In a dramatic turn of events, a missing army soldier, Javed Ahmad Wani, who had disappeared from his native Kulgam district in Kashmir while on leave, has been located and recovered by the Jammu and Kashmir Police. The police made the announcement via a post on X (formerly Twitter), revealing that a joint interrogation will take place following a medical checkup of the soldier. Javed Ahmad Wani, 25, and a resident of Achathal area in Kulgam district, had gone missing on July 29. He was on leave since June 29 and was preparing to rejoin his duties in Ladakh. On the evening of his disappearance, he left his home in Asthal, Kulgam, to buy groceries, as he was scheduled to return to Ladakh the following day.

Bhagwant Mann said that In order to compensate these people for loss of every single penny the Special Girdwari will be completed by August 15.

GST Collection Surges with 11% YoY growth in July 2023

India's gross GST revenue collected in the month of July, 2023 is Rs 1,65,105 crore of which CGST is Rs 29,773 crore, SGST is Rs 37,623 crore, IGST is Rs 85,930 crore (including Rs 41,239 crore collected on import of goods) and cess is Rs 11,779 crore (including Rs 840 crore collected on import of goods).

In the latest data released today, the government has settled Rs 39,785 crore to CGST and Rs33,188 crore to SGST from IGST. The total revenue of Centre and the

States in the month of July 2023 after regular settlement is Rs 69,558 crore for CGST and Rs 70,811 crore for the SGST.

The revenues for the month of July 2023 are 11% higher than the GST revenues in the same month last year. During the month, the revenues from domestic transactions (including import of services) are 15% higher than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year. It is for the fifth time, the gross GST collection has crossed Rs 1.60 lakh crore mark.

In June, GST collection was Rs 1,61,497 crore.

NIA raid on Khalsa Aid office is unfortunate action, says Harjinder Singh Dhami JAGMOHAN SINGH

Punjab Govt will fully compensate people suffered by people due to floods: Anurag Verma



Peace prevailed in Nuh-Sohna and Gurugarm after communal violence

Following Monday's communal violence in Nuh-Sohna, Mewat, in which six people, including two Homeguards, were killed and over 90 injured, including more than 20 police officers, the angry mob set fire to over 100 vehicles and left burnt vehicles on the highways. A large contingent of police and paramilitary forces was deployed in case of any untoward incidents. Law enforcement agencies are on the lookout not only on the ground but also in cyberspace for potential flashpoints that could spark further unrest in the region.

"Six people, including two members of the Home Guards and four civilians, died in the incident. So far, 116 people have been arrested. They are being remanded in custody. Those found guilty will not be spared. We are committed to the safety of the public. The overall situation in the state is normal. We



appeal to the public to maintain peace, calm and brotherhood," Haryana CM Khattar told a news agency. Some 93 criminal cases have been registered, including 46 in Nuh, 23 in Gurugram, three in Faridabad, three in Rewari and 18 in Palwal, said TVSN Prasad, Additional Chief Secretary (Home), adding that a Rapid Action Force centre would be set up in Nuh soon. The failure of the district administration to take action against communal elements has created a situation resembling

ana. A curfew has been imposed in the town for the past four days after the administration failed to take action against the communal leaders who triggered this violence.

The violence erupted in Nuh in an attempt to stop the annual Hindu religious procession through the Muslim-majority Nuh region, which spread to Gurugram in recent days. The Muslim community was outraged when it was announced that the procession would include Monu Manesar, who is a war zone in Neh and Sohna wanted by police for the murder areas of Mewat district in Haryof two Muslim men.

Over Rs 10000 cr VAT refund scam of Trade & Industry in Haryana

Haryana police recovered over Rs 112 crore from four major gangs allegedly involved in Goods and Services Tax (GST) scams. At least 89 people were arrested in these cases in 10 districts across the state. As many as 40 cases were registered with 89 arrests from four accused gangs (group of firms) allegedly defrauded the government exchequer to the

tune of over Rs 464.12 crore through fraudulent means in the state. The nexus of these fraudsters were active not only in Haryana but across the country, the Haryana police said. Then Director General of Police, Haryana said that these persons issued fraudulent invoices to numerous firms and companies without actual supply of goods through fraudulent E-way bills (GST related challans for transporting consignments) and facilitated fake ITC entitlement on GST portal through GSTR-3B form. The major goods involved in these GST invoice scams were scrap, iron and steel articles, cotton-yarn and paper and recovery of Rs 112



crore by unearthing fake GST Identification Numbers.

Giving details about their modus operandi, police said, the maximum number of E-way bills which were generated by these fraudsters were found to be fake on verification by the Sales Tax and Crime branch. These E-way bills mentioned vehicle numbers related to ambulances, government vehicles, motorcycles, private owned vehicles which are contrary to be used for commercial purposes. Further inquiry revealed that the bank account numbers which were shown in GST registration form of the bogus firm were also found dubious and the fraudsters used another fake bank account to deceive concerned government authorities.

Reject anything that potentially dents democracy

he recent communal clashes in Haryana have laid bare a deeply troubling tension in the region, resulting in many deaths and significant destruction. Sparked by a local religious procession, the incident escalated into a conflict, highlighting how quickly situations can unravel when political agendas, religious fervor, and social media provocation combine. Previously a peaceful local affair, the yatra has become politicized, with groups like the Vishwa Hindu Parishad mobilizing participants from neighboring states. This year's event was marked by provocative slogans and weapons, leading to a violent confrontation. The administration's lack of preparedness is a grave failure that must be addressed. Tensions had been building, fueled by social media threats from extremist groups. Despite warnings, the administration's response was inadequate, leading to further violence, including the vandalization of a mosque and the death of an Imam. The police's failure to control the situation raises serious concerns about law enforcement in Haryana. The Chief Minister's claim that the violence was premeditated points to a failure of intelligence and preventive measures. The role of groups associated with the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party in inciting tensions must be investigated. The Haryana administration must act decisively, bringing perpetrators to justice and ensuring such incidents do not recur. This includes legal action and rebuilding community trust. Social media incitement must be curbed, and law enforcement must be better trained and equipped. The Haryana events are a grim reminder of the fragility of our societal fabric. Ethnic and religious differences can be exploited for political gain, with tragic results. The government, law enforcement, and community leaders must foster understanding, tolerance, and peace. The lessons from Haryana call for a commitment to the values that bind us as a nation and a rejection of anything that betrays our democratic principles.

RAKESH SOOD EXPLAINS WHY COLD WAR ESCALATION MANAGEMENT LESSONS NO LONGER APPLY TO U.S.-RUSSIA RELATIONS

Nuclear signaling: Time for change conflict in Ukraine and the recourse to nuclear rhetoric have revived concerns about nuclear escalation management between the major nuclear powers. Since the end of the Cold War, the United States-Russia nuclear rivalry had taken a back seat. Instead, North Korea, Iran and India-Pakistan got attention, with many analysts getting nostalgic about 'nuclear stability' during the Cold War. But, as it is becoming clear now, in today's changed political environment the escalation management lessons of the Cold War no longer seem to work for the U.S. and Russia

Deterrence failure

In June 2021, U.S. and Russian Presidents, Joe Biden and Vladimir Putin, met in Geneva. Nuclear arms control was a high priority item on the agenda but no progress proved possible. As concerns grew about the Russian troop presence in Belarus on the Ukrainian border, Central Intelligence Agency Director Bill Burns flew to Moscow in November to spell out the consequences of aggression. In January 2022, U.S. Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken met Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov in Geneva to reiterate the message. On February 24, Russia began its "special military operation" in Ukraine. U.S. attempts to deter Russian aggression had failed.

Even as North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) leaders met to decide their response, Mr. Biden made it clear that the U.S. was determined to avoid a Third World War or allowing the conflict to escalate into a NATO-Russia conflict. After the freezing of Russian reserves and a slew of financial, energy-related and political sanctions, other elements of military assistance, lethal and non-lethal, began to take shape. Intelligence sharing and restoring Internet connectivity was the first step. The second was the supply of ammunition and some weapon systems which the Ukrainian forces were familiar with. NATO deepened its military involvement by providing gradually more and more sophisticated weapon systems, beginning with the Javelin and Stinger missiles, and moving on to Patriot missile defence batteries, long-range Himars, Storm Shadow and Scalp long-range missiles, and now F-16s. Russian attempts to deter NATO involvement had failed.

On February 7, 2022, Mr. Putin warned that "if Ukraine attempts to take back Crimea, European countries will be in conflict with Russia, which is a leading nuclear power superior to many NATO countries in terms of nuclear force". Annual nuclear exercises normally scheduled for autumn, were announced for February 17, with Mr. Putin personally witnessing them. Announcing the launch of "special military operations" his words of caution were, "whoever tries to hinder Russia will face consequences never seen in history". To drive home the threat, on February 27, Russian nuclear forces were placed on a "special combat readiness" with eave for all personnel cancelled.

Even as the U.S. issued blunt warnings to Russia against using tactical nuclear weapons in the first week of March, NATO decided against a no-fly-zone and Poland, Slovakia and Bulgaria announced that they would not be sending MiG aircraft to Ukraine on account of Russian threats against their airfields from where these aircraft were to take off. Russian officials tried to downplay the nuclear threat by pointing out that Russia would resort to nuclear use only if faced with an existential threat, while U.S. officials tried to convey reassurance to their European allies that while Mr. Putin's threats were to be taken seriously. there were no indications of unusual activity at nuclear sites

Mr. Biden declared on April 24, "We are neither encouraging nor enabling Ukraine to strike beyond its borders," adding that the "U.S. was not seeking regime change in Russia." In short, the U.S. objectives were to support Ukraine, bolster NATO unity and avoid any direct conflict with Russia. Ukraine is not a NATO member and so does not have the security of the nuclear umbrella provided by U.S. policy of 'extended deterrence'. Russia's resort to nuclear rhetoric failed to deter NATO involvement though it influenced its pace and timing. Therefore, both Russia and the U.S. are operating in a grey zone, taking turns at escalatory rhetoric even as they probe each other's red lines. Cold War lessons

Deterrence is fundamentally based on the assumption that both adversaries are rational enough to judge when costs outweigh the benefits of the act. Nuclear deterrence adds a conundrum. With their huge arsenals that provided for assured second strike capability, neither the U.S. nor the Soviet Union had an incentive to try a surprise first strike. This realisation was crucial in shaping nuclear deterrence theory

Thomas Schelling, whose writings during the 1960s and 1970s shaped nuclear deterrence thinking (he won the Economics Nobel in 2005), concluded that nuclear weapons were not usable but had political utility in terms of preventing a war with another nuclear power. Clearly, Schelling was looking at the situation between the U.S. and the Soviet Union which had no territorial dispute. Schelling also concluded that even though any use was "irrational", the nuclear threat had to be "credible" in order to deter. This introduced a degree of uncertainty into the equation. Using his economics training, he interpreted the uncertainty as risk that could be analysed in terms of probabilities. Risk was intended to induce rationality in the adversaries. Realising the conundrum, he concluded that the key to making nuclear deterrence credible is through escalation and raising the risk, that in the final analysis, leaves something to chance".

This, along with the lessons of the 1962 Cuban missile crisis kept the U.S. and Soviet rhetoric in check during the Cold War even as they engaged in proxy wars outside Europe, and away from NATO and Warsaw pact territories. Today, there is no Warsaw Pact, and NATO has expanded to include a number of former Warsaw Pact members. The Ukraine conflict has persuaded Sweden

and Finland to give up their long-standing neutrality and seek security under NATO's nuclear umbrella.

Russia's nuclear doctrine issued on June 2 2020 specifies two conditions under which Russia would use nuclear weapons: "...in response to the use of nuclear weapons and other types of weapons of mass destruction against it/or its allies" and "in the case of aggression against the Russian Federation with the use of conventional weapons, when the very existence of the state is put under threat". Mr. Putin has declared more than once that Ukrainians and Russians are one people with a shared history. Russia, therefore, does not see Ukraine as entirely 'sovereign'.

Second, there is the oft-cited escalate-todeescalate approach, that implies using tactical nuclear weapons to overcome a stalemate on the battlefield, thus forcing a termination of hostilities on favourable terms. In its 2022 National Security Strategy, the U.S. rejected this by declaring that first use would not lead to de-escalation on Russian terms, "but alter the nature of conflict creating potential for uncontrolled escalation".

U.S. caution is reflected in calibrating the supply of more sophisticated weapons by continuously probing Russian red lines even though Ukrainian demands continue to grow. Meanwhile, it suits Russia to increase ambiguity. It is also likely that since Russia failed to achieve its military objectives, its thresholds are evolving.


The path-breaking studies of Daniel Kahneman and Amos Tversky in economics showed that humans often tend to double down on bad bets because of 'loss aversion'. The Cold War escalation management lessons applied to a different world; today, the U.S. and Russia no longer enjoy parity and Russia's red lines are fuzzy. Nuclear signalling today is taking place in uncharted political territory. New guard rails are necessary if the nuclear taboo as to be preserved.



These days, the term "gig" is also representing those laborers in Indian society who are actively involved in various startups, playing a significant role in the development of modern India, and in reality, they are the backbone of these startups. In the current era of modernization, India's new entrepreneurs are trying to take credit for the fact that the most skilled workforce in the world is found in India. In big cities, when a customer get their preferred food items delivered within ten minutes of placing an order, it proves that companies like Swiggy, Zomato, and others are investing significantly in research and development for their workers. Similarly, in big cities, when a taxi is available to a customer within five to ten minutes through mobile applications like Ola and Uber, it saves them from the hassles of public transportation and also eliminates the risk of getting lost on unfamiliar routes. In addition to this, in big cities, using a virtual card, customers can have their preferred vegetables delivered by a delivery ployee Welfare Fund. Failure

The Rajasthan government has passed a bill in the legislative assembly to ensure the economic and social welfare of gig workers associated with various startups, making it a significant step for all gig workers in the country. According to the Rajasthan government, approximately 3-4 lakh people are currently engaged in such employment in Rajasthan. This law guarantees various economic and social security measures for all gig workers. Under its main provisions, the Rajasthan government will register all these workers on a portal and provide them with a unique code for individual identification. Through this portal, all registered gig workers will have direct access to the various social and economic welfare benefits offered by the Rajasthan government. Startups will also have to invest a specific amount in the Em-

including an annual interest rate of 12 percent and fines ranging from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 5 lakh, as mentioned in the legal provisions. The maximum limit for this penalty is fifty lakhs rupees. The bill also proposes the establishment of a welfare board for gig workers.

Several poignant scenes in the film depict gig workers delivering orders with multiple packages and inquiring about additional charges, only to be told that the charge is per package. It also highlights how gig workers consider themselves fortunate when they manage to reach home early one day. In this film, the children of a gig worker ask their father why he doesn't take

up another job? Many sensitive scenes like this portray the real-life struggles and financial situations of gig workers. The Rajasthan government, under Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot, has been in discussions for various social welfare schemes across the country, starting with an expansion of healthcarerelated facilities. Now, with the passing of the law concerning the economic security of gig workers, it has further extended the scope of social welfare. In a democratic society, it is the government's responsibility to ensure the economic and social well-being of marginalized sections of society. The passing of these provisions in Rajasthan raises the question of whether other states will follow suit and implement similar legal measures for the welfare of gig workers.

FMCG, Retail witness 23% decline in new job opportunities: Naukri

NEW DELHi: The Naukri on the domestic economy, such JobSpeak Index for July has revealed that sectors like FMCG, retail, BPO, insurance, and education showed a 16-23% decrease in new job opportunities compared to the previous year.

For white-collar jobs in India there was a significant drop of 19% in hiring compared to the same period last year. The EAM suggested a plan with four pillars for intensified trade and economic engagement between India and LAC countries. "The two sides should look at supply chain diversification since the Covid-19 pandemic had highlighted the need for resilient supply chains for redundant sourcing, diversified production, and food

and energy security", he said. He added that given India's status as the fifth largest economy and the country's rising demand for oil, gas, strategic minerals and food, the two

sides should work on resource partnerships.

"The two sides should share developmental experiences, including digital capabilities, health solutions and agricultural practices. In this context, India can provide customised training and exchanges for LAC countries," Jaishankar said.

Referring to importance of mobility arrangements for professionals, Jaishankar said, "We are willing to work with LAC countries to make movement easier between our businesses and our people."

The business conclave is part of India's upgraded engagement with LAC countries in recent years. India's top leaders have made 34 visits to the region in the past nine years, including four by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.



In many countries of the world, almost no income tax is collected. Countries like Malta, Cyprus, Andorra, Singapore, Antigua, Luxembourg, Iceberg, Ireland, Mauritius, Monaco, Switzerland, Bahamas, Bermuda etc. fall in this category. In developed countries the income tax rate is high and at the same time, nominal tax is collected in a few countries, however, the facilities provided to the

citizens are many times more and better than the facilities provided in India. Apart from this, indirect tax in India is also collected from the direct taxpayers. If direct and indirect taxes are combined, then a person paying 30 percent income tax has to spend more than 50 percent of his income in paying taxes to the government.

Due to such a situation, neither development is taking place in the country nor citizens are getting better facilities. In the financial year 2021-22,

the number of taxpayers paying more than Rs.1 lakh in the country is 30,08,033, taxpayers paying

According to an estimate, non-salaried individuals in the country file an income tax return of Rs 31,500 on an average, while salaried individuals file an income tax return of over Rs 90,000. 96 percent of non-salaried people file income tax returns of less than Rs 10 lakh, while 88 percent of salaried people file income tax returns of less than Rs 5 lakh.

In our country, non-salaried people get many exemptions in income tax, due to which their percent of those earning more tax liability is less, in spite of this, some businessmen do tax evasion. Many small businesses, such as street vendors, daily wage workers, etc. fall under the informal sector, due to which it is not easy for the government to track their income. Another reason for the low tax base in India is the low participation of women in the work force.

According to a World Bank report released in June 2022, there has been a steady decline in the labor force participation of Indian women since 2005 and is set to fall to a low of 19 per cent in 2021. A large population of India is still dependent on agriculture. Since agricultural income is exempt under Income Tax, due to which almost 50 percent of farmers do not file Income Tax Returns.

In the old and new tax regime, income tax has to be paid only when the income is above a certain limit. In the old tax system, no income tax has to be paid to those earning up to Rs.5 lakh. The annual income of a large population in India is less than 5 lakhs and those with this much income are exempted from paying income tax. Not only this, those whose income is up to 5 lakhs also refrain from filing income tax returns.

Obviously, bringing informal businesses and workers into the tax net will benefit both the country and the general public. Therefore, businessmen should be encouraged to self-register their businesses with the government machinery and comply with tax laws. The Goods and Services Tax (GST) system can also help in this task. Depositing income tax regularly can get financial help from the bank and

ernment schemes. With the help of GST, the benefit of deposit of input tax can be availed and the large buyers can get benefit in continuation of supply.

High earners can be identified with the help of bank transactions, credit cards, property purchases, etc. to bring them under the income tax net. The income of some farmers is in lakhs and crores of rupees, but they do not pay taxes. Tax base can also be increased by bringing agricultural

income into the tax net. Collecting tax at source in the course of purchase of certain goods and services can also identify potential taxpayers. Many people in the country earn huge amount every year, but they steal without any fear. Currently TCS is collected on expensive motor vehicles, gold jewelery or money transferred abroad etc.

British Pakistani **Pakistan PM Shehbaz Sharif** hints at delaying elections

As the Pakistan government is readying to bring in an interim setup with a mandate to hold elections within 90 days, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has hinted towards a delay in the polls, creating a rift within his coalition partners.

The visible rift, as seen on various social media posts, is exposing the lack of talks and closed door consultations between Sharif's Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N)) party and its major coalition partnerPakistan People Party (PPP), The premier has said that elections will be held only on the basis of the 2023 digital census, hinting towards a delay between eight months to one year. "We have to hold the elections on the basis of the new census... When the census has been conducted, the polls should be held on its basis unless there is an obstacle that cannot be overcome. But I don't see any such hurdle, " he said during an

Sharif's comments have sparked a widespread debate as the PPP has made it clear that it would not endorse any decision that results delaying the polls. "The party has already taken a position on the subject that fresh delimitation would cause delay in


