Delhi air quality continues to be in 'poor' category

NEW DELHI: The air quality in the national capital continued to remain in the 'poor' category as the overall Air Quality Index (AQI) of the city reached 249 on Friday morning, according to data from the System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting And Research (SAFAR).



The AQI at Dhirpur with PM 2.5 was at 269, under a 'poor' category. The AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', and 401 and 500 'severe'. In Pusa, the AQI recorded with PM 2.5 at 183 'moderate' category. At Lodhi Road, the Air Quality Index with PM 2.5 concentration was at 218 under the 'poor' category and the PM 10 stood at 156 also under the 'moderate' category.

At IIT Delhi station the PM 2.5 was at 273, 'poor' category while the PM 10 reached 169, in 'moderate' category. The Air Quality Index at the

city's Mathura Road was under 'moderate' category with PM 2.5 at 168 with PM 10 concentration at 142.

According to the forecast from the SAFAR for Saturday, the air quality of the national capital will deteriorate further under 'poor' category with PM 2.5 reaching at 286 and the PM 10 concentration at 182 under 'moderate' category.

The Air Quality Index of Delhi's neighbouring cities of Noida stood at 225 and the PM 10 concentration at 208 both under poor category, while Gurugram's AQI was reported at 252, under poor category and the PM 10 concentration at 159 under moderate category.

'G7 Trade Ministers' Meet to Focus on Trade & Investment Related Challenges



OSAKA (JAPAN): Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal will attend the Group of Seven (G7) Trade Ministers' Meeting in Osaka, Japan from 28-29 October, 2023.

The Minister will also have bilateral meetings with a few G7 countries, invitee countries and a few International organisations such as WTO, on the sidelines of the outreach programs, as per the official statement. Trade Ministers of G7 Member States hold an annual meeting with the aim to meet the current global challenges related to Trade and Investment and to set the course for a better future.

Under its Presidency this year for the G7 Trade Ministers meeting to be held during 28-29 October 2023, Japan has invited India along with a very few other invitee countries (Australia, Chile, Indonesia, and Kenya) to participate in the outreach program to be held on 28 October. Apart from them, International organisations such as WTO, ERIA and OECD have also been invited.

This year, Japan has selected contemporary topics for the outreach program namely, "How to enhance Supply Chain Resilience" and "Promote Trade and Sustainability- environment, Development and digital, including prospects for WTO MC13". The G7 is an intergovernmental political forum consisting of the United States, the United Kingdom, Japan, Italy, France, Canada and Germany. Additionally, the European Union (EU) is a "non-enumerated member".

Union Cabinet clears fertiliser subsidy worth Rs 22,000 crore

NEWDELHI: The Union Cabinet on Wednesday is learnt to have cleared fertiliser subsidy worth Rs 22,000 crore for the Rabi season, which runs from October 2023 till March 2024. The Government has cleared an additional subsidy of Rs 4,500 crore on DAP, sources said. The new rates of subsidy are as follows: On Nitrogen it is Rs 47.02 per kg, on Phosphorus it is Rs 20.82 per kg, on Potash it is Rs 2.38 per kg, on Sulphur it is Rs 1.89 per kg.

India moving in direction to become Leader of 6G technology : PM Modi

NEW DELHI: India is moving in the direction of becoming a leader in the area of 6G technology, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Friday.



Inaugurating the 7th Edition of India Mobile Congress 2023, PM Modi said, "We are not only expanding 5G in the country but also moving in the direction of becoming leaders in the area of 6G technology."

He said that be it technology, be it connectivity, be it 6G, be it AI, Cybersecurity, Semicon-

ductors, Drones, Deep sea, the times to come are going to be completely different and it is a matter of happiness for everyone that our young generation is leading the future of the country. "In line with 'Make in India'

campaign, he said Samsung's Fold 5 mobile phone and Apple's iPhone 15 are being manufactured in India. He also mentioned that tech giant Google is going to manufacture Pixel phones in India and said "Recently, Google has announced the manufacturing of its Pixel phone in India. Samsung's Fold 5 mobile phone and Apple's iPhone 15 are being manufactured in India. We are proud that the world is using Made in India mobile phones now." The Prime Minister mentioned that India has become one of the top 3 start-up ecosystems in the world and said, "In a short span of time, we have created a century of unicorns and have become one of the top 3 start-up ecosystems in the world." He further pointed out that India has reached 43rd position in mobile broadband speed that is a massive upgrade from previous rank of 118 and added that 4 lakh 5G base stations have been set up within one year of 5G roll-out, reported in media.

Rs 244 crore cash seized in 15 days in poll-bound Rajasthan

NEW DELHI: Enforcement agencies have seized Rs 244 crore cash in poll-bound Rajasthan in the last 15 days, Chief Electoral Officer Praveen Gupta said on Tuesday.



He said that a strict vigil is being maintained by the police, excise, income tax and other enforcement agencies in view of the Assembly elections in the state, and a "new record" has been made in the seizure of illegal cash, liquor, drugs, gold, silver etc.

Due to the coordination and promptness of the Election Commission, the seizure figure in 2023 has crossed Rs 1,000 crore, Gupta said, adding that since June, the Commission has been working in direct coordi-

nation with all the enforcement agencies, and cash and other material worth Rs 648 crore have been seized since then. In the last 15 days (from Oc-

tober 9 till now), Rs 39.30 crore in cash was seized by the police, Income Tax Department and other agencies. Similarly, over 10.60 lakh litre of illicit liquor

Int'l Copper Association India reports notable 16% growth in copper demand in 2023

Growth in capital public in private & formal sector, consumer spending and clean energy transition have impacted the demand of the metal



NEW DELHI: Copper demand in India has surged to 1,522 KT in 2023 from 1,311 KT in 2022. The findings are part of the Copper Demand Study in India (FY23) which was released by the International Copper Association India (ICA India) today. The copper demand registered double-digit growth for consecutive years after a contraction in FY21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The current trend indicates sustained and robust growth opportunity for new investments in the Indian copper industry. This growth is based on strong foundation of policy reforms, public & private investment and consumer spending in various end-use sectors such as building construction, renewable energy, electric mobility, industrial, railways & metros, power transmission & distribution and white goods. The transportation sector, including automobiles, railways and metros, is one of the primary drivers of this growth, which

witnessed a 34 per cent increase in copper demand. This can be attributed to the electrification & modernisation of railways, addition of rapid transportation and 21% growth in sales of automobiles including rising adoption of electric vehicles (EVs). In the construction sector, 11% growth in copper demand can be attributed to the increased use of copper per square foot, especially in premium, high and middle-income houses. The Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme has driven capex expansion in industrial sectors, with INR 1.7 lakh Crore of investments being announced, leading to an increase in copper demand. The pent-up demand from FY21 and FY22, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, has resulted in remarkable growth in FY23 in the consumer durables sector, such as Room Air Conditioners (RACs) and electronic devices like laptops, PCs, and mobile phones. Rising disposable income has also contributed to this sector's growth.

GTRI advises Government to not participate in Free Cross-Border Data flows under IPEF

NEW DELHI: India should not agree to take binding commitments on free cross-border data flows under the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework (IPEF), Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) said on Thursday.



India has so far not joined the IPEF's trade pillar which includes taking onerous commitments on digital trade, it added. Cautioning the central government, the Think Tank has said that India should not agree to take binding commitments on free cross-border data flows under the IPEF, a 14-member grouping, as the move would lock its policy space.

The IPEF was launched jointly by the US and other partner countries of the Indo-Pacific region on May 23 in Tokyo. The 14 IPEF partners represent 40 per cent of global GDP and 28 per cent of global goods and services trade. The framework is structured around four pillars relating to trade, supply chains, clean economy, and fair economy (issues like tax and anti-corruption). India

has joined all the pillars except the trade one. "India has not joined the IPEF trade pillar which includes taking onerous commitments on digital trade. India should never agree to binding commitments on free cross-border data flows as it will lock in the future," GTRI said. It added that taking the commitments under the World Trade Organisation's (WTO) Information Technology Agreement (ITA - 1) has impacted domestic manufacturing of electronic hardware. It also said that India should retain flexibility to share data with Indian firms and not big tech companies with a view to promote domestic enterprise.

India should also not agree to no tax on services offered online as the government is going to earn significant revenue with most services shifting online, it said, suggesting not to adopt the US standards on artificial intelligence.

GTRI co-founder Ajay Srivastava said that India's stance in free trade agreements, including the IPEF, on digital trade leans towards retaining control over its data.

With China and India being major data generators and China already safeguarding its data, India believes in maintaining flexibility in data-sharing with domestic companies rather than international tech giants, he said.

More women in workforce will drive India's Economy to 8 pc : Report

NEW DELHI: The trajectory of India's 8% GDP growth passes through the precondition of increasing the female workforce and by improving labour productivity, as per a recent Barclays report.



The report titled, "India's breakout moment", says that India can achieve a GDP growth rate of 8% by ensuring that women account for more than half of the new workforce set to be created by 2030. The report also highlighted on the need to improve labour productivity through upskilling to fully utilise its young generation.

Current female labour force participation rate (FLFPR) stands at 37%. However, to ensure incremental growth in the Indian workforce, India needs to increase its FLFPR to 43.4% by 2030.

According to the report it means that of the roughly 108 million estimated increase in the labour force, around 55 million (~50%) would have to come from women, which implies only a partial convergence of male-to-female jobs ratio - that is, for every female worker, there would be 1.9 male workers in 2030, versus 2.2 currently.

Other than the significance of bringing more women into

the workforce, the report underlined the importance of faster growth of non-agricultural jobs to employ surplus labour. It also mentioned the need to bring more formalisation of employment.

Sectors like construction, wholesale, retail trade segments, manufacturing, etc have the potential to generate opportunities for the expanding workforce in the coming years. Sectors like real estate, professional, and financial services, will also provide employment opportunities in the coming years.

Apart from employment generation, a focus on education and skills training in emerging technologies and capital-intensive sectors is required to

improve labour productivity and help generate more formal-sector jobs. The report indicated that India's labour market can increase its share of GDP contribution not "just through a shift away from agriculture, but also through raising labour productivity."

It also suggested that investment in hard infrastructure/traditional industries would significantly improve labour productivity and will also raise the efficiency of both factors of production, capital, and labour.

The report also suggested that sectors such as chemicals, transport equipment, metals, telecom, and business services, can generate more jobs and improve labour's share in income.

ED searches 15 places in Rs 1,626 crore money laundering case

NEWDELHI: Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Friday carried out searches at 15 locations in Delhi, Punjab, Maharashtra and Haryana in connection with the Rs 1, 626 crore money laundering case involving Pranav Gupta and Vineet Gupta's company Parabolic Drugs Pharma Ltd.

Guptas were also the co-founders of the Ashoka University and had last year stepped down. An ED source said that the agency teams are carrying out searches in Delhi, Ambala, Panchkula, Chandigarh and Mumbai on the premises linked to Parabolic drugs and its officials. However, senior officials remained tight-lipped on the developments. The ED case is based on the CBI FIR against Chandigarh-based Parabolic Drugs for allegedly defrauding a consortium led by the Central Bank of India (CBI) of Rs 1, 626.74 crore. Among those booked were Pranav and Vineet Gupta, the co-founders of Ashoka University. Pranav Gupta serves as the Managing Director of Parabolic Drugs while Vineet is one of the directors of the firm. Others booked by the CBI include directors Deepali Gupta, Rama Gupta, Jagjit Singh Chahal, Sanjeev Kumar, Vandana Singla, Ishrat Gill, and the firm's guarantors T.N. Goyal and Nirmal Bansal, and J.D. Gupta. Following the CBI case and searches at 12 locations against them, the Ashoka University in a statement last year in January had said, "The University has over 200 founders and donors who have made personal philanthropic contributions to Ashoka. Their individual business dealings and operations have no connection to the University." "In keeping with the high standards for governance at Ashoka, Vineet and Pranav Gupta have already voluntarily stepped down from all Boards and Committees of the University pending the CBI case and are cooperating fully with the investigations, " the statement had said on January 6 last year.



Delhi govt to grant Rs 1 cr ex-gratia to kin of two more Covid warriors

NEW DELHI: The Delhi government has decided to provide an ex-gratia of Rs 1 crore to the families of two more Covid-19 warriors who lost their lives serving the people during the pandemic.

The beneficiaries are the families of Satpal, a Nursing Orderly who served in the Delhi Health Department, and Constable Amit Kumar of the Delhi Police.

Tragically, Satpal and Kumar contracted the virus while performing their Covid-related duties and subsequently lost their lives.

The Chief Minister on Friday declared that Delhi stands as a



"beacon of recognition for the sacrifices of Covid warriors" across the nation. So far, an ex-gratia honorarium of Rs 1 crore has been extended to the families of 92 coronavirus warriors, and the government is committed to providing con-

tinuous support to their families in the future.

Kejriwal recounted the immense suffering experienced by the people of Delhi during the pandemic, and he recognised the numerous Covid warriors, including doctors, healthcare workers, police officers, sanitation workers, paramedics, and volunteers, who courageously risked their lives to serve the community.

Satpal, who served as a Nursing Orderly at the District Medical Store in Saket, and Kumar, stationed at Bharat Nagar Police Station, made incredible contributions to the fight against Covid-19, he said.

Poor air quality driving 50% rise in lung, chest problems in Delhi-NCR

NEW DELHI: Amid deteriorating air quality levels, there has been a 50 per cent increase in cases of asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), and other chest problems in Delhi and around, city doctors said on Thursday.

The overall air quality in Delhi on Thursday morning continued to be in the "poor" category, with the Air Quality Index (AQI) at 256, as per SAFAR-India. According to the daily bulletin of the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), the national capital's AQI, as of 4 p.m. on October 25, was 243. Neighbouring Noida and Ghaziabad were also in the "poor" category, with AQIs of 212 and 203, respectively. Gurgaon, however, fared better with an AQI of 190, falling in the "moderate" category.

"Amidst the rising levels of pollution in Delhi-NCR, we are witnessing a notable increase in patients with COPD and chest problems coming to us in our OPD these days. We are seeing roughly 30 to 35 patients each day in our OPD, from 7-10 patients a day earlier marking almost a 50 per cent increase," Dr. Kuldeep Kumar Grover, Head of Critical care and Pulmonology, C.K. Birla Hospital, Gurugram, told to media.

Dr. Vivek Nangia, Principal Director & Head Pulmonology, Max Hospital, Saket, added he is



also seeing a "dramatic increase" in the number of patients visiting the OPD and the emergency room.

"The majority of patients that we treat nowadays present with cough, cold, sore throat, feeling of a foreign body in the throat, watering eyes, tightness in the chest, and shortness of breath. And in the majority of cases, we must administer medications such as nasal decongestants and anti-allergy medications," he said.

While Delhi's air quality struggles every year due to stubble burning, there is a notable decrease in these incidents, with only 1,794 farm fires in Haryana and 714 in Punjab recorded till October 23. In addition, increasing temperatures in Delhi and decrease in the speed of the wind may result in an increase in pollution, Delhi

1637 RC & DL files illegally approved behind closed doors during clerical staff strike in Haryana

SDM Sonipat Amit Khokhar has started investigation as regard illegal approval of 1637 files related to automobile registration and driving license cases behind the closed doors in SDM office Sonipat during clerical staff strike in Haryana state when the concerned MRC Anil Malik also remained absent from the duty due to strike for 48 days due to the strike. Mystery exists over how such a large number of files were approved behind the closed doors when the office was closed due to strike. Preliminary investigation reveals that agents were seen very active in the office during this period and the alleged accused clerk have been charging Rs 600 per case in alliance with the agents. When talked to the SDM, he admitted that 1637 files were found approved in spite of the fact the office was closed due to the strike and during investigation code words were written on the files and stern action will be taken against the concerned clerk and others found involved in irregularities. He said that a detailed report has been forwarded to the Deputy Commissioner to take legal action against the accused.

According to SDM, during June till September huge number of applications exceeding 5000 cases seeking vehicle registration and driving license were gathered and were quickly disposed of after the strike was over, still leaving a large number of pending cases.

In rare case doctors used radiation therapy to help 89 year old woman beat cancer

In a rare case City doctors helped 89 year old Mrs. Jasbir kaur beat cancer at such an advanced age using Radiation Therapy alone. Mrs. Jasbir kaur from Punjabi Bagh area of New Delhi was diagnosed with advanced Adenocarcinoma of the rectum (a type of rare cancer) last year . She had lots of trouble passing the stool, pain in abdomen and cramping and discomfort before treatment. In her case a team of doctors did detailed planning in view of her age and comorbidities like diabetes and hypertension and decided to give (IGRT) using Tomotherapy for 25 sessions. When Jasbir Kaur was diagnosed with cancer, she did not panic and decided to fight head-on, being the wife of an Army officer she has always learned to fight

in number while safeguarding most of the healthy organs and tissues in the body. Seeing the advanced age of Jasbir Ji where surgery was not an feasible option, after detailed planning, we used Image-guided radiation therapy (IGRT) which is advanced therapy that delivers radiation with higher degrees of precision, hence the patient faces minimal side effects. It was her positivity and latest technology that helped us to treat her cancer completely."

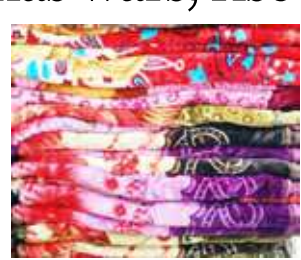

Panipat blanket exports down 70%, Ukraine - Russia & Israel-Hamas wars, rise in yarn, cotton prices

The Russia-Ukraine war now followed by war between Israel-Hamas has adversely disturbed world renowned balnket manufacturing industry at Panipat due to hike in cotton yarn prices and have severely hit Panipat's export business having drop up to 60 per cent this year de to cancellation and halting of orders put exporters in trouble. Raman Chhabra, Chairman of Society and Rajat Grover Secretary said that the exporters are not getting orders from Russia, USA, France, Germany, Italy and other European countries



this year recieved nearly 70% less orders and did export business of value hardly 10 to 12 thousand crore.

They said that Panipat generally has around Rs 45,000-crore annual turnover, including over Rs 15,000 crore from exports alone. Around 4000 units man-

ufacturing handloom products functioning here having export of handloom products, blankets, bed sheets, cushions and hundreds of other items exporting to all over the world. Lalit Goyal, president of the Panipat Exporters' Association said, cotton yarn prices had increased to around Rs 330 per kg from Rs 160 per kg earlier. Open-end yarn, which was earlier available at Rs 120 a kg, had gone up to Rs 170-190 a kg now.

The slowdown in exports at Panipat started in the beginning of this year. There were hardly any fresh orders from overseas buyers. The previously placed orders were also cancelled or held up by them, Goyal asserted. "If the situation doesn't improve in the coming days, textile exporters will lose business worth around Rs 7000-8000 crore this year ,that will be a big setback for Panipat-based exporters," Ashok Gupta, vice-president of the association, said skyrocketing freight charges had increased the production cost by 15-18 per cent. "The economic conditions in America and Europe have led to a slump in demand, thus adversely affecting the Panipat textile industry. If the situation doesn't improve, employment crisis will also set in," he said.

MSME Ministry to support Bahadurgarh footwear industry to compete China

Bahadurgarh footwear industry, known as the biggest hub of footwear in North India has suffered heavy loss worth crores of rupees following around 25 per cent decline in the sales of footwear as compared to the previous years as claimed by Raj Kumar Gupta president of the Footwear Park Association. Bahadurgarh who said a tough competition with footwears manufactured in China and a considerable rise in the goods and services tax (GST) are believed to be main reasons behind the fall in sales. of Bahadurgarh footwear industry. He said, over 25 lakh pairs of shoes, sandals and slippers are manufactured in the industry here every day and a huge stock of shoes has



remained unsold in THE past one year due to slup in sale, forcing manufacturers to sell these at throwaway prices.

The president of Bahadurgarh Chamber and Commerce and industry Subhash Jagga said that there are over 2,000 large, medium and small-scale units associated with the footwear industry directly or indirectly operational in Modern Industrial Estate, the HSIIDC

in case of the poor lifting of stocks during the coming winter season there is possibility that nearly 50 manufacturing units in the town may turn completely sick, said Narendra Chhikara, senior vice-president of the Footwear Park Association, Bahadurgarh.

Chhikara maintained that for the winter season, the footwear production usually started in July and continued for the next three months for fulfill the huge demand from October to February. Hr disclosed that nearly 50% manufacturing units are running at their 50% manufacturing capacity this year due to limited demand. He said fashion and design play a vital role in the sale of footwear as customers do not like out-of-fashion footwear.

Haryana Home Minister Vij directs Haryana DGP to suspend 372 police officers delaying 3229 investigation cases

Haryana Home Minister Anil Vij on Monday directed Sha-trujit Kapoor DGP Haryana to suspend 372 police investigating officers for not disposing of cases. He warned concerned DSPs departmental action against them in case such cases will not be finalized within a month. Vij said that the reasons quoted by them are not satisfactory and action is being taken in public interest. Information reveals that maximum number of such cases have been reported in Sirsa district, whereas the number of such cases is minimum in Panipat district in the state.

The number of the suspended Investigation Officers include in 66 cases in Sirsa, 60 cases in Gurugram, 57 cases in Yamunanagar, 32 cases in Faridabad, 31 cases each in Karnal and Rohtak, 30 cases in Ambala, 24 cases in Jind, 24 cases in Hisar, 10 cases in Panchkula, 9 cases in Sonapat, 5 cases in Rewari and 3 cases in Panipat. While talking to media persons Vij said that he has been directing police officers again and again to finalise all pending cases and observed that 3229 cases are lying pending since past over a year and finally he told DSPs to finalise such cases within a month. Vij said that people cannot be left to run from one officer to another seeking justice. It is the police's duty to provide prompt redressal to the complaints lodged with them. Vij said that he has instructed the DGP to hand over all such cases to Deputy Superintendents of Police who would take action on these cases within a month, failing which they would also be liable for action. He said that the Investigating Officers facing action are in the ranks of Assistant Sub Inspectors to Inspectors.

Rahul discusses revocation of Article 370, Pulwama terror attack with ex-J&K Gov Satya Pal Malik

NEW DELHI: Congress MP Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday shared the interview of former Jammu and Kashmir Governor Satya Pal Malik in which they discussed Pulwama terror attack, the statehood of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir among others.

Malik in his conversation with Rahul Gandhi, on October 14, said that the statehood of Jammu and Kashmir should be returned as the people are unhappy. He also said that the government's lapses led to the February 14, 2019 Pulwama terror attack, in which 40 CRPF troopers were killed. Rahul Gandhi while sharing the post on X, said, "Will this conversation create a stir amid ED-CBI?"

In his conversation with Malik, Rahul Gandhi asked him that during his tenure it was the most complicated time. He said while referring to the revocation of Article 370 and the state being



bifurcated as union territory. To this, Malik said, "In my opinion, you cannot keep Jammu and Kashmir by force and through armed forces. You can do anything by winning the trust of the people."

To this Rahul Gandhi again asked him how Jammu and Kashmir will return to normalcy, to which Malik said that the government must restore the statehood of Jammu and Kashmir.

"Revocation of Article 370 and removal of the statehood of the state was most painful for the

people. I felt that the government was thinking that the state police will revolt. They never shared it with me. But the fact was that the Jammu and Kashmir Police remained with the government and the police personnel did not even take leave on the occasion of Eid," the former governor said, who is at loggerheads with the BJP. He also said that the statehood must be returned to Jammu and Kashmir and it is also a promise by Amit Shah to the people in Parliament and hold the election immediately.

Will BJP win in Chhattisgarh on the basis of OBC and young voters?

cow dung procurement scheme. Here soil is being purchased in the name of cow dung and farmers are facing the allegation of giving soil in the name of vermi compost. In this scheme also the government is accused of a scam of crores of rupees in the name of grant.

He said, that Corruption in Public Service Commission - Bribery is being encouraged in the competitive examinations conducted by the Public Service Commission. Fraud through illegal online gaming/betting - Cases of money laundering related to illegal online gaming/betting apps have been reported. This illegal business is like chit fund companies are flourishing. Promotion of religious conversion - Conversion is being promoted by the Congress government. There have been many cases of Christianization in the Adivasi community, Satnami community and OBC community of the state.

Crime - There has been a rapid increase in criminal incidents in the state. Incidents like murder, robbery, rape have become daily matter.

Mr. Agarwal further accused the government that Communal violence - Hindus are being harassed in a planned manner in the state. Security review meeting discusses Middle East crisis impact on Jammu and Kashmir

A high-level security review meeting was convened in Srinagar in the backdrop of the ongoing Middle East crisis to discuss the potential impact on Jammu and Kashmir. The meeting took place at the headquarters of the 15 Corps in Srinagar and was chaired by R R Bhatnagar, Advisor to J&K, and Lieutenant General Upendra Divedi, Army Commander, Northern Command, along with other top intelligence officers.

The meeting's primary objective was to coordinate and strategize security measures in response to the Israel-Palestine conflict. Various senior officials from the military, administration, and security agencies, including DGP J&K police Dilbag Singh and the Chinार Corps Commander, were in attendance. During the discussions, numerous aspects related to the prevailing security situation in the Union Territory were addressed. The ongoing situation in the Middle East was deliberated upon, and contingency scenarios were discussed to ensure preparedness for any potential developments. While there have not been widespread protests in the region concerning the situation in Gaza, peaceful protests were observed in certain parts of the valley. The congregational prayers were prohibited at the historic Jamia Masjid in Srinagar on two consecutive Fridays, reportedly due to concerns about pro-Palestine protests that could disrupt the peace in J&K.

"Supporting Palestine is in our national interest": Syed Sadatullah Husaini

And of the six-seven million Palestinians inside Palestine, they also live in small ghettos, as if they are open-air prisons. And even in these prisons, they are not safe. Every year the homes of Palestinians are bombed every year. Children die every year. Schools and hospitals are bombarded every year. Every year thousands of women and children are locked up and tortured. It has been going on continuously for years and it should be in front of the eyes of the civilized world. Being silent and a mute spectator to this sounds the death kneel of our entire civilization."

Talking about India's national interest, the Jamaat Chief said, "We should also tell the people of our country that supporting Palestine is in our national interest. Within 24 hours of taking voluntary retirement from service, 2000 batch IAS officer and chief minister Naveen Patnaik's Man Friday VK Pandian was appointed chairman, 5T and Nabin Odisha, both important governance initiatives of Patnaik government.

His appointment with a cabinet rank was significant because he had been directly supervising the implementation of these schemes when he was Patnaik's private secretary. He was also the first 5T secretary of the state. The chief minister knows that no one can handle the implementation of these schemes better than Pandian, a livewire with Midas touch.

Investment revival is the only key to sustainable recovery

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) recent decision to maintain its 6.5% GDP growth projection for the year, despite the myriad of challenges, is commendable. However, the landscape of global uncertainties is ever-changing, and India is not immune to its effects. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's concerns about the potential impact on global food, fuel, and fertilizer supplies are valid. With India's heavy reliance on fuel and fertilizer imports, any disruption or price surge could destabilize our macro-economic framework. The political implications of such a scenario, especially during an election season, are also significant. Furthermore, the RBI chief's mention of rising U.S. bond yields, which recently hit a 16-year high, and mixed signals from central banks globally, underscores the unpredictable nature of the current economic environment. The recent sharp sell-off on Indian bourses is a testament to the prevailing anxiety. While the RBI's 'evenly balanced' outlook on growth risks might be subject to change, the Finance Ministry remains optimistic. Their recent economic review paints a picture of a resilient economy, with growth "on track", easing inflation, and strengthening demand in both consumption and investment. They also downplayed concerns about rising crude oil prices, pointing to the relatively lower averages in the recent quarters. However, while the macro fundamentals might appear strong, there are underlying concerns that need addressing. The decline in small car sales, reports of weak rural demand, and IT firms' reduced growth and hiring projections all point to an uneven recovery. While India might weather the current global storm, it is crucial for the government to delve deeper into consumption and hiring trends. Addressing the disparities in recovery is not just essential for short-term stability but is also vital for ensuring a broader, long-term investment revival.

Time to fight for urban India's health

India's urban population is estimated to reach 675 million in 2035, the second highest in the world. Although there is widespread recognition that cities have been fuelling India's rapid rise to economic superpower status, almost all are failing their inhabitants in terms of delivering on health, environmental and equity targets.

India's urban inhabitants experience multi-scalar health risks including the world's highest levels of air and noise pollution, limited greenery, lack of access to sidewalks and parks that limit active lifestyles, archaic modes of transport that contribute to air pollution, pernicious access to nutritionally dense unhealthy foods and unprecedented exposure to toxic chemicals and heavy metals. This concatenation of exposures dramatically magnifies health risks for heart disease and diabetes, referred to as cardiometabolic disease, especially when combined with a lack of physical activity. Of all behaviours well known to mitigate the development of cardiometabolic disease, physical activity is by far the most effective deterrent. Not surprisingly, the cities of India are amidst an epidemic of historic proportions in these disorders.

Addressing the diverse and multi-scaled social, environmental, and infrastructure risk factors that contribute to cardiometabolic risk in cities, by transforming the design of the built local environment as well as provisioning systems, represents a new paradigm for public health. Globally, there are seven key physical provisioning systems that provide food, energy, mobility-transportation, housing, green infrastructure, water and waste management that lie at the core of human health, well-being, equity and sustainability. Dysfunctional provisioning systems consume more than 90% of the world's water and global CO2 emissions and facilitate an estimated 19 million premature deaths annually. The socio-spatial-political



design of urban provisioning systems in India, many of which are legacies of a colonial past, manifests in and exacerbates social inequalities in cities, by class, race, age, migrant and disability status, translating to vast disparities in health risks and outcomes. Based on the primal importance of India's cities for its future, a new narrative for improving health and well-being in cities is needed. This is reflected in several high-level policy frameworks, such as the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) framework, the New Urban Agenda, and the Health in All Policies approach.

Double or triple-duty actions

Investments such as clean energy and electric mobility which are underway in India offer a once in a lifetime opportunity to improve health through their immediate and dramatic impact of air pollution levels, while also helping meet India's climate and equity goals. While these developments are extraordinarily important, the magnitude of their impact on health outcomes is at risk of being limited, if not simultaneously accompanied by changes in other provisioning systems such as food, mobility and green

infrastructure.

Indeed, studies show that even small changes in the latter systems may have a large catalytic effect on health and productivity and serve as double-duty or triple duty interventions. For example, making way for safe walking and biking lanes, pavements and no-car zones, can help not only improve physical activity and reduce sedentary lifestyles but also reduce the risk from air pollution. Regular physical exercise has been effectively mitigate

the impact of other risk factors such as poor diets, particularly those rich in calories and saturated fats. The dietary ingestion of excess calories without adequate physical expenditure fuels a vicious cycle of insulin spikes, excess fat deposition that together with inflammation sets the stage for heart disease. In this regard, it is well known that exercise may not only help expend excess calories, promoting weight loss and reducing diabetes risk but also act as an effective bulwark against heart disease.

Walking and biking on many Indian roads is not only hazardous but also nearly impossible, as sidewalks are overwhelmed by building and human waste, parked vehicles or street hawkers. Health impact studies indicate that the health and economic benefits of increasing mobility and active transportation vastly exceed that which may be divined by transitioning to electrifying transportation alone.

Studies that have modelled the economic and health impact of the clean energy transition in the transportation sector are currently based almost entirely on the reduction in air pollution and its associated health impact. Ensuring that the transition to electric cars

also paves the way for active transport options such as walking paths and bicycling lanes may not only provide a mechanism to connect the "last mile" but the health and consequent economic benefits of active transportation accrue on top of the benefits of reducing air pollution, making such investments even more economically viable.

Thus, increasing active transportation by any means must be a critical component of a clean energy policy. Similarly, policies that encourage fresh fruits and vegetables and limit sugars and salt in beverages, which may have the largest impact on health outcomes such as obesity, Type 2 diabetes (T2D) and cardiovascular disease, may help contribute to not only better health outcomes but also economic productivity. Urban policies are powerful public health interventions that can serve to promote population health. Health is, unfortunately, an afterthought in most national urban planning policies and mostly non-existent in national urban policy documents from lower and middle-income countries.

Unhealthy diets, reduced physical activity and air pollution in cities in India pose a greater risk to morbidity and mortality than most other risk factors combined including drugs, tobacco, alcohol and accidents. These need to be dealt with on a war footing if India is going to make progress in its fight against cardiovascular disease, obesity and T2D. This will necessarily entail a street fight.

BADRI NARAYAN WONDERS WHY DALIT PARTIES STRUGGLE TO ADDRESS EVOLVING ASPIRATIONS AND IDENTITY QUESTS.

A closer look at the present and future of Dalit politics

Dalit politics in India evolved with the rise of various independent Dalit political parties such as the Republican Party of India (RPI), the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), other political parties such as the Viduthalai Chiruthaigal Katchi (VCK), the Puthiya Tamilagam (PT) in Tamil Nadu, and the Praja Rajyam Party (PRP) in the Andhra Pradesh and adjoining States. Most of these political parties are being gradually weakened with each passing day, which reflects in their political actions. The question being asked frequently is whether there is any future for independent Dalit politics in India. Some people say a deepening of democracy in India may compel every political party to give proper space to Dalits in their politics. In such a situation, the future of the independent Dalit movement seems bleak and dim.

The RPI, which was formed to fulfil the incomplete dreams and desires of Baba Saheb Ambedkar, celebrated its 66th foundation day on October 3; the most influential Dalit political party in North India, the BSP has also completed nearly 40 years. A critical engagement with the present and future of Dalit politics in India is needed.

It is true that these parties have played an important role in enabling Dalit empowerment in India. They also cultivated an assertive consciousness among Dalits which led to the rise of a number of leaders and cadres in the Dalit communities. But there has been a decline in their organisational capacities and electoral performance. There has been fragmentation and even a desertion by leaders. Many of these Dalit leaders are either



moving to dominant regional and national political parties and engaging with them for tickets in elections, posts and political positions, or are forming their own groups. Most of these parties, such as the RPI and the BSP, have lost a large percentage of base voters to the dominant regional and national parties such as the Bharatiya Janata Party, and in some States to the Congress.

Change by affirmative actions

These developments are not autonomous but are closely linked with processual change among Dalit communities due to the influence of democracy, state-led affirmative actions and rising developmental desires. As a result, the socio-political profile of Dalit communities has changed rapidly over time. The percolation of education at the grassroots and the dissemination of the benefits of the affirmative actions have led to a class of Dalits who now aspire for a proper space in politics.

However, while independent Dalit political parties have contributed a lot in leading to the rise of such a section among marginalised communities, they have failed in providing sufficient political space to such a politically aspirant section in Dalit communities, which is why there is a quest for political space in other political parties. Individual ambitions and a growing impatience to gain political power are leading to a drift away from Dalit lead political parties.

The Dalit common masses face struggles and so social welfare schemes launched by the major political parties are a key factor. These welfare schemes work in two ways. On the one hand, these schemes are forging their political relationship with the party in power or a party that might come in power.

Such support provides the basic condition to foster aspiration in even the most marginal Dalit communities. Aspiration is emerging due to state-led democratic interventions and media/social media exposure. These have resulted in the creation of a 'new Dalit mentality'. If independent Dalit political parties have to retain them, there needs to be a new direction to political mobilisation and transformative political programmes and actions.

Most of the independent Dalit political parties still work in a conventional mode of politics involving clichéd identity, dignity and representation. There is a failure to develop an effective political programme around large goals as there are only mere slogans. There is a failure to understand that a sense

of identity is now moving to aspiration — of becoming socio-economically mobile.

Need for democratic functioning

Most of these independent Dalit political parties, including the BSP, are unable to respond to the changing aspirations and identity quest by a section of Dalit communities. There is a need that they recognise the need to weave a politics of identity with the economics of identity in their programmes and politics. Structurally, these parties need to ensure that there is democratic functioning within the party, so that grassroots leaders get proper political space, also restraining any dynastic tendencies that could be developing within these parties. Unfortunately, the BSP and some RPI groups have failed to stop the growth of a dynastic political culture.

A return to the 'chamcha age', where BSP leader Kanshi Ram 'warned Dalits against becoming "chamchas" of the brahminical establishment' is unlikely now. Many of those at the forefront of the Dalits are politically competent, assertive and better in negotiating with dominant and mainstream parties than the decade of the 1960s when Kanshi Ram realised that trend. So, there will be a negotiation for proper political space and participation based on their rising political values. Dalit masses, cadres and leaders may move and disperse now among various political parties and possibly create a multi-polar Dalit politics in India.

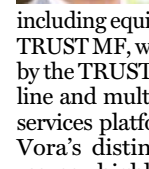

GST notices worth Rs 1 lakh crore issued to online gaming c companies: Report

GST authorities have slapped notices to a host of online gaming firms like Dream11 for alleged short payment of taxes

NEW DELHI: GST show cause notices worth Rs 1 lakh crore have been issued to online gaming companies for tax evasion so far, according to a media report.

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) authorities have slapped notices to a host of online gaming firms like Dream11 for alleged short payment of taxes, it said. According to the Reuters report, a show cause notice was sent to GamesKraft in Septem-



ber last year for alleged GST evasion of Rs 21,000 crore. In August, the GST authority imposed 28 per cent tax on online gaming companies on the total funds deposited to play online games.

Notably, the government amended the GST law, mak-

ing it mandatory for overseas online gaming companies to register in India from October 1. The Ministry of Finance notified October 1 as the date for implementation of the amended GST law provisions for taxing e-gaming, casinos, and horse racing.

In its notification, the GST authority said amendments to Integrated Goods and Services Tax (IGST) will make it mandatory for offshore online gaming platforms to register in India and pay taxes in accordance with the domestic law.

Rajeev Chandrasekhar, the Union Minister of State for Electronics and Information Technology, recently said online gaming segments can add up to USD 300 billion to India's GDP by 2026-27.

The government sees that permissible and legally acceptable online gaming is an important part of opportunities before youngsters, he had said on concerns raised by the online gaming industry over high taxation.

Policy and data support to enhance MSME's role as growth driver: ADB report

NEW DELHI: The role of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) as drivers of growth in the economy will be boosted through policy and data support, according to Asia Small and Medium-sized Enterprise Monitor 2023.

According to the report, initiatives such as "the formalization of small businesses, reskilling, and upskilling of workers, along with the integration of digital tools and technology, economic diversification, and increasing access to new and innovative financing can create a fertile environment" for these businesses to contribute



to sustainable growth.

"Job creation is a critical challenge for Asia and the Pacific," said ADB Chief Economist Albert Park.

"In the Pacific, remittances sent by emigrants to advanced economies can support small businesses and create employ-

ment opportunities for women and younger workers. Tourism and agribusiness—where MSMEs actively participate—drive Pacific economies. Their sustainable growth helps strengthen MSME dynamism and raises national productivity," added Park.

Nifty's expiry this week can add to volatility



NEW DELHI: Nifty had the much awaited correction giving up almost 3 per cent for the week, says Jaykrishna Gandhi, Head - Business Development, Institutional Equities, Emkay Global Financial Services.

The sell-off was even more brutal within the small and mid cap space as retail investors finally seem like throwing in the towel on back of lackluster earnings and no clear positive commentary from management, he said. The market sell-off was triggered by the US 10yr hitting the 5 per cent mark which pulled down risk levels materially in the region. Nifty will have its expiry this week which can add to further volatility, we see Bank Nifty at the highest risk below the 43K levels with support at 42,200 levels which in turn can drag the market below 19K towards the strong support levels of 18,800, he said.

All eyes will be on the US 10yr, the geopolitical uncertainty along with the FOMC commentary to get direction for the week forward, he said. Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services said investor sentiment is on edge as tensions in West Asia continue to drag the market. Despite a drop in oil prices and an optimistic view of the progressing Q2 results season, investors took a cautious approach due to the expectation that a higher interest rate scenario would continue slowing future growth.

IOB highlights increased Net Profit, total Business in present quarter

Indian Overseas Bank (IOB) highlighted a Net Profit of Rs 625 crores for the quarter ended September 30, 2023, besides Net NPA also improving to 0.68% against 2.56% last year's quarter and Provision Coverage recorded at 94.03%.

Total Business rose to Rs 4,82,006 crores this quarter against Rs 4,34,441 crores same quarter last year. The same period witnessed Total Deposits at Rs 2,73,093 crores against Rs 2,61,728 crores last year.

CASA increased to Rs 1,19,206 crores this year against Rs 1,11,924 last year.

Replying to questions, Ajay Kumar Srivastava, Manag-



ing Director and CEO, IOB, said the Bank witnessed Fresh Slippages of Rs 321 crores in sectors like Retail, Agro with Unsecured Educational Loans taking the major portion, while Rs 1,069 crores of Recovery had been done in this quarter and the Bank was looking at comfortably crossing Rs 5,000 crores Recovery this year. "Deposit Growth is expected

during this Diwali season and CASA is our main focus as it is cost-effective to build our credit portfolio," he said while pointing out that 71,000 new customers had onboarded in the bank's 3,200 branches.

"Sales worth Rs 3,000 crore to ARCs have been lined up we are looking to good sales in the coming months," he said while also noting that the Bank is in the process of hiring staff with 5 to 6 years experience in different organisations.

About security and anti-hacking measure in the wake of such global threats, he said the Bank was revising its security and other features in the Apps. The Bank is also planning to set up its branch in Gift City in Gujarat and is awaiting relevant approval, he added.

Toyota urges Centre to cut taxes on hybrid vehicles

NEW DELHI: Toyota Motor has urged the Indian government to cut taxes on hybrid vehicles by as much as one-fifth, arguing these are far less polluting than petrol cars but do not get commensurate policy treatment.

In its letter to the government, Toyota's India Country Head Vikram Gulati has stated that the 5 per cent differential favouring hybrids over petrol cars is insufficient given the reduced emissions and better fuel consumption hybrids offer.

It is to be noted that India taxes EVs at just 5 per cent, while the levy on hybrids is as high as 43 per cent. Taxes on petrol cars are at 48 per cent. The Central government has



focused on pushing sales of EVs offering companies millions of dollars in incentives to build EVs and batteries.

The tax differential over petrol cars should be as much as 11 per cent points for hybrids and 14 points for flex-hybrids, the

letter stated. "We would kindly request for a proportionate policy support," Gulati wrote.

According to a recent report by GameChanger Law Advisors and Speciale Invest, the Indian EV battery market will grow from \$16.77 billion

in 2023 to \$27.70 billion by 2028, with a CAGR of 10.56 per cent during the period spanning 2023 to 2028.

The Indian EV market was valued at \$3.21 billion in 2022 and is expected to grow to \$113.99 billion by 2029 at a compound annual growth rate of 66.52 per cent.

It is worth highlighting that Toyota has faced criticism from investors and climate groups for still supporting hybrids, which it says make better sense for markets where the infrastructure is not ready for EVs.

In the Indian market, Tata Motors and Mahindra & Mahindra are backing EVs, while Toyota and Honda Motor want support for hybrids.

India poised to surpass Japan to become world's 3rd largest economy by 2030: S&P

NEW DELHI: India is likely to surpass Japan to become the world's third-largest economy with its GDP doubling to \$7.3 trillion by 2030, according to the latest S&P Global Market Intelligence report.

"India's nominal GDP measured in USD terms is forecast to rise from \$3.5 trillion in 2022 to \$7.3 trillion by 2030. This rapid pace of economic expansion would result in the size of the Indian GDP exceeding Japanese GDP by 2030, making India the second largest economy in the Asia-Pacific region," the report states.

Japan is currently the third largest economy in the world next to the US and China.

The acceleration of foreign direct investment inflows into India over the past decade reflects the favourable long-term growth outlook for the Indian economy, helped by a youthful demographic profile and rapidly rising urban household incomes.

By 2022, the size of Indian GDP had already become larger than the GDP of the UK and also France.

By 2030, India's GDP is also



forecast to surpass Germany, the report adds.

Japan's nominal gross domestic product will be overtaken by Germany this year as it slips from No. 3 to No. 4 in the world on a US dollar basis, according to new projections by the International Monetary Fund.

India was among the outperformers in the emerging market space with private sector sales in the country having risen at the second-fastest pace in over 13 years, thereby supporting output expansion.

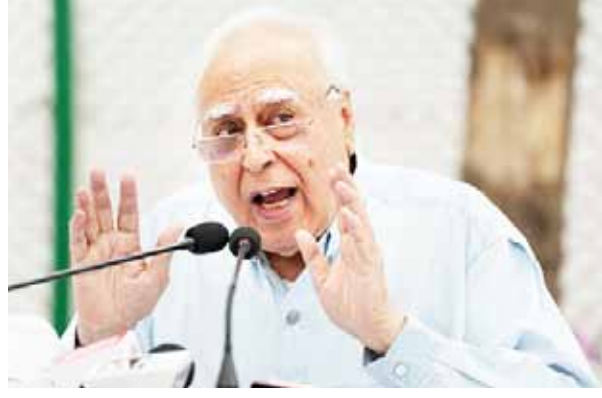
Robust growth was also reported in Russia, but mainland China's expansion slowed while Brazil slipped back into contraction in the latest survey period, S&P said. The report also observes that global economic expansion continued to decelerate at the end of the third quarter, slipping to the slowest in eight months.

Worse may be to come, as global new orders shrank for the first time since January and backlogs of work fell sharply, signalling further weakness in the coming months.

NEW DELHI: In the wake of news that eight former Indian Navy personnel, who were in custody in Qatar since last year, have been awarded the death sentence, veteran leader Kapil Sibal on Thursday sought the intervention of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, saying the government must explore all options for their release.



In a post on X, Sibal, who is also an eminent lawyer, said, "Our Vishwa Guru (PM Modi) must intervene. Eight Indian ex-Navy officers given the death penalty by a Qatar court. "Held accountable on charges which have not been even made public by Qatari authorities. Our government must explore all options for their release," the former Congress

leader said. The eight persons were arrested last year after being charged with spying for Israel by Qatari authorities. The men also include decorated officers who once commanded major Indian

warships, were working for Dahra Global Technologies and Consultancy Services, a private firm that provided training and related services to Qatar's armed forces. Their bail pleas were rejected numerous times and their

detention extended by Qatari authorities. On Thursday, the Court of First Instance of Qatar passed a judgement. Earlier in the day, the Indian government on Thursday expressed shock over the news and said it will contest it.

China, US need to have dialogue: Wang Yi tells Blinken

WASHINGTON: Visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi told US Secretary of State Antony Blinken that the world's two biggest economies "need to have dialogue" following a period of volatile bilateral relations. Yi, who is in the US on a four-day official visit, also said that "not only should we resume dialogue, the dialogue should be in-depth and comprehensive so that with dialogue we can increase mutual understanding, reduce misunderstanding and misjudgment, constantly seek to expand common ground and pursue cooperation that will benefit both sides so that we can stabilise China-US relations and return it to the track of healthy, stable, and sustainable development". He made the remarks to reporters before a one-on-one meeting with Blinken which is part of a reciprocal visit following the Secretary's travel to Beijing and recent high-level meetings as part of ongoing efforts to maintain open lines of communication and responsibly manage US-China relations, according to the State Department.

Canadian agency issues alert along US border after mass shootings



The Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) has issued an "armed and dangerous" alert to its personnel stationed along the country's border with the US after the two mass shootings in the American state of Maine led to the death of at least 18 people. In its alert issued late Thursday, the CBSA asked its officers to be on the lookout for the suspect, identified as 40-year-old Robert Card a trained firearms instructor and a member of the US Army Reserves, who also injured 13 people in the shootings in Lewiston city on Wednesday night, reports Xinhua news agency. "The CBSA is aware of the tragic

events in Maine. Our officers have been alerted to the high risk of this situation, and we are on the lookout with our law enforcement partners. Our thoughts are with the citizens of Maine and all those affected," it said in a post on X. The Agency added that it is working with Canadian and US law enforcement partners to "protect Canada's borders against any threat or attempt at illegal entry". The city of Lewiston is located some 260 km southwest of Canada's New Brunswick province. As of Friday, hundreds of police have continued a massive manhunt to nab Card, who is considered "armed and dangerous".

IDF infantry hits several tanks inside Gaza, ground assault imminent



As the deadly Israel-Hamas conflict continued for a 20th consecutive day on Thursday, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) claimed of destroying several tanks inside the besieged Gaza Strip. In a statement, the IDF said it moved in and fired at the Hamas outposts in Gaza on Wednesday night and destroyed many tanks and missile launching capabilities. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has clearly said that the entry of the Israel armed forces in Gaza Strip is imminent and the ground assault will commence soon. The Israeli forces are, according to former officers of the IDF, well versed in underground fights in tunnels and that they have exact and perfect knowledge of the construction of these tunnels and their precise locations.

French President Emmanuel Macron arrives in Israel



French President Emmanuel Macron arrived in Tel Aviv on Tuesday, joining a list of world leaders to visit the war-torn nation since the October 7 Hamas attack. According to an Elysee Palace source, the President plans to express solidarity and discuss a two-state solution, CNN reported. Macron is expected to meet Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, President Isaac Herzog and opposition leader Yair Lapid. The other world leaders who have visited Israel since the brutal assault were US President Joe Biden, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, and Dutch Prime Minister Mark Rutte.

PM Modi 'stood in solidarity with Israel in moment of crisis'

NEW DELHI: India's Deputy Permanent Representative to the UN, R. Ravindra said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi "stood in solidarity with Israel in their moment of crisis" as the country faced the October 7 terror attack.



Speaking on Tuesday at the Security Council's high-level meeting on Palestine held in the aftermath of the brutal Hamas attack on Israel, he said: "Our Prime Minister was one of the first global leaders to have conveyed his condolences for the loss of lives and prayers for the innocent victims and their families. He stood in solidarity with his Israel in their moment of crisis when they were facing these terror attacks. "The October 7 terror attacks in Israel were shocking and we condemn them unequivocally." On the October 17 Gaza hospital blast that killed more than 425 people, he said: "We have also expressed deep shock at the tragic loss of life." Stepping away from the blame game for the explosion, Ravindra said: "Our Prime Minister clearly spelt out that those involved must be held

responsible." Israel has blamed a failed rocket launch aimed at Israel by the Islamic Jihad terror group for the explosion, which the US has said was likely. On the other hand, the Palestinians have said it was destroyed by a missile from Israel, a claim echoed by several countries at the Council meeting. Ravindra said that "civilian casualties in the ongoing conflict are a matter of serious and continuing concern. All parties must protect civilians, especially women and children".

Looking towards a solution to the Israel-Palestine crisis, he reiterated India's support for a two-state solution. "India backed the establishment of a sovereign, independent and viable state of Palestine, living within secure and recognised borders, side by side in peace with Israel, taking into account the legitimate security concerns of Israel." To achieve this goal, "every effort must be made to create conducive conditions for resumption" direct talks between Israel and Palestine, he added.

Sikhs in Fiji Police force now allowed to wear turban with official crown



SUVA: Navjeeth Singh Sohata has become the first Sikh cop to don a turban with the official Fiji Police crown after the island nation's police force approved changes to the uniform in a bid to promote diversity. Recognising that the respect for diversity and inclusivity are integral to the success of policing efforts, Acting Commissioner of Police Juki Fong Chew approved the wearing of a turban with the official Fiji Police crown.

Police Constable Sohata, 20, is a member of Batch 66 undergoing the Basic Recruits Course Training in Nasova, after being selected from the open market recruitment drive. A devout Sikh, Sohata had marched into the academy knowing the training requirements would require personal sacrifices on his part. "However, the Acting Commissioner of Police, in respecting Sohata's rights, approved the wearing of the turban with the official Fiji Police crown," the Fiji Police said in a statement. Commissioner Chew said the move was a testament of the organisation's commitment in upholding the fundamental principles of equality and diversity. According to a book by Stanley Brown, "The History of the Fiji Police Force", the first Sikh constables were recruited in force the early 1910s. Sharing his experience as a recruit, Sohata, who hails from Dreketi village in Northern Division of Fiji, said it was difficult at first being away from his family. "I have a number of people in my life who I look up to as inspiration and role models, and it is my goal to make them proud and be just as good as them when it comes to my professional life," Sohata said.

World's first AI Safety Institute to be set up in UK: Rishi Sunak

LONDON: The UK is to be the headquarters of the world's first AI Safety Institute as the country takes the lead in examining and testing new types of artificial intelligence, Prime Minister Rishi Sunak announced in a speech in London. Ahead of hosting the first Global AI Safety Summit next week, the British Indian leader who completed one year in office this week said that he genuinely believes that technologies like AI (Artificial Intelligence) will bring a transformation "as far-reaching as the industrial revolution, the coming of electricity, or the birth of the internet". But like those waves of advancements and the many positives that they offer, there are also "new dangers and new fears" that need to be tackled head on. "Get this wrong, and AI could make it easier to build chemical or biological weapons. Terrorist groups could use AI to spread fear and destruction on an even greater scale. Criminals could exploit AI for cyber-attacks, disinformation, fraud, or even child sexual abuse," warned Sunak. He even touched upon the "most unlikely and extreme" fears around AI which is sometimes referred to as "super intelligence" or humanity losing control of the technology altogether.

Israel police arrest actress-activist Maisa Abd Elhadi for endorsing Hamas



TEL AVIV : Police in Israel on Tuesday arrested actress and social activist Maisa Abd Elhadi for seemingly endorsing the Hamas militant group in a series of social media posts. According to Israel au-

thorities, she has made several statements that could be considered as endorsing the raging violence and mayhem unleashed by the Hamas on October 7 against citizens of the Jewish nation. Available information suggests that Elhadi was arrested from Nazareth on Tuesday morning. The police said that one of her post was an image of the broken border fence between Israel and Gaza with the caption, "Let's Go Berlin Style". This was a clear message, a call for barrier breaking conflict and depicting the image to be like fallen Berlin Wall, the police added. Israel is on an all out mission to destroy Hamas after the October 7 incidents of violence leading to the death of around 1400 people. At least 212 people have been taken hostages by the Hamas.

US concerned Israel lacks achievable goals for Gaza ground offensive

TEL AVIV: US President Joe Biden's administration is reportedly concerned that Israel lacks achievable military goals for its operations in Gaza, leading US officials to believe that the Jewish nation's military is not yet ready for a ground incursion, Times of Israel reported.



US officials have held marathon meetings and phone calls with their Israeli counterparts to discuss the ground operation, which many thought the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) would have launched by Monday 17 days after the October 7 Hamas massacre, in which over 1,400 people were slaughtered in Israel and roughly 220 were taken hostage into Gaza. The Times of Israel reported. In the interim, the IDF has maintained a near-constant aerial bombardment it

says is targeting Hamas terrorists and infrastructure, which has left thousands dead. Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin has held near-daily phone calls with his Israeli counterpart, Yoav Gallant, during which the former has urged the importance of carefully considering how IDF troops conduct the incursion in

Gaza, where terrorists will operate from tunnels and densely populated areas. The New York Times reported Monday, citing unnamed US officials. In a Sunday interview with ABC News, Austin said the ground invasion Israel plans to launch could well take longer than the amount of time it took

for the US to remove the Islamic State from power in Mosul, Iraq, when he was the head of the US Army's Central Command. "Urban combat is extremely difficult. It goes at a slow pace," he said. "This may be a bit more difficult because of the underground network of tunnels that Hamas has constructed over time and the fact that they have had a long time to prepare for a fight." US officials told The New York Times on Monday that Israel must decide whether it wants to eliminate Hamas terrorists through a combination of surgical strikes and targeted raids by special forces, as the US did with Iraqi and Kurdish soldiers in Mosul in 2017, or to launch a more expansive ground invasion, as US troops did with Iraqi and British forces in Fallujah in 2004.

Indo-Canadian man fined \$20K for immigration fraud

An Indian-origin man has been fined \$20,000 for his role in a scheme that charged newcomers tens of thousands for permits to work in the Canadian province of Manitoba.



Avtar Sohi, 42, pleaded guilty on Monday to misrepresentation under the Canada Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, the CBC News channel reported. The Provincial Court of Manitoba heard that Avtar provided a woman with pay stubs to show she was working for him as a nanny from March 2019 to July 2021 while she was illegally employed elsewhere. In addition, he also provided her with a number of signed documents that she used as part of her permanent residency application. The woman, an Indian national,

brother Hartar Singh Sohi, an immigration consultant and owner of Abroad Immigration. In March 2021, CBSA investigators executed search warrants at three properties connected with Abroad Immigration and Education Services — a Winnipeg company that arranges permanent residency for newcomers in Canada. Court heard that during the search, the investigators found a work permit issued for an Indian national authorising her to work as a nanny for Avtar and his wife. After surveilling the woman, the investigators found she was working at another place without authorisation. During questioning, the woman said that her family paid \$40,000 for her LMIA, but when she arrived in Canada, she was told there was no job for her.

Massive manhunt underway in US state after mass shootings leave 22 dead

A massive manhunt is currently underway in Maine for the gunman who killed 22 people in two mass shooting incidents, with the police asking residents of Lewiston, the second largest city in the US state, to shelter in place. There were two active shooting incidents on Wednesday evening in the city -- at Sparetime Recreation, a bowling alley on Mollison Way, and Schemengees Bar & Grille Restaurant on Lincoln Street, according to the Lewiston Police Department. The two locations are at a distance of 6.5 km from each



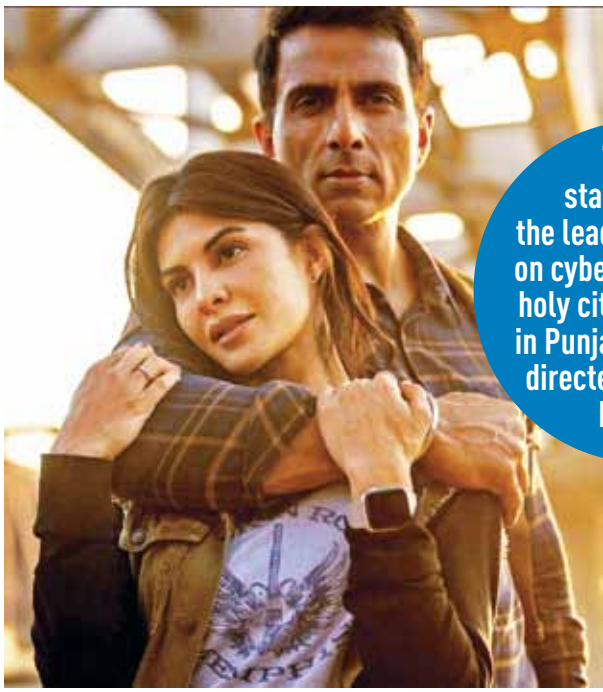
other. State officials said the shootings began at 6.56 p.m., CNN reported. In a statement late Wednesday night, the Lewiston Police Department said the 40-year-old person of

interest Robert Card, who is currently absconding, should be "considered armed and dangerous". "Law Enforcement is attempting to locate Robert Card

regarding the mass shooting at Schemengees Bar and Sparetime Recreation this evening. CARD should be considered armed and dangerous. Please contact law enforcement if you are aware of his whereabouts," the statement added. As of Thursday, hundreds of officers continue to search for Card, a trained firearms instructor and member of the US Army Reserves. Xinhua news agency reported citing authorities as saying. Law enforcement officials said Card "recently reported mental health issues".

The Central Maine Medical Center had also confirmed of reacting to a "mass casualty, mass shooter event" and is coordinating with other hospitals in the area to treat the injured. Although the number of injured persons was not immediately clear, but reports have suggested that at least 50 to 60 people were hurt. The shelter-in-place order remained for Lewiston and now is also in place for Lisbon, which is around 7 miles southeast of the city, Michael Sauschuck, commissioner of the Maine Department of Public Safety, told reporters.

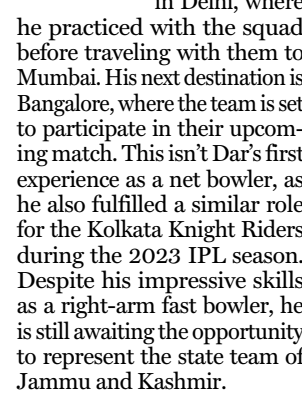

Bishan Singh Bedi's old house still exists in Amritsar

Legendary spinner Bishan Singh Bedi passes away

Born in Amritsar, Bedi plied his trade for Delhi on the domestic circuit, and was the leading wicket-taker amongst Indians in First-Class cricket with 1,560 scalps in 370 matches. New Delhi : Former India skipper and legendary left-arm spinner Bishan Singh Bedi passed away on Monday. He was 77 years old. Bedi played 67 Tests for India between 1967 and 1979 and picked 266 wickets. He also took seven wickets in 10 One-Day Internationals. Later he had served as selector, besides taking over as coach of a number of domestic sides, besides serving the national team in 1990-91. Born in Amritsar, Bedi plied his trade for Delhi on the domestic circuit, and was the leading wicket-taker amongst Indians in First-Class cricket with 1,560 scalps in 370 matches. Bedi also led Delhi to its first two Ranji Trophy titles — in 1978-79 and 1979-80. The team was also runner-up twice under him. Incidentally, the four finals came in a span of five years. In international cricket, Bedi along with Erapalli Prasanna, BS Chandrasekhar and S. Venkataraghavan, formed a formidable quartet, who revolutionised the art of spin bowling in Indian cricket. He began his international



cricket journey in 1966, representing India until 1979. Known for his mastery over flight and spin, Bedi used subtle variations to outwit batsmen, and led India to a historic 1971 series win against England, in the absence of injured Ajit Wadekar. An outspoken person, Bedi never minced his words even during his playing career. He had inevitably courted controversies while objecting to the use of Vaseline by England bowler John Lever in 1976-7, declaring India's second innings at Kingston in protest against intimidatory bowling by the West Indians in 1976 and, most famously as coach, when he had threatened to dump the Indian cricket team in the sea after their poor performance Down Under in 1990-91. After the team lost their match against Australia in the Rothmans Cup, Bedi had said, "The entire teams should be dumped into the Pacific." There's no bigger scam than IPL: Bedi. Bishan Singh Bedi had never approved of the Indian Premier League (IPL), and on several occasions went on to lambast the cash-rich league, also calling it a "scam". "I don't want to say anything about the IPL. There's not a bigger scam in India than the IPL. Nobody here knows where IPL's money comes and goes. The second edition of the IPL happened in South Africa,
