Delhi flood row: ITO, Rajghat flooded, Yamuna Modi becomes first Indian PM to waters reach close to SC; 3 boys drown receive France's highest award

NEW DELHI: The raging Ya muna showed signs of calming on Friday but the breach in a drain regulator led to water logging in some parts of Delhi such as the ITO, with flood water reaching close to the Supreme Court complex, causing hardship for the people.

Water also entered the Mahatma Gandhi memorial at Rajghat due to backflow from a drain in the area.

Three boys drowned while bathing in the floodwaters in northwest Delhi's Mukundpur Chowk area. These were the first deaths reported in the city since the Yamuna water crossed the danger mark last Monday.

While Delhi Fire Services Director Atul Garg claimed the deaths occurred in a ditch at a metro construction site, the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) issued a clarification, saying, "No such

incident has been reported from our sites." "DMRC's sites are properly barricaded



and entry is strictly regulated only for authorised personnel," it said. After breaching the 45-year-

old record three days ago, water levels in the Yamuna in Delhi came down to 208.02 metres at 10 pm on Friday. However, that did not stop the floodwaters from reaching central Delhi, the nerve centre of the national capital.

PSB Privatisation unlikely before 2024 general election

NEW DELHI: No Public Sector Banks (PSB) are expected to undergo privatisation before the 2024 general election. According to a top government official, "Nothing will happen before the 2024 general elections. We don't have legislation yet for it; without that, privatisation is not possible." India currently has 12 PSBs, including Central Bank of India, Bank of Baroda, Bank of India, State Bank of India, Canara Bank, Indian Bank, Bank of Maharashtra, Indian Overseas Bank, Punjab & Sind Bank, Union Bank of India, Puniab National Bank, and UCO Bank. Bank privatisation has been on the anvil for successive governments, but the plan hasn't progressed due to stiff opposition from trade unions. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said, while presenting Budget 2021-22, had announced the privatisation of PSB as part of the disinvestment drive to accumulate Rs 1.75 lakh crore.

Lord Swraj Paul donates GBP 500,000 to London maternity unit

LONDON: Leading NRI industrialist Lord Swraj Paul has donated GBP 500,000 towards the refurbishment of the maternity unit of a north-west London hospital, marking the 75th anniversary of the state-funded National Health Service (NHS).



Parts of Delhi still flooded despite receding water level

DELHI: Despite the receding water level of the Yamuna river after reaching a a historic high, several areas in Delhi remained flooded on Friday

In the wake of the overflowing water, the Delhi government had closed schools, colleges, crematoriums and water treatment plants in the affected areas. As of 6 a.m. on Friday morning, the water level of the river stood at at 208.46 meters, slightly lower than the previous night's mea-

surement of 208.66 meters. The Central Water Commission has forecasted a further decrease in the water leves, estimating it to reach 208.30 meters by 1 p.m. in the afternoon. However, the floodwaters from the Yamuna have affected certain parts of the national capital and on Friday it also reached the ITO, resulting in a significant traffic jam.

'PADMA' Scheme, being introduced to boost MSME in Haryana Two earthquakes hit Jammu anḋ Kashmir′s **Doda region**

Jammu and Kashmir experienced two medium-intensity arthquakes on Monday morning, with no reports of casualties or property damage. The National Center for Seismology (NCS) provided details of the seismic activity.

The first earthquake, measuring 4.9 on the Richter scale, occurred at 5.38 AM. Its epicenter was located in the Doda region of Jammu and Kashmir, at a depth of 10 kilometers. Shortly after, at 5.43 AM, a second earthquake measuring 3.6 on the Richter scale occurred in the same Doda region, at a depth of eight kilometers.

The region of Kashmir is known to be seismically active, making it highly vulnerable to earthquakes. In the past, devastating earthquakes have caused significant damage in this area.

In 2005, a 7.6 magnitude earthquake resulted in the loss of over 80,000 lives on both sides of the Line of Control (LoC), the de facto border between Indian-administered and Pakistani-administered regions of Kashmir. However, the recent earthquakes have not caused any significant harm, providing relief to the residents of Jammu and Kashmir.

Flawed plan: Manipur Police ask farmers to contact SP before field visits

In what can only be described as a poorly executed plan to provide security arrangements to farmers, the Manipur Police have issued a directive, urging farmers not to venture out to their agricultural fields without notifying the respective Superintendent of Police (SP) in their districts. The announcement was made by Inspector General of Police I I Muivah during a press conference at the Manipur Police Headquarters Muivah said: "At this point, farmers should not venture out to the field all by themselves without informing police. Because that will be very hazardous and risky. And we would appeal to the public that they should meet with SP and inform them about their requirements and the SP will accordingly make security arrangements and that the farming activities be done in coordination like that with the security forces. During the press conference, media personnel inquired about the provision of a dedicated phone number for farmers to contact the SP more easily. However, to the disappointment of many, Muivah could not provide such a number, making it appear that the government has not prepared well enough to address the situation.

Why Haryana Govt adamant on imposing Chest conditions on women foresters?

The recent recruitment process for the posts of Forest Ranger, Deputy Ranger and Forester by the Haryana Government has become an issue of controversy. In this, the condition of chest measurement prescribed for females is being demanded to be repealed by the opposition saying that it is insulting and insensitive to women, while the government has made it a prestige issue. Accusations and counter-accusations are being made from both the sides, no one is paying any attention towards the solution. After all, why is the government adamant on making it a point of ego?

According to the condition set by the government, the minimum chest requirement for women for the above posts - 74 cm without expansion and 79 cm with expansion, has been made necessary. The opposition alleges that when the Haryana government does not impose any chest condition for the recruitment of women even in the police force, then why this condition in the lesser hard jobs in the Forest Department? he government is pleading

After three days of continuous rain and flood situation, twin city Ambala, famous for the scientific instruments industry at Ambala Cantt as well as country's biggest wholesale cloth market in Ambala city has suffered a loss worth over Rs 350 crore. The 'Science City' Ambala Cantt having more han 1000 industrial units located in industrial area as well as in thickly populated areas providing employment to nearly 20000 persons in which according to Saurabh Nagpal Vice President of Ambala Science Equipment Manufacturers Association loss worth over Rs 300 crore has been extimated so far due to water entered inside the factories between 6 to 10 feet height in as many as 106 MSME units not only damaging the machinery but also raw and finished good stocks. Information reveals that the exact value of loss due to water will be estimated later on since there are still units flooded with water.

NEW DELHI: Even as the Tamil Nadu BJP state president and former IPS officer, K. Annamalai has time and again been making unruly comments against the AIADMK and its leaders, the central leadership of the BJP is keen that the party is in its fold.

The invitation extended to AIADMK general secretary and former Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Edappadi K. Palaniswami (EPS) to attend the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) meeting on July 18 at New Delhi is a clear indicator to this.

There were reports of the BJP trying to go it alone in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections from Tamil Nadu. However, sources in the BJP told to media that the national leadership had conducted a detailed survey on the prospects of the party and found that without the AIADMK it would not stand a chance to win any seat on its own

It may be noted that for the past five decades, politics in Tamil Nadu revolved around the Dravidian majors, and the Congress, which had once ruled Tamil Nadu, is relegated to political oblivion without the support of a Dravidian major. If the Congress which had once ruled Tamil Nadu is relegated to a minor party status, then the BJP, which had never got proper recognition in the state, will not be able to do anything without the support of a Dravidian major. sovereignty of all nations, international law and the rules-based international order. On 25 years of strategic partnership between India and France, Modi told Les

Echos that "I feel we are now at a turning point. If we look at the post-pandemic global order and the shape that it is taking, I think the positive experience of

our strategic partnership is an important step ahead". "So, we look forward to work-



ing on a roadmap for the next 25 years of the strategic partnership, which I think is very important for the relationship. The relationship is in excellent shape. It is strong, trusted and consistent. It has been steady and resilient in the darkest storms. It has been bold and ambitious in looking for opportunities." Highlighting the significance of India in promoting issues of the Global South. the Prime Minister said: "I see India being that strong shoul-

der that if Global South has to make that high jump, India can be that shoulder to propel it ahead. For the Global South, India can also build its linkages with Global North.

"So, in that sense, this shoulder can become this bridge of sorts. So, I feel that what we

need is to strengthen this shoulder, this bridge so that linkages between the North and South can become stronger and the Global South can itself become stronger." On being asked as to why the Indo-US relationship has seen a phenomenal rise in the last few years, Modi said: "It is true that the relationship has been growing positively since the turn of the century. 

Manipur braces for loss of 1543.23 metric tons of rice, **Bishnupur District hit hardest**

The agriculture sector in Manipur is facing a severe blow due to the ongoing violence, which could result in a staggering loss of 1543.23 metric tons of rice next year if the main crop cannot be cultivated.

N Gojendro, the director of the Department of Agriculture, reported that as of June, the violence had already impacted around 5127 hectares of agricultural land in Manipur. He expressed concern, stating, "If we cannot cultivate in these areas, Manipur will face a loss of 15,437.23 metric tonnes of

rice next year.

Gojendro explained that Manipur has a total of 195,000 hectares of land dedicated to the cultivation of rice during the Kharif season. However, due to the ongoing conflict, an inquiry was conducted to identify the areas where agricultural activities cannot be carried out. The report revealed that as of June, 5127 hectares of land had been affected. The unrest in Manipur has had a detrimental impact on farming and agricultural activities across various districts of the state. Bishnupur District has been the most severely affected, with 2191 hectares of land impacted, while Jiribam District has experienced the least impact, with only 37 hectares affected, Gojendro said.

The current situation has prevented agricultural activities in sensitive areas, and this will undoubtedly have an adverse effect on rice production. Gojendro emphasized, "If the agricultural activities cannot be carried out in these 5127



hectares of land, we estimate a loss of approximately 1543.23 metric tons of rice next year. In monetary terms, this would amount to a loss of around 39 crores." Given the current situation, the state government has been taking measures to address the situation and provide relief to farmers. Gojendra

highlighted the state government's efforts, stating, "Several meetings have already been convened in the department, minor irrigation department, water resource department, and many other departments.'

To mitigate the expected loss, the government seems to have initiated the distribution of high-yielding varieties of rice to affected farmers. Gojendro explained, "We have distributed a certain quantity of rice mainly to the affected areas through district agriculture officers. I hope that they have already received it." He further added: "Additionally, the agriculture department has made efforts to ensure timely access to fertilizers for farmers to properly harvest their crops A substantial quantity of fertilizer has been stored for distribution. with Gojendro himself recently distributing 62,000 bags. District agriculture officers are also distributing fertilizers in their

respective districts."



Extensions of ED, CBI heads bad for agency autonomy

n a verdict that questions the underpinnings of institutional autonomy in India, the Supreme Court recently validated 2021 legislative changes that authorize successive term extensions for heads of investigative agencies. While the Court's move to invalidate two one-year extensions to the Enforcement Director, S.K. Mishra, is worthy of applause, the broader fallout of the judgment appears to sanction a governmental erosion of these agencies' self-reliance. The Court has mandated that Mishra vacate his role by July 31. A central consequence of this latest judgment is its affirmation of amendments enabling yearly extensions for CBI and ED Directors until a five-year tenure is reached. This mechanism effectively converts an initial twovear appointment into a potential five-year stint, courtesy of up to three annual extensions. Several voices, including those contesting Mishra's extension and the Court's appointed amicus curiae, have highlighted the jeopardy to institutional independence posed by such incremental extensions. They warn of a potential incentive-based approach that might compel Directors to conform to government mandates. Unfortunately, the Court dismissed these legitimate apprehensions, providing minimal explanation. It sidestepped claims that the 2021 alterations contravene previous rulings that stipulated fixed tenures for CBI and ED leaders, with the objective of shielding them from undue influence. The Court's unexpected determination that these amendments do not breach fundamental rights is baffling. The prospect of government dominance over the investigative directions chosen by Directors fundamentally violates citizens' entitlements to equitable treatment and impartial investigation. The Court's sanction of a tenure-extension mechanism, potentially tailored to compromise the independence of investigative agencies, is deeply concerning, especially amidst the current backdrop of suspicions regarding the misuse of these agencies against political rivals. Such a trend spells ill for our nation's commitment to the rule of law. It accentuates the pressing ne-


SONALDE DESAI EXPLAINS HOW INDIA'S DEMOGRAPHIC JOURNEY HAS REVOLUTIONISED WOMEN'S LIFE STAGES

The change in women's lives

passage of World Population Day (July 11) is also a time to look at how India's demographic journey has changed the lives of its citizens, particularly its women. India's population grew from about 340 million at Independence to 1.4 billion. This growth was fuelled by the gift of life that receding starvation, improved public health, and medical miracles brought to India. In 1941, male life expectancy was about 56 years; only 50% of boys survived to age 28. Today, life expectancy for men is 69 years, and nearly 50% live to see the ripe old age of 75. This rapid decline in mortality took parents by surprise, who no longer needed to have four children to ensure that at least two would survive, causing population growth until fertility decline caught up with the mortality decline, and the Total Fertility Rate fell from 5.7 in 1950 to 2.1 in 2019.

These statistics mask the tectonic shift in the lives of people as they learn to adjust to a longer lifespan and fewer children. Nowhere is this more apparent than in the lives of Indian women. Women's childhood, adulthood, and old age have been transformed over the course of demographic transition, sometimes positively, sometimes negatively.

As families began having fewer children, ensuring at least one son became more difficult. With four children, the chance of not having a son was barely 6%, but with two children, it grew to 25%. Social norms and patrilocal kinship patterns combined with lack of financial security reinforce a preference for sons. The India Human Development Survey (IHDS) found that 85% of women respondents expected to rely on their sons for old age support, while only 11% expected support from their daughters. Hence, parents who want to ensure that they have at least one son among their one or two child family, resorted to sex-selective abortion, and, in some cases, the neglect of sick daughters. Consequently, the number of



girls per 100 boys, ages under five dropped from 96 to 91 between 1950 and 2019.

With a fertility decline, active mothering occupies a smaller proportion of women's lives, creating space for education and employment. Good data on this only goes back 30 years, but my research with Sojin Yu, based on the National Family Health Survey finds that the number of years women spend caring for children under five declined from 14 years in 1992-93 to eight in 2018-20; the years spent caring for children ages six to 15 dropped from 20 to 14 years. These changes are only partly accompanied by changes in the life course of women. While women's educational attainment increased, with over 70% of girls enrolling in secondary education, early marriage and childbearing remain the predominant forces defining women's lives. As a recent article by Park, Hathi, Broussard, and Spears documents, the average age at first birth has hardly budged about 20 for women born in the 1940s and still remains well below 22 years for those born in the 1980s.

Early motherhood, perhaps, explains why lower fertility does not translate into higher labour force participation for women.

Women need to establish secure connections to the labour market and gain work experience if they are to get skilled jobs. By the time peak childcare demands end, they have missed the window for occupations that require specific skills; only unskilled work is open to them.

Demographic shifts also affect women's lives at older ages. With rising life expectancy, the proportion of the female population aged 65 and above increased from 5% to 11% between 1950 and 2022, and is projected to reach 21% by 2050. While the proportion of older men will also increase, aging for women has unique implications. Women generally marry men who are older and are more likely to outlive their husbands. The 2011 Census shows that while only 18% of men above age 65 are widowed, about 55% of the women are widowed. For widowed women, the lack of access to savings and property results in dependence on children, mainly sons, bringing the vicious cycle of son preference to full circle.

Harnessing gender dividend

Changing patriarchal norms may take a

long time. Meanwhile, enhancing women's access to employment and assets will reduce their reliance on sons and could break the vicious cycle of gendered disadvantage, stretching from childhood to old age. However, unlike East Asian nations where demographic transformation has led to delayed and often foregone marriage and childbearing, early marriage and childbearing remain central to Indian women's lives. Hence, any efforts at improving women's labour force participation must be accompanied by access to safe and affordable childcare.

A World Bank evaluation based on a randomised controlled trial in Madhya Pradesh found that the expansion of Anganwadis to include a crèche led to an increase in the work participation of mothers. Arguably, the most striking example of the importance of childcare is documented in a study based in urban China by Du and Dong; it found that as state support for childcare declined, employment rates for mothers fell from 88% to 66%.

What are the practical strategies for enhancing childcare access? One relatively low-hanging fruit would be to make staffing crèche an acceptable form of work under the National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (NREGS). At present, NREGS is being used to build physical infrastructure but there is no reason it cannot be used to develop social infrastructure where NREGS workers can help staff crèches. The burgeoning selfhelp group movement can be harnessed to set up neighbourhood child-care centres in urban and rural areas. Obtaining the much hoped for demographic dividend cannot be done without fully harnessing the gender dividend. Improving access to childcare is an important component of achieving this.



Citizen action needed for cleaner politics

hat does a comprehensive look at the background of all the 4,001 sitting Members of the Legislative Assemblies across India tell us about the state of Indian politics? Can India's aspirations to be a globally respected economic and cultural power be fulfilled with the kind of politics it has?

All candidates now follow stipulations following a Supreme Court of India judgment, filing self-sworn affidavits which record the details of criminal cases they have, if any. Of the 4.001 sitting MLAs, 1,777 of them, or 44%, have a criminal case. The current Lok Sabha also has 43% Members of Parliament (MP) with criminal cases. In 2004, the percentage was around 22%, and has now doubled. Many people feel that the cases are either trivial ones tically motivated. In the 2019 Lok Sabha, the BJP had 116 MPs with a criminal record, the INC 29, DMK 10, Trinamool Congress 9, and JD(U) 13. When it came to serious criminal cases, the BJP has 87 MPs. INC 19, DMK 6, Trinamool Congress 4, and JD(U) 8. Even Union Ministers are tainted. In the case of their first swearing in during 2019, there were 22 Ministers out of 56 with criminal cases and a total of 61 cases against these 22 Ministers, all from the ruling party. The chances of those with a criminal record winning was over 15%. In comparison, it was 4.7% for those with a clean record. This shows that people with a criminal record are more likely to get elected. No other country has so many people with known criminal records in nt or State Asseml

of 40 lakh for MLAs and 70 lakh for MPs (enhanced to 90 lakh in 2022), which is the limit the Election Commission of India (ECI) has set in consultation with political parties. Public money is spent to promise freebies such as free water, electricity, travel, and food to name a few. The number of MLAs and MPs with criminal records has risen only because their party leaders continue to distribute more tickets to such candidates. In the so-called advanced countries, there is no such system of distributing tickets. Candidates are selected either by a first-round primary, as in the U.S., or by a more open and democratic process, as in many European countries.

In summary, India has a system where there are a very significant number of elected representatives with a serious criminal record. ch people are more likely to wir ers. Electoral laws are flouted while spending money. So far, the ECI has taken very little action on this. Political leaders continue to distribute tickets to such people. Winning is the means by which to recover the money spent and accumulate it for the next election. Media management, especially through social media, passes off as good governance. We will see more of this in the next Lok Sabha election in 2024. Every party fears that it will lose if it undertakes reforms. Media management can impact public perception for some time. Eventually, more and more Indians will get to know the truth. Perhaps that is the moment when change will happen. That is when the potential of the country will be realised. Citizen action can speed up this process.

Tesla car for Rs 20 lakh in India still a distant dream: experts

As reports surfaced on Tesla considering a cheaper Model 3 in India around Rs 20 lakh as it mulls bringing its supply chain ecosystem to the country in the near future, industry experts on Thursday said achieving this price range appears to be a distant dream.

If all goes well, Tesla can reportedly produce 5 lakh electric vehicles annually that starts from Rs 20 lakh, as the Elon Musk-run company plans to set up its auto parts and electronics chain in India, along with seeking incentives and tax benefits.

According to experts, Tesla prices are nearly the same across the globe and currently, the base variant of the Tesla Model 3, which is the cheapest Tesla model available, is priced at \$40, 240 (approximately Rs 33 lakh). Importing this model into India will incur a cost ranging between Rs 60-66 lakh. India imposes a 100 per cent import tax on electric vehicles (EVs)

But it seems that the troubles continue for Go First as on July 7, following the Delhi High Court's decision to permit aircraft lessors to conduct inspections and maintenance on aircraft leased to Go First Airlines, the airline's IRP has filed an appeal challenging the order.

Agra footwear manufacturers threaten to shutdown units over compulsory ISI mark



AGRA: The footwear manufacturers in Agra have threatened to shut down the units over the government's decision to enforce ISI standardisation in the footwear production process.

The move, which requires ISI marks on all footwear priced above Rs 150, has sparked concerns among small businesses in the cottage footwear manufacturing sector.

Upendra Singh Lovely, chairman of Agra Shoe Manufacturers Association highlighted that the expense of acquiring the ISI mark for each new footwear design can range from Rs 5,000 to Rs 10, 000, depending on the size of the business. Given that small businesses often operate on narrow profit margins, this additional cost becomes a major financial challenge.

Pointing out another concern, he said, "ISI mark will lead to the standardisation of footwear, which could stifle innovation. The ISI mark is awarded to products that meet certain standards of quality and safety. This means that all footwear that bears the ISI

mark will be of a similar standard. This could make it difficult for small businesses to differentiate their products from those of their competitors.

According to Somdatt Pippal, chairman of Kendriya Bhim Yuva Vyapar Mandal, the most affordable footwear in Agra is typically priced around Rs 150 and experiences high demand, and since this type of footwear is primarily produced by multigenerational family-run cottage units; the production process lacks significant standardisation.

"Imposing standardisation requirements on these units, would force them out of business as compliance with the standards would be challenging while maintaining their competitive price advantage," he said.

He highlighted that the cost of obtaining the ISI certification process is prohibitive for cottage units. Additionally, the requirement for footwear to be manufactured in a factory setting poses challenges for these smaller workshops that do not meet ISI's manufacturing standards.

Expenses on IPOs be given input credit in GST, **ASSOCHAM says ahead of GST Council meet**

DELHI: Ahead of the meeting of the GST Council,ASSOCHAM has made a strong case for making GST paid on expenses on the Initial Public Offerings (IPOs) eligible for input tax credit, stating such an option is permissible under the GST Act.

"GST paid on expenses towards IPOs are eligible for input tax credit, being expenses used in the course or furtherance of business," the chamber said in a comprehensive note submitted to the GST Council. It said a circular to this effect should be issued.

The apex industry organisation, after wider consultations with the stakeholders, said "The only provision which will be applicable to ITC on goods and services used for IPOs shall be Section 16(1) of the CGST Act, 2017. This section permits companies to

ASSOCHAM Secretary General Deepak Sood said, "IPOs have played a major role in raising equity capital for the companies, strengthening their balance sheets in the process. We would urge upon the GST Council to encourage companies to tap a vibrant

In another recommendation to the council, ASSOCHAM said the Employee Stock Options (ESOPs) are key incentives to promote and retain talents in the corporates, especially amongst the start-ups. Thus, the ESOPs should be kept out of the GST dispensation as these are " in nature of

The chamber also sought clarification stating that Corporate Guarantees or Director's Personal Guarantees issued for borrowing or letter of comfort for performance for group companies, should not be liable to GST. It said a transaction of corporate guarantee does not benefit the guarantor in any manner, but is only an act of safeguarding the interest of the group as a whole akin to a shareholder function. Hence, deeming such transactions as deemed supply and levying them to GST would result in a scenario where every act between related parties, though without consideration, would be liable to GST.

The other recommendations include rationalisation of levy of GST on intercompany cross charge and rationalising penalty provisions.

Indian students pursuing Masters in France to get 5-yrs work visa: PM Modi

Indian students pursuing Master's degree in France will now be given a five-year longterm post-study visa, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced

Modi, who is on an official visit to France at the invitation of President Emmanuel Macron, made the announcement during his address to the Indian community at LA Seine Musicale in Paris on Thursday.

"The last time I came to France, it was decided that Indian students studying in France would be given a two-year post-study work visa. Now, it has been decided that Indian students pursuing Masters in France will be given a long-term post-study visa of five years, " he said. During his address, the

Prime Minister also highlighted the contribution of the Indian community in France, who form a strong foundation of the India-France partnership.

Five Mexicans and Nepali pilot killed in helicopter crash near Mt Everest in $\overline{N}epal$

KATHMANDU: All six people, including five members of a Mexican family, were killed in a fiery crash of a private commercial helicopter near Mount Everest in eastern Nepal on Tuesday, a senior airport official said.

The Manang Air NA-MV chopper took off from Surke Airport in Solukhumbu district at 10:04 am for Kathmandu and suddenly lost contact at an altitude above 12,000 feet at 10:13 am, said Gyanendra Bhul, Manager at Tribhuvan International Airport (TIA).

The helicopter crashed in the Lamjura area of Likhupike Rural Municipality in the remote mountainous Solukhumbu district. TIA spokesperson Tkeknath Sitaula said all six bodies were found at the crash site during a search operation. They were returning to Kathmandu from Surke after enjoying a mountain flight. The flight was conducted from Lukla, the gateway to Mount Everest, Sitaula said. All six people aboard the

UN Special Envoy for Ye men, Hans Grundberg, has called on the warring parties in Yemen to make efforts for a "serious breakthrough" in the ongoing talks to end the conflict in the country.

Yemen has been locked in a military conflict since the Houthi militia took control of several northern cities and ousted the Yemeni government from the capital Sanaa in 2014, Xinhua news agency reported.

On April 2, 2022, the Yemeni government and the Houthi militia agreed upon a two-month truce brokered

by the United Nations, which was later renewed twice through October 2. However, Yemen's warring sides have failed to reach an agreement on further extension.

Despite the expiration of the truce, Yemen and its people continue to feel the benefits from the longest period of relative calm since the beginning of the conflict, Grundberg told a Security Council meeting on Monday.

The period of relative calm has opened the door for serious discussions with Yemeni actors on the way forward toward ending the conflict, he said, noting that to sustainably end the war, the ongoing talks "have to reach a serious breakthrough". The situation on the ground in Yemen remains fragile and challenging, said Grundberg, stressing that "we cannot afford to seek a seasonal peace".

The parties in Yemen need to immediately stop military provocations and prepare for and agree to a sustainable nationwide ceasefire, he said. They also need to immediately deescalate economically and address near- and longerterm economic priorities, Grundberg added.

Biden on Europe visit amid questions over NATO unity, munition to Ukraine

US President Joe Biden on Sunday embarked on Europe visit which is expected to be dominated by the US approval of munitions to Ukraine and bolstering North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) alliance.

During his five day trip from July 9-13, Biden will visit the UK, Lithuania and Finland to bolster NATO, White House Press Secretary Karine Jean-Pierre had said in a statement.

In the first leg of his visit, Biden will have a stopover in London on Sunday night. The US President on Monday has scheduled engagements with King Charles III and Prime Minister Rishi Sunak to further strengthen close relationship between the two nations. On July 11-12, the US President will Vilnius, Lithuania to attend the 74th NATO meeting during which leaders are set to discuss the war in Ukraine and bolstering the military alliance.
