My duty remains same to protect idea of India: Rahul after SC's relief

Maintaining grace and dignity in victory, former Congress president Rahul Gandhi, said that his duty remained the same to save the idea of India. Reacting to the Supreme Court decision staying his conviction in a defamation case, Gandhi tweeted in his characteristic humble and gracious way, "Come what may, my duty remains the same. Protect the idea of India". The Congress meanwhile hailed the Supreme Court of India's verdict to stay the conviction of former party

president Rahul Gandhi in a defamation case. "Truth Alone Triumphs!", remarked Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge in a tweet, while adding, "we welcome the verdict by the Hon'ble Supreme Court giving relief to @RahulGandhi. Justice has been delivered. Democracy has won. The Constitution has been upheld". Lashing out at the Bharatiya Janata Party, he said, "BJP's conspiratorial hounding of Shri Gandhi has been thoroughly exposed. Time for them to stop their malicious targeting of Opposition leaders". Kharge observed, "it is high



time they respect the mandate given by the people and

start governing the country, on which they have miserably failed in the last 10 years". Congress general secretary Priyanka Gandhi remarked, while quoting Gautama Buddha, "Three things cannot be long hidden: the sun, the moon, and the truth". Congress general secretary, Communication, Jairam Ramesh said, "the decision of the Supreme Court is an affirmation of truth and justice". "Despite the relentless efforts of the BJP's machinery, @RahulGandhi has refused to bend, break or bow, choosing instead to place his faith in the judicial process", Ramesh tweeted,

while adding, "this is a lesson to the BJP and their minions: You may do the worst, but we will not back down. We will continue to highlight and highlight your failures as a government and as a party. We will uphold our constitutional ideals and keep faith in our institutions which you want to destroy completely". Hailing the decision, Congress general secretary, Organization, KC Venugopal said, "we welcome the Hon'ble Supreme Court's verdict staying @RahulGandhi ji's conviction. Justice has prevailed. No force can silence the voice of the people".

GST Collection Surges with 11% YoY growth in July 2023

India's gross GST revenue collected in the month of July, 2023 is Rs 1,65,105 crore of which CGST is Rs 29,773 crore, SGST is Rs 37,623 crore, IGST is Rs 85,930 crore (including Rs 41,239 crore collected on import of goods) and cess is Rs 11,779 crore (including Rs 840 crore collected on import of goods). In the latest data released today, the government has settled Rs 39,785 crore to CGST and Rs 33,188 crore to SGST from IGST. The total revenue of Centre and the States in the month of July 2023 after regular settlement is Rs 69,558 crore



for CGST and Rs 70,811 crore for the SGST. The revenues for the month of July 2023 are 11% higher than the GST revenues in the same month last year. During the month, the revenues from domestic transactions (including import of services) are 15% higher than the revenues from these sources during the same month last year. It is for the fifth time, the gross GST collection has crossed Rs 1.60 lakh crore mark. In June, GST collection was Rs 1,61,497 crore.

Missing Army Jawan recovered by Jammu and Kashmir Police



In a dramatic turn of events, a missing army soldier, Javed Ahmad Wani, who had disappeared from his native Kulgam district in Kashmir while on leave, has been located and recovered by the Jammu and Kashmir Police. The police made the announcement via a post on X (formerly Twitter), revealing that a joint interrogation will take place following a medical checkup of the soldier. Javed Ahmad Wani, 25, and a resident of Achathal area in Kulgam district, had gone missing on July 29. He was on leave since June 29 and was preparing to rejoin his duties in Ladakh. On the evening of his disappearance, he left his home in Asthal, Kulgam, to buy groceries, as he was scheduled to return to Ladakh the following day. Concerns were raised when Javed's abandoned car was found a short distance away from his home, bearing traces of blood. His brother, Mudasir Ahmad Wani, explained that Javed had left for the market at around 7:30 pm, but his car was later discovered with blood stains, accompanied by one of his slippers and a cap. Javed Ahmad Wani's family initially feared that he might have been abducted by militants.

'Think of Delhi rather than alliances': Shah to Oppn



NEW DELHI: Home Minister Amit Shah on Thursday criticised the Opposition in Parliament, asking it to think of Delhi rather than making opportunistic political alliances to hide its corrupt practices, while initiating the discussion on the controversial Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi (Amendment) Bill, 2023 in Lok Sabha. Shah said that the bill has been brought in Parliament as it has the competency to frame laws for Delhi. He defended the Central government's move to bring the bill over-riding the Supreme Court's order, which empowers the Lt. Governor to decide on the transfers and postings of bureaucrats. "This ordinance refers to the order of the Supreme Court which says that the parliament has the right to make laws on any issue related to the National Capital Territory of Delhi. There are provisions in the constitution that allow the Centre to make laws for Delhi," Shah said. He taunted the Opposition parties, saying they should not

support corrupt practices taking place in Delhi in the garb of alliances (referring to INDIA alliance), as even after forming alliances, prime minister Narendra Modi will come back with full majority. AAP is part of the INDIA alliance. The Home Minister said that for several years -- both the BJP and the Congress ruled in Delhi simultaneously without any problem under the same sovereign arrangement. However, in 2015, a party (referring to AAP) came to power whose sole intention was to disrupt and fight, not serve people, Shah said. "The problem is not getting the right to decide on transfers and postings, but getting control of the vigilance department to hide their corruption like building their bungalows," Shah said. He further claimed that India's founding fathers like Jawaharlal Nehru, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, C. Rajagopalachari, Rajendra Prasad and B.R. Ambedkar were against the idea of Delhi getting the status of a full state.

INDIA leaders meet in Parliament, seek PM's statement on Manipur Crisis

NEW DELHI: Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) party leaders on Friday met in Parliament and once again decided to press for their demand for a statement by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in both Houses on Manipur violence. The meeting of the INDIA leaders was held in the chamber of Leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge. During the meeting it was

decided to demand for the statement of the Prime Minister in Parliament and "honour his responsibilities". The INDIA parties have been demanding a statement by PM Modi in both Houses of Parliament on Manipur violence. They have also demanded a detailed discussion on the issue in Parliament.

Over Rs 10000 cr VAT refund scam of Trade & Industry in Haryana

Haryana police recovered over Rs 112 crore from four major gangs allegedly involved in Goods and Services Tax (GST) scams. At least 89 people were arrested in these cases in 10 districts across the state. As many as 40 cases were registered with 89 arrests from four accused gangs (group of firms) allegedly defrauded the government exchequer to the tune of over Rs 464.12 crore through fraudulent means in the state. The nexus of these fraudsters were active not only in Haryana but across the country, the Haryana police said. Then Director General of Police, Haryana said that these persons issued fraudulent invoices to numerous firms and companies without actual supply of goods through fraudulent E-way bills (GST related challans for transporting consignments) and facilitated fake ITC entitlement on GST portal through GSTR-3B form. The major goods involved in these GST invoice scams were scrap, iron and steel articles, cotton-yarn and paper and recovery of Rs 112 crore by unearthing fake GST Identification Numbers. Giving details about their modus operandi, police said, the maximum number of E-way bills which were generated by these fraudsters were found to be fake on verification by the Sales Tax and Crime branch. These E-way bills mentioned vehicle numbers related to ambulances, government vehicles, motorcycles, private owned vehicles which are contrary to be used for commercial purposes. Further inquiry revealed that the bank account numbers which were shown in GST registration form of the bogus firm were also found dubious and the fraudsters used another fake bank account to deceive concerned government authorities. The probe also revealed that the fraudsters had established these non-existent firms on forged documents like rent agreements, electricity bill, PAN cards. GST related challans for transporting consignments, and facilitated fake Income Tax Credit (ITC) entitlement on GST portal through GSTR-3B form. According to police information the maximum number of E-way bills which were generated by these fraudsters were found to be fake on verification by Crime branch also when a total of 21 FIRs against fake firms belonging to a gang from Panipat and adjoining areas were lodged in 2019. Information reveals, Haryana government refused VAT scam of value Rs 10,618 crore when ED demanded investigation. Information also reveals that out of total number of 74 FIRs cancellation report of seven cases were submitted by the department and 20 cases were challaned.

Bereaved Nuh! Neglected development, misguided youths

A deadly calm prevailed in Nuh-Mewat after Wednesday's clashes that killed six people, including two home guards, and injured more than 90. The angry mob set fire to more than 100 vehicles and left burned vehicles on the highways. The roads were apparently controlled by anti-social groups for more than six hours, leaving the population and communists at the mercy of the rioters. The violent mob spared no place; even the cyber police station in Nuh was targeted for destruction. Hospitals, grocery stores and liquor stores also fell victim to vandalism. Residents were frightened and hesitant to speak, not wanting to share their pain and seeking only harmony. The streets were littered with destroyed remains of burnt vehicles, bricks and scorched tires - a silent testimony to the violence and bloodshed that continued for many hours without the administration taking any action. One concerned resident said that the population was having trouble getting ration items from



the store: "There is an atmosphere of fear. We do not send our children outside. Even at night we are very afraid and do not know what will happen". A local fruit vendor, on the other hand, complained that his income has been affected because customers no longer come to his kiosk to shop. "I sell vegetables, but in the last two to three days sales have decreased... if customers don't come, how will we make a living? Since no one comes, the vegetables are spoiled. We are very worried," he said. Emissary paramilitary

forces armed with batons and rifles marched throughout the Nuh and Sohna area. They beat anyone who left their homes during curfew. "Curfew hai, bhag andar," they shouted as they swung their batons at those who ventured out. When asked repeatedly, a senior citizen who was concerned about the future of the misguided youth of Mewat replied, "We are so disappointed with the media coverage, especially the way you have portrayed Nuh-Mewat as a notorious area. How can the entire district be a hotbed of

terror? The people here are innocent and peace-loving. How can you treat the entire community and district as terrorists? At least the media should play a positive role now, as they have done in many cases. Why is Nuh being blamed for all the crimes in the whole country?" "Point out with pride that despite the Hindu-Muslim divide, Mewat has hardly any rioting on the index," he said. "Even now, when the situation is so tense, there have been no riots," says Samshad, who insists on looking at the situation objectively. That's

largely thanks to the police, who have done everything they can to catch the culprits. "Social media is a big problem, especially the fake accounts that contain few facts and a lot of emotion and are all too willing to use their power to inflame tempers," says a police official. "It's a tense time for these people. The entire national media is here asking them uncomfortable questions they do not have answers to. These questions should have been asked much earlier - not by the media, but by the authorities and the politicians - and then maybe this day would not have befallen this Muslim zone," said an official who asked not to be named. Ironically, Nuh-Mewat itself is low on the crime index because, unlike major cities where extortion, kidnapping and other heinous crimes dot the landscape, only minor looting and hostile killings are recorded here. Nevertheless, "The area is known for its gunmen, who are regularly used in gang killings, and nearly 100 gangs are active in the areas bordering the district. Thirty of them are large gangs that make their living exclusively from criminal activities," said a police official.

Peace prevailed in Nuh-Sohna and Gurugarm after communal violence

Following Monday's communal violence in Nuh-Sohna, Mewat, in which six people, including two Homeguards, were killed and over 90 injured, including more than 20 police officers, the angry mob set fire to over 100 vehicles and left burnt vehicles on the highways. A large contingent of police and paramilitary forces was deployed in case of any untoward incidents. Law enforcement agencies are on the lookout not only on the ground but also in cyberspace for potential flashpoints that could spark further unrest in the region. "Six people, including two members of the Home Guards and four civilians, died in the incident. So far, 116 people have been arrested. They are being remanded in custody. Those found guilty will not be spared. We are committed to the safety of the public. The overall situation in the state is normal. We appeal to the public to maintain peace, calm and



brotherhood," Haryana CM Khattar told a news agency. Some 93 criminal cases have been registered, including 46 in Nuh, 23 in Gurugram, three in Faridabad, three in Rewari and 18 in Palwal, said T V S N Prasad, Additional Chief Secretary (Home), adding that a Rapid Action Force centre would be set up in Nuh soon. The failure of the district administration to take action against communal elements has created a situation resembling a war zone in Nuh and Sohna areas of Mewat district in Haryana. A curfew

has been imposed in the town for the past four days after the administration failed to take action against the communal leaders who triggered this violence. The violence erupted in Nuh in an attempt to stop the annual Hindu religious procession through the Muslim-majority Nuh region, which spread to Gurugram in recent days. The Muslim community was outraged when it was announced that the procession would include Monu Manesar, who is wanted by police for the murder of two Muslim men.

Nuh Violence: Situation limps back to normal in Sohna, admin permitted opening of market

In order to maintain peace and law and order in the Sohna area of Gurugram, a meeting of the Peace Committee was held under the chairmanship of deputy commissioner Gurugram Nishant Kumar Yadav in Sohna area of Gurugram on Tuesday.

Sohna MLA Sanjay Singh and former MLA Tejpal Tanwar along with enlightened people of Hindu and Muslim society also participated in this meeting organized at the Tourist Complex of Haryana Tourism Department, Sohna.

In the meeting, both sides assured to maintain peace and harmony in the region. During the meeting the DC said, the situation normalized in Sohna, and on the demand of the Peace Committee, the district administration permitted to open of the market in Sohna. The administration formed a committee comprising 20 members each from the two communities. The committee will help in enforcing peace



and harmony. DC Nishant Kumar Yadav insisted on establishing a dialogue with the people of Hindu and Muslim society with the general public to keep the law and order peaceful in the area in view of the Nuh episode.

The DC said that the only way to prevent the spread of communal frenzy in the area was to ignore rumours. The DC appealed to the citizens

to ignore the rumours and maintain peace and tolerance and help the administration in maintaining law and order. "The situation is now normal in the Sohna area. So we gave consent to open the market on the demand of the committee members amid normalcy in Sohna," he said. In the meeting, the members of the committee also demanded compensation for the people

affected by the arson and vandalism that happened on Monday evening. "The assessment report of the persons and institutions affected by the incident is being prepared by the district administration. Soon it will be sent to the government," he said.

The DC said that if any objectionable post is posted by any person or organization, legal action will be taken

against it as per the rules. He said that no one should spread any kind of false rumour on social media platforms. If anyone spreads rumours on social media or makes any wrong comment about anyone's religion or caste, then the police will take strict action on that. DCP Headquarters Deepak Gehlawat appealed to both communities that the incident that happened in Sohna in the context of Nuh clashes. If you have any information regarding him, immediately inform the police so that legal action can be taken against the guilty person.

"We appealed to the general public that if any anti-social element, suspicious person or vehicle is seen around you or in any emergency, immediately report it to the concerned police station or dial 112. The name of the informer will be kept secret. Besides this, a number of police forces have deployed at key locations in Sohna to maintain peace and law and order in the Sohna area, a flag march was taken out by the police in the city," Gehlawat told to media.

Haryana Violence: Death toll rise to 6, many injured; fresh violence incident in Gurugram's Badshapur

Fresh violent clashes erupted in Gurugram on Tuesday following an inter-communal clash in the Nuh area of Mewat district bordering Gurugram on Monday. At least six people were killed, and more than 50 were reportedly injured. On Tuesday, around 2 p.m., rioters set two shops on fire in Badshapur, Gurugram. Haryana Chief Minister ML Khattar did not rule out a conspiracy as the cause of the communal violence.

The CM also informed that around 44 FIRs have been registered and 70 people have been taken into custody, in the aftermath of the violent clashes. Khattar added that 16 companies of Central forces and 30 companies of Haryana Police arrived in Nuh and restored normalcy.

Authorities on Tuesday said mobile internet services will remain suspended in Nuh district till August 2, Wednesday, in light of clashes between two groups. Prohibitory orders were also put in place in the district a day after



the clashes.

Following the clashes, a police contingent was deployed at the scene to maintain law and order and prevent any untoward incident. Two home guards were shot dead and about a dozen policemen were injured after a clash broke out between two groups in Nuh on Monday, the police said earlier. All educational institutions, including schools, colleges, and coaching centers will remain closed on Tuesday in Gurugram in light of the clashes, the district Information and Public Relations officer of Gurugram said on Monday.

The order was issued by District Magistrate Nishant Kumar Yadav. The deceased home guards were identified as Neeraj and Gursevak. They were deployed at Khedali Daula police station. Further, according to the police, the personnel injured in the clashes were under treatment at Gurugram's Medanta Hospital. Police said a mob attacked police teams when they were marching towards Mewat from Gurugram. Sharing details of the incident on Monday, Nuh's acting SP Narendra Bijarniya said, "Today's incident is unfortunate.

Electricity department employee identified as mastermind of gang stolen 70 transformers

A search by Matloda police station in Panipat district on a clue busted a gang of five persons allegedly involved in stolen 70 electric transformers in the state installed by the Haryana State Electricity Board which included 53 transformers stolen in Panipat district, 14 transformers stolen in Karnal district and three transformers stolen in Jind district in past 19 months. The arrested accused during preliminary investigation admitted crime and were identified as Varinder alias Kala a resident of village Kavi in Sonapat district employed with Haryana State Electricity Board who was the kingpin of the gang and admitted crime due to earning huge money. Among other four arrested accused were Naveen, Vipin both residents of Matloda, Vikram originally hailing from Nepal and presently residing at Matloda and Mahavir a resident of village Kavi.

The prime accused Varinder said that they used to bring out coils from stolen transformers and sell to Rishi Pal of Matloda running a disposal goods business. He disclosed that he was also running an electric store in the name of Shiv Electricals at Matloda as an eyewash. Police also recovered a scooter, a motorcycle and Rs 6000 from Varinder alias Kala. A case was registered against all five members of the gang with the police where they admitted involvement in the large number of thefts of electric transformers mostly stolen from agriculture fields during night hours.

For several years now, Mohit Yadav @ Monu Manesar has been leading Bajrang Dal's campaign against cattle smugglers in Haryana & Rajasthan

Known for releasing footage of cow vigilante attacks, the 30-year-old Monu Manesar is the leader of a cow vigilante group in Mewat. He also participates actively in efforts against "love jihad," a term popularised by the rightwing to describe the allegedly forcible conversion of Hindu women by Muslim men. He gained notoriety in 2019 when, while pursuing alleged cattle smugglers, he was shot at. He also participated in a task team for district cow protection that the Haryana government established after a cow protection law was passed in 2015.

Tens of thousands of people follow Monu Manesar on Face-



book and YouTube, and he routinely posted pictures of himself showing off his vehicles and weaponry there.

On Monday, the Bajrang Dal leader was one of the cen-

tral figures at the centre of the communal violence that engulfed the Nuh and Gurugram districts of Haryana.

Rumours about the presence of Monu Manesar, who

is wanted by the police for his suspected involvement in the murder of two Muslim men earlier this year, during a religious procession in Haryana's Nuh near Gurugram on Monday fueled the violence.

In the fighting between two groups yesterday in Nuh, two Home Guards and another person were both slain, leaving four others—including at least 30 others—injured. Gurugram saw an overnight mosque fire as a result of the unrest and tense atmosphere there.

A few days prior, Monu Manesar allegedly posted a video on social media in which he declared his intention to attend the Nuh religious procession and urged his followers to turn out in force. Later, he allegedly received a social media warning to stay away.

JIH Delegation visits violence affected Gurugram, calls for confidence-building measures amidst widespread unrest

NEW DELHI: A delegation of Jamaat-e-Islami Hind (JIH) visited Gurugram, Haryana to take stock of the situation following widespread communal violence. The delegation met Kala Ramachandran, Police Commissioner of Gurugram to enquire and demand accountability about the attack on the Mosque in Sector 57 and the death of Imam Saad and other attacks in and around Gurugram. The delegation was informed that social media propaganda led to an escalation in violence and the Police force could not adequately handle the situation as it got diverted into multiple locations.

Further, the JIH delegation also met residents who expressed fear for their lives due to the ongoing communal tension and unrest. The delegation also visited the local hospital to check on the injured victims and their families. The delegation also visited the Sector 57 mosque which was cordoned off amidst heavy security.

JIH feels that the situation in Gurugram is a failure of our intelligence and coordination with the Police department. A climate of impunity also added fuel to the fire as anti-social elements who indulged in violence felt assured that no action would be taken against them as they enjoyed political patronage. Jamaat calls for immediate efforts for restoring peace and confidence-building measures. There should be serious efforts towards the initiation of dialogue across communities as communal harmony has taken a toll because of the surcharged atmosphere and the vicious media propaganda and instigation of violence being shared across social media platforms.

580 fresh Hepatitis cases identified in Ambala district only worries state health department

Fast spreading hepatitis in the state is a matter of concern for state health department since in past six years district health department Ambala had received 547 and the district health department expressed worry due to as many as 580 fresh cases received in past about a year with 46 deaths. According to Dr Sanjiv Singla District Health Officer it has been observed use those addicted to drugs and taking excessive liquor from families below poverty line, youths having 'tatoos' on their bodies were found victims of this dreaded hepatitis also known as 'Kala Peelia' disease, getting done shaving from a barber shop with unhygienic blade, use of an infected syringe or during blood swere observed prime reason for this disease.

Dr Harsha Ambala district Health Department Nodal Officer said that we are getting large number of patients suffering from Hepatitis from adjoining Punjab state as well as from neighboring Yamunanagar, and Kurukshetra districts also at the Civil Hospital Ambala and



among patients include nearly 50% prisoners lodged in Ambala central jail. He said that among prime symptoms of this disease include lack of appetite, loss of weight and feeling of tiredness, swelling of liver and it is difficult to identify this disease for which a thorough screening of suspected patient is necessary.

During the year 2019 a National Virus Hepatitis Control Programme 'Jiwan Rekha' was started in Haryana state in order to conduct screening test and treatment of disease. For the treatment of this disease usually a patient had to spend an amount between Rs 30 to 40 thousand every month on the treatment and huge amounts to be spent on screening tests at a private hospital, but the Haryana state government provides free treatment as well as medicines to a patient suffering from this disease.

Malikarjun Kharge, the president of the Congress party said that this was a very important meeting to save democracy and the constitution in the interest of the people of the country. Kharge emphasised that, unlike in the past, Congress would not be asserting its dominance in the opposition alliance and was not interested in the prime ministerial post. But question arises who will be the Prime Minister, since there are many willing to grab Prime Minister's seat and there is doubt if the alliance will remain alive till coming polls.

According to information Between the 26 parties, the alliance governs 11 states while the BJP governs 15. The BJP also holds an overwhelming parliamentary majority after the 2019 election, in which it won 303 seats out of 543.

Centre has switched off engine of Constitutional responsibility, says P. Chidambaram

NEW DELHI: Senior Congress leader P. Chidambaram on Wednesday questioned the Modi-led Central government about the situation in Manipur, and said, "the Centre has switched off the engine of Constitutional responsibility and thrown away the key."

Taking a swipe at the BJP governments at the Centre and in Manipur, Chidambaram said, "How long will it take for the Supreme Court's indictment of the Manipur Government to reach PMO in Delhi and CMO in Imphal? If the chief minister of Manipur, N Biren Singh, has any sense of constitutional morality, he should quit immediately. Only those who practise rajdharma can preach rajdharma."

"The central government is like the driver of the police jeep who told the molested women 'there is no key'. The central government has switched off the engine of Constitutional



responsibility (Articles 355 and 356) and thrown away the key," the former Union minister said. His remarks came after the Supreme Court on Tuesday came down heavily on the Centre and Manipur government. The court said that the state police "is incapable of investigation" and "there is no law and order left" in the northeastern state.

Opposition likely hold next meeting of INDIA coalition in Mumbai on Aug 31-Sep 1

NEW DELHI: Opposition bloc INDIA is likely to hold its next meeting on August 31 and September 1 in Mumbai. They said it would be held on the format of the Bengaluru meeting with leaders first confabulating in an informal setting on August 31 before their main meeting the next day.

"The opposition meeting will be a two-day affair and will take place on August 31 and September 1 with all leaders approving the dates," a source said. The likely venue would be a hotel in Pawai and there will be a press conference on August 1 evening, the source said. There have been several dates that have been talked about earlier

but those did not work out as all leaders were not available on those dates.

The third meeting of the bloc is being hosted jointly by the Shiv Sena (UBT) and the NCP's Sharad Pawar faction, with support from the Congress — the three constituents of the Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance. The MVA constituents had been holding parleys to schedule the meeting. The INDIA bloc's first meeting was held in Patna in June and the second in Bengaluru last month. The coalition is also likely to announce the composition of committees for specific actions such as communication and 2024 general election campaign in the run-up to the polls. A joint secretariat for

better coordination among the parties will also be announced soon, the sources said.

During the meeting, the parties are expected to iron out their differences as much as possible, especially in states where they are in a direct poll battle. At the Bengaluru meeting, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge had announced the name of the opposition bloc — Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) — after a nearly four-hour-long meeting of the 26 parties. He had said a committee of 11 members will also be set up for coordination, and a convener will be selected at the next meeting in Mumbai.

An Indian shot dead at Indo-Pak border

at Indo-Pak border was found uncircumcised as he may not be Muslim. He also clarified that yet also not clear that the dead was whether Indian or Pakistani as investigation was underway.

Talking about the appearance of the dead man Officer further said that he was having long unkempt hair and seemed insane.

On being contacted to Deputy Superintendent Police (DSP) Preetinder Singh said that the dead man was Indian but still unidentified, managed to reach near the barbed fencing in the BSF area and during fire opened by BSF he was killed.

Rain likely in several states till Aug 6

NEW DELHI: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) said that Odisha and Chhattisgarh are expected to experience isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall with the possibility of extremely heavy rainfalls on Wednesday while Madhya Pradesh is likely to encounter such intense rainfall on Thursday.

The weather forecast agency further predicted that from Thursday (August 3) to August 6, Northwest India may also experience isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall. However, peninsular India is expected to witness subdued rainfall activity over the next five days.

In the bulletin issued on Wednesday, IMD also said that currently, there is squally wind speed reaching 45-55 kmph



gusting to 65 kmph prevailing over the North Bay of Bengal and the adjoining coasts of Bangladesh and West Bengal.

However, this is expected to decrease to 35-45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph from the afternoon to night of Wednesday.

Additionally, the sea conditions are currently rough to very rough over the North Bay of Bengal and the adjoining coasts

of Bangladesh, West Bengal, and North Odisha. However, from Wednesday afternoon, the sea conditions are likely to become rough to moderate, with gradual improvement expected thereafter.

According to IMD, in the upcoming days, various regions in India are expected to experience varying degrees of rainfall.

UCC: Lest It Becomes a Pit Bull?

Act which the present BJP government is trying to force?

What the UCC is?

On a wider scale, Uniform Civil Code means one law for the whole country. Where the Uniform Civil Code applies, in that country, whatever laws are made related to marriage, divorce, child adoption, property division and all other subjects, they have to be considered equally for the citizens of all religions and castes. At present, many laws in India are decided on the basis of religion and ethnicity too. It is being claimed that the condition of women in India will improve with the implementation of the Uniform Civil Code. There will be simplicity and clarity in the laws. Discrimination on the basis of laws related to personal or religion will be abolished. But can this really happen?

Expressing doubts over the new UCC, Shiromani Akali Dal president, Sukhbir Singh Badal, pleads that the issue had already been examined in depth by the 21st Law Commission which had in its report in 2018 noted that UCC was neither necessary nor desirable at this stage. It said the Commission also observed that reforms in family laws of different communities would provide better guarantee of securing rights of women and children than bringing in Uniform Civil Laws. It also detailed how the Commission emphasized that cultural diversity must not be compromised and that nothing should be done to pose even a remote threat to the idea of 'unity in diversity' and eventually pose threat to the country's territorial integrity. It said in this light there was nothing significant after 2018 to compel the union government to seek views of stakeholders afresh.

Why the Minorities are afraid of the UCC?

Differing the new UCC, Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) clearly rejects the proposed UCC and states that it is not in nation's interest. Opposing the essence of UCC, the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) in a recent letter informed the 22nd Law Commission that the proposed



Uniform Civil Code (UCC) was not in the nation's interest and enforcing it without a genuine countrywide inter-faith consensus, especially among minorities, would violate the spirit of the Constitution and generate fear, distrust and divisive sentiments.

The SAD president also informed the Commission that the party had held consultations with different stakeholders in the State and outside. "On the basis of that, the widespread impression we gathered is that the UCC, if implemented, will definitely affect the freedom of minority communities of different caste, creed and religions".

Sukhbir Singh Badal also asserted that the framers of the Constitution kept the Uniform Civil Code in the Concurrent List. He said after a detailed discussion on UCC it was decided not to put it in the list of Fundamental Rights but in the Directive Principles of State Policy. The SAD also stressed that the proposed UCC would also affect Social Tribes who have their own diverse customs, culture and different personal laws. "It will thus un-necessarily cause disturbance and unrest in the country, especially in North Eastern states which enjoy special exemptions from certain laws under article 371 of the Constitution", Badal added.

Will BJP dare to end the privilege of Hindus?

Addressing BJP booth workers in Madhya Pradesh, on June 27, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that Muslims were being misled in the name of UCC. "These days, people are being provoked by

Article 14 and Article 15 of the constitution."

Will UCC be able to protect gotra restrictions in marriage?

According to the present law, any two adults -boy and girl - can marry each other and live together, but in many castes, there are gotra/clan restrictions for marriage, they cannot marry in their own gotra. If the matrimonial system of Jats is seen, then we find that at present three clans and some areas are forbidden in the community. The boy and the girl should not be residents of the same village or fraternal village, both should not be of same clan, marriage is also prohibited in their mother's and grandmother's gotra. But the present law gives recognition to such marriages, due to which tension arises in the society. And the social fabric gets frayed and there comes a rift in social harmony and brotherhood. Whenever a young man or woman marries in a forbidden gotra or area, it is considered a question of honour in such families in the society and in most of the cases, incidents of 'honour killing' come to the fore. Although the law serves to protect such a married couple, which is considered to be a violation of social norms, and the society grows angry against not only the married couple but also against the government and the law. The government should study such 'honour killing' cases and make this law socially compatible.

Social Khap Panchayats have also been demanding from time to time the government to enact a law to stop marriages in prohibited gotras/ areas. Since long, the khap panchayats have been seeking an amendment in the Hindu Marriage Act to prohibit same gotra marriages. Supporting the concern of Khap Panchayats, on January 10, 2020, Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar had asserted that it has been proven scientifically that intra-clan marriages should not be performed.

"The khap panchayats have a principle that within a village or intra-clan, marriages should not take place. It has

been proven scientifically that intra-clan marriages should not be performed," Khattar said in Panchkula.

Giving example of Gujarat, Khattar stated, "If the relation of sister and brother is followed within the village, or within neighbouring villages and khaps, then certainly it will have a positive impact on the society. I have noticed this in Gujarat also where the women are referred to as Behen (sister) and the men are referred to Bhai (brother)."

Will the Chief Minister's words be heeded? Will consanguineous and same-village marriages be legally prohibited as demanded by Khap Panchayats? Will UCC be able to solve this discrepancy? Questions need answers.

Discrepancies in Reservation: Will UCC Resolve?

Reservation in India is purely based on religion and caste, and that too on discriminatory grounds, will UCC be able to resolve these discrepancies?

Alleging "appeasement politics" in granting OBC status to communities in West Bengal, National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC) chairperson Hansraj Gangaram Ahir himself, on June 8, 2023, stated the state government should fix the "discrepancy" at the earliest.

The NCBC chief also charged that OBC reservations were not being implemented correctly in Rajasthan, Punjab and Bihar — states with non-BJP governments, whereas there are seven districts in Rajasthan which do not extend any reservation to the OBCs and the Punjab, which has 25 per cent reservation for the OBCs, was just granting 12 per cent to the community.

"In Bihar too, there were issues related to Kurmi community which still are to be resolved," the NCBC chief said.

The question arises here that BJP has a majority government at the centre, why don't they talk about creating an equal civil society by removing the anomalies of OBC reservation before bringing the Uniform Civil Code?

In Rajasthan, except two

districts of Bharatpur and Dholpur, Jats of the rest of the state are considered in the OBC category. Here the question arises that what extra social and educational achievements did the Jats of these two districts have that they were not considered under the backward category? Is it only because these districts had Jat princely states?

Do all the subjects of that caste or society automatically come in the upper class from the social and educational point of view when a particular person or family becomes the head of the state.

If so, Raja Rao Tula Ram had princely state in Rewari and adjoining Ahirwal area in Haryana, his heir Rao Birendra Singh was the chief minister of Haryana and at present his descendant Rao Inderjit Singh is a minister in the centre, then why the Yadav subjects of this Yadav dynasty have been included in the OBC category? Jats and Yadavs in Haryana are almost in the same social, economic and educational category. Both are agricultural castes and both have been living on agriculture and animal husbandry. Both have been sending their youth to the army to be martyred in the interest of the country. Then why are the Jats of Haryana being denied the OBC category? Even the ancestors of Jats were not the owners of any princely state in Haryana. Are these discrepancies in reservation not the obstructive anomalies hindering the formation of an equal civil society? Will UCC find a solution for them? Though any majoritarian democratic government has the power to legislate a law to act as a watchdog for the Country's and Society's security, safety and welfare, but should always keep in consideration — "Before we pet a watchdog, test and ensure its breed, creed, seed, deed, and need."

Otherwise, the watchdog may turn out a Pit Bull, which not only bites passers-by, but may also maul the owner, the past instances have proved so.

The conflict in Ukraine and the recourse to nuclear rhetoric have revived concerns about nuclear escalation management between the major nuclear powers. Since the end of the Cold War, the United States-Russia nuclear rivalry had taken a back seat. Instead, North Korea, Iran and India-Pakistan got attention, with many analysts getting nostalgic about 'nuclear stability' during the Cold War. But, as it is becoming clear now, in today's changed political environment the escalation management lessons of the Cold War no longer seem to work for the U.S. and Russia.

Deterrence failure

In June 2021, U.S. and Russian Presidents, Joe Biden and Vladimir Putin, met in Geneva. Nuclear arms control was a high priority item on the agenda but no progress proved possible. As concerns grew about the Russian troop presence in Belarus on the Ukrainian border, Central Intelligence Agency Director Bill Burns flew to Moscow in November to spell out the consequences of aggression. In January 2022, U.S. Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken met Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov in Geneva to reiterate the message. On February 24, Russia began its "special military operation" in Ukraine. U.S. attempts to deter Russian aggression had failed.

Even as North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) leaders met to decide their response, Mr. Biden made it clear that the U.S. was determined to avoid a Third World War or allowing the conflict to escalate into a NATO-Russia conflict. After the freezing of Russian reserves and a slew of financial, energy-related and political sanctions, other elements of military assistance, lethal and non-lethal, began to take shape. Intelligence sharing and restoring Internet connectivity was the first step. The second was the supply of ammunition and some weapon systems which the Ukrainian forces were familiar with. NATO deepened its military involvement by providing gradually more and more sophisticated weapon systems, beginning with the Javelin and Stinger missiles, and moving on to Patriot missile defence batteries, long-range Himars, Storm Shadow and Scalp long-range missiles, and now F-16s. Russian attempts to deter NATO involvement had failed.

On February 7, 2022, Mr. Putin warned that "if Ukraine attempts to take back Crimea, European countries will be in conflict with Russia, which is a leading nuclear power superior to many NATO countries in terms



of nuclear force". Annual nuclear exercises, normally scheduled for autumn, were announced for February 17, with Mr. Putin personally witnessing them. Announcing the launch of "special military operations", his words of caution were, "whoever tries to hinder Russia will face consequences never seen in history". To drive home the threat, on February 27, Russian nuclear forces were placed on a "special combat readiness" with leave for all personnel cancelled.

Even as the U.S. issued blunt warnings to Russia against using tactical nuclear weapons, in the first week of March, NATO decided against a no-fly-zone and Poland, Slovakia and Bulgaria announced that they would not be sending MiG aircraft to Ukraine on account of Russian threats against their airfields from where these aircraft were to take off. Russian officials tried to downplay the nuclear threat by pointing out that Russia would resort to nuclear use only if faced with an existential threat, while U.S. officials tried to convey reassurance to their European allies that while Mr. Putin's threats were to be taken seriously, there were no indications of unusual activity at nuclear sites.

Mr. Biden declared on April 24, "We are neither encouraging nor enabling Ukraine to strike beyond its borders," adding that the "U.S. was not seeking regime change in Russia." In short, the U.S. objectives were to support Ukraine, bolster NATO unity and avoid any direct conflict with Russia. Ukraine is not a NATO member and so does not have the security of the nuclear umbrella provided by U.S. policy of 'extended deterrence'. Russia's resort to nuclear rhetoric failed to deter NATO involvement though it influenced its pace and timing. Therefore, both Russia and the U.S. are operating in a grey zone, taking turns at escalatory rhetoric even as they probe each other's red lines. During the Cold War, the U.S. and the former Soviet Union engaged in multiple proxy wars, Vietnam in the 1960s

and Afghanistan in the 1980s, but these were in distant theatres.

Cold War lessons

Deterrence is fundamentally based on the assumption that both adversaries are rational enough to judge when costs outweigh the benefits of the act. Nuclear deterrence adds a conundrum. With their huge arsenals that provided for assured second strike capability, neither the U.S. nor the Soviet Union had an incentive to try a surprise first strike. This realisation was crucial in shaping nuclear deterrence theory.

Thomas Schelling, whose writings during the 1960s and 1970s shaped nuclear deterrence thinking (he won the Economics Nobel in 2005), concluded that nuclear weapons were not usable but had political utility in terms of preventing a war with another nuclear power. Clearly, Schelling was looking at the situation between the U.S. and the Soviet Union which had no territorial dispute. Schelling also concluded that even though any use was "irrational", the nuclear threat had to be "credible" in order to deter. This introduced a degree of uncertainty into the equation. Using his economics training, he interpreted the uncertainty as risk that could be analysed in terms of probabilities. Risk was intended to induce rationality in the adversaries. Realising the conundrum, he concluded that the key to making nuclear deterrence credible is through escalation and raising the risk, that in the final analysis, "leaves something to chance".

This, along with the lessons of the 1962 Cuban missile crisis kept the U.S. and Soviet rhetoric in check during the Cold War even as they engaged in proxy wars outside Europe, and away from NATO and Warsaw Pact territories. Today, there is no Warsaw Pact, and NATO has expanded to include a number of former Warsaw Pact members. The Ukraine conflict has persuaded Sweden

and Finland to give up their long-standing neutrality and seek security under NATO's nuclear umbrella.

Probing for red lines

Russia's nuclear doctrine issued on June 2, 2020 specifies two conditions under which Russia would use nuclear weapons: "...in response to the use of nuclear weapons and other types of weapons of mass destruction against it/or its allies" and "in the case of aggression against the Russian Federation with the use of conventional weapons, when the very existence of the state is put under threat". Mr. Putin has declared more than once that Ukrainians and Russians are one people with a shared history. Russia, therefore, does not see Ukraine as entirely 'sovereign'.

Second, there is the oft-cited escalate-to-deescalate approach, that implies using tactical nuclear weapons to overcome a stalemate on the battlefield, thus forcing a termination of hostilities on favourable terms. In its 2022 National Security Strategy, the U.S. rejected this by declaring that first use would not lead to de-escalation on Russian terms, "but alter the nature of conflict creating potential for uncontrolled escalation".

U.S. caution is reflected in calibrating the supply of more sophisticated weapons by continuously probing Russian red lines even though Ukrainian demands continue to grow. Meanwhile, it suits Russia to increase ambiguity. It is also likely that since Russia failed to achieve its military objectives, its thresholds are evolving.

The path-breaking studies of Daniel Kahneman and Amos Tversky in economics showed that humans often tend to double down on bad bets because of 'loss aversion'. The Cold War escalation management lessons applied to a different world; today, the U.S. and Russia no longer enjoy parity and Russia's red lines are fuzzy. Nuclear signalling today is taking place in uncharted political territory. New guard rails are necessary if the nuclear taboo has to be preserved.

Financial skills could have saved Desai

The suicide committed by Nitin Chandrakant Desai, the Bollywood art director, in his Karjat studio near Mumbai, shocked everyone in the entertainment industry and others in the country. The great art director, who created the sets of Kaun Banega Crorepati, Aapki Adalat, and big-budget films like Jodhaa Akbar, and Lagaan, etc., was struggling to repay a Rs 180 crore loan which had increased to Rs 252 crore, and a bankruptcy court had recently approved an insolvency petition against his company, ND's Art World Pvt Ltd. The unfortunate incident has once again highlighted the importance of financial literacy.

Nitin Desai was a great creative person, but he seemed to lack basic knowledge of financial management. He took an ultra-heavy loan to fulfill his desire of creating a massive film studio, without much backup plan in case something



had happened to his project. Once he stopped getting work, his dreams shattered and the loan became the cause of his untimely demise. One should always have a backup plan to repay the loan or

to generate alternative sources of income, where Desai failed miserably. Financial literacy is one skill that is not taught in schools, and the lack of this knowledge causes misfortune to a majority of people, who otherwise earn fantastically well but fail to rise in practical life.

Financial literacy is as important as making money. It can make you rich. It is basically your relationship with the money you earn and how effectively you use it to improve your finances. Adopting proper budgeting, saving, and investment is what financial literacy is all about. So step one is to make money which would be most important, but once you have money or sufficient income, step two becomes most important, i.e. to utilize that money to its greatest potential or to help you achieve your long-term goals.

World's most successful investor Warren Buffett once said "Never invest in a business you do not understand." An investment journey takes time. Starting from a small amount and for the long

term is best practice. Starting an investing journey in the stock market is so easy these days. One just has to open a Demat account, and then things take forward.

Depending on the income and expenses, the emergency fund can be 6 to 12 months of the monthly income. If you earn Rs 40,000 a month and Rs 20,000 goes into meeting your routine living expenses, then your emergency fund should be in the range of Rs 2 to 4 Lakh. This corpus is for emergencies only. A financial advisor once told me, "Money management is way more important than earning money. I know people with an income of over Rs 25 Lakh a year, who are so deep in debt that they would lose everything if they ever had to go through a couple of months without a paycheck. Once you have made some money you need to figure out what you are going to do with it. You can spend it, save it, invest it, or a mix of these three."

From commerce to culture: How opium shaped India

Amitav Ghosh, the renowned author of the Ibis trilogy, delved into the hidden history of opium at the launch of his new book "Smoke and Ashes: A writer's journey through Opium's hidden histories." In conversation with singer and activist T.M. 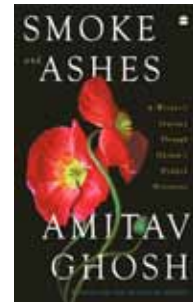

45% job-seeking graduates meet India's industry demands: Study

BENGALURU: Just 45% of graduates in India who apply for jobs have the readiness to meet industry's fast-changing demands, as per Mercer | Mettl's latest report.

The report was exclusively shared with ET which is based on evaluations across 2,500 campuses and 440,000 learners has suggested. According to the 'India's Graduate Skill Index: 2023' report finding candidates with high employability in non-technical skills is easier than finding candidates with high job-readiness for technical skills.

About 53% of Indian graduates are employable for top non-technical jobs compared with 44% of graduates who are employable for top technical jobs.

Applied mathematics has



the highest employability of 72%. About 48% of Indian graduates applying for AI/ML (artificial intelligence/machine learning) roles are job-ready.

Data science and data analyst roles have employability of 39% whereas on-the-job skills such as MS Office, accounting and numerical ability showcase higher employability

at 61%, 60 and 57%, respectively, reflecting the strengths of Indian graduates in office software and financial competencies across all tiers of colleges. Project management has the lowest employability of 23% among the top in-demand non-technical skills.

The widening skill gap necessitates a collaborative ef-

fort between academia and corporates to bridge this talent divide.

"Almost all of our educational institutes have to transform themselves to equip students with the relevant skills of the future and align their learning outcomes with industry needs. Industry itself is grappling with changing goals given changing skill requirements. If the curriculum doesn't catch up, then the gap gets wider," Mercer | Mettl chief executive Siddhartha Gupta told ET.

The analysis involved data from campuses in 30-plus states and union territories, with further categorisation based on college tiers (Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3) according to the National Institute of Ranking Framework by the Ministry of Education.

Ford issues recall notice for over 800K F-150 trucks in US

Ford Motor has issued a recall notice for 870, 701 F-150 trucks in the US that could potentially experience a wiring-related problem with their electric parking brakes.

In a safety recall report to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), the automaker said the rear axle wiring harness bundle may contact the rear axle housing in the affected vehicles, leading to unexpected activation of the electric parking brake.



"Damaged electric parking brake wiring may lead to inadvertent parking brake application while driving, potentially resulting in loss of control of the vehicle and increasing the risk of a crash," NHTSA mentioned.

The 870, 701 trucks that could be affected are from the model years 2021 to 2023 and have single exhaust systems. The recalled automobiles were manufactured during a three-year period.

According to the report, owners of impacted F-150 pickups will receive letters advising them of the recall and the repair for the issue beginning September 11, the same date dealers will receive a notification.

Overburden to Sand: Waste to Wealth-A Unique initiative by Coal & Lignite PSUs

Even as the mandate is to produce & despatch coal/lignite to its consumers, Coal & Lignite Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs), under the guidance of Ministry of Coal, has taken an out of box initiative to produce sand from overburden at a much cheaper price. This initiative is not only helping in minimising environmental pollution due to sand siltation from overburden, but also providing an option for getting cheaper sand for construction purpose. Production of sand has already started in Coal



PSUs & a roadmap of next five years has been drawn to maximise the output of sand from Coal India Ltd. (CIL), Neyveli Lignite Corporation (NLCL) & Singareni Collieries Company Ltd. (SCCL).

The extraction of coal comes with a significant by-product

known as Overburden. During open-cast mining of coal, the strata lying above coal seam is known as overburden comprising of clay, alluvial

sand & sandstone with rich silica content. The overburden is removed to expose & extract coal from beneath. Later, on completion of coal extraction, the overburden is used for back filling to reclaim the land in its original shape. While extracting

overburden from top, swell factor of the volume accounts for 20-25%. This overburden has traditionally been considered waste or burden and often discarded without recognizing its potential value.

However, with the growing focus on sustainable practices and the circular economy, there has been a shift towards exploring alternative uses for overburden, transforming it from Waste to Wealth.

The first commercial initiative of such conversion was taken by Western Coalfields Ltd. (WCL), a Subsidiary of CIL, in its mine during 2016-17.

Gig workers in Rajasthan are legally protected

The Rajasthan government passed a bill, a few days ago, related to the economic and social welfare of "gig" workers in the state legislative assembly. The discussion about such laws started to gain momentum nationwide, highlighting the importance of providing economic security for those working in the unorganized sectors. The social existence of a person working in the unorganized sector, which is a very large part of Indian society, is possible only when he gets the economic security of his basic needs. He depends on day-to-day employment for himself and his family, but his problem is that despite sacrificing his life, he does not get any kind of financial security from his employer or institution towards his future. Under this, neither he has the option of monthly financial savings through investment in the provident fund nor any kind of insurance facility in case of accidents. Apart from this, the inability of the family to get any kind of financial facility after the sudden death of a worker working in the unorganized sector is also a pain that a large section of society has been holding on to it for the last several years. During the lockdown due to the coronavirus pandemic, the sight of crowds on the streets for days highlighted this suffering, as gig workers were compelled to walk back to their villages due to the lack of economic and social security in the cities. Notably, Rajasthan is the only state in the country that has implemented provisions related to the economic and

social welfare of gig workers through this bill. The Gehlot government had presented these provisions in the budget of February 2023, and it was unanimously passed last week.

It is also a fact that generally every other person in society might not know the meaning of the word "gig," but these days, they are hearing it frequently in their surroundings. In reality, another word closely related to the term "gig" is "freelancer." Since the economic reforms of the 1990s, there has been a significant increase in the popularity of technology and management degrees among Indian youth specially over the last two to three decades. In recent years, it has been observed that the youth do not want to tie their qualifications to a single institution for an extended period and prefer flexibility due to financial reasons and the distance from home to the cities. Consequently, they have started giving priority to jobs where they can connect with various organizations at the same time. During the coronavirus pandemic, when big companies established a "work from home" culture in Indian society, the trend of freelancing became quite prevalent. On the other hand, it is also observed that companies themselves have given more priority to such employees because it reduced their financial costs. Currently, there are around 15 crore people working as freelancers in various companies in the country, primarily in IT, BPO, FMCG, pharmaceuticals, manufacturing, marketing, branding, online education, transportation, and accounting fields. According to various experts, in the next two to three years, there is a possibility of a growth of one and a half to two percent in the



GDP through freelancing. They also predict that in the coming years, gig work will provide employment to nearly 30 to 35 crore people. However, at present, the number of such employees in big companies is around ten percent.

These days, the term "gig" is also representing those laborers in Indian society who are actively involved in various startups, playing a significant role in the development of modern India, and in reality, they are the backbone of these startups. In the current era of modernization, India's new entrepreneurs are trying to take credit for the fact that the most skilled workforce in the world is found in India. In big cities, when a customer get their preferred food items delivered within ten minutes of placing an order, it proves that companies like Swiggy, Zomato, and others are investing significantly in research and development for their workers. Similarly, in big cities, when a taxi is available to a customer within five to ten minutes through mobile applications like Ola and Uber, it saves them from the hassles of public transportation and also eliminates the risk of getting lost on unfamiliar routes. In addition to this, in big cities, using a virtual card, customers can have their preferred vegetables delivered by a delivery boy without any inconvenience,

The Rajasthan government, under Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot, has been in discussions for various social welfare schemes across the country, starting with an expansion of healthcare-related facilities. Now, with the passing of the law concerning the economic security of gig workers, it has further extended the scope of social welfare. In a democratic society, it is the government's responsibility to ensure the economic and social well-being of marginalized sections of society. The passing of these provisions in Rajasthan raises the question of whether other states will follow suit and implement similar legal measures for the welfare of gig workers.

The Rajasthan government has passed a bill in the legislative assembly to ensure the economic and social welfare of gig workers associated with various startups, making it a significant step for all gig workers in the country. According to the Rajasthan government, approximately 3-4 lakh people are currently engaged in such employment in Rajasthan. This law guarantees various economic and social security measures for all gig workers. Under its main provisions, the Rajasthan government will register all these workers on a portal and provide them with a unique code for individual identification. Through this portal, all registered gig workers will have direct access to the various social and economic welfare benefits offered by the Rajasthan government. Startups will also have to invest a specific amount in the Employee Welfare Fund. Failure to do so can result in penalties,

including an annual interest rate of 12 percent and fines ranging from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 5 lakh, as mentioned in the legal provisions. The maximum limit for this penalty is fifty lakhs rupees. The bill also proposes the establishment of a welfare board for gig workers.

on the domestic economy, such as oil and gas and real estate, remained robust in their hiring activity. The stability in these sectors showcased the resilience of the Indian job market.

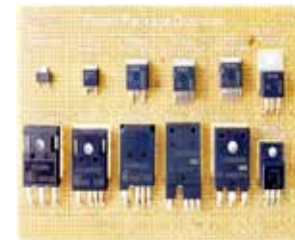

India & LAC Region should target \$100 bn trade by 2027 says S Jaishankar

NEW DELHI: India and the Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) region should aim to double their trade to USD 100 billion by 2027, external affairs minister S Jaishankar said on Thursday.

Addressing the inaugural session of the India-LAC Conclave organised by the external affairs ministry and the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), union minister said that the two sides should also look at negotiating mobility agreements since legal mobility is becoming increasingly important and mutually beneficial in a knowledge economy.

As per reports, the trade between the two regions was worth nearly USD 50 billion in 2022-23, and India's exports to Brazil stood at USD 10 billion, almost double the exports to Japan.



The EAM suggested a plan with four pillars for intensified trade and economic engagement between India and LAC countries. "The two sides should look at supply chain diversification since the Covid-19 pandemic had highlighted the need for resilient supply chains for redundant sourcing, diversified production, and food and energy security", he said.

He added that given India's status as the fifth largest economy and the country's rising demand for oil, gas, strategic minerals and food, the two

sides should work on resource partnerships.

"The two sides should share developmental experiences, including digital capabilities, health solutions and agricultural practices. In this context, India can provide customised training and exchanges for LAC countries," Jaishankar said.

Referring to importance of mobility arrangements for professionals, Jaishankar said, "We are willing to work with LAC countries to make movement easier between our businesses and our people."

The business conclave is part of India's upgraded engagement with LAC countries in recent years. India's top leaders have made 34 visits to the region in the past nine years, including four by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

India's GDP to double by 2030, will touch \$6 trillion: Standard Chartered Bank

NEW DELHI: In the next seven years India's GDP will touch USD 6 trillion, and per capita income will increase to USD 4,000 by 2030, Standard Chartered Bank Research said in a report on Friday.

India's GDP currently stands at about USD 3.5 trillion and per capita income at USD 2,450 during CY 2022. While India turning into the third largest economy by the end of the decade is a known narrative, its potential transition to an upper-middle-income economy from a lower-middle-income is an under-appreciated theme, the report said. India's drivers of growth will be consistent policy reforms, macro stability, healthy financial sector, large share of



working population, digitalisation and political stability, public capex push, it added.

The report further said that several states are likely to be far wealthier than the national average by 2030 and household consumption expenditure may be similar to India's current GDP levels by then. These include states like Telangana, Delhi, Karnataka, Haryana, Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh, among others. "We believe more mea-

sures to address job creation, infra gap, income inequality, climate challenges could further boost India's growth prospects," it added. According to the United Nations, as many as 415 million Indians moved out of poverty in the 15-year period between 2005-2006 and 2019-2021. The latest update of the global Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI), which was released by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Oxford Poverty and Human Development Initiative (OPHI) at the University of Oxford earlier this month, said that 25 countries, including India, successfully halved their global MPI values within 15 years.

RBI Likely To Maintain Status Quo On Policy Rate Despite Rising Inflation: Experts

MUMBAI: Reserve Bank of India (RBI) may keep the policy rate unchanged in the monetary policy review next week in spite of mounting inflation.

The six-member Monetary Policy Committee headed by RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das will meet from August 8-10. The monetary policy review will be announced on August 10. Professor NR Bhanumurthy, Vice-Chancellor, Ambedkar School of Economics University, Bengaluru, told news agency PTI that although consumer price index-based inflation is rising, mainly due to food inflation, credit demand remains stable.

I don't think RBI will ignore it. It will probably maintain the



status quo on the interest rate. He said retail inflation may be around 5.5% due to seasonality and if we remove it, it will be around 4 to 4.5%. It is noteworthy that retail inflation increased

to 4.81% in June from 4.31% in May. Siddharth Sanyal, Chief Economist, Bandhan Bank, said that curiosity about the next MPC meeting has definitely increased. He said the MPC maintained

the status quo in the policy rate in the April-June quarter after hiking the interest rate in the previous fiscal. The move paid off with consumer price index-based inflation falling below five percent in the summer months. The RBI had raised the key policy rate repo by an overall 2.5% through May 2022 to control inflation, before leaving the rate unchanged in April.

The US Federal Reserve recently raised the interest rate by 0.25% points to 5.25-5.5%, taking it to the highest level in several years. The European Central Bank has also increased the interest rate by 0.25%. Due to this, its main rate has become 3.75%.

PNB, Bank of Maharashtra lead in collateral-free MSME loans in FY23

NEW DELHI: One of the top public sector banks (PSBs), Punjab National Bank (PNB), Bank of Maharashtra and Union Bank of India are the banks with the maximum number of collateral-free MSME loans up to Rs 10 lakh and Rs 10 lakh to Rs 25 lakh as of March 2023, said Bhanu Pratap Singh Verma, Minister of State for MSME in a written reply to a question in the Lok Sabha.

In the list of 12 PSBs, PNB led the tally with 18 lakh loans amounting to Rs 27,124 crore. It is followed by 15.20 lakh loans involving Rs 22,783 crore



by Bank of Maharashtra and 14.64 lakh loans involving Rs 20,351 crore by Union Bank of India as of March 2023 under the up to Rs 10 lakh collateral-free loan category.

Within the Rs 10 lakh loan vertical, loans from State Bank

of India stood at 9.92 lakh involving Rs 17,406 crore while another leading PSB Bank of Baroda had 13.66 lakh loans amounting to Rs 21,543 crore outstanding as of March 2023.

SBI and Bank of Baroda had 54,753 and 44,062 loans

amounting to Rs 6,869 crore and Rs 5,372 crore outstanding as of March 2023 respectively.

The Minister further in his response said, "All scheduled commercial banks (excluding Regional Rural Banks) are mandated not to accept collateral security in the case of loans up to Rs 10 lakh extended to units in the MSE sector. Banks are also advised to extend collateral-free loans up to Rs 10 lakh to all units financed under the Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) administered by KVIC."

88% of Rs 2000 notes returned to banks till July 31: RBI



NEW DELHI: As the process for the withdrawal of the Rs 2000-currency notes continues, the RBI on Tuesday said that 88 per cent of the high-value denomination banknotes in circulation have been returned to banks till July 31. The total value of Rs 2000 notes in circulation, which was Rs 3.62 lakh crore till March 31, had come down to Rs 3.56 lakh crore by May 19. As per the latest data from banks, the total value of the Rs 2000 notes received back from circulation till July 31 is Rs 3.14 lakh crore -- 88 per cent of the total. Presently,

the Rs 2000 banknote still in circulation stands at Rs 0.42 lakh crore, said the RBI. The central banks' data indicates that of the total banknotes in Rs 2000 denomination received back from circulation, around 87 per cent was in the form of deposits and the rest 13 per cent were exchanged into other denomination notes. The RBI has urged the people to utilise the next two months bank to deposit or exchange the Rs 2000 banknotes still held by them to avoid any rush before the deadline of September 30, 2023.

Growing Dissatisfaction with Mismatched Tax Collection

164th Income Tax Day celebrated on 24th July 2023. On this day, for the first time, tax on income was collected in India. In 1857, the Indians tried to get independence in an organized way, due to which the British rule suffered a huge loss, which was compensated by imposing income tax.

Even though it has been more than 70 decades since the country got independence. Still, the number of income tax filers is nominal. Still, income tax is not deposited by many businessmen. Not only this, businessmen also do not file income tax returns. Due to this reason, there has been an increase of only 1.63 percent in the number of income tax payers in the last 5 years. However, there has been an increase of 73 percent in the case of personal tax deposits and this success has been achieved by the Income Tax Department due to technology, because now both salaried and non-salaried individuals cannot hide the interest income earned in the bank. Now everyone will have to pay tax on such income.

Only 6.2 per cent of the less than 70 million taxpayers in India file income tax returns, more than 5.5 per cent file zero tax returns, while about 60 per cent of the taxable population in the USA file income tax returns. While only 0.70 per cent of the taxable population in India pays income tax. In this country with a population of about 140 crores, the number of people who pay 30 per cent income tax is only 60.8 lakhs &

they have Rs 10 lakhs income per annum, whereas in the financial year 2021-22 this number was 48 lakhs.

In India, 6.2 percent of about 70 million people file income tax returns, while 59.9 percent in USA, 56 percent in Britain, 58 percent in France and 9.8 percent in China. People pay less tax in India when the tax rate here is very less as compared to developed countries. The tax rate is 54 per cent in Canada, 51.6 per cent in the USA, 49 per cent in France, 47 per cent in Italy, 45 per cent in South Africa, China, Japan and Germany, 40 per cent in the UK and 37 per cent in India. In many countries of the world, almost no income tax is collected. Countries like Malta, Cyprus, Andorra, Singapore, Antigua, Luxembourg, Icoberg, Ireland, Mauritius, Monaco, Switzerland, Bahamas, Bermuda etc. fall in this category.

In developed countries the income tax rate is high and at the same time, nominal tax is collected in a few countries, however, the facilities provided to the citizens are many times more and better than the facilities provided in India. Apart from this, indirect tax in India is also collected from the direct taxpayers. If direct and indirect taxes are combined, then a person paying 30 percent income tax has to spend more than 50 percent of his income in paying taxes to the government. Due to such a situation, neither development is taking place in the country nor citizens are getting better facilities.

In the financial year 2021-22, the number of taxpayers paying more than Rs.1 lakh in the country is 30,08,033, taxpayers paying tax between Rs.1 and 10 lakh are



27,93,463, the number of people paying income tax between Rs.10 and Rs.50 lakh is 1,96,535, the number of people who paid tax between Rs.50 lakh and Rs.1 crore was 12,963 and the number of people who paid income tax more than Rs.1 crore was 5,072. According to the figures of the financial year 2021-22, the percentage of those earning less than Rs.2.5 lakh in the country is 57 percent, while the percentage of those earning Rs.2.5 to Rs.5 lakh is 18 percent, the percentage of those earning Rs.5 to Rs.10 lakh is 17 percent, those earning Rs.10 to Rs.50 lakh. 7 percent and 1 percent of those earning more than 50 lakhs.

According to the data available till August 2020, Uttar Pradesh is at the first place with a share of 18 percent in income tax filers, Bihar at the second place with a contribution of 10 percent and Madhya Pradesh at the third place with a share of 8 percent. Maharashtra and Rajasthan are at the fourth position with a share of 6 percent each. These figures show that the people of Bihar states are better than the developed states in terms of depositing income tax.

Salaried people in India pay the maximum tax, while non-salaried people, which include

professionals such as doctors, lawyers, chartered accountants, architects and businessmen, pay less tax. According to an estimate, non-salaried individuals in the country file an income tax return of Rs 31,500 on an average, while salaried individuals file an income tax return of over Rs 90,000. 96 percent of non-salaried people file income tax returns of less than Rs 10 lakh, while 88 percent of salaried people file income tax returns of less than Rs 5 lakh.

In our country, non-salaried people get many exemptions in income tax, due to which their tax liability is less, in spite of this, some businessmen do tax evasion. Having a machine in the factory, small businessmen get the benefit of 10 percent of the cost of the machine in the form of depreciation, that is, if a person has a machine worth Rs 10 lakh in his factory, he will get the benefit of 10 percent of the cost of machine.

By the way, there are some other reasons for depositing less income tax, for example, due to the informal economy in India, a large part of economic activities is still outside the purview of the government monitoring system, due to which a section of businessmen do not deposit

income tax.

Many small businesses, such as street vendors, daily wage workers, etc. fall under the informal sector, due to which it is not easy for the government to track their income. Another reason for the low tax base in India is the low participation of women in the work force.

According to a World Bank report released in June 2022, there has been a steady decline in the labor force participation of Indian women since 2005 and is set to fall to a low of 19 percent in 2021. A large population of India is still dependent on agriculture. Since agricultural income is exempt under Income Tax, due to which almost 50 percent of farmers do not file Income Tax Returns.

In the old and new tax regime, income tax has to be paid only when the income is above a certain limit. In the old tax system, no income tax has to be paid to those earning up to Rs.5 lakh. The annual income of a large population in India is less than 5 lakhs and those with this much income are exempted from paying income tax. Not only this, those whose income is up to 5 lakhs also refrain from filing income tax returns.

Obviously, bringing informal businesses and workers into the tax net will benefit both the country and the general public. Therefore, businessmen should be encouraged to self-register their businesses with the government machinery and comply with tax laws. The Goods and Services Tax (GST) system can also help in this task. Depositing income tax regularly can get financial help from the bank and can also get the benefit of gov-

ernment schemes. With the help of GST, the benefit of deposit of input tax can be availed and the large buyers can get benefit in continuation of supply.

High earners can be identified with the help of bank transactions, credit cards, property purchases, etc. to bring them under the income tax net. The income of some farmers is in lakhs and crores of rupees, but they do not pay taxes. Tax base can also be increased by bringing agricultural income into the tax net.

Collecting tax at source in the course of purchase of certain goods and services can also identify potential taxpayers. Many people in the country earn huge amount every year, but they steal without any fear. Currently TCS is collected on expensive motor vehicles, gold jewelry or money transferred abroad etc. but the scope can be extended to consumer durables, domestic luxury travel, stay in expensive hotels etc.

It can be said that there are many anomalies related to income tax in our country. Salaried people are paying tax, but some professionals and businessmen are evading tax. There are also some loopholes in the matter, for example, the government has failed to collect taxes from the businessmen working in the informal sector. Along with this, the taxpayers who are depositing taxes are not getting the expected facilities, due to which there is a lot of anger in their mind about the way and system of the government.

US judge rejects Trump's attempt to derail 2020 election probe

Former US President Donald Trump's attempt to derail an investigation into his alleged meddling in the 2020 presidential election in the state of Georgia has been rejected by a judge, the media reported.

On Monday, Fulton County Superior Court Judge Robert McBurney rejected efforts by Trump's legal team to keep a Georgia district attorney from prosecuting him and from using certain evidence gathered in her investigation into the case, reports Xinhua news agency.

In his ruling, McBurney said there are no grounds to disqualify Fulton County District Attorney Fani Willis from pursuing her investigation. Willis has suggested that she may seek charges in the case in the com-



ing weeks. Trump's legal team in Georgia had previously asked the court to throw out all the evidence from the special purpose grand jury investigation and disqualify Willis, citing concerns about the constitutionality of

special grand juries in the state and about "a prosecutor's office that was found to have an actual conflict, yet continued to pursue the investigation".

The special grand jury did not have the power to indict.

Donald Trump pleads not guilty to charges of plotting to overturn 2020 election

WASHINGTON: Former US president Donald Trump has pleaded not guilty before an Indian-American judge to four charges that he plotted a criminal conspiracy to remain in power despite losing the November 2020 election. Donald Trump, 77, entered his plea on Thursday before Magistrate Judge Moxila Upadhyaya at a Washington, D.C., federal courthouse not far from the US Capitol, where the alleged conspiracy he's accused of orchestrating turned violent on January 6, 2021.

But it did issue subpoenas and hear from witnesses and issue a final report with recommendations for Willis.

But despite Trump's mounting legal troubles, his status as the clear frontrunner for the 2024 Republican presidential nomination continues un-

abated.

The former President has been indicted twice in the past four months -- once in New York for alleged financial crimes and once in a federal court on charges that he mishandled sensitive government documents and obstructed an investigation.

Pakistan PM Shehbaz Sharif hints at delaying elections

As the Pakistan government is ready to bring in an interim setup with a mandate to hold elections within 90 days, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has hinted towards a delay in the polls, creating a rift within his coalition partners.

The visible rift, as seen on various social media posts, is exposing the lack of talks and closed door consultations between Sharif's Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) party and its major coalition partner Pakistan People Party (PPP). The premier has said that elections will be held only on the basis of the 2023 digital census, hinting towards a delay between eight months to one year. "We have to hold the elections on the basis of the new census... When the census has been conducted, the polls should be held on its basis unless there is an obstacle that cannot be overcome. But I don't see any such hurdle," he said during an

interview. Sharif's comments have sparked a widespread debate as the PPP has made it clear that it would not endorse any decision that results delaying the polls. "The party has already taken a position on the subject that fresh delimitation would cause delay in

holding general elections and given this reason, the party has opposed it," senior PPP leader Nawaz Muhammad Yousaf Talpur said. "Fresh delimitations would in theory require four months, but in reality, it might take as long as eight months or an year," said PPP information secretary Faisal Kareem Kundi. Meanwhile, the Muttahida Qaumi Movement-Pakistan (MQM-P) has also opposed the decision of going to the polls based on the old census.



British Pakistani radical preacher faces terror trial in May 2024



LONDON: A radical Islamist preacher with dual British and Pakistani nationality charged with three terrorism-related offences will face a trial in May next year, a UK court ruled on Friday. Anjem Choudary, 56, was arrested at his home in east London by the Metropolitan Police last month and charged with membership of a proscribed (banned) organisation, addressing meetings to encourage support for a proscribed organisation, and directing a terrorist organisation under different sections of the UK's Terrorism Act 2000.

He appeared before the Old Bailey court in London via a video link on Friday, when a provisional trial date was set for May 20.

A Canadian national, 28-year-old Khaled Hussein, who was also arrested in a related counter-terrorism inquiry on charges of membership of a proscribed organisation will also face trial next year. Both men were remanded into custody to appear before Kingston Crown Court on January 5, 2024.

"On Monday, July 17, Met counter-terrorism detectives investigating alleged membership of a proscribed organisation arrested a 56-year-old man in east London and a 28-year-old Canadian national at Heathrow Airport, after he arrived on a flight," the Met Police had said in a statement at the time of charging the suspects last month. "They were held under Section 41 of the Terrorism Act 2000 and detectives were granted warrants of further detention allowing them to detain the men until Monday, July 24," the statement added.

The Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) told the court at the time that Choudary spoke online to weekly small groups from June 2022 until his arrest, giving lectures on the establishment of an Islamic State in Britain. Co-accused Hussein is said to have effectively worked for Choudary in Canada.

"The charges relate to the proscribed organisation Al Muhajiroun, also known as the Islamic Thinkers Society. Criminal proceedings against Mr Choudary and Mr Hussein are now active and they each have the right to a fair trial," said Nick Price, from the CPS Counter Terrorism Division.

"It is extremely important that there should be no reporting, commentary or sharing of information online which could in any way prejudice these proceedings. The function of the CPS is not to decide whether a person is guilty of a criminal offence, but to make fair, independent and objective assessments about whether it is appropriate to present charges for a criminal court to consider," he said. UK-born Choudary has been associated with different radical outfits, including the now-banned Islamist group Al Muhajiroun. He was released from London's high-security Belmarsh prison back in 2018 where he was held after being convicted by the Old Bailey court in London in September 2016 for radical preaching and calling on Muslims to support the terrorist group.

Bodies of three Nepalese pilgrims recovered from flash flood & landslide site in Kedarnath Yatra Route



KATHMANDU: Bodies of three Nepalese pilgrims who were killed have been recovered and eight others still missing after a flash flood swept away a hotel where they were staying near the Kedarnath temple area in Uttarakhand in India, a media report said here on Friday. The bodies of at least three Nepalese pilgrims have been identified while those of eight others continue to remain missing following the landslide that hit the Kedarnath Yatra route in Uttarakhand due to heavy rains on Thursday, Nepal's government-run Gorkhapatra daily reported.

Spain-based Indian held from Delhi for terror funding

NEW DELHI: The State Special Operation Cell (SSOC) of Punjab Police on Thursday said it has arrested a Spain-based Indian national Harjeet Singh from the Indira Gandhi International Airport in New Delhi in connection with terror financing and involvement in planning to execute targeted killings in the state. The police have also arrested Harjeet's close-associate, Amrinder Singh, alias Bunty, from his home district Khanna. The development came in less than a week after Punjab Police busted a target killing module with the arrest of five module members handled by foreign entities linked to Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF). Divulging details, AIG SSOC, SAS Nagar, Ashwani Kapur, said they had received an input that Harjeet Singh, a native of village Ghanshampur in Gurdaspur, had come to India around a month ago and is involved in activities of terror financing and also planning to execute few target killings in the state.

Stopping Sikhs from growing beard in NYPD, violation of religious freedom: Dhami

The Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) President Harjinder Singh Dhami has raised objection to the policy of the New York Police Department (NYPD), of stopping Sikh policemen from growing their beard. The SGPC President has written a letter in this regard to the Indian Ambassador to the United States of America (USA) Taranjit Singh Sandhu. He has also sought intervention from the Union Minister of External Affairs Dr. S. Jaishankar.

Earlier, on July 28, a news appeared in the section of media wherein it was reported State trooper Charanjot Ti-



wana, based in Jamestown, New York, requested permission to grow his beard to the length of one-half inch (1.27 centimeters) in March 2022 for his wedding but the Tiwana's request was denied on the basis that it posed a safety issue regarding the use of a gas mask, according to his union, the New York State Troopers Police Benevolent Association.

SGPC president on the basis of news in his letter to the Indian Ambassador to the USA,

Harjinder Singh Dhami said that the NYPD policy of stopping a Sikh policeman from growing a beard on the basis of safety issues is not rational. "Stopping Sikh policemen from growing a beard on the basis that it posed a safety issue regarding the use of gas mask is wrong. Even if a Sikh trooper has a fully grown beard, the gas mask can easily be worn by tying the unshorn beard while serving on such a duty. An example of this is the Sikh soldiers serving in the Indian Army, one of the world's top military forces", said Dhami.

"Initiated Sikhs do not cut hair and keeping hair unshorn for a lifetime is one of the commitments towards the Sikh religion and the Gurus (masters).

Russian stock market hits 17 month high as oil prices surge

MOSCOW: Russia's ruble-based MOEX index exceeded 3,000 points, marking its highest level since February 22, 2023, the day before Moscow launched its military operation in Ukraine, local media reported.

The index was 0.7 per cent higher at 3008.61 points on Friday. Since the beginning of 2023, the MOEX has increased by about 40 per cent. The stock market has demonstrated consistent growth since a collapse following the announcement of partial mobilisation in September, 2022. Analysts told Russian business daily Kommersant that the rally had occurred due to a dropping ruble, rising oil prices, and the dividend policy of the country's corporate sector. Ex-



perts expect the MOEX index to reach 3,500 points by the end of the year, RT reported. In the latest trading session, shares in LUKOIL, Rosneft, Tatneft, Gazprom Neft, and Surgutneftegaz were among the major oil companies that demonstrated solid growth. Sberbank stocks rose by 0.6 per cent, the strongest among firms in the financial sec-

tor. Meanwhile, Brent crude oil, a global benchmark for Russia's main export, was up 1 per cent at \$83.72 per barrel, nearing a three-month high and supporting Russian stock indexes. Russia's national currency, the ruble, edged lower to trade at about 90 against the greenback, nearing its lowest point since April 2022, RT reported.

Trudeau Couple Separation : Punjabis have sweet memories during their visit to Sri Harmandir Sahib

AMRITSAR: People in Punjab have sweet memories of Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and his wife Sophie Gregoire's maiden visit to Amritsar in November 2018 during which they offer prayers at the Golden Temple, Sikhism's holiest shrine that gets millions of visitors annually.

Dressed in Indian clothes with their heads covered, the Trudeau couple, along with their children, bowed before the holy book of the Sikhs and tried their hand at making chappatis at the 'langar' as they spent over an hour at the shrine.

Responding to an announcement by the Trudeau couple over their separation, the media advisor to former Punjab Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh, Raveen Thukral tweeted on Thursday: "And they separate... memories when Justin Trudeau & Sophie were together in Amritsar with @capt_amarinder in 2018. Lovely family, sad to see them drift apart."

Thukral, who is currently residing in Canada and was attached with the Chief Min-



ister during the Prime Minister's visit, shared photos of the Trudeau family from his collection regarding their visit to Amritsar when they Captain Amarinder Singh, who had initially refused to meet the Canadian leader, claiming his cabinet members supported the formation of Khalistan.

With 800,000 Sikhs calling Canada home, the largest Sikh diaspora, the roots of the first Sikh in Canada dating back to the 1800s. The Sikh community is very active in Canadian politics. Their influence is reflected in Trudeau's first cabinet, which was represented by four out of 40 ministers. Prominent Sikhs outside

the government include NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh and Conservative finance critic Jasraj Singh Hallan. Sophie Gregoire announced on Wednesday that she and the Prime Minister, who have been married 18 years, have decided to separate. The couple, in statements posted on Instagram, said they made the decision after "many meaningful and difficult conversations". A statement from the Prime Minister's office said they both have signed a legal separation agreement.

"They remain a close family, and Sophie and the prime minister are focused on raising their kids in a safe, loving and

The Toronto mayor opened the festivities as the two-day event of food, Bollywood music, dance and fun attracted Indians, Pakistanis, whites, blacks and various other ethnic groups in Canada's most diverse city.

Stretched over seven blocks on Gerrard Street, the bazaar remained jam-packed as fun-seekers, food and music lovers and shoppers thronged shops,

food stalls and stages as Bollywood music blared from loudspeakers.

The organisers also introduced 'Cricket Gully' this year to introduce Canadians to India's most favourite sport.

"Over 300,000 people, including more than 40 per cent of non-Indian background, attended the festival this year. It has become a great platform to introduce our culture, food and sport to our next generations as well as the mainstream," said Gerrard India Bazaar president Chand Kapoor. Over 300 artists from various ethnic backgrounds performed during the two-day festival. "We have never seen so much diversity of performers. Everybody seems to be drawn to Bollywood," said Gerrard India Bazaar executive director Tasneem Bandukwala.

S-Korea's inflation at 25-month low

THE OVERALL RISE, HOWEVER, WAS LIMITED AS PRICES OF AGRICULTURAL AND FISHERY PRODUCTS EDGED DOWN 0.5 PER CENT ON THE BACK OF THE FALLING COSTS OF BEEF AND PORK

South Korea's consumer price growth slowed for the sixth straight month in July to the lowest level in 25 months on the back of lower oil prices, data showed on Wednesday. Consumer prices, a key gauge of inflation, rose 2.3 per cent last month from a year earlier, compared with a 2.7 per cent increase in June, according to the data from Statistics Korea. It marked the lowest advance since June 2021. In June, inflation fell below 3 per cent for the first time since

July, as those of diesel and gasoline plunged 33.4 per cent and 22.8 per cent, respectively, offsetting gains in bread that shot up 8.1 per cent.

The price of fuel, in particular, fell at the sharpest rate since the agency started compiling related data in 1985.

The service sector gained 3.1 per cent on-year in July due to higher insurance and house management costs. Prices of daily necessities -- 144 items closely related to people's everyday lives, such as food, clothing and housing -- climbed 1.8 per cent on-year, slowing from a 2.3 per cent jump a month earlier.

Last month, the Bank of Korea kept its key interest rate unchanged at 3.5 per cent for the fourth straight time.

The central bank delivered seven consecutive rate hikes from April 2022 to January 2023.

Swiss embassy denies suspending Schengen visa appointments for Indians

Some media reports last week claimed that the Swiss embassy had suspended Schengen visa applications for Indians till October. However, the officials rejected it and clarified that the process continued without any issues.

New Delhi : The Embassy of Switzerland in India has denied reports that it has suspended Schengen visa appointments for Indian tour groups until October due to high volume of applications. "We have almost 800 daily appointments through the end of September 2023. These include 22 groups," the mission said in a statement released on Thursday.

Asserting that people-to-people contact is at the core of Swiss-Indian relationship, the Embassy said that it has processed more visa applications in the current year than it did in 2019. "We have surpassed our pre-pandemic times processing level. From



January until June, we handled 129,446 applications, as against 120,071 during the same period in 2019 -- a 7.8 per cent increase." In addition, it said various measures have been implemented since the beginning of 2023 to further ease the visa application process for Indian applicants.

As per these measures, it would now be possible for the applicants to apply for their visa six months before their date of travel, as against one month in the past.

So, someone wishing to travel in June can already apply for a visa in January.

Further, the Embassy has increased its overall capacity in India. With a new Visa Application Centre (VAC) in Lucknow, there are now 13 VACs all over India, where applications can be submitted.

The mission also informed that at present it takes "no more than 13 working days between the appointment by our partner VFS Global and the Embassy's decision on the

application".

The statement of clarification came following media reports on Tuesday which said that Indian tour operators were informed by the Swiss embassy to reschedule group trips to allow ample time for visa processing. "Swiss embassies are currently dealing with a lack of staff," several media reports had said, citing Simon Bosshart, Head of Markets East at Switzerland Tourism.

A Schengen visa is a short-stay visa granting individuals an opportunity to travel to any member country within the Schengen Area for tourism or business purposes for up to 90 days. One Schengen visa application costs 80 Euros or Rs 7,260 in India.

India had the second-highest number of Schengen visa rejections worldwide in 2022, leading to an estimated loss of Rs 87 crore on canceled trips, according to SchengenVisaInfo.com.

"If you show some mercy, the petitioner will spend the rest of her life with her husband, four minor children and matrimonial relative, will be grateful that you give a chance to make something of myself and to be a source of strength and support matrimonial petitioner can. The petitioner will finally be able

live a life of dignity in India," Haider stated in a petition. Seema Haider hails from Sindh province in Pakistan. She got in touch with Meena through online game PUBG in 2019-20 and they started talking on whatsapp and Instagram before falling in love with each other. Haider was arrested by local authorities of Greater Noida in UP on July 4, for illegally entering India and got bail on July 7. Since then she is staying in Greater Noida with Sachin Meena.

On the other hand Anju had fallen in love with Nasrullah (who resides in Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province) through facebook, and went to Pakistan. According to media reports of Pakistan, Anju has embraced Islam and become Fatima now. After

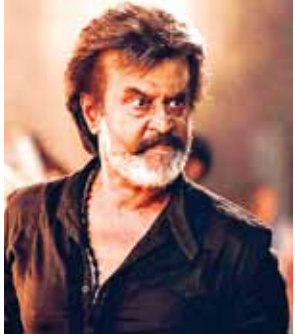
