India dismisses report claiming it ordered targeted killings of wanted terrorists in Pakistan

NEW DELHI: The Indian government got 'individuals' killed in Pakistan as part of Delhi's larger strategy to eliminate wanted terrorists living on foreign soil. 'The Guardian', a renowned global newspaper, claimed in a report on Thursday quoting some "intelligence operatives of India and Pakistan".



poor Pakistanis to carry out the assassinations."

According to the report, "Indian agents also allegedly recruited jihadists to carry out the shootings." Similarly, the report says quoting two Indian intelligence officers that the spy agency's action was triggered by the Pulwama attack in 2019, which was perpetrated by the Pakistan-based terror group Jaish-e-Mohammed.

The report also says that "after Pulwama, the approach changed to target the elements outside the country before they are able to launch an attack or create any disturbance". Quoting one Indian intelligence operative, the report says, "We could not stop the attacks because ultimately their safe havens were in Pakistan, so we had to get to the source." The Guardian also says that in response to its queries, the Ministry of External Affairs denied all the allegations, reiterating an earlier statement that they were "false and malicious anti-India propaganda".

The ministry emphasised a previous denial made by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar that targeted killings in other countries were "not the government of India's policy". According to the report, an RAW handler allegedly paid for information on Zahid Akhund, an alias for the convicted Kashmiri terrorist Zahir Mistry who was involved in the hijacking of an Air India flight. "Millions of rupees were then allegedly paid to Afghan nationals to carry out the shooting in Karachi in March 2022. They fled over the border but their handlers were later arrested by Pakistani security agencies," says the report. Jaish-e-Mohammed commander Shahid Latif was killed on Pakistan soil.

Is EC a 'subsidiary organisation' of BJP, asks Delhi minister Atishi

After being served showcause notice the poll panel has asked Atishi to back with facts her statement that BJP approached her to join the party

NEW DELHI: Delhi minister and senior AAP leader Atishi lashed out at the Election Commission (EC) after she was served a show cause notice on Friday, asking if it was a "subsidiary organisation" of the BJP.

The notice was issued to her over her remarks that the BJP had approached her to either join the party or be prepared to be nabbed by the Enforcement Directorate within a month.

At a press conference, Atishi alleged that the notice was leaked to the media by the BJP an hour before the EC sent it to her through email.

She asked why the Election Commission did not issue notices to the Central agencies concerned after Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal was arrested and bank accounts



of the Congress were frozen ahead of elections.

She asked if the Election Commission is a "subsidiary organisation" of the BJP.

She said the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) wrote multiple letters to the poll panel over the BJP's "objectionable" hoardings and posters, but no action was taken on them.

Atishi said she will reply to the notice and remind the

Election Commission of the neutrality and non-partisanship expected of it in conducting free and fair elections in the country.

In its notice, the poll panel asked Atishi to back with facts her statement that the BJP approached her to join the party.

The BJP moved the poll commission a day back against Atishi's claim made on April 2.

Arvind Kejriwal urges court to allow more time with lawyer



NEW DELHI: Jailed Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday moved a city court urging it to allow him to spend more time with his lawyer in order to prepare for cases pending against him in several parts of the country.

Kejriwal moved the application claiming that two meetings every week with his lawyer, as permitted by the court, were not sufficient since he was facing multiple cases in various states and needed more time for consultation.

The AAP leader urged the court to increase the number of meetings to five per week. The application is likely to come up for hearing before special judge for ED cases Kaveri Baweja on Friday.

The court had on April 1 sent Kejriwal to judicial custody till April 15 in the money-laundering case linked to the alleged excise policy scam.

RBI to release Fintech Self-Regulatory Body framework by April end

MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will unveil the framework for a self-regulatory organisation (SRO) for the fintech sector by the end of April 2024, Governor Shaktikanta Das announced in the post-monetary policy press conference.

The move aims to operationalise one SRO for fintechs by the time of the Global Fintech Festival in September 2024.

«As I had mentioned in last year's GFF, we would like one SRO relating to fintech to be operational. We are working towards that,» Das stated.

Deputy Governor T Rabi Sankar said the RBI is examining stakeholder com-



ments received on the draft SRO framework for fintechs before finalising it.

The fintech industry has welcomed the RBI's timeline to roll out the fintech

self-regulatory body framework.

«The RBI has been driving the SRO conversation systematically. The governor's timebound approach to operationalise the SRO is hugely encouraging,» said Sugandh Saxena, CEO of digital lenders' body FACE.

Jatinder Handoo, CEO of the Digital Lenders Association of India (DLAI), stated the association will study the final framework and take steps accordingly, noting a rise in queries seeking regulatory guidance.

The establishment of a self-regulatory fintech body is expected to streamline oversight and governance of India's rapidly growing fintech sector.

High Court rejects plea seeking Arvind Kejriwal's removal as Delhi CM

NEW DELHI: Noting that it's a personal call of Arvind Kejriwal, the Delhi High Court on Thursday refused to entertain a PIL seeking his removal from the post of Delhi CM following his arrest in a money laundering case related to the Delhi excise policy scam.

"At times, personal interest has to be subordinate to national interest. But that's his (Kejriwal's) personal call," a Bench led by Acting Chief Justice Manmohan said, turning down the second PIL within a week for Kejriwal's removal



as Delhi CM.

"If he (Kejriwal) does not

want to do that (resign), it's up to him. We are a court of law... Do you have any precedent that President's rule or Governor's rule has been imposed by the court?" it asked petitioner Vishnu Gupta's counsel.

Gupta, who was forced to withdraw his Public Interest Litigation, had sought directions for Kejriwal's removal as Delhi CM with effect from March 21, the day he was arrested. Currently lodged in Tihar Jail under judicial custody, Kejriwal has refused to resign as Delhi CM.

Wrestlers' sexual harassment: Delhi court reserves order on framing charges

NEW DELHI: A Delhi court on Thursday reserved its order on framing of charges against BJP MP and former Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief, Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, in an alleged sexual harassment case by six women wrestlers, for April 18.

In February, Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh had sought to be discharged in the case, citing delay in reporting the alleged offence and contradictions in the complainants' statements.

Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Priyanka Rajpoot, of Rouse Avenue Court on Thursday heard the arguments presented by the complainants, Delhi Police, and the accused, including Vinod Tomar, former Assistant Secretary of WFI. Earlier during the proceedings, the complainants and police had said that there was ample evidence to proceed with the trial against the accused individuals.

The Delhi Police had refuted the argument of the accused



that certain incidents occurred overseas and thus fell outside the jurisdiction of Delhi courts, contending that the alleged acts of sexual harassment, attributed to Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, both abroad and in India, including Delhi, constituted part of the same offence. His counsel had told the court that the incidents were said to have occurred in 2012 but were only reported to the police in 2023.

In addition, he had contended discrepancies in the timing and locations of the alleged incidents, asserting no clear link between them. The defence had pointed out contradictions between the complainants' affidavits and statements.

The Delhi Police had con-

cluded its arguments last month. It was contended that incidents of alleged sexual harassment, whether occurring overseas or within the country, were interconnected and part of the same transaction. Hence, the police had said that the court had jurisdiction to hear the case.

The BJP MP had earlier questioned the jurisdiction of the Delhi court claiming that there was no action or consequence which happened in India. Additional Public Prosecutor Atul Srivastava, representing the Delhi Police, had argued that under Section 354 of the IPC, the case is not time-barred, as it carries a maximum punishment of five years.

Addressing the issue of delay in filing complaints, Srivastava had brought up the issue of fear among the women wrestlers, saying that wrestling held immense significance in their lives, and they were hesitant to come forward due to concerns about jeopardising their careers.

RJD, Congress responsible for Maoist trouble, Jungle Raj in Bihar: PM Modi



PATNA: Launching the NDA's campaign for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections in Bihar at a mega rally in Jamui district on Thursday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi held the RJD and the Congress responsible for the Maoist trouble and 'Jungle Raj' in the state during their tenure.

"Everyone knows the kind of identity that was created for Bihar during the RJD and Congress rule when the state witnessed Maoist attacks and the Jungle Raj. Maoists didn't allow the construction of roads in places like Jamui, which adversely affected the farmers, labourers and poor people of

the region. "Now, Maoism is finished in Bihar with many radical operatives joining the mainstream after surrendering. Their children are going to schools now," PM Modi said in Jamui.

The Prime Minister also pointed at the IRCTC land-for-job scam, without naming RJD chief Lalu Prasad Yadav, one of the prime accused in the case.

"They grabbed lands of the poor people to give jobs in the Railways. Such people can never do any good. Nitish Kumar was also the Railway Minister of the country, but there were no complaints against him. The condition of trains was poor during the Congress rule, but now trains like Vande Bharat Express are running across the country.

India's Forex Reserves climb to all time high of USD 642.63 Bn



NEW DELHI: India's foreign exchange reserves have achieved a new milestone, climbing to an all-time high of USD 642.631 billion during last week of March, according to data released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). This represents an increase of USD 140 million over the previous week's total.

The latest surge marks the fifth consecutive week of growth in India's overall forex reserves. In the previous reporting week, the reserves had witnessed a substantial jump of USD 6.396 billion, reaching USD 642.492 billion.

The current level of USD 642.631 billion surpasses the previous record high of USD 642.453 billion, which was attained in September 2021. India's forex reserves had taken a hit in the past year as the central bank deployed a portion of the reserves to defend the rupee against pressures arising from global developments.

Breaking down the components of the reserves, the foreign currency assets, which form a major part of the overall kitty, decreased by USD 123 million to USD 568.264 billion during the week ended March 22, as per the data released on March 29.

'Can't raise anti-Sanatan slogans', Congress spokesperson Gourav Vallabh quits party



NEWDELHI: Congress spokesperson Gourav Vallabh resigned from the primary membership of the party on Thursday morning. Vallabh took to social media platform X to announce his decision. "The directionless path the Congress party is currently taking makes me uncomfortable. I cannot support anti-Sanatan slogans nor can I criticize the country's wealth creators day in and day out. Therefore, I am resigning from all positions and the primary membership of the Congress party," he said in a post.

Visit your areas, solve people's problems, Delhi CM tells AAP MLAs

NEW DELHI: Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Thursday urged Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLAs to regularly visit their respective constituencies and address the issues faced by the people concerning various government departments and other challenges.

During a video-conference call with his wife, Sunita Kejriwal, the Delhi CM conveyed a message to all AAP MLAs. Notably, for the first time since his arrest, a photograph of Kejriwal behind bars, flanked by images of BR Ambedkar (on the left) and Shaheed Bhagat Singh (on the right), was prominently displayed in the background during Sunita's address.

"I am currently in jail, but



that shouldn't hinder any fellow Delhiite from seeking assistance. Every MLA should make it a daily practice to

engage with constituents, inquire about their concerns, and proactively resolve any issues they encounter," read the message conveyed by Kejriwal.

In his message, Kejriwal urged the party MLAs to offer their unwavering support in addressing all issues faced by the two crore residents of Delhi. He emphasised the importance of not only resolving challenges related to government departments but also striving to address other concerns of the people. "People of Delhi are like family to me, and it's imperative that none of them should experience sadness for any reason. God bless everyone. Jai Hind," he said.

Delhi HC reserves its verdict on CM Kejriwal's plea challenging arrest

NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court on Wednesday reserved its verdict on Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's plea challenging his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in the excise policy case.

A bench of Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma reserved judgment after hearing arguments of senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi, representing Kejriwal, and Additional Solicitor General S.V. Raju, representing the ED.

During the hearing, Singhvi submitted that the arrest of the AAP national convener immediately after the imposition of the model code of conduct (MCC) was to prevent his participation in democratic activities and disable his political party.



There is no material to show the proceeds of the crime are with Kejriwal, he added.

On the other hand, ASG Raju said that the ED investigation is at a nascent stage and prayed for rejection of the petition filed by Kejriwal saying that it would be a bogus argument if an accused person

involved in politics should not be arrested during election time.

"Suppose a political person commits murder two days before elections, this means he can't be arrested? Criminals are supposed to be arrested and put in jail," he said.

The ED has termed Chief Minister Kejriwal the "kingpin and the key conspirator" of the alleged excise policy scam in collusion with other ministers of the Delhi government, AAP leaders, and other persons.

In his plea, Kejriwal contended that his arrest and the remand order passed by a trial court were illegal and that he was entitled to be released from custody immediately. The ED arrested Kejriwal on March 21 after questioning him for over two hours at his official residence in Delhi. Earlier, the Delhi High Court had refused to grant any interim relief observing that while deciding a case, it is duty-bound to hear both sides fairly, keeping in mind the principles of natural justice.

'Will meet you soon outside': Former Delhi Deputy CM Manish Sisodia in letter from Tihar Jail



NEW DELHI: AAP leader Manish Sisodia has written a letter from Tihar Jail to the people of his assembly constituency, comparing his plight with the atrocities committed by the British against freedom fighters and asserting his commitment to education.

The former Delhi deputy chief minister, who has been arrested in connection with the Delhi excise policy 'scam' case, also expressed hope that he will be out of jail soon.

"Will meet you soon outside. The British rulers had also arrogated of power and they sent people to jail in false cases," he said and added that Mahatma Gandhi and Nelson Mandela, who spent many years in jail, were his inspiration. Sisodia's bail hearing is scheduled in a Delhi court on Saturday.

In the letter to people of his assembly constituency Patparganj in east Delhi, Sisodia, said a struggle for good education and schools is underway like people fought for freedom of the country. "Education revolution Zindabad. Love you all," Sisodia, who also served as education minister in the Kejriwal government before his arrest, said in the letter. Sisodia said his love for the people of his constituency has increased while being incarcerated and that they were his strength. Despite the dictatorship of the British rulers the dream of freedom was realised. Similarly, every child will get good education one day, Sisodia said. Good education is necessary for a developed country, he added.

PM Modi, Yogi Adityanath among BJP's 40 star campaigners for Bihar



NEW DELHI: The BJP on Tuesday submitted to the Election Commission a list of 40 leaders who will campaign for party candidates in Bihar in the run-up to the Lok Sabha polls.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, party chief J.P. Nadda, Union Ministers Rajnath Singh, Amit Shah, Nitin Gadkari, and Smriti Irani, and Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath are among the star campaigners for the party.

The list also includes Union Ministers Giriraj Singh, and Nityanand Rai, former Union Minister Ashwini Kumar Chaubey, Delhi MP Manoj Tiwari, state in-charge Vinod Tawde, Deputy CMs Samrat Choudhary, and Vijay Kumar Sinha, former Deputy CMs Sushil Kumar Modi, and Renu Devi, former state chief Sanjay Jaiswal, former state minister Shah Nawaz Hussain, and Madhya Pradesh CM Mohan Yadav.

Excise policy case: Supreme court grants bail to AAP leader Sanjay Singh

AAP leader Atishi on Tuesday welcomed the Supreme Court's decision to grant bail to the party's Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh in a money-laundering case linked to the excise policy case.

The Delhi minister shared the news of Singh's bail in a post on X and said in Hindi, "Satyameva Jayate." Singh was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in a money-laundering case linked to the Delhi government's now-scrapped excise policy on October 4. A bench of Justice Sanjiv Khanna, Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice PB Varale ordered Singh's release. The ED said it had no objection if the AAP leader was given bail.

"Sanjay Singh should be released on bail during the pendency of the trial," ordered an SC bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna, Dipankar Datta and Prasanna B Varale. The top court's order comes hours after Delhi's water minister Atishi claimed that she and three other



leaders will be arrested by the ED if they refuse to join BJP.

The bench said that Singh would be able to carry out his political duties during the period of his bail. However, it warned the leader to not make any comments on the case during this period.

'No Recovery'

During the bail plea hearing, the bench observed that Singh was not found in possession of any money, while emphasizing that the accusation of him receiving a Rs 2 crore bribe could be examined during the trial. "Nothing has been recovered, there is no trace," the bench told Additional Solicitor General S V Raju, representing the central probe agency.

Why AAP leader Singh arrested?

AAP leader Sanjay Singh was apprehended by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on October 4, 2023, in connection with a money laundering case linked to his alleged involvement in formulating and executing the now-defunct Delhi excise policy. According to the agency, the policy was purportedly designed to favor specific liquor manufacturers, wholesalers, and retailers.

Former minister, Industrialist Savitri Jindal resigns from Congress, joins BJP

Savitri Jindal represented the Hisar constituency for a period of 10 years and also served as a minister in the Haryana government. She has resigned from the primary membership of the Congress prior to Lok Sabha polls. She represented the Hisar constituency for a period of 10 years and also served as a minister in the Haryana government which is a huge setback for the Congress, OP Jindal Group chairperson and former Haryana minister Savitri Jindal on Wednesday late night announced that she is quitting the grand old party ahead of the upcoming general polls and undertake canvassing for her son Naveen Jindal contesting Lok Sabha polls from Kurukshetra. Sources also reveal that Ex-Haryana Chief Minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda may also not contest LS elections 2024.

While talking to the media Savitri Jindal said that she represented the people of Hisar for 10 years as an MLA and have served Haryana state selflessly as a minister. She said that the people of Hisar are my family and on the advice of my family, I have resigned from the primary membership of the Congress party, but will

always be grateful to the Congress leadership for its support and to all my colleagues who always gave me their support and respect. Naveen Jindal too had resigned from Congress a couple of days earlier, joined BJP and offered Lok Sabha seat from Kurukshetra constituency which was earlier represented by Him twice in 2004 and 2009. Savitri Jindal's resignation from the primary membership of the Congress party comes days after her son and Jindal Steel and Power Limited chairman Naveen Jindal joined the Bharatiya Janata Party now contesting from the Kurukshetra Lok Sabha seat as a BJP candidate in the upcoming general elections.

Regarding Savitri Jindal's political career, she represented the Hisar constituency for a period of 10 years and also served as a minister in the Haryana government. In 2005, she was elected to the Haryana Vidhan Sabha from the Hisar constituency after the death of her husband and Jindal Group founder OP Jindal in a plane crash. She was re-elected from Hisar in 2009 and was appointed the cabinet minister in the Haryana government in October 2013.

Former Home and Health Minister of Haryana and MLA of Ambala Cantt, Anil Vij today took a dig at Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and said that if Kejriwal had read the holy scriptures of the Bhagavad Gita and Ramayana earlier, perhaps this situation would not have arisen. Vij said that just as someone has some deity to worship, similarly, Kejriwal has Prime Ministership in his mind and does not want to give up his desire to become Prime Minister even in jail. It is noteworthy that Arvind Kejriwal has demanded a book to decide the Prime Minister other than the Gita and Ramayana.

Speaking at the rally of the INDI Alliance in Delhi, former minister Anil Vij said that whatever he has said through the rally, if he has the guts, he should say it in court through his lawyer. He said that these are the people who want to influence votes emotionally by bringing forward the wives of both chief ministers. Meanwhile, when asked about Congress receiving a second notice from the Income Tax Department, Vij said that if someone does not file returns on time, notices will come. If someone has a big job, they will get a big notice, and if someone has a small job, they will get a small notice. What's the need to make a fuss about it? Vij said that there are no candidates with the Congress in Haryana, these are just a few people's clique. Meanwhile, as the Congress has not yet announced its candidate in Haryana, former minister Anil Vij said that where are the candidates with the Congress, these are just a few people's created clique and they cannot sit together.

Wheat stocks of value over Rs 82 cr destroyed due to negligence in 4 Haryana districts

The District Food and Supply Controller (DFSC) ordered investigation in the case in which wheat stocks of value worth over Rs 82 crores were destroyed due to lack of care by the government employees, besides huge quantity of wheat was found missing from the government food stock godowns of the Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Department in past couple of years, especially in four districts in the state: Karnal, Kurukshetra, Kaithal and Fatehabad. Information also reveals that nearly 369 bags of wheat have gone missing from the godowns. According to information, during year 2022, as a result of lack of care by the employees nearly 6587 MT wheat stocks of value worth about Rs 12.67 crore were destroyed from the godown in Karnal district 24264 MT wheat of value worth Rs 46.71 crore. In Kurukshetra district, wheat stock of 216 MT of value worth Rs 41.58 lakh in Fatehabad and wheat stocks of 11795 MT of value worth Rs 22.70 crore in Kaithal district were destroyed in storage godowns due to lack of care.

There are other incidents



in which wheat stocks were also destroyed which include 300 quintal wheat of value between 7 to 8 lakh became wet due to leakage of water in godown roof at Kunjpura and question arises why 1,15,000 bags containing wheat were kept in the godown having leakage in the roof during year 2023. During year 2020-21, nearly 30,000 quintal wheat stocks of value worth over Rs 6 crore belonging to the food and supply department for supply to Fair Price depots kept in Jundla godown was also destroyed due to lack of care by the storekeeper but no action was taken against the employee responsible for the damages.

Similarly, during the year 2021-22, nearly 11,795 MT wheat stocks of value Rs 22.70 crore were damaged in Kaithal godown, but in spite of the investigation by

Mukhtar Ansari dies of cardiac arrest in Banda, security tightened in UP

NEW DELHI: Jailed gangster and politician Mukhtar Ansari died in UP's Banda on Thursday, following a heart attack.

Amsari, 60, suffered a massive heart attack in Banda jail on Thursday evening during a medical check-up and he fell unconscious. He was immediately taken to the Banda Medical College where he died. The

hospital administration has confirmed his demise. Earlier on Tuesday, Ansari's health had deteriorated and he was admitted to the ICU at Banda Medical College. However, he was discharged the same evening after doctors declared him fit.

Ansari had earlier told the court that he was being given food laced with poison in jail, after which the court had sought a report on the same. He had alleged that he was also given food laced with poison 40 days ago.

Ansari, a five-time former MLA from Mau Sadar seat, had been behind bars in UP and Punjab since 2005. He has over 60 criminal cases pending against him. Ansari was sentenced in eight cases since September 2022 by different courts of UP and was lodged in the Banda jail.

8 arrested in raid on fake gaming call centre in Gurugram

While addressing media persons, Siddhant Jain, Deputy Commissioner of police said that with the help of 'Pratibimb' portal of the Union ministry of home affairs they conducted a raid in which eight persons running a fake gaming were arrested after a raid on a fake gaming call centre in Koyal Vihar in Sector 52 at Gurugram on Monday night. The arrested accused were identified as the mastermind in the

racket Sunil Kumar alias Sonu (42) a permanent resident of Fatehabad, Tarun (20), Pawan (24), Arshdeep (27) all residents of Hijrawakalan (Fatehabad), Parasdeep (19) resident of Sirsa, Deepak (21) resident of Hisar, Himanshu (20) resident of Jind and Rajinder (37) resident of Riasi (Jammu & Kashmir). Priyanshu Dewan of cyber crime cell said that Sunil the head of this call centre used to pay Rs 25,000-30,000 salary and 2% commission to all suspects functioning for the past about year.

The Congress specially targeted the Prime Minister Narendra Modi, asking him what happened to his claims of fighting the corruption, while inducting someone who is facing the CBI probe for the mining scam to the tune of Rs 35,000 crores.

Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters here today, party spokesperson and the Chairman of the Media and Publicity in the Communications department, Pawan Khara alleged that inducting Reddy into the party was the plan-B of the BJP to generate money for the electoral bonds were held illegal by the Supreme Court of India.

"Now it will be a direct partnership", he remarked, while suggesting that the BJP will now be inducting such potential donors irrespective of their record or reputation. "Mr Reddy is now again a client of the BJP's washing powder", he remarked, while taunting the BJP for inducting tainted leaders and then issuing them clean chit.

Army fires at Pakistani drone along LoC in Rajouri



Troops stationed along the Line of Control (LoC) in Rajouri district of Jammu and Kashmir took action in response to the presence of a Pakistani drone and suspected individuals in separate incidents, officials reported on April 1.

According to reports, a Pakistani quadcopter was detected in a forward area in Sunderbani, prompting the troops to fire at least four rounds to deter its entry into Indian territory. Despite the firing, the drone retreated to the Pakistani side of the LoC.

Simultaneously, suspicious movement of individuals suspected to be terrorists was observed in the Keri sector during the night between Sunday and Monday. Troops responded by firing several rounds, causing the suspected infiltrators to flee towards Pakistan-occupied Kashmir.

Boxer Vijender Singh quits Cong, joins BJP

NEW DELHI: Ahead of the Lok Sabha elections, Olympic medalist boxer and Congress leader Vijender Singh on Wednesday joined the BJP here.

Earlier, speculation was rife that Vijender Singh might be fielded by the Congress from Mathura against BJP's Hema Malini, who is in the fray for the third time in a row.

Vijender Singh is currently a professional boxer and fights in various countries. "It's a homecoming for me after five years as I had contested the poll in 2019," he said, adding "he is inspired by the honour given by the BJP government to the players". The boxer joined the BJP in the presence of the party's national General Secretary Vinod Tawde. Last week, the boxer in a post on X, wrote, "Wherever the public wants, I am ready."

Twitter handle. After the foot march in Haryana, Vijender Singh and the Congress shared photos of the Yatra. "Haryanvi Ha Dabya Koni Karde," tweeted the boxer in the local language along with a photo, which also had Priyanka Gandhi Vadra's pet dog 'Luna' in the frame.

Mining mafia Reddy again in BJP in poll-bound Karnataka

After that, BJP was defeated in Karnataka, but Reddy became MLA from Gangavati constituency.

BJP will secure hat-trick in LS polls: Amit Shah

JAIPUR: Union Home Minister Amit Shah said that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will register a hat-trick of victories in Rajasthan in the upcoming Lok Sabha polls by winning all 25 seats with 70 per cent votes, targeting the Opposition during a programme in Jaipur, he said. "INDIA bloc has come together to save the corrupt, not democracy."

The Union Minister, who in the home constituency of former Rajasthan chief minister Ashok Gehlot, also targeted the veteran Congress leader over several issues.

Addressing the Shakti Kendra Pramukh Sammelan in Jodhpur, HM Shah said "nei-



ther Gehlot nor Sonia Gandhi is worried over the problems of the common people".

"Ashok Gehlot wants to make his son the Chief Minister. Sonia Gandhi wants to make her son the Prime Minister. They are not worried about the common people," he said.

HM Shah also spoke about the work done by the BJP-led Central government in the last 10 years and challenged Ashok Gehlot to stay prepared to participate in a debate on the work front.

"Ashok Gehlot ji, if you are free... then answer my ques-

tion. I have given the details of our work done publicly today. Now, you can decide the date for the debate to discuss your work. I will send our Yuva Morcha president to discuss it," HM Shah said.

Taking a dig at Gehlot regarding the Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project (ERCP) -- a drinking water and irrigation programme, HM Shah said: "When I promised ERCP, everyone was laughing... Ashok Gehlot was asking how it would be implemented? Gehlot ji, Bhajan Lal Sharma has become Chief Minister for the first time and within five months, he took steps towards the ERCP."

Deepfakes in a democratic country like India a big concern: PM Modi

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said artificial intelligence (AI) presents a huge opportunity but there is a significant risk of misuse, especially deepfakes, if such a powerful technology is placed in unskilled hands.

Responding to a question from Microsoft Co-founder and billionaire philanthropist Bill Gates on how India looks at AI which is a huge opportunity but

comes with its own challenges, PM Modi said proper training is must to handle technologies like AI. "I have engaged with leading minds on AI and its risks. I suggested that we should start with clear watermarks on AI-generated content to prevent misinformation. Proper sources of AI-generated content should also be mentioned," PM Modi emphasised. Deepfakes in a vast democratic country like India,



which is going into general elections, is a real issue.

"Someone can even misuse my voice to deceive people and such a deepfake can trigger

widespread uproar. We need to think about creating robust dos and don'ts on deepfakes," the Prime Minister told Gates.

Using AI as a magic tool or asking ChatGPT to write letters is a great injustice to this wonderful technology as we should rather compete with AI to improve ourselves and innovate further to solve real life problems, according to the Prime Minister.

Alleging tax terrorism, Congress questions motive, timing behind Rs 1823 cr IT demand

Alleging tax terrorism and apprehending that no free and fair elections were possible in the country under current circumstances, the Congress today lashed out at the Income Tax department for its blatant and partisan misuse of power by selectively targeting the Congress party in the midst of General Elections.

The party leaders revealed that the IT had only yesterday raised a fresh demand of Rs 1823 crores from the party for the donations spread over a period of about 30 years, from 1993 to 2019. This period includes the time when late Sitaram Kesri was the party treasurer.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said that the Income Tax department had overlooked Rs 4,600 Cr penalty for BJP's Rs 42 Cr unaccounted deposits, while Rs 135 Cr penalty was imposed on Congress for Rs 14 lakh cash deposits by MLAs and MPs.

"Who is pressurising the Income Tax Department to act in this unjustified manner only against the Opposition?", he asked and added, "why is the IT department being allowed to be used as a weapon to harass the principal opposition party, the Congress".

Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters

here today, the Congress treasurer Ajay Maken along with general secretary in charge communications Jairam Ramesh and spokesperson Pawan Khara, disclosed that yesterday, Congress party received fresh notices from the IT department to pay Rs 1823.08 crores. This is in addition to the Rs 135 crores which the IT department has already taken away forcibly from Congress bank account, he added. "This is tax terrorism", remarked Jairam Ramesh.

The Congress treasurer revealed detailed figures procured from the Election Commission of India website which clearly show how the BJP has violated the Income Tax guidelines which make it liable to pay Rs 4600 crore as penalty. He pointed out, the Congress had been imposed with a severe penalty of Rs 135 crores for a violation of Rs 14 lakhs. He said this amount was raised in a transparent manner and had been donated in cash by the party's MPs and MLAs. For this, he said, the IT department took away Rs 135 crores from the Congress bank account.

The Congress treasurer revealed that during his analysis of the data and details submitted by the BJP to the Election Commission, he had found that the BJP had not provided any details of 1,297 donors who had paid Rs 42 crores of

the party. Quoting the Income Tax guidelines, he said, section 29-C of the Act calls for the parties to furnish various details for getting exemption. He said, according to it, the parties are supposed to give entire details including the name and address of the donor. In this case, the BJP had just given 1297 names without any other details like address.

He said, applying the same standards, which the Income Tax department applied to the Congress over the violation worth Rs 14 lakhs and charged Rs 135 crore penalty from the party, the BJP owes a penalty of Rs 4600 crores. He asked the Income Tax department why it had turned a blind eye towards such a serious violation.

Replying to a question, he said, no free and fair elections were possible under such circumstances as the level playing field was being denied to the principal opposition party.

He said the party had full faith in the Supreme Court of India where the matter was listed for April 1. He asserted that the Congress will not let off the BJP lightly and will fight to the finish. He also clarified that the Congress already has plan B,C,D and so on prepared to face any eventuality.

He also said that the party was considering filing a PIL to get the amount of Rs 4600 crore from the BJP.

Jairam Ramesh said, the Congress will not be cowed down or intimidated by such tactics. He said, those who are trying to scare the Congress party are themselves scared.

Moreover, he clarified that what the party had said today were the revelations of the facts taken from the Election Commission of India website submitted there by the BJP itself.

Centre will consider revoking AFSPA in J&K: Amit Shah

Jammu and Union Home Minister Amit Shah said on Wednesday that the Centre is contemplating the withdrawal of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA) in Jammu and Kashmir. Speaking in an interview with Gulistan News, Shah unveiled plans to retract troops from the region, entrusting law and order responsibilities solely to the Jammu and Kashmir Police.

"We have plans to pull back troops and leave law and order to the Jammu and Kashmir Police alone," Shah stated. Recognizing the growing trust in the local police force, Shah emphasized the potential revocation of AFSPA, which grants extensive powers to armed forces personnel in disturbed areas. Acknowledging the contrast between its application in Jammu and Kashmir and the Northeast, where it has been lifted from 70% of areas, Shah stressed the need for a reassessment.

Shah criticized opposition leaders Farooq Abdullah and Mehbooba Mufti, asserting they lack credibility on terrorism issues. He pointed out a decrease in fake encounters under the current administration and pledged dialogue with Kashmiri youths, distinguishing them from organizations with alleged ties to Pakistan.

"We will have a dialogue with the youths of Kashmir and not with the organizations that have roots in Pakistan," Shah affirmed. Highlighting the government's counterterrorism measures, Shah mentioned the ban on 12 organizations, designation of 36 individuals as terrorists, and enforcement actions against terror financing. These efforts included the seizure of properties worth Rs 150 crore, attachment of 90 properties, and freezing of 134 bank accounts.

INDIA alliance is a 'Gathbandhan' or a 'Thagbandhan' says Haryana CM Saini

Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini after a rally of INDIA bloc leaders held at Ramliha Ground at Delhi on Monday slammed the opposition INDIA bloc, raising a question if the alliance is a 'gathbandhan' or a 'thagbandhan' of the crooks, and alleged their fight is to save themselves and the people from the corrupts having no vision or any concern for the country's development but their fight is how to save the corrupts. BJD-BJP Alliance taloks fail, stage set for a triangular battle in odisha

Alliance talks between the ruling Biju Janata Dal (BJD) and BJP in Odisha have failed and both the parties have announced that they will contest the elections on their own strength. This will make for an interesting triangular battle in the state with Congress being the third major party in the contest. Assembly and Lok Sabha polls are being held simultaneously in the state in four phases.

The talks failed after prolonged negotiations that began soon after Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the state on March 5. Making it clear that negotiations have produced no result state BJP president Manmohan Samal on Friday wrote in an X post: "BJP will fight this election alone in all 21 Lok Sabha and 147 Assembly seats with the aim of creating a developed

India and a developed Odisha under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to fulfil the hopes and aspirations of four and a half crore Odias."

BJD general secretary (organisation) Pranab Prakash Das also said in a post on X, "BJD will contest in all 147 assembly constituencies and all 21 Lok Sabha constituencies with the support of the people of Odisha and win more than three fourth seats under the leadership of Naveen Patnaik. BJD will continue to take decisions keeping people of Odisha in the forefront always and their welfare in true spirit of cooperative federalism and statesmanship required for nation building." He said "New Odisha and Empowered Odisha will be our goal and we are on track to achieve this under the leadership of our leader Naveen Patnaik."

Speculation about the revival of the BJD-BJP alliance, which



had collapsed ahead of 2009 elections, gained traction in the wake of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's March 5 visit to the state during which he described chief minister and BJD president Naveen Patnaik as a "popular" chief minister. There was great bonhomie between the two leaders which set tongues wagging.

Soon after PM's departure for Delhi state BJP leaders were called to Delhi while BJD leaders went into a huddle at Naveen

Niwās, the official residence of the chief minister in Bhubaneswar. Soon Naveen's Man Friday and chairman of Nabin Odisha, VK Pandian and BJD general secretary (organisation) Pranab Prakash Das also paid a visit to Delhi.

However, there was no formal announcement from any side about an alliance. Sometime later state BJP president Samal and BJP state in-charge Vijaypal Singh Tomar asserted that

the party would go it alone in the elections. However, Samal later clarified that these were his personal views and suspense over alliance continued.

All that his now water under the bridge with both sides making it clear that they fill fight the ensuing polls on their own strength. Samal's latest statement was also tweeted by union minister Dharmendra Pradhan. Party's Bhubaneswar MP Aparajita Sarangi wrote on her in X handle "Excellent. Immensely grateful."

Sources said the talks failed as top leaders of both the parties could not arrive at a mutually acceptable seat sharing arrangement. It may be mentioned that before the collapse of their alliance in 2009 the BJD and BJP had a seat-sharing equation of 4:3. While BJD contested for 84 assembly seats and 12 Lok Sabha seats in the state the BJP fought on 63 assembly seats and 9 Lok Sabha seats.

Congress releases manifesto for 2024 LS election

***Promises to give legal guarantee to MSP, restore J-K's statehood, scrap Agnipath scheme, 30 lakh jobs, conduct caste census, raise 50 per cent cap on quotas in manifesto**


The Congress today released the 'Nyay Patra', the party manifesto, for the 2024 General Elections, promising 'Paanch Nyay', five pillars of justice with 25 guarantees, which include, 'Yuva Nyay', 'Naari Nyay', 'Kisaan Nyay', 'Shramik Nyay' and 'Hissedari Nyay'.

The Nyaya Patra was released at the AICC headquarters by the Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, Congress Parliamentary Party Chairperson Ms Sonia Gandhi, former president Rahul Gandhi, Manifesto Committee Chairman P. Chidambaram and General Secretary (Organisation) K.C. Venu-gopal.

The main guarantees include caste census, legal guarantee on MSP, removing the fifty per cent cap on reservation of SCs, STs and OBCs, providing 50 percent reservation to women in central government jobs, waiving of all educational loans up to March 15, 2024, filling the 30 lakh vacancies pending in various central government departments at the earliest, raising the minimum daily wage to Rs 400 and introducing the Rajasthan Model of universal healthcare with insurance cover up to Rs 25 lakhs for everyone.

The party also promised to scrap the Agnipath scheme of recruitment in Armed Forces and restore the earlier system.

The party announced that it will provide legal guarantee for the MSP of various crops which will be fixed on the basis of the recommendations of the Swaminathan



Commission.

As promised repeatedly by the former party president Rahul Gandhi, the Congress guaranteed that it will conduct a nationwide socio-economic and caste Census to enumerate the castes and sub-castes and their socio-economic conditions.

The party said, it will scrap the fifty percent cap on reservations of scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and Other Backward Castes, through a constitutional amendment.

The Congress 'Nyay Patra' promised to abolish application fees of examinations for recruitment in various government departments.

Besides, the party will also provide one time relief for students and will write off all the student and educational loans, due up to March 15, 2024 and the banks will be compensated for it by the government.

In a major step towards providing equality to women, the party promised it will reserve one-half (50 per cent) of central government jobs for women starting in 2025.

Promising to launch the Mahalakshmi scheme, the party said it will provide Rs 1 lakh per year to every poor Indian family as an unconditional cash transfer. The poor will be identified among the families in the bottom of the income pyramid, the

party added.

To achieve transparency and ensure credibility of the electoral process, the 'Nyay Patra' said, the Congress government will amend the election laws to combine the efficiency of the electronic voting machine (EVM) and the transparency of the ballot paper. "Voting will be through the EVM but the voter will be able to hold and deposit the machine-generated voting slip into the voter-verifiable paper audit trail (VVPAT) unit", it said, adding, "the electronic vote tally will be matched against the VVPAT slip tally".

The Congress promised to replace the existing GST regime saying it will replace the GST laws enacted by the BJP/NDA government with GST 2.0. "The new GST regime will be based on the universally accepted principle that GST shall be a single, moderate rate (with a few exceptions) that will not burden the poor", the manifesto added.

The party also promised to double the GDP in next ten years, saying, "the Congress is committed to rapid growth and generation of wealth...we have set a target of doubling the GDP in the next 10 years".

On the border issue with China, the party said, it will work to restore the status quo ante on borders with China and to ensure that areas, where both armies patrolled in the

past, are again accessible to our soldiers. "We will take the necessary steps to adjust our policy towards China until this is achieved", it added.

The party said it will repair relations with the Maldives also.

In order to curb the menace of paid and fake news, the party said it will amend the Press Council of India Act, 1978 to empower the Council to deal with the menace of fake news and paid news.

To discourage defections, the party promised to amend the Tenth Schedule of the Constitution and make defection (leaving the original party on which the MLA or MP was elected) an automatic disqualification of the membership in the Assembly or Parliament.

The party promised to raise the pensions for senior citizens, widows and persons with disabilities under the National Social Assistance Programme to Rs 1,000 per month against the current pitiful amount between 200-500.

In order to streamline the functioning of sporting bodies and federations, Congress promised to enact a separate legislation for the registration of sports federations/bodies/associations which will ensure full compliance with the Olympic Charter, allow for autonomy and full accountability, and provide recourse for members and sportsper-

sons against discrimination, bias, sexual harassment, abuse, wrongful termination, etc.

The Congress government will provide sports scholarships of Rs 10,000 per month to talented and budding sports persons below the age of 21.

The party also promised not to interfere with personal choices of food and dress, to love and marry, and to travel and reside in any part of India. "All laws and rules that interfere unreasonably with personal freedoms will be repealed", the party said.

It will also encourage state governments to establish "school fee regulation committees".

It will ensure to provide mobile phones for all students from classes IX to XII for equitable access to learning.

It promised to double the number of Anganwadi workers and create 14 lakh more jobs.

The Congress will immediately restore full statehood to Jammu and Kashmir.

It will also amend the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution to include tribal areas of Ladakh

The party promised to give Special Category status to Andhra Pradesh.

The party will amend the Government of NCT of Delhi Act, 1991 so that the LG shall act on the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers of NCT, Delhi except on 3 reserved subjects. Party has also promised to grant full statehood to Puducherry.

The Congress promised to remove the present state government of Manipur and heal the wounds between communities.

It will appoint a Reconciliation Commission for political and administrative settlement in Manipur and ensure appropriate compensation and redressal for victims and survivors of conflict in Manipur.

The party promised to have a final solution and agreement with the Naga groups.

Priyanka Gandhi, Ajay Maken, Jairam Ramesh, Sachin Pilot, Pawan Khera and many other leaders were present on the occasion.

Rahul Gandhi calls Congress Manifesto aspirational, A roadmap for development

Former Congress President Rahul Gandhi today said that the party's election manifesto was aspirational, representing the voice and aspirations of the people from across the country and was the roadmap for progress and development.

He expressed confidence that the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) will emerge victorious, saying Prime Minister Narendra Modi's claims of winning "400 plus" seats were the sign of his nervousness as he realized it well that his alliance will not even cross 180 mark.

Talking to reporters after the release of the party's manifesto here today, he said it is the voice of the country. "It is a document of India's aspirations, which has been conceived and created by the people and drafted and put into words by the Congress", he said, while disclosing that it had lot of inputs based on his conversations with people across the country.

He said, the manifesto has been prepared after closely understanding the needs of the people from across the country through direct interaction, by him and the Con-



gress president Mallikarjun Kharge, with them during two historical yatras covering over 10,000 kms.

Akhilesh Yadav asks party leaders to focus on PDA



LUCKNOW: The Samajwadi Party (SP) has decided to focus on its 'PDA' formula, even if it means ignoring upper caste voters. PDA is an acronym coined by the SP for 'Pichhde (backward classes)', Dalit and 'Alpsankhyak (minorities)'.

"The development of the country is possible only with proportionate participation of all sections. This goal can be achieved through caste census. Only when everyone gets rights and respect based on their numbers will real social justice be established," SP chief Akhilesh Yadav said in a statement on Thursday. RBI flags inflation risks, keeps repo rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent

MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank of India on Friday decided to keep policy rate unchanged for the seventh time in a row and said that it remains vigilant towards upside risks to food inflation.

The rate increase cycle was paused in April last year after six consecutive rate hikes aggregating to 250 basis points since May 2022.

Announcing the first bi-monthly monetary policy for the current financial year, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) has decided to keep the repo rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent.

He said MPC will remain watchful of food inflation.

The six-member rate-setting panel by a majority vote of 5:1 favoured the status quo on interest rate, while maintaining focus on withdrawal of



accommodative stance.

In February, the Consumer Price-based Inflation (CPI) stood at 5.1 per cent.

The government has mandated RBI to ensure CPI inflation at 4 per cent with a margin of 2 per cent on either side.

GST collections hit Rs 1.78 lakh crore in March, 2nd highest since roll-out

NEW DELHI: GST collections in March grew 11.5% to Rs 1.78 lakh crore on higher domestic sales, the finance ministry said on Monday.

The gross GST collection for the last fiscal (April 2023-March 2024) stood at Rs 20.18 lakh crore, 11.7 per cent higher than the mop-up in the preceding fiscal.

The average monthly gross collection for FY24 stood at Rs 1.68 lakh crore, exceeding Rs 1.5 lakh crore in the preceding fiscal.

"Gross Good and Services Tax (GST) revenue for March 2024 witnessed the second highest collection ever at Rs 1.78 lakh crore, with a 11.5 per cent year-on-year growth. This surge was driven by a significant rise in GST collection from domestic transactions at 17.6 per cent," the ministry said in a statement.

The highest-ever GST col-



lection was recorded at Rs 1.87 lakh crore in April 2023.

Experts said the double-digit increase in monthly GST collection underscores the resilience of economy and paves way for next generation GST reforms.

The ministry said GST collections have shown "strong consistent performance" in 2023-24 and the fiscal ended March 31 marks a "milestone" with total gross GST collection of Rs 20.18 lakh crore, a 11.7

per cent increase compared to the previous year.

GST revenue net of refunds as of March 2024 is Rs 18.01 lakh crore, which is a growth of 13.4 per cent over the same period a year ago.

During the just-concluded fiscal, Central (GST) collection was Rs 3.76 lakh crore, State GST was Rs 4.71 lakh crore; Integrated GST was 10.27 lakh crore, including Rs 4.83 lakh crore collected on imported goods.

Gold hits all time high over Rs 70,000 per 10 grams

NEW DELHI: Gold prices surged by Rs 850 to reach a new peak of Rs 70,050 per 10 grams on Thursday on strong global cues, according to HDFC Securities.

This is the second straight session that precious metal prices have hit all-time high levels. In the previous trade, the precious metal had settled at Rs 69,200 per 10 grams. Silver prices also zoomed Rs 1,000 to hit record Rs 81,700 per kg. In the previous session, it had finished at Rs 80,700 per kg.

"Spot gold prices (24 carat) in the Delhi markets are trading at Rs 70,050 per 10 grams, up by Rs 850, amid a bullish trend in the overseas markets," Saamil Gandhi, Senior Analyst of Commodities at HDFC Securities, said.

In the international markets, spot gold at COMEX was trading at USD 2,297 per ounce, up by USD 22 from the previous close. Gold touched



yet another record after Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell confirmed that an interest rate cut would likely be appropriate "at some point this year". Traders focus on rate cuts rather than the timing of the first rate cut, Gandhi said. Silver was also trading higher at USD 27.05 per ounce. It had closed at USD 26.25 per ounce in the previous session. "Gold continues to hover around its all-time high levels on the back of weakness in the dollar amid uncertainty over US interest rate cuts, while increased safe-haven demand also aided prices.

RBI, NPCI make presentation on remittances to WTO members



NEW DELHI: Senior officials of the RBI and the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) have made a presentation to the WTO members on reducing cost of remittances on March 25, an official said.

India is pressing for the adoption of open and interoperable payment systems like UPI, among WTO (World Trade Organisation) members with a view to cut the cost of money transfers or remittances. India is suggesting to encourage digital transfers, fostering inter-operable systems, streamlining regulations, and enhancing pricing transparency. The remittance costs are about 6.18 per cent globally which is well above the UN's target of 3 per cent.

"While getting periodic dividend payouts is useful for many investors, LIQUIDADD has a growth-based NAV useful for earnings in the form of capital gains instead of dividend," Ghelani said, adding "The capital gains tax will be applicable only when you sell LIQUIDADD units, and if you have any capital losses, it could assist to reduce the tax payable."

"Since there will be no dividends declared by LIQUIDADD, there will be no TDS, your returns will be easier to track and you will never get fractional units in your demat account," he noted.

CAMPAIGN AGAINST BLACK MONEY RUNS COUNTER TO THE SCHEME THAT LACKS TRANSPARENCY



Will Santiago Martin, the 'Lottery King', play the spoiler in the unfolding drama of electoral bonds? Is the State Bank of India (SBI) playing ball with those in authority over the disclosure of the unique alphanumeric code numbers on the bonds that will identify those who benefit?

The Supreme Court has not permitted any latitude to the SBI, which had sought time till June to disclose particulars of the bond purchasers and recipients. According to reports, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) launched a probe against Martin's Future Gaming and Hotel Services in 2019. In October that year, he purchased electoral bonds worth

Rs 190 crore. His total purchases touched Rs 1,368 crore. Why did the 'Lottery King' have to keep political parties indebted to him? Martin's firm is the biggest purchaser of electoral bonds. The biggest chunk of these bonds went to MK Stalin's DMK. What did he hope to gain?

Home Minister Amit Shah says that his party's wish to get rid of black money in the economy has come unstuck because of the Supreme Court's judgment that the voters are entitled to know the identity of the donors and the political party that was favoured by each donor. I am puzzled! How do electoral bonds help achieve this end?



If a political party shouts from the rooftops that it wants to abolish black money and does the opposite by formulating a method that keeps voters in the dark about the source of the donation, I would, as a voter, frown on such an unreliable party.

Santiago is an interesting name. Many men by this name can be found in Spain and Portugal, maybe also in Italy. In Goa, the home of my ancestors, Santiago was a name that some boys were given at birth. The Portuguese colonizers introduced such names, which the natives adopted after conversion.

The surname Martin is an Anglicised version of Martinho. It can also be a given name. The Portuguese did convert a few families on the east coast of India in Bengal and Tamil Nadu. I know of families with the surnames Rosario

in Bengal and Diaz in Tamil Nadu. A senior IPS officer of the Tamil Nadu cadre, SM Diaz, was appointed Director of the National Police Academy in the 1970s. In Kerala, the number of families converted by the Portuguese is far greater. They are locally known as 'Latin Christians' because the Mass was conducted in Latin till the vernacular was introduced. The services are in Syriac among Kerala's earlier Christians, called Syrian Christians.

Whatever may be the origin of his name, the 'Lottery King', who hails from Coimbatore and started off as a labourer in Myanmar, is now rolling in cash. The lottery business is obviously a money-spinner. The BJP calls all gaming earners sinful and imposes a sin tax on bets. Horse racing, which employs thousands of citizens, is being slowly smothered to death by 28 per cent GST levied on each bet placed at the club's Tote.

As if that were not enough, a further 30 per cent income tax on all winnings is extracted at the time of encashing the winning tickets. Poor punters, who wager just a tenner or maximum Rs 50, have perforce given up the only excitement in their otherwise drab existence. They cannot turn to the unlicensed bookies as the latter do not deal in small amounts. The more affluent, who used to wager in hundreds on the legally blessed Tote, have also abandoned the racecourse because of negligible returns on winning bets.

Betting on the outcome of cricket matches is now the 'in thing' for the addicted gambler. It is thriving, though such gambling is illegal in India. In the UK, wagers on all forms of sporting events are allowed

and licensed, though with conditions. No bet can be accepted from a child, for example. The gambling instinct is impossible to eliminate, especially through the legal process. Bans on betting only increase the contours of corruption. It will be more beneficial to regulate betting, like the UK has done. The government will then receive the taxes, the licensed bookmakers their profits and the punters their excitement.

On the electoral bond scheme, I thank the Supreme Court for not permitting any latitude to the government-controlled SBI, which sought time till June to disclose the particulars of the purchasers of the bonds and the recipients.

Donations by corporate houses to political parties are a necessity. In fact, every business house has to donate. If it fails to do so, the visits by myriad inspectors, who make a good living by inspecting, will not only be more frequent but also much more 'expensive'. Business houses are geared up to face these inspectors. Some hire officials especially to 'look after' the inspectors. But the gaming outlets that have multiplied in recent years are a different kettle of fish.

It would be better for the citizens if their rulers stopped moralising about the vice of gambling and allowed it to surface on the open ground. Policemen who routinely shut their eyes to this 'social evil' and the politicians who extract their pound of flesh from the illegal operators will lose

out, but the public will benefit in the long run. The government will rake in the taxes. On cricket betting alone, the government will be able to feed the millions now existing on 5 kg of rice or wheat which the government doles out every month. The statistics put out by the government show that nearly 60 per cent of the country's people live on such doles. Incidentally, these statistics contradict assertions made by the government that poverty in India is on the decline. But we are now accustomed to fake and contradictory news items.

Shah and his colleagues in the BJP's senior ranks are understandably unhappy with the revelations now emerging about the journey of the electoral bonds. They need not bother. Most educated people had already suspected the truth. The less educated and less affluent just do not care. They have become Modi bhakts because of the power of our PM's rhetoric and the overpowering cult figure that his propaganda machine has created. The third term is his for the asking. It's time for him to change gears and concentrate on 'credibility' as a more acceptable keeper of his legacy.

Sensex gains marginally to scale new peak after RBI policy



MUMBAI: Equity benchmark index Sensex registered marginal gains to hit a fresh lifetime high of 74,248 on Friday after the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) maintained the status quo on key interest rates amid a negative trend in global markets.

The six-member rate-setting panel of RBI on Friday kept the benchmark interest rates unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the seventh time in a row. It also expressed concerns over food inflation, given IMD's prediction of above-normal maximum temperatures during April-June.

The 30-share BSE Sensex inched up 20.59 points or 0.03 per cent to settle at a fresh record of 74,248.22. The index oscillated between the intra-day peak of 74,361.11 and the low of 73,946.92.

The broader NSE Nifty ended with a marginal loss of 0.95 points to 22,513.70. As many as 28 components of the 50-share benchmark ended in the red.

Although the RBI policy meeting unfolded as anticipated, concerns over food inflation and warnings of a heat wave tempered sentiment. While the main domestic indices concluded with marginal movement, the Bank Nifty edged higher, propelled by robust credit growth in Q4 FY24.

"The global sentiment was dampened by the rise in oil prices and tensions in the Middle East. Investors remain attentive to upcoming US non-farm payroll and unemployment data, seeking clarity on the Federal Reserve's future rate path," Vinod Nair, head of research, Geojit Financial Services, said.

Kotak Bank was the largest gainer in the Sensex pack, rising 2.09 per cent, followed by Bajaj Finserv, HDFC Bank, ITC, SBI, M&M and ICICI Bank.

On the other hand, UltraTech Cement, L&T, Bharti Airtel, Bajaj Finance and Tech Mahindra were among the laggards. Among sectoral indices, realty surged by 1.49 per cent, financial services advanced by 0.92 per cent and banks gained 0.83 per cent. While BSE Services rose by 0.79 per cent, BSE FMCG went up 0.51 per cent.

In contrast, tech declined by 0.51 per cent, IT fell by 0.44 per cent and capital goods dipped by 0.22 per cent. Other laggards

included auto, oil & gas, and metal, slipping 0.17 per cent, 0.15 per cent and 0.11 per cent, respectively.

BSE largecap gained 0.15 per cent, while midcap and smallcap indices rose 0.50 per cent.

Interest-rate-sensitive bank and NBFC stocks gained on Friday after RBI decided to maintain interest rates.

Among the banking counters, Kotak Mahindra Bank jumped 2.09 per cent to end at Rs 1,785.25, and HDFC Bank went 1.41 per cent higher to finish at Rs 1,549.40 apiece on the BSE.

Also, State Bank of India grew 0.67 per cent to end at Rs 764.35 each, IndusInd Bank climbed 0.66 per cent to settle at Rs 1,554, and ICICI Bank rose 0.51 per cent to finish at Rs 1,082.35.

However, Bank of Baroda fell 0.24 per cent to close at Rs 268.70 per piece on the exchange.

Among the NBFC stocks, SBI Cards and Payment Services jumped 5.24 per cent to close at Rs 730.45, Jio Financial Services climbed 3.24 per cent to settle at Rs 373.05, and Bajaj Finserv gained 1.56 per cent to end at Rs 1,681 apiece on the exchange.

The BSE Bankex increased 451.11 points or 0.83 per cent to close at 54,590.61. Global oil benchmark Brent crude advanced 0.11 per cent to USD 90.75 a barrel.

Asian markets were lower, with Japan's Nikkei 225 losing 1.96 per cent and Hang Seng of Hong Kong declining 0.01 per cent. South Korea index Kospi fell 1.01 per cent.

European markets were trading in the red. Germany's DAX and London's FTSE 100 lost 1.57 per cent and 0.90 per cent. CAC40 of France went down by 1.36 per cent.

The US markets closed largely lower in the overnight trade on Thursday. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth Rs 1,136.47 crore on Thursday, according to exchange data.

On Thursday, the BSE benchmark Sensex surged 350.81 points or 0.47 per cent to settle at its lifetime high of 74,227.63. The NSE Nifty also hit its fresh peak of 22,514.65, gaining 80 points or 0.36 per cent.

RBI's 'unwavering focus' on price stability to help economy become more resilient: ASSOCHAM

NEW DELHI: The decision of the RBI Monetary Policy Committee to keep the policy REPO rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent and its assertion to remain focussed on moderating inflation shows a resolve on the part of the central bank to ensure price stability for a long term sustained economic growth, ASSOCHAM said today.

"We stand by RBI's commitment for 'unwavering focus on price stability' to ringfence the economy from global headwinds including geo-political situation and the resultant supply chain disruptions," ASSOCHAM Secretary General Deepak Sood said. RBI has successfully shielded the economy from global uncertainties over the past few years.

Sood said having witnessed a real GDP growth of 7.6 per cent for the fiscal 2023-24, the RBI's projection of seven per cent economic expansion in FY '25 is reassuring, as it comes on the back of a high base of growth numbers. Robust consumer demand across different sectors of the economy makes India stand out as growing at



the fastest pace amongst the major economies of the world. Inflation too is moderating thanks to a combined effect of money policy as also improving supply side management, the chamber Secretary General said.

Allowing cash deposits through UPI is yet another major forward movement of our digital economy and would ensure ease of banking for the customers. Other laudable measures in the credit policy include more flexibility to small finance banks and allowing non-banking payment operators to offer CBDC (Central Bank Digital Currency) on their wallets.

Foreign Direct Investment and Pharmaceutical Industry in India


Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) is synonymous with the ownership, management, and control of a business entity by a foreign enterprise. On the positive note, FDI is encouraged especially in green field projects, i.e., new projects, as it is expected to bring benefits such as employment generation, creation of manufacturing capabilities, introduction of new techniques and technologies, etc. On the flip side, there are fears and concerns such as domination of multinational corporations (MNCs), entry barriers for new companies, etc. In pharmaceutical sector, there are certain specific concerns attached to FDI such as sale of high priced patented drugs and branded generics instead of low-cost essential drugs by pharma MNCs, elimination of competition from generic players due to acquisition of domestic pharma firms by MNCs, to name a few.

Recent report of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) points out that India emerging as a favourite destination for foreign investors as India has been ranked among the top five countries for greenfield projects. India has been ranked 3rd with 1,008 greenfield investment announcements. The U.S. tops the list with 2,075 greenfield investment announcements followed by U.K. with 1,230 such projects. Majority of FDI flow in India is from five countries namely Singapore (23.2%), Mauritius (22.0%), the U.S. (8.8%), Japan (8.5%), and United Arab Emirates (7.6%) in FY2023-24 (till January 2024). Predominantly, FDI is in sectors such as Services (16.2%), Construction (infrastructure) activities (12.0%), Computer S/W & H/W (10.7%), Trading (8.3%), and Automobile Industry (2.8%) for this period. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) data for the rolling 12-month period ending January 2024 put the net inflows at \$18.4

billion.

Deng Xiaoping, Chinese leader famously said that 'it does not matter whether a cat is black or white, as long as it catches mice'. But while applying this to FDI in pharmaceutical sector in India vis-a-vis domestic capital, it requires caution even though capital serves the same purpose. The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Commerce chaired by Shanta Kumar in 110th Report on FDI in Pharmaceutical Sector (2013, August) had noted that out of 67 FDI investments till September, 2011, only one has been in the green field and all the remaining FDI had come in brown field projects, i.e. acquisition of existing companies. This showed the predominance of brown field investments for merger or takeover of domestic pharmaceutical companies. The Committee had also noted that data captured by the RBI on FDI equity inflows, had not made distinction between Greenfield and brownfield investments. Observations of the Committee were very pertinent in the background that since 2006, seven Indian companies namely Dabur Pharma, Ranbaxy Labs, Matrix Labs, Paras Pharma, Piramal Healthcare, Shanta Biotech, and Orchid Chemicals, were taken over by MNCs. In Indian context, there is scepticism regarding foreign capital as it is always equated with the rise of the East India Company from Traders to Rulers.

FDI in Indian pharmaceutical sector has seen many twists and turns in last seven and a half decades. In 1947, Western pharma MNCs had control over 80-90% of pharmaceutical market in India. At that time, almost 99 per cent of all pharmaceutical products under patents in India were held by foreign companies (U.S. International Trade Commission, 2007). By 1960s, eight out of top 10 pharmaceutical firms in India as per sales, were subsidiaries of MNCs. Foreign Exchange Regulation Act (FERA), 1973 along with the Patents Act, 1970, and DPCO, 1970 completely changed the landscape of pharmaceutical sector in India. Through FERA, restrictions were imposed on the companies in which the



non-resident interest was more than 40 per cent. T. N. Ninan et al. (1982) pointed out that out of about 900 foreign equity companies in India, over 400 were unaffected by the FERA, and of the rest, close to 100 were asked to leave. 230 companies were asked to reduce foreign equity down to 40 per cent, 22 companies chose voluntarily to reduce the holding to 40 per cent. 114 companies were allowed to keep foreign holdings in the range of 51 per cent 74 per cent. Owing to introduction of the FERA that required all MNCs to dilute their equity holding, the market share of MNCs declined during 1970-79. Pharmaceutical sector was also not an exception.

Certain prominent pharma MNCs had presence in India even prior to FERA, 1973 such as GlaxoSmithKline Pharmaceuticals Limited incorporated in 1924, Abbott India (1944), Novartis India Limited (1947), Sanofi India Limited (1956) (Initially, formed as Hoechst Fedco Pharma Private Limited, and then name was changed from time to time), Pfizer Limited (incorporated in 1956 and listed on the BSE in 1966), Procter and Gamble Hygiene & Health Care which was set up in India as one of Merck's Asian subsidiaries in 1967 to name a few. The FERA in 1973 made a distinction between FERA companies and non-FERA companies based on equity shareholding of MNCs in the compa-

nies. Besides this, in 1978, India launched its first Drug Policy which included compulsory provisions, such as ratio parameter, the supply of bulk drugs to non-associated formulators, etc. This made it obligatory for all pharmaceutical companies to produce bulk drugs from the basic stage. Collectively, this affected the market share of pharma MNCs in India.

In 1991, the drugs and pharmaceutical sector was opened to the FDI by permitting FDI/Foreign Equity, up to 51 per cent, under the automatic approval route. The Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 replaced the FERA, and the provisions of the FEMA opened a window of opportunity again for FDI in the domestic pharmaceutical industry. In 2000, FDI was permitted up to 74 per cent under the automatic route. This was in alignment with the 1994 Drug Policy. In 2001, up to 100 per cent FDI was permitted in the pharmaceutical sector in respect of drugs which did not attract Compulsory Licensing (CL) or involved use of recombinant DNA technology and specific cell/tissue targeted formulations. From September 23, 2005 the FDI was permitted under automatic route, and drug manufacturing was also freed from licensing. By 2004-05, market share of foreign pharmaceutical companies in the list of top ten pharmaceutical companies in India was 10.5 per

cent which rose to about 19% in 2010-11.

In September 2011, High Level Committee Report on FDI in Existing Indian Pharmaceutical Companies (Arun Maira Committee) concluded that green field investments must be attracted. There was unanimity among members of the Committee that there should be monitoring and control of acquisitions to ensure that the structure of the pharmaceutical market is not distorted in a way that will be detrimental to the interests of Indian consumers. The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare had expressed concern that 28 per cent of the Indian pharmaceutical market was controlled by pharma MNCs at that time. Based on the recommendations of Arun Maira Committee, the FDI policy was revised and notified by the Department of Industrial Policy & Promotion (DIPP) (DIPP in January 2019) vide Press Note 3 of 2011, and in all cases of FDI, up to 100% for investments in existing companies, i.e., brownfield investments, in the pharmaceutical sector, and approval from the Foreign Investment Promotion Board (FIPB) was required.

In June 2016, up to 74 per cent FDI was permitted under automatic route in brownfield investments, and beyond 74 per cent under government approval

route. It was done due to concerns raised regarding accessibility, and the growth of generic pharmaceutical industry in India. Between April 2012 and April 2013, more than 96 per cent of the total FDI in pharmaceutical sector was in brown-field projects. It deserves attention in the background that 100 per cent FDI was already permitted under automatic route for Greenfield pharmaceutical projects. Through the Union Budget of 2017, the Foreign Investment Promotion Board (FIPB) was abolished as more than 90 per cent of the FDI used to come through the automatic route. The responsibility of examining FDI proposals under Government approval route was entrusted to the concerned administrative Ministries/Departments. The role of the Competition Commission of India (CCI) in specified cases has become critical.

FDI in pharmaceutical sector stood at Rs. 9,052 Crore in 2014-15 but declined in 2015-16 to Rs. 4,975 Crore. FDI went up again in 2016-17 to Rs. 5,723 and Rs. 6,502 Crore in 2017-18. Significant decline was observed in 2018-19 with FDI of Rs. 1,842 Crore. From 2018-19 to 2022-23, total FDI inflows in the pharmaceutical sector have been Rs. 43,713 Crore. Pharmaceutical Sector has witnessed 58% growth in FDI in FY2021-22 alone. During FY2023-24, from April 2023 to September 2023, FDI inflows in pharmaceutical sector have been Rs. 4,456 Crore. And from April 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023, six FDI proposals worth Rs. 9,848 Crore have been approved for brownfield projects. Schemes such as Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for domestic manufacturing of critical Key Starting Materials, Drug Intermediates and APIs, Scheme for Promotion of Bulk Drug Parks are likely to attract foreign investors, and make India a preferred destination for FDI.

Unethical Business: Kidney transplant racket busted in Gurugram with five taken in police custody

Teams of CM Flying Squad and health department in a joint raid at Babil Guest House in Sector 39 Gurugram on Thursday took into possession two donors and three patients busting a gang involved in illegal organ trade and transplantation of kidney illegally, both the donors as well as patients have been identified as Bangladeshis, who were taken to Jaipur for the surgeries in two private hospitals. Preliminary investigation revealed that the racket engaged in Bangladeshis who were allegedly used to lure people both donors and the patients through advertisements on Facebook to be aware of the matter, bring them in the country on health ground Visa. The Bangladeshi donors during preliminary investigation told the police that they were contacted by a middleman from the gang and they agreed to sell their kidneys at Rs 30,000 as they were in dire need of money, which was



being sold to the patients between Rs 10 to 12 Crores. Alok Mittal, additional director general of police (CID), Haryana said a joint raid by a team of the CM flying squad, district health department and the Gurugram police during a raid at the guest house busted a gang that was allegedly involved in illegal organ trade, who were to be taken to a private hospital at Jaipur for kidney surgeries. Arjun Dev, station house officer of Sadar police station, said when they reached the guest house, they found two donors from Ban-

gladesh identified as Shamim Mehadi Hasan (24) and Husain (30) both were unemployed and in need of money and three recipients staying in different rooms in the guest house who were identified as Islam (56), Kabeer (33) and Mehmood (25) all hailing from Bangladesh having no relationship among them. Based on the information provided by the five, the mastermind of the gang was identified as Mohammed Murtaza Ansari, a permanent resident of village Karge in Ranchi (Jharkhand) presently work-

ing with a private hospital and possessing contacts with the concerned staff of private hospitals, the SHO said. Investigation revealed that the racket members used to take donors and the patients for kidney surgery at Jaipur in Rajasthan and after two days bring them back to Gurugram guest house for about three to four weeks. Information also revealed that the blood and other necessary tests required in case of such surgeries were not being conducted by the hospital. Police officer said, when asked by hospital management, they were not prepared to say anything in his regard. Information reveals, Ansari is absconding since after the police raid, once he is arrested police will get all the details regarding the modus operandi and operations of the gang. The donors on the other hand told police that they were contacted by an agent of the gang and immediately agreed to sell their kidney as they were in dire need of money. According to police information, the suspects had managed

to pass off the donors as close relatives of the organ recipients after making their fake profiles and ID cards and the documents will be recovered from the hospital as well to check the case they presented before the hospital. As per law, organ donation is only legal between living relatives, resulting in a chronic shortage of kidneys for transplant said Dr Pawan Chaudhary, deputy civil surgeon of Gurugram also a member of the raiding team said, the raid was conducted in Sector 39 guest house on a secret complaint received that a nexus of organ transplant is run by Ansari. He said, when the raiding team reached the guest house, the guest house owner was present and disclosed that five of the guests from Bangladesh are currently staying and he suspects that they are patients who were brought by one middleman identified as Ansari. During questioning of the guests, all natives of Bangladesh, it was revealed that they are donors and recipients of the Kidney who were treated at a prominent hospital of Jaipur.

TAC Security makes stellar debut on NSE emerge, lists at 174% premium

NEW DELHI: Cybersecurity firm TAC Security made an impressive stock market debut on Friday, listing at a staggering 174 per cent premium on the NSE Emerge platform, the Small and Medium Enterprise (SME) segment of the National Stock Exchange (NSE).



The company's shares commenced trading at Rs 290 apiece, a significant premium over the fixed price band of Rs 106 in its recently concluded initial public offering (IPO). TAC Security's IPO garnered a tremendous response from investors, with the overall issue being oversubscribed a whopping 422 times by the final day of bidding on April 2. The robust demand translated into bids worth over USD 1 billion for the cybersecurity firm's public issue. Breaking down the subscription figures, the Qualified Institutional Buyers (QIB) portion was oversubscribed 142 times, while the Non-Institutional Investors (NII) quota saw a staggering 769 times oversubscription.

The Retail Individual Investors (RII) category wasn't far behind, with the portion being oversubscribed 434 times. TAC Security's IPO comprised a fresh issue of 28.29 lakh equity shares with a face value of Rs 10 each, through the book-building route. The company allocated 1.41 lakh equity shares for the Market Maker, 4.03 lakh shares for NIIs, 13.44 lakh shares for QIBs (including anchor reservation), and 9.4 lakh shares for the RII portion. The lot size was fixed at 1,200 shares.

The cybersecurity firm aims to raise Rs 29.99 crore through the IPO proceeds, which it plans to utilise for investing in human resources and product development to support organic growth in India. Additionally, TAC Security intends to invest in its parent company, TAC Security Inc. Delaware, to hire skilled personnel for driving organic growth outside India. The remaining capital raised from the public issue will be allocated towards general corporate purposes.

India's EV landscape set to be transformed with key govt initiatives



NEW DELHI: The rise in EV battery manufacturing, alongside the 'Make in India' initiative, will lower manufacturing costs and boost EV sales in the country, according to industry experts. According to Liz Lee, Associate Director at Counterpoint Research, India's EV landscape is on the cusp of significant growth. "Government initiatives such as the PLI scheme for Advanced Chemistry Cells (ACC) and the recent reduction in import duties on EVs under \$35,000 to 15 per cent are game changers," said Lee. All this not only opens doors for Tesla but also signals India's readiness to welcome significant investments and foster a new ecosystem for EVs and their component suppliers. "It is a clear sign that India's journey to become a major player in the global EV market is accelerating," Lee noted.

Finance Ministry refutes misinformation on social media over income tax regime

NEW DELHI: The Finance Ministry has clarified that there is no new change in the income tax regime that is coming in from April 1, 2024, as is being reported by some social media platforms.



"It has come to notice that misleading information related to new tax regime is being spread on some social media platforms. It is therefore clarified that: There is no new change which is coming in from April 1, 2024," the Finance Ministry said on Sunday in a post on X. The new tax regime under Section 115BAC(1A) was intro-

duced in the Finance Act 2023, as compared to the existing old regime without exemptions. The new tax regime is applicable for persons other than companies and firms, as a default regime from the Financial Year 2023-24 and the Assessment Year corresponding to this is AY 2024-25, the Finance Ministry said.

Under the new tax regime, the tax rates are significantly lower, though the benefit of various exemptions and deductions (other than standard deduction of Rs 50,000 from salary and Rs 15,000 from family pension) is not available, as in the old regime, the Finance Ministry added. The new tax regime is the default tax regime, however, taxpayers can choose the tax regime (old or new) that they think is beneficial to them. Option for opting out from the new tax regime is available till filing of return for the AY 2024-25.

Blinkit to sell Sony PlayStation 5 on its platform

NEW DELHI: Zomato-owned quick commerce platform Blinkit on Thursday said that they will be collaborating with Sony to sell PlayStation 5 on its platform.



The company will be launching PlayStation 5 on its platform on April 5. "PlayStation 5 on Blinkit. Launching tomorrow," Albinder Dhindsa, Blinkit's CEO, posted on X. Earlier this year, Samsung partnered with Blinkit to deliver its newly launched Galaxy S24 series in the country. Customers living in Delhi-NCR, Bengaluru and Mumbai were eligible to order Galaxy S24 Ultra, Galaxy S24+ and Galaxy S24 smartphones on

Blinkit and get the phone delivered in less than 10 minutes, the company said at the time. Last year, Blinkit again partnered with Unicorn, the Apple premium reseller, to deliver the 'Make-in-India' iPhone 15 and iPhone 15 Plus at customers' doorsteps living in Delhi-NCR,

Mumbai, Pune, and Bengaluru. Meanwhile, Blinkit's revenue from operations surged to Rs 724.2 crore in FY23 from Rs 236.1 crore in FY22. The company saw its losses increase 8.2 per cent to reach Rs 1,078.9 crore in FY23 from Rs 996.7 crore in FY22.

Govt raises Rs 16,507 Cr from CPSE stake sales, half of target in FY24

NEW DELHI: The Indian government has garnered Rs 16,507 crore through the sale of minority stakes in central public sector enterprises (CPSEs) during the fiscal year 2023-24, falling short of its revised estimates for disinvestment proceeds.

Over the course of FY24, which concluded on March 31, the government divested stakes in 10 CPSEs through offer for sale (OFS) transactions. The share sale in Coal India Limited alone fetched Rs 4,186 crore, while the stake sales in NHPC Limited and NLC India Limited yielded Rs 2,488 crore and Rs 2,129 crore, respectively.

Additionally, the government raised Rs 858 crore through the initial public offering (IPO) of the Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency (IREDA). It also offloaded shares in companies such as RVNL, SJVN, IRCON International, and HUDCO, while earning remittances from the Specified Undertaking of the Unit Trust of India (SUUTI). The Union Budget for FY24 had initially pegged the disinvestment proceeds target at Rs 51,000 crore. However, in the revised estimates presented on February 1, 2024, the government did away with a separate head for disinvestment receipts.

Instead, under the capital receipts heading, the government estimated to collect Rs 30,000 crore, which officials clarified included Rs 20,000 crore from disinvestment and Rs 10,000 crore from asset monetisation. According to data from the Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM), the actual collections for FY24 through OFS and share sales to employees stood at Rs 16,507.29 crore as of March 31, 2024, falling short of the revised estimate. Historically, the government has struggled to meet its disinvestment targets set in budgets, with the exceptions of the 2018-19 and 2017-18 financial years. The highest-ever disinvestment mop-up was recorded in 2017-18 at Rs 1,00,056 crore, marginally exceeding the budget target of Rs 1 lakh crore.



India's economy is at risk amidst fiscal strains

The Centre's fiscal deficit's sharp ascent from Rs 11 lakh crore in January to Rs 15 lakh crore by the end of February paints a concerning picture of India's economic stewardship. This leap, marking the deficit at 86.5% of the revised Rs 17.3 lakh crore target within a mere 29 days, starkly contrasts last year's smoother progression. Such a spike in deficit not only mirrors fiscal stress but also raises questions about the government's budgetary discipline and economic forecasting. Two factors partially mitigate this abrupt rise. Firstly, an increased allocation to States via tax devolution shares, and secondly, a significant boost in capital expenditure in February. These expenditures, while necessary, underscore the urgent need for balanced fiscal management. Especially when aiming to meet an ambitious Rs 10 lakh crore capex target amidst constraints like the Model Code of Conduct for the looming Lok Sabha polls. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's adjustment of this fiscal year's deficit target to 5.8% from 5.9% in the interim Budget, alongside a commitment to narrow the deficit to 4.5% of GDP by 2025-26, suggests an awareness of the need for fiscal prudence. However, achieving these targets amidst the dual challenges of stimulating growth post-COVID-19 and managing high inflation, potential agricultural setbacks, and uneven consumption demands, will require more than mere fiscal gymnastics. With significant unspent funds still earmarked for critical sectors such as Agriculture, Rural Development, and Consumer Affairs as the fiscal year ends, there's a real risk that underspending could impact the effectiveness of government programs. This scenario underlines the importance of not just fiscal tightening but also improving budgetary execution to ensure that allocated funds effectively reach intended sectors and initiatives. As the country stands at a fiscal crossroads, the path ahead demands recalibrating strategies to align with economic realities and priorities.

TB still kills thousands daily


Every day, 3,500 people worldwide lose their lives to tuberculosis (TB), and around 30,000 people become infected with TB bacilli, according to World Health Organization (WHO) estimates. India alone accounts for 27% of global TB cases. This is jarring, given that TB is a detectable and curable disease and TB diagnosis and treatment protocols have been a part of existing health systems for a long time.

World TB Day, on March 24, commemorates Dr. Robert Koch's discovery of *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* (the bacteria that causes tuberculosis) in 1882. Despite its discovery then, possible treatments using streptomycin in 1943 and the discovery of antibiotics such as isoniazid and rifampicin in the 1950s and 1960s, the war against the pathogen is far from been won, and there are multiple challenges to be overcome in combating the disease.

India remains a TB hotspot. The TB control programme in India has undergone several changes since its inception in 1962, incorporating evidence from various domains of public health and health systems, including pharmacology, microbiology, epidemiology, the social sciences, and information technology.

The theme for World TB Day 2024 (March 24), 'Yes! We can end TB!', underscores the potential to eradicate TB with existing disease control mechanisms, infrastructure, training, and the political will. Yet, TB in its various avatars — drug-resistant (DR-TB), totally drug-resistant (TDR-TB), extensively drug-resistant (XDR-TB), pulmonary TB (P-TB) and non-pulmonary TB — seep out, akin to trying to hold sand in one's hand, only to have it slip through one's fingers.

We are in an era of hope where public health discourse has gained importance and technology has narrowed the gaps that were previously unimaginable. The COVID-19 pandemic, despite its disruptive and uncertain nature, has brought to the



fore preventive aspects of public health, highlighting social determinants of health in the scheme of things. Despite the passage of World TB Day 2024, looking at rapid urbanisation, migration, and the stresses on the existing health systems, I propose a 10-point agenda towards 'ending TB'.

First, early detection. Given TB's aetiology, early detection is the key. Symptoms are often ignored and mistaken for other common ailments, leading to delays in reporting. Compulsory screening for family and contacts of each index case is essential, necessitating availability of laboratory facilities and efficient follow-up mechanisms within health systems. Second, precise treatment categorisation. With increasing DR-TB, it is imperative to know the resistance status at the time of diagnosis to assign appropriate treatment regimens as per their phenotypic susceptibility.

Third, treatment adherence and follow-up. Unlike other bacterial diseases, TB requires a long period of sustained treatment. Often, this leads to non-compliance, which could be due to observable improvement in health status, or change of residence, movement across States and districts. Even though the TB control programme has a built-in follow-up system, compliance to complete treatment is not 100%. Leveraging technology to monitor compliance needs focus.

Fourth, zero mortality. Mitigating mortality due to TB, be it DR-TB or non-pulmonary TB, is necessary.

Issue of drug resistance

Fifth, controlling drug resistance. Drug resistance in TB remains a man-made phenomenon. Unregulated use of antibiotics and non-compliance with treatment regimens lead to selective evolutionary pressure on the bacillus, in turn resulting in developing drug resistance. Poor regulatory mechanisms for drug control and non-compliance with treatment regimens are the main reasons for such a high degree of drug resistance.

Sixth, assessing the extent of drug-resistant TB. There needs to be data on the proportion of people diagnosed with TB who have rifampicin-resistant TB (RR-TB) and multidrug-resistant TB (MDR-TB) — this is resistance to both rifampicin and isoniazid, collectively referred to as MDR/RR-TB. This helps in better plan and design of the control programme, resource allocation for diagnosis, the treatment regime as well as availability of trained staff mandated for DR-TB.

Seventh, availability of appropriate medicines. Assured medical supply is mandated under the TB control programme. However, procurement challenges for DR-TB medications such as bedaquiline and delamanid

must be addressed, in addition to ascertaining treatment facilities for all DR-TB cases which require in-patient care.

Integration of intra-systems

Eighth, integration into larger health systems. Strengthening referral networks within and between different levels of public health systems and private health systems is vital to ensure no symptomatic cases are lost, no patients miss their dosages and are non-compliant, and, importantly, the screening of contacts for all positive cases of pulmonary TB cases (DR or non-DR).

Ninth, dynamic notification system. A robust notification system will ease the burden of health system personnel. While Ni-kshay has evolved — 'Ni-Kshay-(Ni=End, Kshay=TB)' is the web enabled patient management system for TB control under the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NTEP) — it requires improvements to capture real-time TB data between sectors, practitioners, time, and locations.

Tenth, considering population mobility and migration. Often, the productive aspects of life are overlooked when discussing disease and health care seeking, particularly in the context of TB, which suffers from social and cultural stigma. Interestingly, once TB is diagnosed and positive cases are put on treatment, health is restored quickly for the patient to resume their daily activities. Therefore, portability of TB treatment within the country is crucial at the policy level. Let us pledge to create a 'TB-free India and world. With early diagnosis and continuous treatment accessible to all, we can achieve the goal of 'Yes! We have ended TB!'

China, a 'want-to-be' superpower, stays cautious

The first anniversary of the China-brokered détente between Saudi Arabia and Iran in March 2023 passed without much fanfare. The war in Gaza has enveloped almost all regional political and diplomatic capacities across the Persian Gulf, while also highlighting international actors and their core interests amidst this fallout. Beijing has taken a position that is clearly pro-Palestine, in line with its historical standing on the issue, alienating its relations with Israel.

However, in China's state-controlled media, Chinese President Xi Jinping's success in bringing together Riyadh and Tehran was highlighted as an institutional Chinese position to promote peace. In a glowing piece on the anniversary which quoted regional analysts who underscored a sense of fatigue with the West's 'conditional' relations, the Chinese media outlet Xinhua said, "Today, China's advocacy for peace still resonates with Middle East countries."

Beijing's aims

In early 2023, Wang Yi (director of the Office of the Foreign Affairs Commission of the Communist Party of China (CPC) Central Committee) gave his endorsement to a plan to set up a new China-backed international mediation organisation headquartered in Hong Kong. According to reports, Algeria, Belarus, Cambodia, Djibouti, Indonesia, Laos, Pakistan, Serbia and Sudan were signatories to the initial statement as a preparatory office was launched. The Chinese establishment hopes to link the mediation initiative to its expansive economic corridor, the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI). The BRI has extensive membership in West Asia as well, with Iran, Saudi Arabia and the UAE among others be-



ing part of China's economic highways. Israel, being heavily reliant on the United States for its security, is not a signatory. However, Israel's embattled Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu aired the fact last year that China had invited him for a state visit.

China's absence in the Red Sea crisis

The war in Gaza has drawn strong red lines between China and Israel. This raises interesting questions on the exact role Beijing played in the Saudi-Iran détente. The probability of China being pulled into the process by Riyadh and Tehran, rather than actively brokering a deal, remains high. China has also been absent through the crisis in the Red Sea, where predominantly western naval forces have attempted to maintain the free flow of trade in this critical waterway. Contrarily, reports have suggested that Yemen-based Houthis were not targeting Chinese and Russian ships, suggesting a bypass potentially using leverages that Beijing has with its close partner Iran despite Tehran's calls for the Yemeni militia to cease attacks. If so, it shows China's crafty diplomacy was to predominantly protect its own interests and not wade into the crisis as an influential power looking to use its position

to broker peace or even a ceasefire. Much of this kind of actual heavy lifting remains at the doorsteps of the White House.

This then begs the question. What is China's actual role in the more challenging geopolitical regions such as West Asia? Beijing's support for the Palestinian cause without criticising Hamas practically aligns with the larger Arab posture. This stands against U.S. support for Israel, which is increasingly being criticised for its absolutist nature as the body count in Gaza continues to grow. China's intent for 'mediation' is non-existent in high-stake conflicts and is un-aspirational beyond the strategic aim of showcasing western, and, more specifically, American power and influence, as detrimental to both international stability and security.

A push towards 'mediation diplomacy' has been an aspirational design for China on two major fronts. First, it is to position itself as an antithesis to what Beijing sees as decades worth of western interventionist policies, specifically in a region such as West Asia, where conflict has direct correlation with colonial history. Second, it is to increase its own geopolitical weight as a responsible international actor and power. However, both these aims have been confronted by realities around the war in Gaza as China has taken a clear stance towards the Arab side and has not condemned Hamas by name. Much of the reasoning behind this is to counter long-standing American influence and to take advantage of crevasses in regional diplomacy, specifically by the likes of Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates (UAE), which are looking to chart their own paths of strategic autonomy

and willing to partner with Beijing despite having close security ties with Washington DC.

In perspective

China seems content with predominantly displacing American hegemony without replacing it. Even a perception of being a 'soft hegemon' in the region will stand starkly against Chinese grandstanding against western policies. This is despite the fact that Beijing utilised the 'war on terror'-era to build closer ties with the U.S. and benefit its own security concerns regarding radicalisation and terrorism narratives around its restive Xinjiang region. But once again, these were all narrow geostrategic aims. Scholars Sheena Chestnut Greitens and Isaac Kardon have highlighted in their work on how China, for its partner states, is more about their internal security rather than external — that is, prioritising political security of regimes rather than states. Arguably, this could appropriately explain what formalised Chinese mediation would aim for.

The war in Gaza colours Beijing as still being a 'want-to-be' superpower. Being risk averse and having a lack of alternatives to the historical West-centric policies (which it chides as being detrimental to global security and prosperity) makes Beijing stand out as hollow. Other than offering a sizeable cheque book, China still has few answers as substitutes to long-standing geopolitical flashpoints. For now, despite its size, it remains a utilitarian superpower for others to hedge against rather than being an upcoming traditional superpower.

Lessons from the resilient coast of 'Intertidal'

In "Intertidal: A Coast and Marsh Diary," Yuvan Aves delves into the symbiotic relationship between the natural world and the urban sprawl of Chennai, India, through a lens that is both personal and profound. The book, which juxtaposes the resilience of Chennai's coastlines with the city's struggle against flooding — especially since the devastating floods of 2015 — offers a unique blend of environmental exploration and autobiographical reflection.

Aves, a nature educator, activist, and author, crafts a narrative that is as much an environmental diary as it is a memoir of healing and personal growth. The emotional weight of the book is established from the onset with Aves'


harrowing account of childhood abuse. Yet, it's his transformative years at Pathashaala School that offer a glimmer of hope, not just for Aves, but for the reader as well, showcasing the potential for recovery and reconnection with the world.

Aves skillfully uses these sections to encourage readers to engage with their surroundings in a mindful and considerate manner. His detailed observations, from the resilience of decorator worms adapting to marine pollution to his own practice of "rain meditation" during power

outages, illuminate the intricate connections between human actions and the natural world.

One of the most compelling aspects of "Intertidal" is Aves' ability to draw parallels between the ecological intertidal zones and the floods of emotions within the human psyche. This analogy not only highlights the constant ebb and flow of life's challenges but also the importance of resilience and adap-

tation. Through his exploration of Chennai's coast and marshes, Aves invites readers to reconsider their relationship with nature, urging a collective reevaluation of the impact of urbanization and industrialization on the environment.

The narrative is punctuated with poignant reminders of the consequences of environmental neglect, as seen through the lens of plastic pollution affecting marine life. Aves' account of a decorator worm utilizing fragments of plastic and other debris for its habitat serves as a stark commentary on the state of our oceans. Yet, it's his

optimistic outlook on the potential for change, grounded in mindfulness and environmental stewardship, that resonates most deeply.

"Intertidal" is more than just a diary; it is a call to action. Aves implores us to reconnect with the natural world in a meaningful way, to slow down and appreciate the beauty and complexity of our environment. His meditative approach to experiencing nature serves as a reminder of the therapeutic power of the natural world and the importance of preserving these connections for future generations.

The book also acts as a subtle critique of urban development, highlighted by the juxtaposition of its environmental message against the backdrop of an advertisement for a flood-free township in Chennai. This contrast underscores the ongoing challenges faced by cities like Chennai, where the promise of urban utopias often comes at the expense of environmental integrity and resilience.

Trump ahead of Biden in six of seven key states: Opinion poll

WASHINGTON: Ahead of the upcoming US election scheduled for November, President Joe Biden is trailing behind his main opponent Donald Trump in six of the seven battleground states, according to a latest opinion poll.

Voters are broadly dissatisfied with the national economy and there are deep doubts about Biden's capabilities and job performance, the survey conducted by the Wall Street Journal revealed.



Trump leads between two and eight percentage points in six battleground states of Pennsylvania, Michigan, Arizona, Georgia, Nevada and North Carolina. However, Biden is leading Trump by three points in Wisconsin.

In every state in the survey, negative views of the president's job performance outweigh positive views by 16 percentage points or more, with the gap topping 20 points in four states. By contrast, Trump earns an unfavourable job review for his time in the White House in only a single state — Arizona — where negative marks outweigh positive ones by 1 percentage point, The Wall Street Journal reported.

According to Real Clear Politics, which keeps tracks of all the major national polls, Trump and Biden are in a neck-to-neck fight this fall. An average of major national polls shows that Trump is lead-

ing Biden by 0.8 percentage points.

"Biden and Trump both easily became their party's presumptive nominees last month, but each candidate will face a long and difficult campaign in a rematch of the 2020 contest. In a race expected to be razor-tight, a handful of battleground states will likely determine the winner," The Hill newspaper said Wednesday.

Meanwhile, The Biden administration on Thursday issued final rules meant to protect the jobs of the government's 2.2 million civil servants, as Republican challenger Donald Trump plans to replace thousands with hard-line loyalists if he returns to the White House.

Ukraine discusses peace formula with India

NEW DELHI: Ukrainian Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba said that he had "sincere and comprehensive talks" with his counterpart S. Jaishankar on the Peace Formula and its implementation.



Landing in the capital on Thursday on a two-day official visit, Kuleba said he intends to build on the dialogue between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelensky for peace.

"In New Delhi, I had sincere and comprehensive talks with @DrSJaishankar about Ukrainian-Indian bilateral relations, the situation in our regions, and global security," Kuleba said in a post on X after meeting EAM Jaishankar.

"We paid specific attention to the Peace Formula and next steps on the path of its implementation," the leader, on his first visit to India, said.

On October 11, 2022, Kuleba's remarks came as Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov on Friday dismissed the 10-point plan, asserting that it is pointless to ask Moscow to withdraw its troops from areas it currently occupies.

In an interview published in Russian daily Izvestia on Friday, Lavrov said: "We are in any case ready to hold discussions but not on the basis of (President Volodymyr) Zelensky's 'peace formula'," The Kyiv Independent reported.

"How could any serious politician in Washington, Brussels, London, Paris, or Berlin say that there is no alternative to the Zelensky formula," Lavrov added.

Ukraine also hopes for India's participation in a peace summit to be held in Switzerland later this year to discuss the peace formula.

The Kyiv Independent reported that "over 160 countries will be invited to discuss Kyiv's peace formula and create a joint document on what must be done to restore the country's sovereignty".

Earlier, EAM Jaishankar said that his "open and wide-ranging conversation" with Kuleba focused on the ongoing conflict and its wider ramifications.

PM Modi speaks to Belgian counterpart on India-EU partnership, bilateral ties



NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke to Belgian Prime Minister Alexander De Croo and discussed ways to further strengthen bilateral ties while congratulating him on the successful hosting of the First Nuclear Energy Summit.

Biden 'outraged' by death of Gaza aid workers in Israeli strike

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden has said that he is "outraged and heartbroken" by the deaths of seven humanitarian workers from World Central Kitchen (WCK), including one American, in Gaza on Monday.

"They were providing food to hungry civilians in the middle of a war. They were brave and selfless. Their deaths are a tragedy," Biden said in a statement on Tuesday.

The seven WCK workers, who died in an Israeli strike on Monday, were from Australia, Poland, the UK, a dual citizen of the US and Canada, and Palestine. They were travelling in a deconflicted zone in two armoured cars and a soft-skinned vehicle, WCK said in a statement.



The WCK convoy was hit as it was leaving the Deir al-Balah warehouse, where the team had unloaded more than 100 tons of humanitarian food aid brought to Gaza on the maritime route, it added.

"Israel has pledged to conduct a thorough investigation into why the aid workers' vehicles were hit by airstrikes. That investigation must be swift, it must bring accountability, and its findings must be made public," the US President said.

"Even more tragically, this is not a stand-alone incident. This conflict has been one of the worst in recent memory in terms of how many aid workers have been killed. This is a major reason why distributing humanitarian aid in Gaza has been so difficult — because Israel has not done enough to protect aid workers trying to deliver desperately needed help to civilians," he added.

Biden further said that the US will continue to do all "we can to deliver humanitarian assistance to Palestinian civilians in Gaza, through all available means".

"I will continue to press Israel to do more to facilitate that aid. And we are pushing hard for an immediate ceasefire as part of a hostage deal. I have a team in Cairo working on this right now," he said.

Gaza patients will die if not evacuated: WHO



GENEVA: The destruction of Al Shifa Hospital in Gaza will require more medical evacuations and ultimately cause more deaths if these are not carried out swiftly, the head of the World Health Organisation (WHO) said on Wednesday.

Israeli forces, who left the hospital in Gaza City on Monday after a two-week operation, detained hundreds of suspected Palestinian militants and left a swathe of destroyed buildings in their wake.

"The people who need medical evacuation will increase, and medical evacuation is already slow," said WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus.

"People will die because they will not get the services either from Shifa or because of slow evacuation, because they cannot be evacuated." Only 10 of Gaza's 36 hospitals are still able to function even partially, Tedros said, adding the situation on the ground looked "disastrous".



Country's life expectancy hits historic record in 2023: Russian PM



MOSCOW: Russian Prime Minister Mikhail Mishustin on Wednesday said that the country's life expectancy in 2023 exceeded pre-pandemic levels, reaching a historic high.

"At the end of last year, life expectancy in Russia reached almost 73.5 years," Mishustin said. Such indicators have never been recorded in the history of the former Soviet Union and modern Russia, he said, Xinhua news agency.

According to Russia's Federal State Statistics Service, life expectancy in Russia was 73.3 years in 2019, declined during the COVID-19 pandemic and was 71.5 in 2020. Russian President Vladimir Putin said in February that the country plans to increase life expectancy to at least 78 years by 2030.

Japan govt designates 5 airports, 11 seaports to upgrade for possible defence use

TOKYO: The Japanese government has designated five airports and 11 seaports to be upgraded for possible use by the Self-Defense Forces (SDF) and the Japan Coast Guard, local media reported.

The plan was approved by related government ministers and starts in the current fiscal year through next March, with a 37 billion yen (\$244 million) budget earmarked for the first year, Kyodo News reported on Monday, citing the Cabinet Secretariat.

Local governments that manage these facilities are expected to sign documents with the central government to specify that the SDF and the Japan Coast Guard will utilise them in daily operations and emergencies, it added as quoted by Xinhua news agency report.

The government said the private sector will remain the main user of the facilities, according to Kyodo News.

The five airports are in the three southwestern Kyushu prefectures of Fukuoka, Nagasaki and Miyazaki, as well as in the southernmost prefecture of Okinawa, home to the bulk of US forces Japan hosts.

Among the 11 seaports, five are in Hokkaido, the northern main island, while four are in Kagawa and Kochi prefectures on the western main island of Shikoku, with one each in Fukuoka and Okinawa prefectures.



Under the scheme, the designated airports will have runways extended and aprons widened to make them more suitable for fighter jets and SDF transport aircraft, while deeper and well-equipped docks will be constructed in

Precision Weapons Systems Trigger Worldwide Demand

BLENDED WITH SUPERIOR TECHNOLOGY, INDIAN DEFENCE EXPORTS CROSSES RS. 21,000 CRORES

There was little surprise, when India's Defence Minister, Rajnath Singh, announced on April 1 that the country's defence exports have registered a 31 per cent rise during the financial year closing on March 31, 2024.

Earlier, the Finance Minister, Nirmala Sitharaman, had estimated that Indian defence exports might touch USD 2.8 billion or Rs. 24,000 crores in the year 2024. The success in the previous year with Rs. 21,000 crores has made the current year more promising for defence exports despite the ongoing polls. It is believed that the target might be achieved without much difficulty.

The convergence of the state-of-the-art technologies being developed in the IITs, especially in Madras and Roorkee, blended with the field experiences of the defence forces accompanied by the active participation of the private sector, including Tatas and L&T, has ushered in paradigm changes in the country's traditional approach towards defence production and also reluctance in developing new weapon systems.

However, Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) as well as the public sector defence production units, have complemented in achieving quality products as well as seeking worldwide markets. In this challenging sector, the defence ministry is supporting a large number of start-ups in this sector. The development of drones by a team of highly accomplished technologists, who recently had set up a start-up, received financial support through banks.

Pinaka's Supplies to Armenia

The recent protests from Azerbaijan, Armenia's neighbour, which had been using drones received from Turkey, against the Indian supplies to the tiny country has received worldwide attention. Also, the success of the Pinaka system with its "shoot and scoot" capability has drawn enquiries from various countries. Armenia has successfully deployed the Pinaka system for self-defence. Initially, it was developed for the Indian army. It can fire a salvo of 12 HE rockets in 44 seconds with a range of 40 kilometres, but its enhanced version has a range of 120 kilometres. Armenia has opted for it due to its low cost and simplicity of use, thus making it an ideal weapons system for self-defence.

Improving the Range of Field Guns

In conventional warfare, the artillery plays a key-role, but its fire power must be accompanied by focusing on the target. It means that the precision for ensuring the target has to be improved.

The IIT Madras and Munitions India Limited (MIL) have been working together to develop India's first indigenous 155 mm guided smart ammunition. Their success can be judged by the fact that ammunition will have a Circular Error Probable (CEP) of 10 meters, compared to the current range of 500 meters. The shells will be guided by NavIC satellites and will have a range of at least 8 km and a maximum of 38 km.

The IIT Madras has also developed a ramjet-powered artillery shell with a range of 78 km. The ramjet shell can be fired from all 155 mm howitzers in the Indian Army's inventory. It is believed that India's two adversaries, Pakistan and China too would soon be developing the range of their field guns.



The Controversy

The publication of news regarding the Indian supplies to Armenia in the Azerbaijan news portal has caused controversy. It has published a news report with pictures of a cargo being claimed to be India's indigenous Pinaka multi-barrel rocket launchers. The news portal Caliber.az put out videos of a camouflaged convoy moving through Iran's Nurduz border checkpoint into Armenia.

It is being claimed that the convoy might be carrying military cargo delivered to the Iranian port of Bandar Abbas from the eastern coast of the Caspian Sea. Quoting "independent" sources, the portal identified the source of the cargo as India, which has increased its military-technical cooperation with Armenia in recent years.

Armenia and Azerbaijan have been engaged in a conflict over control of the Nagorno-Karabakh region that resulted in a 45-day war in September 2020. A peace deal brokered by Russia put an end to fighting till 2022 when frequent ceasefire violations escalated into another two-day conflict in September 2023, followed by scattered instances of border clashes.

Amidst the reports suggesting weapons from India had entered Armenia, Hikmet Hajiyev — foreign policy adviser to the president of Azerbaijan — called on the Indian Ambassador to the country, Sridharan Madhusudhanan. Hajiyev noted that Azerbaijan was concerned about expanding military cooperation between Armenia and India and the circulation of photos and videos reportedly showing the transportation of Indian-made weapons systems to Armenia through Iran.


Earlier, Armenia had sought Indian assistance to India to beef up its defences with the purchase of multiple military systems amid continuing tensions with Azerbaijan, which is seen as an ally of Pakistan and Turkey. Armenian Defence Minister Suren Papikyan even met his Indian counterpart Rajnath Singh on the sidelines of the DefExpo held last August, looking to expand defence cooperation with India.

It appears that India's support to Armenia could also be attributed to the Azerbaijani-Turkish-Pakistani axis, which threatens Armenia as well as India's interests in the region. The report said that Armenia is also interested in purchasing Indian-made drones and anti-drone systems, and more deals will be known in the coming months. It is true that India's decision to supply Brahmos to the Philippines has already caused anger in Beijing, but India has already crossed the era of neutrality in world affairs.

India's arms sales to Armenia go beyond business-as-usual relationships. It is being argued in India that this military relationship has a geopolitical background, as India aims to establish itself as a reliable defence player globally and secure its national interests regionally by containing Pakistan, Turkey and their junior partner Azerbaijan.

Is Imran Khan's wife Bushra Bibi being poisoned? Medical reports say 'no evidence'



ISLAMABAD: Amid allegations that Bushra Bibi, the spouse of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan, was poisoned at Bani Gala sub-jail, personal physician Asim Yousuf confirmed conducting a medical examination, Geo News reported.

Dr Yousuf stated that no evidence of any poisonous substance being administered to the former first lady was found during the examination.

"At this time, there is no evidence of Bushra Bibi being poisoned," Dr Yousuf said while speaking to Geo News, adding, "We are not conducting any medical tests to ascertain the administration of any poisonous substance to Bushra Bibi as no such symptoms are detected," as per Geo News. The physician stated that Bushra Bibi's health deteriorated after taking a meal two months ago. However, she started consuming less food due to health issues, he added.

According to Geo News, the physician added that he was unaware of her actual health issues, which happened two months ago.

Yousuf said that medical tests should be conducted by keeping in view of her age and to check for any health problems, including stomach-related issues.

Additionally, he said that he would meet the incarcerated PTI founder on Saturday. Regarding Khan's health, Dr Yousuf confirmed that the former premier's condition had improved, noting that his appetite had not fully returned to normal following his recovery from a minor illness.

On Tuesday, incarcerated former prime minister Khan apprised the court that his wife was poisoned at the Bani Gala sub-jail.

The PTI founder claimed this during a hearing of the USD 190 million settlement case in Rawalpindi's Adiala jail. Khan informed the accountability court judge that the former first lady had marks on her skin and tongue after "being poisoned".

He requested the court order an inquiry into the incident and a comprehensive medical examination of Bushra Bibi.

Before her court appearance, the former first lady also asserted during her interaction with journalists that "three drops of toilet cleaner" were mixed in her food on the eve of Shab-e-Meraj.



Russian Ambassador to India, Denis Alipov, said that his country is committed to fighting terrorism together with India and other nations, as he highlighted the strong statement of support from Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

The remarks came after a dastardly terror attack near Moscow on March 22 left more than 140 people dead and several injured as terrorists, reportedly dressed in camouflage uniforms, stormed the Crocus City Hall, opening fire and setting off explosives. "Russia is committed to decisively fight the menace of terrorism together with India and other countries bilaterally and multilaterally," Ambassador Alipov said in a post on X. "Strong statements of support to Russia and rejection of terrorism in all manifestations were made by Hon. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, leaders of political parties, ministers, senior officials and public activists," he added. He also "highly appreciated" the sentiments towards the victims, their kin, and the Russian government shown by the people of India and other countries. Ambassador Alipov added that the Embassy keeps receiving condolence messages expressing sympathy over the huge loss of lives and condemnation of the "monstrous terrorist attack" on March 22 near Moscow.

Expressing his solidarity with the people of Russia, PM Modi had strongly condemned the heinous terrorist attack, saying, "Our thoughts and prayers are with the families of the victims. India stands in solidarity with the government and the people of the Russian Federation in this hour of grief."

Mukesh Ambani breaks into top 10, ranked at 9th in Forbes global rich list

Ambani at the age 66 is ranked 9th on the list with a wealth of USD 116 billion, up from USD 83.4 billion in the 2023 ranking

MUMBAI: Oil-to-telecom conglomerate Reliance Industries Ltd head Mukesh Ambani continues to be the richest Indian and has now broken into the world's top 10 wealthiest persons in the latest Forbes 2024 Billionaire List.

Ambani, 66, is ranked ninth on the list with a wealth of USD 116 billion, up from USD 83.4 billion in the 2023 ranking, according to Forbes.

Gautam Adani is the second richest Indian and is ranked at No. 17 on the global list. He is worth USD 84 billion, up from USD 47.2 billion in 2023 when



his apples-to-airport conglomerate was rocked by a damning report by US short-seller Hindenburg Research. The Adani group has denied all allegations in the report.

Adani, 61, was worth USD 90 billion in the 2022 ranking. The Forbes 2024 Billionaires List features 2,781 individuals, an increase of 141 names from last year's list. The billionaires,

according to the list, are richer than ever, worth USD 14.2 trillion in aggregate, up by USD 2 trillion from 2023 and USD 1.1 trillion above the previous record, also set in 2021.

Two-thirds of the list's members are worth more than a year ago; only one-fourth are poorer. Fashion and cosmetics giant LVMH's Bernard Arnault is at the top of the list with USD 233 billion wealth, followed by Elon Musk with USD 195 billion and Amazon's Jeff Bezos with USD 194 billion.

Facebook founder Mark Zuckerberg comes next in the list with a net worth of USD 177 billion.

The US has a record 813 billionaires followed by China with 473 billionaires. India added 31

billionaires to the list compared to last year with the number now reaching 200.

"To calculate net worths, we used stock prices and exchange rates from March 8, 2024," Forbes said.

Other Indians on the list include IT pioneer and HCL co-founder Shiv Nadar at No. 39 with USD 36.9 billion wealth, Jindal group's Savitri Jindal and family at No. 46 with USD 33.5 billion, Sun Pharma's Dilip Shanghvi at No. 69 with USD 26.7 billion, vaccine maker Cyrus Poonawalla at No 90 with USD 21.3 billion, property baron Kushal Pal Singh at No 92 with USD 20.9 billion, and commodities king Kumar Billa at No 98 with USD 19.7 billion.

Hero MotoCorp gets Rs 605 cr demand notice from I-T Dept

NEW DELHI: The country's largest two-wheeler maker Hero MotoCorp on Thursday said it had received demand notices from the Income Tax department for around Rs 605 crore, including interest, for six assessment years.

On April 3, 2024, the company received assessment orders or demand notices dated March 30, 2024, pertaining to six assessment years from the Income Tax Department, the company said in a regulatory filing. The two-wheeler major is examining the orders/ notices received and shall take appropriate steps, including the filing of appeals and rectification applications, it added.

The notice pertains to six assessment years, amounting to a tax demand of Rs 308.65 crore and interest thereon of Rs 296.22 crore, Hero Moto-



Corp said.

This is on account of certain disallowances, for the assessment years 2013-14 to 2017-18 and 2019-20, it added. "In the opinion of the management, the demand raised is unsustainable in nature, and is unlikely to have material impact on financials, operations or other activities of the company," the two-wheeler major stated. Shares of the company on Thursday ended 0.75 per cent lower at Rs 4,522.30 apiece on the BSE.



OQ group reports OMR 970 Million profit in 2023, with 408 Million OMR in ICV

MUSCAT: OQ, the global integrated energy group, released today its financial results for 2023. The company reported a revenue of OMR 13.7 billion, earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortisation (EBITDA) of OMR 1.975 billion, and a net profit of OMR 970 million.

This outstanding performance reflects robust operational achievements across the Group's businesses. Key factors included increased production volumes, strong Oman Export Blend (OEB) and refined product prices, operational excellence across the assets, and gains from divestment activities.

The achievement of this level of operational, financial, and strategic performance in 2023 reflects the directives of the Oman Investment Authority (OIA) and the Group's Board of Directors to enhance performance and achieve the targeted rates. The

Booming real estate results in higher recoveries of stressed assets ; trend visible in power, other sectors: Study

NEW DELHI: Recovery in key infrastructure sectors has cast a positive impact even on the stressed assets in these industries as is reflected in marked improvement in realisation of such assets in real estate, roads, power and steel, according to an ASSOCHAM-CRISIL Ratings study.

Recoveries in real estate topped the list, followed by the road sector thanks to several policy interventions, turnaround in these industries as also an overall positive macroeconomic. "Real estate is seen to recover 77-82 per cent of the acquired debt (by asset reconstruction companies) over eight years followed by highway tolling with a recovery of 58-63 per cent," the study noted.

As a result of high recoveries, the debt under the real estate sector is being bought at a very low discount amidst rising investor interest due to



the boom in the sector.

"Along with several macro positives, the factors leading to a substantial improvement in recoveries in vital infrastructure sectors include a transformative role played by the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, though a lot of ground needs to be covered in terms of speeding up the judicial process for the IBC cases," ASSOCHAM Secretary General Mr Deepak Sood said.

Commenting on the ASSOCHAM-CRISIL Ratings report, Mr Sood said the re-

coveries in the stressed assets has resulted in a marked improvement in the banks' balance sheets with the non-performing assets, touching decadal lows in several banks.

As in the real estate industry, the stressed sectors in the power sector have the potential to recover 43-48 per cent of the total debt acquired by the ARCs. "The positive trajectory can be attributed to escalating demand for power, favourable regulatory changes such as coal auctions through the Shakti scheme, ongoing restructuring initiatives and strategic investments," the paper pointed out.

Likewise in the roads including highways, the improvement is taking place due to several measures by the government to develop the public infrastructure ecosystem. These include extension of concession period for build-operate-transfers-toll operators, release of retention money to the extent of work done etc. According to the study, stressed road assets have the potential to recover 58-63 per cent of the total debt acquired.

INTERVIEW WITH CEO, FERAS TAPPUNI

The Impact of Quantum Computing on the Future of Cyber Security

Feras Tappuni is the CEO and founder of SecurityHQ. He has dedicated his life to cyber security and is driven by the desire to offer SecurityHQ clients the highest degree of protection against today's cyber threats.

Feras, in short, what is Quantum Computing?

"Quantum Computing is a computer that is built out of cubits, and is an extraordinarily powerful machine, it is a revolution, it is the gamechanger in terms of computer processor power. But it has limitations. Quantum computers can only run for about a minute. The more cubits you add to it the more unstable it becomes. But it has the capability to resolve highly complex mathematical problems. As in the most complicated possible, and in a fraction of the time it would take a current computer."

How will this impact society and business as we know it?

"A mathematical problem that would take 100 professors 10 years, can now be done in 2 minutes. This will significantly impact the way the world operates. Be it medical research or understanding the universe there are so many things that we use maths for, and maths is the basis of all that we do as a society. But there is a byproduct to quantum computing. In that it will make our current encryption, the encryption that we have on all our websites, applications, internal and ex-



ternal apps, and anything that is encrypted, which is most things, it has the potential to negate all of it, removing security."

What does that mean for Cyber Security?

"As a security company, SecurityHQ, quantum computing is not necessarily a problem we need to solve, but we do need to be extremely aware of it, and start making steps towards that, to understand it more."

It sounds like a real action movie, but within the quantum computing space Q-Day is the term used to describe the day when computers will be able to crack any encryption algorithm, and this will be the day that somebody has the passwords to everything."

This rapid growth is not too dissimilar to the very rapid development of AI in the last 6 to 9 months. AI has been around since the 90s, but very much in infancy. Only in the last 6 months has AI expanded significantly, and we believe that Quantum computing is about to take that same step where people will be able to access it in a functional state."

A byproduct of that is that all known encryptions will become negated. Which is a huge statement for me, as a cyber security expert to say. The Quantum

Computing experts are saying 2025, today is 2024, so it is very close, but how that will be replicated across we do not know at this stage."

IBM state that 'In 2025, we will enhance the quality of quantum circuits [...] and quantum communication to demonstrate the first quantum-centric supercomputer.' In light of this quote, what are the signs that you look for?

"The tech press will be the first to lead with this. Where we are with the race of quantum computers, there are several players. You mentioned some of the big players, IBM, Google, Microsoft, etc, they are close to building their quantum computer. But China is investing billions on quantum, on average of 24 billion US dollars a year, and already have quantum computers."

Who do you predict will be impacted by this first?

"What I estimate is that the first people who will start being affected by quantum computing are those with crypto wallets and crypt currency, because that is an easy target. If you steal bitcoin etc, you can make billions, and they are untraceable, and there is no police force. So, I would watch the crypto wallets first."

I would also note that a lot of the crypto wallets are now becoming quantum proof, they are changing the algorithms of the source code. As are messaging services and apps."

Every organisation will soon start asking 'are my applications, gateway, website, email quantum proof?' That would be the next challenge."

What are SecurityHQ's Steps Going into This?

"Right now, we are at such an early stage it's more about education. Education within the business. Understanding how we are going to support our clients. And it's not like any security company will have the answer here. We as a company have our own CRM systems, we use a bunch of organisations, and businesses use third-party software. That means that third parties must be quantum proof as well. And all companies, and all governments are going to have to start getting real about this."

As an individual there is not much you can do, as you are just relying on third party applications, so the applications you use in your day-to-day life, that is not down to you to security proof that. It's up to you to maintain your passwords, and where you

go and what you do with your accounts, but the applications don't belong to you."

But for companies, such as us, the internal applications, and websites that we build and own, and the source code that we use, we will have to re-look at those algorithms and create test beds for them to start applying across our applications."

The challenge for businesses is understanding where their data is, what it is sitting on. We know that challenge within our own customer base. But there is time to understand where the data is, educate ourselves around this problem and conduct a business case and risk assessment. That is where businesses need to start, and where our journey will start."

This is a nuclear impact. If someone gets your encryption and passcodes there is no way round that. I want to remind people that a lot of us out there, including SecurityHQ, have a duty to care about the 3rd party data that we have. Going into quantum computing makes this element a legal minefield, because if all the passwords are opened up, but you still legally have a duty of care to protect the data of your customers/and third parties, this will affect all of businesses out there."

What would Be Your Advice to CISOs and IT Leaders heading into 2025?

"There is a heap of information out there on quantum computing. You can learn an awful lot from YouTube. The more awareness and conversations you can have on the topic, the better. It's getting started, that's the hard part. But really, it's simply changing certain parts of the algorithm, and if you get the right expertise on

it, it's not that difficult."

But you can't go into it on day one, you really need to look at it, get an understanding of it, learn about the potential impact, and understand what applications you use internally and externally."

And just start making small changes. Start talking to your third parties, ask them if they are quantum proof, have they done an impact/risk assessment etc.?



I read my criticism before the praise: Karan Johar

Stressing that from an early stage, he has believed in closely reading his criticism from diverse quarters without assuming that it is a conspiracy theory, producer-director Karan Johar says, "To evolve, it is paramount that I am around people who are closer to the ground, and draw from those who have talent."

In conversation with film critic Namrata Joshi during the session titled, 'Between Larger-than-Life Romance and Grassroots Love Storyyaan -- the Dharma of Entertainment' at the Cinevestre International Film Festival (CIFF) in Chandigarh, the star director revealed that 'Kill' will be released in July, there is a digital version of 'Student of the Year' that Reema Sengupta is directing, and new work on an OTT platform.

"I would like to direct five films this decade. I sleep barely four to five hours a day, and have complete faith in my team, making it a point not to interfere in their creative space."

Admitting that he had fumbled early in his career, Johar asserts that his production house has invested in diverse content, debut filmmakers, actors without any experience, and writers who floored him with their scripts. When 'Kabhi Khushi Kabhi Gham' was released, and went to be a huge hit, there were four other releases -- 'Lagaan', 'Dil Chahta Hai', 'Chandni Bar' and 'Gadar'.

"Well, that made me question -- 'Did I make a path-breaking



film?' I was assaulted by cinematic missiles." Stressing that taking over Dharma Productions was the toughest phase of his life, considering he had no clue how to run it, and even thought about shutting it down, he adds, "When I look back now, the journey was a learning curve, that evolved me both as a person and professional."

He says complete trust in others who knew their jobs, an open door policy and depending on his instincts brought about a metamorphosis for the production house. "We have worked with 28 filmmakers. I am part of all film festivals in the world and closely watch all new cinema that is being made across the country. There is no apprehension in calling filmmakers whose work moves me, and inviting them to create with us. And yes, Malayalam cinema is the best cinema in India." Even though he has made several films that have been a huge success at the box office, he smiles, "I want to make my 'Lagaan', which will always be in the archives of Indian cinema. That one is yet to come..."

Universality of Bhagavad Gita

One of the salient features of Bhagavad Gita is its liberal and inclusive spirit. It has proclaimed that though expressed, reached and experienced in different ways; the Supreme Being is one and one alone. All beliefs and practices lead to the same truth. Though different people may climb the mountain from different directions, but the view from the top is alike for all. The ultimate reality is same everywhere.

Gita does not confine itself to a shallow stream of metaphysical thought. It is rather a sea of spiritual wisdom. It brings out the essence of all religious rigmarole - the desire to know the ultimate truth and understand one's relation with that truth. The teachings of Gita apply to all human beings in equal measure. Sri Krishna (the Supreme Lord) has declared that:

"I accept men in whatever manner they approach Me; for everyone, in one way or the other, is following My path only" (Shloka 4.11).

This shloka brings out all-embracing nature of the Gita philosophy; namely that there is only one God, who can be worshipped in different ways. All human

beings in every respect follow the path of one Ishvara only. Whether one invokes celestial gods by practising rituals meant to propitiate them, whether he meditates on his favourite sacred form, whether he serves the Supreme by dedicating the fruits of all his actions to Him, whether he devotes himself by worshipping the Supreme Lord in any of His personal forms; or he seeks oneness with the Unmanifest Absolute - everyone relates to the one Divine. Whenever any worship is done, in whatever form, only the same Divine is worshipped.

Various people worship the Supreme variously. They perceive Him in different forms. But what is important is not the form but the internal urge to search for the truth behind that form. The image one worships is only an aid to help him in realising his true self. So long as the object of worship is capable of keeping one's attention fixed firmly, it is a valid manifestation of the Divine. More important than the name and the form of the divinity worshipped, or the manner of worship; is the firmness and steadiness of the mind, and the single-mindedness of the devotion.

Different people comprehend the Divine differently, in accordance with their natural inclination; and take



refuge in Him accordingly. The Supreme accepts every aspirant dotingly, and helps him to grow according to his nature and aspiration. He does not ignore or exclude anyone; because everyone knowingly or unknowingly, directly or indirectly, is following His path only. God reciprocates to all.

The world is governed by the laws of nature, which are authored by Ishvara, the Supreme Lord. As these laws are universally applicable to everyone equally, the God is not partial to anyone. He is same for all beings. He ensures that everyone gets his due in life.

God is the saviour of all. In whatever manner an aspirant approaches Him, He accepts and blesses him in that very manner. In other words, in whatever mode one worships

God, He rewards Him accordingly. He grants appropriate results to those who hanker after fruits of their actions. He grants spiritual wisdom to those who perform their duties selflessly; and He bestows divine bliss to His exclusive devotees. He grants freedom to those who are men of wisdom and who aspire for liberation. Those who recognise the unmanifest and eternal nature of the Divine; and surrender completely and unconditionally to the Indwelling Spirit - they attain to the bliss of the Absolute i.e. they gain everlasting truth, all-pervading consciousness and unalloyed joy.

According to the spiritual evolution of individuals and communities concerned, perceptions of the religious authority vary. Those who

are spiritually naive, they are not willing to recognise any transcendental reality other than the one they themselves believe in. Their conviction that only they are the sole possessors of truth makes them more vulnerable to religious falsehood. They remain shackled by the chains of their own dogmatic beliefs.

Bhagavad Gita does not subscribe to such a narrow worldview. It has, on the other hand, delivered to whole of the mankind, a message of unity of the Godhead. It has been affirmed that though appearing as divided among various beings, the Supreme Brahman is indivisible. He is the one who is supporting all beings, annihilating them; and creating them afresh. All divine manifestations belong to Him alone. The same God is, thus, worshipped by all.

To conclude, in whatever divine form and through whichever spiritual means, one invokes Ishvara; He reveals Himself to him through that very form. What is important is not the form and the means of worship, but the sincerity of devotion. An evolved soul can see the underlying unity behind the apparent differences in various ideologies and practices. He, therefore, does not look down upon either the objects or the manner of worship of others.
