Gift to youth clubs on National Youth Day by State Government led by CM Bhagwant Mann

CHANDIGARH: The State Government led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann gave a gift to the youth clubs of the state on the occasion of National Youth Day, in the form of an amount of Rs. 1.50 Cr which was released to 315 youth clubs. Youth Services Minister Gurmeet Singh Meht Hayer today called on the representatives of 20 clubs at Punjab Bhawan and handed over the cheque. This amount has been divided district wise by the youth services Department to distribute to the clubs. Meht Hayer said that on the instructions of the Chief Minister, an amount of Rs. 1.50 Cr has been given today in the first phase and another amount of Rs. 1.50 crore will be given in future in the second phase. He further said that the selection of 315 youth clubs has been made keeping in mind the grassroots



activities of the last two years. Meht Hayer made another big announcement for the youth clubs and said that in the new youth policy, annual awards are being started for the youth clubs. By choosing the awards at the district level, the clubs coming in the first three places will get Rs. 5 lakhs, Rs. 3 lakhs and Rs. 2 lakh cash respectively. The activities of the clubs will be the

basis for the selection for the award. Inviting the youth clubs to come forward to eradicate the environmental and social evils, he added that youth clubs must come forward to stop the trend of stubble burning. Similarly, people's participation is most important in drug prevention campaigns. Development and promotion of villages through rural youth clubs such as social

activities, blood donation camps, environment maintenance, plantation, cleaning of village/city streets and drains, cleaning of grounds, and parks should be done. The awards will be based on the marks obtained by combining all the activities. The Youth Services Minister contacted the representatives of each club directly and asked for suggestions, during which a very meaningful feedback was received in the discussion. The sports minister said that the state government is going to establish 1000 sports nurseries under the new sports policy. He asked the youth clubs to make efforts to promote National Style Kabaddi as this sport is a part of the Asian Games and National Games. Meht Hayer said that all possible efforts are being made to realise the dream of the Chief Minister to make the state

Rangla Punjab and for the all-round development of the youth of Punjab. State Youth Training Development Youth Workshop, Youth Mela, Schemes like teacher training camp, youth leadership training camp/hiking tracking/mountaineering course, and state tours are being started for the youth. He said that the amount released today will be given to the clubs by the committee formed under the chairmanship of the deputy commissioner at the district level. He said that a maximum of Rs. 50, 000 will be released per club. He also said that this amount should be spent transparently as per the financial rules. Special Chief Secretary Youth Services Sarvjit Singh, Special Secretary Anand Kumar and Assistant Director Rupinder Kaur were also present on this occasion.

Muted response observed to Pre-Packaged Insolvency Process for MSMEs: RBI Governor

NEW DELHI: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) reports limited adoption of the government's Pre-Packaged Insolvency Resolution Process (PPIRP) for managing financial stress among Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). Launched in 2021, it deals with default amounts ranging from Rs 10 lakh to Rs 1 crore. RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das, addressing a conference on the future roadmap for resolving stressed assets and IBC (Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code), noted a relatively muted response to PPIRP, on Thursday. "One reason could be the hesitancy on the part of the financial creditors (FCs) in approving the proposals under this mechanism, wherein the haircut is perceived as voluntary," said Das. Despite this, he emphasised that PPIRP could encourage



promoters to proactively engage with creditors, potentially preventing defaults and facilitating quicker, smoother resolutions to avoid adversarial litigations. "Overall, this could be a win-win situation for both creditors and debtors. Once this perception is established, there could be a greater acceptance of this mechanism for larger corporate debtors as well, as, and when the statutory enablers are in place," the governor

explained. Governor Das underscored the potential game-changing role of PPIRP in the out-of-court resolution framework, especially considering the co-ordination challenges with a creditor universe, including mutual funds, insurance companies, and bond/debenture holders, outside the scope of the Prudential Framework for Resolution of Stressed Assets. He acknowledged the limitations of the out-of-court resolution framework and expressed the RBI's interest in aligning it effectively with the IBC. Das considered PPIRP a potential game-changer in this regard. According to data shared by Minister of State, MSME Ministry, Bhanu Pratap Singh Verma, only six cases were admitted under PPIRP, with four ongoing, one resolved, and one withdrawn.

Punjab CM expressed profound grief over the martyrdom of Jawan Gurpreet Singh



CHANDIGARH: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Friday expressed profound grief and sorrow over the martyrdom of 24 years old Army Jawan Gurpreet Singh, who attained martyrdom while performing his duty.

In a statement issued here, the Chief Minister said that Gurpreet Singh hailed from Bhaini Khaddar (Gurdaspur) of the state. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that brave jawan laid his life while performing duty at Jammu and Kashmir. He said that it is an irreparable loss for the country in general and for the distressed family in particular.

The Chief Minister extended his sympathies with the bereaved family of the brave martyr and said that the Punjab government is with the family in this hour of grave crisis. He said that this martyr displayed utmost dedication to perform his duty valiantly adding that the supreme sacrifice of the martyr will ever inspire youngsters. Bhagwant Singh Mann also informed that monetary assistance to be extended to the bereaved family according to the policy of the state government adding that cremation will be held at his native village with government honours.

PM Modi holds spectacular roadshow in Nashik, to throw open 27th National Youth Festival

NASHIK: Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived in this pilgrim centre and launched a spectacular roadshow, virtually symbolising the start of the Bharatiya Janata Party and its allies' 2024 poll campaign, here on Friday morning. PM Modi was accompanied by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and Deputy CMs Devendra Fadnis and Ajit Pawar, and state BJP chief Chandrashekhar Bawankule on an open-topped vehicle which traversed the 1.20 kms long road. Thousands of people and party activists lined up on both sides as the foursome waved at them and nodded in approval at the cultural events organised on one side of the road. The roadshow started from the Mirchi Circle to the Janardhan Swami Math Chowk on the Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar-Nashik Highway along with a cultural show in which over



1,50,000 people joined enthusiastically, amidst tight security all around. Organised by the Ministry of Youth Affairs in collaboration with other departments, the NYF theme this year is 'MyBharat-ViksitBharat@2047 - By the Youth, For the Youth' to herald the aspirations of the young generations for India's future. Besides Nashik, 750 districts and major cities are simultaneously hosting various

NYF-related events like road safety, cultural programmes and events showcasing India's diverse heritage, to foster a spirit of national unity and progress among the youth. The PM will also visit the historic Kalaram Temple for a 'darshan' and 'puja', then inaugurate the 27th National Youth Festival marking the 161st birth anniversary of the philosopher Swami Vivekananda and interact with the local leaders here. Later this afternoon, the PM will reach Mumbai to inaugurate the country's longest bridge across the sea, the 'Atal Bihari Vajpayee Sewri-Nhava Sheva Atal Setu' linking Mumbai island with the country's mainland. The PM will also inaugurate/launch/dedicate/other major infrastructure projects worth over Rs 30,000 crore in the state during his daylong tour here.

IMD warns of bone-chilling cold wave in North India



NEW DELHI: There seems to be no immediate respite from the bone-chilling cold wave and fog which will continue for the next few days, said the India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Friday. The IMD said the cold wave to severe cold wave conditions are likely over North India during the next two days while cold day to severe day wave conditions are likely over the plains of Northwest India during the next three days and then the conditions will abate thereafter. The IMD also predicted that dense to very dense fog conditions are likely to continue to prevail over North India during the next five days.

In its daily bulletin, the weather forecast agency said that minimum temperatures are in the range of 3-7 degree Celsius over most parts of Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Rajasthan, in some parts of Uttar Pradesh, south Rajasthan, north Madhya Pradesh and in isolated pockets of Bihar. "These are below normal by (-) 1 degree Celsius to (-) 3 degree Celsius at many places of north India. Today, the lowest minimum temperature of 1.4 degree Celsius reported at Amritsar (Punjab)," said the IMD. It also said that cold wave to severe cold wave conditions prevailed in isolated pockets

of East Rajasthan, Punjab and cold wave condition in isolated pockets of Haryana and West Rajasthan. "Gradual fall by 2-3 degree Celsius in minimum temperatures is likely over many parts of Central and East India during the next 2-3 days and no significant change thereafter. However, no significant change in minimum temperatures is very likely over Northwest India during the next five days," said the IMD. As per weather department, cold wave to severe cold wave conditions are very likely to continue in isolated pockets of Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi on Friday and Saturday and cold wave conditions in isolated pockets on Sunday. "Cold wave conditions are very likely in isolated pockets of Rajasthan on Friday, over Uttar Pradesh on Friday and Saturday and over Bihar during Friday and Sunday," said the IMD. The IMD also predicted that ground frost conditions were very likely over Uttarakhand, Punjab, Chandigarh and Haryana on Saturday.

Sukhbir Badal visits Kaunke family, assures complete support to secure justice for Jathedar Kaunke

JAGRAON (LUDHIANA): Shiromani Akali Dal Sukhbir Singh Badal visited the family of Jathedar Gurdev Singh Kaunke along with Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) president Harjinder Singh Dhami and assured it complete support, including legal assistance to ensure justice for the late Jathedar. The Committee constituted by the SGPC to assist the family in securing justice for the kidnapping, torture and eventual murder of Jathedar Kaunke by the police during the tenure of Congress chief minister Beant Singh also accompanied the SAD President. They visited the family at their residence in Kaunke village. Sukhbir Badal spent time with the family members including the late Jathedar's son Hari Singh and wife Gurdev Kaur and listened to the entire



episode concerning the kidnapping and eventual elimination of the Jathedar. The family members disclosed that Beant Singh himself misdirected the probe into the case by denying the incident and covering it up. Badal assured the family that the SAD and the SGPC would extend all possible help to them. Badal said a panel of lawyers would be constituted to launch a legal battle to ensure punishment for all those responsible for eliminating Jathedar Kaunke. Meanwhile the Kaunke family honoured the SAD president and thanked him for extending support to it.

J&K: Assembly, panchayat polls likely after Lok Sabha election

FW DESK Panchayat and Assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir are likely to follow the upcoming Lok Sabha elections, media reports said. The tenure of nearly 4,900 village panchayats concluded on Tuesday, leaving rural areas without elected grassroots representatives. However, the District Development Councils, established through direct elections in 2020, remain active. As for the Assembly elections, the Supreme Court's deadline of September 2024 has added a timeline to this process. Logistical and security assessments for these elections are expected during the Election Commission's visit to the region as part of its Lok Sabha polls review.

Pannun case: US says will not provide 'discovery material' to Nikhil Gupta

NEW YORK: The US government has refused to provide "discovery material" after it was asked by a New York court to respond to a motion filed by lawyers of Indian national Nikhil Gupta, named in an alleged plot to assassinate Sikh radical Gurbhant Singh Pannun. Gupta's lawyers, while also claiming that their 52-year-old client is facing human rights violations, had sought material, or evidence, relating to the charges against him in a 'Motion to Compel Production of Discovery' filed on January 4 in the US District Court, Southern District of New York. Following this, in an order dated January 8, US District Judge Victor Marrero asked the government to file a reply to the motion within three days of the date of the order. In a response filed with the district court on Wednesday, the US government, while objecting to provide the "materials", said "the defendant is not entitled to discovery". "The government is prepared to produce discovery promptly upon the defendant's appearance in this District and arraignment on this case. Before then, however, the defendant is not entitled to discovery, and he identifies no good reason for the Court to order it," federal prosecutors said. "The government stands ready to provide discovery to him, like any other criminal defendant, promptly upon his



appearance and arraignment in this District. His motion to compel discovery should be denied." US Attorney Damian Williams said. On January 4, defence counsel filed the motion requesting that "the Court enter an order directing the Government to begin providing defense counsel with discovery material". Gupta's attorney Jeff Chabrow said in the motion that the "defence materials" are "relevant to its ability to defend the instant charges". In response, the New York court had given the government three days to file a reply to the motion. A motion to compel is a request made to the court to force a party to comply with a discovery request. It is typically filed by the party seeking the information or evidence, and it asks the court to order the other party to comply with a discovery request that has not been fulfilled. If the motion is granted, the court will typically order the other party to provide the requested information or documents within a specified

timeframe. In addition, the lawyers mentioned in the court documents that Gupta, who was arrested by Czech authorities on June 30, 2023, in response to a request by the US under an extradition treaty, is facing human rights violations while being in custody. The motion stated citing Gupta's family that they have "limited access" to him, he is not allowed consular access and "faces basic human rights violations in custody in Prague. In November last year, US prosecutors announced murder-for-hire charges against Gupta for involvement in a foiled plot to assassinate a US citizen allegedly on behalf of an Indian government employee. Gupta has been charged with murder-for-hire, which carries a maximum sentence of 10 years in prison, and conspiracy to commit murder-for-hire, which carries a maximum sentence of 10 years in prison, US Attorney for the Southern District of New York, Matthew G. Olsen, had said.

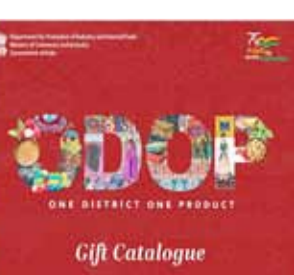
Not us, Maharaja Hari Singh enacted Art 370



Article 370 was introduced and enacted by Maharaja Hari Singh to stop people from Punjab settling in Jammu in the wake of India's partition, former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Dr Farooq Abdullah said while addressing the media in Baran village on the outskirts of Jammu on Monday. "We didn't bring Article 370. This was introduced and implemented by Maharaja Hari Singh in 1947. It was only out of fear that the people of Punjab would come here after partition and settle down and the poor people of our state would sell their land at lesser rates," he said while addressing a press conference in Jammu. Abdullah stressed that Maharaja's intent behind Article 370 was to safeguard the interests of the people in Jammu and Kashmir, particularly the marginalized communities, in the aftermath of partition. He reiterated that the article was put in place to reserve jobs exclusively for the locals of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, serving as a protective measure for their socio-economic well-being.

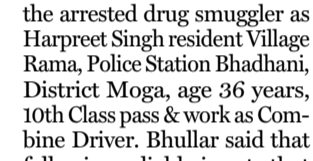

Punjab players bring laurels to state in 67th national school games

CHANDIGARH: Punjab players brought laurels to the state by performing their best in the 67th National School Games.

Disclosing this here today Punjab School Education Minister Harjot Singh Bains said that till now, as many as 142 medals have been won by the players of Punjab in National School Games which included 46 gold, 33 silver and 63 bronze medals. He said that the games will conclude in February 2024.

Currently Punjab was at fifth position as per medal tally, as its players have won a total of 12 medals in Archery including



4 gold, 3 silver and 5 bronze medals and 3 medals in athletics including 1 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze. The Punjab players also clinched 2 medals in Badminton including 1 gold and 1 bronze and 21 medals boxing including 4 gold, 5 silver and 12 bronze medals. The players secured 6 medals including 2 gold and 4 bronze

medals in fencing and clinched a bronze medal each in football and Gymnastics. The players also won 2 medals in handball including 1 silver and 1 bronze. In Judo, the players clinched 14 medals including 7 gold, 4 silver and 3 bronze medals meanwhile, the players won 33 medals in Karate including 12 gold, 9 silver and 12 bronze medals. The Punjab players also clinched 1 bronze medal in Kho-Kho and a silver medal in Kabaddi.

SGPC send legal notice to X (Twitter)

AMRITSAR: The Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) has sent a legal notice to X (formerly Twitter), initiating action against the social media platform over a fake/parody X account of the Sikh organisation. This legal notice has been sent by Advocate Amanbir Singh Siali, the legal advisor of the organization as per the decision of SGPC's executive meeting held on November 20, 2023.

Advocate Siali has stated in his notice that spreading and encouraging hate propaganda against any religion or religious organization by social media platforms like X under the policy of parody accounts is a violation of the Indian Penal Code, Information Technology Act 2001 and Information Technology Rules 2021. He said



that this phenomenon is being done to hurt the religious feelings and faith of Sikhs. With this hate campaign, mutual brotherhood is also being threatened in the society, so it should be stopped immediately, otherwise the SGPC will not hesitate to take legal action at all levels.

Giving information about this notice, SGPC secretary Partap Singh said that the matter was raised to X social media platform when a fake/parody X account of SGPC, the constitutional body of Sikhs, came to light, but in the written communication, X

refused to stop it. In a follow-up communication, X/Twitter described the parody account as part of its policy, after which the executive meeting presided over by SGPC President Harjinder Singh Dhani approved legal action.

The SGPC secretary said that on this fake/parody account, hate propaganda is being spread against the Sikh organization SGPC and the Sikh community, which cannot be tolerated. He said that tarnishing the image of the constitutional body of Sikhs through this social media account is not appropriate in any way. He said that the SGPC has written to the Union and State governments several times to take action against such social media platforms, but this hate campaign continues unabated.

19kg heroin recovery: Punjab police arrest three more members of Mannu Mahawa cartel

Advanced Parkinson's disease treatment now possible with DBS: Experts

30 docs attended CME on Parkinson's diseases at IVY Hospital, Amritsar

As many as 30 doctors attended a CME on latest treatment options for Parkinson's diseases at IVY Hospital, Amritsar today.

Speaking during CME, Dr Jasloveen Sidhu an internationally trained Parkinson's specialist neurologist said that Parkinson's disease is the second most common neuro

degenerative disease in the whole world. Its symptoms are often missed or misdiagnosed with old age and many elderly patients are left untreated.

She said that common symptoms include slowness in daily activities, stiffness in body, shaking or trembling of hands, legs, and jaw, difficulty in walking, walking with stooped posture or losing balance while walking.

Parkinson's disease is a progressive condition and medical treatment doesn't help in advanced cases, she asserted.

Deep brain stimulation



(DBS) surgery helps in reducing the dosage of medications and improves motor symptoms like tremors, slowness and stiffness, she opined.

She explained further that DBS is like a pacemaker surgery for the brain which can control the symptoms by

changing the electrical signals of the electrodes placed in the brain. Patients who need DBS surgery have to be screened by a Parkinson's specialist neurologist and have to undergo UPDRS on & off testing before they can be declared fit for surgery. Also, since this is an awake surgery, Parkinson's specialists have to monitor the patient during the whole surgery to confirm if the electrodes are put in the exact location in the brain, she maintained.

The patients need detailed evaluation of all such symptoms

and treatment is planned according to their age, symptoms and tolerance. Since Parkinson's disease is a progressive disease, the medications will not give good effect for long and brain surgery needs to be planned in such cases. DBS surgery is done for Parkinson's disease patients when they develop fluctuations after a few years of medications, she asserted.

TMC not to initiate further seat-sharing talks with Cong

NEW DELHI: The Trinamool Congress is no longer interested in initiating fresh talks with the Congress regarding the seat sharing arrangement for the Lok Sabha polls this year as part of the INDIA bloc.

A veteran leader of the party and also a senior member of the West Bengal Cabinet said that the party's supreme and Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee was of the opinion that further talks with the Congress were useless on two grounds.

"The first reason is that the Congress' demand for eight to ten seats in West Bengal is totally absurd considering that the vote share of the country's oldest national party has come down to just three per cent in the 2021 state Assembly polls. "Without a single member in the state Assembly and just



two MPs in the Lok Sabha, the demand for eight to ten seats is nothing but overreach," said a state Cabinet member.

He added, "It seems that the Congress leadership is more interested in a seat-sharing agreement with the CPI(M)-led Left Front rather than with the Trinamool Congress and hence the leadership of the state's ruling

party does not find the necessity of initiating any further discussions on seat sharing with the Congress."

Party insiders said that Mamata Banerjee was specially irked on receiving the information that the Congress along with the CPI(M) had taken an in-principle decision to back the lone All-India Secular Front

(AISF)- candidate Naushad Siddique in the forthcoming Lok Sabha polls from Diamond Harbour constituency in South 24 Parganas district from where the sitting MP is Trinamool Congress' General Secretary and the Chief Minister's nephew Abhishek Banerjee.

Recently Mamata Banerjee herself gave hints on this count as she said that while the Opposition INDIA bloc will continue in the national perspective, in West Bengal the Trinamool Congress will fight alone.

Soon after that State Congress President and veteran Lok Sabha member Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury challenged the Chief Minister to contest against him from Baharampur Lok Sabha constituency in Murshidabad district from where he is a five-time MP.

Satyapal Malik defends move to dissolve J&K Assembly in 2018

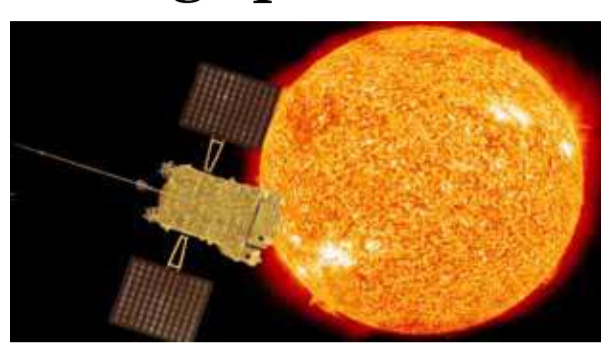

Bell weighing 2,400 kg on its way to Ram temple in Ayodhya

ETAH (UP): The Ram temple in Ayodhya will soon receive a massive bell, weighing 2,400 kg, made of 'ashtadhatu' (eight metals), from the Jalesar town in Etah district.

The bell has been manufactured at a cost for Rs 25 lakh and will be transported by train on Tuesday.

Manufactured by a diverse team of around 30 workers, the bell, made of eight metals - gold, silver, copper, zinc, lead, tin, iron, and mercury - is among the largest in the country.

Aditya Mittal, a metal businessman, said that his late brother, Vikas Mittal, former chairman of Jalesar Nagar Panchayat, wished to donate the bell to the temple but passed away in 2022 after a cardiac arrest. However, Aditya and another brother Prashant Mittal honoured his wish to donate the bell to the temple.

Aditya said that the bell, measuring six feet in height and five feet in width, will produce a sound audible within a 2 km radius.

Providing insights into the bell-making process, Prashant Mittal, highlighted its uniqueness, emphasising that it is crafted as a single piece, making the task more challenging.



The lengthy process included shaping and measuring meticulously, creating wooden templates for the mould, metal preparation, tuning, grinding, and fitting the clapper.

The Mittals had received the order for the bell from the Nirmohi Akhara, a litigant in the Ayodhya title dispute, immediately after the apex court's decision in November 2019.

Aditya said, "We believe there is some divine reason that this work came to us. So, we decided to donate it to the temple."

Jamaat-e-Islami Hind says "India becoming an illiberal democracy"

The Vice President of Jamaat-e-Islami Hind (JIH), Prof Salim Engineer has voiced concern over the situation in the country. Addressing the media at the monthly press conference at the JIH headquarters, the JIH Vice President said, "We are concerned about the steady slide of our country from a constitutional democracy to

an illiberal and majoritarian democracy. Numerous developments substantiate this concern. The recently concluded winter session of Parliament saw the suspension of almost the entire Opposition (46 MPs from the Rajya Sabha, and 100 MPs from the Lok Sabha) over frivolous charges. Without an Opposition, there was zero accountability on the floor of the house, and nobody to question the government's decisions and actions.



Consequently, the government was able to pass controversial new legislation like the criminal laws, the Telecommunications Act, and the appointment of the Election Commission of India. The new laws grant extraordinary powers to the executive and with the ruling party having a

brute majority in Parliament, our country appears to move towards the concentration of power in the executive or the hands of a single leader, diminishing the effectiveness of constitutional checks and balances. The narrative of hyper-nationalism and populism coupled with divisive rhetoric that targets religious minorities is leading to polarization and the steady deterioration of pluralism and tolerance in society.

NE sees sharp rise in narco smuggling, immigrant influx post Myanmar coup

NEWDELHI: Of India's 1,643 km unfenced porous borders with Myanmar, the frontiers with Mizoram (510 km) and Manipur (398 km) are most worrying as illegal influx of Myanmar, drug peddling and cross-border movement of inimical elements including militants is on the rise.

The complex and the rising danger of drug trades and cross-border movement of inimical elements as well as violence-hit civilians have

become more challenging for the Indian authorities especially after the 2021 February coup by the Myanmar military.

Considering the vulnerability of the 1,643 km unfenced India-Myanmar borders with Arunachal Pradesh (520 km), Manipur (398 km), Nagaland (215 km) and Mizoram (510 km), the Free Movement Regime (FMR), which allows citizen residing close to both sides of the border to move 16 km into each other's terri-



tory without passport or visa, is likely to be discontinued soon.

The FMR allows people to cross over after showing a border pass with one year validity.

Assam Rifles and Border Road Organisation (BRO) officials said that work of erection of border fencing along the Manipur border with Myanmar is now going on and there are plans to erect fencing on the entire India-Myanmar border within the next four

years.

"The erection of fencing is not only to stop the misuse of FMR, but also to prevent influx of illegal immigrants, drugs peddling and gold smuggling. The insurgent outfits also take the advantage of the FMR freely and undertake their movement on either side of the border to carry out attacks on the Indian side and flee towards Myanmar," a top Assam Rifles official told to media.

The Modi government is focused on developing a robust quality ecosystem to provide safe, reliable and superior-quality goods, and promoting exports of Indian products. Prior to May 2014, only 14 QCOs

covering 106 products had been issued. The list has now been expanded to 148 QCOs covering 653 products. These include household products like ACs, toys and footwear.

Quality Control on Exports

QCOs have accelerated the mission of 'Make in India for the World'. Many products under QCOs are being exported. Cast Iron products, solar DC cables, door fittings, ceiling fans, helmets, smart meters, hinges, air coolers and air filters are quality-controlled products that are exported much more than they are imported. Cast Iron products covered by QCOs had exports of \$535 million last year, while imports were barely \$68 million. About 25 QCOs are on products where exports exceed imports.

This clearly demonstrates that QCOs are focused on

building robust quality consciousness in India. This also helps reduce dumping poor-quality goods into the country. Access to the best quality goods is the right of every Indian citizen in our Amrit Kaal.

QCOs are also critical for the health and safety of people. Sub-standard products can be extremely hazardous for households because of risks such as fires due to cheap electronics, hospitalization of children because of toxic chemicals in toys and electrical short-circuits.

Shining Example

A shining example of how quality-control can dramatically upgrade manufacturing to help consumers and manufacturers is the toys industry. Prior to the implementation of this QCO, the Indian toy market was plagued by cheap, sub-standard products.

A survey by the Quality Council of India in 2019 showed that barely one-third of the toys adhered to the relevant BIS Standards, and most of them were hazardous for children. The government consults all stakeholders, including industry representatives to make sure their feedback, technical inputs and practical suggestions are considered before implementing QCOs. Special care is taken to make sure that the interest of micro and small units is protected by giving them longer transition period. The government is always ready to help industry become more competitive and support manufacturers who want to upgrade quality.

During the Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit's final day, Das highlighted the government's collaboration with state governments in this endeavour, emphasising that approximately 90 per cent of the country's MSMEs are currently micro units.

In a move toward inclusivity, Das revealed plans to work with nano enterprises, a smaller subset under micro-enterprises.

These nano enterprises will be included in priority sector lending, and the government will introduce additional schemes to support their growth.

Due to their low turnover, nano enterprises currently remain outside the purview of the goods and services tax



and various schemes, limiting their access to formal credit channels.

The Udhyan registration portal has witnessed the registration of about 2.1 crore such enterprises, he added.

Looking ahead, the MSME Secretary set a target to achieve 3 crore registrations on the Udhyan portal by the year-end, underscoring the need to enhance the quality and productivity of MSMEs across the nation.

"MSMEs will have an important role to play for VIKsit Bharat," he further said, noting that presently contributing one-third of the country's GDP and approximately 50 per cent of exports, MSMEs employ about 16 crore individuals.

To achieve the goal of a developed economy by 2047, Das stressed the necessity for the MSME sector's contribution to further increase.

India's growth, spending, and the road ahead

The latest advance estimates of India's national income for the current fiscal year paint a picture of an economy buoyed by government spending, seemingly on steroids. The National Statistical Office (NSO) projects a marginal uptick in real GDP growth to 7.3%, a slender advance from the previous year's 7.2%. However, a closer examination of the sectoral output and expenditure numbers reveals an economy still in search of sustainable, consumption-led growth drivers. The Gross Value Added (GVA) growth, a key measure of economic output, is anticipated to decelerate to 6.9%, down from the last fiscal year's 7%. This slowing is particularly evident in the agriculture, livestock, forestry, and fishing sector — the cornerstone of rural India. This sector is projected to see a growth of just 1.8%, the slowest in eight years and significantly lower than the 4% pace of 2022-23. This subdued performance, potentially exacerbated by the shortfall in kharif output and lagging rabi sowing, particularly in paddy and pulses, casts a shadow on the rural economy, a major employment provider and a significant contributor outside the services sector. On the demand side, private final consumption expenditure, a dominant GDP component, is set to record its slowest expansion in over two decades at 4.4%. This slowdown reflects the rural economy's struggles, impacted by monsoon irregularities and weak farm output, dampening demand for a myriad of consumer goods. The silver lining remains Gross Fixed Capital Formation (GFCF), including government capital spending, which is pegged to grow by 10.3%, reaching a record 34.9% share of GDP. This shines as the primary growth driver in an otherwise subdued economic landscape. As India approaches a general election, policymakers face a daunting dilemma: continue robust spending to sustain growth, risking fiscal imbalance, or tighten fiscal policy, potentially losing further economic momentum. The path India chooses will significantly influence not just its immediate economic future but also its long-term growth trajectory.

VALERIAN RODRIGUES FINDS OUT WHY THE PARLIAMENT'S DECLINE AS OPPOSITION'S VOICE, DESPITE CITIZEN ENDORSEMENT, IS TROUBLING

The Indian Parliament, a promise spurned

The relative distance from the din and dust that the lamentable turn Indian Parliament took in December 2023, gives us a vantage point to review the state of this foundational institution of public life of the most populous country in the world today. It was one of the gravest security lapses the House has witnessed in its history when two young men with gas canisters jumped on to the floor of the Lok Sabha from its gallery and spread pandemonium there for reasons little known so far.

The incident led to a stand-off between the Opposition and ruling party, eventually leading to the suspension of 146 members of both Houses of Parliament, from different Opposition parties. Much of the discussion on both these unprecedented events has hitherto focused on procedural and regulatory concerns. While they are important, it is also necessary to see the bearing of these events on the conception of a parliamentary government for India.

Having a parliamentary government

In historical hindsight, it may be worth noting that while progressive expansion of representation under the colonial aegis exposed a section of Indians to legislative processes, and some of them came under the spell of the Westminster system, the choice of the parliamentary form of government was the outcome of a closely deliberated process. There was much contestation within the Constituent Assembly, as well as outside it, regarding the form of government best suited for India: There were at least four stances around which the debate raged: presidential, Indian orthodoxy, Swarajist, and parliamentary.

Those who argued for the presidential system adduced reasons of stability, unity of the nation, primacy of centralisation, and drew heavily from the American model. Some of its apologists were also tilted towards religious and social majoritarianism. Those who argued for Indian orthodoxy pointed out that one of the cardinal beliefs of Indian anti-colonial movement was to establish a regime founded on Indian classical and



as they can effectively rally in the choice of the representatives. Both these arguments implied that India's representative model encompassed great doctrinal, ethnic, and cultural pluralisms. Some of them may coalesce into a common fold overtime, but others may not, and new ones may sprout forth under conditions of freedom. Those who defended the parliamentary model on this ground also pointed out it was the authentic representative of the true spirit of India.

Pangs of creating an opposition

From the nature of the parliamentary system, it is obvious that such a regime can endure and be effective only if it has stable support, but it has to be questioned and challenged to ensure that it remains faithful to the common good. It is a paradoxical demand: a majority that is elected regards that it has found endorsement from the citizen community, but the reason of the system says such endorsement must be constantly and critically validated by keeping the common good in view. Although the term, political party, did not find a mention in the Indian Constitution till the enactment of the Tenth Schedule, the dialectics of stable support and effective opposition could be institutionally operated only through a competitive party system.

Given the commandeering position the Congress party enjoyed in the First Lok Sabha, Jawaharlal Nehru was sensitive to the absence of an effective opposition, although when such an opposition took shape in the Parliament, he was not very comfortable with it. It is also important to point out that once the Opposition found its effective voice within the House, those radical voices which initially claimed that they took the route of franchise to wreck Parliament from within, were largely absorbed within it. Given the paradoxical challenge that a parliamentary system throws up, the ruling party at the Centre as well as in States, has not found it easy to face a sustained Opposition and employed all subterfuges to limit its space,

but the logic of the system has constrained it to live with it.

The present state

Given the centrality of Parliament to India's chosen public life, its security breach is a breach inflicted on the nation as a whole. The demand of the Opposition to make this issue central in Parliament is, therefore, understandable. In this context, it was the duty of the leadership of both Houses to ensure necessary assurances and explain the lapses. It did not seem that the present leadership exerted itself in that direction.

On the contrary, they converted the insistent demand of the Opposition, however excessive it might have been, as an affront to the working of the Parliament. There are a range of parliamentary committees. The presiding officers could have taken the Opposition into confidence to form a committee on security, at the least. Was the leadership of the Houses kowtowing to the executive at the expense of their dignity?

Madhu Dandavate mentions an incident when Jawaharlal Nehru sent a note to Speaker Mavalankar which read, 'Sir, I have some urgent work with you. Will you come to my chamber?' Mavalankar wrote on the same note, 'According to the accepted conventions of parliamentary life, a Speaker does not go to the chamber of any executive, including that of the Prime Minister. However, if you have any work, you are welcome to my chamber.' Nehru apologised and obliged.

While the Opposition in the present Parliament is not a paragon of parliamentary virtue, it is the responsibility of the leadership of the House, including its presiding officers, that it becomes the voice of the nation. The suspension of almost the entire Opposition from both the Houses, can hardly meet this test. It is also important to restate the principle that it is not the truth that a ruling dispensation upholds that serves its claim to rule but its ability to defend the course that it pursues as the truth.

An expanding Gaza war, with no endgame in sight

With the Gaza war having reached its three-month mark, it has spread dangerously to Lebanon, Iraq, Yemen and even Iran. On January 2, an Israeli drone strike on a Hamas office in Beirut, killed Saleh al-Arouri, the deputy head of the Hamas leadership located abroad. The next day, two explosions in Kerman, at the mausoleum of General Qassem Soleimani, former head of the Al Quds Force, killed 95 people who had gathered at the shrine to mourn on the fourth anniversary of his assassination. Though the Islamic State has claimed responsibility, many Iranians suspect it to be Israeli's hand.

And, on January 4, the United States announced the targeted killing of the head of an Iran-affiliated militia in Baghdad that has been attacking American targets since the beginning of the Gaza war. These attacks have occurred amidst the ongoing skirmishes in the Red Sea's waters over the last several weeks, with the Houthis targeting commercial shipping with drones and missiles and inviting strong U.S. retaliation. The Houthis have demanded that humanitarian assistance be provided urgently to the beleaguered Palestinians in Gaza.

These attacks have escalated tensions in the already volatile region that is reeling from the death and destruction wreaked by Israel in Gaza since early October. Over the last three months, over 22,000 Palestinians have been killed, most of them women and children, while nearly two million have been displaced, the largest displacement of Palestinians in history. An extraordinary humanitarian catastrophe faces the two-million strong Palestinian community in Gaza.



Netanyahu could pursue escalation

Israeli troops have also expanded their military operations to the West Bank: nearly 300 Palestinians have been killed, several thousand taken into detention, and numerous homes destroyed. Israeli cabinet Ministers have complemented the violence of their soldiers by calling for the cleansing of Gaza of Palestinians and the resettlement of the enclave with Jewish settlers.

The major concern at present is that a desperate Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu might pursue the escalation trajectory as, despite the mass killings in Gaza, Israel has very little to show for its efforts: though committed to the destruction of the Hamas war machine and of the movement itself, no prominent Hamas leader has been apprehended in Gaza, while Hamas continues to inflict damage on Israeli soldiers in the ground fighting. A few thousand women and children have been detained by Israeli security to reveal the location of Hamas leaders, with no apparent success so far.

There are concerns that al-Arouri's

killing was carried out to proclaim some success in the war on Hamas. Saleh al-Arouri, by all accounts, was a soft target. Though he has been a prominent presence in the Hamas leadership, in recent years he had been located in Beirut and was principally liaising with Hezbollah and Iran. Most reports suggest that he had no involvement with the planning or execution of the October 7, 2023 attacks.

Peace is distant

Targeted killings serve no useful purpose: while the deceased leaders are quickly replaced, the assassinations increase mutual hostility and escalate tensions. The worrying possibility is that Mr. Netanyahu might not be averse to a regional conflagration: following the political and military failures that facilitated Hamas's October 7 attacks and with no military success to speak of so far, now, with the Supreme Court rejecting his judicial reforms proposals, the Prime Minister faces the imminent prospect of resignation, arrest and imprisonment. Could a desperate Netanyahu not wish to seize this opportunity to obliterate all Palestinian resistance, eliminate Hezbollah as a fighting force, and debilitate Iran as a threat?

The reason why this prospect is even being raised is because, through the three-month war in Gaza, no major player has exhibited a vision or a strategy regarding the endgame and the "day after" the cessation of hostilities. Beyond bellicose claims relating to the extermination of Hamas and ethnic cleansing of the occupied territories, Israel has shown no clarity about its war aims or the management of Gaza after the war. Certainly, there is no mention of a longer-term peace process. Thus, mass

killings in Gaza and provocative targeted assassinations in the neighbourhood have become ends in themselves.

A role for Saudi Arabia

The U.S. has been in search of a policy from day one. Beyond its total political and military support for Israel, the Biden administration has shed crocodile tears over humanitarian concerns, but achieved nothing on the ground. The region's already discredited hegemon appears incapable of insisting on a peace process — obviously, the clout of Israel's right-wing supporters in Washington have paralysed the government and lulled it into somnolence.

The Arab states have exhibited neither voice nor leadership so far: beyond pointless conferences and resolutions, there is no sign of a consensual and forceful approach to the broader Palestine issue or even concerns about regional security.

The principal responsibility for ushering in peace now rests on Saudi Arabia. It alone has the regional and global standing to insist that its views be deferred to. Having shrugged off its subordination to U.S. diktat, it has been confidently pursuing an independent foreign policy that resonates positively with the world's leading powers. Palestinian interests and regional peace require robust and pro-active Saudi initiatives, which have been missing so far.

This is the time when West Asian rulers and their people should be on the same side to serve the region's interests. Failing that, they will be swept away in the tidal wave of regional conflict they have done nothing to prevent.

Amitava Kumar's 'The Yellow Book': A mosaic of text, visuals

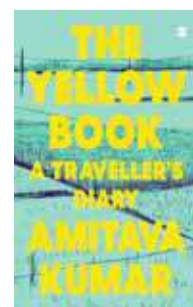
Amitava Kumar's latest offering, "The Yellow Book: A Traveller's Diary," is an audacious exploration of hybrid literary forms, following the path of its predecessor "The Blue Book." Published by HarperCollins India, this work stands as a testament to the potential of experimental literature in our contemporary cultural landscape. Kumar's proclamation, "I want to proclaim my allegiance to the nation of hybrids!" resonates throughout the pages, encapsulating the essence of his work. "The Yellow Book," like "The Blue Book," is a fascinating amalgamation of text and visuals. It

encompasses diary entries, letters, essays, drawings, paintings, and photographs, all blending to create a multifaceted reading experience. The hybridity of the content results in a journey that is as unpredictable as it is engaging. Readers may find themselves oscillating between awe and skepticism, as the book evokes reactions as varied as jaw-dropping admiration and eye-rolling dismissal.

The central part of the book, dominated by a diaristic mode, serves a dual purpose: documenting Kumar's everyday life and offering insights into the creative process, particularly for writers.

It's as much about the man behind the public persona as it is about the author's journey as his daughter

Kumar, an English professor at Vassar College, shares his experiences teaching American students in London, presenting exercises aimed at unlocking their creative potential. The narrative here is intimate and insightful, yet it occasionally borders on the presumptuous, with Kumar's world of illustrious

friends and intellectual prowess potentially alienating to the casual reader.

One of the book's most engaging aspects is its visual component. Drawings and photographs punctuate the text, sometimes expanding to fill entire pages, adding depth to the narrative. However, there are moments when the written word feels insufficient, leaving the reader craving more substance. For instance, Kumar's mention

of a conversation about his work's dialogue with Arundhati Roy's is intriguing but frustratingly brief, leading one to question the purpose of such diaristic ellipses.

The book hits its stride as Kumar's London class concludes and ventures into more essayistic territory. In "Enemy of the People," a compelling essay about Salman Rushdie and his assailant Hadi Matar, the absence of images creates a space where Kumar's prose is at its most gripping. Yet, it is in the essay "Host Country/Lost Country" that Kumar's hybrid approach truly shines. Here, he writes poignantly about his visits to his ailing father in Patna and their village Jadopur. The interplay of text and images in this section elevates the emotional impact, creating a deeply moving narrative.

SBI Report Rejects Notions of K-Shaped Recovery, Terms Indicators as Biased

NEW DELHI: The current discussion on the potential K-shaped recovery of the national economy after the pandemic appears to be flawed and biased, according to a State Bank of India (SBI) study.

The study, conducted by the Economic Research Department of SBI, emphasises that the ongoing debate seems to favour specific interests that are disapproving of India's remarkable progress. As per the report, relying on outdated indicators such as low two-wheeler sales or fragmented land holdings to portray a negative image of India's performance is questionable. Patterns observed in income, savings, consumption, expenditure, and policies, as highlighted by the report, cast doubt on the credibility of these age-old representations.

«The oft-repeated conundrum debating a K-shaped re-



covery post-pandemic seems at best flawed, prejudiced, ill-considered and fanning interests of select quarters to whom India's remarkable ascendance, signalling more the renaissance of the new global south, is quite unpalatable,» said the SBI report. In the context of a K-shaped recovery, where some sectors of the economy rebound while others face challenges, the SBI report questions the efficacy of using traditional indicators that may not accurately reflect India's overall economic well-being.

The release of the SBI report coincides with the initial advance estimate report from the National Statistical Office (NSO), projecting India's economy to grow at 7.3 per cent in the current financial year.

The SBI report counters the prevalent narrative by highlighting positive indicators such as income-tax data, increasing female labour force participation, and the growing popularity of food-ordering platforms, painting a favourable picture of India's economic health.

Finance Ministry Official Rules Out Tax Rebate Hike in Upcoming Interim Budget

NEW DELHI: A senior official from the finance ministry, on Tuesday, stated that it is unlikely to see a tax rebate increase under the new direct tax regime in the upcoming interim Union Budget.

"There is no such proposal," stated the official to Moneycontrol. There were widespread speculations that the personal income tax rebate might see an increase from the current Rs 7 lakh to Rs 7.5 lakh in the upcoming vote-on-account.

A vote-on-account allows a government nearing the end of its term to secure funds for its expenditures temporarily until a comprehensive budget is approved.

The budget scheduled for presentation on February 1 will be a vote-on-account, considering the general elections set for April-May 2024.

However, it is likely that the



government will declare an exemption from tax collected at source (TCS) for individual overseas credit and debit card spending, up to Rs 7 lakh per financial year, in the interim budget.

The Union Budget 2023 raised the income-tax rebate threshold for individuals choosing the new direct tax regime from Rs 5 lakh to Rs 7 lakh.

"Growth in direct taxes will surpass the GDP growth rate. A

realistic target of 10.5 per cent growth in direct taxes for 2024-25 is expected.

Buoyancy is likely to remain above one next year," a senior government official said, as reported by Moneycontrol earlier. Buoyancy reflects the relative growth in tax revenues corresponding to an increase in national income.

The projected net direct tax collection for the ongoing fiscal year is set at Rs 18.2 lakh crore.

Adani Group to invest Rs 42,768 cr in Tamil Nadu



The multi-business Adani Group has decided to invest a whopping Rs 42,768 crore in Tamil Nadu in renewable energy, cement manufacturing, data centre, city gas distribution and generate 10,300 employment opportunities.

The Group announced this decision during the Tamil Nadu Global Investors Meet 2024 held on Monday.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was also exchanged at the investors' meeting by Karan Adani, Chief Executive Officer of Adani Ports and SEZ Limited (APSEZ) and the Tamil Nadu government.

The break-up of the investments by different Adani group companies are as follows: Adani Green Rs 24,500 crore (employment 4,000), Ambuja Cements Rs 3,500 crore (5,000), Adani Connex Rs 13,200 crore (1,000) and Adani Total Gas & CNG Rs 1,568 crore (300).

Steady rise in SIP flows in mutual funds

MUMBAI: The latest AMFI Data for December 2023 paints a positive picture of India's mutual fund industry, especially in equities.

The significant rise in equity mutual fund inflows to Rs 17,000 crore, up by 9 per cent, shows that investors strongly believe in the potential of the stock market, said Robin Arya, smallcase manager & founder, GoalFi. A notable highlight is the steady increase in monthly



Systematic Investment Plan (SIP) flows, growing by an impressive almost 24 per cent Year-on-Year.

At the same time, SIP Assets under Management (AuM) have jumped by nearly 37 per cent

Year-on-Year, Arya said.

Viraj Gandhi, CEO, SAMCO Mutual Fund said owing to commendable performances, evidenced by a notable 6 per cent rise in Nifty Small-Cap 250 and an almost 7 per cent rise in Nifty Midcap 150 during the month, Mid and Small Cap funds continued to attract significant net inflows, aggregating to Rs 5,250 crore, a staggering growth of 25 per cent on YoY basis. This constituted nearly

one-third of the total net equity-oriented inflow for the month.

In parallel, sectoral/thematic funds emerged as front-runners in garnering the highest net inflows, amounting to Rs 6,005 crore, compared to Rs 1,965 crore in Nov 2023.

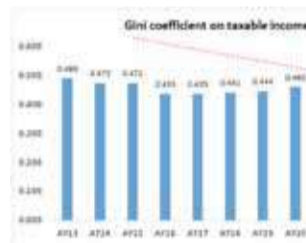
Overall, we saw Rs 16,997 crore garnered by equity linked schemes for the month of December 2023, while SIP book for month stands at Rs 17,610 crore, Gandhi said.

Income inequality shrinks, Mobility on the Rise: SBI Research Report

A new study by SBI Research has revealed that income inequality has declined in recent years, supporting the trend of upward migration through increased income and the ascent of the Indian middle class.

The report quoting CBDT data, states that the Income Tax base is widening by the year and the number of persons filing Income Tax Return increased to 74 million in Assessment Year 2022-23 from 70 million in AY 2021-22. For the Assessment Year 2023-24, a total of 82 million Income Tax Returns have been filed till 31 December 2023. The SBI report further observes that ITRs filed by individual taxpayers earning between Rs 5 lakh and Rs 10 lakh climbed by 295% in the assessment years (AY) 2013-14 and 2021-22, showing a positive trend of migration to higher



range of gross total income. The number of ITRs filed by people earning between Rs 10 lakh and Rs 25 lakh has also increased by nearly 3 times (291%) during the same period.

Gini Coefficient is one of the most widely used measures of income inequality. The Gini Coefficient score lies between 0 and 1, where complete equality would result in a Gini Coefficient of zero and complete inequality would result in 1. Using this measure, SBI Research has calculated that Gini Coefficient has declined from 0.472 during Assessment Year 2014-15 to

0.402 for AY 2022-23.

Meanwhile, the share of Top 2.5% tax payers with income more than Rs 10 crores has declined from 2.81% in 2013-14 to 2.28% in 2020-21. The share of Top 1% tax payers with income more than Rs 100 crores has fallen from 1.64% to 0.77% during the similar period.

"The decline in income inequality is because of a great migration at the bottom of the pyramid; 36.3 per cent of individual ITR filers belonging to the lowest income in FY14 have left the lowest income bracket and shifted upwards resulting

in 21.1 per cent more income for such individuals during FY14-FY21," said the report.

SBI Research Report also highlighted rising female labour force participation, visible highlights in income levels of MSMEs and changing consumption pattern post Covid pandemic like people substituting two-wheelers with four wheelers and increased sale of tractors to underline India's robust economic recovery and bust the myth of the oft repeated 'K' shaped growth, where some select sectors perform well while others keep declining.

Crypto Fraud, a Global Concern

Earlier people were becoming victims of fraud during digital transactions and now fraudsters are cheating people by luring them to tripled and quadruple the money through crypto. Most of the people who become victims of crypto fraud are educated, which include doctors, engineers, administrative officers, politicians etc.

There is an international network of crypto fraudsters, which is being operated from India. However, most of the leaders of such networks are living in Chinese cities or Dubai and carrying out fraud incidents. Telegram or WhatsApp groups are also being used for fraud. Often such groups are deleted after committing fraud. One of the main reasons, why Chinese people are getting involved in crypto fraud is the significant decline in workers' wages in China in 2023 compared to 2016 and increasing unemployment. The unemployment rate in China was 13.9 per cent in 2019, which increased to 16.8 per cent in July 2020. Further, it will increase to 19.9 per cent in 2022 and 21.3 per cent in 2023.

To defraud by crypto, fraudsters first open investors' accounts on an app or portal. The small amount invested by investors initially is doubled or tripled. After winning trust, investors are asked to deposit large amounts. As

soon as investors deposit a large amount in the wallet, it is immediately transferred to another account or put on hold. Generally, fraudsters send the defrauded amount abroad. Such people also indulge in money laundering (AML) and counter financing of terrorism (CFT). The Finance Ministry has given notice to many guilty crypto exchanges in the matter. The government is also working towards blocking the URLs being used for fraud.

According to global blockchain platform Chain Analysis, India has become the second largest market in terms of Crypto Currency transactions after the US, leaving behind the UK, Turkey, and Russia. Crypto Currency exchanges like Coin DCX, Coin Switch, Wazir X, Buy-U-coin, Zeb pay, Giotas, Unocoin etc. are operating in India. Crypto exchanges work like stock exchanges, helping investors buy and sell Crypto Currencies.

Registration is necessary for crypto exchanges to operate in India, but only 31 crypto exchanges have registered with

the Financial Intelligence Unit (FIU). Many crypto exchanges are doing their business illegally in India without registration.

According to a report by crypto currency exchange Coin DCX, about 60 per cent of Crypto Currency investors reside in 10 cities of the country. The 5 cities with the highest investment in crypto in India are Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Lucknow, and Patna, where 12, 10, 8, 5 and 5 percent of crypto investors live, respectively. It is noteworthy that Patna and Lucknow have emerged as leading cities among Tier 2 cities investing in crypto.

Indian women are also not behind in investing in crypto. According to a report by Coin DCX, there is a ratio of 7 men for every 1 female investor. The top 5 cities with the highest number of women investors in India are Delhi, Lucknow, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad, and Chennai, respectively. Thirty five percent of female crypto users live in Tier 1 cities. Delhi has the highest number of women investors. It is noteworthy that despite the provision of 30 per cent income

tax on profits, India's investment volume in crypto during July 2022 to June 2023 has been recorded at about \$ 269 billion.

However, now in India, crimes like Cyber Crime, digital fraud, counter financing of terrorism and money laundering are also being carried out through crypto. The increasing popularity of crypto currency has promoted its use in purchasing illegal activities. Today Crypto Currency is being used on a large scale in black marketing.

Crypto Currency is a type of digital currency, which is not available in physical form. It cannot be minted in any mint; hence, its transactions are not legal like other currencies. The regulator has no control on this. Most of its users transact anonymously.

Blockchain technology is used for Crypto Currency. Encryption is used in Crypto Currency, using which there is very little possibility of fraud through the crypto system. Crypto Currencies are present in the world in the form of Bitcoin, Cardano, Ethereum, Ripple, Litecoin, Dash, Dogecoin etc.

Bitcoin is the most popular of these virtual currencies. Crypto Currency was first used on January 3, 2009, but its popularity started increasing in the year 2012. Today, the value of Crypto Currencies is increasing rapidly compared to other currencies like Euro, US Dollar, Pound, etc.

At the speed at which digitalization is taking place across the world, the spread of Crypto Currency cannot be stopped.

However, globally there are many countries like India, where most people are unaware of the concept of Crypto Currency. Nevertheless, the acceptance of Crypto Currencies is expected to increase in the coming years. The possibility of regulatory scrutiny has increased as the Crypto Currency market continues to expand.

In the changed environment, governments around the world are looking for ways to regulate Crypto Currencies, some of which have created new rules and regulations. The law can bring stability to the Crypto Currency market and help pave the way for its legalization. Appropriate legislation may also reduce compliance costs.

Today, along with digitalization, cases of crypto fraud are increasing and in very few cases the defrauded amount is being recovered. Illiterate people easily become victims of online fraud, but the matter of concern is that the number of educated people is more among those cheated through crypto. Today, on the lines of Jamtara, incidents of fraud through crypto are being carried out across the country.

To stop crypto fraud, there is a need to run a financial literacy campaign like a campaign for 365 days across the country. The easiest way to avoid an accident is to be careful. However, one can save oneself from being cheated by giving up greed.

India-ASEAN to review Modernising Trade Pact in Feb

NEW DELHI: India and the ten-member Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) will start negotiations in February to "modernise" their decade-and-a-half-old free trade agreement (FTA), reported BusinessLine.

The negotiation sets to bring in more balance in the pact currently weighed against New Delhi. India seeks to narrow the trade deficit, currently standing at USD 43.57 billion, by revamping the ASEAN India Trade in Goods Agreement (AITGA) by 2025.

But new areas such as labour, environment, SMEs and gender are likely to be kept out, sources have said, reported BusinessLine.

"There will be a complete re-look at the entire FTA with the broad objective of bringing down the trade deficit for India.



We want to modernise the FTA as a lot has evolved since it was signed almost 15 years back. New elements such as product specific rules and trade remedies will be brought in to make the FTA more efficient," the source told BusinessLine.

The first round of negotia-

tions for reviewing the FTA, officially known as the ASEAN India Trade in Goods Agreement (AITGA), will be on February 18-19 in New Delhi, the source said.

The negotiations will follow a quarterly schedule to wrap up the exercise by 2025.

Donald Trump's civil fraud trial concludes after bomb threat to presiding judge

NEW YORK: Former US President Donald Trump's civil fraud trial in New York has concluded after a bomb threat was made to the presiding judge of the hearing.

Police in the Nassau County responded to a bomb threat to the home of Manhattan Supreme Court Judge Arthur Engoron on Long Island on Thursday reports Xinhua news agency. On the heels of swatting calls targeting the homes of Department of Justice Special Counsel Jack Smith and judge Tanya Chutkan, who presides over a criminal case against Trump, the latest incident didn't interrupt the trial proceeding on Thursday.

Trump was allowed to speak in a courtroom for about five



minutes before the conclusion of closing arguments from his side at 1 p.m. in the civil fraud case that strikes at the heart of the Trump Organization.

On Wednesday however, the judge blocked the former President from making his own closing argument. Calling himself "an innocent

man", Trump said on Thursday the trial was a political witch hunt and he should be compensated for reputation damage rather than to be fined. The former President also claimed that Engoron had his own agenda and accused New York Attorney General Letitia James of hating him and us-

ing him to get elected. Kevin Wallace, a senior enforcement counsel from New York Attorney General's Office, said the defendants have not been able to dispute any of the facts that Trump submitted false financial statements. Trump's statements of financial condition were false every year from 2011 to 2021 with discrepancies as much as \$2.2 billion, according to Wallace. New York State prosecutors are seeking nearly \$370 million of penalty in the case and a lifetime ban on Trump from the real-estate industry in New York State.

The trial began on October 2, 2023 and the judge is expected to issue his verdict in the case in the coming weeks.

US Surgeon General Vivek Murthy renamed country representative on WHO board



WASHINGTON: World Health Organization (WHO) by President Joe Biden. The 46-year-old's nomination was re-sent as his confirmation to the position had been pending in the Senate since October 2022.

He will serve in his new position alongside his continued duties as the country's Surgeon General, the White House said in a statement on Monday.

In March 2021, he was confirmed by the US Senate to serve as the 21st Surgeon General of the US and had previously served on the same post under then President Barack Obama.

As the Nation's Doctor, the Surgeon General's mission is to help lay the foundation for a healthier country, relying on the best scientific information available to provide clear, consistent, and equitable guidance and resources for the public, the White House noted.

The first Surgeon General of Indian descent, Murthy is focused on drawing attention to and working across governments to address a number of critical public health issues. This includes the growing proliferation of health misinformation, the ongoing youth mental health crisis, well-being and burnout in the health worker community, and social isolation and loneliness.

As the Vice Admiral of the US Public Health Service Commissioned Corps, Murthy also commands a uniformed service of over 6,000 dedicated public health officers, serving the most underserved and vulnerable populations. Born to immigrant parents from Karnataka, Murthy was raised in Miami and is a graduate of Harvard, the Yale School of Medicine, and the Yale School of Management.

Before entering government service, Murthy co-founded VISIONS, a global HIV/AIDS education organisation, and the Swasthya Project -- a rural health partnership that trained women in South India to become community health workers and educators.

UK Post Office scandal: Indian-origin postmaster says Kate Middleton stood by him

LONDON: An elderly former postmaster of Indian-origin has revealed that Princess Kate and the Middleton family stood by him when he was accused of stealing 16,000 pounds in the Post Office accounting scandal.

Hasmukh Shingadia, 63, served the Middleton family at the Spar (convenience store) and Post Office in Upper Bucklebury, Berkshire, where Kate and her sister Pippa grew up.

He got suspended in 2010 over a scandal in which hundreds of post office managers across the UK were wrongly accused of theft and fraud because of a software glitch.

According to The Sun, Shingadia would serve sweets to the princess, her sister and even Prince William during the early years of the royal romance.

A grandfather now, Shingadia said Princess Kate, who celebrated her 42nd birthday on January 9, and her family continued to frequent his Spar and Post Office even after his conviction. "Not everybody did that, and some locals shunned me," he said, talking about the hard times. He was even invited to the Royal wedding in 2011 along with his wife, Chandrika. "It meant so much to us. It was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity which they gave me despite the charges," he told The Sun.

"For them to have done that for us, it was tremendous. I've known them more than 25 years, and they have always been such kind and welcoming people," he said.

PM Modi meets Jose Ramos-Horta, Timor-Leste President a day before VGSS

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Horta met in Gandhinagar. PM extended a warm welcome to President Horta and his delegation to the Vibrant Gujarat Summit on what is the first ever Head of State or Government level visit between the two countries. Prime Minister re-affirmed India's commitment to build a vibrant "Delhi-Dili" connect. In September 2023, he had announced the opening of the Indian Mission in the country. He offered assistance to Timor-Leste in capacity building, human resource development, IT, fintech, energy and healthcare including tradi-



tional medicine and pharma. He also invited Timor-Leste to join the International Solar Alliance (ISA) and the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI).

He congratulated President Horta for ASEAN's in-principle decision to admit Timor-Leste as its 11th member and

expressed hope for its attainment of full membership soon.

President Horta thanked the Prime Minister for the invitation to participate in the Summit. He sought support from India in meeting its development priorities, particularly in the areas of healthcare and capacity building in IT. The two leaders also

discussed regional issues and developments in the Indo-Pacific.

President Horta expressed strong support for India's permanent membership of the UN Security Council. The leaders committed to continue their excellent cooperation in the multilateral arena. Prime Minister appreciated Timor-Leste's active participation in the two editions of the Voice of Global South Summit. They agreed that countries of the Global South should synergize their position on global issues. The bilateral relationship between India and Timor-Leste is anchored in shared values of democracy & plurality. India was one of the first countries to establish diplomatic ties with Timor-Leste in 2002.

Air-raid alerts across Ukraine over Russian missile launches

Air-raid alerts were sounded across Ukraine on December 8, with the country's Air Force confirming missile launches from Russian Tu-95MS strategic bombers and MiG-31K fighters.

The alerts were sounded at about 6 a.m., and it lasted for over two hours, the Ukrainska Pravda newspaper reported.

"Enemy Su-35/Su-34 activity in the north. The threat of use of aircraft missile weapons," the Ukrainian Air Force said in a social media post.

It went on to say that there



was "missile danger" in the areas where alerts had been

sounded.

"There is a threat of cruise missile launches from Tu-95MS aircraft. A total of 11 Tu-95MS strategic bombers are in the air. Do not ignore the

air-raid warning! Take shelter." After more than two hours

later, an all clear was given at 8.24 a.m., the Ukrainska Pravda added.

Last week, 25 people were killed and more than 100 injured in one of the deadliest attacks on Russia since it invaded Ukraine in February 2022.

The attack followed a recent huge wave of Russian strikes on Ukraine, which killed dozens and injured over 160.

Those strikes were described by Kiev as Russia's biggest missile bombardment of the war so far.

Wrong to infer I didn't back Rwanda plan as UK Chancellor: Sunak

Ruling out that he had doubts on the Rwanda plan as Chancellor, UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak has said it was his job to ensure value for money on every proposal while he was in the Treasury.

According to The Evening Standard, Sunak said it was "wrong" to infer that he did not back the scheme to stop channel crossing, following a BBC report, which said he was not convinced of the plan's effectiveness. Citing No 10 papers from March 22, the BBC said last week that Sunak was also concerned about the cost of sending asylum seekers to Africa and wanted to limit the numbers.

Sunak said he has not seen the documents the report was based on as he appeared on the BBC on Sunday. However, he did not rule out having voiced concerns about the cost of sending asylum seekers to the east African country when at the Treasury. "My job (was) to ask probing questions of every proposal that crossed my desk as chancellor," the Conservative Party leader told the BBC.

"You should always ask probing questions, you should always approach things from a position of scepticism to ensure that you get value for money for taxpayers." But to infer from that that I don't believe in the scheme or the principle of deterrence is



wrong. I was doing my job to get good value for money for taxpayers," the Prime Minister added. The documents had said that as Chancellor, Sunak felt "hotels are cheaper" than reception centres to house migrants, and was reluctant to fund "Greek-style reception centres" at a cost of 3.5 million pounds per day. The Rwanda plan, launched in April 2022 by then Prime Minister Boris Johnson, became the core of Sunak's policy to stop the boats -- one of five key priorities, which he set out to achieve when he became the premier in October the same year.

Calling the British Government to publish the No 10 papers, Labour MP Yvette Cooper said: "It is time the Tory Government was honest with the public, and publish both the papers outlining Rishi Sunak's concerns and the full details of the cost of the scheme."

Rajnath calls on Sunak during UK visit, discuss enhancing defence ties

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh called on British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak at 10 Downing Street, London, said officials on Thursday, adding that both discussed enhancing defence ties between the two countries.

The meeting took place on Wednesday during which Singh recalled the recent enhancement in bilateral defence engagement, spanning joint exercises, training, capability building, increased interoperability and military-to-military ties especially in the maritime domain.

Sunak fully agreed with Rajnath Singh on the need for UK and India to work in the domains of trade, defence and technology. In particular, he expressed hope that the ongoing Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations could be brought to a successful conclusion soon. He was keen to bolster defence and security pillar of India-UK ties, officials said.

Sunak also underlined his keenness, and that of his government, to strengthen the defence and security pillar of the bilateral relationship, including through government backing for stronger business and technology partnerships with Indian counterpart entities, a Ministry of Defence (MoD) official added. The Ministry of Defence said that Singh emphasised the ongoing efforts to enhance defence industrial cooperation, including in the technology domain.

The meeting was warm and cordial, said the official, adding that the Defence Minister highlighted that both nations have made significant strides in moulding and recrafting the historic ties into a mod-



ern, multifaceted and mutually beneficial partnership, under the direction of the leaders of both the countries.

According to the MoD, Rajnath Singh briefed Sunak about his positive interactions with the UK defence industry and the new positive energy in the bilateral defence relationship.

The Defence Minister stated that the UK and other like-minded countries should work with India for strengthening a peaceful and stable global rules-based order, including through partnering India in its inexorable rise, which can be strengthened, reinforced and speeded up with friendly collaboration.

Rajnath Singh further stated that at the international level, the Government of India is ready to partner with friends like the UK to strengthen the rule-based world order.

Singh gifted a Ram Darbar statue to the UK PM during the meeting, which was also attended by UK National Security Adviser (NSA) Sir Tim Barrow.

Singh also met with the UK's Foreign Minister Lord David Cameron at the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development

Office. The Ministers appreciated the new momentum and direction of the India-UK partnership, symbolised by intense engagements at various levels, the official said.

The India Defence Minister outlined his goal of integrating defence industries of both countries, including through supply chain integration to build resilience. He also emphasised the importance of bilateral startup level interaction, and identification and discussion of joint projects which India and UK could implement together.

Foreign Secretary Cameron reiterated the UK government's desire to collaborate with India in the defence areas, particularly in the field of defence industrial collaboration, as one of the means by which the UK hopes to strengthen the support for a rule-based international order, official added.

Later, Singh interacted with the Indian community at India House, London. Over 160 prominent persons of Indian origin attended the interaction. A number of Indian military ex-servicemen, including few family members of World War II veterans, were also present.

United Airlines finds loose hardware on number of Boeing 737 Max 9s



Chicago-based United Airlines said that it found loose hardware, including bolts in need of "additional tightening", on a number of their Boeing 737 Max 9 fleet during inspections.

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA)-mandated inspections began on January 5 after an Alaska Airlines Boeing 737 Max 9 had to make an emergency landing the same day in Portland, Oregon, with a window and a part of the fuselage missing.

As a result, certain Boeing 737 Max 9 aircraft still remain grounded across the US. In a statement on Monday, United Airlines confirmed it found the loose bolts on an undisclosed number of its 737 Max 9 aircraft as the company is still conducting the inspections.

"Since we began prelimi-

nary inspections on Saturday (January 5), we have found instances that appear to relate to installation issues in the door plug -- for example, bolts that needed additional tightening," it said.

The door plug is a piece of fuselage with a window that can be used as an emergency exit in certain configurations, reports the BBC.

It was this part of the Alaska Airlines plane which fell off mid-flight and left a gaping hole on the side of the plane as it flew at 16,000 feet shortly after taking off from Portland, carrying 177 people. The refrigerator-sized Boeing 737 Max 9 fuselage door plug eventually landed at a teacher's backyard.

The vast majority of Boeing 737 Max 9s used in the US are operated by United Airlines and Alaska, while Turkish

Airlines, Panama's Copa Airlines and Aeromexico have also grounded aircraft of the same model for inspections. Also on Monday, Alaska Airlines issued a statement saying that technicians who were preparing to conduct their inspections had seen "some loose hardware was visible on some aircraft".

The formal inspection process of Alaska Airlines' fleet hasn't started yet as they wait for final documentation from Boeing and the FAA, CNN quoted the statement as saying.

As Chancellor, Sunak was not convinced of Rwanda plan's effectiveness



LONDON: During his tenure as the British Chancellor Prime Minister Rishi Sunak had doubts whether the government's scheme of sending migrants to Rwanda would stop channel crossings, documents seen by the BBC suggest.

According to No 10 papers from March 2022, Sunak was not convinced of the plan's effectiveness, which was launched in April 2022 by then Prime Minister Boris Johnson.

In addition, he was also concerned about the cost of sending asylum seekers to Africa and wanted to limit the numbers, The Evening Standard reported, citing the BBC. The then Chancellor felt "hotels are cheaper" than reception centres to house migrants, and was reluctant to fund "Greek-style reception centres" at a cost of 3.5 million pounds per day, the documents revealed.

But when he became the Prime Minister in 2022, the Rwanda Bill became the core of his policy to stop the boats -- one of five key priorities, which Sunak set out to achieve.

Under the plan, anyone who arrived in Britain illegally after

January 1, 2022, faced being sent to Rwanda, some 6,400 km away. In a big setback to his government last year, the UK's Supreme Court rejected plans to send migrants to Rwanda as unlawful as it would put them at risk. Stating that the ruling "was not the outcome we wanted", Sunak said that his "commitment to stopping the boats is unwavering".

Shadow Home Secretary Yvette Cooper told the BBC that as a Chancellor, Sunak resisted the plan as he knew it was incredibly costly and wouldn't work. "But he is so weak he has now agreed to write cheques to Rwanda for 400 million pounds without sending a single person there in a desperate attempt to shore up his leadership," Cooper said. The revelations by the documents come as Sunak grapples with a new crisis after a Conservative MP pledged to stand down "as soon as possible" over a new legislation. The announcement from former Energy Minister Chris Skidmore means the Conservatives will have to defend two seats which could easily swing to Labour in upcoming by-elections.

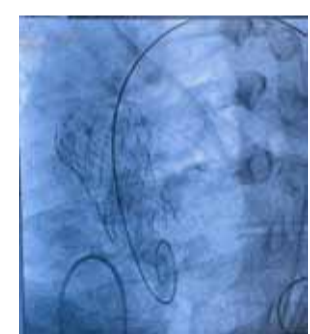

The Indian football team will play its first match against Australia on Saturday in the AFC Asian Cup, which begins on Friday. India has a poor record against Australia, who won this tournament in 2015. The top 24 teams from Asia will compete for the trophy in Qatar. The AFC Asian Cup is the biggest football tournament on the continent.

India has never won this tournament and will be participating for the fifth time. It is the first time that India has qualified for two consecutive seasons. India's best result in this tournament was in 1964 when they finished second behind Israel.

Team India will face the challenge of the 24 best teams in Asia. The final will be played on 10 February. The teams have been divided into 6 groups, with each team playing 3 matches. The top two teams from each group will advance to the round of 16.



The Aussies are undoubtedly the better team; they have won this title before and have also been runners-up; they have played in the World Cup, and Australian players even play for the top clubs in Europe, while India, on the other hand, is on the verge of becoming a good team in the near future. Judging by the team performances, Australia will dominate this match and it can be a one-sided game,

but no one should rule out the possibility of the Indian team pulling off a miracle.

The Indian team will play in Group B along with Australia (FIFA ranking 25), Uzbekistan (FIFA ranking 68) and Syria (91), with India ranked 102nd in the FIFA rankings. Based on the rankings and statistics, the Indian team looks like an underdog, but in fields like football, anything can happen, as did Morocco, who not only

participated in the recently held FIFA World Cup 2022 despite being underdogs, but also reached the semi-finals.

India have played eight matches against Australia. Australia won five and India won two matches. One match was a draw. India lost four out of six matches against Uzbekistan. Two games were played to a draw. The team played six games against Syria. They have won 3 games, lost 2, and

drawn 1 game.
