invasions for close to five decades

While the Assam government has made it a point to take the Lachit Borphukan story across the country, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the celebration in New Delhi.

Lachit Borphukan, it may be recalled, had defeated the Mughal army in the Battle of Saraighat, one that took place on the Brah-

maputra in March 1671. Such was the defeat that it also signalled the beginning of the Mughal empire's gradual collapse.



international level' Indian history, repeated invasion of Assam for nearly five centuries, beginning with Bakhtiyar Khilji of the Slave Dynasty in 1206 A.D., have somehow not found favour with our historians.

In his book, Kashyap has given in detail how Qutb ud-Din Aibak,

soon after taking over the reins of Delhi, had dispatched Ikhtiyar al-Din Muhammad Bakhtiyar Khilji on a mission to central and eastern India.

"After conquering Bihar and Bengal in 1203 A.D., Khilji headed for Assam. But such was the counter-attack by the Kamrup (Assam) king Viswasundardeva that Bakhtiyar Khilji somehow managed to get back to Bengal after his entire army was literally wiped out on the banks of the Brahmaputra," Kashyap in his book said.

The Kamrup king's victory over

the first-ever Muslim invaders of Assam has been recorded in a rock inscription at Kanai-Borosi-bowa near Guwahati. "Since then, there were a se-

ries of invasions of Assam by different Muslim rulers of Delhi and Bengal. While the invaders were successful in a few of those attempts, Assam however had managed to resist the invasions in most cases, with the kings of Kamrup as well as a number of local chieftains fighting valiantly with traditional weapons against the better-equipped invaders."
The book describes the hero-

ism of kings and chiefs like Indra Narayan, Chakradhwaj, Nilambar, Chilarai, Indrapratap Narayan, Parikshit, Sonatan, Balinarayan, Madhusudan, Parasuram, Jadu Nayak, Susengpha, Momai-Tamuli Barbarua, Tangchu Sandikui and several others who had resisted the invaders despite the latter having better fire-power.

Further, the interest rate hike is also affecting the inventory financing. The fitting of year may have an impact on demand in the lower end of that vehicle segment, but the overall industry is expected to touch 4.1 million units, said Shashank Srivastava, Senior Executive Director, Marketing & Sales, Maruti

He said the industry is exvear with a total volume of about 3.8 million units.

Queried about the down-

prices and the rationale for hiking prices, Srivastava said the prices are still high as compared to the rates two years ago. He said the manufacturers are not able to pass on the cost increase fully and Maruti Suzuki is watching the price situation.

According to Srivastava during December, the companies log highest sales with buyers trying to avoid paying a higher sum later as the manufacturers will hike their prices at the start of the year.

The charge sheet said that the laundered money was spent on credit cards, foreign trips and renting chartered planes. The CBI has alleged that Wadhwas were using a special designed software which was generating dummy data. The software was also showing various fake entries of home loan takers.

The accused also created a virtual branch in the name of Bandra branch with a code 001 whereas in reality this branch does not exist. From this virtual branch, loans were given to shell

UK PM's plan to restrict entry of foreign students seen as setback by varsities, education companies **NEW DELHI:** UK Prime

Minister Rishi Sunak>s plan to restrict the entry of foreign students to curb increasing migration is being seen as a setback for universities and the UK economy in general by migration and education advisors.

Sunak is considering curbs on foreign students taking «low quality» degrees and bringing dependents. The UK Prime Minister>s spokesman said the idea was being considered after official figures showed net migration to the UK had climbed to a record half a million, the reports said.

The Prime Minister's plans to bring down foreign student numbers could include restricting admissions to top universities, as well as restricting visas for students dependents.

Home Secretary Suella Braverman has been quoted as saying as per media reports that foreign students have been «bringing in family members who can piggyback onto their student visa» and «propping up, frankly, substandard courses in inadequate institutions».

However, a government migration adviser warned it would bankrupt many universities. Moreover, an adviser on immigration policy has warned that some universities could go bankrupt if there is a clampdown on so-called «low-quality» degrees. Hersha Pandya, Executive Director of



Square Media, an education management company, has also aired her concerns over this new development.

Japan on Thursday began a stable supply of power for the power saving scheme in a bid to ensure a stable electricity supply throughout the winter months amid concerns over a possible power crunch. The government is ask-

ing people and businesses to make efforts to reduce their power consumption by wearing warmer clothes and turning off lights, among others, through March, reports Xinhua news agency. The government and utili-

ties are offering a point reward program to households who sign up, to incentivise the reduction of electricity

BERLIN: The annual inflation rate in Germany, Europe's largest economy, declined slightly to 10 per cent in November, according to preliminary figures published by the Federal Statistical Office (Destatis)

After rising for three months in a row, the rate peaked at 10.4 per cent in October, the highest level since the country's reunification in 1990, reports Xinhua news agency citing the Destatis

In November, food prices still increased by an above-average rate of 21 per cent year-on-year. Although energy prices eased

slightly, German consumers were still paying 38.4 perc ent more for energy products, including household energy and motor fuels, than a year ago. Since the start of the Russia-

Ukraine war, energy and food prices have increased considerably and have had a "substantial impact on the inflation rate", Destatis said on Tuesday.

To cushion the effects of the energy crisis and the record inflation levels, the German government has passed three relief packages worth 95 billion euros (\$98 billion).

Measures include a tax reduction on natural gas from 19 per cent to 7 per cent, which took effect retroactively from October. An even bigger "protective

umbrella" of up to 200 billion euros was also set up. On November 25, the government approved the draft laws for the "centrepiece" of the


