Delhi will give befitting reply to BJP in election says AAP after the services bill passed by Parliament

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Tuesday targeted the Centre over the Delhi services bill passed by Parliament and said the people of the national capital will give a "befitting reply" to the BJP in the upcoming elections.

AAP chief national spokesperson Priyanka Kakkar said the entire opposition "unitedly opposed" the bill. Party Delhi convener Gopal Rai said the bill is an "insult" to the people of Delhi.

"The entire opposition unitedly opposed the unconstitutional bill yesterday. We are fighting the battle in Parliament and the court. The people of Delhi will

give them (BJP) a befitting reply in the next elections," Kakkar said. Parliament on Monday passed the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi (Amendment) Bill, 2023, that gives the central government control over bureaucrats in the Delhi government.

Rai alleged that the bill was introduced in Parliament by the Central Government against the decision of the Supreme Court and called it a "murder of democracy". "The bill brought in Parliament by the Central government against the historic decision of the Supreme Court is nothing but murder of democracy.

This is an insult to the people of Delhi. People of Delhi and history will not forgive the BJP.



The public will answer this in the Lok Sabha elections 2024," he said in a tweet. AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sushil Kumar Gupta termed the passing of the bill in Parliament as a "black day in democracy" and said the people of Delhi "will reject the BJP" in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections.

"August 7 will be known as a 'black day' in Delhi's history. The people of Delhi had rejected BJP before and they will again give a befitting reply to it in the upcoming elections," Gupta said. AAP MP Sanjay Singh alleged that the digital voting system inside Parli-

ment was damaged and there was "no counting agent" during the passage of the bill. "For the first time, I am seeing that in Modi ji's Digital India, the digital voting system got damaged inside Parliament itself. Voting was done by slip. There was no counting agent. Don't know who voted for whom. Scams happening inside Parliament," Singh alleged. The bill, passed by Parliament, replaces an ordinance promulgated by the Centre for handling the transfers and postings of officials in the Delhi government. Meanwhile, the AAP has defended its MP Raghav Chadha after the BJP accused him of forging signatures of five MPs in a motion related to the Delhi services bill.

Manipur violence shameful, govt has no intention to change demography, says Amit Shah



NEW DELHI: Home Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday said that the incidents of Manipur are shameful and said that the government has no intention to change the demography of the northeast state. He also appealed the all the ethnic groups to shun violence and look for a peaceful solution to the problem by talking to the central government. "I agree with the opposition about the violence which has happened there. It is shameful, but it is all the more shameful to politicise it," he said.

Shah at the same time said that had the video been shared with the state's DGP or the police on time, then action would have been taken against the perpetrators at the earliest. The Home Minister wondered why the video was leaked just a day before the commencement of the monsoon session. He also urged

the ethnic groups to talk to the Central government and look for a peaceful solution to the strife torn situation prevailing there.

Participating in the discussion on the no-confidence motion in Lok Sabha, the Home Minister attacked the Congress-led opposition saying that the most instances of ethnic and communal violence and riots took place during the reigns of Jawaharlal Nehru, Indira Gandhi and Rajiv Gandhi. He even listed out all such incidents of the past several years, and went on to add that in 1993 and 1997 when ethnic violence had broken out in Manipur, no discussion took place in Parliament during the first instance, and when it did take place at the time of the second incident, only the Minister of State for Home replied to the discussion.

What is regretful is that PM has not found time to visit Manipur says P. Chidambaram



NEW DELHI: Senior Congress leader and former Union Minister P. Chidambaram on Thursday took a dig at Union Home Minister Amit Shah, and also questioned the Prime Minister over not visiting violence-hit Manipur. In a tweet, Chidambaram said, "Ethnic cleansing is shameful," admitted the Home Minister. It happened under his watch. He added that it is 'more shameful' that politics is being played on it. He is wrong.

"Raising and debating the issue of ethnic cleansing is the duty of every citizen, especially of political leaders and MPs. What is regretful is that the Prime Minister has not found the time to visit Manipur in the last 100 days," the Congress leader added. His remarks came a day after Shah, while speaking in the Lok Sabha on the no-confidence motion, said that the ethnic strife in Manipur "is shameful, but what's more shameful is how the opposition is playing politics over the issue". "Why was the video not shared with the DGP and police agencies? Why were the cops kept in dark about the incidents?" Shah asked in the Lok Sabha.

What went wrong in Nuh-Mewat

The violence in Nuh-Mewat has sparked a lot of questions about why the police and the state have not been able to stop communal violence despite prior information. Other states cannot target only Haryana; Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, West Bengal and other parts of India have all made similar mistakes under such circumstances. The question is whether the government has acted quickly enough to prevent such incidents.

The question arises as to why the government's machinery failed to react in time, despite having knowledge of the potential for violence between two communities. The role of police, local administration, and local religious leaders must be scrutinised, as it cost this horrible occurrence in which six people died and over a hundred people were hurt, including some police officers.

Failure of policing?

There needs to be an investigation into why the cyber-intelligence did not act quickly enough to neutralise the hate that was being spread on social media and WhatsApp messages by fanatics from both communities before the violence on 31 July. Why did not the local police conduct aerial surveillance by flying drones over vulnerable places to check rooftops in the area before and on July 31. They could have easily spotted stones and bricks on the roofs of the suspicious houses that threw stones at the religious procession. Later, widely circulated videos showed individuals throwing stones from their roofs at the religious procession. Why were drones used after violence when stones are freely available as tools for violence, whether in the Delhi riots (2020) or in the history of previous riots and sectarian violence in the country?

Intelligence failure?

What is the reason for the failure of grassroots policing? Did intelligent groups of local police fail to grasp the seething situation in the areas as a result of the constant online social media war between local Muslim and Hindu fanatics? Did the city administration ignore or overlook this? Reportedly, the local police had indications that there might be tension between two communities due to a religious procession. If these leads were received, the question of why the killing of these leads went wrong must be answered, and those responsible must be held accountable.

Tax on online gaming & casinos at 28%: Centre to seek introduction, passage of bill to amend GST Act

NEW DELHI: The central government on Friday will seek the introduction and passage of the Central Goods and Services Tax (Amendment) Bill, 2023 and Integrated Goods and Services Tax (Amendment) Bill, 2023 in the Lok Sabha.

The union cabinet earlier this week had cleared the two bills. The amendment in the Central Goods and Services Tax Act will



allow introduction of a 28% goods and services tax rate on

horse racing, online gaming and casinos. Similarly, states too will have to amend their individual GST legislations separately.

If the bill is passed in the day, the new tax system will become applicable from October 1, as was decided in the GST council meeting held earlier this month. It was decided in that meeting that 28 per cent levy on online gaming, casinos and horse rac-

ing will become applicable from October 1 onwards and will be reviewed for six months, and if need arises, changes could be made in the tax structure after that. Friday being the last day of the monsoon session of Parliament, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will introduce the two bills and if the House business continues, then it will also seek to get the two bills passed.

2,444 Women-led MSMEs reported Shut Down in FY23



NEW DELHI: About 2,444 number of women-headed MSMEs closed during the period of 2022-23, as per Udyam Portal, informed Minister of State for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Bhanu Pratap Singh Verma in a written reply to the Lok Sabha on Thursday.

In the current fiscal year till 4 May 2023 total 320 MSMEs led by women have shut down so far and during FY 2021-22 the tally was 1,040, as per the official government data. The MoS also shared the number of women owned MSMEs registered on Udyam Portal of Ministry of MSME. According to year-wise data, 652,715 women owned MSMEs have been registered so far in the present financial year till 8 August 2023.

In FY23 and FY22 the registration records are 1487,840 and 910,375, respectively. He emphasised on various schemes launched by the government to encourage entrepreneurship among women.

Through an amendment to the Public Procurement Policy, the Government has mandated that all Central Ministries/ Departments and Public Sector Undertakings should procure at least 3% of their annual procurement from women owned micro and small enterprises, said the MoS. The Ministry also implements several other schemes for promotion and development of MSMEs, including women owned MSMEs, namely, Micro and Small Enterprises Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP), Tool Rooms & Technol-

'PM Modi wants Manipur to stay on fire', says Rahul Gandhi



JAIPUR: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, during his visit to Mangarh Dham in Rajasthan on World Tribal Day on Wednesday, said Prime Minister Narendra Modi wants Manipur to keep burning, adding the BJP's ideology has killed the spirit of Mother India in Manipur.

Addressing the gathering, he said that the tribals were the first owners of India. "This is our land, which we call India today... this land was the land of tribals. This was told to me by my grandmother Indira Gandhi, but the BJP calls tribals 'Vanvasi'. This is an insult to the tribals and Mother India," he said. Regarding the violence in Manipur, Rahul Gandhi said that the

Prime Minister wants Manipur to keep burning.

"The Prime Minister wants the fire to keep burning in Manipur. It has been three months, it seems that Manipur is not a part of the country at all. I went to the relief camp. The leader of the opposition went but the PM did not. He did not say a word about Manipur," the Congress MP said.

The former Congress president further said "wherever the people of BJP go, they try to suppress the voice of India".

"BJP's thinking has set Manipur on fire. Manipur has been on fire for months. Bharat Mata was murdered in Manipur. BJP's ideology has killed Mother India," he added.

Hry khaps, farmers' union demand Monu Manesar's arrest

Representatives from approximately 30 khaps in Haryana, leaders of the Samyukt Kisan Morcha, diverse farmer unions, and individuals from various faiths convened a significant mahapanchayat in Bass village, Narnaund town, within the Hisar district. The assembly was orchestrated under the leadership of Suresh Koth, a notable member of the SKM.

A series of resolutions were presented and unanimously adopted by the members. These included a call for the apprehension of individuals Bittu Bajrang and Monu Manesar, alleged to have used derogatory language to challenge the Muslim community during a procession. The assembly fervently advocated for individuals from all faiths to abstain from participating in any form of violence in the future. Furthermore, attendees, representing diverse strata of society, pledged to collaborate to establish peace and harmony within the areas affected by the Nuh violence.



Exodus of artisan worker to their hometown, after the violence hit Nuh, Gurugram

Despite the authorities effort to halt the departure of the migrant worker from the city, fear coursed artisans from the minority community have fled the violence-hit district of Haryana. The exodus of artisan to their hometowns in various states had surged due to the recent incident of communal clashes in Nuh and Gurugram-much of the exodus has taken place from the Rajka Meo Industrial area in Nuh and Gurugram's sector-37, Khandasa, Kadipur, Manesar and IMT Sohna.

The exodus was triggered after mobs led by right-wing groups indulged in stone pelting, set multiple shops ablaze, and threatened and thrashed scores of workers belonging to a particular community after a VHP procession was attacked in Muslim dominated area in Nuh. The Nuh and Gurugram



violence claimed the lives of six people and 88 were injured. The violence sparked widespread fear among migrant workers of a community who work in the textile industries in Nuh, Gurugram, and Sohna.

The exodus started on August 1 as the workers headed back to their homes in Bihar, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, and West Bengal carrying their meagre luggage and accompanied by their wives and children.

"In Gurugram Muslim karigars have left Gurugram amid violence and fear. However, these karigars were not targeted in Gurugram and even no one has threatened them as they worked in garment houses and not in open shops like, salon shops, meat shops or scrap shops. They returned to their native places due to fear, which harms the garment industries' production," said K.K. Gandhi, President of Industrial Association Sector-37.

Gandhi said the winter season is a few months away and this is a peak time for the production of winter clothes. The violence will surely prove to be a great loss to the garment industry.

"We are leaving, we are no longer safe here and have no faith in the police," said Babu Jha, a middle-aged Karigar from Bihar, who worked in one of the garment houses in Gurugram. "We have told our employers that we no longer feel safe despite the presence of security guards," he said.

Meanwhile, the IMT Manesar Industrial Association has condemned the violence. "We do not believe in religion among the workers. We hired workers as per their work quality and skill and at the time of hiring, we do not see religion. We strongly condemn the violence that erupted in Nuh and Gurugram," Atul Mukhi, President of IMT Manesar Industrial Association told.

Explained : How Delhi Services Bill will impact governance of capital

After the Rajya Sabha ratified the Delhi Services Bill, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Monday said it was a 'black day' for India's democracy and accused that the BJP-led Central government is stealthily seizing authority.

This divisive bill, which passed with a count of 131 to 102 in the Rajya Sabha, empowers the Central government to supervise the bureaucracy within the Delhi government.

Home Minister Amit Shah defended the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi (Amendment) Bill, 2023, saying the proposed legislation is aimed at providing effective and corruption-free governance in the national capital.

The recent legislation dictates that the Centre will oversee the transfer and duties of Delhi government employees across all



categories. Kejriwal, in his critique, humorously questioned if such policies would lead the prime minister to micromanage even the daily tasks of a low-level government peon.

"Will the prime minister now sit and decide what work a peon of the Delhi government will do? Is this the job of the prime minister?," asked Kejriwal.

Expressing his gratitude, the Aam Aadmi Party chief lauded several political figures, such as the erstwhile PM Manmohan Singh and JMM head Shibui Soren, for standing by AAP

during these challenging times. Emphasizing his deep-rooted connection with Delhi, Kejriwal stated that the citizens' affection for him remains unswayed, despite continuous criticism from BJP leaders. Condemning the bill's endorsement as a blatant overreach, Kejriwal opined that the BJP's central governance isn't acting in the nation's best interests but rather suppressing its citizens. He equated the bill's ramifications to shackling Delhi's populace and remarked on the irony of such a move 75 years post India's independence.

Delhi L-G grants sanction to prosecute 2 for raising anti-national slogans like 'Khalistan Zindabad'

NEW DELHI: Delhi Lieutenant Governor V. K. Saxena has accorded sanction for prosecution of two persons accused of spreading anti-national slogans like "Khalistan Zindabad" at the behest of banned outfit -- Sikh for Justice (SFJ) -- early this year.

According to information, accused Vikram Singh and Balram Singh were arrested by the Delhi Police for drawing multiple "pro-Khalistani" graffiti in areas of Vikasपुरी, Janakपुरी, Pachim Vihar, Peeragarhi, Meera Bagh and other adjoining parts of West Delhi on January 19.

Graffiti with anti-national slogans like "Khalistan Zindabad", "SFJ", "1984", "Punjab Banega Khalistan", "Referendum 2020 Vote for Khalistan", were drawn by the accused, who during investigation, disclosed that they indulged in such activities on the instruction of fugitive secessionist and SFJ founder Gurpatwant Singh Pannun.



"The L-G has granted the sanction for prosecution under Section 196 (1) of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), 1973, in the case registered by the Special Cell of Delhi Police for the commission of offence under section 153B and 120B of the Indian Penal Code. Section 153B of IPC deals with Imputations, assertions prejudicial to national-integrity and social and religious harmony," said LG office.

During investigations, the Delhi Police seized USB Pen Drives containing CCTV footage, proof of payments and location of mobile phones of the accused in the area where graffiti were made.

"During investigations, it was revealed that a video was circulated on social media platforms wherein Pannun was advocating and encouraging secession through such graffiti and video message and conspiring to disrupt the sovereignty and territorial integrity of India," police said

The delegation will include party national vice-president and former MP Shaikh Siddiqui, national general secretary Yashvir Singh, RLD national spokesperson Bhopendra Chaudhary and former Thana Bhawan MLA Rao Waris. Chaudhary said that the team will meet the victims and gauge the prevailing situation in Nuh which happens to be a Muslim dominated district. "The district administration was committing atrocities on innocent people in the guise of taking action," he said. The RLD's stance came hours after the Punjab and Haryana High Court put a hold the demolition drive in Nuh.

DSGMC demands proper investigation into suspicious death of young Sikh medical aspirant in Rajasthan

Delhi Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee (DSGMC) President Harmeet Singh Kalka and General Secretary Jagdip Singh Kahlon have urged Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and DGP Umesh Mishra for proper investigation into suspicious death of young Sikh medical aspirant in Rajasthan.

In separate letters written to CM and DGP, both Kalka and Kahlon said that a Sikh youth and medical aspirant of 18-years Manjot Singh died in a suspicious condition in Kota, Rajasthan. They said that it was a matter of grave concern that Rajasthan Police claim's that this was a case of suicide whereas the family of the deceased has alleged a foul play as the hands of their son were found tied behind after death. They disclosed that this Sikh boy was hailing from Uttar Pradesh and taking coaching for NEET exam in Kota, Rajasthan.

High Court directs action against 3 FSL officers alleged involved in Rs 11lakh bribe

In-spite of Punjab and Haryana High Court's direction the action was not taken by Haryana state government against three officers of Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) in Karnal district in-spite of the fact the Special Investigation Team (SIT) led by IGP Karnal confirmed irregularities in purchase of DNA-PCR kits by FSL. Although Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB), Haryana state too confirmed that their investigation revealed that FSL officers had taken bribe against tender for supply of DNA-PCR kits required in cases of serious crimes including murders, rapes and gang rapes to match the DNA of the victim with the DNA of accused. Information also reveals that more than a lakh kits

have already been supplied by the firm. In fact, the tender for procurement of the kits was floated by Haryana Medical Service Corporation Limited for which a purchase committee was constituted and one of the members of the committee Dr. Rajiv Kwatra had made a complaint against committee members about irregularities in this deal. In January 2021 when Home & Health Minister Anil Vij had ordered investigation by a Special Investigation Team (SIT) which indicated embezzlements in these procurements followed by another SIT led by ADGP to investigate the matter which also indicated irregularities in the purchases and the case was handed over to the court in 2022.

During hearing in this case in June this year, High Court justice took a serious view over state vigilance department Haryana taking no action against three alleged accused suspecting that senior bureaucrats sheltering them in-spite of Anti Corruption Bureau as well as reports confirming irregularities in purchase of DNA-PCR kits when High Court directed Chief Secretary Haryana, Director General Police in the state and Home Secretary to register case against corrupt officers within a month and produce them in the court during next hearing date on 11th September 2023, failing which senior officers saving alleged accused should be prepared to face consequences in this case.

Karnataka state formally Launched Gruha Jyothi scheme, 200 units of free electricity in the state

Karnataka Government formally launched in Kalaburagi home turf of Congress president Mallikarjuna Kharge, its Gruha Jyothi scheme that promised up to 200 units of free electricity to every household in the state. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, who officially launched the Gruha Jyothi scheme by symbolically handing over 'zero bills' to 10 consumes, cm in his speech dared BJP to implement similar poll guarantees in the BJP ruled states if they indeed cared for the poor. Taking dig at BJP, Siddaramaiah said people talk a lot about the Gujrat model, "we don't need the Gujrat model. We have begun Karnataka model. "PM had said if the guarantee schemes are implemented,

the state will go bankrupt, but Karnataka is strong enough financially to fulfil the promises we have made to the people" he added.

With the rollout of Gruha Jyothi, the state government has so far implemented three of the five poll guarantees issued by the Congress. The other two being Shakti, which offers free ride for all women passengers on state run buses, and Anna Bhagya, which hands out a monthly cash payment of Rs 170 per member in families that are below the poverty line (BPL), in lieu of 5 kg of rice. Addressing huge congregation on his home turf Kharge said, "If this country must be safe, Congress will have to return to power and INDIA (the alliance of anti-BJP parties) will have to come to power in the Parliament."

Mother- Newborn Intensive Care Unit inaugurates at Safdarjung Hospital

With a motive to decrease the risk of mortality and morbidity in preterm infants the Safdarjung hospital, Delhi inaugurated Mother-newborn Intensive Care Unit for out born babies.

"World over, it is an established practice to separate the sick new-borns from their mothers and shift them to a neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). So the Mothers stay at home or wait in the hospital lounge. Consequently, only few are able to come to the new-born units to attend to their babies. They are allowed to do this only

intermittently as a visitor and not as a caregiver. As a result babies do not get much needed for their mother's breast feed and the Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) (skin to skin contact with mother), said Dr Vandana Talwar, Medical Superintendent, Safdarjung Hospital.

Often these babies are at higher risk of cross infections due to low nurse baby ratio in low-middle income countries. The Dept. of Paediatrics at Safdarjung hospital is the first tertiary care centre in the country to initiate a Mother-Newborn Intensive Care Unit (M-NICU) services for out born babies in 15 bedded Level 3 (Tertiary level) NICU.

Dr Rajiv Bahl, DG ICMR said, 'Keeping mother and her sick baby together increases the opportunity for prolonged and effective KMC, which is a proven intervention to reduce mortality and early and sustained breastmilk feeding'.

Manohar's bulldozer speed increases, about 250 houses of anti-social elements razed

Following Yogi Adityanath, Chief Minister Uttar Pradesh, the Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar has also started a bulldozer campaign in Mewat area in the state after the recent incidents of riots at Nuh in Mewat. He said that all losses caused during recent riots will be recovered from those involved in these riots and a large number of them have already been identified by the state vigilance department. Yamuna-Ghaggar being polluted, untreated wastewater being pumped into these rivers

According to Haryana government's recent report as reargd Yamuna and Ghaggar rivers water unfit for drinking at six locations in Palwal district, five locations in in Ballabgarh, two locations in Bahadurgarh and one location in Nuh district with few others at different locations due to polluted as well as sewerage water is being illegally thrown in these rivers at places, as such millions of litres of untreated effluent has become the main reason behind toxic waters of both Yamuna and Ghaggar rivers. According to the government information for laying sewerage line work has been completed in 30 villages out of the total number of 34 villages has been installed by the government near Yamuna canal, whereas work for installation of sewerage in villages in Karnal, Panipat, Palwal and Faridabad districts will be

completed by end September this year. In case of Ghaggar catchment area work for laying sewerage line out of 27 villages is near to completion in 26 villages.

A monthly progress report by the Haryana government regarding the Ghaggar and Yamuna action plan has been reported to the National Green Tribunal (NGT) reveals that over 11 drains are discharging 540 million litres per day (MLD) untreated effluent into the Yamuna at 25 sewage treatment plants (STPs) located in the Yamuna catchment area are non-compliant with the prescribed standards. Similarly, in Ghaggar catchment area of total 62 STPs with a capacity of 535 MLD, 23 STP are not meeting the prescribed specifications, while there are total number of 59 STPs installed in the Yamuna catchment area with a capacity of 1075 MLD, and 25 of them are not meeting the prescribed standard.

Drop in female sex ratio in eight Haryana districts, worrying state govt

A recent report from the NITI Aayog said sex ratio at birth nationwide has dropped from 906 in 2012-2014 to 900 in 2013-2015. The number of girls born for every 1,000 boys in 17 States in the country witnessed a drop with Gujrat state performing the worst declining 53 points. While this is a highly disturbing trend, it is not new for India, which has seen a consistent downfall in girls as compared to every 1000 male children. The number of girls born is naturally lower than the number of boys because of the preference for for the male child.

Shockingly, In case of Haryana state Sex Ratio (SR) in male and female in eight districts including Rohtak, Mohindergarh, Sonapat Karnal, Charkhi Dadri, Kaithal, Bhiwani and Gurugram has been observed

less than 900 girls as compared to 1000 boys. In-spite of state health department efforts there is no control over illegal ultrasound centres across the state involved in detecting pre-natal sex of unborn child in pregnant, which usually charge amount between Rs 30000 to 40000 for determination of sex of child in womb and there are several private hospitals and 'Jholachhap' doctors charging amount between Rs 80000 to Rs 1 lakh for termination of pregnancy in

case of female child in the womb. However, the health department has arrested a large number of persons including owners of ultrasound centres involved in this illegal practice.

Government of Haryana had started 'Beti Bachao-Beti Padoo' campaign from Panipat in year 2015 when in the year 2019 male-female sex ratio (SR) in newborns in Haryana state slashed down to 923 in 2019 and was recorded as 906 in July 2022.

Horizontal landing of Chandrayaan 3 is a challenge says ISRO

Vikram, the lander of India's third lunar mission Chandrayaan-3, will be able to make a soft-landing on the Moon's surface on August 23. These de-orbiting manoeuvres will be performed on August 9, August 14, and August 16 till its orbit reduces to 100 km x 100 km from the Moon, Somanath said. A lander propulsion module separation exercise will be taken up subsequently, soon after lander "deboost", a process that slows down the craft. It will be followed by landing on lunar surface on August 23, he explained. "We have also made sure that if two of the engines (in Vikram) don't work this time also, it will still be able to land," the ISRO chairman said. "So the whole design has been made to make sure that it (Vikram) should be able to handle many failures, provided the algorithms work

into lunar orbit on August 5. There will be three more de-orbiting manoeuvres -- exercises to bring it closer to the Moon so that Vikram lands on the Moon's surface on August 23. These de-orbiting manoeuvres will be performed on August 9, August 14, and August 16 till its orbit reduces to 100 km x 100 km from the Moon, Somanath said.

A lander propulsion module separation exercise will be taken up subsequently, soon after lander "deboost", a process that slows down the craft. It will be followed by landing on lunar surface on August 23, he explained. "We have also made sure that if two of the engines (in Vikram) don't work this time also, it will still be able to land," the ISRO chairman said. "So the whole design has been made to make sure that it (Vikram) should be able to handle many failures, provided the algorithms work




properly," he added.

The biggest challenge before the ISRO team, according to him, is to make a horizontal Vikram land vertically on the lunar surface. Somanath said once the lander separates from the orbiter, it will move horizontally. Through a series of manoeuvres, it will be brought to a vertical stance in order to land safely on the Moon. This exercise is crucial, as

ISRO failed to get its lander to touchdown safely on the Moon's surface during the Chandrayaan-2 mission. "The ability to transfer from horizontal to vertical direction is the trick we have to play here. Here only we had the problem last time," Somanath pointed out. The challenge is also to make sure that the fuel consumed is lesser, the distance calculations are correct and all the algorithms work properly, the ISRO chief said.

However, the ISRO team this time has made arrangements to ensure that Vikram makes an attempt to land properly even if there are some variations in the calculations, Somanath explained. According to him, the lander will have four payloads: Chandra's Surface Thermo Physical Experiment (ChaSTE) will carry out the measurements of thermal properties of lunar surface near polar region.

Anxious moment as Chandrayaan-3 just 1,437 km from lunar surface

Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has released two images taken by the Chandrayaan-3 spacecraft. The first image is the Earth as viewed by Lander Imager (LI) camera. The second image is of the Moon captured by the Lander Horizontal Velocity Camera (LHVC) on board the spacecraft on August 6. ISRO guided Chandrayaan-3 even closer to the lunar surface - It's now at 1,437 km at Apolune (farthest point from moon) with the completion of its third lunar-bound manoeuvre, including the lunar orbit insertion (LOI) carried out on Sunday.

The next lunar-bound manoeuvres will be on August 14, when ISRO will further reduce the distance between the spacecraft and Moon, on August 16, when Chandrayaan-3 enters the 100 km circular orbit, and August 17, when the landing module, comprising the lander Vikram and the rover Pragyan break away from the propulsion module. Once Vikram, with Pragyan sitting inside, separates, ISRO will de-boost it to an orbit where the perilune (closest point to Moon) is 30 km and the Apolune is 100 km. The final landing will be attempted from this orbit. S Somanath, ISRO chairman, in a lecture at the event organised by Disha Bharat, an NGO in Bengaluru, reiterated that various redundancies introduced in Chandrayaan-3 to ensure a safe

landing on August 23.

Somanath said, "The most critical part of landing is the process of reducing the velocity of the lander from 30 km height to the final landing. At 30km, the spacecraft is horizontal. Transferring the spacecraft from a horizontal orientation to vertical is very challenging. We had problems here with previous mission Chandrayaan-2. We have to ensure that not too much fuel is consumed, the distance is calculated correctly. All algorithms work... For this, we have changed the guidance design, introduced newer algorithms and extensive simulations have been done" he added.

Meantime in other development ISRO discusses Moon, Sun data sharing with Japan. ISRO chairman S Somanath and National Astronomical Observatory of Japan director - general Saku Tsuneka discussed multiple possibilities of collaboration as part of Indo-Japanese bilateral relations and partnership through QUAD - Quadrilateral Security Dialogue between Australia, India, Japan and the US. Tsuneka, also the vice-chair of Japan's cabinet committee on National Space Policy (CNSP) met with Somanath at the ISRO head quarters in Bengaluru. "India-Japan space science cooperation at national level, space agency level (ISRO and JAXA) and institutes-level were discussed with specific reference to the proposed joint Lunar Polar Exploration (LUPEX) mission," ISRO said.

Couple arrested in Kashmir for posing IAS, IPS officers



NEW DELHI: Jammu and Kashmir Police have arrested a couple on charges of impersonating as IAS and IPS officers and duping people. The accused have been identified as Manmohan Ganjoo, and Ayoush Koul Ganjoo. According to a police spokesperson, the couple's modus operandi involved deceiving people by making false promises of lucrative positions, career advancements, and other personal favors. Further investigation revealed that Manmohan Ganjoo had been serving as a suspended police personnel. Law enforcement authorities executed a search warrant at the couple's residence, leading to the confiscation of incriminating evidence. Among the seized items were laptops, mobile devices containing fabricated transfer and appointment orders, including fraudulent documents related to Manmohan Ganjoo's induction into the Indian Police Service (IPS). Policy rate to balance growth and inflation

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) recent decision, steered by its Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), to maintain its policy rate is a strategic gamble. This move is particularly intriguing when juxtaposed against the MPC's upward revision of its inflation forecast. A mere two months ago, the MPC projected a 5.1% average inflation based on the Consumer Price Index for the fiscal year ending in March 2024. This forecast has now been adjusted upwards by 30 basis points to 5.4%. A significant factor in this revision was the unexpected surge in tomato prices, which propelled the inflation projection for the July-September quarter up by a notable 100 basis points to 6.2%. RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das recognized the transient nature of such price shocks but also cautioned against the potential destabilization of inflation expectations due to recurrent food price fluctuations. While the RBI rightly emphasizes the government's role in timely supply-side interventions to mitigate such shocks, it's undeniable that unchecked price instability can jeopardize macroeconomic stability and growth. The MPC's commitment to a 4% inflation target is evident in its majority-backed policy stance, which emphasizes the gradual withdrawal of accommodation. In alignment with the MPC's position, the RBI has temporarily mandated a 10% hike in the cash reserve ratio for banks. This move aims to absorb some of the excess liquidity in the banking system, which could otherwise fuel inflation. Das has assured a review of this increase by September 8, if not sooner, to maintain liquidity during the festive season. However, the MPC acknowledges potential inflation risks, including erratic rainfall, rising crude oil prices, and anticipated output price increases. While the RBI and the MPC have expressed their readiness to align inflation targets and anchor inflation expectations, their proactive intervention in the upcoming months will be the real test of their commitment to stabilizing the economy.

India's Myanmar dilemma



July 31 and August 1 will be recorded as the crucial dates when the history of Myanmar's ongoing tragedy was written. In the first case, the acting President of Myanmar, Myint Swe, announced the fourth extension of the 'emergency' for another six months, which is in violation of the 2008 Constitution. In the second instance, the military regime decided to release several political prisoners and even reduced the sentences imposed on Daw Aung San Suu Kyi and the deposed President Win Myint. Ms. Suu Kyi was also moved out of prison to house arrest. However, these developments do not signal the dawn of a democratic and peaceful Myanmar.

Emergency and elections

The extension of the emergency further delays the elections proposed by the military. Min Aung Hlaing, the coup orchestrator, justified the extension due to the failure to establish 'normalcy' in large parts of the country. However, it is this pursuit of 'normalcy' that has resulted in suffering, with ACLED, or the Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project (a disaggregated data collection, analysis, and crisis mapping project) reporting that Myanmar civilians witness two and a half times more violence than those in Afghanistan.

The military regime's relentless campaign includes an average of over 30 airstrikes per month in 2023. Surprisingly, the Tatmadaw (the military of Myanmar) exerts real control in only 30 percent-40 percent of the territory, as in admissions from the Burmese military and a report of the Special Advisory Council for Myanmar (SAC-M). A factitious national election would lead to the loss of further credibility if it is conducted only in a third of the country.

Moreover, the reshuffling within the military-backed Union Solidarity and Development Party (USDP) under Khin

Yi, is aimed at adding more military hardliners, further raising concerns about the junta's commitment to democracy. The decision by the National League for Democracy decision not to participate in the new elections, combined with the exclusion of smaller parties through the new party registration laws, leaves no viable opposition to the USDP in a parliament whose constitutional structure gives the military a practical veto.

The junta's decision to reduce Ms. Suu Kyi's sentence and shift her from the prison is a move that has perplexed a few. Yet, it is not a step towards democracy. Despite being the Tatmadaw's biggest rival, Ms. Suu Kyi has demonstrated a willingness to compromise and work with the military. She remains the rallying point for political change in Myanmar despite international criticism over her position/stand and role in the Rohingya persecution. Some protest may ease with these symbolic gestures. But more importantly, Suu Kyi's return could potentially split the National Unity Government (NUG)-led resistance. A young generation of activists is leading the NUG and its cooperation with ethnic armed organisations and even reconciliation with

Rohingyas. This could all change if Ms. Suu Kyi is back in active politics.

These symbolic gestures by the junta, as said, may ease some protests and allow the military to claim progress over international and regional appeals, possibly leading to a lifting of sanctions and revived economic prospects. Additionally, they offer political bandwidth and a face-saving token to actors engaging with the junta, such as India.

Indian policy

At the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic and the coup, India took a proactive approach by providing food and vaccine assistance. However, the plight of the Myanmar people seems to have faded from memory, with accusations of instigating violence in Manipur replacing it. Communities along the border have already defied the Home Ministry by providing shelter to the refugees. Concerns over trafficking and drug smuggling in Myanmar led to India suspending the Free Movement Regime in September 2022. India's External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar raised the issue of infrastructure projects and stability in border areas with his Myanmar counterpart Than Swe in

Bangkok in July, on the sidelines of the Mekong Ganga Cooperation (MGC) meeting. India has also supported the Association of Southeast Asian Nations' 'Five-Point Consensus'. Nevertheless, India's policy towards Myanmar presents a paradox.

India's official rhetoric on commitment to democracy in Myanmar is in contrast with its policy framed through the lens of its security concerns in north-east India and relations with China. For example, India's announcement of the Sairang-Hmawngbuchhuah railway project near the Myanmar border, under India's Act East Policy, aims to counter China's railway access in Myanmar through Yunnan and the ambitious China-Myanmar Economic Corridor.

Disturbingly, sources such as Justice for Myanmar, SAC-M, and the United Nations Special Rapporteur have reported an increase in India's arms supply to the military since the coup. Arming the Tatmadaw not only undermines India's position on restoring democracy but also adds fuel to the fire, which spills over regularly across the border.

An approach to pursue

India's policy options in Myanmar are challenging, but not limited. The relaxation of Ms. Suu Kyi's prison sentence may provide an opportunity for India to engage with her and pro-democracy actors, including the NUG. Additionally, the government and media must avoid blanket securitisation and profiling of incoming refugees, many of whom have ties of kinship in India. This approach is essential to prevent further violence and foster an environment of care and compassion.

Time to stop the fence-sitting in cluster bomb use

The decision by the United States to send cluster munitions to Ukraine, as part of a new military aid package to bolster Kyiv's war efforts against Russia, has raked up controversy. Cluster munitions, or cluster bombs, are weapons that release multiple explosive submunitions, also called bomblets, into the air. These submunitions explode as soon as they hit the ground, killing and maiming people in the area. Many bomblets do not blow up instantly and remain dormant for years (also known as the dud rate). These inactive bomblets act as precarious landmines, posing a grave threat to the civilian population, including women and children, for a long time. According to the Human Rights Watch, which is a civil society organisation, Russia, since launching a full-scale invasion of Ukraine, has used cluster bombs against Ukraine in cities such as Kharkiv, resulting in hundreds of civilian deaths and damaging civilian objects such as homes, hospitals, and schools. Now, Ukraine using these dangerous weapons will worsen the situation.

Cluster bombs have a notorious history. They were used in the Second World War. Since then, cluster bombs have been used on multiple occasions including by the U.S. in the wars in Vietnam, Afghanistan, and Iraq. According to the Cluster Munition Monitor, anywhere between 56,000 to 86,000 people have died in cluster munition-affected countries, since the 1960s.



Enactment of convention

Along with its increasing use, the international campaign against cluster bombs led by the civil society organisations such as Human Rights Watch also gathered momentum. This resulted in an international treaty called the Convention on Cluster Munitions (CCM) being enacted in May 2008. The enactment of the CCM has been a major step in eradicating cluster bombs. However, the treaty is not universal — 112 countries have acceded to the CCM including many North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) members such as Canada, Germany, France, and the United Kingdom. But important countries such as the U.S., Russia, China, Israel, and India have not signed the CCM. Ukraine is not a member.

Article 1 of the CCM bans the use, production, stockpiling, and transfer of cluster bombs. The convention further obligates countries to destroy existing stockpile of cluster munitions in their possession. Countries are also legally bound to develop a victim assistance programme to provide support and rehabilitation to the cluster bomb victims in their jurisdiction.

Customary international law

Given that there is such an international treaty, are Russia and Ukraine violating international law by using cluster bombs? Since these countries are not signatories to the CCM, it is argued that they are not bound by international law banning cluster bombs. This is not correct.

International law on armed conflicts has always drawn a distinction between combatants and civilian populations and between civilian objects and military objectives. In this regard, a fundamental customary international law (CIL) norm applicable to armed conflicts is the prohibition of indiscriminate attacks. In other words, an essential canon of international law is that the use of force must be discriminate, that is, the force should target specific military objectives and not civilians. This CIL norm is codified in Article 51(4) of Additional Protocol I to the 1949 Geneva Conventions, to which both Russia and Ukraine are parties. Given the nature of cluster bombs, their usage is a classic example of indiscriminate use of force that fails to differentiate between combatants and civilians, or between civilian objects and military objectives, and is thus illegal.

Another fundamental international humanitarian law norm relevant here is proportionality. Codified in Article 51(5) of the Additional Protocol I to the 1949 Geneva Conventions, this rule prohibits excessive use of force that causes incidental damage to the civilian population or civilian objects, when compared to military benefits anticipated. Given the fact that the use of cluster bombs is inherently indiscriminate, harming civilians, their use will amount to disproportionate use of force and is thus illegal. In sum, even if Russia and Ukraine are not signatories to the CCM, their use of cluster bombs violates international law.

But what about the U.S.? Arguably supplying cluster bombs to Ukraine outside of the CCM, that Washington has not signed, is not a violation of international law. Moreover, it is claimed that the U.S.-made cluster bombs, unlike the Russian ones, have a low dud rate, that is, the prospects of unexploded bomblets are slim. Thus, questionably, they meet the requirements of the use of force being proportional and discriminate. Nonetheless, supplying cluster bombs to any country is an irresponsible act. The usage and the possession and transfer or supply of cluster bombs should be banned universally, as envisaged in the CCM. For this to happen, all United Nations member-countries should accede to the CCM and eradicate cluster bombs from the face of the earth.



Punjab MP urges Govt to revive Ludhiana's Textile Industry



LUDHIANA: The Spinning mills in Ludhiana are in a dire state and there is an urgent need to revive the city's textile industry, member of Parliament Sanjeev Arora said in the Rajya Sabha on Thursday.

Arora pointed out that through various forums and platforms, he has been receiving appeals to impose anti-dumping duty on import of polyester spun yarn (PSY) under ASEAN Free Trade Agreement (FTA) and making import of cotton duty free as this will provide a level playing field for all the stakeholders in the textile sector.

"It is shocking to learn that the Central government, after considering the final findings of the designated authority, has decided not to accept the aforesaid recommendations," Arora said. He pointed out that the Indian textile industry contributes to 40 per cent of the country's demand for man-made fibres.

The spinning industry employs more than 6.5 lakh powerloom machines weaving three crore metres of cloth a day, and a yearly consumption of over 6 lakh metric tons of various yarns and fibres.

The MP said that the government's decision of not imposing definitive anti-dumping duty on imports of "Polyester Yarn (Polyester Spun Yarn)" originating in or exported from China PR, Indonesia, Nepal and Vietnam has cast a shadow on the domestic weaving sector which is mainly dependent of various types of synthetic yarns. Also, it defeats the goal of Made in India.

Two top-level executives exit IPO-bound Ola Electric



NEW DELHI: Ola Electric has seen two more top-level exits, as it plans for an initial public offering (IPO) in early 2024, the media reported on August 5.

According to a report in Money Control, Slokarth Dash who is head of strategy and planning, and Saurabh Sharda, head of growth and corporate affairs, have moved on. Ola said in a statement that "Slokarth and Saurabh have delivered well for the company for over seven years, and we wish them well in their future pursuits". The company, however, denied that more CXO-level members are set to move on. "India is the future hub for tech and top global talent is eagerly joining new age companies like ours. Ola is the largest EV company in India thanks to the efforts of our world-class team," according to the company spokesperson.

Ola Electric has registered an operating loss of \$136 million (roughly Rs 1,116 crore) and revenue of \$335 million (roughly Rs 2,750 crore), missing its revenue goal disclosed publicly. The company reported sales of over 1,50,000 electric scooters for FY23, media reports said, citing sources. In the first two months of FY23, Ola Electric claimed to have surpassed Rs 500 crore in revenue and was on track to surpass \$1 billion by year's end. Meanwhile, leading US asset manager Vanguard has further slashed its holding in ride-hailing major Ola by more than half, which takes Bhavish Aggarwal-run company's valuation down to nearly \$3.5 billion from \$7.3 billion at the end of 2021, according to an earlier TechCrunch report.

From being a fragile economy, India now among fastest growing economies: FinMin

NEW DELHI: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on August 10 said that from being declared a fragile economy in 2013, India is now among the fastest growing economies in the world with real GDP growth being 7.2 per cent in 2022-23, which is expected to expand by 6.5 per cent in the current financial year.

Participating in the discussion on the no-confidence motion in the Lok Sabha, the finance minister said India's growth is in stark contrast to the deceleration being seen in the global economy. Sitharaman observed that within nine years, the Indian economy has risen and experienced substantial economic growth, largely due to the government's policies, despite the Covid pandemic.

She said that India finds itself in a unique situation of harbouring optimism and



positivity regarding its future growth. Taking potshots at the earlier UPA regimes, the finance minister said, "We only heard of slogans like 'Garibi Hatao', but never saw it happen for six decades. We don't give post dated cheques. Earlier it was 'milege', 'banega' and 'hoga'. Now all this has changed to ban 'gaya', 'mil gaya' and 'ho gaya'." All the treasury benches could be seen echoing Sitharaman's

comments. The UPA, she said, wasted a generation because of corruption. "Under NDA, we have seen high growth and low inflation. We believe in empowering all and appeasement of none," Sitharaman added.

The finance minister also targeted the opposition bloc INDIA, calling it a bizarre partnership. "In Punjab, Congress and AAP are fighting. In Bengal, TMC, Left and Congress are

fighting. In Kerala, Left and Congress are fighting. In J&K, the National Conference and PDP are fighting, etc," she said. Sitharaman, while referring to direct benefit transfer (DBT), said that it serves as a model for the global community. She acknowledged the implementation of DBT by the UPA, but pointed out that only Rs 7,367 crore were transferred in 2013-14. However, DBT transfers have grown five-folds.

She informed that India's UPI was now a global success story, being emulated by many nations. Banks now were functioning professionally and NPAs had been drastically reduced from where they stood 10 years back. "Aapka phailaya rayta hum saaf kar rahe hain" she quipped amid peels of laughter by treasury benches.

She even had a war of words with DMK MPs, while inform-

ing the House about the AIIMS in Madurai, which she said will have 900 beds, 150 more than other such institutes. When DMK members Kanimozhi and Dayanidhi Maran sought to know where the facilities were and that the minister was misleading the House, a war of words began between the DMK MPs and Sitharaman erupted.

She could be heard saying that the new AIIMS won't burden Tamil Nadu, however the DMK MPs started shouting "Yeppo! Yeppo!" (Where! Where!). In retaliation, the BJP MPs started chanting "Modi! Modi!"

When TMC's Sougata Ray said that she was from the Rajya Sabha, the finance minister snapped back, saying that UPA's prime minister was also imported from the Upper House, referring to Manmohan Singh.

Rupee falls 16 paise to 82.82 against US dollar amid losses in local equities

MUMBAI: The rupee depreciated by 16 paise to settle at 82.82 against the US dollar on Friday amid weak sentiment in the equity markets and a strong dollar against major rivals overseas.

Foreign fund inflows and softening crude prices, however, supported the Indian currency even as investors were awaiting India's industrial output number, to be released later in the day, said analysts.

At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 82.75 against the US dollar. It touched the peak of 82.73 and hit the lowest level of 82.87 during intra-day trade before settling at 82.82 against the greenback, 16 paise lower from its previous close.

"Indian rupee depreciated on a positive US dollar and weak domestic markets. However, FII inflows and over-



night decline in crude oil prices cushioned the downside," Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, said.

On Thursday, the rupee rebounded 19 paise to close at 82.66 against the US dollar after the RBI asked banks to set aside a larger part of incremental deposits under the cash reserve ratio (CRR) as part of measures to take out excess liquidity from the banking system.

The Reserve Bank of India in its bi-monthly monetary policy review also decided to keep key interest rate unchanged, but hinted at tighter policy if food prices drive inflation higher.

In the overseas currency market, the dollar strengthened after US consumer price inflation showed moderation in July, raising hopes that the US Federal Reserve would pause rate hike. Choudhary said the rupee is expected to trade with a "negative bias on risk aversion in global markets and elevated crude oil prices. However, fresh inflows by FIIs may support Rupee at lower levels". "Traders may take cues from India's industrial production and US PPI and consumer sentiment data. We expect the USDINR spot to trade in the range of 82.40 to 83.30 in the near term," he added. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, rose 0.11 per cent to 102.64.

Global oil benchmark Brent crude was trading 0.19 per cent lower at USD 86.24 per barrel.

Indian medical devices sector to reach USD 50 billion in coming years: Union Health Minister



NEW DELHI: The market size of the Indian medical devices sector is likely to reach USD 50 billion in the coming years from the current USD 11 billion, Union Minister Mansukh Mandaviya said on Thursday.

Addressing a curtain raiser of India MedTech Expo 2023, to be held in Gandhinagar from August 17-19, the minister said that India is set to emerge as the global manufacturing hub for medical devices through a holistic development of healthcare, pharmaceuticals and medical devices sectors.

He further emphasised that to make healthcare affordable, the government is targeting to increase the share of generic medicines to 50-60 per cent from the current level of 14 per cent alongside localisation of medical devices.

"The medical device sector is considered one of the sunrise sectors in the country. While earlier, we used to think in silos, Prime Minister Modi's holistic thinking has put India on the path of being the global hub for manufacturing medical devices and producing innovative medical technologies," Mandaviya said. As per reports, over 230 delegates from 50 countries from ASEAN, Africa, CIS, Middle East, OCEANA are expected to participate in the three-day event. Over 400 exhibitors, including MSMEs, domestic and international manufacturers, start-ups, regulatory bodies, state governments and central ministries and departments are likely to participate in the event.

World Bank mulling local currency lending in countries like India: Official

MUMBAI: The World Bank is mulling local currency lending in countries like India to help borrowers save on costs, a senior official said on Friday.

"How do we do local currency lending for a country like India is also something we are trying to think of at a price which is advantageous to this country," Anshula Kant, the Managing Director and Chief Financial Officer of the World Bank, said.

Speaking at the event on global economy organised by the Ministry of Finance and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) as part of India's G-20 presidency, Kant said the Indian government has a "huge advantage" in local currency borrowing as compared to the World Bank, even though the Washington DC-based multilat-



eral bank is rated AAA.

In some countries like the ones in Africa, which do not possess market infrastructure from where the bank can borrow, the bank may not adopt the local currency lending strategy, Kant said. At the event, Chief Economic Advisor to the Government of India V Anantha Nageswaran said global inflationary pressures are easing more than expected.

He said persistence of core inflation globally continues to be a cause of concern and added that there is a need for coherence between fiscal and monetary policies. Ashima Goyal, an academic who is also an external member on the monetary policy committee of RBI, said it is important for the monetary policy to address the financial stability needs.

MSME's GVA share in GDP rise to 2%; Exports share decline in last 3 years

NEW DELHI: The share of MSME Gross Value Added (GVA) in all India Gross Domestic Product (GDP) during the year 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 was 30.5%, 27.2% and 29.2% respectively, informed Minister of State for MSME, Bhanu Pratap Singh Verma in a written reply to the Rajya Sabha on Monday.

He cited the latest information received from Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation.

In view of export share of MSMEs, there has been a decline during the year 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 as the share reported 49.4%, 45.0% and 43.6% respectively, as per the information received from Directorate General of Com-



mercial Intelligence and Statistics (DGCIIS).

The share of MSME manufacturing output in all India Manufacturing output during the year 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 was 36.6%, 36.9% and 36.2% respectively, re-

ASSOCHAM expects no change in REPO rate

ASSOCHAM expects the RBI Monetary Policy Committee to keep the policy REPO rate unchanged when it shares the outcome of its meeting tomorrow, giving the present state of the macro-economic situation along with a hint of future interest rates trajectory, chamber Secretary General Deepak Sood said today.

"It looks like a pause situation when it comes to policy interest rates, given some pressure in prices of food articles which we expect should abate in the next few months. Besides, the global macro picture also may work as a key factor to keep the rates unchanged," Mr Sood said.

RBI's eye on sustainable growth is a prudent policy: ASSOCHAM

NEW DELHI: Credit policy review by the RBI Monetary Policy Committee focuses on ensuring sustainable growth of 6.5% or more for the economy while navigating challenges of inflation related more to weather conditions, ASSOCHAM said today, expressing confidence that the RBI would ensure adequate liquidity in the banking system for a momentum to the India Growth Story.

"Anchoring of inflation may have led to measures like incremental Cash Reserve Ratio, but as the RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das has given an assurance it is a temporary intervention that would be reviewed on September 8. Besides, there is an assurance of enough liquidity in the system that should give us comfort," ASSOCHAM Secretary General Deepak Sood said. Retention of policy REPO rate to 6.5 per cent is on the expected line.

He said, despite challenges emanating from the global

economic, the RBI-MPC has several positive macro take-aways like a sustainable GDP growth of 6.5 per cent, uptick in capacity utilisation in the manufacturing sector and revival of private sector investment in key sectors of the economy. Taking inflation to the RBI target of four per cent would eventually lead to a solid and sustainable growth. Excluding food and fuel, core inflation is declining while the weather conditions should play out in a few months.

MUMBAI: To promote online payments, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has increased the limit for small digital payments from Rs 200 to Rs 500 per transaction. 200 per transaction for small value digital payments in offline mode including National Common Mobility Card (NCMC) and UPI Lite, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said after the third bi-monthly meeting of the Monetary Policy Committee on Thursday. 2000 and set an overall limit of Rs.

Since the trend of transactions through this mode has increased rapidly, there has been a continuous demand to increase the transaction limit.

To encourage wider adoption of this mode of payment and bring more use cases to this mode, it is now proposed to increase the per transaction limit to Rs.500. However, the overall limit has been retained at Rs 2000 to contain the risks associated with relaxation of two-factor authentication. Instructions will be issued soon in this regard.

According to the EOW, both David and Gurtej Sidhu have travelled to many places in India including Odisha and have attended various STA programs. They are always seen using luxurious lifestyles like star hotels, expensive cars, fancy clothes, surrounded by bouncers, hero's welcome in meetings etc.

The Ponzi firm conducts several publicity programs at various places to spread its membership. They use fancy hotels, motivational speakers, music, lunch/dinner etc. in such meetings to brainwash future members.



Two Crore disbursed as pensions to 2103 dead beneficiaries, Rs 2.8 cr diverted for publicity: CAG

NEW DELHI: The Ministry of Rural Development (MORD) made payment of pensions amounting Rs 2 crore to 2,103 National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP) beneficiaries in 26 states and Union Territories even after their death, and funds worth Rs 2.83 crore were diverted for publicity and campaign, the Comptroller Auditor General of India (CAG) has said in its report.

The CAG report, on the performance audit of the NSAP from 2017-18 to 2020-21, was tabled in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday. The report said that according to NSAP guidelines, a pensioner's pension may be discontinued due to death or migration or crossing BPL or any other reason and the pension payment should be stopped accordingly.

It said that further, gram panchayats or municipalities shall report every case of death of a



pensioner to the designated Sanctioning Authority. "Non-reporting of death leads to continuation of pension even after the death of the beneficiary leading to irregular payment of pension," it said. The death of beneficiaries was not being reported by gram panchayats or municipalities in a timely manner in case of 23 states and UTs of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Delhi, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Kerala, Ladakh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Manipur, Nagaland, Odisha, Punjab, Sikkim, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Puducherry.

India Exim Bank enters factoring segment of Trade Financing for MSMEs

Donald Trump pleads not guilty to latest charges in classified documents case

Former US President Donald Trump as well as his close personal aide Walt Nauta have pleaded not guilty to the latest charges in the case of mishandling classified documents.

Trump and Nauta, a former White House military valet turned personal aide, are facing charges which accuse the two men and a third aide of conspiring to conceal surveillance footage at the former President's Mar-a-Lago resort in Florida from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), reports the BBC.

They have already pleaded not guilty to previous charges against them.

The office of Special Counsel Jack Smith, who is leading



the documents case and also overseeing a separate indictment of Trump over his alleged efforts to overturn the results of the 2020 election, on Thursday recommended to a federal court in Washington D.C. that the former President

face trial in the election case on January 2, 2024.

In June, he charged the former President with 37 counts, for retaining hundreds of confidential files, including about US nuclear secrets and military plans, after leaving office and

for lying to investigators.

Nauta was also charged in the indictment and accused of moving files to hide them from the FBI.

In a superseding indictment, prosecutors detailed an alleged effort between Nauta and Carlos de Oliveira, the property manager at Mar-a-Lago, to obstruct the investigation, the BBC reported.

The court document alleges the two men, at Trump's request, tried to delete security footage outside the storage room where documents were being held.

That indictment added one count of wilful retention of defence information and two of obstruction against Trump,

bringing the total charges against him in the case to 40.

He had previously waived his right to appear in person in the Florida courtroom on Thursday.

His attorney Todd Blanche entered a not guilty plea on his behalf.

Nauta also received two additional charges of obstruction in the latest indictment, while de Oliveira was charged with four counts, including conspiracy to obstruct justice and making false statements.

Both men were present in the room, but de Oliveira was unable to enter a plea as he had not yet retained local counsel.

His arraignment has been rescheduled for August 15.

Chinese Naval warship docks in Colombo port after delay caused by Indian concerns: Report

COLOMBO: A Chinese Navy warship capable of surveillance has docked at the Colombo port, nearly a year after another spy vessel berthed at a strategic port in the country and raised concerns in India.

The Chinese People's Liberation Army Navy warship HAI YANG 24 HAO arrived at the port of Colombo on Thursday, the Sri Lankan Navy said. The vessel is to leave on Saturday.

"The 129 metre-long ship which arrived in Colombo is manned by a crew of 138 and it is commanded by Commander Jin Xin. The ship is scheduled to depart the country tomorrow," the Navy statement said.

According to media reports on Friday, Sri Lanka delayed its arrival upon concerns raised by India. "The Chinese authorities sought permission for it earlier, but Sri Lanka delayed permission because of resistance from India," the Daily Mirror newspaper reported. Despite a briefing by Sri Lanka to Indian officials, the latter remained concerned about the research ship's visit to the island nation.

In August last year, a similar



visit by the Chinese ballistic missile and satellite tracking ship, 'Yuan Wang 5', which arrived in the southern Sri Lankan port of Hambantota elicited strong reactions from India. There were apprehensions in New Delhi about the possibility of the vessel's tracking systems attempting to snoop on Indian defence installations while being on its way to the Sri Lankan port.

However, after a considerable delay, Sri Lanka allowed the ship to dock at the strategic southern port of Hambantota, being built by a Chinese company.

Sri Lanka considers both India and China equally important partners in its task to restructure its external debt.

The negotiations for Sri Lanka's external and domestic debt restructuring must be concluded by September, in time for the International Monetary Fund's review of its USD 2.9 billion bailout extended in March this year.

The island nation was hit by an unprecedented financial crisis in 2022, the worst since its independence from Britain in 1948, due to a severe paucity of foreign exchange reserves.

Person hit & killed by Caltrain in California



A person was hit and killed by a Caltrain in Redwood City of California on Tuesday afternoon, officials said.

At about 12:30 p.m., a train heading south struck and killed an individual, who hasn't been identified. None of the passengers onboard were injured, Xinhua news agency reported, citing Caltrain's public information officer Dan Lieberman.

The San Mateo County Sheriff's Office Transit Police and county coroner responded to the scene. The tracks were cleared by 3:00 p.m., according to Lieberman. None of the passengers onboard were injured, Xinhua news agency reported, citing Caltrain's public information officer Dan Lieberman.

The accident marked the transit agency's eighth fatality of the year. Five of them happened in the past two months, the transit agency said.

India and Nepal appreciate each other's strong cooperation in developmental partnership through LOCs

KATHMANDU: India and Nepal have both expressed appreciation for the strong cooperation in the developmental partnership between the two nations, including through the Line of Credits that is extended to the Himalayan nation for infrastructure development.

During the 10th India-Nepal Line of Credit (LOC) Review Meeting held on Thursday, both sides acknowledged their cooperation and reviewed the progress of projects which are at various stages of implementation, according to the press release by the Indian Embassy here on Friday. The Indian delegation also conducted site visits to ongoing road projects being built with the Government of India's (GOI) LOCs.

From the Indian side, the meeting was led by A. Ajay Ku-



mar, Joint Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, and from Nepal side, the meeting was led by Shreekrishna Nepal, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Finance, Government of Nepal (GoN). Site visits to ongoing road projects being built with GOI's LOCs were also carried out by the visiting Indian delegation on 9 and 11 August 2023.

GoI's LOC portfolio is more than USD 30 billion and is spread across more than 60 partner countries. In Nepal, it includes four LOCs: US\$ 100 million, US\$ 250 million, US\$ 550 million and US\$ 750 million, totaling US\$ 1.65 billion. These LOCs are dedicated towards infrastructure development as prioritized by GoN. So

far, these LOCs have financed more than 40 road projects (1105 km completed), 6 projects in hydropower and transmission lines, and several others in housing and reconstruction.

Power transmission infrastructure in Nepal has been augmented with major LOC projects, such as Koshi Corridor (220 kV), Modi Lekhnath (132 kV), Solu Corridor (132 kV) and the Dhalkebar-Bhittamod (400 kV) projects. As of now, upto 452 MW of power export is being carried out through the Dhalkebar-Bhittamod 400 kV line. GoI has also agreed to fund Bheri Corridor, Nijgadh-Inaruwa and Gandak Nepalgunj Transmission lines and associated substations under Indian LOC at an estimated cost of US\$ 679.8 million.

CHANDIGARH: UK Sikh MP, Tanmanjeet Dhesi who is on a Punjab tour, met Shiromani Akali Dal (Sanyukt) President, Sukhdev Singh Dhindsa at his residence in Chandigarh. Dhesi was accompanied by his family.

Notably, MP, Tanmanjeet Dhesi who had landed at Amritsar on Thursday was made to sit for two hours at Sri Guru Ramdas Jee International Airport by the immigration officers. After this incident, Sukhdev Singh Dhindsa had



an immediate conversation with the Union Home Minister, Amit Shah and Dhesi was given clearance by the airport authority.

Following that, the UK MP along with his family especially came to meet Sukhdev Singh Dhindsa at his residence in Chandigarh today and ex-

pressed his gratitude to him.

During the interaction with both the leaders, apart from the issues related to Panth also held key discussions on the difficulties faced by Punjabis living abroad while coming to India. Meanwhile, Dhesi gave a special invitation to Dhindsa to visit England. Parminder Singh Dhindsa, Paramjit Singh Raipur Member SGPC and Jaspal Singh Dhesi, father of Tanmanjeet Singh Dhesi also remained present on this occasion.

British Sikh presenter arrested for alleged sexual offenses released

LONDON: British Sikh chef and former BBC presenter Hardeep Singh Kohli, who was arrested and charged over sexual harassment allegations, has been released on an undertaking and will appear in court at a later date, police said.

The 54-year-old was accused of predatory and sexually inappropriate behaviour by more than 20 women, according to an investigation by The Times newspaper. "A 54-year-old man has been arrested and charged in connection with allegations of non-recent sexual offences. He has been released on an un-

dertaking to appear in court at a later date," Police Scotland said in a statement on Wednesday.

"A report of the circumstances has been submitted to the procurator fiscal," the police said. Police Scotland started its probe last month after fresh complaints of sexual harassment allegations emerged against Kohli. They have submitted a report to the Procurator Fiscal, the independent public prosecution office of the devolved region. The Times newspaper reported in July that a former Labour party official alleged Kohli bombarded her with



unwanted sexual comments after he reached out to her on

social media.

"He phoned me and immediately started talking about sex," she said. "I told him I didn't feel comfortable but he tried to make out there was something wrong with me because I didn't want to engage with him in sex chat." Kohli deleted his X profile last month after women used the platform to accuse him of sexually inappropriate behaviour.

Born in London to immigrant parents from Punjab, Kohli presented several programmes for the BBC and other broadcasters, and was runner up in the 2006

edition of Celebrity Masterchef.

The BBC snapped ties with him in 2020.

Before that, the BBC had axed him for six months when he was a reporter in 2009 following allegations of inappropriate conduct towards a female researcher.

Kohli forayed into comedy in 2009 at the Edinburgh fringe, where he performed a one-man show, cooking curries on stage.

He also wrote for The Guardian and also participated in in Celebrity MasterChef in 2006 and Celebrity Big Brother in 2018.

Indian diaspora leaders to hold 'G20 Forum' in New Delhi

NEW DELHI: Indiaspora, a network of the global Indian diaspora, is organising a G20 Forum in New Delhi this month bringing together 200 leaders from 25 countries, according to its Executive Director Sanjeev Joshipura.

The Indiaspora G20 Forum that coincides with India's presidency of the group of developed and emerging nations will explore how the diaspora "can contribute to India's journey towards 100 years of independence", he said.

"The Indian diaspora, working alongside prominent leaders in India, are committed to harnessing our collective strength to foster inclusive growth, sustainable development, and social progress, as



India continues to assume its global leadership position," Joshipura said.

The speakers at the three-day meeting, scheduled for August 22 to 24, will include "government officials and policymakers, businesspersons and entrepreneurs, accomplished sportspersons, inspiring artists, and dedicated philanthropists, all of whom share a common vision for a better world", the organisation said.

The agenda includes foreign policy, financial inclusion, climate change, gender equality, health-care, philanthropy, entrepreneurship, sports, and trade and investments, it said.

Sreekumar Nair, the CEO of Indiaspora-India, said that the "forum is a testament to the Indian diaspora's collective commitment to creating positive change and leaving a meaningful legacy for generations to come".

The forum precedes the G20 summit led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to be held in New Delhi next month bringing together the heads of state or government of more than 20 countries.

Islamabad HC orders Attock jail officials to allow lawyers to meet Pak ex-PM Imran

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court ruled on Friday that the lawyers of Imran Khan can meet the former Pakistan prime minister in Attock prison where he has been incarcerated after his conviction in a corruption case. The ruling came after Khan's lawyer Sher Afzal Khan Marwat appeared before Chief Justice Aamer Farooq and requested him to issue directives to allow the legal team access to Khan jailed since Saturday in the Punjab province.

Marawat said the lawyers were not permitted to meet the 70-year-old Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman despite the court orders, the Express Tribune newspaper reported. He said "false accusations" of causing disruptions in the jail were levelled against Khan's lawyers, it said.

"We have said this before and we will say it again, lawyers are allowed to hold meetings," the chief justice said. "Failure to allow these meetings will be viewed as contempt of court," he warned. The court also heard Khan's plea requesting a transfer from Attock district prison to Rawalpindi's high-security Adiala jail, the report said.

"There is the matter of meetings and facilities at the jail before us. We will issue appropriate orders," Chief Justice Farooq said. On Thursday, Khan's wife Bushra Bibi was allowed to meet her husband for the first time since the former premier was put behind bars on Saturday, while his legal team was stopped from having a meeting with Khan.

Bushra met Khan after the Islamabad High Court (IHC) granted her permission, said



Khan's lawyer Naeem Haider Panjutha. Panjuthaha was granted access on Monday by the jail authorities to meet Khan, but was denied permission on Thursday. After seeing the PTI chairman, he had said that the former premier was being kept in "distressing" conditions and provided "C-Class jail facilities". Attock prison in eastern Punjab province is infamous for its harsh conditions and its inmates include convicted militants.

Khan has told his lawyers to take him out of the Attock jail as he does not want to remain

in a small, isolated cell without air-conditioning that is infested with flies during the day and insects at night. His party has approached the Islamabad High Court (IHC) and sought Khan's transfer from Attock prison to Adiala jail in the garrison city of Rawalpindi. Khan, the cricketer-turned-politician, was arrested on Saturday from his Lahore house shortly after an Islamabad trial court found him guilty of "corrupt practices" in the Toshakhana corruption case.

He was sentenced on charges of unlawfully selling state gifts acquired by him and his family during his 2018-2022 tenure.

Khan has also been barred from politics for five years, preventing him from contesting an upcoming election. He has denied any wrongdoing.

Biden reportedly to create Grand Canyon national monument to block new mining

US President Joe Biden is leaning toward designating a vast area near the Grand Canyon as a national monument to safeguard it from uranium mining, a media report said.

"Leaders of local tribes and environmentalists have spent years lobbying to protect areas near the park from potential uranium mining, which they say would threaten aquifers and water supplies," Xinhua news agency quoted The Washington Post report as saying citing sources.

"They have asked Washington to double the protected area around the canyon by including 1.1 million acres of public lands in a Baaj Nwaavjo

Federal officials have started telling tribal and environmental groups to be available for a potential Grand Canyon announcement early next week, which would fall during Biden's travel, said the report.

"No decisions have been made," White House spokesman Abdullah Hasan said in an email. 
Jha's story, riddled with struggles and financial burdens, touched Sonu's heart, prompting him to lend him a helping hand.
