## BBC documentary screening: Several students detained at DU, CrPC Sec 144 imposed

**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi police has detained 24 students and imposed section 144 prohibiting gatherings outside the Faculty of Arts at Delhi University after scores of students gathered there to watch the controversial BBC documentary on Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (north), Sagar Singh Kalsi, said that at around 4 p.m. on Friday, some 20 persons came to the Arts Faculty gate to screen the banned BBC documentary.

"As it can cause disturbance of peace and tranquility in the area, they were asked to disperse from there. When they did not, they were peacefully detained. A total of 24 persons were detained. The situation



is normal at present," said the DCP.

The call was given by the NSUI-KSU for the screening of the BBC documentary. Students said that the documentary was to be screened at Gate No. 4 of the Arts Department at 4 and 5 p.m. Delhi University au-

thorities said that they have not given permission for the screening. Some students however watched the documentary on their laptops and mobiles.

"No mass screening or public screening will be allowed on the campus. However, if the students want to watch it on their phones, that's their discretion," said varsity sources.

The police have been deployed in large numbers at the Arts Faculty after Proctor Rajni Abbi wrote to the police on the matter, and asked them to take action.

Earlier, some Left-wing students of Ambedkar University here staged a protest on Friday afternoon after electricity supply to the institute was snapped following an announcement to screen the documentary.

Despite the power supply being cut, students still managed to watch the documentary titled, 'India: The Modi Question', on their laptops.

Friday's protest came two days after the Delhi Police on Wednesday detained 13 students of Jamia Millia Isla-

mia after the announcement to screen the documentary in the Mass Communication Department of the university.

According to Esha Pandey, Deputy Commissioner of Police (southeast), the screening was organised by a group of students despite no permission from the varsity administration.

The same day, the Delhi police had received cross complaints from both the Jawahar Nehru University Students' Union (JNUSU) and the Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) a day after high drama prevailed on the campus, with JNUSU members alleging that they were pelted with stones while watching the documentary. The classes at Jamia were also suspended on Friday.

## Students detained at Jamia not yet released by police: SFI

Thirteen students, detained for organising a screening of a controversial BBC documentary on the 2002 Godhra riots at the Jamia Millia Islamia on Wednesday, have not been released by police yet, the Students Federation of India claimed.

There was no immediate response from the Delhi Police to the claim made by the Left-backed student's body on Thursday.

The government had recently directed social media platforms to block links to the documentary titled "India: The Modi Question". The external affairs ministry has trashed the documentary as a "propaganda piece" that lacks objectivity and reflects a colonial mindset.

Scores of students were detained on Wednesday as they gathered outside the university gate to protest against the detention of four Students Federation of India (SFI) members hours before the proposed screening of the documentary.

While police released a majority of the detained students on Wednesday evening, 13 are still in detention, the SFI claimed.

The screening of "India: The Modi Question" was announced by the SFI on Wednesday. The student's outfit had said the docu-

## FISME advises MSMEs to challenge foreclosure penalty before Banking Ombudsman



**NEW DELHI:** Upping the ante against the Banks' practice of imposing foreclosure or prepayment penalties, the Federation of Indian Micro and Small & Medium Enterprises (FISME), has advised MSEs to challenge the penalty before the institution of Banking Ombudsman.

According to the Code of Bank's Commitment for Micro and Small Enterprises' which was adopted by all commercial banks in 2012, Banks had committed that they would 'permit prepayment of fixed rate loans up to Rs. 50 lakh without levying any pre-payment penalty and also 'permit prepayment of floating rate loans without levying any pre-payment penalty'.

"Banks, primarily private sector Banks continue to flout their own commitment given in Code and slap foreclosure penalties on hapless micro and small enterprises ranging from 2-4 per cent on sanctioned loan", says Neeraj Kedia, Chairman of Banking & Finance Committee of FISME.

These penalties are evoked if a small enterprise decides to move on to another bank for better financial terms. Banks also withhold papers of securities of such customers.

"It is disappointing that these Banks have tried to discredit the Code itself, stating that the Board which led to the formulation of the Code was under dissolution and hence the Code was infructuous. However, continued lobbying by FISME has finally led RBI to clear the air by amending the Master Circular which now upholds the Code", adds Kedia.

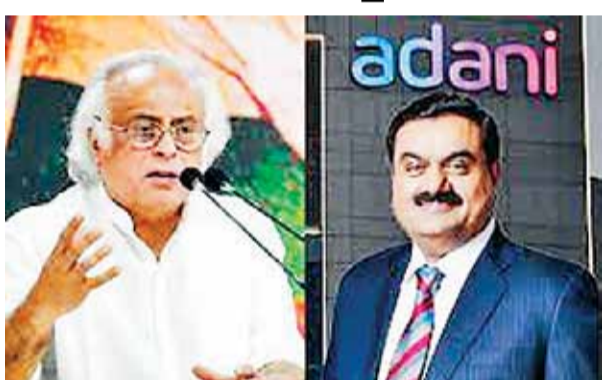
## Rahul Gandhi pays floral tribute to martyrs of Pulwama terror attack



**NEW DELHI:** Congress on Friday demanded an investigation by Sebi on the Hidenburg report on Adani group. Party General Secretary Jairam Ramesh said, "The allegations require serious investigation by those who are responsible for the stability and security of the Indian financial system, viz. the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)."

He said the high exposure of financial institutions such as the Life Insurance Company of India (LIC) and the State Bank of India (SBI) to the Adani Group has implications for financial stability and for the crores of Indians whose savings are stewarded by these pillars of the financial system. It is worth noting that earlier reports had described the Adani Group as "deeply over leveraged".

## Hidenburg report on Adani group: Congress demands probe by SEBI



The allegations of financial malfeasance would be bad enough, but what is worse is that the Modi government may have exposed India's financial system to systemic risks through the liberal investments in the Adani Group made by strategic state entities like LIC, SBI and other public sector banks, he alleged.

"These institutions have liberally financed the Adani

Group even as their private sector counterparts have chosen to avoid investing because of concerns over corporate governance and indebtedness. As much as 8 per cent of LIC's equity assets under management, amounting to a gigantic sum of a, 74, 000 crore, are in Adani companies and comprise its second-largest holding.

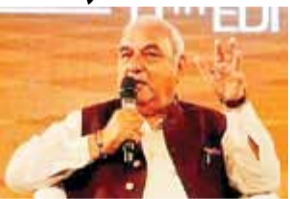
State-owned banks have

lent twice as much to the Adani group as private banks, with 40 per cent of their lending being done by SBI," he said.

He said it has exposed the crores of Indians who have poured their savings into LIC and SBI to financial risk. If, as alleged, the Adani Group has artificially inflated the value of its stock through manipulation, and then raised funds by pledging those shares, banks such as SBI could face heavy losses in the event of a fall in those share prices.

"Indians are increasingly aware of how the rise of Modi's cronies has exacerbated the problem of inequality, but need to understand how this has been financed by their own hard-earned savings. Will the RBI ensure that risks to financial stability are investigated and contained? Are these not clear-cut cases of 'phone banking'?" he said.

## Bhupinder Hooda seeks compensation for mustard farmers in Haryana



**JAMMU:** Rahul Gandhi while reacting to the BBC documentary on Gujarat riots said that truth always comes out and it cannot be suppressed by using the ED and CBI.

"The truth always comes out and banning of the press and using institutions like ED and CBI against people can't suppress the truth from coming out," he said.

The Union Ministry of Information and Broadcasting has issued directions for blocking multiple YouTube videos which published the first episode of the BBC Documentary "India: The Modi Question".

As per informed sources, orders were also issued to Twitter for blocking of over 50 tweets containing the links of the concerned YouTube videos.

## Truth always comes out: Rahul Gandhi on BBC documentary

Former Haryana Chief Minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda on Saturday demanded compensation for mustard farmers as 70-90 per cent of the crop has been damaged due to frost.

He said the BJP-JJP government neither carried out the 'gidawari' nor announced compensation. He demanded the government should come forward to help the farmers without delay.

Hooda said the farmers are protesting at many places demanding compensation for the Kharif crop of 2020. "For the last several seasons, farmers have either been given a nominal amount of compensation or they do not get any compensation at all. In this way, the government and insurance companies have duped the farmers of hundreds of crores."

"Even after paying premium to the insurance companies every season, the hands of the farmers remain empty. While insurance companies have earned huge profits of more than Rs 40, 000 crore from Haryana. Under the protection of the government, insurance companies are minting money while farmers wait for support," the Leader of Opposition said.

## An Accused Ashish Mishra released from jail



**LAKHIMPUR KHERI :** Ashish Mishra, son of Union Minister Ajay Mishra Teni and an accused in the Tikunia murder case, was released from jail on Friday evening after the Supreme Court granted him an interim bail of eight weeks.

Mishra was taken out of the jail from the rear gate to avoid the media which had gathered at the main gate and taken to his residence.

Family members refused to disclose where he would relocate to after one week as per Supreme Court directives.

The Supreme Court has directed Mishra to leave Uttar Pradesh within one week after his release from jail.

"Petitioner to give his passport to the trial court, and will not enter the state of Uttar Pradesh, apart from his appearance for trial proceedings, the court had ordered.

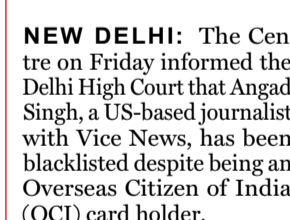
The court also said that the petitioner has to mark his attendance at the police station of jurisdiction where he relocates to.

The court also warned Mishra and his family members against influencing witnesses, violation of which would lead to the cancellation of his bail. "If it is found that Mishra is trying to delay the trial, it will be a valid ground to cancel his bail," the court said in its order.

The case will now be taken up on March 14 again for further directions on the matter.

## Journalist Angad Singh blacklisted, Centre tells Delhi High Court



**NEW DELHI:** The Centre on Friday informed the Delhi High Court that Angad Singh, a US-based journalist with Vice News, has been blacklisted despite being an Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card holder.

On December 7, 2022, a bench of Justice Prathiba M. Singh had directed the Central government to file a response in a suit filed by Singh against his deportation from Delhi to New York in August last year. He has also challenged the refusal to grant him a Special Permit.

Appearing for the Centre, advocate Anurag Ahluwalia told the court that as Singh has violated Section 11A of the Foreigners Order, 1948, which prohibits a foreigner from producing any picture, film or documentary without permission in writing from the Centre, he is a blacklisted subject. He had allegedly depicted India in a negative manner in the "India Burning" documentary. Singh has covered important issues in his documentaries, including the Shaheen Bagh protests, the farmers' protests and the Covid-19 pandemic in India, among others.

Ahluwalia submitted that Singh was entering India on his journalist visa for a personal visit but he wasn't issued a visa for that.

The FRRO, in an affidavit, told the court that Singh was blacklisted at the instance of the Consulate General of India in New York.

On January 7, Ahluwalia

had said that the affidavit will explain why the petitioner was denied entry into the country. Advocate Swathi Sukumar, representing Singh before the court said that Singh's OCI card is still valid and has not yet been cancelled. To this, Ahluwalia sought time to obtain instructions and file a response on whether any show cause notice or proceedings were started against Singh for the cancellation of his OCI card.

The court then granted two weeks' time to Ahluwalia to file the affidavit.

In his plea, Singh has mentioned that his fundamental right under the Citizenship Act, 1955, is being violated by not letting him into India.

He has also asked the court to restrain the government from violating his rights.

Earlier, Singh's counsel had sought a declaration that his deportation from the government was illegal and disclosure of all the materials and data available with the government related to him.

His mother, through a Facebook post, had claimed that he had come to India to meet his family in Punjab and it was because of his journalism that he was deported.

## Congress to launch 'Haath Se Haath Jodo Abhiyan' campaign in Haryana

After Rahul Gandhi's 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' to be concluded at Srinagar in Jammu-Kashmir on January 31, 2023, Congress in Haryana is going to launch another campaign 'Haath Se Haath Jodo Abhiyan' in every village, block and district in the state led by senior party leaders in their area for a period of sixty days, probably in order to strengthen Congress network in Haryana state and prepare for coming 2024 polls, it was declared by HPCC president Choudhary Udai bhan when Congress will also release a charge sheet against ruling BJP-JJP government in the country.



Information reveals, among those senior Congress leaders in Haryana state attending closing ceremony of 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' at Srinagar on January 31, 2023 include the names of former Chief Minister also leader of opposition in Haryana Vidhan Sabha Bhupinder Singh Hooda, Congress General Secretary Randeep Singh Surjewala, Deepender Hooda MP, HPCC President Choudhary Udai bhan and former HPCC president Kumari Shelja. However, few MLAs in Haryana from Shelja's lobby are also joining closing ceremony of 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' at Srinagar.

In order to give final shape to proposed 'Haath Se Haath Jodo Abhiyan' in Haryana state, earlier scheduled to commence from January 26, 2023 was delayed since most of the senior Congress leaders in the state are attending closing ceremony of 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' on January 31, 2023 at Srinagar as such proposed 'Haath Se Haath Jodo Abhiyan' campaign will now commence in the state with effect from February 1, 2023. It cannot be denied that rift between the groups of senior Congress leaders in Haryana state is going on since past couple of years, rather increasing, al-

though during a conference held at Ambala when 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' arrived all party leaders had assured Rahul Gandhi to join hands and strengthen party network in the state assuring congress victory in coming 2024 polls but it doesn't look so.

# MCD House adjourned again without electing mayor, deputy mayor; AAP stages dharna

The Municipal Corporation of Delhi could not elect a mayor as its proceedings were adjourned on Tuesday, a second instance of the new House convening for mayoral poll but not being able to complete the process, prompting a protest by Aam Aadmi Party councillors and MLAs.

There was an unusual security arrangement for the House proceeding with personnel deployed on the Civic Centre premises, and in the House as well. However, there was a heated discussion between BJP and AAP members following which presiding officer Satya Sharma, a BJP councillor, adjourned the House without holding the poll. AAP council-



ors, their 13 MLAs and three MPs sat in the House and demanded BJP councillors come back so that the mayoral polls could be conducted.

"We will not leave the House until the BJP councillors come back and polls are held. We will sit here until the elections are conducted," said AAP Leader Durgesh Pathak.

(AAP MLA) Atishi about the incident. She hid him behind her. They were laughing and shoving. It is very shameful of them," Rekha told PTI.

This is the second time in the 15 days a ruckus led to the adjournment of the house and the mayor could not be elected.

The proceeding went largely smoothly till the councillors and nominated members were administered the oath. After the oath, the House was adjourned for 15 minutes during which several BJP councillors left their seats and raised slogans. They went towards the benches where AAP councillors were sitting and raised slogans. A few councillors from both parties then entered into a heated exchange on one of the aisles of the House. This prompted Presiding Officer

Satya Sharma to adjourn the House till further date.

"A House cannot run like this. This House is adjourned till next date," Satya Sharma, a BJP councillor, said. Enraged by the move, the AAP accused the saffron party of adjourning the House because it does not have the number for mayoral polls. "The BJP doesn't have numbers that's why he has adjourned the House. All our councillors are sitting here. If you have guts then come and get voting done. Respect the mandate of the people of Delhi," Pathak said.

A senior official said the security this time around was enhanced from the first municipal house with a large number of civil defence personnel, including women members, and marshals deployed.

# Uproar in House, mayoral poll postponed sine die; Sisodia calls for poll today itself

The high stakes battle for Delhi's main municipal body, now hinging on the election of a mayor, was postponed after the house was adjourned sine die following the ruckus for the second time in week after a fresh clash between the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) councillors.

The house was adjourned after Presiding officer Satya Sharma said the proceedings cannot be conducted amid sloganeering from both AAP and BJP councillors.

"We were sitting in the House to vote since 11 am and when finally the time came, a ruckus began in the House. This is wrong, democratic principles must be followed," Union Minister Meenakashi Lekhi said.

Nonetheless, "We want the election of the Mayor of the MCD to be held today itself. The AAP councillors did not create any ruckus in the House. The BJP created ruckus with its own councillors and postponed the mayoral election again," Manish Sisodia said.

Proceedings of the House began today nearly three weeks after the process to elect the new mayor was aborted on January 6 following acrimonious scenes between the AAP and the BJP.

Visuals from the House earlier today showed heavy deployment of security personnel, including in the well of the House. The oath-taking ceremony began at the Civic Centre here with Presiding

officer Satya Sharma of the BJP administering oath first to aldermen, the members nominated by the Lt Governor before administering oath to the elected councillors.

All 250 councillors and 10 nominated members completed the oath-taking process

before a break was announced. After the break, there was a commotion between AAP and BJP councillors. Earlier visuals showed heavy presence of marshals inside the House. Sharing a video, AAP spokesperson Saurabh Bharadwaj said: "Today BJP has brought force with sticks to take possession of Municipal Corporation. Have you seen this in any House?"

The maiden meeting of the newly elected 250-member MCD (Municipal Corporation of Delhi) House on January 6 was adjourned without electing the mayor and the deputy mayor amid loud protests by AAP councillors over the presiding officer's decision to administer oath to the 10 aldermen first. The MCD polls were held on December 4 and the counting of votes took place on December 7. The AAP scored a landslide victory in the polls, bagging 134 wards and ending the BJP's 15-year rule in the civic body. The BJP won 104 wards to finish second while the Congress won nine seats.

## VHP warns against religion conversion and growing 'Love Jihad' activities

Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) after two days session held at religious town Kurukshetra while addressing media persons warned stern action against fast increasing cases of 'Love Jihad' and forcible religion conversion in the country. Dr Surinder Jain VHP Joint National Secretary disclosed that in the past couple of years, more than 420 alleged cases of 'Love Jihad' have been reported to Vishva Hindu Parishad, said Dr Surendra Jain that VHP have launched a nationwide public awareness under 'Dharma Raksha Abhiyan'

against such religious conversion in the country and the growing activities of 'Love Jihad' which is most heinous and inhuman forms of 'Jihad' and will not be tolerated in future.

While talking to media persons it was disclosed that VHP is going to set up VHP units in about 6000 villages across Haryana state and has decided to curb increasing cases of illegal cow slaughtering in the state as well as warned stern action against those making propaganda against 'Sanatan Dharam'. Dr Jain said that there is an immediate need for a strong central law to prevent love jihad and illegal conversions, which create



social discontent and threats to national security also. He said, love-jihad is the most gruesome form of religious conversion, behind this is the inspiration of 'Mullah-Maulvi' and a handful of fundamentalist Muslim leaders for their self vested interest, 'Tukde Tukde' gang, 'Tool Kit' gang and warned leaders like Obsesy to hold their tongue.

Information reveals that terrorist organizations like PFI and ISI spending huge amount of money to encourage Jihadis for which they earning huge amount of money from abroad towards human trafficking in the country. Dr Jain quoted the Churches of Kerala and Karnataka where nearly 10,000 Christian girls became victims of love jihad and nearly 2000 teenage females found missing from Hyderabad, even the states like Himachal and Ladakh are facing incidents of love jihad. A church in Kerala has also alleged that their girls are being kidnapped and being sent to Syria, Afghanistan and other Muslim countries.

## 48 corrupt, non-performer employees expelled from jobs by Haryana govt

As many as 48 officers, employees working in government offices in Haryana state have been either expelled from jobs by Manohar government in the state in past eight years. Such officers, employees were either found involved in corrupt practices or failed to perform desired services. Talking to media persons Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar said that ruling government in the state will take similar action against corrupt and non-performers in future also and asked to take pre-retirement from the services in case between age 50-55 or already served for a period of minimum for 20 years. He said, there are nearly 2000 corrupt or non-performer employees in the state including officers in the hit list of state government either to be expelled from the services or asked to take premature retirement since to here



is no place for them in the state government's zero tolerance policy against corruption and transparency in working. According to information, Haryana State Government, too, following the footsteps of the Central Government terminated officers or employees of the age group between 50 to 55 years in last eight years and has decided to adopt similar policy in the state and taking action against officers as well as junior employees involved in corruption, negligent in duty and in incorrect practices in their working, may either be expelled from the job or asked to take premature retirement. Among those 48 employees expelled from jobs

were working in the offices of Haryana Government's various departments, boards, and corporations. Chief Minister said, the government keeps evaluating the performance of officers and employees from time to time after reviewing their service records and the state government will be more vigilant in this regard in future to evaluate the performance of each employee including officers.

Khattar said, present government in the state aims to make the governance system transparent and completely corruption free working on the basic principle of minimum government and maximum government and corrupt people have no place in present system, moreover according to the government rules the services of officers or employees unfit to work properly can be terminated or retired at the age between 50-55 years or after 20 years of service.

## 13 sugar mills in Haryana closed down due to farmers protest

Thousands of labourers involved in crushing sugarcane in sugar mills have become idle in as many as 13 sugar mills in Haryana state, except sugar mill at Palwal since an indefinite strike called by the farmers demanding a hike in the sugar cane price by the government. According to the farmers they will not allow the crushing operations at sugar mills until the Haryana government increases the SAP to Rs 450 per quintal from the existing price Rs 362. According to information, as a result of farmers strike crushing worth three lakh quintal sugarcane every day in sugar mills in the state has stopped, besides there is possibility of sugarcane get dried in the absence of crushing.

There are 14 sugar mills in the state which include three private owned mills, 10 cooperative mills controlled by the government and one sugar mill run by HAFED of these 13 sugar mills are lying closed due to farmers strike since after January 19, 2023 causing heavy financial loss to these mills. According to the Haryana Sugarfed, per day crushing capacity of cooperative



sugar mills is 2.54 lakh quintals, besides the crushing capacity of private mills around 1.70 lakh quintals as such large number of migrant labourers from U.P and Bihar working in these sugar mills, loading-unloading sugarcane and working in agriculture fields are now sitting jobless and many of them has started shifting to their native towns in search of work. According to information more than 40000 labourers have become jobless due to farmers strike.

According to a spokesperson of agriculture department, farmers are getting Rs 362 per quintal sugarcane and demand increase in the prices but it is difficult to increase the price of sugarcane since most of the sugar mills in the state are running on loss and to run these mills government is paying

subsidy amounting up to Rs 500 crore every year to such sugar mills. However, there is a proposal to install plants in the sugar mills to manufacture Ethanol and other sugar products in these sugar mills to compensate losses in sugar production.

Meanwhile, State Agriculture Minister J.P. Dalal has made an appeal to farmers associations that forcing sugar mills to close down their shutters will not solve the problem since between 40 to 45% production of sugarcane yet lying for crushing. Dalal told that in order to improve the condition of sugar mills in the state a high level committee has been constituted which include Harvinder Kalyan MLA, Ghanshyam Dass Arora MLA and Dr Sumita Misra Agriculture Secretary in the state.

## Several leaders of Haryana's ruling BJP-JJP join Congress

## 2 highly sensitive cases of sex exploitation alleged in a week in Haryana

Two sex exploitation allegations by the females including by a athlete and another by students of Kalpana Chawla Government Medical College Karnal have been reported to media in Haryana state within a week, in which the victims have demanded immediate action against alleged accused at the time when large number of wrestlers were protesting against sexual harassment by heads of sports federations at Jantar Mantar New Delhi demanding justice.

Recently in a press conference at Chandigarh, a former international level player in weight lifting Kavita Dalal told media persons that she had left the career in weight lifting in year 2008 when faced severe mental harassment by then president of weight lifting federation, since she refused to dance at his tune and she was compelled to jump into the 'Akhada' to start fresh career in world wrestling entertainment. When asked why she remained silent for such career in sports and her dreams would have remained unfulfilled.

Expressing surprise over the attitude of organizers of sports federations a long period of 14 years, she told that in case she would had raised voice against such black sheep her parents would have not



allowed her to adopt

Kavita said that when they do not spare national, international level athletes what to speak of exploitation by these people towards fresh players willing to join career in sports. Kavita expressed surprise over the appointment of political people in sports federations who are unaware of even ABC of sports. They are often seen exploiting young sports persons and start harassing female players refuse dance at their tunes. Kavita said, there are incidents when young players were drugged, trapped in Dope Test and thrown out of sports field when they opened their mouth against such elements.

In another recent case reported at Kalpana Chawla Government Medical College at Karnal where a protest is going on by the female students of B.Sc Operation Theatre Technician 2022-23 batch at present blaming sexually

exploited by OT Master also allegedly involved in passing vulgar remarks on female students, mentally exploiting them, blackmailing and luring students to get them job at PGI Chandigarh in case they respond him and in-spite of complaints to college management no action was against him as such parents of large number of students has stopped sending their wards to attend college.

When matter was taken up with Seema Trikha chairperson of 9-members committee investigating the case, she listened to the grievances by complainant students in a close room and assured them justice. Sources reveal, the role of senior officers of college management also seems to be doubtful who did not bothered to resolve this highly sensitive issue. Surprisingly, media persons were allowed to see students or have comments of college management in this regard.

# Despite plenty of ammo against govt, divided Oppn may fritter away Budget session

The first test of opposition unity will be on Monday when the Bharat Jodo Yatra will conclude in Srinagar, where the Congress has invited at least 24 political parties to join the hoisting of the national flag. So far many of them have either skipped the yatra altogether, or distanced themselves from it.

The second test will be in the budget session of Parliament. Will the Congress be able to lead the charge of the Opposition, which has so much ammunition to fire at the government, or will they collectively flounder as a result of the disunity within them. The Congress has made a long list of issues to corner the government with -- from the Chinese presence on the LAC to inflation, rising national debt and unemployment, and the damaging Hidenburg report --

but on many of these issues, the other political parties are silent.

The JD(U) has sent a letter to the Congress's Mallikarjun Kharge that they are unable to attend as there is no clarity on the SP, BSP as SP leader Akhilesh Yadav chose to skip the BJJ and join the BRS rally of the Telangana Chief Minister recently.

However leaders of the Kashmir based parties have walked with Rahul Gandhi and some have shown solidarity. The Congress wants to demonstrate the strength of the opposition in Srinagar and subsequently in the Parliament as without a united opposition the Congress can't corner the BJP in both the Houses due to the lesser numbers. Also, the government has played it smart by giving the late SP leader and Akhilesh's father Mulayam Singh Yadav



the Padma Vibhushan.

However the Congress is undeterred and is attacking the government with renewed energy after the successful Bharat Jodo Yatra which has put its leader Rahul Gandhi first among the opposition. On the Hidenburg report, the Congress

will press it in Parliament as the party alleged that there is public money involved in it. Party General Secretary Jairam Ramesh said, "The allegations require serious investigation by those who are responsible for the stability and security of the Indian financial system, viz.

the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)."

The Congress picked up the issue of losing 26 patrol points at the LAC, and demanded a discussion on it in Parliament during the budget session.

Citing the three-day annual DGPs-IGPs conference in which a detailed security research paper was submitted for discussion, the Congress alleged that it revealed shocking facts about the rank apathy of the Modi government to China's illegal occupation of India's territory in the region. Media cell chairman Pawan Khera had said, "India lost access to 26 out of 65 Patroling Points (PP), which was not the case before May 2020, and the subsequent Galwan clash where 20 Bravehearts sacrificed their lives."

## BJP only national party in India, says JP Nadda



BJP President J.P. Nadda on Monday said that his party is the only national party left in India as all others, including the Congress and several regional outfits, have become "family parties".

Addressing the BJP Rajasthan State Working Committee meeting here, he attacked the Congress over its Bharat Jodo Yatra, alleging that those who raised slogans against India are walking in it. Nadda also said that in 2023, the BJP will form a government in Rajasthan with a three-fourth majority under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Congratulating the state leadership and their entire team for the successful organisation of Jan Aakrosh Yatra and Jan Aakrosh meetings, he said: "We have to maintain this mission and continuity of such campaigns."

Nadda claimed that the condition of Rajasthan is the worst under the Ashok Gehlot-led Congress government under which the graph of crime against women, and Dalits and cyber crime is rising rapidly, while the continuous increase in the prices of electricity, petrol and diesel left the common man of the state troubled.

He said that the BJP was "not just a political organisation but also a party working for social concerns with human

aspect and the whole of India and the whole world saw the social face of the party during the Corona period as it served food, ration, water etc. to the needy across the country".

"Along with politics, the social side of the BJP also came in front of the whole world through service. Our party is a party with ideas, we work with politics with mission, politics with ideology, service to the country, party and ideology are paramount for us.

"There is democracy in our party and we work for the strength of the cadre in a democratic way, BJP is the only national party, all other parties have become family parties, Congress is completely finished, and regional parties have also become family parties," he claimed. Attacking the Congress over its Bharat Jodo Yatra, Nadda alleged: "Congress doesn't know whom they are uniting, or breaking, in the entire journey of Rahul Gandhi. ## Tripura: CPI-M MLA, Trinamool leader join BJP

Ali and Bhowmik joined the BJP at the party headquarters in Delhi in presence of Tripura Chief Minister Manik Saha, state party president Rajib Bhattacharjee, and the party's spokesperson and northeastern states' in-charge Sambit Patra. BJP sources also said that senior Congress leader Billal Mia and some other leaders are also likely to join the saffron party. Mia, however, denied the possibility of joining the BJP. Ali was elected to the Tripura Assembly from Kailasahar constituency in northern Tripura in 2018, while Mia won the Boxanagar seat in western Tripura twice, in 1988 and 1998. Both Ali and Mia are senior leaders of their respective parties. The Trinamool Congress removed Subal Bhowmik from the post of Tripura unit state president on August 24 last year, but he was in the party. Bhowmik, a former Congress MLA, joined the Trinamool Congress in July 2021. He had jumped ship from the BJP to the Congress in 2019. "The party is in talks with a few other CPI-M and Congress leaders to join the party," a Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader said.

He said that this hybrid 6-winged drone, worth Rs 10 lakhs, is assembled with parts manufactured in USA and China, and was equipped with hi-tech features includ-

ing long-lasting battery backup and infrared-based night vision camera and GPS system.

DGP said that after noticing the drone movement in Indo-Pak border on the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday, Po-

lice teams from Amritsar Rural district immediately shared the pin-pointed inputs with the BSF and jointly conducted an intensive search operation in the area of Village Kakkar, which is just 2kms away from the Indo-Pak border. He said that the Police teams had fired at least 12 burst-fires from AK-47 to shoot-down the drone. Sharing more details, Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Amritsar Rural Swapn Sharma said that the Police have rounded-up two persons from the spot when they were trying to escape. Investigations are on to ascertain the identity of the Pak smugglers, who sent the consignment via drone, and also their Indian associates, who were to receive this air-dropped consignment of heroin, he added.

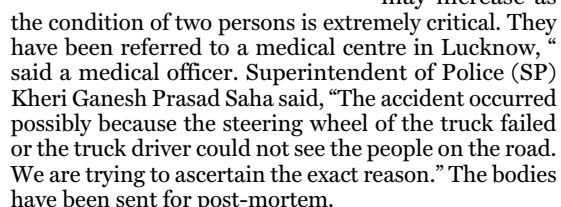
While elections in Tripura will be held on February 16, Meghalaya and Nagaland will go to polls on February 27. The results of all three will be declared on March 2.

## Five killed as truck ploughs into crowd in UP's Lakhimpur Kheri

Five persons were killed while several were reportedly injured after a speeding truck lost its balance and rammed into a group of people who had gathered on road here to rescue a biker, who was hit by a speeding car.

The incident took place late on Saturday night near Pangi Khurd village under the jurisdiction of Lakhimpur Sadar Kotwali police circle. Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has expressed condolences at the loss of

lives and instructed District Magistrate Mahendra Bahadur Singh to ensure best possible treatment of the survivors. "The death toll may increase as the condition of two persons is extremely critical. They have been referred to a medical centre in Lucknow," said a medical officer. Superintendent of Police (SP) Kheri Ganesh Prasad Saha said, "The accident occurred possibly because the steering wheel of the truck failed or the truck driver could not see the people on the road. We are trying to ascertain the exact reason." The bodies have been sent for post-mortem.

Devnarayan, born in Malaseri in the 10th century, is believed to be an incarnation of Lord Vishnu. It is believed that in Malaseri Dungri of Asind area of Bhilwara district, Lord Devnarayan incarnated on a lotus flower.

## Cyber criminals syndicate operating from China and Dubai unearthed, had cheated 11,000

NEW DELHI: Delhi Police has unearthed an international gang of cyber crooks based in China, and Dubai, and a mastermind in Georgia, who have defrauded 11,000 people on the pretext of providing online work from home jobs in Amazon, an official said on Friday.

The gang duped people of crores of rupees on the pretext of providing online jobs. Police have so far arrested three people in separate raids conducted at Delhi, Gurugram and Fatehabad (Haryana) in this connection.

The accused have been identified as Satish Yadav, 36, Abhishek Garg, 40, and Sandeep Mahla.

Deputy Commissioner of Police, Outer North, Devesh Kumar Mahla, said the investigation done so far indicated that Chinese cyber criminals have developed a module to cheat people looking for online work from home jobs or part time jobs as Chinese loan fraud are now declining due to action by agencies and awareness among people.

"A complaint was received by Delhi Police in which a woman stated that she was cheated of Rs 1.18 lakh by some unknown scammers in the garb of providing online part-time jobs in Amazon.



In the complaint, the woman stated that it is a well drafted big scam being run by some unknown criminals posing as Amazon company. After ascertaining the facts, the police registered a case of cheating," he said.

During investigation it was revealed that the telegram ID used by the scammers was being operated from Beijing, and the WhatsApp number used to defraud the victim by convincing her to invest into a fake Amazon site was also found being operated from outside India.

The police then wrote an email to the NPCI and Kotak Mahindra bank seeking beneficiary details of the suspected transactions and it was re-

vealed that a shell firm account had been used to accumulate money from victims.

"During the examination of details received from the bank, it was found that a total of Rs 5.17 crore was credited in a single day. In further money trail, it was revealed that the whole amount was siphoned further through 7 different firms. That siphoning of money has been done to foreign accounts through crypto currency," the DCP said.

The official said the technical investigation finally led them to Satish Yadav, who disclosed the name of another accused Garg. The third accused Mahla was arrested after his account was found involved in siphoning the money through

RazorPay to a fraudster sitting abroad.

The DCP said that fake websites are created in such a way that they appear like genuine Amazon websites and one can get deceived easily. Websites are generally developed from China.

As per police, promotions are being done on social media platforms like Instagram, Facebook, YouTube with posts of handsome earnings to lure aspirants/job seekers and they get millions of paid likes and ratings and reviews through digital marketing so that victims fell prey to this fraud.

Artificial intelligence is also used to pop them up before people on their screen finding online job or work from home.

The scammers reach victims through WhatsApp automatically or in some cases, victims approach themselves. Victims are convinced with fake screenshots of WhatsApp chat with employees earning good money and well-crafted creative chats.

To keep victims in darkness, the cyber-criminals have developed a "fool-proof" procedure like genuine companies use to run their organisation, eg providing a tutor to teach them how to work for which Rs 200 is charged. Any aspirant will pay such a petty amount to get a job with ease, police said.

Victims are asked to create a work ID on the website. Wallets are designed like Amazon where users can see various options like balance, tasks, order, withdrawal, selling/flagging products, they said.

Then users are assigned with the task of selling or purchasing products for the company. Users get carried away when they see that products have been sold out and money reflects as balance in their wallet but in actual, they are tricked by the criminals who have complete control over the website, and they can make any modifications in users accounts, police warned, adding that these websites are operated from China.

## Faltering global economies hit Indian exports

Last year was bad, but December 2022 had marked the steepest fall in two years for India's goods exports, with products worth \$34.5 billion shipped out — 12.2% lower than a year ago. This was the second time in three months that shipments dropped year-on-year and top Commerce Ministry officials sought to calm nerves by citing the global headwinds that were posing challenges for Indian merchandise. These include the clouds of recession blowing through Europe and the U.S., the COVID-19 situation in China and a reversion towards protectionism in some markets. To be clear, a high base effect also played a role in exaggerating the year-on-year export dip in December. Amid the ongoing tumultuous times, a month-on-month reading of export trends is perhaps a better way to gauge the situation. For now, December's export numbers, even if lifted by the last batches of pre-holiday festive shipments reaching their destined shores, hold up well on this front vis-à-vis October and November's initial trade estimates. The other silver lining is that imports also contracted 3.5% in December, the first such instance since November 2020, although they remained flat sequentially at around \$58.2 billion. For the first nine months of 2022-23, India's goods exports are still 9.1% higher than a year ago, slightly lower than the 11.1% rise recorded till November 2022. Some agencies expect the global recession to hit demand for Indian goods far harder in the current quarter so much so that the full year could still end up with a shrinkage in exports. With China reopening, competition is expected to intensify even as demand shrinks. Some recent government moves such as fixing glitches in a duty remission scheme for exports and lifting curbs on iron ore shipments have helped, but more macro- and swifter micro-policy actions are warranted to keep the export engine chugging.

## Current Inflation figures are not rational

Current Inflation data is providing a breath of fresh air to the Indian economy as both the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and Wholesale Price Index (WPI), have dropped down to low level of 6 percent after a long time. The drop in CPI is seen for the first time since January 2022. Presently WPI is at the level of 5.85 percent as compared to 8.39 percent during the same time last year in 2021. After the release of these figures, it has become interesting to discuss if an Indian consumer has started getting some real relief from the ever-increasing inflation? Or is it just a game of numbers?

Certainly this question is very logical and its solution can be obtained only through analysis. On the face of it, it is fair to say that if there has been a decline in the figures, then surely there must have been some major financial factors behind it. Also, in this context, the changes being made in the monetary policies continuously by the Reserve Bank of India for a long time has also played a major role. It should be noted that during the current financial year, the repo rate has been increased 4 times so far to control the liquidity. However, its direct impact is to control the purchasing power of the consumer, which is in negative trend in terms of economic growth. On the other hand, it is also a fact that the economic benefit of the drop in these latest figures of the index of inflation is not directly seen in the life of the common man on a very large scale.

It is very important to clarify that in the economic life of a common man, the inflation rate data of Consumer Price Index (CPI) is more important than the WPI. Because the change in retail prices of different types of goods is measured at different levels and the National Statistics Office (NSO) publishes this. In this context, it is also very important to point out that



both Wholesale Price Index and Consumer Price Index will always complement each other, is not necessary.

In the present times, it is significant that the drop in both is recorded equally. At the global level these days, due to the change in interest policies by the American Fed, the comparatively stronger dollar has weakened the currencies of all the Countries and as a result, the fear of global economic recession is everywhere. Its effect is visible somewhere on the reduction in the inflation figures of WPI. Supporting to the facts of decline in CPI is due to the decrease in the prices of vegetables and fruits these days. The importance of food and beverages are relatively very high in the basket of 6 levels of CPI inflation. With the onset of winter season, the arrival of vegetables and fruits has suddenly very much increased. As a result there is a decrease in the prices and hence, the rate of CPI in the month of November was 5.88 percent. However, the increase in the prices of various pulses, spices and milk shows its own logic in this regard.

The Consumer Price Index definitely presents the impact of inflation in the

life of the common man in a very rational way, but it is a great irony that, in the present time for assessing the consumer's purchase pattern base year is the year 2011-12. Has there been no change in the mindset of the Indian consumer in the last 10 years? It should be noted that the National Statistics Office was to determine the criteria of various levels of the consumer's purchasing power in the year 2017-18, which has not happened yet, and for this reason even today, the rate of inflation is being calculated on the basis of 10 years old criteria which seems completely impractical and also raises a question on the thinking that how the reduction in the rate of CPI is providing relief to the common man from inflation?

Above all it is important to understand that the Consumer Price Index is a very elaborated criteria for calculating the rate of inflation. In this index, the mindset of a rural consumer and an urban consumer for the purchase of different items is seen. Apart from this, the difference in purchasing mindset of rural and urban consumers in different states of India can also be noticed and understood from this index.

At present, the inflation rate of rural areas in 16 states is higher than urban areas, which seems to be a surprising fact but it is a reality. Apart from this, the consumer price index at the national level has been recorded less than 6 percent but in some states like Telangana, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and Andhra Pradesh it is currently quite high. Currently the CPI in Telangana is currently 7.89 percent, but it did not have much negative impact on the average consumer price index of all the states of the country because Telangana's weightage in the average of all states is only 3.5 percent. The highest significance or weightage in the rate of inflation of the Consumer Price Index is in the states of Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh. It is clear from this that if there is an increase or decrease in the prices of food and beverages in urban or rural areas of Maharashtra or Uttar Pradesh, then its huge impact can be seen on the inflation rate of the country. Is it rational?

On the other hand, the Reserve Bank of India, is continuously changing the rates of interest so that the purchasing power of the consumer remains in control. At the initial level, it seems to be a necessary step, but on the basis of economic analysis, it is also essential to understand that the increase in the repo rate increases the "EMI" or monthly installment of the financial loan, whose economic burden comes on very common consumer. Therefore, it is probably not wrong for a common man to think that changes in inflation data do not affect him much. In reality it is a game of numbers.

But it certainly seems logical that both CPI and WPI dropping below 6 per cent indicates a boom in the third quarter GDP rate of Indian economy which can be seen in the time to come.

## India's policy paradigm



A report by the World Bank, released in November last year, on financing India's urban infrastructure needs, focuses on private investments ameliorating urban problems. The push to attract private capital, since the 1990s, followed by the urban reforms under the United Progressive Alliance I regime, the Smart City mission, and now this report, continues to plague India's policy paradigm in the urban sector.

So, has the reform process really been able to attract private capital to urban infrastructure? After three decades of reforms, urban finance predominantly comes from the government. Of the finances needed to fund urban capital expenditures, 48%, 24% and 15% are derived from the central, State, and city governments, respectively. Public-private partnership projects contribute 3% and commercial debt 2%.

In the last few years, various reports have estimated a huge demand for funding urban infrastructure; for example, the Isher Judge Ahluwalia report says that by 2030, nearly 39.2 lakh crore would be required. Likewise, the 11th Plan puts forth estimates of 1,29,337 crore for four basic services, Rs 1,32,590 crore for urban transport and Rs 1,32,590 crore for housing. A McKinsey

report on urbanisation has a figure of \$1.2 trillion, or Rs 90 lakh crore.

### World Bank estimates

The World Bank estimates that nearly \$840 billion (Rs 70 lakh crore) would be needed for investment in urban India to meet the growing demands of the population, and \$55 billion would be required annually. The flagship programmes of the

government, the Smart City mission, the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT), the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY), etc., are not more than Rs 2 lakh crore (that too for a period of five years). So, how will such a gap between demand and supply be matched?

The core idea of the report and the solutions suggested include "improving the fiscal base and creditworthiness of the Indian

cities. Cities must institute a buoyant revenue base and be able to recover the cost of providing its services". In simpler terms, it means increasing property taxes, user fees and service charges to name a few.

This report already points out that nearly 85% of government revenue is from the cities. This means that urban citizens are contributing large revenues even as the World Bank report's emphasis is on the levying of more burdens in the form of user charges on utilities, etc. But the point is even by enhancing the tax base, will it be sufficient to meet the rising demands of urban infrastructure in the cities?

### The answer is that it will not.

The basic problem with this report and other reports drawn up in a similar fashion is that they are made using a top to bottom approach, with too much of a focus on technocentric solutions using very high capital-intensive technologies.

For the urban context, plans must be made from below by engaging with the people and identifying their needs.

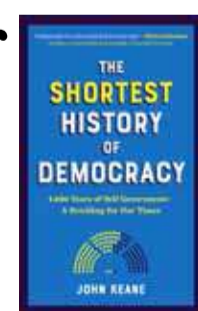

Twitter CEO said that the figure of 420 was not chosen because of a joke.

"It was chosen because there was a 20 per cent premium over the stock price," said Musk.

420, 4:20 or 4/20 (pronounced four-twenty) is cannabis culture slang for marijuana and hashish consumption.

Musk last week admitted that he ignored his advisors and investors while tweeting about Tesla securing funding in 2018.

The controversial 2018 tweets by Musk on taking

Tesla private has come back to haunt him and he stands to lose billions.

The plaintiffs have argued that Musk's tweets about taking Tesla private, in which he said he had "funding secured", led them to lose millions of dollars.

Musk in August 2018 had tweeted: "Am considering taking Tesla private at \$420. Funding secured."

## Global smartphone shipments suffer biggest fall in holiday quarter



Global smartphone shipments declined 18.3 per cent (year-over-year) to 300.3 million units in the holiday quarter of 2022, the largest-ever decline in a single quarter.

According to an IDC report, the Q4 2022 drop contributed to a steep 11.3 per cent decline for the entire year. The year 2022 ended with shipments of 1.21 billion units, which represents the lowest annual shipment total since 2013 due to significantly dampened consumer demand, inflation, and economic uncertainties.

This tough close to the year puts the 2.8 per cent recovery expected for 2023 in serious jeopardy with heavy downward risk to the forecast, the report mentioned. "We have never seen shipments in the holiday quarter come in lower than the previous quarter. However, weakened demand and high inventory caused vendors to cut back drastically on shipments," said Nabila Popal, research director with IDC.

Chinese vendors suffered massive losses for the entire year. Heavy sales and promotions during the quarter helped deplete existing inventory rather than drive shipment growth. "Vendors are increasingly cautious in their shipments and planning while realigning their focus on profitability. Even Apple, which thus far was seemingly immune, suffered a setback in its supply chain with unforeseen lockdowns at its key factories in China," said Popal.

According to Anthony Scarsella, another research director with IDC, with 2022 declining more than 11 per cent for the year, "2023 is set up to be a year of caution as vendors will rethink their portfolio of devices while channels will think twice before taking on excess inventory."

"However, on a positive note, consumers may find even more generous trade-in offers and promotions continuing well into 2023 as the market will think of new methods to drive upgrades and sell more devices, specifically high-end models," he added.

Earlier, the coal behemoth in December 2020 had got in-principle approval for venturing into aluminium and solar sectors and creation of special purpose vehicles.

## Measures likely to give some momentum to laggard deposits

With the Indian banking sector stable plank with the ghosts of non-performing assets (NPA) vanishing — at least for now — there may not be any major announcements by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman as to capital infusion in public sector banks or even their disinvestment in the upcoming Union Budget, said experts.

With the credit offtake being good while deposit mobilisation lagging behind, the Centre may announce something to increase bank deposits, they added.

"The banking sector — government and private — is stable now. We don't expect any capital infusion announcement by the Finance Minister for the public sector banks," Sanjay Agarwal, Senior Director, CARE Ratings, told to media. He also said there may not be any announcement relating to disinvestment of the public sector banks.

"The privatisation of IDBI Bank is moving ahead. The government may wait and watch post IDBI Bank privatisation relating to disinvestment in pub-



lic sector banks. The process of privatisation of government

banks has to be streamlined," Agarwal added.

According to a report by Emkay Global Financial Services, the government may name the two banks that would be privatised.

The report also said the banking sector witnessed slight moderation in credit growth to 15 per cent year-on-year (YoY) for the fortnight ended December 30, 2022 (vs 17.4 per cent the previous fortnight), mainly due to the base effect (heavy lending to oil PSUs last year), while underlying growth in absolute terms remained robust.

"Deposit growth continued

to be a laggard, at 9.2 per cent YoY, which remains a concern amid the tight liquidity situation, resulting in most banks turning aggressive in raising deposit rates in the last quarter," Emkay Global said.

"The interest on deposits has to be hiked by the banks. The budget may have some announcements on credit support or tax support for bank depositors," Agarwal said.

According to Emkay Global, the banking industry would look for growth boosters in the bud-

get like:

1. Announcement of large infra/power and defence projects with private participation, to revive capex demand;

2. Increase in bad-debt-provision deduction, under Sec 36(1) (via) from the current 7.5 per cent of adjusted total income plus 10 per cent of average aggregate advances made by rural branches, can be expected;

3. Increase in the FPI/FTI limit for public sector banks, which though looks unlikely, given there is already enough headroom.

**NEW DELHI:** The Union Budget 2023-24 is less than a week away, actually four calendar days. There are just two trading sessions left and then the budget would be presented on February 1. Yet markets seem unaware of it as there is no reaction or expectation to the expected event which has a special significance. This Budget would be the last one before the 2024 general elections. The government of the day would use it as an opportunity to meet expectations of as large a population as it could, and keep spirits of its vote bank flowing and flying.

Friday saw these levels being broken comfortably and decisively with markets closing below them. The street attributes the same to a report from Hindenburg on Adani Enterprises who are in the midst of their mega follow-on offer issue of Rs 20,000 crore. This attack by so-called Hindenburg is from the US based investment firm that specialises in activist short selling. Very clearly there is a vested agenda and the Adani group has clarified on the allegations made. The fate of the FPO, which closes on Tuesday the January 31, still remains unclear.

At present levels, the floor price of the share and market price being far away, a reduction in price seems the only alternative if the issue is to be subscribed to. This outcome may happen only on Tuesday as there is no other instance of price being reduced midway through an issue, but only at the end. In such a scenario, what does the budget have in store for the markets and the common man? Revenues have been robust with GST clocking an average of Rs 1.5 lakh crore monthly and income tax from corporates and individuals have seen significant improvements.

The PLI scheme has done wonderfully well and has seen India becoming a large mobile phone exporter. Some tweaking of the scheme, extension to new industries and sectors and maybe the time frame may help further boost Make in India. At the same time, changes to customs duty to encourage investments in PLI may also be tweaked to incentivise local production.

The markets expect some relief in STT (securities transaction tax). With trading at the markets increasing rapidly with demat accounts almost touching the 11 lakh crore mark, this number has become big. The ongoing demand of rationalising tax on long-term capital gains tax and dividend is perennial. Knowing that the salaried and middle class is clamouring for relief on the inflation front, the demand for higher basic exemption limit is reasonable. If the government obliges, it could do wonders. With nothing negative expected in the budget, markets at rock bottom on account of an unrelated crisis, anything which strikes a chord with the markets could lead to a flare-up.

With January futures having expired on Wednesday, positions in the market are light and that is a redeeming feature for the market.

With mood and sentiment currently negative, the possibility that markets get lifted post budget is a very big possibility. If I believe what three events could do so and hazard a guess, this is what I would say. Firstly focus on growth through infrastructure spend and creating the network to accelerate growth. Providing impetus to the salaried class and middle class by providing a higher basic exemption limit and proportionate benefit in higher slabs and thirdly giving the thrust to woman and child development across rural India. I believe that if the budget delivers on these broad lines we would see a post-budget rally instead of a pre-budget rally. The only negative factors working against Indian equities at present is the rich valuation and the outflow of money to Chinese markets. It had happened some time ago as well and at that time, investors burned their money as those markets did not rally.

# PhonePe envisions massive opportunity ahead across UPI, lending, insurance, ONDC



Fintech platform PhonePe on Wednesday said the company envisions massive opportunities ahead across UPI, lending, account aggregator, insurance, and ONDC. PhonePe recently raised \$350 million in funding from General Atlantic, a leading global growth equity firm, at a pre-money valuation of \$12 billion, making it a decacorn.

“General Atlantic is a really good blue chip global investor that has a long view on companies, which gives us the flexibility to be able to actually do at-scale investments in new sectors like insurance, lending, broking or ONDC,” Sameer Nigam, Co-Founder & CEO, PhonePe, said. Moreover, commenting on its relocation from Singapore to India, the company said it is here to stay for the next few decades. “I think for the mission PhonePe is on, which is solving for at-scale financial inclusion and digitisation, the move to India was right. India is where we started and where we are focused on, and I think we will

be here for the next couple of decades,” said Nigam. While moving domicile, the company faced a few challenges, to which, he said: “Our investors have paid almost Rs 8,000 crore in taxes just to allow us to come back to India. Another challenge was to convince several thousand employees that they’re ESOPs are back to zero vesting at a one-year cliff, because the law in India says if you migrate, you still have to start with a new one-year cliff.” The fintech platform also expressed its future strategy, to which it says the company wants

to fulfil the ambition of taking digital payments in India to a billion transactions a day, from close to half a billion, with NPCI, RBI and the entire Fintech ecosystem. “We want to actually help scale payments with a whole bunch of new initiatives that are coming on UPI. We will be looking at launching new products and offerings be it lending on the merchant side, lending on the consumer side, a lot of new open API initiatives like account aggregator and ONDC,” said Rahul Chari, Co-Founder & CTO, PhonePe.

## Rs 21.2 cr sent to Dubai via cryptocurrency in UP's Prayagraj



Investigations into transfer of cash to Dubai through cryptocurrency in Uttar Pradesh's Prayagraj have revealed that cash transactions worth Rs 21.29 crore have taken place, police said. The police have also come across 35 bank accounts of the accused Krishna Avtar, who has been arrested and sent to jail.

The scam had come to light on January 2, following which police launched detailed investigations.

According to police officials, Avtar transferred cash from a gaming app to one Jai, based in Dubai. Earlier, investigations revealed that Avtar converted cash worth Rs 3.75 crore into cryptocurrency and transferred it to a wallet based in Dubai within 10 days.

However, detailed scanning of his bank accounts showed that he transferred cash worth Rs 21.29 crore after converting it into cryptocurrency since he came in contact with Jai.

The police team has also come across information about his 35 bank accounts. It is scanning the transactions made into these bank accounts, according to a senior police officer aware of the finding, said the police.

## Dell acquires Cloud services startup Cloudify for '\$100 mn'

Dell Technologies has acquired Israeli startup Cloudify that is known for cloud orchestration and infrastructure automation. According to reports, Dell spent close to \$100 million in buying the startup to boost its cloud services business, specifically its offerings in DevOps.

A company spokesperson told TechCrunch that Dell Technologies “has completed the acquisition of Cloudify.” “This transaction allows Dell to continue to innovate our edge offerings,” said the spokesperson. In a US SEC filing, Dell referred to issuing of Class C common stock “in respect of certain outstanding and unvested options to acquire the ordinary shares of Cloudify Platform Ltd., an Israeli private liability company.” Cloudify is an open source,



multi-cloud orchestration platform featuring unique technology that packages infrastructure, networking, and existing automation tools into certified blueprints. Originally the startup was spun out from GigaSpaces in 2017. The startup raised less than \$8 million, according to PitchBook data. Cloudify's environment-as-a-service packages infrastructure, networking, and automation

tools into certified blueprints that it says its customers can use to manage heterogeneous cloud environments at scale, and to help bridge the gap between DevOps and IT service management (ITSM). Cloudify includes in its technology ecosystem such partners as Amazon Web Services, Google Cloud Platform, Microsoft Azure, F5, Wind River Software, and ServiceNow.

## BharatPe paid Rs 1.69 crore salary to Ashneer in FY22, Rs 63 lakh to his wife

Fintech platform BharatPe paid a salary of Rs 1.69 crore to its Co-founder and managing director Ashneer Grover in FY22, while his wife Madhuri Jain Grover who was the former head of controls at the company took home Rs 63 lakhs.

Currently, the company is involved in a legal battle with Ashneer, after suing him and his family for allegedly siphoning off company funds worth Rs 88.6 crore.

According to its financial statement filed with the Registrar of Company (RoC), its former CEO Suhail Sameer took home Rs 2.1 crore in FY22.

Rajnish Kumar, BharatPe Chairman, received Rs 21.4 lakhs, while BharatPe board member Shashvat Nakrani was paid Rs 29.8 lakhs.

However, these remunerations do not take stock payments into account as the company incurred Rs 70 crore worth stock-based payment expenses in FY22, up 218 per cent (YoY).

MoneyControl was first to report about the remunerations to top BharatPe executives.

Meanwhile, BharatPe suffered huge losses to the tune of Rs 5,610.7 crore in the financial year 2021-22, due to a one-time non-cash expense related to



change in fair value of compulsory convertible preference shares (CCPS).

In FY21, the company had posted a net loss of Rs 1,619.2 crore.

Apart from the CCPS cost, the company's adjusted loss grew 2.2 times to Rs 828.2 crore in FY22, from Rs 227.3 crore in the earlier fiscal year, according to its financial statement with the Registrar of Company (RoC).

Earlier this month, the company had clarified that the CCPS-related item is a “one-off and shall not be there from next year as we have now reclassified the compulsorily convertible preference shares from liability to equity”.

Meanwhile, its revenue from operations went up 3.8 times to Rs 456.8 crore from Rs 119 crore in FY21, owing to a surge in payments volumes on loan disbursements.

Founded in 2018, BharatPe is currently serving 1 crore merchants across more than 400 cities.

## IPA to create Centre for Maritime Economy and Connectivity in India with RIS

**NEWDELHI:** The Indian Ports Association (IPA) in collaboration with the Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS) will develop a Centre for Maritime Economy and Connectivity in India.

An agreement between the two organisations was recently signed in New Delhi.

Union Minister for ports, shipping and waterways Sarbananda Sonowal, who witnessed the signing ceremony, tweeted that the institute will pave way for seamless, cost-effective trade and commerce with neighbours.

Secretary handling the ministry Sanjeev Ranjan said the



proposed transshipment port at Galathea Bay at Greater Nicobar in Andaman and Nicobar Islands will be advantageous

for the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) member nations.

## US venture capitalists anticipate Indian budget to give impetus to startup ecosystem

For the financial year 2023-24, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is set to table the union budget before the Parliament on February 1, 2023.

The venture capitalist community here in the US is very excited given the large number of unicorns emerging out of India in



recent years, reported ET. The venture capitalists want

to capitalise on Indian talent and invest in them, as per Arun

Kumar, managing partner of Celesta Capital.

“As a US-based venture capital firm investing in India, we are keenly interested in policies and initiatives that will support the growth and development of the startup ecosystem in the country,” Kumar told PTI.

Kumar further stated that signals and allocations in the budget that further the growth of new ventures based on innovation and entrepreneurship would be particularly welcome.

## Union Budget 2023-24: Removal of 15% MAT tops Start-ups wish list

**NEW DELHI:** To promote start-ups, the industry has urged the Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman to do away with the Minimum Alternative Tax (MAT) of 15 per cent applied on start-ups.

Opening up about the expectations of start-ups from the upcoming union budget, Ashish Jain, CEO, The Start-up Board told KNN India in an exclusive interview that introduction of non-voting shares will help bring more investment into the start-ups, without founders losing control of their venture.

He suggested this because investors have started investing in the start-ups as it has started becoming a new asset class.

“They are interested in returns, instead of the controlling stake. Introduction of non-voting shares will help bring more investment into the start-up, without founders losing control of their venture.



This is quite prevalent in the USA,” he added.

Jain explained that many start-up founders incorporate their company in Singapore, Dubai or other tax havens.

“These start-ups working in India for majority of their revenue, still are not called Indian start-up due to taxation policies. In the short period of 10 years, revenue from start-up have already reached USD 74 billion (IT industry in India is USD 327 billion worth), generating employment, creating IP

from India for products for the world among other benefits,” he said.

He further suggested that make ESOPs table on sale of shares instead of taxability on allotment, as ESOPs in the start-up are difficult to be liquidated.

K Srinivas, Founder, Solar-Bull Energy LLP told media India that it has proposed the government to drop the GST on Solar Power Plants from 12 per cent to 5 per cent. “Aatmanirbhar Bharat Ro-

jgar Yojana (ABRY) scheme facilitates Start-ups and other MSME companies where the government has borne the Provident Fund for 2 years (both Employee portion & Employer portion) for all the new recruitments made up to March 31, 2023 needs to be continued for all new recruits,” he said as it will encourage MSMEs and Start-ups to recruit more employees.

Calling for separate classification in GST for “Water Purifiers”, Chandrasekaran J, Founder Director, Watsan Envirotech Private Limited has sought for a lesser GST of 5 per cent as against 18 per cent for Non-electricity-based water purifiers (gravity and UV based).

Start-up Founder of Zippytech Private Limited, Manoranjan Mishra has requested for the introduction of GST/MCA compliance holiday for 3 years or till certain revenue is generated.

# G20-Startup20 Engagement Group to launch Handbook for common terminologies

The Startup20 Engagement Group will work to harmonize the global start-up ecosystem through consensus-based definitions and promote a global community of knowledge sharing among start-up ecosystems to explore opportunities.

“Additionally, we aim to create supportive policies

for industry players and government organizations to work with startups,” Chintan asserted.

The Startup20 has three main taskforces; the Foundation and Alliances Taskforce, Finance, and Inclusion and Sustainability. The Startup20 activities will span over five events, starting with the inception event on January 28-29, 2023 in Hyderabad and the summit event on July 3, 2023 in Gurugram.

## Indian student dies after being struck by a police vehicle in US

A 23-year-old student from Andhra Pradesh died after being struck by a police patrol vehicle in Seattle, a media report said.

Jaahnavi Kandula, a student of Northeastern University campus in South Lake Union, was walking near Dexter Avenue North and Thomas Street when she was hit by a Seattle Police vehicle on Monday, The Seattle Times reported.

Police arrived at the scene just after 8 p.m. and immediately started with CPR after they found Kandula with life threatening injuries. She was later transported to Harborview Medical Center in criti-



cal condition where she succumbed to her injuries. The officer driving the patrol SUV was responding to a priority one call at the request of the Seattle Fire Department

just after 8 p.m., according to the Seattle Police Department. The police did not name the officer but said in a statement that he has been with the department since November 2019.

"At this point in the investigation, we have no reason to believe the officer intended to hit that woman," Seattle Police Department spokesperson Detective Valerie Carson told Seattle Times.

Carson further said that Kandula's death will not be investigated as a use of force case, and the officer has not been placed on leave.

"I was in shock," Ashok

Mandula, victim's uncle, told Seattle Times after he was informed of the tragedy.

He said Kandula first travelled to the United States in 2021 from Adoni in Andhra Pradesh's Kurnool district, and spent a month with his family.

Daughter of a single mother who teaches in an elementary school in Adoni, Kandula was to receive a master's in information systems this December, Mandula told Times.

He added that Kandula's mother had taken a loan for her education. Detectives from the Traffic Collision Investigation Squad will lead the investigation, Seattle Police said.

## Over 17,000 weapons surrendered under Australian gun amnesty

More than 17,000 weapons were surrendered in the first year of Australia's permanent national firearms amnesty, the government revealed on January 21.

The government released the first annual report on the amnesty program, which allows Australians to hand in unregistered, illegal or unwanted weapons without facing punishment, revealing 17,543 weapons were surrendered in the first 12 months, reports Xinhua news agency.

The permanent amnesty was set up in mid-2021 following temporary programs in the wake of the Port Arthur massacre in 1996 and again in 2017.

According to the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commis-



sion, there are approximately 260,000 illicit firearms in circulation in Australia.

Among the weapons handed in between July 2021 and June 2022 were 8,140 rifles, 2,896 shotguns and 789 pistols.

"It is an important measure to reduce the number of firearms circulating in our community, and keep Australians safe," the country's Attorney-General Mark Dreyfus said on January 21.

## US operation in Somalia kills senior IS leader



A US military operation in Somalia has killed a number of Islamic State (IS) members, including a key leader of the terror group, Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin announced.

"On January 25, on orders from the President, the US military conducted an assault operation in northern Somalia that resulted in the death of a number of IS members, including Bilal-al-Sudani, an IS leader in Somalia and a key facilitator for IS's global network," Austin was quoted as saying in a statement on Thursday.

"Al-Sudani was responsible for fostering the growing presence of IS in Africa and for funding the group's operations worldwide, including in Afghanistan.

"No civilians were harmed as a result of this operation. We are grateful to our extraordinary service members as well as our intelligence community and other inter-agency partners for their support to this successful counter-terrorism operation," the Defense Secretary added.

No US troops or civilians were killed in the operation, he said.

Wednesday's operation comes after US forces killed two top IS leaders in an airstrike in Syria late last year, CNN reported.

Al-Sudani was sanctioned by the US Treasury in 2012 for helping foreign fighters travel to a training camp of the al-Shabaab terror group and facilitating financing.

## Putin wishes Murmu, Modi on R-Day, hails India's contributions



**NEW DELHI:** Russian President Vladimir Putin on Thursday sent his wishes to his Indian counterpart Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the 74th Republic Day, hailing India's achievements in various fields.

In a statement issued by the Russian President's office, he said that India was making a significant contribution in ensuring international peace and security on the global stage. Putin was quoted as saying

in the statement that India's achievements in the economic, social, scientific, technological and other spheres are widely known. "Your country is making a substantial contribution to ensuring international stability and security and to addressing vital issues on the regional and global agenda," he said.

"We set a high value on the relations of privileged strategic partnership between our states," he said, expressing confidence that "by working together we can ensure the continued growth of mutually beneficial bilateral cooperation in all areas. This undoubtedly meets the fundamental interests of the friendly peoples of Russia and India".

## Indian drunk driver jailed for injuring pedestrian in Dubai

**DUBAI:** An 39-year-old Indian man has been sentenced to one month jail in Dubai and fined Dh10,000 after he drove over a woman's legs, leaving her seriously injured.

The Dubai Court of Appeal also found the Indian, who was driving under the influence of alcohol, guilty of fleeing the accident scene and revoked his deportation order, The National reported.

The man, driving his Nissan Patrol out of the car park of a hotel in Bur Dubai's Al Mankhool area last November, failed to see a woman sitting on the pavement with her legs stretched out into



the road. "We were in the car together when the incident happened," the man's friend told the court, The National

drove off," he said. He was later tracked down and arrested, the report said, adding that the offender admitted to the charges during a police probe and in court.

The United Arab Emirates (UAE) has a zero-tolerance policy to drunk-driving, which is a criminal offence.

"According to Article 393 of UAE's traffic law, offenders causing a road death can face between one month and three years in prison or a fine as decided by the court," Nida Al Masri, a legal consultant from Justitia Advocates and Legal Consultants, told The National.

## China claims Covid wave has past its peaked



**BEIJING:** China's health authorities have said the Covid-19 wave is past its peak, with rapid decline in both severe cases and deaths in hospitals, but experts remain wary of the governments official data, the media reported.

According to China's Center for Disease Control (CDC), the number of critically ill patients in hospital peaked in the first week of January, then rapidly declined by more than 70 per cent, says the Guardian report.

The number of deaths also reached its highest level that week, the CDC data revealed.

Prof Chi Chun-huei, director of the centre for global health at Oregon University, said local officials were incentivised, via punishments and rewards, to under-report infection figures during the zero-Covid policy.

Now that policy was gone, they were incentivised to exaggerate infection rates and under-

report deaths, the Guardian reported.

"Most international experts know this very well, China's statistics are very unreliable," he said.

Covid cases have swept across China in recent months, escalating rapidly after the government suddenly ended its zero-Covid policy in early December 2022.

Last week a senior health official said 80 per cent of people had been infected in this wave, although it was not clear where the figures came from.

According to the data, there were 128,000 critically ill Covid patients in Chinese hospitals on January 5, the highest number reached during this wave.

It described a peak inside hospitals over the western new year, with almost 10,000 new critically ill cases a day from December 27 to 3 January, the Guardian reported.

## Jamaat-e-Islami Hind condemns the burning of the Quran in Sweden

gious books and personalities deserve proper respect and cannot be subject to any denigration and acts of slander or disparagement. There should not be any discrimination and we cannot be selective in the condemnation of such acts. Such desperate acts that seek to create a rift within communities should not be condoned by any civilized society.

We feel that even those harboring malice against the Quran should read it once and try to understand its message. It is the only religious book that rises above blind faith and dogma and appeals to intellect and reason. The Quran presents a very ra-

## Bank of Canada hikes policy interest rate by 25 basis points

The Bank of Canada has increased its benchmark interest rate by 25 basis points to 4.5 per cent.

The bank's governing council expects to hold the policy rate at its current level while it assesses the impact of the cumulative interest rate increases, reports Xinhua news agency citing an official statement issued on Wednesday.

The bank conducted eight consecutive interest rate hikes since March 2022 and added 425 basis points in total to tackle inflation.

The country's inflation declined from 8.1 per cent in June to 6.3 per cent in December, reflecting lower petrol prices and, more recently, moderating prices for durable goods, the Bank of Canada said, adding that despite this progress, Canadians are still feeling the hardship of high inflation in their essential household expenses, with persistent price increases for food and shelter.

According to the bank, short-term inflation expectations remain elevated. Year-over-year measures of core inflation are still around 5 per cent, but three-month measures of core inflation have come down, suggesting that core inflation has peaked.

Inflation is projected to come down significantly this year. Lower energy prices, improvements in global supply conditions, and the effects of higher interest rates on demand are expected to bring CPI inflation down to around 3 per cent in the middle of this year and back to the 2 per cent target in 2024, the bank said.

There is growing evidence that restrictive monetary policy is slowing activity, especially household spending.

Consumption growth has moderated from the first half of 2022 and housing market activity has declined substantially. As the effects of interest rate increases continue to work through the economy, spending on consumer services and business investment are expected to slow.

## Indian-origin Sikh engineer wins PM Rishi Sunak's award

**LONDON:** An Indian-origin Sikh engineer has won UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's Points of Light Award for designing an energy-efficient manual washing machine for displaced and low-income communities.

London-based Navjot Sawhney's hand-cranked washing machine is benefitting over 1,000 families without access to an electric machine.

Navjot set up The Washing Machine Project some four years ago, with over 300 machines distributed worldwide so far to places including refugee camps, schools and orphanages.

"Winning the Points of Light award and getting recognised by the Prime Minister is a phenomenal privilege," Sawhney said after receiving the award.

"The Washing Machine Project's mission is to alleviate the burden of unpaid labour, mainly on women



and children. I'm so proud that giving back the dignity of clean clothes to those who hand wash them is getting the recognition it deserves," Sawhney added.

The machine is named after his neighbour Divya in India, who would spend up to 20 hours each week washing her

family's clothes -- a burden which prevented her from pursuing paid work and caused her to suffer skin irritations and back pain.

The machine can help save up to 50 per cent of water and 75 per cent of time compared to handwashing clothes.

Navjot's machines are also

helping Ukrainian families who have been forced to flee their homes and are currently living in humanitarian aid centres. In a personal letter to Navjot, Sunak said: "You have used your professional skills as an engineer to help thousands of people around the world who don't have access

to electric washing machines."

Sunak said that the machines are giving families the "dignity of clean clothes" and empowering many women who have been held back from education and employment.

"Your ingenuity, compassion and dedication to improving the lives of others is an inspiration to us all," Sunak wrote in the letter.

Previously employed by Dyson that manufactures vacuum cleaners, Navjot wanted to use his skills to improve quality of life for disadvantaged communities.

While volunteering in India with Engineers Without Borders, he saw the disproportionate burden placed on women to carry out hand-washing, inspiring him to design a manual, off-grid and fully sustainable machine.

The Points of Light recognises outstanding individual volunteers who are making a change in their community.

## Indian man shot dead in US by 3 masked men

A 52-year-old Indian man died in the US after three masked men opened fire at him, leaving his wife and child injured, police said.

Pinal Patel and his family had arrived home from work when three masked individuals with guns targeted them last week on Thoroughbred Lane in Georgia, the Bibb County Sheriff's Office said.

Upon arrival, deputies found Patel, his wife Rupalben, and child Bhakti, suffering from gunshot wounds in the driveway of their home.

The family was transported to Atrium Health where Patel was pronounced dead on arrival by Deputy Coroner Luann Stone.

Rupalben and her daughter were listed in stable condition, the police said.

"Patel confronted the three



and while doing so, shots were fired at the family," the Bibb County Sheriff's Office said in a statement.

"The three masked individuals then ran to a dark in colour vehicle waiting across the street occupied by a fourth

person." Investigators have sought public assistance in locating the four-door vehicle and assistance in identifying persons of interest in this case.

No items were reported to have been taken from the family, the police said.

The film has registered a record opening of Rs 57 crore (NBOC) across India. The film, which also stars Deepika Padukone and John Abraham, released in three languages: Hindi, Tamil and Telugu.

Of the Rs 57 crore of the film's business, Rs 55 crores come from the Hindi markets and the rest Rs 2 crores came from Telugu and Tamil territories, as per senior film trade analyst,

This film bypassed the Hindi collections of 'K.G.F.: Chapter 2', which stood at Rs 53.95 crore and the 2019 two hero film 'War', which collected Rs 51.60 crore. The latter, too, belongs to Yash Raj Film's - the production house behind 'Pathaan'.

In terms of worldwide collec-

tions, the film reportedly has minted Rs 100 crore, an achievable feat given that SRK enjoys a rock-solid fan-following among the Indian diaspora.

'Pathaan' marks the return of King Khan, as he is known, on the silver screen after 4 long years of wait. His last film was the ambitious 'Zero' directed by Aanand L. Rai, which was released in 2018. The film was a box-office disaster as it earned Rs 88.74 crore in India.

Prior to that, SRK's 'Jab Harry Met Sejal', which released in 2017, earned Rs 62 crore in India as per Box Office India.
