Govt gives in principle approval to food truck policy in Delhi

Delhi will soon have food truck hubs like that in New York, Hong Kong and Australia, with Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday giving in-principle approval to a policy.

The policy will be implemented with the operation of food trucks in 16 selected locations. Upon its successful implementation, the model will be replicated across Delhi, according to a statement from the chief minister's office.

Kejriwal took to Twitter to announce the introduction of the food truck policy, approved at a meeting on Tuesday.

"This plan will allow the citizens of Delhi to enjoy delicious meals even late at night. Additionally, it will create opportunities for employment on a large scale and strengthen the economy," he tweeted.



Additionally, dedicated food hubs will be developed to cater to the needs of Delhi residents, fostering economic growth and employment prospects during nighttime.

According to the statement, Kejriwal has given his in-principle approval to the policy.

Food trucks have gained immense popularity in major cities and tourist destinations worldwide such as New York,

Washington DC, San Francisco, Amsterdam, Brussels, London, Australia, Singapore, Tokyo, and Hong Kong.

Following this global trend, the Kejriwal government aims to promote food culture in Delhi, enabling residents to experience the culinary diversity of various Indian cities, the statement said.

The primary objective of the policy is to establish Delhi as

the "food truck capital".

The Delhi government intends to support small businesses through this policy, while simultaneously generating employment opportunities and boosting the nighttime economy of the city.

The Public Works Department (PWD) has identified 16 locations, including renowned

marketplaces and neighbourhoods, for the establishment of these food truck hubs initially. Subsequently, food truck hubs will be opened across the city.

PWD Minister Atishi said the policy will not only generate employment opportunities but also contribute to the city's nighttime economy.

The policy prioritises the maintenance and upkeep of these food hubs, with the responsibility for their operation and maintenance entrusted to a designated agency, the statement said.

Presenting the budget for the financial year 2022-23, then deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia had said the government was preparing a policy to allow food trucks to operate at designated places in the city from 8 pm to 2 am. "This will strengthen the night economy of Delhi and new employment opportunities will be created."

Indian economy rose by 87 per cent in 9 years: FinMin



NEW DELHI: The economic growth of India has increased by over 87 per cent in US dollar terms in the nine years to 2023, said the Finance Ministry on Monday.

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's office said in a tweet, "India's GDP has reached USD 3.75 trillion in 2023, from around USD 2 trillion in 2014; moving from 10th largest to 5th largest economy in the world. India is now being called a Bright

Spot in the global economy."

The Chief Economic Advisor (CEA) V Anantha Nageswaran at an event in Kerala on Monday said India is set to become the third-largest economy by 2027. "India is becoming consequential for the world economy because of our progress from number 10 position to number five," Nageswaran said. He said India's average contribution to world GDP rose from 1.1% in 1998-2007 to 5% in 2010-2019 and is estimated to be 6% in 2021-2028. "India's contribution will only become better if we continue to deliver on our potential and promise.

Last week the CEA had said that both the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Ministry of Finance believe 6.5% is the estimated growth for FY24 and the risks to this growth rate are evenly balanced

PM Modi reviews situation related to Cyclone Biparjy



NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday reviewed the situation related to Cyclone Biparjy which is likely to hit the Kutch region of Gujarat on Thursday. The meeting was attended by Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Principal Secretary to Prime Minister P K Mishra, Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gauba, Earth Sciences Secretary M Ravichandran, Kamal Kishore, Member National Disaster Management Authority, India, Meteorological Department Director General Mruyujay Mohapatra, among others. According to a presentation made during the meeting, Kutch, Devbhumi Dwarka, Porbandar, Jamnagar, Rajkot, Junagarh and Morbi could experience stormy weather with a wind speed of 125-135 kmph gusting to 145 kmph on June 15 morning to evening. Fishing activities along Gujarat's south and north coasts have been suspended and authorities were evacuating people in districts by the sea in view of Cyclone Biparjy that is likely to make landfall along the Saurashtra-Kutch coasts as a very severe cyclonic storm, officials said on Monday. Officials in coastal Devbhumi Dwarka said around 1,300 people have been shifted to safer places so far. In its latest bulletin, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said the 'extremely severe cyclonic storm' was very likely to move north-northeast and cross Saurashtra and Kutch and adjoining Pakistan coasts between Mandvi (Gujarat) and Karachi (Pakistan) by the June 15 noon as a 'very severe cyclonic storm' with maximum sustained wind speed of 125-135 kilometres per hours (kmph) gusting to 150 kmph.

Government to bring one-time settlement scheme for water bills of 11.7 lakh consumers with arrears

The Delhi Government will bring a one-time settlement scheme for the water bills of 11.7 lakh domestic consumers who have arrears, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal announced on June 14.

Addressing a press conference at the Delhi Secretariat, Kejriwal said the government plans to implement the scheme from August 1 and the consumers will receive the corrected bills after that.

"There has been a severe accumulation of water bills. During the COVID-19 pandemic,

meter readings could not be taken. Meter readers filed false readings and therefore, people received wrong bills. There are 27.6 lakh domestic meters in Delhi and of these, 11.7 lakh bills have arrears and they have not been submitted. The arrears are to the tune of Rs 5,737 crore," he said.

Explaining the scheme, the Chief Minister said it will be divided into two sub-heads -- one will cover those who have two or more correct readings and the other will cover those who have one or no correct meter reading. "Had we gone about correcting every bill, it would have taken us more than 100

years to rectify those. Through this scheme, we will settle the bills of 11.7 lakh consumers. In fact, of these 11.7 lakh consumers, seven lakh will get zero bills following the implementation of the scheme," he said.

Mr. Kejriwal said the scheme has been approved by the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) and will come to the cabinet soon. After the implementation of the scheme, the consumers will be given three months to pay the bills. "If they fail to pay the bills within the three months, they will have to pay the bills with arrears," Kejriwal said. He added that the government is taking steps to stop wrong meter readings.

Giani Raghbir Singh appointed as Akal Takht Jathedar; replaces Giani Harpreet Singh

The Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) on Friday in an emergency meeting of Executive members of SGPC appointed Giani Raghbir Singh as the new (regular) Jathedar of the Akal Takht the highest Sikh temporal seat.

Giani Raghbir Singh replaces acting Jathedar Giani Harpreet Singh who was appointed in 2018 by the SGPC. He remained as acting Jathedar for the past four and a half years.

Now Giani Sultan Singh would be the next Jathedar Takht Kesgarh Sahib replacing Giani Raghbir Singh, said Dhami adding that now Giani



Raghbir Singh besides Jathedar Akal Takht would also hold additional charge of Head Granthi (priest) of Golden Temple Amritsar.

Addressing the press conference here, SGPC president Harjinder Singh Dhami informed that acting jathedar



has resigned voluntarily from his additional charge as Jathedar Akal Takht and at the same time he will continue to serve as the Jathedar of Takht Dardma Sahib at Talwandi Sabo in Bathinda.

On being asked about the resignation of acting jathedar

Harpreet Singh as he had submitted resignation in writing, Dhami replied, "No, 'I have talked to him over the phone and he gave his consent for the appointment of regular Jathedar Akal Takht', he quipped.

Adding further Dhami said, "It is not easy to leave such a significant post, but Giani Harpreet Singh has set an example. SGPC respects him for this act".

Talking to media after his appointment as Jathedar Akal Takht, Giani Raghbir Singh said, "I am thankful to Guru Ramdas Ji (Fourth Sikh master) who gave me privilege to serve as a Sewadar of Akal Takht Amritsar which Shiromani (supreme) Takht among five Takhts.

AAP's politics solely dependent on educating children: Delhi CM

Neither the BJP nor the Congress talked about education during their respective tenures in Delhi, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal said on Monday, while asserting that his government's politics is solely dependent on educating children. He made the remarks at the inauguration of a new building of a government school in west Delhi's Uttam Nagar. This school was constructed in 1985. The governments of (BJP and Congress) came to power. But education was not on their agenda. "Neither the BJP nor the Congress spoke about providing education. But our politics is dependent on education," the chief minister said.

India asks EU to consider exemptions for MSMEs from carbon tax

NEW DELHI: The central government has spoken to European Union (EU) officials regarding exemption for Indian MSMEs from the bloc's carbon tax, which will be implemented from October this year, said Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal on Thursday. Understanding the impact the levy would have on domestic industry sectors, India held a stakeholders' consultations meeting on the issue last month and discussed the preparedness of the industry for the Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) compliance. The compliance is in two parts - a requirement of filing data from October and later imposition of the tax. The secretary also flagged the matter with the EU authorities during the Trade and Technology Council (TTC) meeting in Brussels last month.

5 terrorists killed in JK's Kupwara

Security forces killed five foreign terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district on Friday, according to the additional director general of police (ADGP) Kashmir, Vijay Kumar.

This encounter marks the first major attempt of infiltration in the region this year from the Kupwara sector.

The operation was initiated based on specific intelligence input leading to a joint operation by the Army and Police forces. The encounter took place in the Jumagund area along the Line of Control (LoC) in Kupwara district.

The Kashmir Zone Police had earlier shared this information through a tweet, stating that an encounter had commenced and that further details would be shared subsequently.

"An encounter has started between terrorists and joint parties of Army & Police on a specific input of Kupwara Police in Jumagund area of LoC of Kupwara district. Further details shall follow," Kashmir Zone Police had earlier tweeted. On June 13, two terrorists were neutralized during this operation in the Dobanar Machhal area along the LoC. The search operation is still ongoing in that region.

WPI inflation in May drops to -3.48%; remains in negative territory second-month in a row

NEW DELHI: Wholesale Price Index (WPI)-based inflation of India in May declined to -3.48 per cent, said government data on Wednesday making it the second month in a row when WPI has been in negative territory. In April, the wholesale inflation was -0.92 per cent and the drop in May is also the lowest level since November 2015. The food wholesale inflation has fallen to -1.59 per cent in May as compared to 0.17 per cent in April, said the Ministry of Commerce & Industry. The inflation in fuel and power category was recorded at -9.17 per cent as compared to 0.93 per cent in April. For manufactured products the inflation fell from -2.42 per cent to -2.97 per cent in May. "Decline in the rate of inflation in May, 2023, is primarily contributed by fall in prices of mineral oils, basic metals, food products, textiles, non-food articles, crude petroleum and natural gas, and chemical and chemical products," the Ministry said.

Congress demands answer from govt on Jack Dorsey's claim on facing pressures

At a press conference in Delhi Surpiya said "Opposition voices are also suppressed by the government." Now truth has come out from Dorsey's statement and we need answers. There



cannot be any bigger proof of the weakening of democracy in the country. Senior Congress leaders Jairam Ramesh and Surjewala have also tweeted against BJP calling it a cowardly act, and have demand answers from the Prime Minister over these allegations.

When farmers were protesting in Delhi and adjacent borders in chilling cold, scorching heat and heavy rain last year, they were called terrorist and Mawalis. And platforms like Twitter were not allowed to show the farmer's concerns in India. If they did so they would be shut down" These are the allegations made by Jack Dorsey



in an interview to a Youtube show "Breaking Points with Krystal and Saagar". "India had many requests of us around the farmers protest, around journalists who were critical of the Govt and manifested in ways such as we were shut down in India, which is a very large market for us, homes of our employees will be raided, our offices will be shut if we don't follow this is India" Dorsey said.

Citing an example of how recently a Union Minister threatened a journalist in Amethi who lost his job after it. Surpiya said Intimidation of media, journalists and social media platforms should stop immediately.

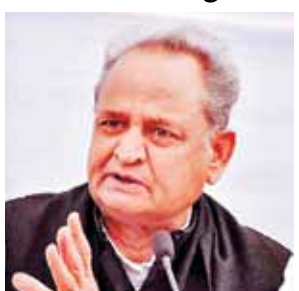
Govt cuts import duty on refined soybean & sunflower oils to 12.5%



NEW DELHI: The government has reduced the import duty on refined soybean and sunflower oils to 12.5 per cent from 17.5 per cent with effect from Thursday to boost the domestic availability and check prices, a finance ministry notification said. Usually, India imports 'crude' soybean and sunflower oils and not their 'refined' form. Yet, the government has reduced the duty on refined soybean and sunflower oils. With this reduction, the effective duty on refined edible oils stands at 13.7 per cent, including cess on social welfare.

BJP-RSS maligned UPA by promoting Anna Hazare, Kejriwal: Ashok Gehlot

JAIPUR: Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot accused the BJP-RSS of maligning the atmosphere against the erstwhile UPA government. "By promoting Anna Hazare and Arvind Kejriwal, the BJP-RSS created an environment against the UPA government. It also defamed the UPA by raising the issues of 2G spectrum, Coalgate etc. Today, no one takes the names of these 'scams'. Did anyone go to jail? There was so much hue and cry over Lokpal, but it is hardly discussed in the country today. However, government changes in the name of religion," Gehlot



said while addressing the Gandhi Darshan Sammelan here on Wednesday. Targeting the Central government, Gehlot said that 'critics' are being treated as 'traitors'. "I like when me or my govern-

ment is criticised. It may be that there are some areas where there is scope for improvement. What's the problem with that? If I don't like criticism, how will the truth come out? The allegations levelled by the Twitter co-founder (Jack Dorsey) are serious, the situation is not good," said Gehlot. To recall, during an interview on a YouTube channel on Monday, Dorsey was asked if he had faced any pressure from foreign governments.

Dorsey had replied: "India, for example, India is one of the countries which had many requests around farmers protests, around particular journalists

which were critical of the government, and it manifested in ways such as 'we will shut Twitter down in India'... 'we would raid the homes of your employees', which they did; 'we will shut down your offices if you don't follow suit'. And this is India, a democratic country."

Gehlot further alleged that the Constitution is being torn to pieces in the country. "Those in power at the Centre do not like criticism, and want to eliminate the opposition. If there is no opposition in a democracy, what is the point of having a government," Gehlot asked.

BJP afraid of holding Assembly polls in J&K: Omer Abdullah

The NC leader and former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omer Abdullah once again said on Wednesday that the BJP is not interested in holding elections in the union territory and dared it to conduct the exercise.

"Let them hold the Parliament and assembly elections here together, we will see who stands where," Omer said. The former chief minister said that the delayed elections in the region was indicative of the existing crises and criticized the government for being afraid to hold elections due to widespread discontent among the people. Responding to a question on films being made to



"defame" Islam, Omer Abdullah said, "Islam is not so weak that a film made by someone would impact our religion." "We know there are some people who have so much hatred for our religion that they cannot tolerate us and they often make these kinds of movies in between. We have been negotiating them and will continue to

do so," he added. Talking about the upcoming union meeting of opposition parties in Bihar on June 23, Omer Abdullah stated that the National Conference has a limited role to play in the gathering. He, however, highlighted that parties with a significant number of seats in Parliament should demonstrate unity.

Delhi govt to install more than 90,000 smart street lights to eliminate dark spots

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal granted in-principle approval to a smart street light policy in Delhi. As part of this initiative, the Delhi government plans to install over 90,000 smart street lights on all roads maintained by the Public Works Department (PWD). The primary objectives of this project are to eliminate dark spots and enhance women's security.



To ensure uninterrupted functioning of the lights, he stressed on having a robust central monitoring system. In the event of any fault in street lights, the control room will be promptly alerted, triggering immediate replacement measures, according to a statement from the chief minister's office.

Kejriwal said the Delhi government is doing whatever it can to strengthen women's security. Smart street lights will play a pivotal role in eliminating dark spots and instilling a sense of safety among citizens, particularly women, he added.

The proposal to install 90,953 smart street lights was presented before the chief minister by PWD Minister Atishi during a high-level meeting at the Delhi secretariat. PWD officials provided a comprehensive overview of the project, highlighting the

outdated technology used in existing street lights, which made it challenging to procure spare parts and led to excessive energy consumption. Consequently, electricity bills soared due to increased usage. Additionally, the manual monitoring of the current street lights made it difficult to address complaints promptly, as real-time monitoring was lacking, it said.

This initiative aims to eliminate dark spots in the city and enhance safety by reducing incidents of crimes against women in poorly lit areas, it added. The chief minister expressed concern about the rising number of crimes against women in recent times and said his government is taking all necessary measures within its jurisdiction to prevent such crimes. The implementation of the smart street light scheme is part of these efforts, the statement said. The government has adopted the Energy Service Company (ESCO) model for the policy, centralising the control of smart lights.

It will enable the control room to promptly identify and rectify any faulty lights. Moreover, many lights remain illuminated during the day on various roads, leading to unnecessary electricity wastage. The scheme aims to address this issue and reduce electricity wastage, it said.

Arvind Kejriwal accuses BJP, Congress of neglecting education for 37 years



NEW DELHI: Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal accused the BJP and the Congress party of neglecting education for 37 years while inaugurating the new building of a Girls' Senior Secondary School in Uttam Nagar.

He said that this school was opened in 1985 but was operating in temporary tin sheds. Kejriwal said that despite the BJP and Congress gov-

ernments being in power for 37 years, no one took steps to improve the school.

He emphasized that his government had rebuilt the school, which was previously functioning in substandard conditions. The infrastructure of the new school is now better than that of any private school. As per Kejriwal, when his government approved the construction of a new building in

January 2021, the school was operating in 48 tin sheds.

However, within a record time of 28 months, the new building was completed which consists of 41 classrooms, where 1, 600 girls study.

Additionally, the school has 12 labs, 2 libraries, offices and staff rooms, activity rooms, including those for children with special needs. Each floor also has a toilet block, and a lift is installed in the main school building. Moreover, the school boasts a multi-purpose auditorium with a seating capacity of 250 people.

"Come what may, I will not let the work being done in education be hampered. This school exceeds the standards set by any private school. For 37 long years, both the BJP and Congress governed the state, yet education never found a place on their agenda. As a result, a permanent school building was never constructed here," Kejriwal said.

Delhi court sends gangster Lawrence Bishnoi to judicial custody



NEW DELHI: A Delhi court on Wednesday sent gangster Lawrence Bishnoi to judicial custody on expiry of his police remand in connection with an extortion case. On June 11, Bishnoi was sent to three days of police custody by the Saket court.

On Delhi Police's application, the Saket Duty Metropolitan Magistrate sent the accused to the judicial custody.

Earlier, while seeking his remand, Delhi Police's Crime Branch had told the court that they have arrested an individual, who they need to interrogate face-to-face with other accused. A "Lawrence also needs to be taken to Gandhinagar, Gujarat," it had argued. "It is submitted that accused Lawrence Bishnoi needs to be confronted with the accused Akshay to unearth the criminal nexus and to gather information regarding another accused, Kapil and how accused Lawrence Bishnoi was able to give directions to accused Akshay despite being in jail. The interrogation is required for a meaningful conclusion of the investigation," the court had noted while allowing the move of the Crime Branch. On June 9, Lawrence, through his counsel, had filed an application before a Special NIA court, requesting the court not to lodge him in Mandoli Jail. He had requested in his plea that he should be lodged in a jail in Bathinda instead of Mandoli.

Baby injured in Lucknow courtroom shootout discharged from KGMU



The 18-month-old baby, who had sustained a bullet injury below her shoulder in the Lucknow courtroom shootout that killed gangster Sanjeev Maheshwari Jeeva on June 7, has been discharged from the King George's Medical University. "The girl is absolutely fine now. We have called her after five days for a follow-up and if things are alright, then she may not be called again," said Sandeep Tiwari, head of the trauma surgery department at KGMU where the toddler was brought shortly after the shootout in which two constables were also injured. Doctors said her recovery after the bullet was taken out had been satisfactory and she will lead a normal life now. The bullet had entered the girl's body from behind apparently due to the ricochet effect. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath had visited the baby in hospital.

Kerala HC dismisses plea for law to curb superstitious practices

Kerala High Court has dismissed a plea that sought directions for the state government to enact a law to curb superstitious practices like sorcery and black magic.

The petition was moved by an organisation called Kerala Yukthi Vadi Sanghom.

The plea came to be filed in light of an incident of human sacrifice in the state in which two women were killed and their bodies dismembered.

A division bench of Chief Justice S.V. Bhatti and Justice Basant Balaji dismissed the plea.

According to the petitioner, this was not the only such incident.

"Several cases of human sacrifices and other types of assaults in connection with the superstitious belief of black magic and witchcraft have come to light. For the purpose of God's grace, financial gains, getting jobs,



resolving family problems, the birth of children, and for several other desires, some people are practicing black magic and witchcraft of which people belong to the downtrodden, and the children and women are mostly the victims," the petition stated.

The petitioner-organisation claims to have approached both Central and state governments and submitted model bills for

the enactment of The Kerala Prevention of Eradication of Inhuman Evil Practices, Sorcery and Black Magic Bill, 2019.

The plea also pointed that there are many films, telefilms, and advertisements on television, YouTube and OTT platform that advertise superstitious practices that prompt people to indulge in such activities and hence appropriate actions must be taken.

The petitioner further prayed that advertisement of books with regard to black magic on internet sites be declared illegal.

In October last year, the state government had informed the Court that it is actively considering enacting an anti-superstition legislation.

However, since no one appeared on behalf of petitioner when the case was posted for hearing, the Court decided to dismiss it for default.

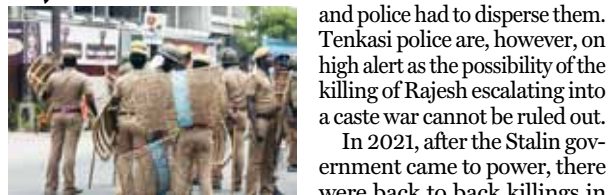
Reforms within the Mus-

Police on alert as Dalit youth hacked to death in TN's Tenkasi

The Tenkasi police have been put on alert after a Dalit youth was hacked to death at Sengottai municipal complex building.

Even though the two accused belonging to a Most Backward Community (MBC) were arrested on Wednesday itself, the possibility of retaliation is not being ruled out. Rajesh (27) of a Dalit community was working as a temporary employee at Sengottai municipality. Eye witnesses said that two bike-borne youths reached the municipality complex building and waited for Rajesh on



Wednesday. As soon as he arrived, they two hacked him to death using sickles they were carrying. The killers, Mari (21) and Manthiramoorthi (26) were arrested even as they were trying to surrender before the Ambasamudram police. Rajesh's kin staged a blockade on the Kollam-Thirumangalam road

and police had to disperse them. Tenkasi police are, however, on high alert as the possibility of the killing of Rajesh escalating into a caste war cannot be ruled out. In 2021, after the Stalin government came to power, there were back to back killings in Tirunelveli and Madurai districts. State Director General of Police, C. SylendraBabu had to camp in Madurai and bring the situation under control.

While police are not expecting such a situation in Tenkasi, it is on alert at the possibility of retaliation by the relatives and caste members of the deceased.

Odisha Train Crash: Locals organise Mahayajna, prayers for the departed

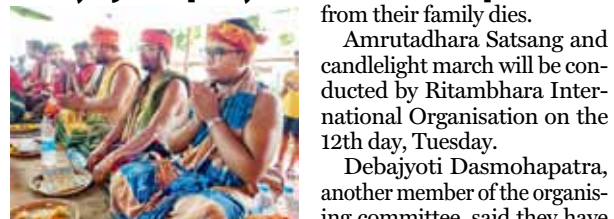
BHUBANESWAR: Locals of Bahanaga and nearby areas on Monday organised Mahayajna and prayers for 'Mukti' (salvation) of 288 passengers who lost their lives in the June 2 train crash.

A large number of people of Bahanaga, Soro and Balasore gathered at the Bahanaga High School ground this morning and took part in the Bisva Shanti Mahayajna, Astaprahari Nama Sankirtan, Akhanda Gayatri mantra and Dipadan.

As people from different religions were killed and injured in the accident, the organisers

conducted 'Sarva Dharma Prathana Sabha' (all faith prayer) at the ground where the religious leaders prayed for the departed souls and the injured.

"People from different religions died and suffered injuries in the train accident. So, their family members are holding different programmes like the Bisva Shanti Maha Yajna, Akhanda Gayatri mantra, Sarva Dharma Prarthana Sabha, etc. for the departed souls. We are also praying for the speedy recovery and longer life of the injured," said Sarat Raj, one of the organisers.



On Sunday, the residents observed the 10th day ritual for the deceased of the triple-train accident. As a part of the ritual, over 100 people shaved their heads at a pond near the Bahanaga Bazar accident site. The people also observed all rituals they do when someone

from their family dies. Amrutadhara Satsang and candlelight march will be conducted by Ritambhara International Organisation on the 12th day, Tuesday. Debajyoti Dasmohapatra, another member of the organising committee, said they have rescued hundreds of people from the accident-hit trains and recovered many bodies with the help of rescuers.

"We do not know the religion of many of the deceased who are still unidentified. So, we organised an all-religion programme," he said.

Cong slams Centre after Law Commission seeks public opinion on Uniform Civil Code

NEW DELHI: A day after the Law Commission sought suggestions of public and recognised religious organisations on the Uniform Civil Code (UCC), Congress on Thursday termed it Modi Government's "desperation for a legitimate justification of polarization and diversion from its glaring failures".

In a statement, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said that the 22nd Law Commission of India notified its intention to examine the UCC. This was being done, on a reference sent by the Ministry of Law & Justice.

"It is strange that the Law Commission is seeking a fresh reference when in its press release it acknowledges that its predecessor, the 21st Law Commission had published a consultation paper on the subject in August 2018," Ramesh said. He also said that no reasons



are given for why the subject is being revisited except for vague references to "the relevance and the importance of the subject and also the various court orders". The real reason is that the 21st Law Commission, after carrying out a detailed and comprehensive review of the subject, observed that it is "neither necessary nor desirable at this stage" to have a Uniform Civil Code.

"This latest attempt repre-

sents the Modi Government's desperation for a legitimate justification of its continuing agenda of polarization and diversion from its glaring failures," Ramesh said hitting back at the government. He highlighted that the 21st Law Commission in para 1.15 of its 182-page Consultation Paper on Reform of Family Law submitted on August 31, 2018 said, "While diversity of Indian culture can and should be

celebrated, specific groups, or weaker sections of society must not be disprivileged in the process. Resolution of this conflict does not mean abolition of all

differences. "This Commission has therefore dealt with laws that are discriminatory rather than providing a uniform civil code which is neither necessary nor desirable at this stage. Most countries are now moving towards recognition of difference and the mere existence of difference does not imply discrimination, but is indicative of a robust democracy."

Ramesh said that the Law Commission has produced an enviable body of work over the decades on numerous issues of national importance.

"It should be mindful of that legacy and remember that the interests of the nation are distinct from the political ambitions of the BJP," he added.

His remarks come a day after the Law Commission published a notice soliciting views and ideas of the public at large and recognised religious organisations about the UCC.

Names of CBI, ED should be changed to 'BJP Sena': Kejriwal



NEW DELHI: Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday accused the Bharatiya Janata Party-led Central government of misusing the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) by targeting the opposition leaders.

During a meeting with CPI general secretary D Raja and others, Kejriwal sought their support against the Central government's ordinance and accused it of using the CBI and the ED as tools for political purposes. Kejriwal tweeted, "The names of CBI and ED should be changed to 'BJP Sena.' There was a time when these investigative agencies were respected. Whenever they conducted raids or made arrests, it appeared that the person must have done something wrong. Today, these agencies have become mere political weap-

ons of the BJP."

Kejriwal also criticized a provision in the Union government's ordinance that allows them to establish commissions and boards for the Delhi government. "If that's the case, then why hold elections? The people of Delhi have decisively defeated BJP three times. They were only given 3 out of 70 seats once, and 8 seats in another election. The BJP was even defeated in the MCD. If they can't win, they want to control Delhi through backdoor tactics," Kejriwal said.

During the event, D Raja referred to Kejriwal as his great friend and expressed support for Kejriwal's stance on how the rights of Delhi are being undermined by the ordinance. "Our party stands with Arvind Kejriwal on this issue, opposing the Union government's ordinance," said Raja.

Charge sheet filed against WFI chief, Delhi Police seeks cancellation of POCSO case



NEW DELHI: Delhi Police on Thursday recommended dropping of POCSO charges against BJP MP and outgoing WFI chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh but charged him with sexual harassment and stalking six women wrestlers.

The government had assured the agitating wrestlers including Olympic medallists Bajrang Punia and Sakshi Malik and fellow Olympian Vinesh Phogat that the charge sheet would be filed by June 15, following which they had suspended their stir. They were demanding Singh's arrest on allegations of sexual harassment against seven wrestlers, including the minor. Singh has denied all the charges.

The police recommended the cancellation of the complaint filed by the minor wrestler against Singh, citing "no corroborative evidence".

Gold worth Rs. 47.45 lakhs seized at Airport

Gold worth Rs 47.45 lakh seized at Shri Guru Ramdas ji International Airport from the passenger who arrived here from Sharjah. In a statement issued here today, Customs official said that Customs staff of SGRDJI International Airport, Amritsar intercepted one passenger coming from Sharjah by Indigo 6E1428 flight in the evening of 15th June. He further stated that on personal search of the passenger, three white capsules were found hidden inside his rectum weighing 1072 grams. The recovered gold from the said 3 white capsules is 778 grams and market value of the said gold is Rs. 47.45 lakhs. The same was seized under section 110 of Custom Act, 1962. Further investigation is under process.

Negative trend in wholesale prices should reflect in retail inflation after a lag; Monsoon a key factor to watch: ASSOCHAM

NEW DELHI: Drop in wholesale prices by 3.48 per cent for May 2023 is a pointer towards decline in the retail inflation in the coming months, once the bulk or mandi rates start reflecting in the CPI after a lag, ASSOCHAM Secretary General Deepak Sood said. "There is no doubt, prices are softening for most of the items even though there is a gap between the WPI measured inflation and CPI-gauged retail inflation. Negative trajectory in wholesale prices should help the overall input cost in the value chain. While we expect the trend to continue, we need to watch out how Monsoon plays out as food prices are influenced a lot more by rains than manufactured goods," Deepak Sood said.

Pakistani drone seized at Tarn Taran

Karnataka CM Siddaramaiah Launch 'Shakti scheme' free bus travel for women across K'taka

The Karnataka government on Sunday launched "Shakti Yojane", the scheme that provides free bus travel for women across Karnataka. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and Deputy CM DK Shivakumar along with other ministers inaugurated the scheme at Bengaluru's Vidhan soudha and called it a move for women empowerment in the southern state. It was Congress's one of the five poll guarantee promises before the assembly elections. CM Siddaramaiah said during the launch that beneficiaries can also travel upto 20km inside neighbouring states.

The travel in ordinary buses will be free for all women in Karnataka, starting from 1 pm on Sunday. Speaking to the reporters, Karnataka transport minister Ramalinga Reddy said, "Our priority is to make travel convenient for women across Karnataka. We will also increase bus services in



those routes where shortage is observed. All women across Karnataka can travel for free from 1pm today."

The minister also asked the women to apply for Shakti smart cards in next three months. Answering about the privacy breach, "We have designed these smart cards in a way that the data privacy will not be breached. The portal will be open for next three month and I request women to apply for Shakti smart cards." Meanwhile, until the cards are issued, women who would like to avail

the free travel benefit must carry a government photo ID card with their residential address on it. It is compulsory for women to carry the Shakti smart card, after three months from June 11. The scheme applies for all women in Karnataka, including the transgender community.

The Shakti scheme applies only on the ordinary state run bus services of Karnataka. Airavat, Airavat Club Class, Airavat Gold Class, Ambari, Ambari Dream Class, Ambari Utsav, Fly Bus, Vayu Vajra, Vajra, Non-AC Sleeper, Ra-

jahamsa and EV Power Plus AC buses are excluded in this scheme. The scheme doesn't also apply to those buses which travel outside the state. 50 per cent seats on KSRTC, NWKRTC and KKRTC's ordinary and express buses will be reserved for men.

KHARGE ON GALWAN VALLEY CLASH ANNIVERSARY

PM Modi's clean chit to China a body blow to national security

NEW DELHI: Congress on Thursday paid tributes to 20 soldiers, who died in Galwan Valley clash in 2020, and slammed the BJP-led Centre for not maintaining the status quo ante at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) and also said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's "clean chit" to China was a body blow to national security.

In a tweet, Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge said, "A grateful nation pays heartfelt tributes to the supreme sacrifice made by 20 bravehearts in the Galwan valley, three years ago. Modi government is responsible for not maintaining the status quo ante at the LAC. We have lost possession of 26 Patrolling Points (PP) out of 65."

Lashing out at the Centre, Kharge, who is also the Leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha, said, "We have attempted to raise this issue several times in the Parliament, but the Modi govern-



ment wants to keep fellow Indians in the dark. Modi ji's 'clean chit' to China on Galwan is responsible for China achieving its nefarious designs. This is a body blow to our National Security and Territorial Integrity.

"Modi government's 'Laal Aankh' (red eye) has become blurred, on which it is wearing tinted Chinese glasses! As a responsible opposition, our job is to keep the country united against the Chinese expansionist policy and to show the mirror of truth to the Modi government," the Congress leader added.

ED summons Tamil Nadu Minister Senthil Balaji's brother, others for questioning next week

CHENNAI: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has summoned arrested Tamil Nadu Minister Senthil Balaji's brother R V Ashok Kumar, personal assistant B Shanmugam and others for questioning next week in an alleged cash-for-jobs linked money laundering case, officials said.

The two, along with some other accused and a woman who is suspected to be linked to an alleged 'benami' land deal

related to the minister, have been called for recording their statements under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), they said.

They have been asked to depose before the agency at its office here on different dates next week. The agency had earlier claimed that Balaji allegedly "misused" his

office for illegal gratification and "engineered" a job racket scam in the state's transport undertakings during 2014-15 with purported kickbacks paid by candidates through his associates who included Kumar and Shanmugam.

Balaji, 47, was arrested by the ED on Wednesday and is

currently in hospital. Calling the minister the "prime suspect" in the cash-for-jobs case, the federal probe agency also stated in its custody papers that alleged unaccounted cash deposits worth about Rs 1.60 crore were made in the bank accounts of Balaji and his wife. The case against Balaji and his aides pertains to his tenure as the state transport minister in the AIADMK government during 2011-15.

Inflation mustn't affect buying power of poor

The recent data on retail inflation in India reveals a mix of positive and concerning trends. In May, headline inflation reached a 25-month low of 4.25%, largely driven by the high price gains recorded in May 2022, where inflation had exceeded 7%. This deceleration aligns with the Reserve Bank of India's decision to pause monetary tightening as it evaluates the impact of past interest rate increases. However, month-on-month, the provisional Consumer Price Index (CPI) showed a consistent inflation rate of 0.51% in May, unchanged from April's six-month high reading. One of the notable contributors to the decline in year-on-year price gains was the deceleration in food item inflation, which dropped by 93 basis points to 2.91%. Oils and fats were particularly influential in driving down food prices, experiencing a 16% deflation. Additionally, the cereals and products category continued to deflate, with cereal inflation easing by over 100 basis points to 12.7%. However, caution must be exercised when interpreting the year-on-year moderation in inflation, especially within the food and beverages group, which accounts for 46% of the CPI. Nine out of its 12 sub-groups witnessed sequential increases in price levels. Vegetable prices, in particular, experienced 3.35% sequential inflation, nearly double the gains seen in April. Milk and dairy products also saw inflation rise to a three-month high of 0.67%, while pulses reached a 31-month high of 6.56% year-on-year. Policy-makers face the challenge of convincing consumers that inflation will be effectively managed to safeguard their purchasing power and savings. It is crucial to address the fluctuations in prices, particularly in essential food items, and create a favorable environment that instills confidence in the stability of prices. While the deceleration in overall retail inflation is a positive sign, sustained efforts are necessary to tame inflationary pressures, ensure long-term fiscal sustainability, and protect the welfare of Indian households.

Job for Finance Commission



The government will appoint a Finance Commission in the next few months to determine how much of the Centre's tax revenue should be given away to States (the vertical share) and how to distribute that among States (the horizontal sharing formula). In the pre-reform period, the Finance Commission recommendations were not that critical because the Centre had other ways to compensate States, or indeed to play favourites, through plan financing and public sector undertaking (PSU) investments. Post-reforms, fresh PSU investments have thinned out and the Planning Commission was abolished in 2014 with the result that the Finance Commission remains virtually the sole architect of India's fiscal federalism. Its responsibility and influence are, therefore, much larger. Currently, the Centre gives away 41% of its tax pool to the States. For sure, States will demand that this proportion be raised, but I do not see much room for stretching this further given the Centre's expenditure needs and the constraints on its borrowing limit. Therefore, much of the debate will centre on the horizontal distribution formula. When the previous Finance Commission was appointed in 2017, its terms of reference became quite contentious because it was asked to take into account the 2011 population figures in determining the expenditure needs of a State. This was a departure from the standard practice until then of mandating Finance Commissions to use the 1971 population numbers so as not to give a perverse incentive to States to neglect family planning with an eye on a higher share of devolution. States which had done well in stabilising population growth rates, typically the southern States, protested against this change in the base year, calling it a 'penalty for good performance'. A similar conflict arises with regard to revenue deficit grants that the Finance Commission awards to States which remain in deficit on

the current account even after tax devolution. In theory, revenue deficit grants have a neat rationale — that every State in a country should be able to provide a minimum level of service to its residents even if it involves an element of cross-subsidisation. The worry is that this too has become a perverse incentive. Why bother raising revenues on your own when the Finance Commission will compensate you? Historically, Finance Commissions have struggled to determine how much a State's deficit is due to its fiscal incapacity and how much is due to fiscal irresponsibility. They have tried to tweak the distribution formula to support deficit States without penalising responsible States, a mathematically impossible task since you cannot give more to a State without giving less to another. The net result is that every horizontal distribution formula has been criticised as being inefficient or unfair or both. These faultlines across States have in fact deepened in recent years along political, economic and fiscal dimensions. When the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) lost the Karnataka election last month, many political commentators read that as a north-south divide, with the BJP being confined to the northern States while the Opposition parties rule the southern States. Similarly, many headline numbers suggest that the southern States of the country are doing better in terms of infra-

structure, private investment, social indicators and the rule of law, which has put them on a virtuous cycle of growth and prosperity and widened the north-south gap. The bottom-line though is that it is in the very nature of horizontal distribution that richer States compensate poorer States. How to ensure that this happens without deepening the divide will challenge the government in defining the terms of reference of the Finance Commission, and of the Finance Commission itself in delivering on those terms of reference. Cesses and surcharges The terms of reference of the Finance Commission enjoin it to take into account the expenditure needs and revenue earning capacity of the Centre and States. I believe the forthcoming Finance Commission should use this leverage to focus on two issues in particular. The first is the egregious practice by the Centre of increasingly resorting to a levy of cesses and surcharges rather than raising taxes. A white paper released by the Tamil Nadu government a couple of years ago pointed out that the proportion of cesses and surcharges in the Centre's total tax revenue had nearly doubled from 10.4% in 2011-12 to 20.2% in 2019-20. There is a perverse incentive in operation here. The straightforward option for raising revenues is to raise taxes, but if the Centre does that, it has to part with 41 paise to States. On the other hand, if it raises the additional rupee by way of a surcharge, it gets to keep all of it. When the Constitution was amended in the year 2000 giving States a share in the Centre's total tax pool, the implicit understanding was that the Centre will resort only sparingly to cesses and surcharges, and not as a matter of routine as has become the practice. As a result of this breach of understanding, States have felt cheated out of their legitimate share of national tax revenue. The next Finance Commission should lay down guidelines for when cesses and surcharges might be levied,

and also suggest a formula to cap the amount that can be raised. Restraint on freebies The second issue of focus for the Finance Commission should be government spending on what has come to be called freebies. All political parties are guilty on this count, some more than others, but trying to apportion blame will be a wrong start. In a poor country, where millions of households struggle for basic human needs, it sounds cruel to argue against safety-nets for the poor. But it is precisely because India is a poor country, that we need to be more circumspect about freebies. In theory, the restraints imposed by the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management (FRBM) Act should have acted as a check on such populist spending, but governments have found ingenious ways of raising debt without it appearing in the budget books. It is not easy to unambiguously define a freebie, and any check on this will be contested as infringing on the sovereignty of elected governments. Nevertheless, the next Finance Commission should bite the bullet in the interest of long-term fiscal sustainability and lay down guidelines on the spending on freebies. After the BJP lost the Karnataka election, the Prime Minister said that the guarantees offered by the Congress in Karnataka were impossible to implement, and if taken forward, 'the country and the State concerned will become bankrupt.' Strong words indeed. In the State Assembly elections to be held later this year, the Prime Minister should walk the talk and invest his political capital to show that the promise of good governance can trump the lure of freebies. Reflections on Artificial Intelligence, as friend or foe

Artificial Intelligence (AI) has been dominating the headlines for its triumphs, and also fears being expressed by many including some of the best minds in AI. The Association for Computing Machinery released a statement in October 2022 on 'Principles for Responsible Algorithmic Systems', a broader class of systems that include AI systems. Several leading AI experts and thinkers have been part of different cautionary messages about AI, issued by the Future of Life Institute, the Association for the Advancement of Artificial Intelligence and the Center for AI Safety. There is deep concern about AI among many who know it. What is behind this? AI systems are capable of exhibiting super-human performance on specific or "narrow" tasks, which has made it to the news in the field of chess. Go (a game several orders harder than chess) and also in biochemistry for protein folding. The performance and utility of AI systems improve as the task is narrowed, making them valuable assistants to humans. Speech recognition, translation, and even identifying common objects such as photographs, are just a few tasks that AI systems tackle today, even exceeding human performance in some instances. Their performance and utility degrade on more "general" or ill-defined tasks. They are weak in integrating inferences across situations based on the common sense humans have. Artificial General Intelligence (AGI) refers to intelligence that is not limited or narrow. Think of it as human "common sense" but absent in AI systems. Common sense will make a human save his life in a life-threatening situation while a robot may remain unmoved. There are no credible efforts towards building AGI



yet. Many experts believe AGI will never be achieved by a machine; others believe it could be in the far future. A big moment for AI was the release of ChatGPT, in November 2022. ChatGPT is a generative AI tool that uses a Large Language Model (LLM) to generate text. LLMs are large artificial neural networks that ingest large amounts of digital text to build a statistical "model". Several LLMs have been built by Google, Meta, Amazon, and others. ChatGPT's stunning success in generating flawless paragraphs caught the world's attention. Writing could now be outsourced to it. Some experts even saw "sparks of AGI" in GPT-4; AGI could emerge from a bigger LLM in the near future. Other experts refute this vociferously, based on how LLMs work. At the basic level, LLMs merely predict the most probable or relevant word to follow a given sequence of words, based on the learned statistical model. They are just "stochastic parrots," with no sense of meaning. They famously "hallucinate" facts, confidently (and wrongly) — awarding Nobel prizes generously and conjuring credible citations to non-existent academic papers. True AGI will be a big deal if and when it arrives. Machines outperform humans in

every physical task today and AGI may lead to AI "machines" bettering humans in many intellectual or mental tasks. Bleak scenarios of super-intelligent machines enslaving humans have been imagined. AGI systems could be a superior species created by humans outside of evolution. AGI will indeed be a momentous development that the world must prepare for seriously. I believe current LLMs and their successors are not even close to AGI. But will AGI arrive some day? I reserve my judgement. However, the hype and panic about LLMs or AI leading directly to human extinction are baseless. The odds of the successors of the current tools "taking over the world" are zero. Where the dangers lie Does that mean we can live happily without worrying about the impact of AI? I see three possible types of dangers arising from AI. Superhuman AI: The danger of a super intelligent AI converting humans to slaves. I do not worry about such a highly unlikely scenario. Malicious humans with powerful AI: AI tools are relatively easy to build. Even narrow AI tools can cause serious harm when matched with malicious intent. LLMs can generate believable untruths as fake news and create deep mental anguish leading to self-harm. Public opinion can be manipulated to affect democratic elections. AI tools work globally, taking little cognisance of boundaries and barriers. Individual malice can instantly impact the globe. Governments may approve or support such actions against "enemies". We have no effective defence against malicious human behaviour. Well-meaning people have expressed concern about AI-powered "smart" weapons in the military. Unfortunately, calls for a ban are

not effective in such situations. I do not see any easy defence against the malicious use of AI. Highly capable and inscrutable AI: AI systems will continue to improve and will be employed to assist humans. They may end up harming some sections more than others unintentionally, despite the best intentions of their creators. These systems are created using Machine Learning from data from the world and can perpetuate the shortcomings of the data. They may introduce asymmetric behaviours that go against certain groups. Camera-based face recognition systems have been shown to be more accurate on fair-skinned men than on dark-skinned women. Such unintended and unknown bias can be catastrophic in AI systems that steer autonomous cars and diagnose medical conditions. Privacy is a critical concern as algorithmic systems watch the world constantly. Every person can be tracked always, violating the fundamental right to privacy. Another worry is about who develops these technologies and how. Most recent advances took place in companies with huge computational, data, and human resources. ChatGPT was developed by OpenAI which began as a non-profit and transformed into a for-profit entity. Other players in the AI game are Google, Meta, Microsoft, and Apple. Commercial entities with no effective public oversight are the centres of action. Do they have the incentive to keep AI systems just? P.J. A thrilling exploration of history and identity

In Guy Gunaratne's "Mister Mister", readers embark on a thrilling exploration of recent history, specifically the pre and post-9/11 era. One of the book's remarkable aspects lies in Yahya's ability to attract a following through his captivating poetic power. Gunaratne skillfully deconstructs language, using the melodic nature of Islamic verse peppered with English to forge connections between people based on sound and ideas. Readers are simultaneously entranced by Yahya's transformational journey and unsettled by the unsettling sense of inevitability in his choices. In this regard, Robert Verkaik's "Jihadi John: The Making of a Terrorist" provides a more candid account, examining the life and fetishization of a militant perpetrating acts of brutality on camera. Gunaratne, known for his debut novel "In Our Mad and Furious City" (2019), delivers a piercing portrayal of London's hidden immigrant pockets, shaking them to their core. He tackles the anguish experienced by disenfranchised migrants seeking absolution or, in more recent times, revenge, as a consequence of the

colonial legacy's deception and the subsequent search for identity and redemption. Gunaratne's annotated chapters read like a performance, with the author assuming the role of a master puppeteer, manipulating characters and teasingly pointing at the audience, exposing the hypocrisy of a corrupt and decadent society. His talent lies in captivating readers, much like the great Charles Dickens, by throwing minted chocolates amidst the haunted urchins and Jihadi Johns lurking in the shadows. "Mister Mister" is a tragic exploration of displacement on a global scale, its reverberations felt within our own communities. The "other," historically defined through the

colonial gaze, emerges as our doppelgänger, revealing the monster within ourselves. Gunaratne's work challenges readers to confront the complexities of identity, history, and extremism, leaving an indelible impact long after the final page is turned. counting, legal, and product", said the report, citing a former employee.

The Cloud major is developing a national health records database. According to Oracle's Chairman and Chief Technology Officer Larry Ellison, the patient data would be anonymous until individuals give consent to share their information. Ellison has assured that Oracle's database will anonymise all patient data.

Cerner is a leading provider of digital information systems used within hospitals and health systems to enable medical professionals to deliver better healthcare to individual patients and communities. Oracle's new health records database will also involve the patient engagement system the company has been developing throughout the pandemic.

The Cloud major is also working on the patient engagement system's ability to collect information from wearables and home diagnostic devices.

NEWDELHI: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has been reached out by banks to provide a policy framework for silver metal loans on the lines of the existing gold metal loans for borrowers.

that has the most usage in the industrial sector and hence it gets affected by trends in both gold and industrial metals.

Under existing RBI rules for gold, nominated banks are authorised to import gold. The designated banks, who are a part of the Gold Monetisation Scheme, 2015, can extend gold (metal) loans (GML) to jewellery exporters or domestic manufacturers of gold jewellery.

Herein, the loans are repaid in rupees, which is equivalent to the value of the gold borrowed. Banks can provide the borrower with the option to repay a part of the loan in the form of physical gold in lots of one kg or more.

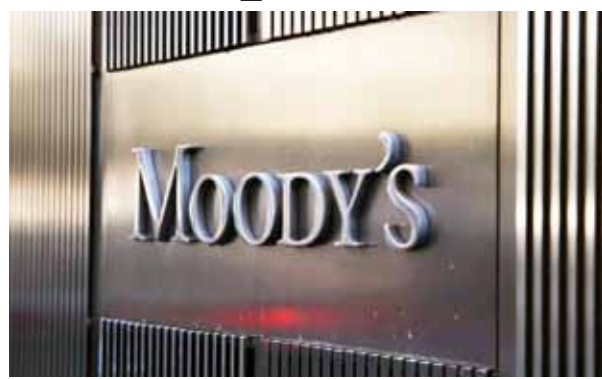
Moody projects India's economy to grow at 6 to 6.3 pc in June quarter

NEW DELHI: The Indian economy is likely to witness a 6 to 6.3 per cent growth in the June quarter, said Moody's.

The Credit Ratings agency flagged risks of fiscal slippage arising from weaker-than-expected government revenues in the current fiscal.

In comparison to the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) projection for the first quarter, Moody's growth estimate is 8 per cent lower than that.

In an interview with PTI, Moody's Investors Service Associate Managing Director Gene Fang said India has a relatively high level of general government debt at around 81.8 per cent of GDP for 2022-23, and low debt affordability. India, he said, has a high



growth potential and its credit strengths include a stable domestic financing base for government debt, as well as a sound external position.

"We expect India's growth to come in around 6-6.3 per cent in the first quarter of the

current fiscal year, which remains relatively flat from the 6.1 per cent recorded in the final quarter of fiscal 2022-23," Fang said.

While household demand is likely to see an improvement given the moderation in

both headline and core inflation readings, lagged effects of higher interest rates pose some risks on gross fixed capital formation, in particular, Fang added.

Fang said as a 'Baa3' rated sovereign, India's strengths lie in its large and diversified economy with a high growth potential, which is evident in the relatively strong growth forecast this year despite the weaker global economic outlook. For the full 2023-24 and 2024-25 fiscals, Moody's projects economic growth at 6.1 per cent and 6.3 per cent, respectively. On a calendar year basis, Moody's expects growth to be 5.5 per cent in 2023, which could improve to 6.5 per cent in 2024

Gold jumps Rs 510; silver rises by Rs 450



NEWDELHI: Gold price jumped Rs 510 to Rs 60,210 per 10 gram in the national capital on Friday amid strong cues in international markets, according to HDFC Securities.

In the previous trade, the yellow metal had settled at Rs 59,700 per 10 gram.

Silver also climbed Rs 450 to Rs 73,050 per kg.

Settle with Binance over asset freeze, judge urges US SEC



A US judge has urged the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) to reach a settlement with crypto exchange Binance to let it continue operating in the US.

The New York Times reported that Judge Amy Berman Jackson of the US District Court for the District of Columbia asked the two sides to reach a compromise over the asset freeze.

She ordered both the parties to continue negotiating and submit a status update by Thursday.

The judge also expressed skepticism about the SEC's use of its enforcement powers to regulate the crypto industry, calling it "inefficient and cumbersome".

At the end of the hearing, she suggested both sides come to an agreement on the SEC's request to freeze assets as soon as possible.

Last week, the US regulator sued leading crypto exchange Binance, its CEO Changpeng Zhao and BAM Trading and BAM Management over allegedly mishandling funds and lying to regulators.

In a federal lawsuit, the regulator filed 13 charges against the defendants. "Defendants unlawfully solicited US investors to buy, sell, and trade crypto asset securities through unregistered trading platforms available online at binance.com and Binance.US," the lawsuit read.

In court filings, Binance lawyers argued that the SEC's proposed asset freeze would prevent the crypto exchange from paying vendors, employees and suppliers, causing its operations to "quickly grind to a halt."

"We're not willing to accept a death penalty eight days into the case," a lawyer for Binance.US said at the hearing. The SEC has also charged another crypto exchange Coinbase with operating its crypto asset trading platform as an unregistered national securities exchange, broker, and clearing agency.

W20 Communique recommends minimum 15% tax break for women-led tech start-ups



CHENNAI: G20's official engagement group, Women 20 Communique 2023 has recommended the government to provide a minimum 15 per cent tax break or other equivalent incentives for women-led technology and tech-enabled startups.

It has been suggested apart from incentives and subsidies for women entrepreneurs.

The group focussed on five major areas including climate change, entrepreneurship, the gender digital divide, grassroots leadership and education, skill development and labour force participation.

The document, released in

the inaugural session of the W20 Summit on Thursday, will be given to the G20 leadership.

After the release of the communique, Union Minister Smriti Irani announced that in collaboration with the W20 India group, the Ministry of Women and Child Development will put together a research paper to collate gender-related data across the nation.

Amitabh Kant praised the document and said that the world needs to bring in radical changes to achieve gender equality in 15 years as a recent study by the World Economic Forum has stated that it would take 132 years.

A pre-approved BNPL (Buy Now Pay Later) instrument, travel insurance at a boarding pass printing kiosk, auto-routing of cashbacks for micro-investment and seamless credit to pay for hospital expenses are amongst a host of embedded financial services that may be rolled out by neobanking business models, riding on a robust infrastructure like UPI and open networks, an ASSOCHAM-PwC study has pointed out.

United States SEC actions against crypto exchanges send out clear message: 'Buyers Beware'

Cryptocurrency-related enforcement actions taken by the United States securities regulator significantly increased in the six months since the bankruptcy of cryptocurrency exchange FTX, the crypto industry news provider Cointelegraph has reported.

An analysis of press releases from the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), and news reports on its actions, found that in the six months preceding FTX's collapse, the SEC undertook approximately six enforcement actions.

In the six months after FTX's bankruptcy on November 11, 2022, SEC crypto-related enforcement actions jumped to at least 17, an estimated increase of 183 per cent from the preceding period, Coin Telegraph reported.

The increased actions, including the recent ones taken against the two exchanges, led to some observers suggesting the SEC is attempting to redeem itself for failing to police FTX, Coin Telegraph reported. MarketWatch reported that

U.S. Representative French Hill said the recent crackdown was a "cover your ass" move from the regulator and SEC chair Gary Gensler, while speaking at an event in Washington, D.C. on June 7. The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission sued both crypto exchanges Binance and Coinbase earlier this week, but analysts said they don't expect such regulatory actions to pose "existential risks" to crypto prices, MarketWatch reported.

Coinbase and Binance together account for 70% of crypto trade volumes, according to data from Kaiko. "Most capital that had to leave crypto is already out," analysts at Alliance Bernstein wrote in a note. "Shallow liquid crypto markets in the U.S. may continue in view of the U.S. regulatory environment, but we don't see this as an existential risk to crypto given the global presence of the industry," according to the analysts, MarketWatch reported.

Roughly 90% of crypto trading volume happens outside of the U.S., and "regulation seems



to be evolving more favourably in U.K, Europe, and Asia," the analysts added. Bitcoin dipped about 1% to about \$26,415 on Thursday, according to CoinDesk data, MarketWatch reported. The Securities and Exchange Commission's back to back lawsuits this week against the cryptocurrency exchanges Binance and Coinbase mark a new phase in long-running government efforts to rein in the industry. But the crackdown won't change much for crypto investors in the near term, analysts say, NBC News reported.

By targeting Binance, the world's largest crypto exchange, and Coinbase, the second largest, the agency is taking its biggest step yet to tighten controls on an industry that has largely

operated outside the traditional financial system.

The commission's moves are the latest in a multiyear effort to erect new guardrails; crypto exchanges such as Binance and Coinbase are likely to continue to operate relatively uninterrupted while the civil litigation moves through the court system, PitchBook crypto analyst Robert Le said, NBC News reported.

"In the short term, I don't see any changes," Le said, referring to the next three to five years. He cited XRP, a digital coin that continues to trade despite the SEC's ongoing lawsuit against the blockchain company Ripple Labs, announced in late 2020.

The lawsuits don't appear to have spooked crypto investors much. Bitcoin, the most-traded cryptocurrency, dropped sharply Monday but jumped back up Tuesday to trade at around \$27,000 - significantly higher than where it traded late last year in a broader industry decline that has come to be known as "crypto winter", NBC News reported.

Manufacturing sector has seen a huge drop in GDP

The GDP numbers for the last financial year, 2022-23, announced last week, have granted the Modi government an extension of its nine-year achievements. According to the data, the Indian economy has achieved a growth rate of 7.2 per cent during this period, which surpasses the forecasts of many prominent global institutions such as the IMF, World Bank, etc. Additionally, it has exceeded the Modi government's own expectations. With this figure, India appears to be on track to become the world's third-largest economy in the next decade. Since GDP is defined by data, there are diverse opinions and analyses on this matter. Criticism also arises regarding the fact that the economic growth rate in 2021-22 was over 9 per cent, which has now decreased to 7 per cent. This reality should be viewed in a broader context since the annual growth rate was negative for the first time

in 40 years due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020-21, and the subsequent increase was unexpected and justified

If the GDP data is divided into different parts and analyzed, five facts are worth mentioning. Firstly, the agriculture sector has achieved a growth rate of 4 per cent, which is higher than the previous financial year. It has seen an increase in four consecutive quarters, with the highest growth rate of 5.5 per cent occurring in the January to March quarter. This also indicates that the yield of both Rabi and Kharif crops was very good last year. Of course, this is good news for a country with a large population like India.

The second fact is that the services sector has once again retained its reins in the economy and achieved a growth rate of 28.3 per cent. The positive aspect here is that the financial and real estate sectors have now strengthened their hold in society. There has been an increase of about 3 per cent compared to last year, which will bring a new outlook to many dimensions in



the coming years.

The third positive aspect is that the 'core sector' of the economy, which comprises eight segments - coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery, fertilisers, steel, cement, and electricity - has achieved a staggering growth rate of 7.6 per cent. The highest increase has been observed in the coal sector, with a growth of about 15 per cent. Apart from coal, electricity, steel, and cement play important roles in the development of society's infrastructure. The available data shows that, along with coal, the remaining three sectors have also achieved growth rates

of more than 8 per cent. This serves as direct proof that the Indian economy is rapidly advancing in terms of infrastructure development. However, crude oil alone has registered negative growth rates, which can be largely attributed to the prolonged rise in global crude oil prices during the previous year due to the war between Russia and Ukraine."

The fourth fact raises a cause for concern for the manufacturing sector as the sector has only been able to achieve a growth rate of 1.3 per cent, compared to 11 per cent in FY21-22. The sur-

prising aspect is that while all other sectors of the core sector are experiencing growth, why is the manufacturing sector underperforming? In the second and third quarters, there were negative growth rates of 3.8 and 1.4 per cent respectively, despite the constant announcements of new schemes for the manufacturing sector by the Modi government. One such scheme includes an investment of approximately Rs. 2 trillion under the PLI scheme. This indicates that the budgetary promotion of the manufacturing sector by cutting the social welfare scheme MGNREGA does not appear to be as effective on the ground.

Fifth, the economy has shown a positive attitude towards investment, which indicates that both the government's capital expenditure and private financial investment in various development schemes have increased. According to the data, the government's capital expenditure in the fourth quarter was approximately 2.46 trillion rupees.

It has also been observed that currently, government and private financial investment accounts for 34 per cent of GDP, the highest level in the last nine years of the Modi government. As a result, various private projects in India are experiencing greater recovery compared to the past decade, which is very positive for the economy.

An analysis of GDP data for 22-23 also reveals that the positive increase in per capita purchasing power is not very encouraging. India, the world's most populous country, is putting in great efforts to continuously boost its economic growth rate. However, is it not too little to increase the per capita purchasing power by just 2.8 per cent? This situation presents a contradiction with the economic growth figures: the wealthy are spending more in the economy, while the consumption capacity of the poor remains stagnant. The reason behind this is that the purchase of luxury goods and high lifestyle-related ex-

penses only contributes to a single aspect of the increase in per capita purchasing capacity, which exclusively benefits the economically affluent class. Furthermore, it has also been observed that tractor sales have increased, but two-wheeler sales have not, indicating that lower-income individuals are still managing their purchasing capacity, with their primary goal being an increase in their financial income. This situation underscores the clear imbalance in the distribution of economic income within society, as evidenced by the data on ever-growing economic inequality. In summary, it can be concluded that in the future, there will undoubtedly be an increase in economic expenditure on social welfare schemes, enabling the lower class to become part of the mainstream economic growth.

Modi to visit US, Egypt from June 20-25

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will embark on a visit to the US and Egypt from June 20 to 25.

Modi's state visit to the US is at the invitation of President Joseph Biden and First Lady Jill Biden.

The visit will commence in New York, where Modi will lead the celebrations of the International Day of Yoga at the UN headquarters on June 21.

In December 2014, the UN General Assembly had adopted a resolution proclaiming June 21 as the International Day of Yoga.

Modi will thereafter travel to Washington D.C., where he will receive a ceremonial welcome at the White House on June 22, and meet President Biden to continue their high-level dialogue, according to a statement issued by the



external affairs ministry said. The Bidens will host a state dinner in honour of the Prime

Minister the same evening. At the invitation of Congressional leaders, including the

Republican House of Representatives Kevin McCarthy and Democratic Senate Speaker Charles Schumer. Modi will address a joint sitting of the US Congress on June 22.

The next day, the Prime Minister will be hosted at a luncheon jointly by Vice President Kamala Harris and Secretary of State Antony Blinken.

In addition to the official engagements, Modi is scheduled to have several curated interactions with leading CEOs, professionals, and other stakeholders.

He will also meet members of the Indian diaspora.

After wrapping up the US trip, the Prime Minister will then head to Egypt for a state visit from June 24-25.

The visit is at invitation of Egyptian President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi, which he extended

to Modi in January 2023 when he had graced the Republic Day celebrations as the chief guest.

This will be Modi's first visit to Egypt.

Apart from his talks with President Sisi, the Prime Minister is likely to interact with senior dignitaries from the Egyptian government, some prominent personalities, as well as the Indian community in the African nation.

Relations between India and Egypt are based on ancient trade and economic linkages as well as cultural and deep-rooted people-to-people ties, according to the External Affairs Ministry statement.

During the state visit of President Sisi in January, it was agreed to elevate the relationship to a 'strategic partnership'.

Blinken to travel to China this weekend



After he cancelled his initial visit to Beijing earlier this year due to a Chinese spy balloon transiting the US, Secretary of State Antony Blinken will embark on a fresh visit to the Asian giant this weekend amid thawed bilateral ties.

Blinken will be the first Biden administration official to travel to China and also the first since 2019, reports CNN.

Confirming the visit, Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian and Pacific Affairs Daniel Kritenbrink said on Wednesday that the two nations came "to the shared conclusion that now is the right time to engage at this level".

Kritenbrink said he would not expect "a long list of deliverables" to come out of the visit, but described it as "a really critical series of engagements that we'll have in Beijing at a crucial time in the relationship that we again hope will, at a minimum, reduce the risk of miscalculation so that we do not veer into potential conflict".

He said the agenda would focus on three main goals: establishing communication channels "that are open and empowered to discuss important

challenges, address misperceptions and prevent miscalculation"; discussing US concerns "on a range of issues" as well as on "a host of regional and global security matters"; and "exploring potential cooperation on transnational challenges when it is in our interest in areas such as climate and global macroeconomic stability".

In recent months, there have been a number of engagements between US and Chinese officials, including National Security Adviser Jake Sullivan and Kritenbrink himself.

"I think there's a realisation on both sides that it is important to have these channels of communication," CNN quoted the Assistant Secretary as saying.

In a statement also on Wednesday, State Department spokesperson Matthew Miller said that Blinken would meet "senior PRC officials" while in Beijing, adding that "we expect a series of visits in both directions in the period ahead" following the Secretary of State's visit.

But neither Kritenbrink or Miller did not say if Blinken would meet Chinese President Xi Jinping.

Canadian police probe China meddling claims



Police in Canada have launched a probe into claims that China sought to intimidate MP Michael Chong and his family, the media reported.

Addressing a parliamentary committee here on Tuesday, Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) interim commissioner Michael Duheme said that the force was only made aware of the allegation connected to Chong via Canadian media, reports the BBC. A series of media reports, many based on leaked intelligence briefings and information accusing China of attempting to interfere in Canadian elections, have been published in recent months. "When we were made aware of it, we approached Chong and began the investigation," Duheme told federal lawmakers.

The investigation is one of more than 100 current RCMP probes looking into foreign interference within Canada, he added. Canada's intelligence agency believes Beijing sought details about Chong and his relatives in Hong Kong in an effort to deter "anti-China positions", the BBC reported. It came after the politician put forward a motion in Parliament in 2021 that declared China's treatment of its ethnic Uyghur minority population a genocide.

India appreciates UN resolution on setting up memorial wall for fallen peacekeepers



NEW DELHI: Prime minister Narendra Modi on Thursday expressed delight over the UN General Assembly's resolution to set up a new Memorial Wall for fallen peacekeepers.

"Delighted that the Resolution to establish a new Memorial Wall for fallen Peacekeepers, piloted by India, has been adopted in the UN General Assembly. The Resolution received a record 190 co-sponsorships. Grateful for everyone's support," he tweeted.

On Wednesday, the UN General Assembly passed a resolution, "By the resolution, which was adopted without a vote, the Assembly welcomed Member States' initiative to establish - within three years of the text's adoption - a memorial wall at United Nations Headquarters in New York honouring the memory of fallen peacekeepers".

"In deciding that its planning, construction, upkeep and maintenance will be funded entirely from voluntary contributions, the Assembly invited interested Member States to provide voluntary contributions to that end.

"It also decided to give prominence to the memorial wall by including it in the solemn ceremonies conducted on the International Day of United Nations Peacekeepers and other United Nations peacekeeping-related events," the resolution said.

The headline of the advisory said that the session will be led by Modi. The International Day of Yoga is coinciding with the Prime Minister's state visit to the US, which is scheduled between June 21-25.

He has been invited by President Joe Biden. "Recognising its universal appeal, on 11 December 2014,



the UN proclaimed 21 June as the International Day of Yoga through a resolution. The International Day of Yoga aims to raise awareness worldwide of the many benefits of practicing yoga," the UN advisory said.

"The draft resolution establishing the International Day of Yoga was proposed by India and endorsed by a record 175 member states. The proposal was first introduced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his address during the opening of the 69th session of the General Assembly," it added.

"We love to support people building on our platform. Some of our teams here today are happy to help with that," Sam Altman, CEO of OpenAI, said during a meeting with Korean businesspeople in Seoul. "We're exploring investing more in Korean startups. And we'd be very excited to explore the joint chip collaborations to develop AI accelerators."

Before working with the Microsoft-backed OpenAI, Altman said he had run a firm that invests in startups and had success in funding deep tech firms, reports Yonhap news agency.

"It was my great passion in investing. I really want to see a lot more of that in the world," he added.

The 38-year-old American businessman is on a world tour, meeting political and business leaders in several countries, including the United Arab Emirates, India and South Korea.

He said he was impressed by Korean people's reception of up-to-date AI technology led by ChatGPT and interested in their innovative products, both software and hardware.

"Korea is one of the places in the world that has adopted OpenAI most the earliest, use it the most creatively. It's amazing to see what people are doing here," he said. "Those two combined with the culture of innovation and what's happening with the use of AI, particularly OpenAI, make us very excited to collaborate more deeply with the country."

Since OpenAI launched ChatGPT 3.5 late last year, people were amazed by the content-creating generative AI technology. At the same time, talks about its future and threat to humans have also come into the spotlight across the world.

Some countries led by the European Union have been moving to regulate generative AI technologies and services, while South Korea has been working on a rule to foster AI products and place liability on service providers in a less restrictive way.

Altman said he had talks with many leaders on the issue during his trip, and South Korea can play a role in the global conversation to shape a new global framework.

Khalistani separatist and mastermind of attack on Indian High Commission dies in UK

Avtar Singh Khanda, a Punjab-origin Khalistani separatist and mastermind of the attack on the Indian High Commission in London, died in a hospital in the UK on Thursday due to blood cancer.

He was the head of Khalistan Liberation Force.

A bomb expert, Khanda, who was the principal orchestrator of the March 19 violence at the Indian High Commission in London, was handler of arrested 'Waris Punjab De' Chief Amritpal Singh.

Confirming the death, UK-based Khalsa Aid founder Ravi Singh has put a post on Instagram. Khanda, who belongs to Punjab's Moga town, was arrested by British authorities in March in connection with vandalism with his supporters to protest crackdown on Amritpal.



On Wednesday, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) had put out a series of photos on Twitter a "request for identification/information" of individuals who were "involved" in the attack on the High Commission.

One of the individuals in the NIA photos were Khanda. "They caused grievous injuries to an official and disrespected the Indian National Flag," the NIA post said.

Over 600 migrants cross English Channel in a day: UK govt

The UK Home Office said that more than 600 migrants crossed the English Channel on June 11 -- the highest number so far this year on a single day.

In a statement on Monday, the Office said a total of 616 people were detected making the journey from France in 12 small boats, reports the BBC. The previous single-day high for this year was 497 people on April 22. According to the Home Office, the total number of migrants who have crossed the English Channel in 2023 has increased to over 8,000 -- about 2,000 less than at the same point last year.

At this time last year, the cumulative figure had just passed 10,000 and the total number of crossings in 2022 was 45,755.

Responding to the Home Office's announcement, a No 10 spokesman said: "There is a great deal of work going on which is stopping these criminal gangs in their tracks.

"But, clearly, crossings are



continuing and that is because we have not been able to put in place our full plans; and obviously there is a great deal of work across government to that end." The latest development came after Prime Minister Rishi Sunak said last week that his plan to reduce the number of migrants crossing the Channel in boats was working and numbers were down for the first time. Sunak told the BBC that crossings to the UK were down by a fifth, and figures for Albanians heading to Britain

were down by 90 per cent.

The Prime Minister has made reducing the number of Channel crossings a key part of his premiership, including via the Illegal Migration Bill.

The plans would mean anyone reaching the UK without permission would be detained and promptly deported, either to their home country or a third country such as Rwanda.

The bill would create broad new detention and search powers, and migrants would be barred from claiming asylum.

Makers of Jaswant Singh Khalra biopic move Bombay HC for censor clearance



The biopic based on the life of prominent human rights activist, Jaswant Singh Khalra has been subjected to delays owing to the clearance for the censor certificate. The makers of the film moved the Bombay High Court and asked for legal intervention.

The yet-to-be-titled film, which is directed by Honey Trehan, and headlined by actor-singer Diljit Dosanjh, has hit the roadblock and the makers have sought legal help from the court.

Following Operation Blue Star, the assassination of Indira Gandhi, and the 1984 Anti-Sikh Riots, the police were empowered to detain anyone as suspected terrorists. The police were accused of killing unarmed suspects in staged shootouts, and burning thousands of dead bodies to cover up the murders.

Jaswant Singh Khalra was the director of a bank in Amritsar during the militancy period in Punjab. He found the evidence of abduction, elimination and cremation of thousands of unidentified bodies by the police. They reportedly even killed 2,000 of their own officers who refused to collaborate in these extra judicial operations.

It was Khalra's investigation that sparked worldwide protests and led to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) concluding that the Punjab police had unlawfully cremated 2,097 people in the Tarn Taran district of Punjab alone. The Supreme Court of India and the National Human Rights Commission certified the validity of his data. On September 6, 1995, Khalra disappeared and a case of murder, abduction and criminal conspiracy was registered on the complaint of his wife, Paramjit Kaur.

No Indian film will be exhibited if 'Adipurush' doesn't correct mistake: Kathmandu Mayor

KATHMANDU: After placing a map of "Greater Nepal" at his office in retaliation at the "Akhand Bharat" mural in the new Indian Parliament building, Kathmandu Metropolitan City Mayor Balen Shah on Thursday announced that no Indian movie will be allowed to be exhibited within the capital territory if South Indian movie "Adipurush" does not correct the "mistake" about the birthplace of Sita.

Nepal's Censor Board also decided to hold back permission to the upcoming Indian epic mythological film, based on the Hindu epic "Ramayana", for the same reason.

In "Adipurush", it is mentioned that "Sita is the daughter of India", Shah said in a tweet on Thursday, adding that until this mistake will not be corrected in India and



Nepal, no Indian movie will be allowed to be shown within the Kathmandu metropolitan city limit.

The film is written and directed by Om Raut and produced by T-Series and Retro-piles. Shot simultaneously in Hindi and Telugu languages, the film has courted controversy in India too.

Mayor Shah, on June 8,

placed the map of "Greater Nepal" in his chamber to counter the "Akhand Bharat" map placed in India's new parliament building. Some other local elected representatives followed his example.

The main opposition, CPN-UML has demanded to send a diplomatic note to India to protest the "Akhand" map.

The government should

immediately send a diplomatic note to India protesting against the Indian mural that has allegedly depicted some places of Nepal in it, Raghuj Pant, an UML lawmaker said in Parliament on Thursday.

The new Indian map has incorporated some of the Nepali territories like Lumbini and Kapilvastu, the birthplace of Gautam Buddha. Nepal and India are already facing the boundary row over Kalapani, Lipu Lekh, and Limpiydhura.

At one time, the territory of Nepal spread from Teesta in the east to Sutlej in the west. However, after a war with the British, it lost a large part of its land. After the war, the territories from Mechi to Teesta and from Mahakali to Sutlej were permanently annexed to India.

We believe our result in Junior Asia Cup would not have been possible if not for this kind of scientific support system to train».

India's ICC Trophy dream shattered

Another day of disappointment unfolded for Indian cricket fans as Rohit Sharma and his team suffered a disheartening defeat against Australia in the final of the World Test Championship. The loss in this high-stakes encounter further extends India's unfortunate streak in ICC tournaments since their glorious triumph in the 2013 Champions Trophy.

Despite consistently reaching the knockout stages in subsequent tournaments, India has been unable to replicate their earlier success. Hopes were high that the bitter memories of the 2021 World Test Championship final loss would be forgotten as the Indian team embarked on a new journey in 2022 under the leadership of coach Rahul Dravid. Rohit Sharma assumed the captaincy across all three formats, taking over from Virat Kohli, while the appointment of Rahul Dravid as the head coach was expected to bring a winning mentality and a sense of calmness to the



squad. The stage was set for India to showcase their mettle in the upcoming tournaments, including the Asia Cup 2022 and the T20 World Cup in Australia, with the aim of overcoming past disappointments and returning with silverware.

However, the Asia Cup campaign started on a positive note with a thrilling victory over Pakistan, followed by another win against Hong Kong, securing India's position at the top of the group. Regrettably, the Super 4 stages saw a reversal of fortunes as Pakistan avenged their earlier defeat, and

Sri Lanka further dashed India's hopes by defeating them, denying their entry into the final. These results exposed the persistent issues of finding the right combination and lacking specialists for the T20 format, which had plagued the Indian team throughout the Asia Cup. The same challenges persisted as India entered the T20 World Cup. While they began their campaign with an exhilarating victory over Pakistan, the subsequent match against South Africa served as a wake-up call, highlighting the vulnerabilities in the team.
