Sales of PC in India surges by 14 pc in **Jul-Sept due to Import Licensing Notice**

quarter of the current fiscal, the sale of personal computers (PCs) in India, including desktops and notebooks, rose 14 per cent to 4.5 million units, as compared to the same period last year, according to the latest data from the International Data Corporation (IDC).

In its Worldwide Quarterly Personal Computing Device Tracker, IDC said that the desktop category grew by 19.3 per cent while the notebooks saw a rise of 13.1 per cent. The rise in sales was attributed to higher



demand for inventory owing to the Centre's decision to impose import licenses for PCs.



With farmers continuing stubble burning in-spite of complete ban by the government air quality of as many as 13 districts across the state reported air quality index (AQI) in severe and very poor categories. Jind and Narnaul districts in the state were identified worst recorded index (AQI) of 480, followed by Faridabad (479), Gurugram (469), Rohtak (467) Bhiwani (466), Sirsa (462), Hisar (458), Kaithal (448), Ballabhgarh (438), Bahadurgarh (435), Manesar (427), Panipat (421) and Karnal (407), all under severe category.

The AQI is rated poor between 201 and 300, very poor between 301 and 400 and severe between 401 and 500. AQI is used by agencies to communicate to the people how polluted the air is. Public health risks



increase as the AQI rises. Districts with very poor air quality include Fatehabad 393), Kurukshetra (383), Palwal (369), Ambala (350) and Yamunanagar (322). Mewat was rated as poor with AQI 235.

Rape and murder mystery of 15 years old girl in Panipat factory solves



DU prof Diwan S. Rawat offers a ray of hope to Parkinson's victims, clinical trials in US volves assistance from McLean

Parkinson's disease (PD) is a serious illness, affecting more than 10 million people worldwide. Tremors, excessive shaking of the entire body or limbs, stiffness, slowed walking, and difficulty in movement are its primary manifestations.

The disease also becomes a cause for severe depression among patients. Currently, there is no cure for PD available in the market. However, India has now discovered a potential treatment for this incurable disease, and its clinical trials have begun in the US. Delhi University has identified a specific protein that could lead to the treatment of

The clinical trials for the molecule (ATM 399A) developed by Professor Diwan S. Rawat of Delhi University and Professor Kim at the McLean Hospital in the US have commenced.

PD is a neuro-degenerative disorder, with common symptoms such as tremors, stiffness, slow movements, and difficulty in walking, leading to noticeable behavioural issues like depression and anxiety. The primary cause of this disease is the death in a deficiency of dopamine and some proteins are essential for the existence of dopamine neurons. In the pursuit of finding a cure for this serious ailment, researchers under the leadership of Rawat have initiated clinical trials for a synthesised molecule (ATH-399A).

The research collaboration in-

McLean Hospital reached an agreement, with NurrOn Pharmaceuticals joining as a partner to develop this molecule. Later, HanAll BioPharma

and Daewoong Pharmaceutical collaborated with NurrOn Pharmaceuticals, initiating the administration of the first dose to a human participant in Phase 1 of clinical trials. The Phase 1 study involves healthy participants aged 18 to 80, receiving oral doses of ATH-399A to assess safety, tolerability, phar-

ED issues fresh summons to Neville Roy Singham in NewsClick case NEW DELHI: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has

issued fresh summons to Shanghai-based millionaire Neville Roy Singham for allegedly funnelling funds to media portal NewsClick.

Singham - a US citizen currently located in Shanghai - was issued fresh summons to record his statement with the central agency last month through the Ministry of External Affairs with the Chinese authorities, a source said. Earlier last year, the Chinese authorities had reportedly refused to serve summons to Singham. The ED is probing how Singham's media company was promoting Chinese propaganda in India.

Notably, the Delhi Police had arrested NewsClick founder Prabir Purkayastha and the company's HR Head Amit Chakravarty last month on charges of alleged anti-India activities. As part of its inquiry, the ED had attached a flat in New Delhi's Saket linked to Prabir Purkayashta, editor-inchief of NewsClick, in connection with its money laundering probe against the news portal.

The property worth Rs 4.52 crore attached under the Prevention of Money Laundering



Act (PMLA) was allegedly part of the proceeds of crime.

ED is probing "fraudulent" foreign funds infusion of over Rs 86 crore into the company that runs the portal.

The probe agency had raided Purkayastha's premises in September 2021.

As per ED officials, the company claimed "receiving export remittance" of Rs 76.84 crore, Rs 1.61 crore, Rs 26.98 lakh, and Rs 2.03 lakh from Justice and Education Fund Inc USA, The Tricontinental Ltd Inc USA, GSPAN LLC USA and Centro Popular De Midas, Brazil, from March 2018 until the 2021 raids. Officials said the agency has not found any evidence of exporting of services to these entities. ED is also probing at the foreign direct investment (FDI) transfer of Rs 9.59 crore in April 2018 by way of subscription of shares of PPK NEWSCLICK Studio Pvt Ltd from a company named Worldwide Media Holdings LLC, USA (a Delaware Limited

Tunnel Collapse: Augur drilling machine gets to work, Union minister V.K. Singh takes stock

UTTARKASHI: Rescue operations to bring out the 40 workers trapped in an underconstruction tunnel in Silkyara in Uttarakhand's Uttarkashi resumed for the fifth day on Thursday as an Auger drilling machine began to operate to expedite the process of digging through the debris and rescuing the people.

This heavy drilling machine has been brought from Delhi to Uttarakhand by the Indian Air Force's Hercules cargo aircraft.

National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd. (NHIDCL) Director Anshu Manish Khalkho said that the 25 ton heavy Auger machine drills five to six metres per hour.

If this drilling machine works well then all the 40 workers trapped in the tunnel can be rescued in the next 10 to 15 hours. However, the working of this machine will also depend on how far the workers are trapped inside the tunnel.

After the installation of the Jack and Push Earth Auger machine sent from Delhi, it has started drilling and pipe pushing. At present, the entire process is going on satisfactorily. In case there is no glitch in the rescue operation, it is expected that the trapped workers will be rescued by late Thursday evening or Friday.

Meanwhile, Union Minister V.K. Singh arrived at the tunnel on Thursday to take stock of the rescue operation, where he spoke to the rescue officials and tried to find out the reasons behind the accident that took place in the tunnel.

The Minister said that all the 40 workers are trapped in a 2-km empty space inside the



tunnel where there is some light and the authorities are sending food and water to the trapped workers.

This new drilling machine is operating more powerfully and speedily than the older one.

On the fifth day of the tunnel collapse, Uttarakhand Director General of Police Ashok Kumar also reached the spot and took stock of the situation. Later, he told the media that all the Central and the state agencies are trying their best to rescue the trapped workers.

He added that all the people trapped in the tunnel are completely safe. "We all have to maintain their (trapped workers') morale by playing a positive role. Now the Army and Air Force have also been involved in the rescue operation, "he stated. On Tuesday night, when the efforts being made at the state government level were not successful, the PMO, which was continuously monitoring the situation, sprung into action. After this, the Central government sent the Jack and Push Earth Auger machine weighing 25 tonnes to Uttarkashi in two

Expert agencies of Thailand and Norway have also been consulted to rescue the workers. Help was sought from the Thailand agencies which had rescued children trapped in a tunnel last year. At present, an Army team led by Colonel Deepak Patil is also involved in the relief and rescue operations.

Apart from these, a team of 200 people is working round the clock. Soldiers and personnel of various state agencies, including the NDRF, SDRF, local police, fire service, ITBP, BRO, Rail Vikas Nigam have also been deployed in the operation. SDRF Commandant Manikant Mishra is at the spot for the fifth day along with local administration and police officials. Engineer and drilling expert Aadesh Jain said late on Wednesday night that till November 14, debris had caved in six times and its radius had increased to 70 metres. The drilling machine that was installed earlier could work only up to 45 metres.

Digital footprints are as significant as physical ones

he Supreme Court's directive to the Indian Union government to establish guidelines protecting media professionals from arbitrary seizure of their digital devices is a crucial and timely intervention. This decision comes in the wake of recent incidents where journalists' laptops and smartphones were seized and scrutinized, sending a disconcerting message to the media community and sources who rely on confidentiality. Such actions not only threaten press freedom but also hinder journalists' right to livelihood, as digital tools are indispensable in modern journalism. The necessity for these guidelines stems from the need to balance law enforcement prerogatives with the sanctity of journalistic work. The guidelines should mandate that law enforcement cannot seize or search journalists' devices without a prior judicial warrant. This warrant must specify the information sought, preventing unchecked intrusions under the guise of broad allegations. It's critical to ensure that journalists are not coerced into selfincrimination or revealing their sources by providing access codes or biometric data. Technological solutions, like device cloning, should be employed to allow journalists to continue their work without losing access to their data indefinitely. Additionally, a comprehensive record of the device at the time of seizure is essential to prevent the malicious implantation of incriminating material during the investigation. The Court's call for a "balancing of interests" emphasizes the need for transparency and public consultation in drafting these guidelines. This is not just a media issue; it's about upholding the fundamental right to privacy for all citizens in a digital age where personal and professional lives are increasingly intertwined with handheld devices. Finally, this situation underscores a broader necessity - updating existing laws on search and seizure to reflect the digital realities of today's world. Handle terror with realism, not machismo



social media on the Israel- Hamas conflict, with a large number of people sympathising with Israel, which suffered an unprecedented attack by Hamas on October 7. This is perhaps because India went through the trauma of the Mumbai attacks in 2008 (known as 26/11), among others. Opinion, however, became more strident when The New York Times columnist, Thomas Friedman, published an article last month praising former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh's "remarkable act of restraint" in not attacking Pakistan immediately after the Mumbai attacks. Some social media warriors were outraged, condemning India's past inaction as an act of cowardice. This is perhaps because India prides itself on its air strikes on Balakot in Pakistan in 2019 to avenge the Pulwama terror attack. But counter-terrorism is a delicate act:

it is to be carried out with due thought and realism, not raging machismo, as India showed. First, terrorists strike in the hope of eliciting a response that will highlight their cause. Hamas attacked Israel when the Saudis and Israelis were on a path to peace, which would have led to the Palestinian cause taking a back seat. With Israel's violent response, the Palestinian issue has taken centre stage now. Let's assume that after 26/11, India had bombed major cities and cantonments in Pakistan. That would have led to a nuclear standoff, with the international focus shifting to how to 'solve' the India-Pakistan issue, which centres around Kashmir, rather than terrorism itself.

Here is what happened by doing nothing. The gravity of the 26/11 attacks was equated to that of the 9/11 attacks in the U.S. Soon after the attacks, U.S. President George W. Bush sent a strong statement of support to India, world leaders condemned the attacks, and India was praised for being a "responsible nuclear power". The



path-breaking India-U.S. Civil Nuclear agreement was operationalised just a month before the attacks in Mumbai. In addition, there was another issue. The global financial crisis had just hit, with the collapse of the Lehman Brothers. In India too, the stock market crashed by 41% between June and December. A war would have been disastrous.

Second, it is vital to frame an issue in terms of the prevailing international circumstances and how that can best be used to achieve one's own objectives. Delhi decided to ally itself with the 'war on terror', which was being fought across continents. The result of a war would have been not just finger-wagging from the international community, but also the loss of international money. Investors hate instability.

Pakistan's fortunes began to tumble soon after 26/11, furthered by an internal mess of its own making. The country, under General Pervez Musharraf, milked 9/11 for all it was worth: the U.S. military's aid rose exponentially during this period in order to enable Pakistan to fight Taliban and al Qaeda militants. Joe Biden, who was Senator, repeatedly called for reducing this aid in 2008. Real GDP growth crashed after 2008-09 and later recovered briefly, but it never recovered to previous growth rates. Foreign Direct Investment, which had risen in the 9/11 period, dropped by 42% by 2010, as Pakistan became identified with the 'war on terror'. The focus on Pakistan increased further when the United Nations designated the Lashkare-Tayyiba (LeT) as a terrorist organisation in 2010. In 2009, the U.S. Senate passed the revised version of the Kerry-Lugar Bill, which tripled U.S. non-military assistance to Pakistan from \$400 million to \$1.5 billion annually for the next five years, with clauses that Pakistan considered offensive. For instance, the bill said that Pakistan must show that it is "ceasing support" for terrorists and that it must prevent groups such as LeT from carrying out attacks on "neighbouring countries." Pakistan was furious. This narrative began to build as

notable scholars such as Stephen Cohen began to call it "America's most dangerous ally". India was de-linked from Pakistan as it drew closer to the U.S., while Pakistan's future was evaluated entirely by its terrorist antics.

It can be argued that the collapse of present-day Pakistan is in part due to India's decision not to attack and instead craft an international response. Alongside, India created a path for a \$3 trillion economy, while Pakistan's economic fortunes continue to tumble. None of this might have happened if India had gone to war.

Showing strength

However, this does not reduce the vital importance of the air strikes on Balakot. Those were carried out when India's defence capability had vastly improved, its economy was strong, and it enjoyed a solid relationship with the U.S. The strikes were carefully calibrated to send a signal to Pakistan that its terrorism was not costfree. Importantly, it freed Indians from a defensive mindset. Strong leadership matters. But strength can come from a deliberated move rather than the kind of chest-beating that Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has adopted.

Finally, whether then or now, there is no uestion of having boots on the ground' given that India and Pakistan are nuclear powers. Pakistan can be punished, but without being invaded. Those calling for India to be as "decisive" as Israel miss the point. Mr. Netanyahu has just given Hamas the priceless gift of publicity; now, support for the Palestinian cause has swelled everywhere. The trick is to outwit a country, even as the threat of a slashing sword is seen to be ever-present.

DR. V. MOHAN SAYS A 'DIABETES COMPLICATIONS FREE' INDIA IS ACHIEVABLE, IF NOT DIABETES-FREE

Remission of diabetes, desirable, but not essential



e concept of a reversal of diabetes has become very popular recently. Several commercial organisations have jumped on the bandwagon of a 'reversal of diabetes' and are making tall claims. Therefore, it is important to consider the pros and cons of a reversal

First, the term 'reversal' of diabetes is scientifically incorrect; the appropriate term is 'remission' of diabetes. Reversal implies that the condition has permanently reverted to normal and a cure has been achieved. 'Remission' implies that diabetes has only gone away temporarily. We know for instance that cancer can go more virulent form.

Remission and type 2 diabetes

Diabetes is not a single condition but consists of several types. When we talk of remission of diabetes, we are referring most often to type 2 diabetes. However, there are other forms of diabetes such as type 1 diabetes where long-term remission is very unlikely to occur.

Can everyone with type 2 achieve remission? Some diabetes reversal programmes claim that they can reverse type 2 diabetes

at any stage of the disorder. This is not true. There are certain individuals with type 2 diabetes who are more likely to achieve remission. This can be identified by the letters ABCDE. A refers to A1c (glycated haemoglobin) which should not be very



likely to achieve remission due to weight loss; C stands for C-Peptide, a measure of insulin secretion. If it is good, you can achieve remission more easily; D stands for Duration of diabetes; the shorter the duration, the greater the chances of remission; and E stands for an Enthusiastic individual who is keen to achieve remission. One should remember that even if one

achieves remission of diabetes only for a few months or years, it is still worthwhile because it leads to a good 'legacy effect' which provides protection from complications caused by diabetes.

What about those who cannot achieve remission? Should they be disheartened? Definitely not. Indeed, in my experience, the majority of people with type 2 diabetes would find it difficult to achieve long-term among those who do so, in the majority of cases, diabetes returns after a few months; the severity of the diabetes is often much worse than when it was before the person went into remission

Leading a long and healthy life

I would like to reassure people who do not achieve remission that nothing is lost. My experience over the last four to five decades has taught me that all that is needed to have a long and healthy life

cated haemoglobin should be below 7% (or if possible even below 6.5%); B: Blood Pressure should be less than 130/80 mm/ Hg L or as appropriate for the age; C: Cholesterol (LDL cholesterol) should be less than 50 mg/dl or at least below 70 mg/dL; D: Discipline which includes healthy diet, exercise and frequent check-ups with your diabetologist. We were among the first to show that if ABCD is maintained, people with diabetes can live long and healthy lives. Indeed, 50 or 60-years of survival with diabetes and with no complications whatsoever, is possible.

The ultimate aim of the treatment of diabetes is to have a diabetes complications-free life. Today, diabetes remains sub-optimally controlled which is why it is the leading cause of blindness, amputation,

remission of their diabetes. Even heart attacks, stroke, kidney failure and impotence. Very often we find people in the prime of their life affected by one or more of these devastating complications which affects not only the individual but also his or her family. It can ultimately even impact the economy of the country.

Data on India

According to our recent Indian Council of Medical Research-India Diabetes (ICMR-INDIAB) study, there are currently 101 million people with diabetes and 136 million people with prediabetes in India. In those with prediabetes, preventing the majority of these individuals from developing diapetes for a considerable numb is possible with just lifestyle modifications. In those who already have diabetes, we should, of course, try to achieve remission of diabetes. But if this is not possible, meeting the ABCD guidelines of the treatment of diabetes will ensure that they can all live a long and healthy life without any diabeteslinked complications.

Even though we may not be able to make India 'diabetes free', my dream is that we can at least have a 'diabetes complicationsfree India'. On the occasion of World Diabetes Day (November 14), let us rededicate urselves to achieve this dream.

Trade Remedies Anant Swarup said that these products are mainly manufactured by MSMEs. He said that the import of these four products together stood at about Rs 800 crore and they are coming from China.

Indian Manufacturing Sector Growth Expected To Continue In Q2FY24: FICCI



NEW DELHI: Despite a slowdown in developed nations. India's manufacturing sector is expected to register a strong growth momentum during the second quarter of the fiscal year 2023-24, FICCI said.

The latest quarterly survey from the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry revealed that in Q1 (April-June), 57 per cent of reproduction levels, which gained further traction in Q2 (July-September) with over 79 per cent noting higher production. Order books also reflect this positive trend, with 80 per cent of respondents reporting increased orders, indicating optimistic demand conditions.

The survey covered ten maior sectors, drawing responses from over 380 manufacturing units with a combined annual turnover exceeding Rs 4.88 lakh crore. FICCI survey revealed that an average capacity utilisation stands at 74 per cent, slightly higher than in previous quarters, reflecting sustained economic activity.

Sahara Group Chairman Subrata Roy passes away at 75

Subrata Roy, passed away at Mumbai's Kokilaben Hospital due to cardiorespiratory arrest amidst health complications. Roy faced controversies and legal battles, particularly over alleged Ponzi schemes.

MUMBAI: Sahara Group chief Subrata Roy died due to a cardiorespiratory arrest at a private hospital in Mumbai on Tuesday after a prolonged illness, according to a company statement. He was 75.

Having created a huge business empire across retail, real estate and financial services sectors, Roy was at the centre of a huge controversy and faced multiple regulatory and legal battles in connection with his group firms that were accused of circumventing regulations with Ponzi schemes, allegations his group always denied.

According to the company statement, he was admitted to the Kokilaben Dhirubhai Ambani Hospital & Medical Research Institute in Mumbai on Sunday

after his health deteriorated.

He passed away at the hospital at 10.30 pm on Tuesday due to a cardiorespiratory arrest following an extended battle with complications arising from metastatic malignancy, hypertension and diabetes, it added. "It is with profound sadness

that Sahara India Pariwar informs the demise of our Hon'ble 'Saharasri' Subrata Roy Sahara, Managing Worker and Chairman, Sahara India Pariwar,' the group said in the statement.

Calling him an "inspirational leader and visionary", the statement said, "His loss will be deeply felt by the entire Sahara India Pariwar. Saharasri ji was a guiding force, a mentor, and a source of inspiration for all who had the privilege to work alongside him." Sahara India Pariwar is committed to upholding Roy's legacy and will continue to honour his vision in driving the organisation, it

In his prime, Roy had made the Sahara Group a multi-billion dollar enterprise that counted itself among the biggest employ-



known to have friends among the famous and powerful across the fields of politics and Bollywood. Having scripted one of the most famous rags-to-riches stories of the country, Roy went on to expand his business across various sectors ranging from finance, housing, manufacturing, aviation and the media and

became a household name. His enterprise went on to own landmark global properties, including New York's Plaza Hotel and London's iconic Grosvenor House. Under his leadership,

Sahara also sponsored the Indian cricket and hockey teams and owned a Formula One racing team. Weddings of his two sons some two decades ago are still among the biggest parties ever seen in India. He lived in

His troubles began in November 2010 when stock market regulator Sebi asked two entities of Sahara Group not to mobilise funds from equity markets or from issuance of any security to the public while restraining Roy from approaching the public for raising money.

He was later granted bail

but troubles continued for his various businesses. Two Sahara Group companies -- Sahara India Real Estate Corporation (SIRECA) and Sahara Housing Investment Corporation -raised funds in 2007-08 through a debenture instrument OFCD. Later in June 2011, the regulator asked the two group entities to refund money collected from investors through Optionally Fully Convertible Debentures (OFCD) along with the return.

After a long process of appeals and cross-appeals, the Supreme Court had ordered in 2012 refund of deposits of its investors along with 15 per cent interest. Sahara was eventually asked to deposit an estimated Rs 24,000 crore with Sebi for further refund to investors, though the group always maintained it amounted to "double payment"

Roy was arrested in 2014 on as it had already refunded more than 95 per cent of investors after he failed to appear before directly. Once asked for proof of repayment, Roy famously sent across 100 truckloads of documents to SEBI, triggering a unique warehousing crisis for the regulator. In another incident, a man from Gwalior threw ink on Roy's face and called him a thief when he was brought to the Supreme Court in his trademark waistcoat and

tie amid chaotic scenes. The Sahara Group had earlier said it has always built its businesses by productively channelizing human capital spread across India and giving employment and work at people's doorstep.

"În this way, Sahara is providing bread and butter to more than 14 lakh people in their own villages and towns. It is the country's second-largest human capital after Indian Railways. This amount could have been used by the organisation to generate more employment and work and helped the country and therefore its economy," it had said in an earlier statement.

Previous IMF interventions may have reduced a country's ability to invest in transition. Now, the IMF's response to, or management of, an economic crisis must also consider solutions that are not building the fragilities of the future.

US not trying to 'decouple' from China, but seeks improved ties, says Biden



The five-member bench had previously declared such trials as "null and void" on October 23, instructing authorities to shift the hearings of cases involving former Prime Minister Imran Khan's supporters to ordinary criminal courts, media


reported The Ministry of Defence, in its intra-court appeal, is urging the apex court to overturn the October 23 decision and reinstate the sections of the Official Secrets Act that were deemed illegal by the bench. Additionally, the government is seeking the restoration of Section 59(4) of the Army Act. The petition emphasizes the potential harm to the country if certain sections of the Army Act and Official Secrets Act remain illegal.

The Supreme Court's earlier ruling allowed for the trial of 103 individuals and others connected to the May 9 and 10 events to be conducted in



Since the film industry suffers a loss of Rs 20,000 crore and Information & Broadcasting Officers are authorized to direct blocking, removing any website/app/link having pirated film content.

After Parliament passed the Cinematography (Amendment) Act 1952 during the monsoon session this year, the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting has set up a set of nodal officers to receive complaints against piracy and direct intermediaries to remove pirated content on digital platforms. As of now, there is no institutional mechanism to take direct action against pirated film content except legal action under copyright law and IPC. There are strict penalties for piracy. This amendment is in line with the existing laws that address the issues of film piracy i.e. the Copyright Act, 1957 and the Information Technology (IT)
